Dear Mr. Geary

Pastor Ron Baity of Berean Baptist Church has contacted me (and forwarded the letter concerning your reception report of station WPIP. Our firm is WPIP's engineering counsel of record. Enclosed please find a map showing the normally protected (0.5 mV/m, F(50,50) nighttime contour of WCBS New York, the absolute position of your receiving post, and the calculated F(50,10) 0.1 mV/m skywave contour of WPIP. Frankly, we are astonished that you could copy WPIP at all although you mentioned that you were using an Adcock antenna or a high performance ferrite H-field antenna.

As an aside, I had a Sony SRF-100 AM stereo receiver that would null out WAYS here in Charlotte (610 kc) perfectly and I could hear other stations holding the radio in various odd positions. Unfortunately, my poor little Sony went to my ex-wife in the divorce proceeding. (This is a little bit like the old management tactic of "when you want to fire someone, give them everything except the one thing they want.")

I haven't even heard the Hammarlund word in 10 years (I am 35). Frankly, a radio receiver with 18 valves boggles the mind. (Then again, I had a Kenwood KT-917 FM tuner (stolen from me in 1989) with a nine gang tuning condenser - two for the local oscillator alone!)

Also, I am quite flattered by your remarks about WPIP's signal quality. This is no accident. We are using a Gates BC-1(T?) which is the tall one with the holes in the bottom. The valve lineup consists of 828C's (with the pyrolytic graphite anodes) six type 807's (two for kF drive and four for modulator drive) and a couple of 12BY7's in the crystal oscillator and first buffer. This transmitter has been modified extensively including the installation of modern solid state rectifiers, polypropylene / polystyrene (where voltage permits) condensers, and metallised film (established reliability) resistors. This transmitter is high level plate modulated AM.

The "modification" consists of putting a 500 ohm 200 watt adjustable resistor in series with the B+ leading to the modulator's audio blocking choke (about 50 henries). The final amplifier is operated at 2500 vdc but the modulators are operated at 2,900 vdc. We can fit under the NRSC RF mask even at 140% modulation (positive).

Our transmitting antenna is the folded unipole type with three symmetrical feedlines running the entire length of the tower. Shorting bars permit us to tune the 200' tower's resistance to 50 ohms, and the remaining inductive reactance is tuned out with a single vacuum variable condenser. The impedance

bandwidth is excellent, varying only one or two ohms within our allotted channel.

We think our audio quality is rather crummy, as BellSouth still cannot get a quiet programme link between our studios on Thomasville Road and the transmitter site downtown. There is a persistent 8000 hz squeal. This year, we will be installing Marti STL's and fire BellSouth. I've simply given up on them. Our audio processing consists of the CRL Audio Preparation Processor, and the middle one, but in lieu of their output processor, we are using Inovonics equipment for peak limiting and bandwidth control.

In answer to your question, you definitely received WPIP. I am astonished that you didn't also receive WBLU (or whatever it is now) at Smith Mountain Lake, (Moneta) Virginia, also on 880 kc.

The only other time I have ever received a letter like yours were from two independent DX clubs in New Zealand who heard my client KGOL Humble (Houston) Texas. My ex-wife insists that she heard the FM station in Charlotte on 104.7 mc at a rest area 30 miles into Virginia on Interstate 95. I once received WGBF Evansville, IN (1280) in Greensboro, NC perfectly for about four minutes. Once, one of my dearest friends (we've known each other since 8th grade) and our attorney were sitting in his parent's basement and instead of receiving channel 4 from Chapel Hill, we received channel 4 from Los Angeles. It is also usual in April to see KPRC-TV Houston (video only) completely overtaking WFMY Greensboro on channel 2. Somewhere I have video tape of this.

Well, I must be off to WOGF Charlotte to put tower 1 into nondirectional operation (tower 2, the other tower, has been the nondirectional tower so we could build #1's atu during the daytime.) Tower 2 has a massive kink in it and it is about to fall.

In the beginning of this letter sir let me say that I'm sorry that the press of circumstances, and the work of getting our transmitter and studio operating properly, caused this delay in our sending confirmation of the program that you heard from this station on Feb. 15, 1947, but I do hereby send you that confirmation.

In the event you are interested, here is the arrangement of studios, etc. at this station. We are using the whole upper floor of the Radio Bldg., which has been cut up into two very well constructed studios, one large control room, the rest being used for administration offices, as for program handling we are using two telephone lines from the studios to the transmitter which is located on Eagle Island about 5 miles from the heart of Wilmington, N.C. The program feeds through the usual jack board to a Western Electric type 23-C console from which the engineers can control the program level, the output of the console feeds a limiter stage, the output of which goes to the transmitter. The transmitter is a Western Electric 450A-1, using 6 type 242-c tubes in the final stage, in push-pull parallel, and having 250 watts output. We are using General Radio frequency and modulation percentage monitoring equipment and find that it is doing fine work.




Thanks so much for your taking time to write. This is to confirm your reception report of WTLK April 26-27, 1982. The programming you described is essentially correct. Steele Rulane is the gas company you mentioned. Elmores in Westpark Shopping Center in Statesville is the Wheel Horse dealer. Our studios, offices, transmitting facilities, and tower site are on Linneys Mountain. As you noted from our Sign-on announcement, we operate at 1,000 watts daytime and 500 watts pre-sunrise. On both mornings of your reception, we were operating at 500 watts til 7:00 a.m. In May, we operate at 500 watts til 6:15 a.m. In June, we will be signing on at 6:00 a.m. with 1,000 watts. Incidentally, we sign off in May at 8:30 p.m. You might be interested to know that we have received reception reports from Pittsburgh, PA, Washington, DC are, and Conneticut in the last several months. The most incredible reception report we have ever received was from West Germany in December, 1981. Probably one reason for our unusual "Skip" is that we are locatdd on Linneys Mountain which is about 400 feet above the surrounding area. Our tower is only about 180 feet tall. Elevation of Taylorsville is about 1400 feet above sealevel. Our transmitter is a Collins 20-V3 which was new when the station signed on in 1962. When we changed transmitter sites a few years ago, we installed the best ground system possible here on the mountain. I have tried to mention things you might want to know as I think of them. I would be happy to try to answer any other questions you may have at any time. And will be happy to hear from you concerning further reception of WTLK. Again, thanks for writing and keep listening. WDTF is a 500-watt non-directional AM station licensed to Raleigh, NC. We have recently been authorized to increase power to 1000 watts and that should happen when a new transmitter is installed about April 1st. Our night time power is limited to 59 watts. You must have received the station just after the power change which is made each day at 6:00 a.m.

WDTF originally went on the air in the mid-70's as WLLE as this communities primary Rhythm and Blues formatted station targeting the African-American community. In the fall of 1997 the station was sold to, and operated by, Mortenson Broadcasting of Lexington, KY and the format was changed to Christian Talk and Information.
