

Gentlemen:

This refers to your application for renewal of license of Station KYNT, Yankton, South Dakota (File No. BR-3102).

In response to Question 26, Section IV-A, concerning your proposed commercial practices, you state that your normal ceiling of 18 minutes of commercial matter in any 60-minute segment may be exceeded so as to allow up to 20 minutes during certain specified times. You are requested to state the percentage of total weekly hours of operation (i.e., the percentage of total operating hours in any week) you expect to exceed your proposed ceiling of 18 minutes an hour.

There is enclosed a copy of a letter sent to Station WXCL, Peoria, Illinois, which may be of interest to you. You will note in reading the letter that observance of a policy as stated therein would obviate any problem with the commercial aspects of the station's operation.

Information submitted in answer to this letter should be filed in triplicate, as an amendment to the application, duly signed by an officer of the corporation, within twenty (20) days of the date of this letter.

Gentlemen:

This refers to your report, dated June 19, 1969, on the commercial aspect of the operation of Station WXCL, Peoria, Illinois, during the 18 month period December 1, 1967 through May 31, 1969. Although your report reflects that 1,296 hours (approximately 13% of your assumed total broadcast hours) contained in excess of 18 minutes of commercial matter, the Commission contemplates no action at this time in light of the revision of your commercial policies.

Station WXCL is now operating under a commercial policy which specifies a normal commercial content of 18 minutes in each hour with specified exceptions permitting up to 20 minutes in each hour during no more than 10% of the total weekly hours of operation. A further exception would permit up to 22 minutes where the excess over the 20 minute ceiling is purely political advertising.

It would appear that compliance with the terms of your current commercial policy, the station observance of which is indicated by our review of the latter months of your reporting period, would obviate any problem with the commercial aspects of your operation at the next renewal period.

The report will be associated with the Commission's files on your station.



In a small community, such as Yankton, the Applicant and Staff is well acquainted with community and area leaders on a day to day basis. At such times their needs are discussed and often resolved through arrangements for broadcast of news and discussion programs.

Member of the Board of the Yankton Community Concert Association. Active in Corporation providing Senior Citizen Housing for low income group. Active in Yankton Women's Club and church work.

Applicant has contacted Congressional delegation on needs of Community, State and Nation. One of the fine privileges of residing in a small community and sparsely populated State is getting to know your officials on a personal first name basis. Problems and needs are also more obvious in less populated areas where another's problem or need becomes your own and everyone works together for a solution. The services of KYNT are always available and have been offered in many situations. The station is concerned that all sides of an issue or problem are presented.

2. Applicant is primarily concerned with meeting the needs and interests of the city of Yankton, and its immediate area. There are a few small communities of under 200 population in this area which KYNT does serve with coverage of their affairs.

There is a second station in Yankton, regarded as a regional farm station, which attempts to serve the greater rural area.

KYNT has assisted smaller communities in its coverage area with news and special projects and observances. KYNT has established a weekly broadcast from Hartington, Nebraska on which a resident of Hartington, Joan Burney, tells of community events and presents Public Affairs discussion with folks of Hartington and the surrounding area.

Exhibit 4

Applicant will endeavor in an impartial and fair manner to present significant needs, outlined in exhibit three, and interests of the Public through varied programming and comprehensive news coverage and informative discussion broadcasts. Applicant will welcome individuals, groups, and organizations who also seek time to present views. Time will also be made available for those with opposing views.

There is an urgent need for Water Plant expansion in the city. Bond issues failed this year. Applicant will continue efforts to inform the Public of this vital need.

Through Editorial comment this station was largely responsible for creating Public Interest in a combined City-County Law Enforcement Center. This project has advanced to a completed study with both the City and County Boards having passed resolutions of intent to continue cooperation in the building of such a center. Applicant will continue to interest Public support for this project.

Part of the City and area's Seven Point Highway Program is under construction. A change of priority is needed to develop one segment of the program ahead of another. The Applicant will inform the Public of this need for change and seek support.

As a result of a shopping center development in the community, downtown renewal is of vital importance. Industrial development efforts are being made to bring in a Pork Processing plant. A private group is attempting to fill a need for a convention center and downtown motel accommodations by bringing in a Ramada franchise. A private developer is attempting to fill a need for low cost housing. Applicant will support these interests in presenting information of community benefits.

Vandalism, shoplifting, drugs and other problems of Law Enforcement and Juvenile Delinquency are subjects which will be covered in discussion and talks by proper authorities and interested citizens.

City has been placed on the priority list for a new National Guard Armory. Applicant will attempt to inform the Public of the need to proceed with immediate plans for this facility in view of proposed Volunteer Army for the Nation and new emphasis placed on the role of the National Guard in the near future. Facility would also fulfill community need for improved athletic, exhibition, and convention services.

Applicant Manager Reedstrom was one of four persons in the community to testify at a House Sub-Committee hearing (Public Works) in Washington, D. C., this past October in support of the Sioux City, Iowa, to Yankton, S. D., Navigation proposal. The project passed the full House, but was deleted in a House-Senate Conference Committee. Applicant will continue interest of the Community in this vital economic growth potential project. With Environmental interest in opposition, such views will also be presented.

Matters on a State level to be presented are views on need for equitable State Income Tax. (South Dakota Broadcasters contributed \$500.00 for such a study)...views on Board of Regents Controversial plan to reorganize Higher Education in the State...Highway, Parks and Recreational development needs and policies. Legislatures Sessions are annual in South Dakota and are covered by Applicant station by direct broadcast reports, newswire, and personal interview.

National and International matters are presented over the Mutual Network, and through interviews with dignitaries and broadcasts of their talks, when available, as they visit the college campuses or make other appearances in the area. Applicant will continue the opportunity to present such interviews and talks.

Most of the needs and interests of the Public will be served through news reports, interviews, and discussion programs. However, Applicant has increased frequency of Editorials. Applicant has received many favorable comments on its editorial material and finds it an effective way to introduce problems and needs to the community. Applicant desires to point out that of the composite week selected by the Commission, a review of the logs indicates a loss of 1 hour and 18 minutes Public Affairs time through no fault of the Applicant.

A Toastmasters Club live discussion program was not broadcast due to a lack of panel members on Monday, May 25, 1970. 30 minutes lost.

The Announcer missed recording the Mutual program, Northwestern Reviewing Stand, for playback on Monday, May 25, 1970. 24 minutes lost.

The Announcer indicated on Tuesday, January 6, 1970, that the Mutual program, Labor News Conference, recorded for playback had been inadvertently erased.

If these programs had been performed as logged the percentage of time devoted to Public Affairs by the Applicant would have more nearly approached the time proposed at last renewal.

The time devoted to Public Affairs would have indicated over 9 hours and 22 minutes, or 7.4% of total time on the air.

Applicant reviewed the month of May 1970 as to Public Affairs time broadcast, which bears out the above for comparison.

Total Public Affairs time broadcast in May 1970 was 41 hours and 15 minutes, or 7.6% of total time on the air.

A programming change by the Mutual Network during the past renewal period was a handicap to the Applicant. Mutual dropped a daily Public Affairs program scheduled by the Applicant, "Capitol Assignment." This was a loss of 2 hours and 5 minutes. Mutual dropped another program regularly scheduled by the Applicant, "Reporters Roundup." A loss of 25 minutes. The sickness of Senator Mundt resulted in the loss of his report scheduled on a regular weekly basis. Currently on the air is a series of five minute programs produced from a drug seminar held by the Governor of S. Dak. conducted by Art Linkletter.

There have been many programs of coverage of Springfield, S. Dak., Centennial; Tabor, S. Dak. Czech Days; Ground Breaking and subsequent Dedication of new Yankton Historical Society Museum; Welcome Home to YHS Basketball team from State Tourney; Dedication of new County Ambulance.

Interviews of Public Interest have been broadcast on topics of Senior Citizens, Jobs Daughters, Minnesota Twins Baseball Clinic sponsored by this station, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Swim team, Police, Mayor, Government officials of all levels, United Fund, Heart Fund, Community Concert Series, etc.

In 1969 an open forum with Yankton and Clay County legislators was held with listeners calling in questions. A Coroners inquest into a death due to drugs was broadcast. 1½ hours long.

Presidential news conferences are broadcast. Congressional reports from the States Congressional delegations are carried from both South Dakota and Nebraska.

EXHIBIT NINE

Applicants news staff consists of one reporter, full time, and the on-duty announcer, plus the Manager of the station, who serves in a meaningful news capacity.

The reporter gathers and writes news primarily through telephone calls to regular news sources on a daily schedule. This reporter, now with six years news experience, frequently covers assigned stories, interviews visiting dignitaries, and on the scene news developments.

The Manager personally covers City Commission, School Board, and County Board meetings. The manager does most of the on the scene reporting of fires, accidents, and news-worthy events. When the manager is not available an announcer is often assigned to report.

The on-duty announcer is responsible for news calls to designated sources when the reporter is off duty.

The Applicant maintains a Mobile-Remote Unit for on the spot coverage of news and Public Affairs events.

Applicant subscribes to several area newspapers and is a member of the Associated Press News Wire Service.

Applicant enjoys a fine relationship with all the Law Enforcement people in the area and the co-operation of the local newspaper, The Press and Dakotan.

News stringers have been used in area towns, but are continually in a state of change.

Applicant has established a weekly remote broadcast for news items and Public Affairs interviews from the Hartington, Nebraska town and area. The program is conducted by Mrs. Joan Burney. She is well qualified and does an excellent job. Talent such as hers is not available in most area towns. If it were the applicant would consider more such programs.

Applicant believes local coverage of news to be most important to keep the public informed of local events and issues. Applicant is proud of its reputation in the community in this regard.

- B. During the composite week, Applicant broadcast 7 hours 15 minutes time devoted to local and regional news for 44%. This percentage is out of proportion due to 14 hours and 36 minutes of the week was devoted to coverage of Sports Events. National and International newscasts, which would normally increase the hours devoted to all news, were not broadcast because of time devoted to baseball, football and/or basketball. Also, 1 hour and 45 minutes devoted to Sports News and Scores is not included in the total time devoted to News.

EXHIBIT 10

The Composite Week selected by the Commission was unusual for this station as there was more time programmed for Sports Events than is normally scheduled. Eight games were scheduled for six days, a total of 14 hours and 36 minutes. Time regularly scheduled for Public Affairs, News, Other programs and Public Service Announcements, is lost under such circumstances.

To complicate the lack of available time for Public Affairs, News, Other programs and Public Service Announcements, when such programming is logged on days of Sports Events, is the loss of such programs because of operator error, or other eventuality through no fault of the Applicant.

One hour 18 minutes of scheduled Public Affairs during the composite week was not broadcast through no fault of the Licensee. If these programs had been aired, Applicant would more nearly approached proposed Public Affairs percentage. Applicant proposed 8% and 7.4% would be indicated had not the scheduled programs been lost for one reason or another.

Scheduled Public Affairs lost:

Toastmasters Meet Monday, May 25, 1970--not aired due to lack of panel to conduct program.

Reviewing Stand Monday, May 25, 1970--normally carried live from Mutual, due to Sports Event, scheduled to be recorded and later playback. Announcer missed recording program.

Labour News Tuesday, January 6, 1970--recorded for playback, inadvertently erased according to announcer on duty.

Jean Burney Helle Hartington Wednesday, April 29, 1970--remote broadcast not aired because of no broadcast loop.

Had these programs been broadcast as scheduled Applicant Public Affairs time would have indicated over 9 hours 22 minutes, which would have approached the 10 hours 30 minutes proposed.

The composite week indicates 16 hours 23 minutes time devoted to News. Over 3 hours news time was displaced by Sports Events. Had the normal time been devoted to News it would have totaled nearly 20 hours. Less than proposed, but Network programming of less time to News is partly responsible for the station indicating less time devoted to News. This less is in National and International News as station Local and Regional coverage remains approximately the same.

Sports Scores and Sports News is not reflected in News or Other Programs. Applicant broadcast 1 hour and 45 minutes of time devoted to this type of information of vital interest to a large number of people. Applicant believes such programming should be considered in the public interest as News or Other programs.

Sports Events also displace Public Service Announcements in the composite week although 145 were indicated. PSA's aired in Mutual Sustaining News-casts were not counted, but would approximate an additional 15 for a total 160. Applicant did not include those carried on Mutual's Off We Go program, or Mutual's Public Affairs programs.

The composite week does not reflect the warning coverage during Tornado Alert, Fire Calls, Cancellation and School Notices in severe storms in winter, Lewis and Clark Lake conditions and warnings to boaters.

EXHIBIT 11

There has been no change in Applicant's programming policy or practices since last renewal.

There has been a change in the Mutual Network Newscasts which has not been compensated for by the station, resulting in a drop in the amount of news broadcast by the station. This is National and International coverage.

Applicant believes, in review of the situation, that 24 hours 37 minutes previously proposed and actually performed during previous license period to be excessive and not in the interest of good programming--or the listener public interest.

Another Mutual Network change which worked a hardship on the Applicant was the network cancellation of Public Affairs programs, Capitol Assignment and Reporters Roundup. This resulted in a loss of over two hours per week of Public Affairs programming which the station was not able to replace with other Public Affairs programs.

Another fifteen minutes Public Affairs time was lost weekly due to the illness of South Dakota Senator Carl Mundt, whose program was aired by the station.

The loss of these programs significantly affected the attempt of this station to perform fully the representation indicated in the Applicants last renewal.

Had these programs been continued the representations would have been exceeded.

Applicant has determined to be more selective in broadcasting Public Service Announcements. There is a judgment decision to be made in the nature of what is, or may not be, a PSA. For example: American Medical Association, Optometric Association, Bar Association, all well known, but engaged in Commercial enterprise....though broadcast free, are they not commercial promotion and ought to be paid? What does the small Broadcaster know about a far-away Non-Profit (?) Organization seeking public service time for one thing and another?

As mentioned in previous exhibits, Sports Events have also affected overall programming. Applicant has always disregarded Sports in determining programming practices. The reason for this has been that it is not known from one year to the next whether the station would be contracted to carry Twins baseball games. When the games are secured the station has not compensated for the loss of Public Affairs and News time and PSA's.

EXHIBIT 12

Applicants news staff consists of one full-time reporter, the on-duty announcer, plus the Manager of the station, who serves in a meaningful news capacity.

The reporter has several years newspaper writing experience and has taught school for several years. She is Helen Light. Her duties consist of gathering, writing, and producing news programs and Public Affairs programs. She also does on the air reporting and interviewing.

Manager Reedstrom does considerable news gathering and writing. He personally attends City, School and County board meetings and notable events in the city and area. He is also responsible for most of the live coverage broadcasts of fire and accident news. He also is responsible for most of the special events broadcasts and often conducts Public Affairs programs.

KYNT is a member of the Associated Press and subscribes to area newspapers.

A live broadcast weekly from an area town, Hartington, Nebraska, will be continued. The program consists of news and interviews of Public Affairs nature conducted by Joan Burney who resides in that community.

KYNT uses a specially rigged bus in the coverage of mobile-remote broadcasts. This unit equipped with sound equipment is also in demand at many special outdoor events.

Announcers will continue their news duties with their shifts when the regular reporter is off-duty. They have a schedule of news calls to make by telephone.

Applicant will continue the approximate 30% local and regional news balance. In the composite week this percentage is reflected higher due to the National and International Mutual Newscasts missed in the week due to coverage of sports play-by-play events.

Applicant realizes the importance of reliable news coverage, fair and impartial reporting, and news leadership in the Community.



EXHIBIT 15

Applicant has stated in previous license renewal applications his belief the composite week is an indicator of what a radio station is attempting in its programming, but not a complete picture of what a station has actually accomplished during a 52-week period. It does not reflect the many "off the air" activities of its staff, reputation in the community, or Public Service performed other than Broadcasting. It is realized that the composite week is the Commission's main guide.

Applicant desires the Commission be aware of the broad scope of activities a radio station engages in a community.

Members of the KYNT staff are often called upon to participate as Master of Ceremonies or speak at community functions. They often serve in various capacities on Civic committees, Judges for 4H activities, school parades and other contests. The KYNT Mobile Remote Pickup Sound truck is requested by many groups and organizations for various functions and usually provided at no charge. Many of the above mentioned activities are not always broadcast for one reason or another and do not then appear in the composite week. Never-the-less, the station has participated in and performed a Public Service.

The new studios into which KYNT moved in January of 1969 has a large Community room with seating capacity of almost 100 people. This room is available to groups of all kinds for meeting purposes and is in great demand. The room was not necessary to the broadcast operation of the station, but was still provided at considerable expense to the licensee because the applicant felt such a room was needed to provide additional meeting space for the community. This is another Public Service which does not appear in an evaluation of a composite week.

Since the last renewal period the Commission in its wisdom allowed use of qualified operators for a pre-test period. This is commendable and a definite advantage to a small station. However, a shortage of Production people in the industry still exists, creating problems for stations having personnel capable of creating and conducting more and better Public Affairs programs. Finding experienced people is difficult and training them is costly. Keeping them at salaries a small station can budget is also difficult.

Applicant believes automation would provide an opportunity for more effective use of staff members in performing duties and providing more time in planning and creating Public Affairs programs, if such small stations could be operated. Such operation would be more economical and allow operating expenses to be channeled in more productive ways of benefit to performing in the Public Interest. The licensee could do more public service activity with funds which could be saved in not having an operator handcuffed to attending a transmitter.

The Commission can be assured of KYNT continuing to operate in the Public Interest upon renewal of this application.

In the past year KYNT has been effective participant in raising funds for two kidney transplant patients in the area; Mrs. Jean Lake, Gayville; and 17 year old Marilyn Zurcher, Crofton, Nebraska. KYNT was also instrumental in an appeal for funds to send a Yankton man, Jack Steinbeck to Switzerland for delicate brain surgery. The station has also helped in appeals for victims of home fires and other emergencies.

EXHIBIT 16

STATEMENT OF EXPLANATION
CONCERNING
EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

Radio station KYNT is located in an area where the relevant minorities are represented in such insignificant numbers that a program would not be meaningful.

Although this station does not presently have an employee of the relevant minorities outlined in Part 1, Section VI, neither do we discriminate against hiring qualified, and/or qualifiable minorities. This station has in the past employed Negroes and an American Indian.

There are two Colleges in Yankton and a Senior High School. When in need of help to fill various jobs we often contact these schools for assistance. We are nondiscriminatory in recruiting, selection, hiring, placement and promotion. We have a record of training young people for employment without regard to race, creed or color.

An Equal Employment Opportunity Program is not meaningful for this station. However, due to the large American Indian population in other parts of our State we are cooperating with our state broadcasters in setting up, through the Association, one or more scholarships for training American Indians in the broadcast field. This action was initiated while a licensee of this station, Lloyd G. Reedstrom, was President of the South Dakota State Broadcasters Association.

Since writing the above explanation a substantial Scholarship has been set up at a State College, near an Indian area, that has a course in Broadcast engineering. Through agreement with that college, Southern State College, and its President, Allan R. Millar, a \$500.00 Scholarship fund is at the command of the college: "to assist people of Indian heritage in their quest for training and a career in Broadcast engineering...The college is requested to advise the South Dakota Broadcasters Association of students of Indian heritage that might be employable by members of the Association prior to the students completion of studies, and the Association will cooperate with the placement services of the college in employment of such students".



AGREEMENT made this 24th day of November, 19 72, between Mutual Reports, Inc. ("MRI") and Leon T. Scobolic & Lloyd G. Reedstrom ("Broadcaster") the owner and operator of Station KYNT located at Yankton, South Dakota ("Station").

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. MRI PROGRAMS:** MRI will furnish to Broadcaster and Broadcaster will broadcast on Station the MRI program(s) designated in the Addendum(s) attached hereto on the terms and conditions therein set forth. MRI will also from time to time hereafter offer to Broadcaster other MRI programs for broadcast on Station on specified terms and conditions subject to acceptance by Broadcaster, each such arrangement to be reflected in another Addendum to this contract. The following will apply to each MRI program covered by an Addendum to this contract.
- 2. LIVE BROADCASTS OF AGREED PROGRAMS ONLY:** It is of the essence of these arrangements (a) that Broadcaster will carry on Station each MRI program offered to and accepted by it once only on a live basis when transmitted by MRI and that there be no delayed broadcast of any MRI program without MRI's prior consent, and (b) that Broadcaster's rights are only with respect to those MRI programs offered to and accepted by it and that Broadcaster shall in no event carry any other MRI programs which may be transmitted on the program lines.
- 3. FCC RULES:** Nothing in this relationship shall be construed to prevent or hinder Broadcaster (a) from rejecting or refusing any MRI program which Broadcaster reasonably believes to be unsatisfactory or unsuitable, or (b) with respect to programs so offered or accepted, from refusing or rejecting any program which in its opinion, is contrary to the public interest, or from substituting a program of outstanding local or national importance.
- 4. PROOF OF BROADCASTING:** Immediately after the end of each calendar month during which Station shall carry any MRI programs, Broadcaster will furnish to MRI, on forms provided by MRI, complete and accurate executed reports by Broadcaster setting forth proof of the broadcasting of said programs on Station during such month.
- 5. FORCE MAJEURE, APPROPRIATIONS:** Neither party will have any liability with respect to any MRI program if performance by such party shall be prevented, interfered with or omitted because of a labor dispute, failure

f facilities, Acto of God, government or court action, or any other similar
r dissimilar cause beyond the control of the party so failing to per-
orm. MRI may substitute a program which it deems of public importance
or any scheduled MRI program.

MISCELLANEOUS: Any question as to the validity, construction or per-
ormance of this contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of

MRI grants Broadcaster the right to broadcast on Station and Broadcaster will broadcast on Station on the terms hereinafter set forth, "the MRI Broadcast" of the 1972 Orange Blossom Classic which is scheduled to take place in Florida's Orange Bowl on December 2, 1972 beginning at 8:00 P.M. E.S.T.:

A. As hereinafter used, the term "the MRI Broadcast" refers to MRI's complete broadcast of the Game including the play-by-play description of the Game itself and the half-time program and which may also include, at MRI's option, a pre-game program and a wrap-up.

B. Broadcaster will carry live on Station, once only, the MRI Broadcast of the Game precisely as fed by MRI from commencement to conclusion, including, without limitation, all commercial announcements for network advertisers and all other announcements therein contained. If Station is an AM station, MRI may place any MRI Broadcast on any FM station in Station's market area; and if Station is an FM station, MRI may place any MRI Broadcast on any AM station in Station's market area.

C. MRI will authorize the telephone company to release the MRI Broadcast of the Game to Broadcaster, but Broadcaster will pay all charges for the local loop and connection to interconnect the Station with the MRI program transmission line.

D. MRI and Station will have announcement time in the MRI Broadcast as follows: Station will have nine (9) 60-second announcements in the MRI Broadcast and MRI will have fifteen (15) 60-second announcements therein. All announcements will be at such points in the MRI Broadcast as designated by MRI. MRI will give Broadcaster notice of MRI network advertisers in the MRI Broadcast as they are sold. Broadcaster may not sell any of its announcement time in the MRI Broadcast for the advertising of any product or service competitive with any product or service to be advertised in such broadcast for any MRI network advertiser. It is understood also that the MRI Broadcast may not be sponsored locally by any alcoholic beverage, drug or feminine hygiene products, nor may it contain any political advertisements nor

announcements for any political causes. MRI's network advertisers and Station's local advertisers will share opening and closing billboards in the MRI broadcast.

E. Broadcaster, in any advertising or promotion released by it in connection with the MRI Broadcast of the Game, will provide identification credit to the Mutual Black Network as the entity furnishing the game.





Your request is appreciated in that it serves to clarify Question 26, Section IV-A, of the license renewal.

We endeavor at KYNT to remain under the 18 minute ceiling, and find it little problem as the enclosed composite week commercial analysis indicates. Exceeding the ceiling, however infrequent, does occur, and therefore we stated the 20 minute exception in our renewal.

Rather than stipulate the very low percentage of time which KYNT may exceed the 18 minute ceiling, as indicated by the past composite week, we should like to amend our proposed commercial practices to specify:

Normal commercial content of 18 minutes in each hour with specified exceptions (Thursday-Friday schedules, for example) permitting up to 20 minutes in each hour during no more than 10% of the total weekly hours of operation.

We are also enclosing for the record a copy of a letter dated December 28, 1970, from the NAB Code Authority indicating KYNT's compliance with the broadcast code in a review of our logs as outlined.

Thank you for the opportunity to amend our license renewal (File No. BR-3102).
