Your report is the furtherest so far with many reports from Iowa who reported us coming in like a local.





Your signals were R4-5, S4-7. There was considerable fading, but no static. There was occasional overlapping from WPAC in Patchogue and splatter from WNBC and WCBS who are located only a few blocks away. There was also considerable local electrical noise. The weather was fair with the temperature about 45°. My receiver was a National NC-125 using a 100 foot North-South antenna.

Hope that this report may be of interest to you and your staff and that I may have the pleasure of receiving a confirmation of my reception of WBUX. Thank you very much.

Dear Sir:

I wish to thank you for your report on reception of WHGB. It is correct in every detail and we are happy that we are reaching out so far. Our antenna is 200 feet high, which is higher than the required height but this is for taking care of any insufficient ground image. We have heard from Buffalo, N.Y. and East Hartford, Conn.

The transmitter is composite and the lineup follows:

6L6 oscillator.

809 first buffer.

T-55 2nd buffer.

G.e. 805's pushpull final stage, class C.

G.E. 805's pushpull modulators, class B.

The antenna is a selfsupporting Hoke radiator on top of a 8-story building. Underneath the antenna is a lot of copper mesh and 120 radials of #6 copper wire 5 degrees apart. This is all grounded to the steel frame of the building. The transmitter is in the basement and grounded to two 8-foot rods driven into the ground, plus the other ground.

I cannot promise any definite schedules for test as there is so much work to be done yet. However on June 10 at 3:00AM I hope to give a test program for the National Radio Club. We are on the air now 6AM to 1AM.

WHWL started commercial operation 7 A.M. on February 20th and operates daily from local sunrise to sunset. The transmitter is a kilowatt Raytheon which works into an open wire transmission line using six wires.

The tower is shunt fed and the associated tuning unit is mounted on a platform 30 feet above the ground. This design was necessary due to the fact that we are in a flood area by the banks of the Susquehanna.
