This letter verifies that the station which you heard Nov. 26, 1962 at 0407 EST, on 1440 kilocycles, was our 1000 watt station WCDS, in Glasgow, Kentucky.

We would like to express our thanks to all of you who stayed up to listen for us and took the trouble to write. We were happy to cooperate with Len Kruse and the NRC in conducting a scheduled test program for the benefit of those interested in hearing our station. We are glad that you enjoyed our short program, and we hope that you will hear us again sometime. We will attempt to contact the NRC before future tests.

WCDS is owned and operated by John M. Barrick, a local citizen who has been in the announcing business for many years. Mr Barrick himself was the announcer that you heard on the test program. We employ three other announcers. We are a 1000 watt daytime station, covering a fifty-mile radius. We have all new deluxe Gates equipment and a quarter-wave antenna. Our transmitter is operated at maximum legal response, which slightly reduces our power but greatly increases the quality of our sound. Our regular programming consists of popular music, news, and community service programs.

Glasgow is located in South-Central Kentucky, in the heart of a great tobacco farming area. Glasgow is a farming center, and also boasts its share of industry. WCDS is located about two miles South of downtown. We hope to establish downtown studios in the near future. Please call on us if you happen to pass through Glasgow sometime.

We have been on the air for only two months, and all four employes have been "busy as a bee." We haven't printed any QSL cards or coverage maps yet. We would answer each letter with a personal letter, but our small staff and lack of time prevents answering over 100 letters!

Many thanks to you for writing to us. We were very happy that we were heard in so many places. Too bad we can't operate every night; but you know the law. We hope that this letter will be of some benefit to you in your interesting hobby of DX radio listening. 73's, all!

Received your letter several days ago and was very pleased to hear from you. Thanks a million for your interest in our new station.

We are using Collins Equipment - 300 G transmitter with 6L6 buffer; 807 IP amplifier, driving a pair of paralleled 810's in the final. We are feeding 235 feet of transmission line, terminating in a Collins tuning unit and radiating with a 150 foot guyed Blaw-Knox tower. Our ground system consists of 120 radials spaced 3 degrees apart, 175 feet long and covered by 48 square feet of copper mesh wire-all bonded together.

Your excellent report is in accordance with our station log. Thanks again for your response to our frequency check, which is scheduled on the third Monday of the month from 3:50 A.M. to 4:00 A.M. E.S.T., and you are invited to tune us in on Monday, October 15th, at that time.



I would like to say that your letter containing the reception report of last March 1, was correct.

I am writing in answer to your verification and hope that the information here enclosed will be of an assistance and informative.

WNOP operates on a frequency of 740 Kcs. and a power of 1000 watts. The station is daytime only, operating from sunrise to sunset using two towers to achieve the correct directional field pattern. Each tower is 232 feet high and spaced 774 feet apart. We use a Gates phasor to get 61.5 degrees phase difference between the two towers. Our transmitter is a Raytheon unit that uses two 833-A in the RF final in push pull. The modulators employ the same type tubes in push pull. The studios and transmitter are located six miles apart, the transmitter being at Cold Springs, Kentucky.

I am enclosing a contour map that maybe helpful.
