Our studio location is 1190 North River Road, West Royalty
P.E.I., with transmitting facilities at Rocky Point, Prince Edward
Island.

CHTN operates a 10 000 watt RCA transmitter into a 3-
tower antenna array, with an overall height above sea level of 243 ft.
An omnidirectional radiating pattern is used during daytime hours, and
the full array is employed to affect our night pattern.




