Our monthly check is made every fourth Wednesday of the month from 2 to 2:30 A.M., MWT.

Mr. Meyer is a Class "A" Amateur Ham, therefore, our transmitting equipment was his biggest hobby before he entered the U. S. Navy. I am trying to "keep the home fires burning" until he returns after the duration and can take over again. Incidentally, I might mention at this time that he built his own short-wave transmitter for our home and holds "WAS" and "WAC" certificates. He designed a three-beam antenna, which occupied two pages of QST Magazine of May, 1939.

I would be very happy if you would drop me a line at any time you hear KPOW on the air. If in the future you would like to have another dedication made, just drop me a line and I shall be very happy to do this.



Dear Sir:

This will confirm as correct your report of reception of Radio Station KODI, at Cody, Wyoming on Jan. 17, 1948 at 2-2:15 AM MST, during our Frequency Check program.

KODI operates on a frequency of 1400 kcs. with a power of 250 watts, unlimited time, and conducts a regular monthly frequency check. This consists of a 1000 cycle tone modulation and identification from 2:00 AMMST to 2:15 AMMST the THIRD Saturday of each month altho we usually stay on the air with a record program from the time of our regular sign off at 10:30 PMMST until 2:00 AMMST on the night of the frequency check.

Our regular operating hours are from 6:30 AM to 10:30 PM weekdays and from 8:00 AM to 9:00 PM on Sundays.

Studios and transmitter are located approximately one mile south of the City of Cody, at an elevation of slightly over 5,000 ft. above sea level.

RCA equipment is used throughout, including studio and control equipment. The antenna is approximately  $5/16$  wavelength, vertical guyed tower - uniform cross-section; fed with gas filled co-axial cable. Ground system consists of 120 quarter-wavelength radials buried 6 to 18 inches in swampy ground located on a slight slope between a city reservoir and a small lake.

Thank you for your reception report and please accept our cordial invitation to visit us any time you are in our city. We regret that we are unable to acknowledge each inquiry with an individually typed letter but the number of inquiries we receive following each frequency test has precluded the possibility of typing each letter separately. We want you to know that we appreciate your letter and hope you will let us know in the future when you hear us.



MAXIMUN RATED CARRIER POWER 250 WATTS. ANTENNA 165 FEET OVER ALL HEIGHT UNIFORM CROSS-SECTION, GUYED, SHUNT EXCITED VIRTICAL RADIATOR GROUND SYSTEM CONSISTS OF 120 BURIED COPPER WIRE RADIALS 150 FEET LONG. K.G.O.S. IS ON THE AIR FROM 6:30 A.M. TO 10:30 P.M. WEEK DAYS AND FROM 8:00 A.M. TO 10:00 P.M. SUNDAYS. 


Dear Sir:
