The Commission has affirmed a review board decision which granted the application of Johnson Broadcasting, Inc. for a new FM on 107.5 A in Roswell, GA. In so doing, the Commission denied the applications for review filed by Robert W. Rounsaville, Eathel Holley, Lowell Maze Jackson, Ivan Miles, Mazo Radio Co., Southern Radio Services, and Georgia Public Telecommunications Commission.

The grant of Orion Communications for a new FM in Biltmore Forest, NC was also reaffirmed this week.

Over the objections of Newsweb Corp., the Commission has consented to assign the licenses of KEZW/KOSI, Denver from D & D Broadcasting, Inc. to Tribune Denver Radio, Inc., granting a one-to-a-market rule waiver in the process. The apps were granted because Denver is the 21st ADI and the market has more than 30 signals. Newsweb is the permittee of KTVJ-TV in Boulder CO, and contended the waiver would "disserve the Commission's goals of promoting competition and diversity."

ELSEWHERE

First the industry thought it would. Then the industry thought it had backed off. Now Westwood One/Mutual has confirmed that Larry King will give up his longtime overnight shift and move to 3-6 p.m. eastern starting next February 1, three days after his 15th anniversary with the network. Longtime King backup host Jim Bohannon, will, as expected, assume King's overnight slot. The significance of the 3-6 time slot is that it prevents stations that carry both King and EFM's Rush Limbaugh from having to make a choice that might not have gone in King's favor judging from some of the people we spoke to last month. King in afternoons could easily be another coffin nail for full-service ACs, many of which had already made the move to N/T just on the strength of EFM, Daynet, etc .

Promising to reach the "rural and suburban gay and lesbian community that is often missed by traditional gay media," GM Clay Henderson has launched Denver-based "Superstation KGAY," a 24-hour gay-themed satellite network broadcasting on Galaxy 5 (channel 6, 6.30/6.48 Mhz) and Spacenet 3 (channel 22, 6.20/7.40 Mhz). For more info, call 303-733-6642.

Following an eight-month drop, national spot sales were up for the second month in a row during October according to new figures from the Radio Advertising Bureau. National revenue, up 2% in September, was up 3% for October. Added to a 6% gain in local sales, that brings combined revenue to +5% overall.

All regions of the country were up in local revenue with the southeast (11%) and southwest (12%) leading the way. The southwest also posted a 10% national rise, although the southeast was flat and the east was off 1%, the only region that was.

National revenue was still off 7% from the first 10 months of 1991 which, as you'll remember, wasn't so great either. Local revenue is up 4% over a similar period in '91; combined revenue is up 2% over the first 10 months of last year.

Meanwhile, the RAB has announced a series of discounts for next year's Managing Sales Conference, scheduled for Feb. 4-7 at Dallas' Lowes Anatole. Among them: \$365 members registration before 12/31 (vs. \$450 afterwards); a \$99-a-night room rate; coach airfare discounts on Delta and American for registrants and an extra 5% discount through World Travel (800-341-2014); and one free registration for parties of eight or more people. As for renting the golf cart to get from one end of the Anatole to the other, you're on your own.

Other items from the places to see, things to go, and people to do file: The Michigan Assn. of Broadcasters holds its 1993 Great Lakes Broadcasting Conference on Feb. 23-24 at the Lansing Radisson; call 517-484-7444. Jock seminar host Dan O'Day branches out with his first "PD Grad School," held Feb. 20-21 in Dallas. Speakers include Jacor's Randy Michaels, Bolton Research's Larry Rosin, and Burkhart/Douglas' Dwight Douglas. Call 310-476-8111.

And for those of you convinced that travelers' info stations would finally come into their own if they could just get off of AM 530, the first in-band TIS station has signed on, a National Park Service outlet on AM 690 in West Branch, Iowa, home of Herbert Hoover. Other upcoming TIS stations, made possible by a rule change last April, include a 1290 AM in Galveston, a 1480 near Erie, Pa., a 610 in Virginia Beach, and a 1250 in Burkburnett, Texas.

Childrens' Satellite Network flagship WWTC Minneapolis staged its first annual "Kidstock" concert on Nov. 7 featuring such luminaries as Bob McGrath, Tom Chapin, Craig (N' Company) Taubman, Ice Cube, Twisted Sister, GWAR, drag model Ru-Paul, comedians Woody Allen and Andrew Dice Clay, and Pat Benatar who closed with a rousing "Hell Is For Children." (Alright, the first three names were real, anyway, but the idea of Clay yelling "Hickory Dickory Dock" and the audience yelling back the real next lines is kind of amusing.) CSN hopes to stage similar concerts in its other markets

STERN TIMES, STERN MEASURES

(The following, by M Street associate editor Sean Ross, is the first in a series of essays by M Street's editors that will appear occasionally.)

So why did Americans vote for Bill Clinton? R&R, judging from a recent editorial, thinks it was to protect the First Amendment rights of Howard Stern. The unsigned piece calls the election a "mandate for change" at the FCC, specifically an end to the commission's indecency fines and the ever escalating campaign against Stern in particular.

R&R thinks voters "sent a clear message that the government, the religious right, and other watchdog groups have no right to monitor the personal choices of the American people--including the content of their favorite radio programs." It also castigates the FCC for "the convenient governmental theory that one complaint outweighs millions of satisfied listeners."

The more trivial contention here is the one that a vote for Clinton was a vote for an end to Al Sikes' indecency crusade. Civilians were probably voting their pocketbooks; if they were voting to uphold their personal freedoms, they were likely hoping to protect Roe v. Wade more than the Pacifica decision. And judging from the proximity of that great First Amendment crusader Tipper Gore to FCC policy these days, many civilians might be on Sikes' side anyway.

So were broadcasters voting thumbs down on the Sikes era? Well, Sikes certainly didn't give them the clear and reasonable guidelines on indecency that they deserved. But judging from the orgy of deregulation that took place from 1980-92, and especially from the new ownership guidelines, the Republicans gave broadcasters most of what they wanted, except a working economy. Even if broadcasters were thinking about the FCC when they went to the polls, there was little sign during the campaign that either candidate cared about them, especially judging from the Ron Brown/Rich Bond debate at this year's NAB convention where the word "broadcasting" was barely even tacked on to either party chairman's stump speech.

Trade magazines can be forgiven for a certain amount of self-absorption; the editors of Beverage Industry Weekly probably saw election '92 as a clarion call for something or other. Besides, I personally would be just as glad to see the capriciousness of the FCC indecency campaign end. I don't like Stern much, but I suppose I have to stand up for his First Amendment rights, just as one would for the Nazis' right to march through Skokie. Stern has, at worst, been only a small part of the vulgarization of American culture in recent years and this author, who derives part of his income from the sale of rap records, is ill entitled to bemoan that too much himself.

But has Stern has really been given any sort of mandate by "millions of satisfied listeners." If "Deep Throat" ran on prime time network TV, it too would probably find millions of satisfied viewers. That wouldn't have much bearing on whether it was indecent. And while 10% of New York's morning radio audience is formidable, it doesn't make Stern the prevailing community standard. The other 90% of the radios in New York are NOT tuned to Stern; Nobody has asked them, or the people who don't listen to any radio in the morning, whether they find Stern indecent.

Besides, the mandate probably isn't the listeners' to give at this point. Like it or not, the airwaves are still a public trust and the FCC still has their mandate to regulate them as they see fit--even if we agree that they might not be doing such a good job. It was never the assumption of most people that the day would come when you could say anything on TV or radio and not have to worry about it. That we've come so close is the biggest real surprise here.

Surely, some broadcasters must realize this. Five years after the indecency campaign started, you have to wonder which are truly victims of capricious persecution and which are just brazening it out. The first station to be fined for playing "Erotic City"--a record that many stations had played without incident for several years--came by its confusion honestly. The stations still playing it, and there are a bunch, have no such excuse. Stern had his warning shot across the bow years ago. Now the FCC, right or wrong, is merely doing what any policing body does when it gets ignored constantly. (Besides, the FCC has already decided this year to codify--through the new ownership rules--what broadcasters had already taken it upon themselves to do. The idea that radio might get away with it a second time is too much to expect.)

You also have to wonder at the audacity of Stern's parent company, Infinity, for asking that the FCC might decide to back off its anti-Stern actions, then give Stern a semi-exclusive franchise for what he does. Infinity has sought special dispensation for broadcasters without a significant teen audience and, amazingly, has been joined in this by the NAB and the three major networks, among others. This would, in effect, make off-color broadcasts a franchise for classic rock, AC, and oldies stations while denying them to CHR, country, and, most troublingly, many black broadcasters. That hardly seems like a ringing defense of every broadcaster's first amendment rights. It also contradicts radio folks' argument that all they want is equal treatment with TV--the right to talk about masturbation at length if Seinfeld can talk about masturbation.

Off-color broadcasting is a commodity. It isn't working for everybody who tries it--heard any top 40s saying "don't be a dickhead" lately?--but it has been a lucrative commodity for a lot of people. Most of Stern's affiliates had problems in morning drive before he came along, and Stern himself wasn't doing so great at WWWW Detroit, his last stop before he began pushing the envelope. While the FCC rattled its sabre, fining stations a few grand at a time, groups like Infinity and Evergreen made enough money to put themselves on the "have" side of the fence when the new rules began dividing the haves and the have-nots.

If Stern, Steve Dahl, and their cohorts have an inalienable right to be racy, so does every other program, including "Mrs. Bush's Story Time." Popularity isn't the key; one of the key tenets of First Amendment law is that it protects unpopular speech too. This, again, is why it's time for some consistent rules once Clinton's FCC to take shape, and why the FCC should be consistent about how it chooses to enforce them for both radio and TV.

Lest anybody come away with the opposite impression from all of this, I do care about the First Amendment and I worry a lot about what the Gore family might chose to do to it. If the FCC comes up with real rules, and they're something we can't live with, I'll be right alongside you and Howard Stern to protest them. That doesn't mean I have to be enthused about laying down a cover of protective fire while a few large broadcasters try to bully their way past the rules as they presently stand.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

FCC Chairman Al Sikes has made it official. Although his term doesn't end until June 30, 1993, Sikes will leave the FCC on January 19, leaving president-elect Bill Clinton to choose his own commission boss. Despite Sikes' announcement, the deadly game o' chicken continues between Infinity and the FCC with commissioner James Quello now saying that the Howard Stern fines against Infinity's New York, Washington, and Philadelphia stations might now go as high as \$900,000, \$25,000 for 12 days on three stations. That is, Quello says, if the FCC doesn't just send the whole thing to an administrative law judge. Or if it doesn't just hang fire until Sikes leaves. All of which speaks volumes about the job the FCC did in coming up with clear indecency guidelines in the first place. (For 25 extra bonus points: Is there safe harbor this week?)

The Cleveland Plain Dealer reports that the local NAACP and Southern Christian Leadership Conference chapters have filed a petition to deny against the quasi-duopoly sale of WJMO-AM-FM to WZAK's Lynn Tolliver and Bobby Rush (in conjunction with WZAK owner Xen Zapis). The petition claims that Tolliver and Rush are minority front-men whose sole purpose is to get Zapis a minority tax certificate. Tolliver and Rush call the petition a "personal peeve"; Tolliver, in particular, has had more than one run in with local community groups during his decade or so at WZAK.

The Commission zapped Zapis Communications' WAAF Worcester, MA \$4,000 for airing a conversation without informing the other party.

ELSEWHERE

Ready for the one-eyed, one-horned flying pocket people meter? Arbitron is promising to debut a pocket measurement device in two markets by 1984. The TV/radio "pocket people meter" would be worn by participants and would measure what is essentially an audio barcode transmitted by stations. Arbitron is joined in the venture by Canada's BBM Bureau of Broadcast Measurement and Australia's AGB McNair; they'll use technology developed by defense contractors Martin Marietta and Intellisys for anti-submarine warfare technology. (There were, at one time, rumors that Arbitron was looking at audio bar-coding, but for the purpose of doing airplay monitoring, not ratings.) Arbitron promises this will give customers their long sought after larger sample sizes for the same money; it doesn't yet have an answer on how the PPM will measure Walkman devices if their users have headphones on.

Arbitron's announcement comes on the heels of the surprise departure of longtime Arbitron president Rick Aurichio and his replacement by Steve Morris, the president/GM of General Foods' Maxwell House division. Morris, incidentally, does have a background in audio bar-coding, having headed the commercial tracking firm Vid-Code. Meanwhile, WIL St. Louis GM Dick Williams is the new chairman and KGO San Francisco GM Mickey Luckoff is the new vice-chairman for Arbitron's Radio Advisory Council. Radio Advertising Bureau president Gary Fries has been appointed to an at-large seat. Other new members are WFOX Atlanta GM Eddie Esserman, Saga Exec. VP Steve Goldstein, WKBN Youngstown GM Bill Kelly, WAQI Miami GM Carl Palmer, and WLWQ Columbus, Ohio GM Tom Thon.

Lots of network sales change to report this week. T.J. Lambert is leaving the Senior VP post at Jones Satellite Network, replaced by SMN veteran Roy Simpson. Jim Higgins is upped from Sr. VP/New York to Senior VP/national sales at Unistar. And Westwood One VP/programming Gary Landis joins the newly revamped Children's Satellite Network as VP/programming.

M Street also offers its congrats to Inside Radio VP/editorial Steve Butler and managing editor Tom Taylor who are upped to president/COO and VP respectively at Inside Radio as publisher Jerry Del Colliano continues to move his concentration to sales and marketing.

ELSEWHERE

The Sacramento Area Radio Broadcasters Association is the recipient of the Radio Advertising Bureau's November Marketing Partnership Award. SARBA wins \$1,000 and is qualified for the \$9,000+ year end prize for its Red Cross benefit "Radio Relief." Meanwhile, the following panelists have been announced for the "National Spot Marketing" panel at next year's RAB Managing Sales Conference: Interep president Les Goldberg, Katz Radio Group president Gordon Hastings, CBS Radio Reps marketing director Don Macfarlane, Saatchi & Saatchi VP Sam Michaelson, and Camelot Communications president Tom Kalahar. The MSC is next February 4-7 in Dallas; for more info, call 212-387-2100. You can also get information on the MSC or next year's NAB conventions from the NAB's new "fax on demand" machine at 301-216-1847.

Broadcast Programming has acquired the Nashville-based syndicator Musicworks. It's BPI's seventh purchase of a rival programming service in the last five years. Musicworks programs country and adult contemporary formats.

From the "nice gesture, but get rid of that damn 'la da de, la da da' theme" department: WBEE Chicago has added a new Sunday brokered program called "Help The Homeless Network. The show features information on job training, housing, and health, as well as a "Shelter of the Week" feature. In a sign of the times, producer/host Babette Payson formerly brokered a show on WBEE called "Your Road To Success."

In an opening bid to syndication of its news/information programming, KRLD Dallas is up on satellite now. Try Galaxy 6, Transponder 3, Channel 66.9 to hear KRLD's night-time shows "Texas USA" and "Texas Overnight." KRLD is owned and located with the Texas State Network.

Unistar will present the three-hour "American Music Award Nominations Special" on January 22-24, the weekend before the 1993 edition of the Dick Clark-hosted awards show airs.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The National Assn. of Broadcasters has promoted Michael Waring, its director of political communications, to VP/government relations; he'll oversee broadcaster/congressional relations activities and NAB's Television and Radio PAC. Also, Kathleen Ramsey, who has been an in-house consultant to NAB since last February, is upped to director of broadcaster/congressional relations. NAB House liaison Tristan Carter Warren assumes those duties for the Senate as DeDe Ferrell replaces her in the House.

ELSEWHERE

Arbitron's annual consultant fly-in was full of surprises--and the meal was better than last year. Several topics were discussed including a rehash of the "pocket people meter" (or, as one person put it, "little brother.") Market changes beginning with Fall '92: moving from continuous measurement to twice per year--Johnson City-Bristol-Kingsport, Roanoke-Lynchburg, and Youngstown. Tupelo gets its own book in Spring '93. San Luis Obispo becomes its own market then, as well. Amarillo goes from standard to condensed. Orlando adds a Hispanic breakout. Dropped from the rolls completely this year are Albany GA, Lufkin-Nacogdoches TX, Pascagoula-Moss Point MS, Sioux City IA, Terre Haute IN, and Victoria TX. Casper WY's fate has not yet been finalized.

As expected, sample size is a big issue, and a number of possibilities were discussed to do a little better. As rumbled at the RAB Winter Board Meeting, two sixteen week surveys would increase diary counts by an estimated 81 percent. Secondly, decreasing the number of books in continuous measurement markets from four to three. Lastly, moving ADI and TSA diaries into metro counties, thus increasing sample size by approximately 20 percent. After all the discussion--the one issue everyone can agree on--We need sample. Sample is good. We like sample. Arbitron will be looking for industry consensus on a plan to accomplish the sample size gains (scheduled about the same time as world peace.)

On the issue of ratings piracy, one person went so far to suggested that Arbitron should only publish the numbers of subscribing stations. Although Arbitron shrugged this idea off as "just a suggestion", they did say their lawyers had already looked into it. (BBM Bureau of Broadcast Measurement, Canada's largest radio measurement firm, does just that.)

What amounts to an Arbitron reversal of position, Atlanta may be a test site for on-air survey announcements. Atlanta stations have been lobbying--Arbitron may finally give in. All stations would have to run the approved tape, uncut and unaltered. All stations would have to participate and the experiment would have to be "self-policing."

Chuck Harder, who had used UPI News as part of the Sun Network, is reunited with his old buddies this week. Harder's new For The People network had been using USA Network news; now it's offering UPI news to affiliates who take specific hours.

M Street congratulates longtime Radio Business Report staffer J.T. Anderton who officially becomes editor of RBR this week, assuming those duties from publisher Jim Carnegie.

This sounds like an April Fool's Joke, but it's December and Small Market Radio Newsletter reports that KSHN Liberty, Texas, faced with the dilemma of two major high school football games on the same Friday night ran them both simultaneously...one in the left channel, one in the right. One game ran through the production room; one ran through the main board. Listeners were told to use the balance knob to select the game they wanted.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC's game of Hi-Lo with Infinity over its threatened Howard Stern fines ended this week with a total of \$600,000 fines levied against the group's stations in a notice of apparent liability. (You'll remember that the fines could have been anywhere up to about \$900,000.) The FCC did, decide, however, to approve Infinity's purchase of three Cook-Inlet stations which is expected to put Stern on in at least one more market. The ACLU, meanwhile, has filed a letter with the FCC protesting the \$105,000 fine against KLSX Los Angeles for the same broadcasts involved in the Infinity fines.

To a near-universal chorus of derision, the FCC has finally selected Motorola's C-Quam as the standard for AM stereo. The decision takes place 10 years after AM stereo was allowed to go into affect and forced to fend for itself without a standard. The National Assn. of Broadcasters has condemned the decision as 10 years too late; comments are due by next April.

KRJV St. Louis and KARO Columbia MO both had their licenses renewed, conditioned on EEO reporting conditions. KRJV was admonished to contact minority sources for every vacancy because of repeated failures to comply with EEO rules during the previous license term. KARO was also hit with a \$4,000 fine.

Western States Broadcasting's KCHQ Altamont OR had its \$1,000 forfeiture for operating with reduced power and for operating an unauthorized booster station. However, the requirement for payment has been held for three years if the same violations are not repeated during that time.

WEEC Springfield OH was granted non-commercial status this week.

Group W Radio president Jim Thompson has been named chairman of the steering committee for the NAB's 1993 radio convention to be held Sept. 8-11 in Dallas. Apollo Radio's Bill Stakelin will chair the management subcommittee. WMXV New York PD Bob Dunphy will have those duties for the programming subcommittee. CBS-FM group head Rod Calarco will oversee the sales/marketing subcommittee.

ELSEWHERE

Some last minute holiday shopping taking place: Barnstable Broadcasting, which already pairs one station (WHBQ) with its WGKX-FM Memphis, gets a second FM in that market this week with the purchase of oldies WYPR from Diamond for \$4.25 million. ABC sells WPRO-AM-FM Providence, R.I., to Tele-Media (owner of crosstown WLKW/WWLI). Tichenor picks up KSRR San Antonio for \$3.8 million, pairing it with its KCOR and taking the station out of a duopoly with KONO-AM-FM. KKR-backed Granum picks up WSSH-FM Boston from Noble for \$18.5 million, pairing it with WBOS.

After more than a decade at urban WKYS Washington, D.C., longtime morning man (and former PD) Donnie Simpson defects to crosstown WPGC for a six year contract reportedly worth more than \$1-million a year. WPGC has been beating WKYS handily for the last several years--even though it's never owned up publicly to actually being in the urban format--but it's always had problems establishing a high-profile morning show. Simpson is expected to end up in syndication, perhaps on co-owned KBXX Houston which has also had problems making a morning show stick.

KIRO Seattle midday host Dave Ross joins the CBS Radio Network schedule next month with a 2-1/2 minute program set to air at 12:25 PM eastern. Ross had previously filled in for Charles Osgood. In addition, Dr. Marvin Moser and Lou Adler become the new host and producer respectively of CBS' "Healthtalk" and Julie Vaughn and Adler will handle those duties for "Growing Up: Parenting In The '90s," previously known as "The Parent Profile."
