EVERGREEN AND BROADCASTING PARTNERS MERGE IN PUBLIC. In what is said to be the first merger of two publicly traded radio companies, Evergreen Media and Broadcasting Partners have decided to hook up in a deal valued at \$243 million, and finally give Evergreen the New York signal it's always wanted. Evergreen will acquire all of BPI's common stock for \$12 in cash and .46 shares of Evergreen's Class A common stock. Evergreen will also refinance \$81 million of BP's long-term debt. The deal pegs the station tally for the new entity at 22--eight of the top 10 markets--with four FM's in Chicago. (Evergreen has rock combo WLUP and WRCX, BP has urban AC WVAZ and urban WEJM-FM. Each company has an AM there, as well.) They'll ask the Commission for a one-to-a-market waiver "for a limited period of time" until they can find a buyer. The combined revenue of the two companies in 1994 was \$160 million.

MUSICA PARA LAS PALOMAS. Heftel Broadcasting, which has completely surrounded Dallas-Ft. Worth with their Tejano and Regional Mexican programming, have taken it to the bird. The two formats will be syndicated via satellite. The Tejano format, based at KICI, Denton (Dallas), kicks off as "Hot Tejano Hits." KMRT, Dallas, will be the base for the Regional Mexican format.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission has upheld a decision that David Ortiz Radio Corp. is not qualified to be a Commission licensee. Ortiz was disqualified for misrepresenting facts to the Commission in a proceeding for a new FM in Lajas, PR. In an application for review, Ortiz contended that these decisions were wrong on all counts and asked to be absolved. The Commission ruled that the Administrative Law Judge ruled correctly and upheld the earlier decision.

Linda F. Calhoun has joined the Mass Media Bureau as a Special Assistant to the Bureau Chief. Calhoun was with the communications law firm of Morrison & Foerster for four years and is a member of the Federal Communications Bar Association.

ELSEWHERE

KKSB, Santa Barbara, CA, the country station at 1290 KHz, changed its call letters to KZBN this week after being purchased by "Rotijefco, Inc." from Guy and Joyce Erway for \$299,000. New call letters often have a special meaning for the new owners. In this case, the "BN" in KZBN stand for "Bob Newhart." According to the Santa Barbara News-Press, Rotijefco, Inc. is comedian Bob Newhart's corporation, named after letters in his kids names--Rob, Tim, Jennifer, and Courtney. Newhart plans to flip the station to adult standards, and is planning to buy stations in other Southern California markets. The station will keep its sales LMA with Atmor Properties' KTMS and KHTY, both Santa Barbara.

Charlotte will welcome a new duopoly as Tom Harrell's WSTP and WRDX, Salisbury (Charlotte), NC are being sold to The Dalton Group for \$3 million. Dalton also owns oldies WWMG-FM, Shelby (Charlotte). WSTP runs adult standards. WRDX is famous for its beach music-oldies format. Dalton immediately enters into an LMA with the combo.

In the Beaumont/Port Arthur, TX area, in a strange twist of fate, GulfStar Communications announced it's trading down up its duopoly there as it will acquire AC KMY, Orange (Beaumont) for an undisclosed amount from Uno Broadcasting. GulfStar already owns news-talker KLVI and country KYKR, both Beaumont, and regional Mexican outlet KLTN, Port Arthur. GulfStar says it will sell KLTN, which covers Houston, and is currently in an LMA with regional Mexican KLAT, Houston. The resulting KMY/KYKR combo allows GulfStar to concentrate on the Beaumont/Port Arthur market. However, the release did not mention if it will sell to the owner of its LMA partner, Tichenor Media Systems.

New Jersey Governor Christie Whitman has kept her campaign promise to Howard Stern. She's renamed a highway rest-stop in Stern's honor--and not everyone's laughing about it. From a story in Inside Radio, the Trenton Times reports NJ N.O.W. President Myra Terry is outraged. During an appearance on Stern's show in 1993, Whitman pledged to Stern she'd rename the stop if elected. Stern was one of the first to endorse Whitman.

"Heavy-handed" EFM Network faxed an "apology" to affiliates this week after an earlier fax was sent warning stations that they would be "defining (our) relationship" if they pre-empted Rush at any time without notifying the network. The follow-up fax apologized for sounding "heavy-handed" and said it was sent because of advertisers' concerns.

Westwood One has filed suit against Dick Clark's Olive Enterprises for breach of contract. The suit alleges Clark began marketing "Countdown America" and "Dick Clark's Rock, Roll, & Remember" three months before the end of an exclusive marketing and production contract with the Westwood's Unistar Radio Networks, which terminated December 31, 1994. The suit asks for unspecified damages.

It's page 5-B notice season as the Fall '94 Arbitron's roll out. WPOR (AM) & FM, Portland, ME, got hit for a "Dear Diary" promo. You won't find WGL, Fort Wayne above the line this book. They got a cover notice, tape flag, and below-the-line listing for telling listeners in a promo "When a diary comes to your home, don't just ignore it or give it to the kids." The promo went on to say, "If you want to have a say in what the media in this community is doing for you, let them know. Fill out a diary! It's your choice."

Ever wonder how Arbitron rates? In a recently released ranking of the top research companies by U.S. research revenue conducted by Advertising Age magazine, Arbitron ranked third behind Nielsen and Information Resources, Inc., with gross U.S. research revenues of \$172.2 million for 1993. That total is down 3.4 % from 1992. Domestically, Nielsen did \$710 million in 1993, miles ahead of Information Resources, which came in at \$284.3 million. Nielsen's worldwide total research revenue comes in at a staggering \$1.868 billion. Scarborough parent VNU finished fourth with U.S. research revenue of \$160 million.

WOR Network has announced a permanent replacement for Gene Burns' 4 to 7 pm weekday slot. Jay Severin took over this week, focusing on current events and interviews. Severin is chairman of Severin/Aviles/Associates based in New York City, a political advisory firm.

Public Radio International (the old American Public Radio Net.), is being true to its name by opening a Germany Bureau. George Lewinski will be the International editor based in Berlin. Former BBC World Service television reporter Caroline Wyatt will head the bureau.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

FCC Chairman Reed Hundt had a surprise for broadcasters in an FCC proposal to Congress--automatic license renewal. The proposal eliminates comparative hearings unless the broadcaster has had serious FCC violations. Other items mentioned in the proposal includes extending the statute of limitations of station fines to five years up from the current one year term.

The FCC has denied Reding Broadcasting Company's application for review of actions by the Mass Media Bureau granting the applications for assignment of license of KEEP, Bandera, TX from Big Pine Broadcasting, Inc. to James G. Withers and the assignment of KRME and KRBH, Hondo, TX, from Radio Medina, Inc. to Withers. In its objections, Reding had argued that grant of the applications should be reversed because the KEEP assignment involved a "bare license"; that Withers was financially unqualified; that Withers held an undisclosed 49 percent ownership in KRME/KRBH; and that Radio Medina will remain a real party in interest in the two stations. In its application for review, Reding reargued these points and also argued that the KRBF permit is being sold for a profit. The Commission denied the review, and simply agreed with the Bureau's analysis that Reding's arguments were without merit.

Educational Media Foundation's KLVS, Kingsbury, CA, and KLVN, Chowchilla, CA has asked the Commission to allow them to operate as a non-commercial stations. KLVS is on 106.3 MHz serving the Fresno market. KLVN is on 93.3 MHz in the Merced market.

Engineers from the FCC's Kansas City office closed down a pirate radio station in Joplin, MO. The station equipment, which was in the basement of the operators home, was seized by U.S. Marshals. At the time the pirate station was identified by FCC direction-finding techniques, a second station operator was noted at the same station who had subsequently been linked to a national pirate radio journal and pirate radio computer bulletin board. Both operators received warning letters.

Interep has filed a "Friend of the Court" brief in support of Valley Broadcasting's case which challenges a federal statute barring the broadcast of advertisements for a wide range of lotteries, including casino gambling and other forms of gaming. The case, Valley Broadcasting v. USA, is scheduled for oral argument in the U.S. Court of Appeals, Ninth Circuit. Previously, a lower court declared the statute unconstitutional as applied to broadcast stations in Nevada, and the FCC suspended enforcement of the ban until the appeal is decided. Interep argues that the ban is discriminatory because the lottery rules allow advertising through some media but not others, and thus violates the First Amendment and Equal Protection Clause of the Constitution.

ELSEWHERE

In one of the most legalese press releases we've seen, Sonny Bloch's Independent Broadcasters Network is merging with Spartan Funding Company. Terms weren't disclosed, however, Spartan's new board is made up of Sonny, Paul Bloch, and IBN's president Stephen Wiegner. The press release includes lines such as, "IBN, and Mr. H.I. "Sonny" Bloch, a principal shareholder of IBN, disclaim any responsibility for, and hereby nullify, a prior press release issued by Spartan dated October 11, 1994. Spartan also wishes to change the same press release to reflect the current amended projects." Bloch has been under fire for dealings with two unscrupulous advertisers on his weekday talk show. Spartan's new location will be with the IBN headquarters in Clearwater, FL.

Interep has released format share results for Arbitron's 94 continuously measured markets. Growth formats for the Fall '94 book were news/talk, oldies, and new rock. Urban, AOR, and AC suffered declines. Country, CHR and Spanish held their ground. News/talk continues to be the #1 ranking format with a 15.0 share of 12+ listening, up from 14.2 for the Summer '94 book. Interep's format study is based on M Street format classifications.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Radio advertising revenue grew at a rate of 11.3% in 1994 to an estimated \$10.652 billion, up from \$9.568 in 1993, giving radio its fastest rate of ad revenue growth since 1985. According to the Radio Advertising Bureau, national spot was up 14.8% for the year, while local was up 11.2%.

Birmingham-based TAPSCAN founder Jim Christian and former C.O.O. Dave Carlisle have reached an out-of-court settlement. Terms of the settlement weren't disclosed, however Carlisle has resigned from the board of directors and will launch his own radio venture soon. Christian retains 100% ownership of TAPSCAN.

The latest duopoly in the West Palm Beach market goes to American Radio Systems, which is purchasing WKGR, Ft. Pierce from Amaturio Group for \$19 million. ARS is also buying rocker WPBZ, Indiantown, FL, for \$10 million, but will immediately spin it off to a third party buyer. ARS owns talker WBZT and country WIRK, both West Palm Beach.

In the Parkersburg, WV market, The Dailey Corporation has sold WFGM to Fantasia Broadcasting for \$1.2 million, giving Fantasia a duopoly there. Fantasia owns news-talker WMMN (AM) & easy listening WMMN-FM, Fairmont. The broker on the transaction was Ray Rosenblum.

Barnstable Broadcasting may be doubling up in the Harrisburg market by buying Gemini Broadcasting's talker WCMB and CHR WIMX, pending resolution by the bankruptcy court. Barnstable bid \$2.25 million for the combo. Michael J. Bergner of Bergner & Co. was the exclusive broker.

Herald Broadcasting, the shortwave broadcasting service of the Christian Science Monitor, has sold its worldwide shortwave station WCSN, Scott's Corners, ME, for \$5 million cash to World Voice of Historic Adventism. Herald also operates shortwave outlets WSHB, Cypress Creek, SC, and KHBI, Saipan, MP. Herald began using the SC transmitters to reach Europe and Africa, diminishing the need for the Maine station.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

In San Francisco, Capital Cities/ABC won permission to own two AM's and a TV in San Francisco--a waiver of the one-to-a-market rule. The Commission approved the transfer of KSFO from First Broadcasting to Cap Cities, and granted the waiver, stating that, "in this instance is consistent with the public interest and would have no effect on diversity and competition in the San Francisco market."

Capital Cities/ABC will finally get to close on KMPC, but someone's going to have to come up with another twenty grand. The FCC finally ruled on EEO problems from four or five years back for Golden West Broadcasting, KMPC and sister KSCA's licensee, for not recruiting enough qualified applicants. The ruling clears the way for approval of the transfer of KMPC to Cap Cities.

The FCC handed out another EEO fine, this time for \$10,000, to WWCT, Peoria. The NAACP asked for a reconsideration of the decision, which was dismissed.

The National Association of Broadcasters has announced the results of the Radio and Television Board of Directors election. In radio, incumbents Richard Ferguson (NewCity Communications), Jerry Lee (WBEB), and Bill Evans (WQXE-FM), were reelected in districts 1, 3 and 5 respectively. New directors include Dean Goodman (Paxson) District 7, Michael McDougald (WRGA/WQTU) 9, Verna Green (WJLB-FM) 13, and Bobby Caldwell (KWYN) 15. Other radio winners were Roger Coleman (WGEN) 17, "J.R." Curtis (KPRO) 19, James Kefford (KSRO/KLCQ-FM) 23, and Gary Grossman (KRKT) 23. Run-off elections are required for Districts 11 and 21.

ELSEWHERE

Ft. Myers Broadcasting Company has found a sister for its AM-FM-TV group in Ft. Myers. It's purchasing talker WDCQ, Pine Island Center, FL from Network Properties of America, Ltd. for \$560,000. Ft. Myers Broadcasting owns WINK-AM & FM. The AM is talk, the FM is AC. Broker on the deal was Donald K. Clark.

Barnstable Broadcasting is doubling up in the Portland, ME, market by picking up sports outlet WLPZ, Westbrook, ME and hot AC, WCSO, Portland from Atlantic Morris Broadcasting for \$1.9 million. Barnstable already owns soft AC WHOM, Mt. Washington, NH,

Arbitron has run into some crediting problems with the most recent Fall '94 book. In the Lafayette, IN book, it is reassigning two diaries from a TSA county to a metro county. The change caused a slight adjustment to the listening of several stations, forcing Arbitron to reissue the book. In Denver, the book has also been recalled because KXPK-FM, Evergreen, CO, didn't get all the listening it should have. The station is known as "The Peak," but the station just signed on a while back, so Arbitron's ascription procedures didn't pick it up in the previous book. Consequently, all the listening went to KRDO-FM, Colorado Springs, which is also calling itself the "Peak", and is about 60 miles south of Denver.

Ludlow Porch will begin syndicating his popular morning show on his own on March 1. WSB, Atlanta, where the show used to be based, was also handling the syndication. Porch's new network, "The FunSeeker's Network," broadcasts the show from 9 am to 12 noon ET. With the move, the show will switch to Galaxy VI rather than Galaxy IV, also beginning March 1. SONNY'S NEXT CALLER. . .THE F.B.I. The financial records of nationally-syndicated financial talk show host Sonny Bloch were seized in New York and Florida by federal agents this week as he faces federal investigations and at least two class-action lawsuits. According to Inside Radio and the St. Petersburg Times, in addition to the civil charges, he faces an investigation by the U.S. Attorneys in both New York and New Jersey surrounding the funding of his station purchases with memberships from listeners. The Securities and Exchange Commission is also looking into the allegations. Bloch's attorney, Paul Goldberger, claims they were complying with an agreed-upon schedule to turn over documents. But, Jayne Blumberg, a U.S. Attorney based in Newark, apparently wanted to speed up the process. She ordered the seizure of the documents.

MAJOR WELCOMES STANDARD NEWS AS THE EXXIT EXITS. . . Pretty major changes at Major Networks this week as it's announced it will purchase StandardNews and ZapNews from Broadcast Equities. Terms were not disclosed. Broadcast Equities has been shopping the services for quite some time. Major has also sold its alternative format, the Exxit, to the DRE Network. WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission has renewed the license of WMYG, Braddock, PA, subject to reporting conditions, but fined licensee WHYW Associates, LP, \$16,000 for EEO violations. The Commission approved a settlement agreement between the station and the NAACP over WMYG's failure to "engage in affirmative recruitment efforts for a substantial number of its vacancies and failed to maintain adequate records for self-assessment." However, the Commission found no evidence of employment discrimination, as the NAACP alleged.

In a similar situation, the Commission has granted a "hardship" waiver to Glendive Broadcasting which is purchasing KDZN from Magic-Air Communications. Glendive also owns KXGN (AM) and KXGN-TV, giving them three of the four media outlets in the market. The sale was approved because the Commission felt the disappearance of the station would hurt the community (Glendive has less than 2,000 people), and that this was more important than meeting the requirements of the failed-station standard.

The Commission granted a petition for the distress sale of rocker KBER, Ogden, UT (Salt Lake City) to Radiowest Communications L.P. for \$1.65 million. The seller, Chris Devine, had been accused of controlling both KBER and country KUJJ, Spanish Fork, UT, (also Salt Lake) before the duopoly rules had taken effect.

Pyramid Communications has been granted a waiver of the one-to-a-market rule on behalf of Leonard Lieberman, who is a nominee to Pyramid's board of directors. Lieberman currently sits on the board of Outlet Communications, which owns WJAR (TV) in Providence, RI, while Pyramid owns WJMN, Boston, MA. Because the Grade A signal of WJAR encompasses the entire city of Boston, Lieberman's seat on Pyramid's board is "inconsistent" with the one-to-a-market rule. Pyramid successfully argued that the waiver request for Boston satisfies the top 25 markets/30 voices presumptive waiver.

The FCC's Office of Engineering and Technology is restructuring itself to "operate more efficiently and effectively." The office handles four divisions: Policy and Rules, Allocations and Standards, Equipment Authorization, and New Technology Development. With the restructuring, the office has moved to 2000 M Street, Washington, DC 20554. The main number is (202) 739-0700.

ELSEWHERE

There are so many duopolies to report this week, they're deserving of their own section. Duopoly market of the week is Portland, OR. Duopoly dealer of the week is Paul Fiddick's Heritage Media, which does two deals in as many days.

Trumper Communications is abandoning Portland, OR, as they've decided to sell their duopoly to separate bidders. Heritage is picking up talker KXYQ, Milwaukie, and AC KXYQ-FM, Salem, OR, for \$7 million.

Citicasters will double up there, too, as it buys Trumper's AC KKCW, Beaverton, OR, for \$30 million. Citicasters owns AC/talker KEX and hot AC KKRZ there. Closing should be in second quarter, 1995.

In other Portland news, Apogee Communications is buying soft AC KMUZ-FM, Camas, OR, from Pacific Northwest Broadcasting Corp. to combo with its classic rocker KGON, Portland and sports outlet KFXX, Oregon City, OR. Apogee will take KMUZ-FM to a modern rock format under an immediate LMA.

In San Jose, KOOL Communications has sold classic rock KUFX, Gilroy (San Jose), to Baycom Partners, L.P., which already owns brokered ethnic KSJX and rocker KSJO, both San Jose. GM John Sutherland will manage all three stations.

Richmond, VA-based Sinclair Communications buys itself into a duopoly in Austin, TX from two separate owners there. It's buying alternative KGSR, Bastrop from Beasley Broadcasting's Central Texas Broadcasting, Inc. for \$5.3 million and southern gospel KOKE, Giddings, TX, for \$3.1 million.

Midwest Communications is buying into Kalamazoo in a big way. It's picking up Tri-State Broadcasting's four stations for \$4 million. They are easy listening WHEZ and 70's oldies WFAT-FM, Portage, MI, and country WTVB and AC WNWN, Coldwater, MI.

Puerto Rico gets a duopoly deal as Radio Aeropuerto is selling Spanish talker WRAI and oldies WLDI, San Juan to Primedia Broadcast Group for \$4.32 million. Radio Aeropuerto had owned the San Juan combo for 35 years. Primedia recently announced it will buy Spanish hits WOYE-FM, Mayaguez, and tropical WZNT, San Juan in separate transactions. The companies have entered into an LMA. Primedia plans to immediately spin-off WRAI.

Chicago-based talent agent Saul Foos pleaded guilty to mail fraud recently after receiving between \$6.8 and \$7.2 million from over 100 bogus investments used for his own personal financial gain. According to the Chicago Sun-Times, the now-bankrupt Foos was released on his own recognizance pending sentencing on May 24.

A crediting snafu has caused Arbitron to reissue the Montgomery, MS, Fall book after WVRK, Columbus, GA got credit for some listening to WMXS, Montgomery. The revised book affects some Montgomery stations and drops WVRK because it will not now meet minimum reporting standards.

Inside Radio reports that Capital Cities/ABC has axed KSFO, San Francisco talk-show host J. Paul Emerson after the ABC TV station in San Francisco refused to air an episode of Donahue on which Emerson appeared. Emerson is an outspoken right-leaning talker. KGO-TV claims they didn't want to give him a platform for his anti-gay and anti-AIDS views. The San Jose Mercury reports that the next morning on his radio show Emerson raved, "You don't put up with this kind of crap in America. That is bullshit. You can fire me for saying "bullshit" if you want. Americans deserved to see this show. I hope they fire me." This is the second time Emerson's been fired in two months.

If you missed this year's Radio Advertising Bureau Marketing Leadership Conference and Executive Symposium, make plans for next year now. Other than a couple of minor hotel snafus, the record 2,002 attendees were treated to standing-room-only sessions, an easy-to-navigate exhibit floor, and plenty of atrium/lounge space to do business. Afternoon to early evening exhibition hours coupled with seminars that started as early as 6 a.m. or as late as 9 p.m. made it easy to make it to everything without feeling rushed.

During Gary Fries' State of the Industry address, he announced he would be speaking soon at the Yellow Pages Publishers Association to explain the factors behind radio's edging out yellow pages as the fourth largest advertising medium. Other motivational and sales psychology speakers focused on providing radio marketers with keys to build station revenues and managing people. Next year's event is scheduled for Feb. 15-18 at the Loews Anatole Hotel in Dallas.

Despite multi-media bombardment, 96% of Americans still tune into radio on an average of nearly 23 hours weekly. "Radio Today," Arbitron's new 52 page report, shows that the key advertiser demographics - ages 25-54, 18-34, and teens - have even higher listening levels. The study also demonstrates that while TV viewing varies dramatically by season, there is little seasonal variation in radio. The finding notes that more than half of radio listening occurs away from home, closer to point-of-purchase decisions. Stations and ad agencies may obtain copies of "Radio Today" from their Arbitron rep.

The National Football League and CBS Radio have inked a new four-year contract, beginning in 1995, to continue broadcasting a full schedule of regular- and post-season NFL games. The contract provides a 53 game package, including the Super Bowl. CBS has held radio rights since 1978. The CBS Americas network will again offer extensive coverage in Spanish as well.

Inside Radio's Radio Only Management Conference is quickly approaching. The conference features a weekend of hot radio topics, management seminars, and personal development. It will happen April 28th through the 30th at the Scanticon Conference Center in Princeton, NJ. For more info, call (609) 424-6800.
