
A comparison of the data you sent us with our Station's Log shows conclusively that you received the programme.



This will acknowledge your letter of recent date, and will confirm your report of reception of our long wave, CHNS, operating on a frequency of 960 kc., Tuesday, October 10, 1950, 7.04 to 7.15 a.m. ADT., and Wednesday, October 11th, 1950, 6.59½ to 7.14 a.m. ADT.

For your information CHNS is on the air Monday through Saturday, 7.00 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. ADT., and Sunday 9.00 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. ADT. By the end of October we will revert to Standard Time, running between the hours quoted above.

You may also be interested in knowing that our shortwave, CHNX, operating on a frequency of 6130 kc., carries the full schedule of the long wave CHNS.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your interest in the Station, and to compliment you on the excellent report you submitted.


Dear Mr. Geary:

Dear Mr. Geary,

Your letter of April 7th addressed to the Engineering Department, CBA, Sackville, N.B. has been passed to me for reply.

From your description of reception it certainly appears that you received one of our two low power relay transmitters, broadcasting at 1140 on the dial - Andover, N.B.-CBAN or Shelburne, N.S.-CBAP. They are 40-watt unattended stations programming from our national network. They do not transmit any station calls and the 30-second period at the end of each program, which normally for station identification, is therefore dead air on these transmitters.

Thank you for taking the time to write to us. I will certainly bring your letter to the attention of our program officers here.

We thank you for your letter of December 10th., and are very pleased that our signal reached you on December 10th., and your logging checks with our Station log.


It is gratifying indeed that we can penetrate the ether so far, and only wish that we could let you hear some of our programs.

Thank you for your kind letter. Your reception report is quite correct. We have received quite a number of such reports and it has just occurred to me that they seem to be coming from points which are within a certain radius as in your own case. We also have them from Toronto and Hamilton, Ontario. We may plot those points on a map and see what can be learned.

We are on the air twenty-four hours daily except from 5.00 A.M. to 9.00 A.M. Sunday and from Midnight Sunday to 6.00 A.M. Monday.

Most of our radiation is thrown northward round an axis 10° East of North.

I hope we may hear from you again.
