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## INTRODUCTION

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*General remarks.*—The financial and operating data shown in this volume relate to the calendar year 1943. In accordance with the provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, the jurisdiction of the Commission extends to telephone, telegraph, cable and radiotelegraph carriers which render interstate and foreign service, and includes the controlling companies of such carriers, also broadcast stations and networks.

*Common carriers filing annual reports.*—All common carriers that are subject to the act are required to file annual reports. Statistical data concerning individual companies are shown in this volume for telephone carriers having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$100,000 and for wire-telegraph, ocean-cable and radiotelegraph carriers having average operating revenues exceeding \$50,000. Only limited data are shown for the smaller carriers, as they submit less comprehensive annual reports.

The tables in this publication concerning telephone carriers include data shown in the annual reports filed voluntarily for statistical purposes by five carriers engaged primarily in rendering intrastate service. These carriers are subject only to sections 201–205 of the act, which pertain to the filing of schedules of charges for interstate services.

In view of the fact that the major portion of the telephone business in the United States is handled by the Bell System, the summaries relating to telephone carriers show Bell System data separately. Certain inter-company items of operating and financial data have been eliminated. Accordingly, the net result represents data for all telephone carriers considered as one system.

*Common carriers filing monthly reports.*—Telephone carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$250,000 and wire-telegraph, ocean-cable and radiotelegraph carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000, that are subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission, are required to file monthly reports. The tables shown in this volume, which are compiled from these reports, include data shown in the monthly reports of 57 telephone carriers and one wire-telegraph carrier that are subject only to sections 201–205 of the act and file monthly reports voluntarily for statistical purposes. For that reason the cumulative monthly figures of telephone carriers for the year are slightly higher than the figures compiled from the annual reports.

*Holding companies.*—Section 219 of the act requires the companies, which control communication carriers, to file annual reports. Holding companies are classified in two groups, as follows: (a) companies having large interests, and (b) companies having nominal interests in the communication industry. The tables in this publication contain selected financial items concerning holding companies, and show the intercorporate relations between the carriers and controlling companies.

• *Broadcast stations and networks.*—The Communications Act of 1934 states that persons engaged in radio broadcasting are not deemed to be common carriers. Accordingly, the annual financial reports are filed with the Commission by standard broadcast stations and networks on a confidential basis, and are not available to the public. The statistical data are, therefore, shown in summary form in this yearbook and not by individual stations and networks.

*Communication industry and post-war planning.*—The communication industry has made an important contribution toward our country's war effort. There has been an increased demand for the statistical data relating to the communication industry shown in this publication, and for supplemental information, from various agencies of the Government and organizations engaged in war activities, and interested in post-war planning.





1926-1943







1926-1943



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## SECTION B

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### **Financial and Operating Data Relative to Standard Broadcast Stations and Networks**

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## STANDARD BROADCAST STATIONS AND NETWORKS

**General remarks.**—Section B contains financial and operating data and information concerning the employees of 841 commercial broadcast stations, also of 4 major and 5 regional networks, for the calendar year 1943. The tables showing employee data by months are for 841 stations, while those showing functional employment and pay roll data cover 855 stations. The information was compiled from reports filed by standard broadcast stations in accordance with the provisions of section 1.361 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, and from financial statements submitted by the networks in compliance with the Commission's request for data. The following table indicates the number of existing licenses for stations and permits for new construction as of December 31, 1943:

**Northeastern region.**—Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont.

**Great Lakes region.**—Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

**Midwest region.**—Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota.

### SOUTHERN DISTRICT

**Southeastern region.**—Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia.

**South Central region.**—Oklahoma and Texas.

### WESTERN DISTRICT

**Mountain region.**—Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming.

**Pacific region.**—California, Oregon, and Washington.



OF STANDARD BROADCAST STATIONS 1937-43**




