JOHN HOLBROOK THE OTHER OWNER HAS A SPECTACULAR HISTORY IN RADIO DATING BACK ALMOST AS FAR, AND YOU NO DOUBT HEARD HIS TAPE RECORDED STATION IDENTIFICATION AT THE BEGINNING AND END OF THE BROADCAST. HE IS CURRENTLY HEARD DAILY ON THE DON LEE AND MBS STATIONS CARRYING THE ALKA SELTZER "NEWSPAPER OF THE AIR" FROM KHJ.

OUR RETURNS INDICATE FAIRLY GOOD RECEPTION IN OHIO, WASHINGTON, CALIFORNIA AND OTHER CLOSE STATES. THERE WERE MANY REPORTS OF STATIONS ON THE SAME 1230 WAVE LENGTH WHICH CAUSED UNEXPECTED INTERFERENCE. WE HOPE TO DO A SIMILAR BROADCAST AGAIN SOMETIME AND PERHAPS WE'LL HAVE THE AIR TO OURSELVES NEXT TIME.

BY THE WAY, OUR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE HOPES YOU'LL VISIT THIS AREA WHEN YOU HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY. IT'S NOTED FOR GOOD FISHING AND THERE'S LOTS OF GOOD HUNTING FOR ROCK HOUNDS IN THIS MINERAL RICH COUNTY.



The transmitting equipment at KCLS consists of a Raytheon RA250 running 1.85 amperes to a 165 foot uniform cross-section guyed tower. (Wincharger). The associated equipment is the required frequency and modulation monitoring, Doolittle and Gates in that order, with a Gates limiting amplifier.

The transmitting site is .6 miles south of Flagstaff on U. S. 89, the beautiful Oak Creek Canyon Road. Rising to the north are the San Francisco Peaks, and beyond the world famed Grand Canyon. The Flagstaff folks enjoy an attractive yearly income from the principal industries of lumber, tourist trade and railroading. The Arizona Sno Bowl is the winter sports headquarters of the Southwest.

A target date for the new facility is November 1. We at that time likely will have another test broadcast.


