It is a pleasure to be able to send a confirmation of your reception of KXGO. Your report was identical to that we have on file.


For your information our signal was heard almost from coast to coast east and west. The western listener was just out of Seattle and the eastern listener was at Buffalo, New York.


SOUTH DAKOTA
