**ATLANTA RAVES.** . . Atlanta is arguably the Shangri-la of all U.S. radio markets, and it appears that Cox is ready to spend \$280 million just to buy a successful format there - without even keeping the frequency. WALR-FM owner Midwestern Broadcasting is studying Cox Radio's offer to pay \$280 million for the class C1 "Kiss" urban AC. Cox has to pony up that much money because Emmis made a "triggering offer", which Midwestern then took back to Cox. Cox has a right of refusal to buy WALR-FM, dating back to 1995. (And by the way: Emmis' Jeff Smulyan gets \$17 million just for tendering the offer.) Here's what M Street expects to happen: Cox will succeed in buying WALR-FM, Athens at 104.7 MHz. Then it will spin off the frequency and license to Salem (which gains its first FM in Atlanta). Cox puts the "Kiss" format on the current WJZF, La Grange at 104.1 MHz, now smooth jazz. But the dominos keep dropping: To complete the deal with Salem, Cox will give up KLUP, San Antonio and WSUN, Plant City, FL and in return gain a fourth FM in Houston - Salem's KKHT, Conroe at 106.9 MHz. Back in Atlanta, Midwestern is keeping its three AMS: WCNN, WALR and WFOM. Complicated? You bet. We'll do the play-by-play inside this week's M Street Journal.

**PHOENIX.** . . We finally know who will end up with the Hearst-Argyle radio stations in Phoenix: Emmis, in a cute tax-advantaged station-exchange deal that reminds us of the mechanism that enabled Emmis to gain smooth jazz WQCD, New York. The bottom line is that Emmis will start operating soft AC KKLK, news/talk KTAR and sports KMVP by July 1 in an LMA that could run as long as three years. Hearst-Argyle will start looking for a TV station that it would like to own - then ask Emmis to buy it, so they can do a like-kind tax-free exchange of broadcasting assets. Two years ago Emmis bought KTZZ-TV, Seattle and WXMI-TV, Grand Rapids to satisfy Tribune's price for WQCD.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

It's extended hours for the first-ever FCC filing window for Low Power FM, as the Commission propped the window three days longer than planned. It explained the extension by citing reports that applicants had trouble doing their electronic filing June 3 and 4 - a Saturday and Sunday. So it kept the filing window open until 11:59pm on Thursday, June 8 for electronic filers and until 7pm for paper filers. It's another demonstration that the FCC is really committed to Low Power FM, though the agency has extended other filing windows when it saw sufficient reason. As for the NAB's fight to stall LPFM: Every day that goes by gets us closer to the end of the 106th Congress. That means FCC Chairman Bill Kennard gets closer to realizing his dream, unless the federal courts stop him. We expect the next LPFM filing window to open in less than three months.

Who gets the other 9.5%? Gloria Tristani protests Citadel's "staggering" 90.5% revenue share in Bloomington, IL as a result of its purchase of the Bloomington Broadcast Group. Here's our thought: The FCC's approval of the transfer of this dominant three-station cluster is the most extreme example yet of not forcing a buyer to break up an existing local group. In Bloomington, CHR WBNQ, country WBWN and full service WJBC literally own a 90.5% share of the local market revenue. Tristani's proposed remedy: Require the seller to demonstrate that it tried to find a second buyer for one or more stations.

Antenna violations cost a Georgia station a fine of \$4,000, and WLBA, Gainesville, GA licensee La Favorita didn't help matters by failing to respond to the FCC's original Notice of Apparent Liability issued in February. M Street notes that WLBA (1130 KHz) has a CP to re-license to Powder Springs, GA and basically move in to Atlanta. Its current format is regional Mexican music, and they call it "La Mexicana."

**ELSEWHERE**

In Phoenix, Emmis is the new landlord at Hearst-Argyle's three sought-after radio stations, beginning a long-term LMA that will lead to a purchase worth \$160 million. As we said on page 1, Emmis will run these stations under an LMA while Hearst-Argyle searches for a suitable TV station that Emmis can buy -- instead of Emmis doing an outright purchase. Jeff Smulyan tells us that none of the current or announced Emmis TV properties will be the "trade bait" here. Emmis must pay \$160 million if they can't find a TV station to exchange for the radio properties by July 2003. The stations are soft AC KKLTV at 98.7 MHz, a full class C. News/talk KTAR at 620 KHz (5-kw fulltime, DA-N). And sports KMVP at 860 KHz (1-kw full-time, ND). We think Emmis out-bid at least Mel Karmazin's Infinity to win the coveted prize. We also think Clear Channel, rumored elsewhere as a bidder, passed on this particular auction, given the size of its current cluster there.

Hearst-Argyle remains in the radio business in Baltimore, Louisville and Greensboro, even though it was on the way out of radio when it acquired the Pulitzer broadcast holdings last year that included WLKY, Louisville (970 KHz) and Greensboro, NC-market WXII, Kernersville (830 KHz). Both AMs are closely tied to the TV news operations at their sister TV stations. Hearst-Argyle's only remaining radio stations before that were the Baltimore combo of WBAL (news/talk) and WIYY ("98 Rock") -- which also tie in with Hearst-Argyle sister WBAL-TV.

Atlanta's burning, all right - but it's due to the white-hot radio revenues and the deal-making. Cox Radio exercised its right of first refusal to buy WALR-FM from Midwestern for \$280 million, and Midwestern's Lew Dickey tells M Street they're studying the offer now. But we'll bet Cox Radio's Bob Neil gets what he wants: the intellectual property of "Kiss" WALR-FM, which he'll transfer to 104.1 MHz, the current home of smooth jazz WJZF. Because of its extensive broadcast holdings in Atlanta, Cox wouldn't be allowed to own another FM. And as the front-page story mentions, Cox swaps away to Salem the current 104.7 MHz Athens frequency where urban AC "Kiss" is now. The Kiss format will replace smooth jazz on Cox-owned WJZF, La Grange at 104.1 MHz.

Here's the rest of the Cox-Midwestern-Salem story: Cox is swapping away the frequency that WALR-FM is on (104.7 MHz, licensed as Athens, GA) to Salem. It's also giving Salem San Antonio market adult standards KLUP, Terrell Hills (930 KHz) and Tampa and Lakeland markets oldies WSUN, Plant City, FL (910 KHz). In return, Salem swaps to Cox its Houston-market KKHT, Conroe (106.9 MHz). And by the way, back in Atlanta, Midwestern is keeping WCNN, WALR-AM and WFOM, though it's a safe bet that WCNN, North Atlanta (680 KHz) will get a new format. WCNN recently started simulcasting urban AC WALR-FM, which is being sold.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

George Beasley's doing everything he can think of to expand his group through acquisitions, (buying six stations in Las Vegas and New Orleans), strengthening upper management (recruiting Allen Shaw back as Co-COO) and talking up the company to analysts. Beasley Broadcast Group went public in February at \$15.50 a share and has literally never traded that high since. A weak stock price means you're hamstrung when it comes to acquisitions, so getting "BBGI" up to respectability is a big priority. Here's what Beasley tried, this week -

Beasley gains the Centennial stations in Las Vegas and New Orleans for \$138 million, adding two new markets and another \$15 million in revenue. Here's the breakdown: In Las Vegas (Arbitron market #39), Centennial brings in adult standards "Jewel" KJUL at 104.3 MHz, a class C; classic rock KKLZ at 96.3 MHz, another C; and hot AC "Star" KSTJ. Boulder City, NV at 105.5 MHz, a C2 ("Star" is the onetime oldies KQOL-FM). And in New Orleans (Arbitron market #40), Beasley gets classic rock and Walton & Johnson home WRNO-FM at 99.5 MHz, a class C; R&B Oldies "Old School" KMEZ, Belle Chasse, LA at 102.9 MHz, a C3; plus adult standards WBYU at 1450 KHz.

A second part of the Beasley-Centennial agreement is that Allen Shaw returns to Beasley as Vice Chairman and Co-Chief Operating Officer. Allen was a key part of the company from 1985 to 1990, as COO. Then he left to start his own company, the original Centennial group (this one is actually Centennial II). Shaw is a "name" on Wall Street, which should be familiar with him from his efforts to grow the Centennial Broadcasting group. And very importantly for George Beasley and Beasley Broadcast Group, Allen Shaw brings in a non-"Beasley" name to top management. Allen Shaw may sell Centennial's final station, too. That's Ft. Pierce, FL-market WOSN, the market-leading adult standards station with a 12.2 share 12+ in the Fall Arbitron. We hear Beasley took a look at "Ocean FM" and decided to pass, since it doesn't own anything else there. WOSN is already co-located with Mitchell Rubenstein's local group. We wonder if Shaw will sell it to Rubenstein. Allen Shaw tried to roll up his Centennial group into a larger company last year, but they couldn't swing it. Oddly enough, we think one of the companies they were talking to was Beasley -- before George Beasley took his company public as a solo act in February.

Along the I-15 corridor north of Riverside-San Bernardino, Infinity supplements its Inland Empire cluster of country KFRG/KXFG with the \$3,537,500 pickup of Tele-Media's AM-FM combo there. The stations are adult standards KVVQ, Hesperia, CA at 910 KHz (1,000 watts day, 500 watts night, DA-2). And oldies KHDR-FM, Victorville, CA, a class A at 103.1 MHz. These days Tele-Media is mostly an East coast group, though after selling the Victorville-Hesperia stations, it will still own three stations further up I-15 in Barstow, CA: Talk KSZL (1230 KHz), oldies KDUC (94.3 MHz) and classic rock KXXZ (95.9 MHz).

In San Antonio, Hispanic spends \$45 million to buy its third and fourth FMs in this major Hispanic market, as Hispanic adds KBUC and KRNH to its KXTN-AM/FM and KROM (both regional Mexican) and KCOR (regional Mexican and sports, with Renan Coello in mornings). Hispanic is buying KBUC and KRNH from two separate sellers and will convert both from classic country to Spanish-language formats. Another thing: both facilities are in for significant technical upgrades. Here's what Hispanic just took off the table -- KBUC, licensed to Pleasanton, due south of San Antonio. KBUC is a class A at 98.3 MHz, but Hispanic's purchase is contingent on Reding Enterprises winning an upgrade that will move it to 98.5 MHz and make it a C1. Seller Reding is keeping a CP for a new C3 licensed to Jourdanon, TX at 95.7, which it plans to debut in early 2001. Hispanic forecasts a new format for KBUC in Q4 2000. Second station being purchased: KRNH at 95.1 MHz, licensed to Comfort, TX, northwest of San Antonio. KRNH has a Construction Permit to upgrade from a C2 to a C1 facility. Seller is Radio Ranch, Inc. Hispanic says it will unveil a new format on KRNH in the third quarter.

From Albany, NY to the world: Jim Morrell's Pamal group expands to Gainesville, Florida. This is Morrell's group -- formerly known as Albany Broadcasting -- taking its first step outside the northeast. Morrell's beachhead in northern Florida is the country simulcast of WDFL (1240 KHz) and WKZY (106.3 MHz), both licensed to Cross City. WKZY is the former WDFL-FM, and it recently built out its CP to make the facility a C1. WDFL-AM is a one-kilowatt, ND. Seller is Women in Florida Broadcasting, Ltd. Jim Morrell's stronghold is Albany, NY, where he's owned CHR "Fly 92" for many years. (He's also got soft AC WYJB, smooth jazz WZMR, urban WAJZ and talk/sports WROW in the Capital District.) Pamal's other markets are Poughkeepsie and Rutland, VT. Group name trivia: The "Pamal" name is a combination of the names of Jim Morrell's three kids.

**ELSEWHERE (cont'd)**

In Chicago, Catholic Family Radio moves closer to selling one of its two Chicago-market AMs - WAUR, Sandwich, IL (930 KHz), as we hear both sides still intend to close the \$4.4 million deal announced last October. The engineering issues are still apparently being worked through. Buyer Brad Saul's innovative idea for WAUR is to broker out most of the airtime while making the operation a training ground for disabled people who'd like careers in radio. As for the rest of the Catholic Family Radio station group -- M Street believes there is no group deal to sell it.

BroadcastSpots.com will sell time for One-On-One Sports' network and O&Os. The online buying-exchange says that adding One-On-One gives it affiliates in every top 20 market and a majority of the top 50. BroadcastSpots.com is the Chicago area venture founded by veteran group owner Jeff Trumper.

Scarborough continues to add features found in other research, as M Street finds that Scarborough Research will offer P1 info and format profiles in the next issue of its qualitative reports. Info about P1's (First Preference listeners) is something programmers are used to having from their experience with Arbitron products. The format profile lets subscribing stations gauge how they stack up against other stations in their format around the country. The P1 and format profile features will surface with Scarborough's Release 2, which starts in October. Scarborough competitor The Media Audit has offered a similar P1 feature for years, based on a "most often listened" question, and Arbitron's P1 is an often-used tool.

**M STREET BAZAAR. . . PEOPLE, PRODUCTS, AND PROGRAMMING**

We'll look forward to Dick Purtan emceeding the Marconis at the NAB Radio Show in San Francisco, at the big dinner and show on Saturday, September 23. Detroit radio veteran Purtan is the morning host at Infinity oldies WOMC, his base for years of charity work (he's raised over \$4.2 million for the Salvation Army alone). From what we can feel, San Francisco will be a more popular convention-city choice than last year's pick of Orlando (and the weather should be cooler!). The Radio Show is September 20-23. It's kids' stuff at the NAB, as the association delivers a new resource kit to help broadcasters address children's issues. The 2000 "Kids' Action Pak" should prod a few managers into thinking about how their station can improve the lot of children today, if nothing else.

Public Radio International hooks up with Sony Music-funded Redband Broadcasting, in a multi-faceted agreement where they'll co-develop audio programs and distribute each other's content. The new deal expands their current association, where Redband provides underwriting for PRI's The World, Marketplace Morning Report and the new Satellite Sisters talkshow. Speaking of public radio and the Internet, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting is sponsoring a new research study called the Public Internet Consumer Insight Study. Purpose: "provide a benchmark of public radio's role in the online world."

The Old West isn't dead, says Montie Montana, Jr. -- and it's ripe for a comeback on the radio. Montana, who's a real-life cowboy, published author, and owner of the Buffalo Bill Wild West Show, is branching out into radio with a new syndicated weekend show about the "Wild West." It should launch in the next several weeks, it runs an hour, and you can get more info about "The Wild West Show, featuring Montie Montana, Jr." from syndicator Abernat at 800-544-9890. And that's all we have to say on this subject, podnuh...

"We Remember" is a new short-form daily show from United Stations Radio Networks that remembers the legendary performers of soul and R&B. It's hosted by T.C. Bandit of Radio One's WMMJ, Washington, D.C., and done in cooperation with Radio One's Kirk Tanter. USRN: 212-869-1111.

The former "Wesham" radio group was co-founded by former Treasury Secretary and 1970s "energy czar" Bill Simon, who became involved in a wide range of private business activities after he served in the Nixon and Ford Administrations. His radio group was the New Jersey-based "WESHAM" group that owned stations in places like Louisville and Mobile. (The first half of the group name came from the initials of William E. Simon). Bill Simon has just died at 72, after committing to giving away virtually his entire fortune of \$350 million to charity.

Sorry to report the death of longtime WYNK, Baton Rouge owner Robert McGregor, who ran WYHK from the time he bought it out of receivership in 1962 until he sold it, in 1985. McGregor died at age 78.

**STRANGE JUSTICE.** . . . Hispanic Broadcasting's Mac Tichenor claims the Justice Department thought up a new rule and then applied it retroactively to his \$127 million deal to buy three stations out of the Clear Channel-AMFM Inc. spinoffs. We believe that Clear Channel thought they had the go-ahead for a complete package of radio spinoffs from Justice -- and then Justice disallowed the Hispanic deal on Monday (6/12) because of Clear Channel's 26% non-voting interest in HBC. (Saying that a seller can't hold a significant interest in a divestiture buyer.) It won't dent Clear Channel, which speedily went to backup buyers (Emmis for Phoenix' "Power 92" KKFR and Denver-market modern rock KXPK, and Frank Wood's Secret for Austin-market oldies KEYI-FM). But it's a shovel over the head for HBC, which must find new ways to enter the big Spanish-language markets of Denver and Austin. Will the DOJ's new rule crimp Clear Channel's style in future deals? And aren't staffers at KXPK and KEYI-FM scrambling because they'd expected those formats to disappear as HBC took over?

**SUMMER STORM.** . . . Cumulus Media is taking drastic steps to reorganize the company and reassure investors that everything's going to work out. Richard Weening remains Executive Chairman, but the operating part of Cumulus will consolidate from Milwaukee (where Weening is) and Chicago (where former President Bill Bungeroth and former CFO Rick Bonick were) to Atlanta (where new Cumulus chief honcho Dickey is based). Dickey and company must operate the 300-station group, sell off some assets, stabilize the quarterly financials and lift the stock price out of the danger zone -- a tall order.

**DOWNLOADING LITTLE JIMMY DICKENS.** . . . Gosh, Grandpa, even the Grand Ole Opry's going on the web. The "world's longest-running live radio show" will now be included as part of the brand-new 24/7 streaming of 75-year-flagship WSM (650 KHz). Addresses: Opry.com or WSMOnline.com. The Opry's cyber-launch comes as it unveils a new Opry set and Nashville winds up its biggest week -- the annual "Fan Fair." Plenty more radio news -- including a peek at the just-released Duncan's American Radio revenue rankings for 1999 -- inside this week's M Street Journal.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Too much of "Forever"? Two Altoona owners are challenging Kristen Cantrell's purchase of WVAM/WPRR as a "sham" deal. That's because Kristen is the daughter of Forever principal Kerby Confer, and Forever owns five stations in Altoona with a combined 41.2 share 12+ in Arbitron. The combo Cantrell is buying racked up a combined 13.9 share. Now WRTA owner Rod Wolf and WBXQ/WBRX owner David Barger allege there's a "masquerade" being perpetrated to give Forever a "virtual monopoly over broadcast revenues." Wolf not only signed the FCC Petition to Deny -- He ran it as a news story on WRTA and placed a copy of the Petition to Deny on the "WRTA.com" website.

Here's the latest on Low Power FM: We're calling Senator Judd Gregg's S. 2068 the "killer" bill, because it would prohibit the FCC from establishing a new Low Power FM service -- pure and simple. It's far more decisive than the amended bill that came out of the House (HR 3439). Gregg's proposal continues to gain support, as Senators Connie Mack (R-FL) and John Warner (D-VA) sign on as the 35th and 36th sponsors. Meanwhile John McCain is starting to look pretty lonely on this one, as his LPFM-friendly bill has literally no co-sponsors, though Senators Bob Kerrey and Paul Wellstone appeared at a Thursday afternoon rally sponsored by the Low Power Radio Coalition. Meanwhile -- the legislative clock is racing toward October 6.

Is the FCC turning into Amazon.com, mailing out CDs to listeners? Well, no -- but it did locate the edited version of a song called "You Suck" and mail it to a complainant who'd heard something she objected to on Infinity's L.A.-market KROQ-FM. The Commission asked her if that's the version she'd heard played at 9:10pm on March 28, 1997. Answer: No. She heard lots of extra words, like "pussy", "dick" and "clit." On that basis, the FCC proceeds to issue a Notice of Apparent Liability for \$2,000 for alleged broadcast indecency -- and finally cleans up a three-year-old case.

The House is about to debate the "Noncommercial Broadcasting Freedom of Expression Act", with the accompanying background voices from religious broadcasters who want to make sure the FCC never pulls the same stunt it tried six months ago in that Pittsburgh TV case. The FCC backpedaled almost immediately, and now the National Religious Broadcasters group is supporting Mississippi Republican Chip Pickering's H.R. 4201 -- which would prohibit the FCC from regulating the content of speech that's broadcast by non-coms.

CANADA THIS WEEK

In January the CRTC cited technical reasons in denying the application of Christian Radio Manitoba, Ltd. for a new radio station on 107.1 MHz. The rejection was accompanied by encouragement to submit an application for another frequency. Christian Radio Manitoba was promised a license if they could find a technically suitable channel. Following engineering studies, Christian Radio Manitoba this week submitted an application for use of 95.1 MHz with 100,000 watts. The application now goes to the Department of Industry for technical review.

GX Radio Partnership will be allowed to double-up in Yorkton, Saskatchewan. The CRTC has approved GX Radio's application for a new FM station. The new outlet, on 94.1 MHz, will offer a "pop, rock and dance" format. GX Radio's existing Yorkton station, CJGX, has a country format.

Roberts Rules of Orderly Selling...The week's biggest deal (in terms of number of stations) is Clear Channel's acquisition of the Roberts Radio group for \$65.9 million. So Robert Sherman and Robert Pittman -- the two "Roberts" the group is named after -- decide to take Lowry Mays' offer and sell their holdings in New York's Hudson Valley, the "Four Corners" area where Utah, New Mexico, Arizona and Colorado meet, Santa Fe (NM) and the Dakotas. Here's a quick M Street look at what the two "Roberts" are selling to Clear Channel --

Poughkeepsie, NY: Country WRWD-FM, Highland, NY at 107.3. Rhythmic oldies WBPM, Kingston at 94.3. Hot AC WBWZ, New Paltz at 93.3. (All three FMs are class A facilities.) And talk WGHQ, Kingston at 920 KHz, 5-kw day, 500-watts night, DA-1. Roberts' Hudson Valley holdings will meld with the Straus Media stations Clear Channel is acquiring, such as soft AC WRNQ.

Santa Fe, NM: AC KSFQ, White Rock, NM, a C3 at 101.1. Adult alternative KBAC, Las Vegas, NM, a C at 98.1.

Four Corners: "The Crown" rocker KRWN, Farmington, NM, a C1 at 92.9. "Kiss" country KISZ-FM, Cortez, CO, a C at 97.9. Modern AC "Point" KPTE, Durango, CO, a C2 at 99.7. Oldies KDKO, Durango at 1240 KHz, with 1-kw, ND. Talk KENN, Farmington at 1390 KHz, with 5-kw day, 1300-w night, DA-N. The CP for expanded-band KNNT, Farmington at 1620, with 10-kw day, 1-kw night, ND. And southwest of the "Four Corners" area, the CP for a new C1 licensed to Tuba City, AZ, carrying calls of KAXB.

Gallup, NM: Country KGLX, Gallup, a C1 at 99.1. KFXX, Chinle, a C2 at 107.3, simulcasting KGLX. Rock KFMQ, C2 at 106.1. Dance KXTC, Thoreau, C at 99.9.

Vail, CO: "Ski Country" KSKE-FM, Vail, a C1 at 104.7.

Minot, ND: "Wolf Country" KZPR, a C1 at 105.3. Hot AC KIZZ, a C1 at 93.7. Classic rock/talk "Cars AM" KRRZ at 1390 KHz, with 5-kw day, 1-kw night, ND.

Dickinson, ND: Hot AC "Point" KZRK, a C3 at 92.1. "Roughrider Country" KCAD, a C1 at 99.1. Country KLTC at 1460, with 5-kw fulltime, DA-N.

Aberdeen, SD: Oldies "Cool 95" KQAA, a C1 at 94.9. AC "Point" KBFO, a C1 at 106.7. Country/talk KKAA at 1560, with 10-kw day, 5-kw night, DA-2. Talk/sports/soft AC KSDN at 930 KHz, 5-kw d, 1-kw n, DA-2. And classic rock KSDN-FM, a C1 at 94.1 MHz.

Media Venture Partners brokered the \$65,900,000 deal between Clear Channel and former NBC radio exec and group owner Bob Sherman and his partner Bob Pittman, now a top executive at AOL.

In the McAllen-Brownsville, TX market, the about-to-go-public Entravision group acquires Sunburst's four FMs, to enter the 10th-largest Hispanic market. The stations: rock KFRQ, Harlingen, a class C at 94.5. Gold-based AC KVLV, Edinburg, a C1 at 107.9. "Que Pasa" Tejano KKPS, Brownsville, a full C at 99.5. And classic hits KVPA, Port Isabel, an A at 101.1 MHz (with an app to upgrade to C2 status). Entravision's in the process of buying Z-Spanish and going public.

Sunburst is also a seller up in Tyler-Longview, TX, dealing four stations to local operator Waller Broadcasting for \$8.5 million. After all the hub-bub about John Borders allegedly having some all-encompassing group deal on the front burner -- he sells most of his Tyler-Longview stations to in-market owner Waller, whose stations include soft AC KOOI. Here's what Sunburst is selling -- Country "Kicks" KYKX, Longview, a class C at 105.7 MHz. Sports KFRO, Longview at 1370 KHz, an ESPN Radio affiliate with 1-kw fulltime, DA-N. Oldies "Cool" KFRO-FM, Gilmer, a C3 at 95.3 MHz. And country KKUS, Tyler, a C2 at 104.1 MHz. Earlier this month, Waller agreed to acquire Tyler move-in KLIS from Nicol Broadcasting. Classic rocker KLIS (96.7) is about to re-license from Palestine, TX to Frankston, TX.

Quite a ways south of Salt Lake City, Mag Mile buys another FM that it expects to move in toward a major population area: country KYKN-FM, Nephi, UT (103.9 MHz). As Charlie Hall's station is right now, it's a C1 that's located about an hour south of Salt Lake. But we know Mag Mile's mission in life is to acquire move-ins and upgrade them. The facility is a class C1 at 103.9 MHz, licensed for 60,000 watts at 649 feet. The Commission has already cleared the way for an upgrade from C1 to C. Chicago-based Chris Devine and Bruce Buzil operate Marathon Media for stations in more established situations. Around Salt Lake, Mag Mile has dance KUUV, KFVR-FM and an LMA with KTCE. In this deal for Charlie Hall's KYKN-FM, the broker is Doug Ferber of Star Media Group and the price is \$1.5 million.

The offer was made -- and accepted. And what an offer it is: Cox Radio offers to pay Midwestern Broadcasting \$285 million for a facility it doesn't even plan to keep, and Midwestern quickly accepts the "right of first refusal" offer for Atlanta's WALR-FM. The offer breaks down to \$280 million plus \$5 million in working capital -- a terrific return on Midwestern's \$6.7 million acquisition of WCNN/WALR-FM back in 1993, as the stations were literally coming out of

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

bankruptcy. Even after selling urban AC "Kiss" WALR-FM to Cox, the Dickey family retains its three AMs in the market, including WCNN, plus WALR-FM and WFOM. By the way -- There won't be an LMA on "Kiss" prior to a closing in late Q3 or early Q4, and Cox will consummate its exchanges with Salem as the deal closes. It will spin WALR-FM's facility, along with San Antonio-market KLUP and Tampa/Lakeland markets WSUN (910) to Salem. In return, Cox gets Houston-market KKHT at 106.9. The WALR-FM format goes over to Cox' WJZF, where it displaces "Jazz Flavors."

The Dickey family made money selling stations in Atlanta -- and also Wauseon, Ohio. The \$280 million sale of Atlanta-market urban AC WALR-FM is the headline deal, but the Dickey-controlled Midwestern Broadcasting also sold another FM in a far smaller transaction. It's actually a potential FM, the Construction Permit for a new class A licensed to Wauseon, OH at 96.9 MHz. Midwestern picked it up for \$800,000. Now they're dealing it away to the Cornerstone Church of Toledo for \$2 million -- a nice profit just for holding onto a CP. Cornerstone already owns black gospel/Christian WDMN, Toledo at 1520 KHz.

In upstate New York, SabreCom (Paul Rothfuss and Joel Hartstone) acquires another combo in the area south of the Finger Lakes -- this time in Hornell, NY, northwest of Elmira, where Sabre already owns stations such as CHR "Wink" WNKI. For \$1.8 million SabreCom gets these Hornell stations from Bilbat Radio: Adult alternative WKPQ, a B at 105.3 MHz; and talk WHHO, which has 5-kw day, 22 watts night, ND, at 1320 KHz. Richard Lyons and Bill Berry (the GM) have owned WKPQ and WHHO since 1983, and they have no other broadcast interests. Dick Kozacko handled the brokerage duties.

Tony Renda must like Florida's beautiful Gulf Coast -- he just bought his fourth FM in Ft. Myers/Naples for \$7 million. "Groovin' Oldies" WJGO at 102.9 MHz hit the air just last Fall and debuted with a 2.8 share 12+ in the Fall Arbitron. We'll see how it fits alongside Tony Renda's other stations there: Hot AC WSGL at 104.7, "Gator" country WWGR at 101.9, and talker WGUF at 98.9. WJGO is a C2 licensed to Tice, FL and it's being sold by Gulf Communications Partners. Gulf (Allen Bowdach and the always-busy Florida owner Mitchell Rubenstein) bought the CP from Audrea Anderson and Dianne Adams for \$419,541, then upgraded it from an A to a C2. Their payoff: They sell WJGO for \$7 million cash. Blackburn & Co. handled this transaction.

Regent gets the one it left behind in Grand Rapids... From the Clear Channel-AMFM spinoffs, Terry Jacobs and Bill Stakelin were already in line to get 3 of the 4 AMFM stations -- AC WLHT, modern rock WGRD-FM and soft AC "River" WTRV. With a little more dealmaking, Regent claims the fourth one: all-news WNWZ, with 1-kw day/58 watts night, ND.

And...Regent and Clear Channel re-visit their swaps. Regent's three stations in Lancaster/Antelope Valley, CA are now out of the deal, and Regent will write a check to Clear Channel that's \$13.5 million larger than the amount announced March 13. Here's what Regent is keeping: Country KTPI, Tehachapi, a class A at 103.1; AC "Oasis" KOSS, Rosamond, an A at 105.5 MHz; and Christian KAVC, Mojave, 1-kw ND full-timer at 1340 KHz. Regent will still exchange its stations in Victorville, CA and Mansfield, OH as part of the package that earns it properties in Albany, NY and Grand Rapids.

Imagine a single radio station billing \$67.5 million! Infinity's WFAN, New York did it in 1999, according to new Jim Duncan numbers just released. Another top-10 surprise: Spanish hits WSKQ jumps from #37 in 1998 to #10 for 1999. Here are the first numbers from Duncan's Radio Market Guide, 2000 Edition -- #1: WFAN, NY, from \$54,000,000 in 1998 to \$67,500,000 in '99. #2: WXRK, NY, from \$45,600,000 to \$54,400,000. #3: WLTW, NY, \$45,400,000 to \$51,000,000. #4, Infinity's WINS, NY, \$39,100,000 to \$44,900,000. #5, Clear Channel's KIIS-FM, LA, \$39,100,000 to \$44,500,000. #6, Infinity's WCBS-FM, \$36,300,000 to \$42,900,000. #7, Infinity's KTWV, LA, from \$4,500,000 to \$41,900,000. #8, ABC's KGO, SF, from \$36,000,000 to \$41,800,000. #9, Infinity's KLSX, LA, from \$32,400,000 to \$39,800,000. And Spanish Broadcasting's WSKQ, NY, from \$26,500,000 to \$39,500,000.

As for Duncan's Highest-Billing Groups -- It's #1 Clear Channel (plus AMFM Inc.), at \$2,978,972,000. Then #2 Infinity, at \$2,112,173,000. Then a huge drop to the #3 player: ABC (with just 43 stations) billed \$392,270,000 for all of 1999. The revenues are gross dollars and don't include trade/barter, LMA or SMA revenues. Deals announced as of May 2000 are calculated on a pro forma basis. Consolidation hits the streaming business, as Jeff Mandelbaum's GlobalMedia buys the 212 station-streaming contracts of OnRadio for \$9 million. OnRadio will now steer away from direct radio services to concentrate on general B2B online products. While GlobalMedia becomes a much bigger player in the audio streaming and online services business, with a total of 257 stations under its wing doing audio streaming. GlobalMedia pays \$500,000 in cash and will issue up to 1,697,619 shares of its Nasdaq-traded stock to acquire the station contracts. GlobalMedia stock trades as "GLMC."

The SmartRoute cameras should spot the Brinks truck at any second now...Westwood ponies up \$25 million to buy high-tech traffic provide SmartRoute Systems. It's the Cambridge, MA high-tech company run by former Katz Media COO Arnie Sheiffer and it employs a sophisticated network of special cameras and other means of detection that will complement Westwood-owned Metro/Shadow traffic services. Westwood's buying the operating assets of SmartRoute for \$25 million plus assuming some obligations. SmartRoute sells much of its traffic data to wireless and online customers.

Consolidation continues in England, too, as British radio group GWR Radio announced it's buying DMG Radio Group from the Daily Mail and General Trust for 146 million pounds (about \$220 million U.S.). GWR picks up a total of eight British stations, a station in Hungary and DMG's stake in an Australian radio group. But they have ownership limits in England, too, and GWR quickly said it will divest a number of AM licenses to get back under the 15% national ownership cap.

Emmis is looking more and more likely to spin out its television stations into a separate group, based on the announcement that it's postponing its annual shareholders meeting for possibly a couple of months, while it studies "structural alternatives for separating its radio and television operations." Reason for the delay: Shareholders would have to vote on the split. Why split off television? Jeff Smulyan and TV chief Greg Nathanson want to take advantage of low TV prices to build their holdings. But Wall Street is cautious about broadcast TV right now. Emmis is proceeding to release its next quarterly numbers (June 22) and will mail its stockholders annual report, as scheduled. Emmis' unusual fiscal year means it's always releasing results a month before everybody else-- and since its next quarter will contain two of the three months of the usual Q2, Emmis makes a great "bellwether" stock.

We saw a tee-shirt the other day that said "Thou Shalt Not Scab" -- and while it didn't belong to a guy who looked like he was in the radio/TV voiceover business, you never know. What we're saying is, the long-running strike by AFTRA/SAG union talent against ad agencies, big advertisers and production houses is threatening to turn into a very long affair. The strikers met with a federal mediator this week, but still wanted nothing to do with the other side, which is also refusing to budge. As M Street went to press, AFTRA/SAG was planning a big rally in New York City featuring Lauren Bacall, Judd Hirsch, Jay Thomas (of WTJM, New York), Jerry Orbach and Linda Fiorentino.

The very large markets continue to eviscerate the old sales records, as we've seen in Los Angeles and New York. Latest results from New York's NYMRAD group (212-808-4332) are that the New York market radio revenues grew by 30% in May. Not only that -- May was the fifth consecutive month that revenues rose by 30% or better. For the period January through May, the New York market is up an astonishing 35.9%, to \$331.3 million. Back to May itself, Local sales (up 26.5%) were the bulk of the dollars. But check the national gain for May -- 49.9%, to \$15.1 million. That's a lot of William Shatner "Priceline.com" spots.

**M STREET BAZAAR. . . PEOPLE, PRODUCTS, AND PROGRAMMING**

Pull over! Two Sinclair-owned national trucker shows will be permanently parked this Summer. #1, The Interstate Trucking Network is gone at the end of June. And #2, sister operation Road Gang ("Dave Nemo's Road Gang") quits work at the end of July. Sinclair still owns both operations, but Sinclair is definitely on the exit ramp when it comes to radio. It was commonly thought that Interstate Trucking Network and Road Gang wound up being owned by AMFM Inc., since they were operating out of AMFM Inc. facilities in Nashville. But AMFM Inc. just provided facilities and distribution -- and that contract has expired. Who benefits? For one, "Truckin' Bozo" Dale Sommers -- syndicated out of Clear Channel-owned WLW, Cincinnati. And some stations are clearing the WBAP, Ft. Worth-based Bill Mack. But how about up in the sky? National satellite radio promises seamless national coverage for anybody traveling the American highways. Both Sirius and XM already have agreements with Freightliner.

M STREET BAZAAR. . .(cont'd)

No pauses here: Cox will keep WTMI, Miami's classical format after it closes on July 1. Regional VP Bob Green says "Had you asked me 3 months ago about WTMI remaining classical, I would have said the chances are 10%." Listeners have spoken loudly enough that Cox will retain the format it's inheriting from Woody Tanger. Now it's up to the listeners to make Cox Radio's \$100 million gamble pay off. (And no, we don't mind Ft. Lauderdale Sun-Sentinel columnist Tom Jicha reminding us that last Winter we'd bet our entire collection of Beethoven CDs on WTMI dropping classical. We're just a little surprised, that's all.) M Street Database statistic: There are now 38 commercial classical stations in the U.S.

Boston legend Charles Laquidara is leaving mornings after 30 years of doing wakeups. The Boston Herald reports that Infinity classic rocker WZLX will have a new morning show by September or October -- and 31-year market veteran Laquidara won't be part of it. It's his choice, and he insists he's not retiring. But he will spend more time with his wife, who moved to Hawaii because of health problems. He'll continue to do some other air-work and perhaps online work for WZLX. Laquidara -- who had an influence on a young Boston College student named Howard Stern -- began his Boston radio career in 1969 at WBCN. He left in '76, then returned and worked at 'BCN from 1978 to 1996. That's when WBCN moved Stern's syndicated show from nights to mornings, and Laquidara graciously shifted to sister WZLX. The new WZLX morning show will be Tai (ex-WFNX and WRKO) and veteran Beantown comedian Steve Sweeney.

WQAM's Neil Rogers just may have the best gig around: A million dollar-per year contract to talk about whatever's on his mind. And -- soon -- every summer off. Beasley wanted to extend the Miami talk personality's current contract, and one of the sweeteners was a promise that Neil could literally have summers off (after the Spring Arbitron is over each year). The Ft. Lauderdale Sun-Sentinel reports Rogers also rates a \$150,000 signing bonus, \$1,150,000 a year plus bonuses starting in 2002, and continued free season tickets to the Panthers, Dolphins and Marlins. With this deal, GM Greg Reed keeps Rogers on the air complaining about life until he's 62. By the way -- the summers off are in addition to Rogers's usual vacation. We believe that Neil is the highest-paid personality in any medium (radio, TV you name it) in south Florida.

You "bookmark" a website -- why not bookmark a favorite song on the radio? Both Xenote and Sony are into the radio bookmark business, with gadgets that automatically "catch" the identity of a song that's playing on the radio. So if the 10-in-a-row DJ never mentions the artist and title, you plug your keychain into a peripheral on the computer for online research and ordering. Xenote has already announced AMFM Inc.-owned San Francisco KKSF, San Francisco as its first client. And we're expecting Sony to make a big run at this category, too.

Two more editions of "Sex, Lies and Audiotape" are scheduled for airing July 4 and Labor Day, as syndicator Jones Radio (212-556-9500) puts the recorded voices of folks like John Rocker, Darva Conger, Kathie Lee Gifford and Bill Gates through the "Truster" voice analyzer system. (And we promise, we're telling the truth about this...)

The ballots are in: Susquehanna's David Kennedy is the new Chairman of the NAB Radio Board, succeeding Bloomington Broadcasting's McElveen. The Radio Board also selected a new Vice Chairman: Pathfinder's John Dille. The NAB Radio and TV Boards were in D.C. for Monday's Summit on America (with speaker Jimmy Carter).

Two sad deaths to report this week: One is that of 45-year-old journalist Judd Rose, who worked at Los Angeles radio stations KHJ and KFVB before going on to do great work at ABC-TV and CNN. Judd died after fighting brain cancer. And in New England, a most distinctive voice has been stilled, as classical radio icon Robert J. Lurtsema has died at age 71. His WGBH, Boston-based "Morning Pro Musica" show introduced generations of New Englanders to the classics -- and if you ever heard his amazingly deliberate, almost halting delivery, you never forgot it. He spent more than 28 years on the air and in 1993 pulled back to doing just weekend work. WGBH calls him a "giant" -- and we'd agree.

No summer slowdown in the radio news, either from the FCC or the deal table -- and we'll be back next week with more in the M Street Journal. 

**FAST-MERGING LANES.** . . . We continue to think Clear Channel has the accelerator floored, trying to consummate its merger with AMFM Inc. long before the "no later than" date of September 30. This week we saw more evidence they're not fooling around: After the Justice Department pulled the plug on its divestiture deal with Hispanic Broadcasting for stations in Phoenix, Denver and Austin, Clear Channel speedily announced its "backup buyers." New buyer for urban KKFR, Phoenix and Denver-market modern rock KXPX is Emmis. (So Jeff Smulyan finally gets something from the divestitures.) And in Austin, Frank "Bo" Wood of Secret Communications agrees to take oldies KEYI-FM. Two other pieces of news support the merger-soon theory: the announced departure of Clear Channel COO Bobby Lawrence, effective June 30. And the announced departure of AMFM Radio Networks President David Kantor, whose unit will fall under the jurisdiction of Kraig Kitchin at CC-owned Premiere Radio Networks.

**NOVEMBER 7 IS ALL ABOUT BILL KENNARD, TOO.** . . . It's not just Bush vs. Gore, it's an election that determines who controls the five-member FCC -- and who's the chairman. If George W. Bush wins on November 7, you'll be seeing FCC Chair Bill Kennard pack up his office not long afterwards and a new chairman named (could it be Michael Powell?). If Al Gore keeps the White House Democratic, Bill Kennard can likely look forward to spending more time in the Portals. One former FCC Commissioner has been privately lobbying against Gore for more than a year, saying he would be "bad for broadcasters." Meanwhile, Bill Kennard is probably not going to appear at the NAB Radio Show in San Francisco this September for the traditional "Chairman's Breakfast." He may just be weary of butting heads with broadcasters about issues like Low Power FM.

This week, Salem Communications filed 316 applications for all 49 stations from Salem Communications Corp. to Salem Communications Holding Corporation.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

Religious broadcasters won a quick victory in the House of Representatives, which passed Chip Pickering's "Non-Commercial Broadcasting Freedom of Expression Act" by a vote of 264 to 159. The only fight was over Massachusetts Democrat Ed Markey's attempt to insert the word "educational" in front of the phrase "religious" broadcasting. In Tuesday's floor debate Pickering accused Markey of "demonizing" religious broadcasters by suggesting that extremists like David Koresh and Jim Jones could qualify for licenses. Markey's amendment died. The bill proposed by Chip Pickering (R-MS) is H.R. 4201, but we're a lot less sure it will make it through the Senate this session.

No auction for us, please: National Public Radio and its allies claim it's illegal to force non-commercial broadcasters to bid on new frequencies opening up outside the "reserved" band of 88.1 to 91.9 MHz. They quickly filed an appeal in the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals of the FCC's June 8 decision about auction requirements. National Public Radio, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting and the Association of America's Public Television Stations claim the Communications Act "categorically exempts" non-commercial applicants from auctions.

The price of gasoline may be spiraling, but the NAB is going to give breaks to both conventiongoers and association members. The NAB's in a generous mood, as it declares a new 1-for-1 admission policy to the Radio Show in San Francisco. The Radio Board voted to allow the second registrant from a station to get a free pass to the Radio Show (September 20-23). Registrations have probably gone well for San Francisco, but even the NAB acknowledges that last year's steamy late-summer confab in Orlando wasn't its best moment. Here's the second break from the NAB: The Radio Board votes to rebate some station dues. Radio members will literally get a rebate check after stations pay their first-quarter 2001 dues -- two months' worth of dues returned to them. TV members do even better. They get a rebate on the entire Q1.

In 1998, midwest owner Mike Rice had his licenses revoked for sexually abusing minors, and he just lost again in appeals court. The D.C. Circuit Court dismissed all of Rice's legal challenges to the FCC's "character" policy. Contemporary Media owner Michael Rice once had five stations in Missouri and Indiana, held two CPs in Missouri and had an application pending for another station in Missouri. (Among the stations: WBOW and WZZQ in Terre Haute.) Rice started serving his prison time in September 1994 and is eligible for release now. But the federal appeals court says he won't be getting those licenses back.

Citadel's Worcester deal draws a loud protest from FCC Commissioner Gloria Tristani, but the \$14,250,000 sale closes shortly after it wins staff approval. Tristani says Citadel's purchase of WWFX gives Citadel and AMFM Inc. (soon to be Clear Channel) a "staggering" 94.4% of the market revenue. Tristani says their pincer grip "effectively eliminates the possibility that a third competitor would enter the Worcester market." The deal (brokered by Mike Bergner) closed on Monday (6/19). But it wasn't a lickety-split approval -- the green light took six months from filing (just before Christmas 1999) to approval. So Tristani did have an effect, after all -- a delaying effect.

Should radio have to pay performance rights fees to do audio streaming? The House just held a hearing on it, as the Recording Industry Association of America sees its chance to get performance fees from broadcasters from the first time. (Licensed broadcasters typically pay music licensing fees to ASCAP, BMI and SESAC, but that's for the publishing rights.) Howard Coble's Intellectual Property Subcommittee heard from the NAB's Eddie Fritts (strongly against the idea) and RIAA executive Hillary Rosen (obviously a major proponent). The NAB has already filed a pre-emptive lawsuit in New York against the RIAA.

After just one year, the FCC gets a new Chief Economist, in the form of Wharton School professor Gerry Faulhaber. He'll take over for Howard Shelanski on July 1, when Shelanski returns to the law faculty at UC-Berkeley after a one-year stint at the Commission. Gerry Faulhaber is Professor of Public Policy and Management at the Wharton School of business at the University of Pennsylvania. Before Wharton he'd done economic planning for both AT&T and Bell Labs.

A personnel change in Commissioner Gloria Tristani's office, as mass media and cable advisor Rick Chessen departs for the private sector. Chessen's new job is VP of policy for San Francisco-based RespondTV.

CANADA THIS WEEK

Since late last year thirteen applicants have been awaiting word on whether they would win the right to broadcast on one of three open frequencies in Toronto. Now they know.

B. Denham Jolly and his Milestone Radio, Inc. has been granted use of 93.5 MHz for an urban contemporary format. Milestone Radio will attempt to grab audience from Buffalo, NY market WBLK. According to the CRTC, one percent of Toronto radio listening goes to WBLK and so it's felt that Milestone Radio's urban station will satisfy a demand not filled by Canadian radio and add to the diversity of the Toronto market. Jolly promised little programming overlap with CHR stations CISS-FM, CING-FM and CIDC-FM. The new station will use 298 watts, which from atop the CN Tower will cover a significant part of metro Toronto although not as much ground as Toronto's other FM stations.

While there was little debate that the new urban format on 93.5 MHz will add to programming diversity, objections were raised because of its ownership structure. Standard Radio, Inc., owner of Toronto stations CFRB and CKFM-FM, holds a 29.9% interest in Milestone Radio and some expressed fear that the new station would enter an immediate LMA with the two established outlets. Milestone principle Jolly gave assurances that there would be no LMA. He did reveal that the new station will be involved in a Joint Sales Agreement with CFRB and CKFM-FM.

The second new Toronto license went to Gary Farmer's new company, Aboriginal Voices Radio. Aboriginal Voices will use 250 watts (with antenna likely atop Toronto's CN Tower) to air a variety of programs targeting native Canadians. Programming will be in English, French, Inuit and other native tongues. Farmer had asked to simulcast this format on the vacant 740 KHz frequency as well, with the FM designed to cover the inner portion of the Toronto metro and the AM complementing with coverage outside of the central market. The CRTC rejected this proposal and noted that the wide coverage area of the clear channel 740 KHz allocation was too precious to use for a niche format of narrow appeal.

Adult standards programming will be heard over 740 KHz. The frequency, which became available when the CBC vacated it in a move of its Radio One service to FM, went to CHWO Ontario, Inc. The current adult standards format of CHWO, Oakville, ON will migrate from a 10,000 watts day, 5,000 watts night facility with a directional antenna on 1250 KHz to the 50,000 watt non-directional 740 KHz operation. The 1250 KHz station will then adopt a contemporary Christian format. The grant of 740 KHz gives CHWO Ontario, Inc. three outlets in the Toronto market. CHWO Ontario, Inc. also owns ethnic programmed CJMR, Mississauga.

More on that Clear Channel "Plan B" to satisfy the Justice Department with spinoffs in Phoenix, Denver and Austin: Infinity's Mel Karmazin is shut out, as Clear Channel awards Phoenix and Denver to Emmis, and Austin to Frank Wood. Jeff Smulyan really wanted KKBT, Los Angeles and some say he's still bitter about that and may even have squawked to the Justice Department. But all's well that ends well: Urban KKFR, Phoenix is in a format Emmis does in markets like New York (WQHT) and Los Angeles (KPWR). And Emmis can team KKFR with the Hearst-Argyle stations it's LMAing: soft AC KKLK, news/talk KTAR and sports KMVP. Denver will be a brand-new market for Emmis as it acquires modern AC KXPK, Evergreen, a class C at 96.5. Emmis will pay Clear Channel \$108 million for "Power 92" KKFR and "Peak" KXPK. The Austin-market KEYI-FM, San Marcos, a full class C at 103.5 MHz, goes to Frank Wood's Secret group. Wood ran Jacor a decade ago, then left to get into ownership. Now he's involved with Internet services company Feed The Monster, back in ownership with WKKJ, Chillicothe, OH (which he took off Clear Channel's hands) -- and now he's acquiring KEYI-FM.

Canton, OH appears to be the next market in the sights of NextMedia, as it pays \$43.5 million for the Beaverkettle Company's heritage combo of full service WHBC and AC WHBC-FM. That's a lot of money for Canton (\$12.5 million in Duncan-estimated revenue in 1999), but these are the kind of properties you can confidently build a cluster around. WHBC at 1480 KHz has 15,000 watts day, 5,000 watts night, DA-2, and did a 9.6 share 12+ in the Fall 1999 Arbitron. WHBC-FM is a full B at 94.1 MHz and scored a 12.1 share. Now wait to see whose door NextMedia knocks on next in Canton, which is Arbitron market #123.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Hearst-Argyle finally acts to sell off the AMs it inherited from Pulitzer in the Greensboro/Winston-Salem and Louisville markets. Both stations are doing news, and strongly linked to their co-branded Hearst-Argyle TV stations. Buyer of both Greensboro-market WXII and Louisville-market WLKY is Truth Broadcasting, which we believe is paying in the neighborhood of \$3 million for the pair. Here's the rundown --

For Truth Broadcasting, this is its fifth AM in Greensboro, and its debut in Louisville. The North Carolina AM is WXII, Kernersville at 830 KHz. It's got 50,000 watts day, 10,000 watts night, DA-2. Buyer Truth Broadcasting already has four AMs in Greensboro/Winston-Salem/High Point: the talk simulcast of WCOG, Greensboro at 1320 and WTOB, Winston-Salem at 1380. Conservative talk WWBG, Greensboro at 1470. And black gospel/Christian "Joy 1340" WPOL, Winston Salem, which Truth is acquiring from Willis. In Louisville, Hearst-Argyle's AM is WLKY at 970, with 5,000 watts full-time, DA-2. Like WXII, it uses AP News plus audio from its sister TV station. WLKY -- also due for a new format and calls -- will be Truth's first station in Louisville.

In San Luis Obispo, Abel de Luna sells his two FMs in San Luis Obispo, in a deal that moves Al Placencia's Lazer Broadcasting up the California coast by one more market. The stations are KLMM, Morro Bay, a class A at 94.1 MHz, and simulcast KLUN, Paso Robles, a class A at 103.1. Lazer Broadcasting has already flipped them to a simulcast of its regional Mexican KXLM, Oxnard in an LMA. Lazer's current markets are Riverside (KXSB, KSDT and KXRD), Oxnard-Ventura (KOKR and KXLM) and Santa Maria-Lompoc (KSBQ). Both buyer and seller mostly focus on Spanish-language formats. KLMM and KLUN previously did regional Mexican as "La Maquina Musical." Price: \$1,150,000.

West of Corpus Christi, Sendero Multimedia buys country KOPY (1070 KHz) and tejano KOPY-FM (92.1 MHz) in a transaction worth \$350,000. The stations are both licensed to Alice, TX, and the AM's facility is 1-kw, DA-N while the FM's a class A. The radio interests of McAllen-Brownsville-based Sendero are based at regional Mexican KILM (102.1 MHz). From there it distributes the format via T1 line to Laredo-market KBDR (100.5) and Austin-market KTAE (1260), which it's buying from Vie Dansanti. Sendero's also involved in Spanish-language video production (a children's TV show for Discovery), music (they did videos for Selena) and concert promotion. Alberto's brother Luis is involved in the video interests. In the Alice, TX deal, the broker was John Barger.

In northern California, Radio Unica pulls out the engineering maps and decides to buy KATD, Pittsburg (990 KHz) and move it toward Sacramento. Joaquin Blaya's hoping for a "two-fer" here (we don't know what the Spanish translation of that would be), since he's hoping the KATD move would allow him to improve the San Francisco/San Jose signal of KIQI (1010 KHz), which Radio Unica already owns. At the very least, KATD gives the network and station owner a credible daytime signal into Sacramento. Radio Unica plans to move KATD northeast from its current location, believing that the FCC will grant permission to let out KIQI's signal to the east and south. This is tricky since KATD is Pittsburg's only locally-licensed station. The FCC might not want it to re-license to a new city. KATD now does talk and sports for licensee People's Radio, as "Cat." Radio Unica will, as usual, clear its own 24-hour Spanish-language feed of news, talk and sports.

Forever Broadcasting just keeps buying in northwest Pennsylvania, and since Carol Logan, Kerby Confer and Donald Alt would be the last people to put out a press release about their activities, we dug their latest deals out of the FCC files for you. In the Erie area, Forever wins an immediate FCC "red flag" for its purchase of three stations from Great Circle Broadcasting: Country WZPR, Meadville, PA, a class C1 at 100.3 MHz. Classic rock WMDE, Saegertown, an A at 94.3. And talk/sports WMGW, Meadville, a 1-kw ND fulltimer at 1490. And from Robert Sauber and son Tom Sauber, under various ownership structures, a total of six stations in the Keystone State: Adult standards WFRA, Franklin, a 1-kw ND fulltimer at 1450. AC "Mix" WFRA-FM, Franklin, a class B1 at 99.3 MHz. Talk/sports WOYL, Oil City, a 1-kw full-timer at 1340 (with an unusual setup of directional signal days, non-directional nights). Country WOYL-FM, Oil City, a B1 at 98.5. Adult standards WTIV, Titusville, 1-kw ND fulltimer at 1230. And oldies WAQM, Cambridge Springs, PA, an A at 104.5 MHz.

How big has Forever Broadcasting grown? It currently has stations or deals pending in Altoona, Johnstown, State College, Williamsport, and the Ohio market of Lima. Separate from Forever, Kerby Confer and Donald Alt operate Keymarket, which has stations around Pittsburgh and Steubenville/Wheeling, OH. They're also behind the growing Western Kentucky Radio group.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

In lovely Santa Fe, NM, the Brandon family's American General Media buys five more stations for \$7 million. Russell Withers is selling a station named K-Bomb (no kidding) and its four sister stations -- Oldies KBOM, Los Alamos, a C1 at 106.7 MHz. AC KZXA, Santa Fe, a C1 at 94.7 MHz. Country KEFE, Los Alamos, a C1 at 107.5 MHz. Adult standards KTRC, Santa Fe at 1400, 1-kw, ND. And talk/sports KVSF, Santa Fe at 1260, 5-kw/1-kw, ND. American General Media has Santa Fe and Albuquerque covered now: AGM owns two stations in Santa Fe (oldies KABG at 98.5 and rhythmic oldies KMMG at 95.5). And four down the road in Albuquerque: Tejano KARS at 860, Christian KKIM at 1000 KHz, regional Mexican "Radio Lobo" KLVO at 97.7, and dance KYLZ. In the latest deal, John Pierce handled brokerage for buyer AGM and John Lauer of Force Communications & Consultants repped Withers.

In York, SC, Curtis Sigmon sells his WBZK (980 KHz) to Vernon Baker, in a transaction that cashes him out of radio ownership. (In 1995 Sigmon dealt his then-WBZK-FM, Chester at 99.3 MHz to Jefferson-Pilot, which turned it into a simulcast of WBT, Charlotte as "WBT-FM.") The station being sold here is York-licensed, WBZK, licensed for 3,000 watts day, 167 watts night, DA-2. It's currently doing oldies. Buyer Vernon Baker, based in Blacksburg, VA, already owns Charlotte-market WNOW, Mint Hill (1030 KHz), which does Christian and brokered Spanish-language programming. In the sale of WBZK, John Pierce represented buyer Vernon Baker and Force Communications and Consultants repped seller Curtis Sigmon.

In Great Falls, MT, Fisher Regional Radio adds another future FM, in the form of the CP for a new Class C at 104.9 MHz licensed to Cascade. Fisher -- formerly known as Sunbrook -- is paying Frank Spain \$326,000 for it. Fisher Regional already has a basket-ful of stations there: AC KAAK, news/talk KQDI, classic rock KQDI-FM, standards KXGF, plus another CP, for a new class C at 107.3. The four on-air stations combined for a 38-share in the Fall 1999 Arbitron. Just about the only way Fisher Regional could add to its cluster would be to buy CPs with no ratings or revenues -- which is what it's doing.

M STREET BAZAAR. . . PEOPLE, PRODUCTS, AND PROGRAMMING

A Bud Light spot from DDB Chicago wins the \$100,000 Radio-Mercury Award. "Heroes/Footlong Hot Dog Inventor" was written by John Immesoete, produced by Bryan Sweeney, with creative direction from Immesoete, Bill Cimino and Mark Gross. The Starlight Roof Room at New York's Waldorf Astoria was packed with a sellout crowd of 400 for the first-ever Mercury event done as a lunch. The point of giving away big cash prizes is to get Madison Avenue to pay more attention to radio, and the ad community definitely turned out. You can check all the winners (from Volkswagens to Food.com's very funny "Foulmouth") at the "RAB.com" website. We'd like to salute KIEV, Los Angeles, which won \$5,000 for the best Station-Produced spot ("Say AHHH" for Brazos Country Foods). And Big Bang Idea Engineering for its "Nose Bank" PSA on behalf of the San Diego Blood Bank.

That Los Angeles frequency swap between Mega and The Beat will happen on June 30. That's even earlier than we'd expected, which was around July 4th. This is before the station closing actually takes place, the one where Radio One acquires the "Beat" urban format and the 100.3 frequency where "Jammin' Oldies" Mega is now. (The "Beat" migrates from 92.3 to 100.3.) Alfred Liggins has told M Street that Clear Channel has agreed to support the move with plenty of promotion. Radio One's getting the Los Angeles package as part of its Clear Channel-AMFM spinoffs in Cleveland, Dallas, Houston, Miami, Raleigh and Greenville.

In Columbus, OH, a rocker named "The Fox" replaces modern rock Channel Z on WZAZ-FM. The Clear Channel flip also gives Bob & Tom their first-ever platform in Columbus. The station played a loop of "Prison Bitch" and a tease for "Mix 105.7" leading up to the 5pm June 16 launch of "The Fox -- World class rock from the 70s, 80s, 90s and today." First indications to M Street were that the older rock was leaning pretty classic hits. The local rock scene already has Infinity's WLVQ, North American's WBZX (with Howard Stern) and WEGE (classic hits "Eagle"). The surprise is that WZAZ-FM didn't attack Saga's heritage "Sunny" AC WSNY. The station is WZAZ-FM, at 105.7, which is re-licensing from Maryville, OH to the much-closer-in town of Hilliard.

Interep opens a new division dedicated to streaming audio. "Interep New Media" will work with "the evolving sales needs of current broadcast clients" as well as Internet-only webcasters and other audio entertainment producers. Graham Kennan will be the unit's first president, which will team with the current Interep Interactive and Interep Marketing Group (the former Radio 2000).

**M STREET BAZAAR. . . (cont'd)**

Katz Streaming Media Sales signs up everstream, and Mike Agovino calls everstream -- whose execs include former Cleveland radio owner Lee Zapis -- "a ground-floor tenant" in the new Katz Streaming Media Sales Network. Cleveland-headquartered everstream claims 250 affiliates with 17 million unique monthly visitors. M Street notes that those "affiliates" aren't radio stations. They're newspaper and other publishing interests, trying to make money online.

Lots of very high-level executive-suite changes this week, beginning with Clear Channel Executive VP Bobby Lawrence, who's leaving just ahead of the AMFM Inc. merger. There's only going to be one COO at Clear Channel after the merger with AMFM Inc., and his name is Kenny O'Keefe. We note that Bobby Lawrence doesn't have a non-compete, so he could go right back into radio and compete with Clear Channel, and his associates of 25 years. Lawrence and Randy Michaels have functioned as a team since they met at Taft Broadcasting in the 1970s; then they left to form Seven Hills Broadcasting, which became Republic, which merged with Jacor in '86.

More merger-related executive-suite changes, as AMFM Radio Networks President David Kantor tells the staff he'll be exiting when the Clear Channel merger closes. One of his future ventures: working with ABC Radio personality Tom Joyner on his non-radio ventures, like his new Black America website.

At ABC Radio Networks Traug Keller succeeds Lyn Andrews as the new President, as Traug moves up from Executive VP/Advertising Sales and Marketing. His new responsibilities cover ABC's 24-hour formats, ABC News radio, ABC Sports (including ESPN Radio), Internet programming, plus ABC talent like Paul Harvey, Tom Joyner, Bob Kingsley, Doug Banks, Dick Bartley and Bob Brinker. Also from ABC Corporate: 21-year ABC vet Darryl Brown becomes Executive VP, also taking the title of General Manager, responsible for the development of its brands. And one of Dick Purtan's daughters continues to make her own market, as Jennifer Purtan becomes Senior VP of Sales. Jennifer has been VP/Sales for the Detroit, Los Angeles and San Francisco offices.

No Mouse ears this time for former Radio Disney chief Scott McCarthy, who returns to ABC as Senior VP of the Broadcast Group. Scott oversaw Radio Disney from 1996 to 1999 after writing the business plan for it. He left to pursue Internet-related ventures last year. The new job places him in the office near ABC Broadcast Group Bob Callahan, doing acquisitions, startups and broadband & new media. Callahan's ABC Broadcast Group covers the owned radio stations, the Radio Networks, Regis Philbin and the folks at the ABC-TV network and ABC-owned TV stations.

At Tapscan Worldwide, General Manager Drew Simpson exits, leaving the division he's managed ever since Arbitron purchased Tapscan's radio station, advertiser/agency and international assets from Jim Christian in May 1998. Arbitron's Brian Stone steps up to become VP of Application Software and take over many of Simpson's duties. Stone (not the Broadcast Architecture exec of the same name) will relocate from Arbitron's New York office to Birmingham. Arbitron seems to be well into the integration of Tapscan Worldwide into the parent company.

At Salem Communications in Camarillo, CA, COO Eric Halvorson leaves to go back to school. This time he's the professor, and his academic career will last for only one year. Longtime Salem Communications executive Halvorson is leaving his twin jobs as COO and General Counsel to take a teaching position at Pepperdine University during a sabbatical period. Salem won't name an interim or acting COO, but it is promoting Associate General Counsel Jonathan Block to take over Halvorson's role as General Counsel.

Congrats to Charlie Pride, who will make a little history on October 4 when he becomes the first African-American inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame. Charlie went to Nashville in the 1960s after he tried his hand at major league baseball and had a string of hits in the 1960s and 1970s. But the format failed to produce other black stars and Charlie has probably felt left out of the country scene because of both his generation and his race. (He did become the first African-American member of the Grand Ole Opry in 1993 since DeFord Bailey in the 1920s through 1941.) Congrats to Charlie, and congrats to country music.

**BURY THE HATCHET.** . . Emmis and Sinclair have negotiated their way out of mutual lawsuits over the Barry Baker dispute, a feat which may rank up there with peace in Northern Ireland. This battle began when CEO-designate Barry Baker left Sinclair last year and tried to assign his option to purchase St. Louis TV station KDNL and six radio stations to Emmis. Sinclair was determined to fight that deal to the bitter end. End result: Sinclair keeps ABC affiliate KDNL-TV, but Emmis gets Sinclair's six St. Louis radio stations for \$220 million (country WIL-FM, classic hits KIHT, modern rock KPNT, modern AC "River" WVRV, classic rock KXOK-FM and adult standards WRTH). Then came surprise #2, Jeff Smulyan's real stunner: He's trading St. Louis stations WIL-FM, WKKX, WVRV and WRTH to Bonneville in exchange for its country KZLA-FM, Los Angeles. That \$200 million package earns Emmis a second FM in Los Angeles to pair with urban KPWR. It also gave Nashville's Music Row massive migraines, because Smulyan refuses to commit to keeping KZLA-FM country forever. We'll diagram the deals and what they mean for you inside this week's M Street Journal.

**WATCH THE CLOCK.** . . Low Power FM licenses may well be awarded by the end of the summer -- which isn't far off. One veteran communications attorney sifted through the first batch of 722 LPFM applicants and told M Street "The FCC sure is fast-tracking this." Meanwhile, one station owner tells us he can't get a peep out of the Commission on a filing he made six months ago. There are multiple "clocks" to watch here: The clock at the FCC, where they're not only ready to think about awarding the first-ever LPFM licenses, they're also preparing the second filing window for late Summer. (That's for stations in CT, IL, KS, MI, MN, MS, NV, NH, VA, WY and Puerto Rico.) There's also the clock over on Capitol Hill, where Congress hasn't gotten its act together long enough to decide whether it wants to protect LPFM (the John McCain bill), kill it (Judd Gregg's S. 2068) or trim it back and slow it down (Mike Oxley's H.R. 3439). Congress is planning to adjourn on October 6.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

A total of 722 Low Power FM applications were filed at the FCC during the first LPFM filing window -- well below the FCC's own internal expectations. It looks as if community groups are proceeding cautiously. Here's the state-by-state analysis: California produced the most apps with 309. Then 109 from Georgia, 73 from Indiana, 66 from Louisiana, 61 from Oklahoma, 27 from Alaska, 25 from Rhode Island, 19 from Utah, 17 from Maryland, 12 from Maine and 4 in the FCC's own backyard of Washington, D.C. Some frequencies were extremely popular (in San Diego, Old San Diego Community College, Revival Pentecostal Tabernacle and All Souls' Episcopal Church and others all want 105.9 MHz). Where there are competing applicants, the FCC will use its point system. M Street notes that some of these possible allocations didn't need the FCC to relax its 3rd-adjacent standard -- just the FCC being willing to license at lower power. We expect the Commission to push forward rapidly with accepting these apps (these 722 are only "received", technically). Then proceed to issuing licenses by late Summer.

We expect some fighting over the LPFM licenses, inside the FCC. That's the prediction of a prominent communications attorney, who says there will be plenty of petitions to deny, not only from currently-licensed broadcasters who think they're being crowded. But also from other community groups who "wished they'd thought about filing, and didn't." Something else to watch for: Petitions to deny based on the suspicion that an application is a "put-up job" or a front, possibly by a national organization.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)**

The House moves closer to putting a "shot clock" on the FCC's merger review activities, and just for good measure, Mike Oxley (R-OH) tosses in an amendment that would curtail the FCC's lobbying activities. But Mississippi Republican Chip Pickering's main mission is to give the FCC just 90 days to rule on mergers. Another amendment added in the Telecommunications Subcommittee would forbid the Commission from putting antitrust conditions on specific deals. Still another would shift the burden of proof onto the Commission for apps that it denies or gives conditional approval to, thus making court appeals easier. The "House Telecommunications Merger Review Act" is H.R. 4019, and it moves on to the full Commerce Committee.

The Supreme Court accepts a wiretapping case involving a couple of Pennsylvania radio stations, and it's a dilly. Two people whose phone conversation was secretly taped by a third party are suing Scranton/Wilkes-Barre-market WILK and WGBI plus talkhost Frederick Vopper, even though Vopper didn't do the taping. But he did air the conversation that included a threat of violence toward school board members from a teacher's union negotiator. The constitutional issue the U.S. Supreme Court has agreed to review is a First Amendment question: Can people be sued for revealing information gleaned from phone calls that were illegally recorded? At the 3rd Circuit Court of Appeals, both a three-judge panel (voting 2-1) and the full court (voting 6-5) ruled that Vopper and WILK/WGBI are in the clear, since they didn't participate in the taping. The twin cases are *Bartnicki vs. Vopper* (99-1687) and *U.S. vs. Vopper* (99-1728).

The end of an Administration usually brings more personnel turnover, and we've got some inside FCC Commissioner Michael Powell's office: His legal advisor for mass media and cable, Marsha McBride, puts on Mouse ears and takes a big job for Walt Disney Company. McBride becomes VP/Government Relations in Disney's Washington office. No replacement yet from Commissioner Powell.

**CANADA THIS WEEK**

If Howard Stern accepts a new contract to continue doing his morning show after this November, Toronto listeners are guaranteed to continue hearing him through 2003. CILQ-FM, "Q-107," signed a contract renewal for carriage through August 31 of that year. People who tune to Stern in morning drive reportedly account for half of the weekly cume audience of the rock formatted station.

Here's what happened between Emmis, Sinclair and Bonneville in St. Louis and Los Angeles: It's "the end of a battle no one really won", says Emmis chief Jeff Smulyan -- though Smulyan was able to put together a followup deal that gets him a second FM in Los Angeles. The resolution of the Emmis-Sinclair lawsuits was for Emmis to give up Barry Baker's asserted right to buy ABC affiliate KDNL-TV (Channel 30) and take only the six Sinclair radio stations. Those are: Country WIL-FM (full class C at 92.3 MHz). Classic hits KIHT (C1 at 96.3). Modern rock KPNT (C at 105.7). Modern AC "River" WVRV (C2 at 101.1). Adult standards WRTH (1430 KHz, 5-kw, DA-2). And classic rock KXOK-FM (C1 at 97.1). Smulyan says the \$220 million is under the appraised price, so he's happy about that. The most recent appraisal for the total TV-radio combo was \$366.5 million.

Then Emmis handled its station oversupply problem in St. Louis by sending four stations to Bonneville: country WIL-FM, country WKKX, modern AC "River" WVRV and adult standards WRTH. Divestitures were necessary because Emmis already had a solid cluster in St. Louis. These stations will be Bonneville's entrance to the St. Louis market. Here's what Emmis has left itself: rocker KSHE, modern rocker WXTM, modern rock KPNT, classic rock KXOK-FM and classic hits KIHT. It also kept the Steve and D.C. morning show, currently on WKKX (going to Bonneville, remember). That show has done well locally, and is also being syndicated outside of the market.

Coming to St. Louis around August 1-- multiple format shakeups, caused by the Emmis-Bonneville swap. M Street believes Emmis was forced to change its gameplan: It originally wanted to keep its two country stations (WIL-FM and WKKX) and spin off some of the rock properties. But Bonneville may have wanted a sweeter package in exchange for its KZLA, Los Angeles. Result: Emmis winds up with at least one and maybe two rock stations more than it needs. It will own rocker KSHE (with Bob & Tom), modern rocker WXTM (with Howard Stern), modern rocker KPNT (from Sinclair), classic rock KXOK-FM (from Sinclair) and classic hits KIHT (from Sinclair). Emmis has work to do, and fast: LMAS begin in St. Louis and L.A. on August 1.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Four stations in St. Louis equal one struggling country FM in Los Angeles. "Our single largest priority is adding stations in Los Angeles" -- that's what Jeff Smulyan told analysts in his quarterly conference call. The four St. Louis stations he's swapping to Bonneville (country WIL-FM and WKKX plus modern AC WVRV and adult standards WRTH) actually have a little more cash flow than KZLA -- but Jeff's willing to eat the difference in order to win a second FM in the nation's largest radio market. By one measure you could say that KZLA-FM is struggling (it's #22 in Jim Duncan's 1999 revenue rankings, just behind KABC). But it billed \$16.2 million in 1999, which isn't chickenfeed. The looming question now is, how long will Emmis keep KZLA (a class B at 93.3 MHz) doing country? Smulyan says "Country should do better in Los Angeles, and we're going to study it, research it."

In St. Cloud, MN, Regent pays local owner Starcom \$5 million for another three stations to fill out its cluster. Regent has persuaded competitor StarCom to part with three of its six stations there. Since Regent is already operating hot AC KMXX, country WWJO and news/talk/sports WJON, it will now own six stations in the market northwest of Minneapolis-St. Paul. Here are the stations Terry Jacobs and Bill Stakelin have just begun LMAing from StarCom -- Classic rock "Loon" KLZZ, Waite Park, a class A at 103.7 (it has a CP to upgrade from an A to a C3). AC "Star" KKSR, Sartell, MN, a C2 at 96.7. And adult standards "Easy 1390" KXSS, Waite Park at 1390 KHz, with 2500 watts day, 1000 watts night, DA-2.

Sure enough, Mitchell Rubenstein buys Ft. Pierce-market WOSN from Centennial. Beasley "took a pass" on buying Centennial's WOSN when it agreed to shell out \$138 million for everything else in Allen Shaw's group. (Three stations in Las Vegas and three in New Orleans.) The logical buyer for standalone adult standards WOSN, was the local guy-across-the-street -- Mitchell Rubenstein. Now that rumored deal is confirmed. Rubenstein owns three other stations in the Atlantic coast market of Ft. Pierce-Stuart-Vero Beach -- news WTTB, AC WGYL and country WPAW. M Street notes that "Ocean FM" already shares office space in Vero Beach with WPAW. (WTTB and WGYL are in separate space at 1236 16th Street). WOSN is a class C3 at 97.1, licensed to Indian River Shores, FL. One of the brokers at Blackburn handled the sale, which clocked in at \$4.1 million.

In Galveston, TX, KGBC (1540 KHz) sells for \$745,000, as one locally-based owner (Peter Miller's Harbor Broadcasting) deals it to another (Richard Prets' Prets/Blum Media). Neither company owns other radio stations. KGBC does adult standards and has 1,000 watts day, 250 watts night, DA-N. Media Services Group broker Bill Whitley handled the deal. If the calls sound familiar, KGBC was the station where "Tim Kingsbury" was the GM and community leader until last year -- when it was discovered that Kingsbury is really Patrick Hennessy Welsh, who fled Ohio 15 years before to escape charges of insurance fraud and had been presumed dead.

Duke Wright's Midwest Communications buys Grand Rapids-market WHTC (1450 KHz) for a first station in the area, WHTC is a full-service AM licensed to Holland, MI, southwest of Grand Rapids, and it's seller Michael Walton's only property there. Most of Duke Wright's Midwest-group stations are in Wisconsin (he's based in the Packers hometown of Green Bay). But he's got combos in Kalamazoo (hot AC WFAT and urban AC WNWN) and Battle Creek (AC WTVB and country WNWN-FM). WHTC looks to be his first strike around Grand Rapids. The facility is 1,000 watts full-time, non-directional.

We just spotted the name of onetime group owner Ragan Henry in the FCC applications, as the principal behind Zoma Corp. -- which is buying WYNS, Lehigh, PA (1160 KHz), north of Allentown. We like the quote of WYNS seller Martin Philip to the Allentown Morning Call: "I'm 93 years old and I've had the station for 32 years. I like the station a lot, but I'm getting a little tired and can't devote the time to run things." We wish Mr. Philip well and welcome Ragan Henry back into radio ownership. The station he's buying is WYNS, with 4,000 watts day, 1,000 watts night, DA-2. It usually pulls about a 1.5-share 12+ in the Allentown Arbitron, and we always enjoy its mixture of old and new country and community service when we drive through the Lehigh Valley. Ragan Henry says he's leaving the format alone.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

South Carolina owner Curtis Sigmon cashes out his last radio station, by selling WBZK, York (980 KHz) to Vernon Baker for \$500,000. In 1995 Sigmon dealt then-WBZK-FM, Chester to Jefferson-Pilot, which turned it into a simulcast of WBT, Charlotte as "WBT-FM." The station being sold here is oldies WBZK, with 3,000 watts day, 167 watts night, DA-2. Buyer Vernon already owns Charlotte-market WNOW, Mint Hill (1030), which does Christian and brokered Spanish-language programming. In the sale of WBZK, John Pierce represented buyer Vernon Baker and Force Communications and Consultants repped seller Curtis Sigmon.

Around Dallas, wheeler-dealer Ronald Unkefer is buying another FM through his First Broadcasting company. Unkefer previously sold his Flower Mound, TX-licensed KNKI to ABC for \$24 million (it's now KMEO). This time he's paying \$4,110,000 for Charlie Henderson's KXGM, an oldies station at 106.5 MHz licensed to Muenster, TX. It's a class A facility in Cooke County, due north of Ft. Worth. We believe we'll be seeing an upgrade on that facility float through the FCC very soon

In Memphis, Barnstable may be headed to a fourth FM, as KTMO at 98.9 MHz is about to change hands again, from Scott Krusinski's Legend Broadcasting to a company controlled by Barnstable's Al Kaneb and Michael Kaneb. Krusinski just acquired KTMO, Kennett, MO from KBOA for \$2.1 million. Now he's on the verge of FCC approval to re-license it from Kennett to Munford, TN, which makes it worth \$4 million to the Kaneb's. Barnstable's current brood in Memphis is country WGKX, classic hits WSRR-FM and "Soul Classics" WRBO (also a re-licensed move-in).

Turns out an app for a CP in north-central Nevada being purchased by Desert Sky Media is the fruit of another project by the ever-busy Chris Devine and Bruce Buzil -- but this one isn't a move-in. Their \$225,000 purchase of the CP for KHIX, Carlin, NV doesn't get them a move-in candidate to Las Vegas or Salt Lake City -- just a presence up in north-central Nevada. KHIX just re-licensed from Ely, NV to Carlin and upped its power to a full Class C at 96.7 MHz. Devine and Buzil are active through groups like Marathon and Mag Mile. They tell us that Desert Sky Media will be an area-specific name for Nevada. We also note that they just closed (6/23) on their new Denver move-in, KRKI, Estes Park, CO at 102.1. For the KHIX CP, Greg Merrill of Media Services Group repped seller Topaz Enterprises (Dale Ganske).

Would Nipper like this? 3Com buys Internet-radio pioneer Kerbango and makes a deal with Thomson to produce standalone Internet radio receivers under the "RCA" brand. Kerbango made a sensation at the last NAB Radio Show with its standalone Internet radio, which literally doesn't require a host PC (just a phone line and AC power). 3Com's "Ventures" subsidiary made an earlier investment in Kerbango, and they like what they've seen enough to buy the rest for \$80 million. Kerbango CEO Jon Fitch becomes VP/GM of 3Com's Internet Audio Division.

The syndicated Bizness Soup Talk Radio operation has been acquired by Peacock Financial, which says the talkshow is now clearing in 20 major markets. Peacock will expand the syndication and also focus on Bizness Soup's online potential.

Make that two stations who've earned notoriety for mounting a Britney Spears hoax. This time it's Citadel's WBHT in Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, and nobody was seriously hurt. (Unlike the mom who suffered a heart attack and died at WMRV-FM's stunt in Binghamton.) WBHT said listeners should've figured out that this appearance was actually a prank. But 300 to 400 people showed up at the station to watch a limo drive up, out of which sprang jock Billy Fox in a tuxedo holding a Britney Spears doll. At least one bottle was thrown by the disgruntled crowd -- it was aimed at Fox but hit a child.

The Lytle Organization changes its name to "Apex Performance Systems", but the name change doesn't mean a change in focus. Husband and wife Chris Lytle and Sarah McCann started the company in Madison, WI back in 1981, and for a while it was also known as the "AdVisory Board." Right around the time of last year's NAB Radio Show in Orlando, they sold the company to Cumulus Media. Their agreement with Cumulus allows them to do international consulting and to work for clients in any non-Cumulus U.S. market.

In the public radio world, CPB announces it will invest more than \$3 million through its Public Service 2000 grants program, including \$1.2 million to Minnesota Public Radio (for online efforts), KPBS, San Diego (\$141,500 for its voter education project), California's Inter-Tribal native Radio Summit (\$224,900), and "Hearing Voices" (a Bozeman, MT independent producers' effort that will get \$330,000).

The rich get much richer, as the very large markets dominate Jim Duncan's "Highest Growth Rate" markets for 1999. San Francisco is tops with an amazing 31.6% one-year rise in revenue. Chicago and San Jose are tied for #2 at 25.9%. Washington, D.C. is #4 at 24%. Atlanta's #5 at 23.1%. Austin's #6 at 21.9%. Los Angeles is #7 at 21.8%. Seattle's #8 at 20%. Boston is #9 at 19.7%. New York is #10 at 19.5%. Dallas is #11 at 19%. Little Rock is #12 at 18.4%. Corpus Christi and Riverside are tied for #13 at 17.1%. Norfolk is #15 at 15.9%. The dominance of the very largest markets is a change from the pattern of the last couple of years. The 1998 top ten highest-growth-rate markets were Raleigh, Fayetteville (NC), San Francisco, Las Vegas, Austin, Louisville, Mobile, Greensboro, Portland (OR) and Orlando. **M STREET BAZAAR. . . PEOPLE, PRODUCTS, AND PROGRAMMING**

Clear Channel is preparing to move "Channel 103.1" listeners in L.A. over to the Internet, as it prepares to sell KACD/KBCD as part of its Los Angeles-area divestiture package. Check out this "Petition Registration" on "Channell1031.com": "Our parent company has promised us that if we can show them enough listeners will follow us, they will make Channel 103.1 the first-ever radio station to move from the FM dial to a state-of-the-art broadband broadcast over the Internet." Of course other L.A. "lost formats" have morphed into Internet-only stations (though not broadband). Those include hard-rock KNAC and "Groove Radio" -- which also used to occupy the 103.1 frequency of KACD/KBCD. The FM stations themselves are being sold to Spanish broadcaster Entravision.

More pre-merger activity from Clear Channel and AMFM Inc., as Premiere's Kraig Kitchin pays a visit to AMFM Radio Networks in Dallas. We hear that current staffers will be offered the chance to stay when Clear Channel-owned Premiere Radio Networks takes over its rival. Where there are redundancies between CC-owned Premiere and AMFM Radio Networks, they'll look to place AMFM people in other slots. We also hear that Kitchin will maintain a significant presence in Dallas, where AMFM Radio Networks is based. David Kantor, AMFM Radio Networks' first and only President, will be exiting with the takeover. How about the brand name of "AMFM Radio Networks"? It may stay in the case of the RADAR-rated sales networks and some programs where there are competing products currently offered by CC and AMFM Inc. (example: Premiere's Rick Dees countdown and AMFM Radio Networks' Casey Kasem).

Also pre-merger, AMFM Inc. names programming execs for the east and west coasts. One of Steve Smith's new jobs is to look for opportunities to syndicate formats like "Jammin' Oldies" and "Rockin' Hits" to additional stations. New Executive VP of Programming/Western Operations Smith will oversee stations in L.A., Chicago, San Francisco, Minneapolis and Riverside. While Z100, New York-based Tom Poleman gets the equivalent East Coast position, with markets like Boston, Philadelphia, D.C., Detroit and New York.

Goodbye, Miss Patti Page, the Singing Rage: Standards KABL, San Francisco updates its format by 15 years. And hello to a new focus on the 60s, 70s and 80s. In fact KABL programmer Ed Ely tells M Street the new slogan is "Bay Area Favorites of the 60s, 70s and 80s." Ed dispels the rumors that the personality lineup is changing (it's not) and says the new demo target is 45 to 64. The station is KABL, Oakland at 960 KHz and it's owned by AMFM Inc. Despite consistently pulling a 2 to 3-share 12+ in the San Francisco Arbitrons, Duncan's American Radio figures KABL billed just \$3,700,000 in 1999. That made KABL #23 on Duncan's list of 23 top-billing stations in S.F.

The show must go on -- even if your traffic copter crashes during morning drive. WLW, Cincinnati reporter Dave Armbruster was able to radio in a report while the helicopter was literally lying on its side, broken in two pieces on the ground -- surely the happiest traffic report WLW has ever gotten. Neither Armbruster nor pilot Rodney Newsome was injured in the June 23 morning-drive-time crash of the WLW traffic chopper. The aircraft lost power at about 1200 feet and Newsome set it down on the berm of the I-275 beltway around Cincinnati. Armbruster was subbing for WLW's regular traffic guy, John Phillips.

Multicultural decides to make its WNYG, Long Island a broadcast training facility. Newsday reports that new GM Jack McCloy calls WNYG, Babylon (1440 KHz) a "combination of training center and commercial radio station." The actual format will be CHR and they're calling it "Student Radio 1440", to be mostly student-run and aided by a small full-time staff. This isn't what Multicultural's Arthur Liu had in mind when he started the process of acquiring WNYG out of bankruptcy. His original scheme was to control WNYG so he could improve the signal of adult

standards WNSW, Newark, NJ (1430). Could it be that Liu discovered the re-engineering wouldn't really help WNSW?

Looks like Lexington is due for an oldies battle, as Clear Channel quietly flipped its just-acquired WMST-FM, Mount Sterling (105.5) from country to oldies on Friday, June 23 -- anticipating that Blue Chip's "Louie Louie" stunt might signal an oldies format on WLXO. As M Street went to press, Blue Chip was still marching in the "Louie Louie" parade while WMST-FM is playing full-time oldies under new calls of WMJK. But we do expect WLXO will make the commitment to oldies.

Blue Chip signs a group streaming deal with Portland's BroadcastUrban.com, which is the urban-themed division of BroadcastAmerica.com. It signed all 18 Blue Chip stations to a contract that includes audio streaming and a featured position on the BroadcastUrban website. M Street notes that while Blue Chip is African-American owned, it does a wide variety of formats including CHR, news/talk and country.

Radio Disney returns to Albuquerque, this time on Henry Tafoya's KDEF at 1150 KHz, which drops sports to become an affiliate of ABC Radio Networks' Radio Disney format. KDEF retains its locally programmed sports show in morning drive (7-10). ABC lost Albuquerque last July when then-KDZZ went adult standards. That station later moved from 1580 to 1600 and just became all-news KIVA (in cooperation with KOB-TV).

This year's Marconi nominees are public, and we expect the campaigning to begin any second for the balloting that ends August 14. The five "Legendary Station" nominees are Infinity's KNX, L.A., Carter Broadcast Group's KPRS, Kansas City, Jerry Lee's WBEB, Philadelphia, Clear Channel's WEBN, Cincinnati, and Journal Broadcast Group's WTMJ, Milwaukee. Network/Syndicated Personality nominees are J-P's Bob & Sheri, Westwood's Don Imus, ABC's Tom Joyner, Premiere's Rush Limbaugh and the Howard Stern show. The complete list is online at NAB.org, with winners to be announced at the Radio Show in San Francisco at the Marconi dinner on September 23, emceed by Dick Purtan.

There's no business like show business. . . Jones picks up the Hollywood Stock Exchange show that's been running on KLSX. No dull talk about P-E ratios on this "stock exchange" program -- it's all about the movies and other L.A.-produced entertainment and it features filmmakers and celebs. The show started on Infinity's KLSX (97.1) last July and is "going national" via Jones Radio.

Reba McEntire is doing a 90-minute concert special for Westwood One called "The Singer's Diary", and it's Reba's first concert on U.S. radio (says Westwood) in more than 12 years. The special airs the weekend of August 19-20.

At Stratford Research, Lew Dickey promotes Jan Jeffries to President, as Dickey moves many of the Stratford consultants who've been working with Cumulus clients over to the Cumulus payroll. Jan's currently the Senior VP and director of contemporary programming for Stratford. Lew Dickey is the principal of Stratford Research and also the President of Cumulus. Wall Street continues to watch Cumulus to see whether it can close all its announced deals and weather a very difficult period. Cumulus did close this week on Tupelo-market CHR WWKZ, which it acquired from Houston Pearce for \$2,925,000.

When is a recipe dangerous? Answer: When you're former SLA fugitive Sara Jane Olson, who canceled her radio appearance on L.A.-market pubcaster KPCC because of her attorneys' advice that she might be violating a judge's gag order. Olson is raising funds for her legal defense by selling a cookbook titled "Serving Time: America's Most Wanted Recipes." Guess we'll have to buy the book to see how Olson makes her artichoke dip.


