NOT QUITE NAFTA, BUT... The U.S. and Mexico have begun implementation of three new broadcasting agreements for AM expanded band, FM, and Multi-Point Distribution Services. All of the agreements are effective immediately. Details are on page six.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC and Mexican authorities have signed new agreements that renew cooperation in three areas: FM, AM expanded band, and MDS. The agreements are effective immediately. The expanded AM band agreement establishes a procedure for the assignment of AM stations on the ten channels above 1605 kHz, adding 21 new AM allotments near the U.S./Mexico border areas. These new stations will be permitted maximum powers of 10,000 watts days and 1000 watts nights. Other operations, as they are made available, will be limited to a maximum power of 1000 watts days and nights. The new FM agreement, which replaces the existing agreement signed in 1972, offers additional flexibility for both countries in allocating new FM stations in the border zone, as well as allow existing U.S. FM stations to upgrade their facilities.

The Commission dismissed a petition to deny by the NAACP for the license renewal of WHYW Associates' WMYG, Braddock, PA. but with reporting conditions and a \$6,000 fine. The Commission found that "WMYG's recruitment efforts were deficient because the licensee recruited for only 11 of 53 positions, contacted minority specific sources for only four vacancies, and failed to maintain adequate documentation for meaningful self-assessment."

The results are in after the Commission's Notice of Inquiry on its EEO policies. The ruling: It's Not Enough. The FCC has adopted a report to Congress that determined that the Commission's present policies "have been and are effective in promoting employment opportunities for women and minorities in those [cable and broadcasting] industries." But, the report concludes:

- more progress can be achieved.
- there is a continued need for monitoring.
- more extensive analysis is necessary.

The report states that although broadcasting's employment of minorities and women outpaces employment overall in the national workplace, "more progress can and should be made." In order to do this, the report notes that the Commission, among other things, has revamped the Office of Small Business Activities, and renamed it "Office of Communications Business Opportunities," which will oversee the FCC's EEO practices within the Commission, support the creation of small, minority and female-owned communications businesses, and make policy recommendations regarding EEO.

The Commission cancelled the license of WHPY, Clayton, NC this week. The station has been silent for over a year.

CANADA THIS WEEK

Major changes in Quebec as Radiomutuel and Telemedia merge many of their radio operations. The new venture will be called Radiomedia and will include a sales, programming and news operation for 22 stations. Six stations have closed down to minimize competition and overlap. The Quebec market has been hard hit in recent years and both companies felt these moves were required to make a profit in a very crowded marketplace. In addition to the joint operations of the two groups, two stations--CHRC, Quebec City and CKAC, Montreal--will form a new news and talk network for Radiomedia. In addition to the loss of six program services, an estimated 100 people will be out of work. Worth noting is the fact that one of the stations closing--CKCH, Hull--does so after 61 years of operation.

ELSEWHERE

Bud Paxson maxes out Orlando by picking up WGTO, Orlando from Florida Media. Paxson already owns 50,000 watt news-talker WWNZ, and all sports WWZN, Orlando (which he'll have to spin off.) The purchase will give Paxson two 50,000 watt facilities in Orlando, as well as two FM's. WGTO's format is news and sports--a favorite of Paxson's.

Inside Radio reports Major Networks has purchased the Michael Reagan show from syndicator American Entertainment Network. The three-hour nighttime talk show brings 80 affiliates to Major, including WMAL, Washington, DC, and WXYT, Detroit.

Arbitron released it's Summer 1994 response rate summary. The first thirteen markets of the Summer 1994 radio survey posted a 6.4 point response rate gain over the equivalent Summer 1993 response rates. The Summer 1994 average metro response rate for the same thirteen markets is 37.1% representing a 21% increase over the equivalent Summer 1993 response rate of 30.7%.

ELSEWHERE

Interrep announced it is teaming up with Fairwest Direct to provide technical and database expertise for Interrep's Radio Interactive Marketing Network, a grouping of unwired stations with "common demographics and listener buying behaviors," according to the release. RIMN will launch with 15 stations during the fourth quarter of 1994.

In the stupid D.J. tricks department, Steve and D.C. are in the news again. This time the WKBQ, St. Louis morning team decided they'd put a gift package together for the President of the L.A. Rams football team in hopes that he'll move the team to St. Louis. According to Inside Radio, they felt the need to include a photo under a Shaw Avenue street sign. So they promptly disassembled the sign on the air. The police arrested two interns that helped them do it, then Steve and D.C. a day later. All four are due in court November 18.

Radio Aahs and Warner Music Enterprises have joined together to produce a national magazine and companion CD for children. The magazine and CD are due to premier in February 1995.

Sports Byline USA announced October 3rd that its "Sports Overnight Update" was now being carried on Armed Forces Radio Network (AFRN). The hour long wrap-up of each day's sports and scores will run Monday through Friday beginning at 10:12 p.m. PT.

CBS Americas has added two new sports programs this week. "Boxeo HBO en Espanol" will provide listeners with Spanish-language radio coverage of one World Championship Boxing match per month in conjunction with HBO. The other show is "RadioDeportes CBS", a bi-coastal call-in sports talk program. For more information call CBS Americas at 212-975-3773.

USA Radio Network has brought on David Reeder as Vice President/General Manager over network operations. Reeder was most recently with Marsh Broadcasting's KYCR, Golden Valley, MN (Minneapolis) and WDCT, Fairfax, VA (Washington, DC) where he was serving as both stations' General Manager until Marsh sold them.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission dismissed a petition to deny by the NAACP for the license renewal of WHYW Associates' WRRK, Braddock, PA, but with reporting conditions and a \$6,000 fine. The Commission found that "WYMG's [now WRRK] recruitment efforts were deficient because the licensee recruited for only 11 of 53 positions, contacted minority specific sources for only four vacancies, and failed to maintain adequate documentation for meaningful self-assessment."

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

The Commission ruled that it is reasonable to require broadcasters to provide federal candidates access to odd program lengths, such as five minutes, to the same degree such lengths have either been made available to commercial advertisers or programmed in the year preceding a particular election period.

The ruling is in response to a request by the NAB to clarify Commission policies under the "reasonable access" provision of the Communications Act. NAB's request acknowledged the obligation to provide access to normal spot lengths, such as 30- and 60-seconds, and normal program time, such as thirty minutes, but sought clarification of whether odd program lengths, such as five minutes, must also be made available.

The FCC celebrated sixty years of existence this past week with a cake-cutting ceremony in the FCC's meeting room and a reception honoring Chairman Reed Hundt, the Commissioners and several Congressional members. The agency, which was established in 1934 under President Franklin D. Roosevelt, started with 233 employees and a budget of \$1.14 million. Today there are 1,964 employees and a budget of \$160.3 million.

ELSEWHERE

SW Networks, the joint radio venture between Sony Software and Warner Music Group, has unveiled its plans for the launch of several 24-hour networks. Three brand new formats will hit the air in early 1995. The three are "Classic FM U.S.," a classical service developed in conjunction with the U.K.'s "Classic FM;" "SuccessRadio," an all-motivational format utilizing audio tapes and programs from selected motivational speakers; and a yet unnamed smooth jazz/new AC format.

SW will also add several short-form programs to its offerings. They are "Pure Concrete," an album rock show; "static," a two-hour new rock show; "Street Heat," a two-hour hip-hop program; "Country's Most Wanted," a two-hour country program, and an adult alternative program that hasn't been named. The programs will be offered to its affiliates digitally via satellite, as well as on mini-disc and CD.

SW is not the first company to try its hand at these full-time formats. The motivational format was syndicated out of WWNN, Pompano Beach, FL, and had as many as eight stations at its peak four years ago. Three companies have gone the smooth jazz route--Satellite Music Network, the Minnesota-based Breeze network, and TheLyte. SMN and the Breeze no longer syndicate the format. In the classical arena, Seattle-based Broadcast Programming currently syndicates a classical format on CD and tape.

Spacecom Systems has announced a new turn-key satellite transmission service for the radio industry, which will be shown at the NAB Convention in L.A. SW Networks, the new radio venture between Sony Software and Warner Music Group, is one of the first to use the system.

The Lincoln Group has claimed a new duopoly in Rochester, NY as it has purchased Pyramid's CHR WPXY. No terms were disclosed. The deal will force Lincoln to spin off easy listening WEZO. Lincoln already owns news-talker WHAM, talker WHTK, and hot AC WVOR-FM.

After four years, Irene Mojica and WGCI-FM, Chicago, have settled their differences. Mojica, who has been doing overnights on the station for years, filed suit claiming the station had passed her over for promotion because she is female and Hispanic, and was paying her less than her male counterparts. She was awarded \$160,000, but the judgment was later overturned. In a statement in the Chicago Sun-Times, WGCI's VP/GM Darryll Green said that an amicable resolution had been reached.

The Radio Advertising Bureau has hired Radio Ink's editor, Reed Bunzel, to head up their information services, including their Radio Sales Today fax and the monthly membership kits. Jody Mutnansky, who handled those responsibilities for the RAB, is heading to Arbitron as the RAB moves to Dallas.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Capital Cities/ABC has selected AP NewsCenter software for installation at ABC News bureaus worldwide. The software will be phased in throughout the ABC organization, replacing the majority of the systems the company currently uses to gather, manage and produce its news programs and services.

Radio for the age-enhanced is coming to Cincinnati. The Cincinnati Enquirer reports Mapel Knoll Village, a retirement community, will be operating WMKV, Redding (Cincinnati), OH come next May. The all-volunteer station had a rough beginning. When fund-raising fell short last year, the trustees for the Southwestern Ohio Senior Services Inc., owners of Mapel Knoll Village, pulled the plug on the project. The project resumed when project director Alan Bayowski raised the necessary \$100,000 through a partnership with the Cincinnati Council On Aging and six other agencies. Station equipment came from the University of Cincinnati's WGUC and will be installed at the new station for a May 17th sign-on. The station will broadcast adult standards and senior activities information.

Broadcast Programming introduces two new formats: "The Heart Of The Seventies" and "Radio X". "The Heart Of The Seventies" will feature 700 of the best Top 40 hits from the 70's and will be formally introduced at the BP booth (#2140) at the NAB Radio Show in Los Angeles. "Radio X" is a new rock-alternative format designed and programmed by consultants Ed Shane and Cheryl Broz for Shane Media Services, Houston. In addition, the "The Rarities Collection," a special five-CD set of lost and forgotten classics of the 70s, is also available. For more information call (800) 426-9082.

The Sports Collector's Radio Show, the program that is devoted exclusively to sports collecting celebrates its third anniversary and adds 20 new stations including: KYOK, Houston, WJDS, Jackson, MS, WCMF, Rochester, NY, and KTKK, Sandy (Salt Lake City), UT.

ABC News Radio has secured the exclusive rights to the audio portion of Court TV. ABC will also use Court TV correspondents for commentary and interviews, and will distribute a daily audio newscall of Court TV material.

MTV will present the Eagles in a rare televised concert performance on Wednesday, October 26 from 9-11 PM (ET/PT). The performance will be simulcast on the Westwood One Entertainment Network. The show took place this past April at the Warner Bros. Studios in Burbank just prior to the kick-off of their "Hell Freezes Over" tour.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission has released the list of stations that will be given the opportunity to migrate to the new AM expanded band. Hundreds of stations filed a letter of interest to be considered for migration. Only 79 stations made the cut.

The Commission cited many reasons why stations didn't make it, such as the Canadian, Mexican, and Region 2 Agreements; traveler's information stations; harmonic frequency relationships with existing stations; or preclusion by stations of higher ranking.

The Canadian Agreement restricts the assignment of stations within 500 km of the common border to 1620, 1640, 1660, 1680, and 1700 kHz with a U.S. priority on 1680 kHz and a Canadian priority on 1630 kHz. The Mexican Agreement restricts assignments within 450 km of the common border to 21 specified frequencies at specific locations. If an expanded band proposal for a station was within 45 km of an allotment specified by the Mexican Agreement, it received an expanded band allotment, provided it was not precluded by a station with a higher ranking or other factors.

The Public Notice announcing the plan outlines the process expanded band applicants can expect to see. We've paraphrased it here:

Stations not selected for migration will be given thirty days to file for reconsideration of the allotment plan, with arguments limited to addressing errors in the selection process. After the plan is finalized, a Public Notice will be issued to call for applications to be filed. Then, stations selected for migration will be given sixty days to file for a construction permit on their allotted channel (Form 301). After the applications are accepted for filing, they'll be put on a cut-off list and subject to petitions to deny, but not to competing applicants. After the applications are granted and the facilities have been built, the permittee will file a license to cover on Form 302. Licenses for stations in the expanded band will be issued for a term that is concurrent with the existing regular-band license.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

The FCC has proposed hiking the national ownership limits for minorities to 25 AM's and 25 FM's. It also proposed raising the limits on the number of minority or small business-owned stations that a non-minority owner can have a non-controlling but attributable interest in 5 AM's and 5 FM's. The Commission will ask for comments on the new proposal soon.

Mass Media Bureau Chief Roy Stewart hinted that the MMB will present proposals on how to increase minority ownership limits in other ways. One being talked about is a new "minority incubator" proposal, which would allow non-minority owners opportunities to invest in minority-owned stations. We're not sure how the minority incubator proposal would be any different than the 5/5 limits mentioned above.

According to Inside Radio, Commissioners are still concerned about the big question that yet remains unanswered-- What does it matter to raise ownership limits for minorities if they can't get capital in the first place? Capital has been tough to come by for anyone in recent months.

The NAB's Jeff Baumann, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, stated in a release that he is disappointed that the Commission didn't choose to move ahead on duopoly relief for small market broadcasters, but applauded the Commission's efforts on minority ownership.

M Street: We've seen station groups buying more and more stations, but NO ONE has hit even the EXISTING limits yet, let alone any minority-owned groups, although groups like Willis Broadcasting and U.S. Media are closer than anyone. Also, there has been very little interest by non-minority groups purchasing non-controlling interests in minority-owned stations. We have to wonder why the Commission is raising the ceiling on limits that haven't much gotten off the ground.

Also out of this week's meeting, expanded-band AM stations won't count against the proposed limits if the owner hasn't already made plans to migrate during the five-year transition period. A complete listing of those stations who will be the first to be allowed to migrate are listed later in this issue.

The FCC denied a petition filed by Polnet Communications' WKTA, Evanston, IL, which asked the Commission to recalculate the interference improvement factors for stations that have petitioned to migrate to the AM expanded band. Polnet alleged that the Mass Media Bureau's formula for figuring improvement factors should have accounted for areas of interference that weren't exclusively caused by the station petitioning to migrate. This omission, Polnet says, resulted in unrealistically small improvement factors for stations like WKTA.

The Commission denied the petition, stating that if the formula to figure improvement factors included the interference issues WKTA says should belong in the formula, the interference reduction for anyone in an area of multiple-station interference would be marginal. Consequently, the Commission saw no reason to reconsider it's action.

The FCC has approved the transfer of WOWO-AM & FM, Ft. Wayne, IN from Price Communications to Inner City Broadcasting, despite over 200 objection letters and petitions to deny. According to Radio & Records, the Commission told opponents they'll be able to object to the reduction of WOWO's signal, once Inner City files to make the planned engineering changes. Inner City plans to sell the AM to Pathfinder Communications once they've made their facilities changes.

The Commission messed up on the filing period in which interested parties could apply for several new allotments. The filing window period opens on October 21 (instead of October 24), and closes November 21, for the following new allotments:

CANADA THIS WEEK

The loss of six AM stations in Quebec recently has raised the eyebrows of the CRTC. In a news release, CRTC Chairman Keith Spicer stated, "The CRTC deeply regrets today's closure of six Quebec AM radio stations, especially the impact this will have on the communities they served, as well as on some very talented, dedicated employees. The six stations were shut down as a result of a merger of Telemedia and Radiomutuel, two of Canada's largest operators.

Spicer admitted that despite the best intentions of the CRTC, "we must face the realities of the marketplace," referring to listeners increasingly turning to the FM band. However, he cautioned, "During the coming days, we will be assessing the impact on the communities to ensure each market continues to have an acceptable level of service and a diversity of voices on the radio dial. Our first step will be to talk to Radiomutuel and Telemedia because, while they informed us of their decision as a courtesy shortly before it was made public, we do not yet have all of the facts."

ELSEWHERE

Omaha will get a new duopoly soon as WTMJ, Inc., who is purchasing rock combo KEZO-AM & FM from Narragansett Radio, will buy classic rocker KKCD-FM from Vantage Communications. No terms were disclosed. WTMJ, Inc. owns several midwestern television stations, as well as WSAU/WIFC, Wausau, WI, WTMJ/WKTI, Milwaukee, and KQRC-FM, Leavenworth, KS (Kansas City).

Clear Channel Communications is playing musical stations in Houston as it's announced plans to pick up 80% of Sunbelt Broadcasting's AM news/talk combo KPRC and KSEV, while purchasing former SMA partner urban oldies KYOK and urban KMJQ, both Houston. Sunbelt will keep 20% of KPRC and KSEV. Terms for that deal were not disclosed. The KYOK/KMJQ purchase from Noble Broadcasting Group is for \$38.5 million. Clear Channel already owns urban AC KHYS, Port Arthur and urban KBXX, as well as nearby gospel outlet KALO, Port Arthur, serving the Beaumont market. They've announced they'll spin KALO, KYOK, and KHYS off to Faith Broadcasting soon for an undisclosed amount, and keep KBXX.

The radio industry continues to grow at double-digit rates of advertising revenue. The Radio Advertising Bureau reports a 13% August gain of combined national spot and local radio versus its August, 1993 performance.

ABC/SMN and Compass Media are letting their "Kool Gold" format go away as of December 31, 1994. Bob Hughes of Compass Media confirmed that it won't go to another syndicator when it dies. Compass has agreed to help assist a couple of current affiliates past December 31 with music lists and format clocks. "Kool Gold" will continue on Compass-owned stations KCBQ in San Diego and KOOL in Phoenix. "Kool Gold" was distributed and marketed by ABC/SMN and produced by Compass Media.

Two stations have gotten their hands slapped by Arbitron for special station activities during the Summer book. KHTT, Muskogee, OK (Tulsa) got a 5B notice and a tape flag for this promo statement: "If you're keeping track, write K-Hits 106.9." WMGF, Mount Dora, FL (Orlando) was hit with a 5B note for using a contest entry form called a "Listening Diary" that Arbitron says may have sensitized diarykeepers.

An Arbitron Hispanic radio listening habit study conducted during the Spring 1994 Survey revealed that 44 percent of all listening by Hispanics is to Spanish language stations. Hispanics listen to their choice of format on average of 10 hours a week as compared to 7.33 hours average time for the general population age 12+. The study was taken of Hispanics in age group 12+, in 96 markets from March 31 through June 22, 1994. The study also shows that Hispanic women are more avid listeners to Spanish language radio than their male counterparts and the top three format preferences are 1) Spanish 43.8%, 2) Top 40/CHR 14.7% and 3) Adult Contemporary 10.2%. The study did not break Spanish radio listening out into its individual formats.

There's more than one way to skin a cat, and the Chicago National Association of Broadcast Employees and Technicians (NABET) certainly found a most clever way. According to the Chicago Sun Times, the union was trying to get ads placed on local radio stations supporting a boycott of NBC-owned Channel 5 with no success. So, they rewrote the commercials on behalf of George Larney, who is running for a seat in the Illinois 9th Congressional District. Since stations can't edit political ads, the spots are running--and in accordance with lowest unit charge rules.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

The Interep Radio Store's new study titled "Active, Affluent, Adventuresome... Adults 50-plus" show that consumers 50 years and older are becoming a mandatory buy for marketers and advertisers because their discretionary spending is "unchallenged by any other age group in the U.S." The new study also found: Household incomes for adults 45-64 are estimated to be the highest in the country and householders aged 55-64 register the highest per capita discretionary spending income in the country. More than 77% of householders aged 50-plus own their own homes. Radio reaches 91-96% of all adults 50-plus each week. High concentration of the 50-plus listeners can be found tuning into Adult Standards, All-News, News/Talk and Country stations. Interep has named Michael Weiss to head up the newly created Infinity Radio Sales, which will exclusively handle all of the Infinity-owned radio stations. Weiss moves up from Regional Executive of Interep's Midwestern office in Chicago.

In recognition of January as Radio Month, the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) is mailing Radio Month kits to all U.S. radio stations to celebrate two events: Radio's 75th anniversary and radio's first \$10 billion year. "The Sound of Your Life" (Susquehanna agreed to share the slogan) campaign kit has music created by TM Century and is accompanied by bumper stickers by U.S. Tape & Label. Stations are free to use the materials all of next year.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission reports that 2,000 radio stations have taken advantage of the revised radio ownership rules since their inception two years ago. These stations are now either in duopoly situations or in Local Marketing Agreements that would not have been possible under the old rules. On a national basis, the Commission's report says that the average group owner (no definition of "average" given) owns 6.2 radio stations, as opposed to 6.1 before the new rules. The Commission was quick to point out the report makes no general conclusions about the long-term effect of the rule changes on the radio industry. The full text of the report will be released with the text of the Commission's decision on reconsideration of the revised rules.

The FCC has changed the license renewal dates for FM radio and television translator stations and LPTV stations to coincide with those of full service radio or television stations operating in the same state. The Commission also eliminated FCC Form 348 (Application for Renewal of a Low Power TV, TV Translator, or FM Translator Station License) and revised Form 303-S (Application for Renewal of License) to include information formerly included on Form 348.

The Commission said these form revisions will permit translator stations co-owned with primary stations in the same state which rebroadcast the same signal as the primary station to file for license renewal on a single application form with their primary station. The Commission hopes to cut paperwork and save money by conforming renewal dates and combining the forms.

During the transition periods, those broadcasters filing for translator license renewals will be granted renewals only through the expiration of the license period for the main station being retransmitted. They will then have to file again for full-term license renewal. Realizing that some broadcasters will have to file two applications within a short time period, the Commission will waive the application fees for any translator that is required by this action to be filed within 26 months of the station's most recent prior renewal filing.

Still upset about the Westin MisAdventure in Los Angeles? You'll have someone new to complain to soon. The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) named Haidee H. Calore to Senior VP of conventions and exhibitions effective November 14th. She will be responsible for the management, development and execution of five trade show events with total revenue for the five exceeding \$20 million. Calore is replacing Rick Dobson who leaves the NAB November 1st to join Atwood/Galaxy as Executive VP of Marketing.

CANADA THIS WEEK

Listeners in Quebec City and Montreal will have the rare opportunity to hear religious programming as the CRTC has authorized new stations that will broadcast religious French-language programming soon. Radio Ville-Marie will broadcast to Montreal on 91.3 MHz. Fondation Humanite' 2000 will operate on 90.9 MHz in Quebec City, as well as a transmitter at Beauceville on 102.5 MHz. Radio Ville-Marie is limited to six minutes of advertising per hour, up to 504 minutes per week, while Fondation Humanite' will operate similarly to a U.S. non-commercial religious station, and will not be able to sell advertising.

ELSEWHERE

WOR Network's Gene Burns, has decided to resign from the web over differences of opinion with management over programming content. The resignation is effective immediately. Burns has been a staple of the network ever since its launch. WOR will be filling in with political strategist Jay Severin until a replacement can be found.

Arbitron is reissuing the Albany-Schenectady-Troy book after a diary review revealed that WWCP-FM, Clifton Park, NY, which recently became a WDRE Network affiliate, had all of its listening credited to WDRG-FM, Hartford. The WDRE Network identifies itself as "DRE" on the air, which probably caused the confusion with WDRG. Neither station can be heard in each other's market.

Arbitron's Radio Presurvey Bulletin is out for the Fall '94 book, which began September 22. The book runs through December 14. As announced earlier, both the Anaheim and San Diego North County books have been discontinued. Three metros will increase their frequency of measurement from one book a year to two--San Luis Obispo, CA; Trenton, NJ; and South Bend, IN. Three metros have added counties--Lafayette, LA; Louisville, KY; and Des Moines, IA.

Since several cities in Virginia are considered equivalent to a county by the Census Bureau, Arbitron has established several metro areas in that state as independent city sampling units. Previously, these cities were attached to a nearby county. The survey area definitions will not change.

Also, fifteen more markets have signed up for the metro sample increases. Sample sizes for these markets will go up fifteen percent this book. They are Billings, MT; Cleveland, OH; Columbus, OH; Evansville, IN; Hagerstown, MD; Harrisburg-Lebanon-Carlisle, PA; Merced, CA; New Orleans, LA; Oxnard-Ventura, CA; Riverside-San Bernardino, CA; San Diego, CA; Santa Barbara, CA; Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater, FL; Visalia-Tulare-Hanford, CA; and West Palm Beach-Boca Raton, FL.

Coming in the Winter '95 book, you'll see some things you haven't seen before, including trending information, and the elimination of total lines for simulcasting stations. Also, stations will have the opportunity to choose their format from a list of M Street-like formats in the station information packet. This format will be listed on the facilities page of the new book. The station will also be able to choose not to list its format at all.

Less than a year after they bought KBLA, Santa Monica and KNAC, Long Beach from L.A. real estate mogul Fred Sands, Keymarket has spun off KNAC for \$13 million, hauling in a tidy \$6 million profit from the sale. The rock FM will go to Liberman Broadcasting, which owns two Spanish AM's in L.A.--KKHJ, Los Angeles, and KWIZ, Santa Ana.

Shortly after the purchase of hot AC combo KXYQ, Milwaukie/KXYQ-FM, Salem, OR, to create a Portland duopoly with AC KKCW, Beaverton, OR, Trumper Communications is putting the stations on the block in order to form Trumper Communications II, the focus of which will be to acquire stations in markets 25-75. In a press release, President & CEO Jeff Trumper said, "I would love to roll all the stations from Trumper I into Trumper II, but differences in investment strategies prohibit that." Trumper is teaming up with Media Communications Partners and Providence Ventures to launch the new group.

In Portland, ME, Ron Frizzell's Wireless Talking Machine Company is doubling up on the FM band by purchasing Beacon Broadcasting's WHTT, Lewiston, ME. Price was not disclosed. Frizzell already owns adult standards combo WLAM, Gorham/WZOU, Lewiston, ME; and AC WKZS, Auburn, ME; and operates WJTO, Bath, ME under an LMA. Frizzell will not go ahead with the previously announced plan to purchase WVYH, North Windham, ME (which has not yet been built) from Sebago Broadcasting.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Evergreen Media Corp. rejected an offer this week by Jacor to buy all of the outstanding shares of the company, at approximately \$20 per share. Evergreen's Chairman and CEO Scott Ginsburg said the Board unanimously rejected the offer, as it would not serve the interests of the company's shareholders.

Supertramp, Pablo Cruise, and Seals & Crofts are just a few of the artists listeners in several markets across the country will hear as Westwood One's 70's format hits the air November 1. According to WWI President Ed Salamon, the format will launch with 15 affiliates and feature a "foreground personality approach and a unique mainstream music mix. We've sampled an hour, and find the mix strikingly similar to Coleman researched KJR-FM, Seattle:

Ever wondered how much the big "big guys" make. According to Radio Only, the new daily fax publication from the makers of *Inside Radio*, Infinity's Mel Karmazin does a meager \$1,925,798 in salary each year, without stock. Even though Norm Pattiz is out of the day-to-day at Westwood One, he still pulls in \$570,000 a year. Group W Broadcasting's CEO Bill Korn comes in at \$1,097,079. Art Kellar and Alan Box, EZ Communications' head honchos, make about \$277,000 per year. Jacor's co-CEO's Randy Michaels and Robert Lawrence make \$481,000 each, but Terry Jacobs, Jacor's retired CEO makes five times that amount, pulling down \$2,046,748. Emmis's Chairman Jeff Smulyan earns just over \$600 K. Clear Channel's Lowry Mays does \$851,153 per year, while Citicasters CEO John Zanotti, who runs both the TV and radio groups, makes \$871,782.

Robert Smith, aka Wolfman Jack, is suing California Senate contender Republican Michael Huffington for unspecified damages after Huffington imitated Wolfman's voice and "wolf calls" in several campaign ads without Smith's permission. According to Reuter's, Smith's attorneys claim the commercials made it appear that Smith had endorsed Huffington.

Everyone hears about the big station transactions. Here's a little one in upstate New York. Peter Hunn, who has owned and managed W222, Fulton, NY (north of Syracuse) for years, has sold the 1000 watt daytimer for \$150,000 to David Zinkhann of Youngwood, PA. Zinkhann has an interest in the country/classic rock combo of WEMR/WYMK, Tunkhannock, PA (Scranton/Wilkes-Barre), and is the GM of adult contemporary combo WCVI, Connelville/WPQR, Uniontown, PA. Ray Rosenblum was the broker on the transaction.

Major networks has picked up "Fax-A-Tak" a syndicated, faxed comedy service for morning shows. The Atlanta-based service will continue to be written by Kevin Healey.
