WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC has designated for hearing the license renewal application of WXBM-FM, Milton, FL. The inquiry follows denial petitions filed by the National Black Media Coalition (NBMC) and the NAACP. Subsequently, NBMC withdrew its petition, and the NAACP and WXBM-FM filed a Settlement Agreement conditioned on the FCC's grant of the renewal. According to the FCC, the issues in question include WXBM's lack of compliance with affirmative action provisions (EEO) under Section 73.2080 of the FCC's rules, whether WXBM made "misrepresentations of fact" regarding EEO in its license renewal application, and whether such failures were inadvertent or intentionally discriminatory.

In an uncommon occurrence Darrell Spann's WSVE, Jacksonville, FL has had its application for renewal dismissed. Spiecom Broadcasting, Inc. had filed and later requested dismissal of its competing application for 1280 KHz in Jacksonville. The FCC in granting the Spiecom petition for dismissal with prejudice went on to dismiss the renewal application for failure to prosecute. Word from WSVE is that they plan to appeal the decision.

The pirate station shutdown of the week is appropriately located in Pennsylvania. Mark Radeckie of Erie was fined \$1,000 by the FCC for illegally operating his rock station on 7415 kHz, a frequency allocated to the International Fixed Public Radio Service.

In a change from its strong advocacy of the Eureka/147 system, the NAB's DAB Task Force considered in-band technologies in a recent meeting, hosting DAB presentations from four in-band proponents. The proponents were: American Digital Radio, Mercury Digital Communications, Project Acorn/USA Digital Radio, and Stanford Telecommunications. The NAB is now encouraging demonstrations "of all DAB technologies" at the upcoming Radio 1991 convention in San Francisco and Radio Montreux.

The NAB has requested that the FCC grant an "entrepreneur's preference" to existing radio broadcasters who locate vacant frequencies in their local markets and wish to start up new stations. In particular, the NAB feels the policy would reward the "sweat equity" of an existing AM station wanting to add an FM to a market by giving it preference over outside applicants who have the advantage of the FCC's comparative hearing policy. The NAB emphasized that the proposed preference would be a "weighted factor" for a station, not an "automatic ticket" for a new license.

In another statement to the FCC, the NAB is advocating enlarging the current 12 AM and 12 FM station ownership limits in order to compete for advertising revenue against other media outlets such as cable television, magazines, and newspapers in a struggling economy. The NAB said that expanding the ownership limits will help financially troubled stations by giving them necessary resources to help management and programming. **M Street:** While we see no problem with increasing current ownership limits, we find it hard to believe that this will have an impact, considering that 65% of U.S. stations are owned by individuals with stand alone or a single AM/FM combo. It should also be noted that virtually no one is at the 12-12-12 limit.

ELSEWHERE

Oldies has overtaken CHR as the the third most popular commercial format. In our most recent survey CHR dropped from down to 688 stations while Oldies move up to 689. The top-10 now reads: 1) Country 2,438 2) AC 1,803 3) Oldies 696 4) CHR 688 5) News, talk, business 522 6) Religion 442 7) Standards 406 8) Gospel 340 9) Rock 339 10) Spanish 319.

The results are in from Arbitron's recent mail-in ballot. Sixty percent of responding subscribers have rejected the proposed three survey system by a margin of 499 votes to 333. Thus far, 832 of 1270 ballots have been returned. Despite the negative response, Arbitron Vice President Jay Guyther said, "This vote does not close the book on Arbitron's efforts to find a way to increase sample sizes

for our customers. We will continue to discuss with the [Advisory] Council and with our station and agency clients other options to address this issue." Support for the plan came from only two formats: Black and Spanish.

The 35 Plus Committee, which advocated the importance of the 35-64 demographic, has disbanded due to a lack of funds. Among the group's accomplishments were the addition of the 35-64 demo in the rating books and the administration of several seminars at NAB and RAB conventions. In a letter to 35 Plus members Dorf said, "We contacted everyone we knew who might be interested in seeing the 35 PLUS COMMITTEE continue and grow. Many of them responded, but far too few to form a financial base for future activity." **M Street:** It is sad to see the committee end. This issue needs to be addressed. We hope someone comes along soon to take up the fight.

In what may be the first program of its kind, Business Radio Network (BRN) is allowing its affiliate stations to sell national advertising spots on the network. Mike Morgan, BRN's director of national advertising, said, "BRN affiliates have asked for [the program] and are welcoming it with open arms. This program will give every affiliate an opportunity for additional income, without using their local avails." BRN, which features business, financial and consumer news and information, presently has 83 affiliate stations in the U.S., Mexico, the Caribbean, and Puerto Rico. **M Street:** It sounds good to us. The more people on the street, the better.

After a lengthy battle, Americom Radio Brokers, Inc. has reached settlement on the shareholders suit filed by former partner William Steding. In his lawsuit, Steding had alleged that Americom co-owners Tom and Daniel Gammon had appropriated company funds for themselves without his knowledge. According to Americom president Daniel Gammon, Steding's settlement was equivalent to the cash value of his 15% ownership in the company.

And in this week's battle of the consultant press releases, Atlanta-based Burkhardt/Douglas & Associates announced that in a "unique agreement" they will pay L.A.'s KLOS "an undisclosed amount" for every tenth of a share the station moves above its 4.5 showing in the Spring Arbitron. WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC has issued its first variable "grid card" fine schedule, implementing a 1989 law passed by Congress. The schedule lists base amounts ranging from \$2,500 for failure to maintain records to \$20,000 for misrepresentation or lack of candor. According to the Commission, these base amounts can be adjusted upward, based on various criteria such as egregious misconduct (an additional 50-90%), intentional violations (50-90%), or causing substantial harm (40-70%). In addition to higher adjustments, the FCC may reduce fines by certain percentages depending on factors such as voluntary disclosure or a station's history of overall compliance. Under the new schedule, the maximum fine that could be imposed would be \$25,000 per violation, or per day of a continuing violation up to \$250,000. These figures are up from the pre-1989 maximum fines of \$2,000 and \$20,000, respectively. See the chart on the last page.

The Commission has upheld its decision revoking the license of Williamsburg County Broadcasting Corp. (WCBC) for WKSP (AM) in Kingstree, SC. WCBC's chief stockholder, Gregory Knop, was convicted in federal court of two felonies--cocaine possession with intent to distribute and conspiracy to commit that offense, and was sentenced to five years imprisonment. In addition, Knop admitted to lying to a sentencing judge and bribing a policeman. While WCBC took exception to the FCC's initial decision, the Commission deemed them unqualified as a licensee.

In a separate battle in the FCC war on drugs, the Commission ordered NewSouth Broadcasting, Inc., and Timothy S. Brumlik to show cause why their license for WFXL(TV), Albany GA, and construction permits for four low power television stations should not be revoked. The Commission also denied Brumlik's request to transfer the license and permits under the FCC's Minority Distress Sale Policy. Brumlik was sentenced to four years imprisonment and fined \$75,000 for laundering drug money.

Efrain Archilla-Diaz has been granted a new FM station in Naguabo, Puerto Rico after the FCC upheld the Review Board's decision denying three competing applicants: Naguabo Broadcasting Co., Reyes Ruiz Rivera, and Hector Negróni Cartegena. In its initial decision, the Board found that Ruiz had failed to obtain a waiver of the minimum spacing rule. The FCC later found that the Board erred in denying Ruiz's waiver when it incorrectly computed distances for Ruiz's site. Despite the Board's error, the FCC agreed that Archilla-Diaz was the most qualified applicant, based on factors such as local residency, civic participation, and broadcast experience.

The FCC is granting a proposal from the Primary Entry Point Advisory Council (PEPAC) for a test of the NOAA National Weather Service Weather Radio Specific Area Message Encoder (WRSAME) and the Emergency Broadcast System (EBS) two-tone Attention Signal. Experiments will be conducted by broadcasting the WRSAME tones sequentially, alone and simultaneously with the EBS tones over AM stations KCMO, Kansas City, and WBAP, Fort Worth, TX. These experiments will be performed to help determine enhancements to the EBS signaling system, with a report of the findings going to the FCC. The Commission invites other EBS test proposals in response to its June 13, 1991, Notice of Inquiry, including those submitted beyond the closing date of December 31, 1991.

The Commission has affirmed a decision by the Mass Media Bureau to dismiss four commercial FM station applications with facsimile signatures. The Commission adopted a "hard look" approach in an effort to reduce the large volume of carelessly prepared, abusive, and speculative FM applications being received. In a separate "hard look" dismissal the Commission affirmed a decision by the Mass Media Bureau which dismissed the application of RDH Communications, LP for a missing certification page in the application's financial section.

Johnson Enterprises, Inc. licensee of KLEY, Wellington KS, was granted a waiver of the duopoly rule allowing it to purchase KVFU, Winfield KS. The stations have a small overlap of service contours. KVFU is silent and has been unable to find a buyer.

A Review Board Action dismissing the application of Prater & Durham for a new FM station at Vinton VA was upheld by the Commission. The Commission rejected P&D's contention that failings by its counsel should mitigate against dismissal. The Commission said it has held that counsel is the applicant's agent when appearing before the Commission and applicants are therefore bound by counsel's action.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (Cont'd)

The Commission has renewed the applications of KARN, Little Rock AR; KOLL-FM, Pine Bluff AR; KIXX-FM, El Dorado AR denying objections to the renewals by the NAACP and the National Black Media Coalition. KOLL-FM and KIXX-FM had conditions placed on their renewals and were fined \$2,000 for inadequate record keeping of job applicants in order to do self-assessment.

In other various actions the Commission: reinstated the application of Seaside Wireless, Ltd. in the matter of a construction permit for a new FM station on 103.9 MHz in Seaside CA; stayed pending further motion in the new FM proceeding for 107.1 MHz at Castle Rock WA establishing a July 23 to August 22 filing window; denied a petition by Garden state Broadcasting LP for investigation into possible violations of FCC rules by a Commission employee; upheld the Review Board's decision to grant Horace Perkins application for a new FM station on 107.5 MHz at Columbus OH and dismissed the petition for reconsideration filed by Mid-Ohio radio Limited.

DeDe Ferrell of Houston has been named the NAB's manager of House government relations. Ferrell will serve as part of a three-person House lobbying team focusing on several issues, including cable reregulation, performer's royalty rights, and spectrum taxes.

The NAB, in conjunction with the Electronic Industries Association (EIA), has announced a campaign to generate consumer interest in new high-quality AM receivers. The receivers, which will bear an AMAX or AMAX Stereo certification mark, feature improved sound with static reduction, as well as a better sounding AM stereo, which will approximate the sound quality of FM Stereo, according to the NAB. The AMAX promotion will be unveiled at Radio 1991 next month and will go nationwide in October, with spots pledged to run on over 1,100 AM stations.

ELSEWHERE

The Radio Advertising Bureau (RAB) reports that radio revenue for June is down 6.0% in comparison to June 1990. The figures are based on a 7.2% drop in local revenue and a 2.3% decrease in national revenue. The combined national and local year-to-date revenue growth is down 3.9% from last year.

Birch Scarborough has agreed to a monetary settlement of its lawsuit against Bell Broadcasting Company of Detroit (owners of WJZZ) for Bell's alleged copyright infringement and misappropriation of trade secrets. Though it would not disclose the amount of the settlement, Birch said as part of the agreement Bell will become a paid subscriber to the Scarborough Report. Birch Scarborough president Bill Livek urged station executives to caution their staff that "using unpurchased information can place their stations under tremendous, unnecessary financial and business hardships."

KJZY-FM, Dallas, is soliciting funds from its listeners to keep the financially struggling jazz station on the air. According to the Dallas Morning News, KJZY must raise \$150,000 for overhead and operating expenses. GM Jay Noble said that his 28 member staff responded well to the situation, "even though they knew they would be working without a paycheck." The station, which is Dallas-Fort Worth's only full-service jazz outlet, is calling its fund raising campaign "Operation Jazzy" and is offering incentives to contributors such as baseball caps, T-Shirts, and CDs. Previous station owner Denton FM Limited had trouble keeping the jazz format afloat and sold KJZY after one year to the present licensee, Broadcast House of Texas, in 1989. **M Street** hint: Try it without 28 people on staff.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

According to figures from the NAB's 1991 Radio Financial Report, FM standalones showed a slight decline in net revenue of 0.9% in the period from 1987-1990. Full-time AMs averaged a revenue decrease of 9.5%, while AM/FM combos showed the only increase with 2.1 percent. Over half of all AM and FM stations lost money in 1990. Full-time AMs lost \$11,000; FMs lost \$15,715; AM-FM combos lost \$10,165; and AM daytimers lost \$8,461. A copy of the full report is available from the NAB.

The NAB has announced its fall seminar "Positioning for the 1990s: Investment Opportunities in Western Europe" which will begin in London, September 22-24 and continue in Paris, September 25-27. Among the topics to be covered are: foreign ownership, regulatory overviews, banking and venture capital, market opportunities and advertising, and British, French and German media opportunities. CANADA THIS WEEK

The CRTC received submissions from 12 parties to its December, 1990, "Radio Market Criteria" proposal, which gave a set of criteria that the public and the Commission can use to determine at an early stage the capacity of markets to support new commercial stations. The proposal also detailed a revised CRTC procedure for handling applications, incorporating the new criteria and other measures. Acting CRTC Chairman David Colville said issuing the criteria was "especially important now as Canada's radio industry experiences serious economic difficulties, with many stations either losing money or earning marginal profits."

Under the proposal, three tests are given to markets when an application is made: 1) Group Profitability - in which the Commission determines the average profitability before interest and taxes of all commercial stations in the market over the preceding 5 years. 2) Individual Profitability - The Commission will examine the number of instances in which individual stations in the market were profitable over the preceding 5 years. 3) Revenue Growth - the CRTC will examine growth of total advertising revenues within the market. Markets not demonstrating profitability or revenue growth are deemed to have failed these tests. Financial market data will be made public and updated annually.

Most of the submissions supported using profitability and revenue growth tests of the market, while others questioned the use of data from licensees who might deliberately or inadvertently issue false information. To prevent distortions or false information, the CRTC will require that licensees submit with their data a related financial statement audited by an outside party. The Commission also emphasized that while information might be distorted, the market test is the first step in the application process, which will include a more in-depth examination of the market performed by an independent expert.

CANADA THIS WEEK (Cont'd)

The revised procedure for consideration of new applications wishing to enter into a market are as follows:

1. An application for a conventional AM or FM undertaking is received.
2. Through correspondence with the applicant, the CRTC ensures that the application is complete.
3. Following receipt of a complete application, the CRTC will commission an independent study to more fully investigate the capacity of the market to support an additional station.
4. The findings of the study will be made available to the applicant following its completion. The applicant must then decide whether to proceed with the application, based on the results of the study, and the Commission's criteria, as mentioned above.
5. If the applicant decides to proceed, the study will be made public; a call for applications from other interested parties may be issued; and all complete applications will be considered at a public hearing. If the applicant decides not to proceed, the process will be terminated and the application will be returned.
6. The study will be placed on the public record.

After the shutdown last year of the CKO all-news service, the CRTC solicited public comment on future use of the former CKO frequencies, which will be made available when the FM freeze is lifted September 1, 1991. A majority of the 87 submissions were from public interest groups or the general public. The greatest number of submissions came from the Toronto area, where several respondents advocated the specific use of the 99.1 MHz frequency for an Urban format. The Urban enthusiasts didn't indicate suggestions for the other CKO frequencies. Other submissions suggested formats for a national service, including: all-news, senior citizens programming, ethnic/multi-cultural, and a network for Francophones outside Quebec. In addition, submissions were received proposing an alternative private commercial national service, a dance music network, and a youth-oriented service. The CRTC said it will consider all applications pertaining to one or more of the available frequencies when the FM freeze is lifted in September.

ELSEWHERE

In a meeting last week, the Arbitron Radio Advisory Council passed two resolutions pertaining to increasing sample sizes without added expense to subscribers. The first resolution requested that Arbitron increase its target sample in the Fall 1992 report by a total of 15% over the Fall 1989 report, after 5% increases each in the Fall 1990 and Fall 1991 reports. The second resolution concerned alternatives to the recently rejected three-survey proposal that would save costs, enabling Arbitron to increase sample size without charging subscribers. The Council's primary cost-saving proposal is the elimination or reduction of Arbitron's printed market reports in favor of electronic data delivery. Arbitron V.P. Jay Guyther said both resolutions will be addressed at the Council's December 1991 meeting.

Three Boston market stations, WBOS, WFNX, and WCGY announced that they will combine their sales efforts under the name "The Boston Rock Network" to serve local advertisers. Each of the three will maintain its own sales department in addition to the network. One week subsequent to the agreement, WBOS was put up for sale by owner Ackerley Radio, whose president Alan Goodman initiated the new sales network.

Look for a new documentary about radio pioneers by "Civil War" creator Ken Burns on PBS television next January. The program, "Empire of the Air: The Men Who Made Radio" will feature profiles of pioneers David Sarnoff, Lee DeForest, and Edwin Armstrong.

Bonneville Broadcasting System will unveil its new "Adult-Progressive" format at NAB's Radio 1991 convention in September. The format is described as a blend of Soft AC vocals and Light Jazz instrumentals and is targeted at the 35-44 demographic. For more information call them at (800)631-1600.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Mass Media Bureau: dismissed the license renewal application of Radio Habersham, Inc., for AM station WLTA on 1500KHz at Clarkesville GA; dismissed the petition by Don R. Davis for reconsideration of the dismissal of his proposal to substitute 95.9 C3 for 95.9 A at Santa Rosa NM and his counterproposal to reallocate the channel from Santa Rosa to Tucumcari.

In various docket actions the Review Board: denied a joint petition for extraordinary relief, waiver and approval of settlement in the proceeding for a new FM station on 97.3 A at Homewood AL; denied Innovative Women's Media association's appeal of the dismissal of their application for a new FM station on 102.9 C2 at Shreveport LA; granted Robert C. Rickenbacker's request to intervene as a separate party in the proceeding for modification of WDIX's facilities at Yadkinville or a new AM station at Greensboro on WDIX's frequency.

The NAB has announced the members of its Future of Broadcasting radio and television committees, which will convene at an industry summit during the NAB 1992 convention next April. The radio and television committees will be chaired by NewCity Communications President Richard Ferguson and Harte-Hanks Communications Senior Vice President Michael Conly, respectively. The committees will address long-term technology planning, public policy and business strategies at the NAB's January board meeting in addition to next spring's convention.

John Marino has been named the NAB's manager of technical and regulatory affairs in its Science and Technology Department. Marino is currently the president of Marino Broadcast Associates and was previously Vice President, Engineering, at NewCity Communications, in Connecticut. He will be responsible for technical and policy support of the NAB before the FCC and other federal agencies. The NAB is also adding Ken Springer as staff engineer, digital communications. He will assist with policy and technical development of digital audio and television systems.

CANADA THIS WEEK

CHUM, Ltd. has been granted a short term six month licence renewal for CHQM(AM) in Vancouver. CHUM purchased CHQM AM & FM last year and has been working to spin off the AM. CHUM already owns CFUN(AM) also in Vancouver.

ELSEWHERE

The Radio Advertising Bureau announced the selection of a new president and CEO. Gary R. Fries, currently president of the Unistar Radio Network, will assume the position in early October. Fries was chosen from a field of more than 50 candidates in a five month nationwide search. He succeeds Warren Potash, who announced his resignation earlier this year. The RAB has 3,000 member stations.

Two new services will be added next month to the Business Radio Network for broadcast on music and news-talk stations. BRN "Highlights" will feature three different updates each hour: "The Business Report," with business and market information; "The Business of Living," featuring consumer information; and "Travelers Weather," which will include airport delays along with nationwide forecasts. The second service, BRN "Forum", will package BRN's various talk and informational programs, including talk host Don McDonald's show, "The Ways and Means Committee."

In addition to the aforementioned new services, Business Radio Network will add the Sonny Bloch Show to its talk line-up starting September 9. BRN will broadcast Bloch's Sunday show live from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Eastern time, and will replay his weekday shows Tuesday through Saturday, from 2:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. Also in September, BRN is adding a new program called "Main Street," featuring

interactive talk on "the week's hottest topics" with host Al Malmberg. "Main Street" will air live on Saturdays from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. Eastern, with a replay on Sunday from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

In other Sonny Bloch news, the veteran financial talk host is the founding member of the new Independent Broadcasters Network (IBN), which is described as a cooperative network for radio talk show hosts. Under the network's policy, talk show hosts will syndicate themselves by paying for their time on the air, with commissions going to sales staff for any advertising sold on the show. Other programming slated for IBN will include Jack Anderson in his "first ever" one-hour daily call-in show, as well as shows on medical care, home repair, and a pet show with veterinarians; all featuring players to be named later.

For those of you already planning your Veteran's Day activities, NPR is offering its members a one-hour holiday tribute "Good Morning Vietnam" for broadcast November 8 and 11. The program will feature former Armed Forces Radio disk jockey Adrian Cronauer whose Vietnam broadcast career inspired the Robin Williams character in the 1987 movie of the same name. Cronauer, who is presently a lawyer, will play clips from his original 1966 program with 60s music, and will discuss the significance of disk jockeys, then and now, helping overseas soldiers during wartime by keeping them in touch with the music and trends from home.

Art Vuolo will be presenting his famous Video Air-Chex, at NAB Radio 1991 in San Francisco. The two-hour video featuring radio personalities from throughout the country, will be shown in two versions: uncut and uncensored over channel 18 at the Marriott Hotel, and edited for display at the Moscone Convention Center. Vuolo said, "NOTHING is being cut out of the hotel version," and he should know. Copies of the tape can be purchased for \$29.95 from Vuolo at the NAB, or by mail: Box 219, Ypsilanti, MI 48197.
