Dear Sir:

I had the pleasure of tuning your station, WERI, this morning while you were testing on 1230 kilocycles. I would like very much to receive a verification of my reception of WERI if this report agrees with your station log. How long has WERI been testing?

Program details: Eastern Daylight Time.
2:55-3:03 A.M. Variable-frequency audio tone signals.

3:03 "WERI, Westerly, R.I. We are taking the carrier off the air for approximately 15 minutes."
Carrier off.

3:20 Carrier noted on again. Various tests with carrier and tone on and off. No announcements noted until 3:55 A.M.

3:55 "WERI, Westerly, R.I. testing."

Your signals were fairly strong, although they ran into heavy interference at times on the channel from all-night stations. The interference covered your tone at times and I'm not sure whether or not you were carrying tone continuously during the second period mentioned above. There was also slight fading. Your signals were R3-5, S5-8. There was no static. The weather was fair with the sky clear. My receiver was a 14-tube Stromberg-Carlson using a built-in loop antenna.

Hope that this report may be of interest to you and your staff and that I may have the pleasure of receiving a confirmation of my reception of WERI. Thank you very much.


