And now for something completely different (if you have never listened to public radio that is.) KPIX AM and FM made their debuts over the weekend with a news, information and jazz format named "The Express." Look for long form information and talk pieces reminiscent of NPR's "All Things Considered." KPIX will focus on Bay area news, not national, coupled with lifestyle talk and information. Weekends will be a jazz and urban AC mix. With this format the ratings race should be more with news/talk public station KQED-FM than with commercial talkers KGO/KSFO and all news KCBS.

CITADEL COMMUNICATIONS IS SELLING THE ZOO. . . that is, its entire collection of animals in Montana, by selling its duopoly combos in Bozeman and Billings to Deschutes Communications for \$5 million. In the Billings market, the stations are country combo KDWG and KCTR ("The Cat"), and oldies KKBR ("The Bear"). In Bozeman, the country combo of KBOZ-AM and KATH ("The Cat"), and Hot AC KBOZ-FM, Livingston.

The DAB subcommittee's "Field Test Task Group" picked San Francisco because of the many "propagation challenges" (read hilly, densely-urban signal-reception nightmare.) The tests will include four in-band, on-channel systems for both AM and FM, and one in-band, adjacent-channel system for FM. The tests are scheduled to begin in early 1995.

Chestnut Broadcasting's KBER got hit with a \$5,000 fine for calling a jock at cross-town KRSP, taping the conversation, and playing back parts of it on the air without informing them. The jock that did it is no longer with the station.

ELSEWHERE

BMI has announced it will provide a "rate court" for disputes involving license fees paid by stations. The idea is welcomed by Radio Music License Committee Chairman Dick Harris, who said, "...there is no doubt that we will support the idea of creation of a rate court, though not necessarily in the fashion proposed by BMI."

Regent Communications will be picking up country KFMS-AM & FM, North Las Vegas/Las Vegas from Broadcast Associates for \$7.75 million. Regent will combo the stations with yet-to-be-acquired AC KRLV. Regent will enter into an immediate LMA with the stations and an SMA with country KEYV--the other station Broadcast Associates owns.

What are call letters worth? A \$65 fee at the Commission. But if you're Bonneville Broadcasting, who's buying KING, Seattle, it's \$300,000. Bonneville is planning to buy KING to combo with KIRO-AM & FM. Selling price: \$1.8 million with call letters, \$1.5 million without. Providence Journal-owned KING-TV must grant permission to use the call letters to both the AM and the FM once the dismantling of the combo is completed.

Boston-based American Radio Systems is buying religion outlet WBMD Baltimore and oldies WQSR-FM, Catonsville, MD, reportedly for close to \$40 million. The purchase will bring ARS's station count to 20.

If you're the development director for a non-commercial station, imagine having to refund \$1.5 million in contributions to listeners. Ron Cowan, owner of KJAZ San Francisco is going through just that. Ron was trying to raise money to keep the station, and its traditional jazz format, from having to sell to the Z Spanish Network. KJAZ is an institution in San Fran, but couldn't break even. The "Friends of KJAZ" on-air campaign began last year, but fell short of its \$3 million goal. Look for a Spanish format in August.

Dr. Demento returned to the air in L.A. after a year's hiatus over the Fourth of July weekend on new alternative outlet KLIT, Glendale, CA. KLIT will serve as the flagship station for his nationally-syndicated program.

African-American-targeted talk show "Night Talk" hosted by Bob Law will broadcast live from the NAACP convention July 11 through July 14th. The show will have audience participation on-site and call-in lines for listeners across the country. For more information contact the American Urban Radio Networks at (212) 714-1000.

USA Talk Network has announced the creation of "After The Rush", A new two-hour, issue-driven talk show hosted by "wealthy, high-tech, bleeding-heart liberal" Aaron Harber (no kidding--the adjectives are right out of the press release). The show will begin its national broadcast on August 15th. For more information contact Jack L. Tyson or Thomas C. Lion at (303) 443-2626.

The Country Radio Broadcasters, Inc. is holding its first mini-convention in Dallas, TX, August 25-27 at the Harvey Hotel, DFW Airport. The CRS South West "is being targeted to the states of Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and Louisiana." The convention will begin with two days of Board meetings followed by a welcoming reception on Friday evening featuring recording artist David Ball. Saturday's sessions will include "Legislative/Regulatory Issues", "Programming Basics", "Commercials That Sell" and "Building the Local Sales Staff." The buffet lunch will feature an acoustic performances by Brother Phelps, Susie Luchsinger and Jon Randall. "Cousin Brucie" Morrow of New York's WCBS-FM has been signed to perform in the Broadway musical production of "Grease" at the Eugene O'Neill Theater in New York City. "Cousin Brucie" will take over the part of "D.J. Vince Fontaine" while Brian Bradley, whom originally had the part, recovers from a fractured foot.

CANADA THIS WEEK

Canada's BT magazine reports that two suburban Toronto AM stations will change frequencies: Asian CIAO, Brampton, ON, which is currently at 530 kHz, has purchased Telemedia's 1430 kHz frequency from sports CJCL Toronto, which plans to move to 590 kHz. Country CKYC, currently at 590 kHz, would cease to exist.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission, in separate actions, dismissed EEO objections and granted the assignments of WGNA-AM & FM Albany, NY, and WHFM Southampton, NY to Liberty Broadcasting of New York. David Naylor, a member of the NAACP and the National Black Media Coalition, stated that he applied for openings with WGBB Freeport and WBAB-FM Babylon, NY. Each time, the station sent him a letter stating that the positions had been filled and asked him to return a form identifying his race and referral source. Naylor claims that since he was not granted an interview, he was discriminated against because he is black. He also argued that the two stations have employed few minorities and have inadequate EEO programs.

The Commission dismissed his objections because Naylor did not file an affidavit that he is either a listener or resident of the service area of either station. Further, "Mr. Naylor's EEO allegations against Liberty . . . are based entirely on a period that is prior to Liberty's April 1, 1993, acquisition of the stations. Such activities, therefore, have no bearing on Liberty's qualifications."

Specifically in the WHFM petition, the Commission says Naylor didn't raise any specific allegations of discrimination or violation of EEO rules; "Liberty's inquiry into his race and referral source without an interview do not, standing alone, raise a question or issue of discrimination."

Commissioner Susan Ness has appointed David R. Siddall as a legal advisor on mass media and wireless matters. Siddall was most recently Chief of the Frequency Allocation Branch. He has been lead attorney for formulating the Commission's initial policies governing high definition television and was Acting Assistant Chief, Law, of the Mass Media Bureau. Ness also appointed Mary P. McManus as her legal advisor focusing on spectrum auctions, Cable Act implementation, and international issues.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

The Commission has issued guidelines on how to file those pesky user fees electronically. In order to file this way, you must have 50 or more regulatory fees and, according to the public notice, "your organization must possess the knowledge and ability to provide the necessary automated information on a floppy diskette(s) in ASCII format without technical assistance from the Commission." We're not sure if it'll do any good, but if you have any questions, call (202) FCC-FEES.

The Commission shut down two more pirate stations broadcasting in New York City. The two pirate stations were broadcasting news and music to the Haitian community from Hollis, Queens. The operators of the two pirates, Samuel Menager and Pierre Brutus, were tracked down using mobile automatic direction finders after several residents complained about the interference. Both were charged with operating a radio station without a license and fined \$20,000.

ELSEWHERE

Buckley Broadcasting is getting out of the L.A. market to the tune of \$4.5 million and a tax certificate. A new duopoly will be created as AC KMGX, San Fernando, CA, will combo with Chagal Broadcasting's Korean KFOX, Redondo Beach. KFOX currently simulcasts on KREA, Ontario, CA in the nearby Riverside-San Bernardino market.

Connoisseur Broadcasting will pick up two more stations in Youngstown, giving it a duopoly there. It announced this week it will be buying John Kanzius and Myron Jones' adult standards WHOT (AM) & CHR WHOT-FM. Price was not disclosed. Connoisseur recently announced their intent to purchase H & D Communications' news-talk WBBW and oldies WBBG.

El Paso will get another duopoly as J.R. Phillips' Magic Media, Inc. will buy classic hits KOFX from ELP Communications for \$3 million. Phillips already owns country KSET.

Katz Media Corporation reached an agreement over this past weekend to sell the company to DLJ Merchant Banking Partners, L.P., a company owned by Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette Securities. No price was disclosed. Katz had been preparing for an initial public offering.

The NAB announced the selection of this year's final nominees in the NAB Marconi Radio Awards competition. Included were Rick Dees, Don Imus, Tom Joyner, Bob Kingsley and Howard Stern for Syndicated Personality of the Year. NAB member stations will receive their ballots by mid-August and are due back by 5 pm EDT, September 9th.

The Interep Radio Store released a new report entitled "The Seasonality Of Business...Radio. The Medium For All Seasons". The report shows that all household consumer spending has reached the \$3 billion mark, suggesting that one way businesses can increase yearly sales is to broaden their Target Consumer Profile. Some of the other findings include the fact that persons aged 25-34 is an important demographic cell for most businesses, accounting for 39% of the adult 25-54 radio listeners, while persons aged 55+ are "vital to the success of many categories." This age bracket represents 25% of all adults 18+ radio listeners. The study sums up the relationship between spot radio advertising and the seasonality of business by emphasizing that radio listening patterns remain constant year-round, thereby reaching target consumers during any given month. "Increased sales of only one percent, during a month in most categories, translates to millions of dollars." For more information contact Interep.

Westwood One is dipping a toe in the retail audio pool with the unveiling of the Westwood One Audio Products division. The new effort is introducing what they claim to be "the world's first audio fanzine." *Inside Track*, a monthly entertainment magazine on audio cassette, hosted by Mike Kasem, son of Casey Kasem, will feature celebrity interviews. The cassette retails for \$2.98 and is available at major record retail outlets.

The Word In Music Satellite Network announces the creation of a new division: Word In Music Creative Services. The new department will provide both affiliate and non-affiliate stations with writing, voiceover and production work. Production services are available on a per spot or monthly service contract. Morningstar Radio Network announces the addition of Scott Thunder, formerly PD and GM of KCMS in Seattle, to their on-air roster and programming department.

FCC SPENDING MORE TIME IN COURT THAN O.J. On the heels of a D.C. Circuit Court decision that threw out the use of many of the integration credits used by the FCC to determine the most qualified applicant for new stations during comparative hearings, the D.C. Circuit Court has thrown out the FCC's forfeiture schedule. The battle to force the FCC to throw out the schedule has been waged for some time as the U.S. Telephone Association, among others, argued that the Commission did not follow proper procedures when the schedule was adopted in 1991. The Commission stands by its claim that the schedule was adopted as a matter of policy, not rulemaking, and therefore was not required to go through the public comment periods. Now the National Association of Broadcasters has asked the Commission to set aside its EEO "policies" for the same reason, and vacate all enforcement decisions made so far. The Commission revised those policies in January of this year. No comment yet from the Commission.

TEJANO DOUBLE-UP IN HOUSTON. On the heels of the best Spanish book ever in that market, El Dorado Communications has purchased KQQK, Galveston, TX for \$10.25 million plus a tax certificate from KQQK, Inc. El Dorado already owns KXTJ, Beaumont, TX. Both stations are Houston move-ins and program Tejano. KQQK has a CP to upgrade to a full class C facility.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Every once in a while, the Commission will bury a warning to broadcasters in its Field Operations Bureau activities notice for the week. Here's one all AM station licensees should heed. The FCC is concerned that many AM stations with directional patterns are not properly maintaining their signal patterns. Field inspectors are out ensuring compliance. The most recent activity was from the Dallas office when a field inspector visited an AM station in Denison, TX, to find the station "had no Disc Jockey," did not change its night time pattern, had no one watching the EBS receiver, and had no telephone. According to the notice, "A violation notice is being prepared and further action will be coordinated with the Mass Media Bureau."

In a move that could be great news for broadcasters, the Small Business Administration has repealed its "opinion molder" rule, which prohibited the agency from making loans to anyone who has the potential to affect public opinion, including broadcasters, bookstores, newspapers, and theaters. According to the NAB, the decision means that almost 90% of radio stations and half of all television stations may be eligible for loans or loan guarantees. FCC Commissioners Andrew Barrett, Rachele Chong and Susan Ness will attend the NAB Radio Show, October 12th to 15th in Los Angeles and will participate in a policymaker's breakfast on Friday, October 14th at 7:30 a.m. For more information contact the NAB fax-on-demand service at 301-216-1847.

In the "We Don't Mean to be Anal, But..." department, the FCC has issued a public notice stating that the printing on all filings with the FCC must be in at least 12-point type, double spaced, and be filed on A4 or 8 1/2 x 11 inch paper with the printed material not exceeding 6 1/2 x 9 1/2 inches. This action amends the prior order that required all filing use "print consisting of 10 and 12 characters per inch."

ELSEWHERE

Benchmark Communications continues its shopping spree this week as it picks up country WESC-AM & FM Greenville, SC from the estate of Robert Schmid and George Francis, respectively. Benchmark will combo these two with its recently announced purchase of Francis' silent WHYZ Sans Souci, SC and CHR WBBO-FM, Forest City, SC, for Greenville-Spartanburg's first four station duopoly. Prices were not disclosed, but the press release wanted to make it known that "WHYZ-AM, the market's only other 50,000 watt AM facility, was one of the market's top rated stations until going dark one year ago."

J. Morgan Dowdy will be doubling up in the Biloxi-Gulfport market as he exercises his purchase option on oldies LMA partner WGCM-FM, Biloxi, MS. Ed Muniz, WGCM-FM's current owner, has had the station in an LMA with Dowdy's trombo--country WRPM, adult standards WROA, Gulfport, MS, and CHR WZKX, Poplarville, MS for approximately one year. Price for the station is \$1.1 million. No word on what will happen to sports WGCM (AM), which was also in the LMA.

In the Monterey-Salinas market, EXCL Communications is buying classical combo KSUR Soledad, CA and KSUR-FM, Greenfield, CA, from Mt. Wilson FM Broadcasters for an undisclosed price. EXCL already owns KLOK and KBRG, San Jose, CA, which is just north of the Monterey market. The purchase of KSUR-AM & FM gives them a logical extension down the coast.

Fueling the rumors of a joint venture or merger of the Group W radio stations with CBS, the television side of Group W announced to its employees this week the forming of a "comprehensive strategic partnership" with CBS intended to expand ownership of television stations in major markets, programming distribution once the Fin/Syn rules are abolished, CBS television network affiliation agreements for all Group W stations, and the merging of the advertising sales operations of the two companies. These plans will cause CBS to sell its heritage Philadelphia TV station, WCAU-TV, and Group W to change the affiliations of its TV stations in Boston, Philadelphia, and Baltimore.

Months after it purchased Billboard Publications, VNU has announced it will purchase Bill Communications, a magazine publisher with titles such as "Sales & Marketing Management," "Plastics Technology," "Modern Tire Dealer," and "Contemporary Long Term Care." The terms of the deal were not disclosed in the press release. VNU also owns Scarborough Research Corp. and Claritas. For those of you wondering what VNU stands for: "nv Verenigd Bezit VNU."

Harold Camping, owner of non-commercial Family Radio, one of the nation's largest radio station groups, has put his listeners on notice that nothing will much matter after September--because the world will end some time during that month. Camping has a nightly talk show on the Family Radio network, and has devised his own system for dating biblical events. In an interview with the Associated Press, Camping says this system points to a date sometime during the month of September, when "the 'saved' will be raised up and the 'unsaved' living and dead will be condemned to everlasting damnation." Scholars dismiss Camping's theories, but are worried about the psychological effects on the nation because of Camping's influence on those who listen to his show.

Arbitron is pleased to announce that Spring '94 book response rates were up 11.7% for the first 110 markets over Spring '93. Those markets that enjoyed double-digit gains were St. Cloud, MN; West Palm Beach-Boca Raton, FL; State College, PA; and Frederick, MD. Those markets that lost ground are Pueblo, CO; Ithaca, NY; Chico, CA; Bryan-College Station, TX; Bloomington, IL; and Altoona, PA.

Arbitron is serving up a Page 5B notice to subscribers of the Baltimore book for a reference on a promo aired by adult standards WWLG, Baltimore, for the Spring book. The promo stated, "If someone asks you to write it down, this is Baltimore's all new Legends 1360, spelled WLG."

Making good on its promise to look at new cable TV ventures, Arbitron has announced it will offer a new research tool for cable system local ad sales called the "Cable Viewers' Shopping Survey." Unlike the diary method used to measure radio, the survey utilizes telephone methodology to measure the shopping habits of a cable system's audience. The results of the survey compare cable viewing to newspaper readership in the local market and allows cable systems to qualitatively analyze their viewers.

Its amazing what a little surgery can do...WLS (AM), Chicago, was all set to go with Lt. Governor Bob Kustra as afternoon co-host when Governor Jim Edgar called from his bed, in the hospital after a quadruple bypass surgery, and helped Kustra change his mind. Start prepping your resumes.

The Interep Radio Store released a new analysis of Arbitron and AccuRatings audience data. Generally, the two companies had seven stations common to both top ten lists. The analysis was based on the nine top-20 markets in which both services measured radio listening in Winter 1994. The overall findings show that AccuRatings indicated higher 12+ listening for CHR, while adult contemporary, Spanish and oldies formats have higher estimates in Arbitron. Arbitron now has a higher sample size in New York and Los Angeles than does AccuRatings. AccuRatings delivered higher samples in four out of the nine commonly measured markets and was equal with Arbitron in the remaining three markets. "Live by the numbers..." The Interep Radio store completed its first Consumer Need Assessment Panel (CNAP) in Seattle, WA. Among the key findings: agencies would like to see radio sold on its own merits and not in comparison with television. Radio should not be sold by numbers, but by its ability to reach a consumer group and move product. Radio creative is not valued as an art by station and agency copywriters and should have an additional charge for quality promotions. WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Radio Advertising Bureau's President Gary Fries commended the NAB's lobbying efforts in guiding the proposed leasing ad disclosure bill through Congress. The bill, when signed into law, will allow leases to be advertised on radio using alternative off-air means, such as toll-free phone numbers, to provide consumers with required disclosure information, including lease terms and down payments. Fries commented that the new legislation will "open a floodgate of new automotive radio advertising now held at bay by the current restrictions." The Radio Ad Disclosure Act must now be approved by the full House and Senate and signed into law by President Clinton, then new regulations enacted to enforce it -- a process which is expected to take several months.

ELSEWHERE

George Sosson's Radio Equity Partners is doubling up in the Columbia, SC, market by buying rocker WARQ for \$1.9 million from Clayton Radio. R.E.P. already owns urban WWDM, Sumter, SC. WARQ's sister, talker WVOC, will be sold soon to Benchmark Communications.

Morris Communications, who owns several domestic newspapers, has purchased Stauffer Communications, Inc., for \$283 million. Among Stauffer's broadcasting and publishing holdings are KGNC-AM & FM, Amarillo, and WIBW-AM & FM, Topeka. The AM's are news-talk. The FM's are country.

American Radio Systems is getting out of Des Moines by selling its three stations there to Community Pacific Broadcasting Company. Terms of the deal were not disclosed. The three stations are rocker KGGO, country KHKI, and religion KDMI.

Arbitron announced that the first 195 markets of the Spring 1994 radio survey will post a 4.2 point response (11%) rate gain over the equivalent Spring '93 rates.

In the latest round of Arbitron Special Station Activity for the Spring '94 book, news-talker WJNO, West Palm Beach was hit with a page 5B notice and a tape flag for urging listeners "...If you're listening to radio at home, away from home, or in your car, you're hearing WJNO. The News Station." Also getting busted was KNXR, Rochester, MN, who told listeners through promotional material: "If you are called by Arbitron, please agree to participate in their listener survey, especially if you live in Rochester." And, "Whenever I get the opportunity, I will let KNXR advertisers know I am hearing their commercials." KNXR will be below-the-line this book. They'll also get a page 5B notice and a tape flag.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

The Washington Post reports conservative talk show host Armstrong Williams, who has been on the air on Washington D.C.'s WOL for 14 months, is suddenly searching for a home for the show. Armstrong alleges WOL's general manager, Cathy Hughes, suddenly yanked his three-hour-nightly program just as Boston-based TalkAmerica was about to install equipment at the station so the program could be syndicated nationally. Williams claims he has 21 stations carrying the program.

The Interep Radio Store announced it will expand its radio format network program by adding five networks in 1994-95: Classic Rock Radio Format Network, "Mature" Radio Demographic Network, Radio Interactive Promotion Network, "Oldies" Radio Format Network, and the AOR Radio Format Network. The networks consist of unwired groupings of stations with common demographics and listener buying behavior.

The Interep Radio Store released a study on the Classical Radio format which shows that Classical radio indexes higher than any other format in the much sought after qualitative categories of professionals/executives, college graduates and households with incomes above \$75,000. Compared to the U.S. population in general, the Classical format has double the percentage of Adults 18+ in these same categories. The format indexes over 200 in all three, which means that Classical listeners are 100 times more likely than the average adult to fall within these exclusive marketing targets.

Westwood One Entertainment, in celebration of the 25th Anniversary of Woodstock, will broadcast a three-hour retrospective hosted by Dennis Hopper. The event will coincide with "Woodstock 94" and will feature interviews and music from Pete Townshend, Roger Daltrey, Jerry Garcia, Joe Cocker, Janis Joplin, Crosby, Stills and Nash, Carlos Santana, Grace Slick, Lesley West of Mountain, John Sebastian, Country Joe McDonald, Bill Graham and many more. WW1 will also offer Woodstock Rock Blocks featuring original interviews and material. For more information contact Laurie Peters at WW1 (310) 840-4383.

CBS News Radio will provide a series of 90-second news updates from Woodstock to air at :20 and :31 minutes past the hour. CBS Spectrum Radio affiliates will receive CBS NewsBriefs and 60 second special reports. CBS Radio House of Blues affiliates will be provided with "Wavy Gravy's Woodstock Flashback Features" hosted by the original emcee Wavy Gravy a/k/a Hugh Romney.

The Communications Industry Forecast released by Investment banking firm Veronis, Suhler & Associates reports that radio will grow at an annual compound rate of 7.1% over the next five years making it the "fastest [growing] of all the measured media." The Forecast also notes that radio's share of ad revenues rose to 11.1% last year despite double digit increases in cable ad growth and the barrage of new advertising options available.
