# IBS Annual Report

## 1975-1976

The 1975-76 academic year has proved to be among the most active of all of the Intercollegiate Broadcasting System's 36 year history, and it is a pleasure to report on some of the highlights.

Perhaps the single most important change in the system was the bringing together, under one roof, all of the various activities that make up IBS. Starting last spring, IBS was moved to a central office of it's own at Vails Gate, N.Y. For those who haven't had the chance to visit, Vails Gate is a tiny little village on the banks of the Hudson River, about 60 miles north of New York City. Besides the International Headquarters of IBS, Vails Gate boasts a large intersection, thousands of garden apartments and the revolutionary war quarters of General Henry Knox, known to visitors and residents alike as "corpulent, but consistent." There are many fine shopping plazas in Vails Gate also.

With the establishment of a central office, the first full-time Executive Director of IBS was appointed. Rick Askoff, a 1974 graduate of college radio (and college too, although it's hard to say which is more important) started the year in September. Those of you who are familiar with IBS's past probably remember the days when, in order to communicate with the system, you had to pick and choose from 11 or 12 different people, in different states, to get what you wanted. Nowadays, all of the internal IBS communication (between all of the volunteers in different areas) is taken care of by the central office. Member stations writing to Vails Gate either get their letters answered from there, or, the letters are forwarded to the right people. Not only does the member station find it easier to write, but letters do get answered, usually within a few days. But that's not the only advantage to having a central office.

Each one of the IBS departments

benefits in some way from centralization. All of the activities of the system are now coordinated from Vails Gate, and we think that the difference in the system's functions is noticeable. To be totally honest, some things have worked out better than others, but on the whole, things are well. Here's a complete rundown on what we've been up to:

### FORMAT magazine

A tremendous amount of effort went into the publication of the IBS music newsletter this year. As of this past summer, FORMAT was expanded to a booklet-style magazine, edited by John Davlin. John is the station manager of WGSU-FM, the radio station of the State University College of New

York, at Geneseo. FORMAT has become not only a medium for record reviews and comment, but also, a real help for stations who are attempting to deal with record company promotion departments. The FORMAT record company directory, published last November and reproduced elsewhere in this magazine, is an excellent guide to the correct addresses, names and phone numbers of record company people. In addition to assembling and printing this guide, John has added a number of helpful hints on how to get the best service possible from the companies. Tips on putting out playlists, where to send them and how to get the message across to promotion departments have helped stations get record service that they never dreamed of having . . . for free. As if that weren't enough, John organized and carried out an actual boycott of Warner Brother's records, in protest of their \$150 subscription fee for college station service. Thanks to John's efforts, the participation of over 200 IBS stations and the work of John Montgomery (of Warner Brothers), that company has decided to resume service to college stations once again.

Needless to say, nearly everyone involved has benefited from what has been called the first truly organized action of college radio stations.

The obvious popularity of *FORMAT* among our member stations led the system to up-grade the magazine's appearance. *FORMAT* is now published with a heavy paper cover, with its own cover logo. Next year, we hope to improve *FORMAT* to a greater extent, including the exploration of methods of getting *FORMAT* to stations faster than at present. Individual subscriptions to *FORMAT* are now available, and we will continue to send out a copy to each member station next year.

## IBS conventions

Two separate regional conferences were organized by IBS this past fall. They were both held in the Northeast area . . . one in New Jersey and the other in Western New York. Mike Teer, a senior at Livingston College in New Brunswick, N.J. organized a conference on November 29. There were at least 8 different sessions going on at different times, many featuring speakers from record companies or area colleges. About 75 people attended from stations in the New Jersey, Delaware, New York City and Pennsylvania areas, making it one of the largest regional IBS conferences ever.

The other conference took place in Geneseo, New York and stations from New York, Pennsylvania and Ohio were invited. Delegates from about 25 stations attended. The idea behind this conference was basically informal, with students from stations meeting together in sessions and discussing their problems and ideas. The conference was organized by John Davlin and his staff from the Geneseo college station.

Regional activity was at a higher level than most years, but there are still vast areas in the country that have yet to be organized. The planning of conferences, the publication of regional newsletters, the exchange of tapes and other activities are all possible for those areas that have some interested people. Hopefully, next year's staff of IBS regional directors (to be announced next issue) will be even more active than this year's. Anyone interested in working with other stations in a geographic area can contact IBS (at Vails Gate) for information on the regions program. If you would like to help

out in your area, you might try giving your regional director a call next fall and see what you can do to help. Remember—Regional directors are volunteers, but if they know you are interested in getting something together, they will work on it.

By the time this magazine is published, the IBS national convention for 1976 will be over. "Interdependence '76" is the name of the convo, and it's taking place in Philadelphia on March 5th, 6th and 7th. The next issue of *JCR* will have a complete run-down on the convention for those who missed it.

## The Journal of College Radio

The issue of *JCR* that you are now holding is, believe it or not, the first to be published since December of 1974. Along with everything else in IBS, the *Journal* was moved from one part of the country to another . . . from Edmond, Oklahoma to Connecticut. Things seemed to be going along well, but unfortunately, the new-found editor of *JCR* resigned unexpectedly, leaving a magazine but no one to put it together. As a last resort, the editing of *JCR* was left to the IBS Executive Director, Rick Askoff, and as things stand now, we will be publishing this issue and one other this year, after the March convention.

The *Journal of College Radio* was, at one time, the perfect medium for publishing articles about college radio. In fact, it was, and still is, the only nationwide magazine exclusively devoted to radio on campus today, aside from *FORMAT*, the other IBS publication. *JCR* has published articles on engineering, station management, business management and music programming . . . and all of it related specifically to the college station. One of the main priorities of IBS in the coming year is to put *JCR* back on its feet again, perhaps making it better than ever before. Articles for the magazine are being solicited and so is a new editor. *JCR* will probably make its home in Vails Gate, and if things go as planned, a full time editor will be hired, probably this summer. Anyone interested in publishing *JCR*, or writing articles for it, should send a note to Vails Gate. We welcome your suggestions, of course, but more than that, we need your help. Given proper care and feeding, this magazine *could* be the college radio equivalent of

## IBS MEMBER SERVICES

The general heading of Member services encompasses several different IBS functions. Most are operating on a demand basis . . . that is, if a station requests a service, we do what we can to provide it. Without doubt, the largest of these is the IBS program department. This year was the best year ever for IBS programming, mostly because of the addition of a series of interviews called "FOCUS: America". Produced by Rick Arenstein and Chuck Bortnick at the University of Miami in Coral Gables, Florida, this series was ordered by well over 100 stations in IBS. Because of the series' success, the show's producers have come up with still another set of interviews, again being distributed by IBS. Besides "FOCUS: America", the IBS program catalogue offers eight other taped programs, all for the lowest possible cost.

IBS continues to provide printing services for stations who request forms and other supplies. Contracts, affidavits, program logs and Press cards are all available from the member services office at Vails Gate. Again, the cost is as low as possible for member stations.

IOTA BETA SIGMA, the national collegiate honorary society for college broadcasters, is still active and many new chapters are being formed today.

In the remainder of this year, IBS will be providing several publications for its members that should be interesting to all. For those who have difficulty in grasping the fine points of FCC license exams, especially element nine's complexities, Jeff Tellis will be preparing the IBS study guide. The test has gotten much harder in recent years but hopefully, we'll be able to help test-takers this spring get around those technical pitfalls. The *College Radio Placement Service* or CRPS, is undergoing some changes for this year. In the past, this service has consisted of a survey of commercial stations in the United States inquiring of the job prospects that year, who they were looking for and what was required. These results were published in a kind of code and distributed to member stations. At the same time, individual students at IBS member stations submitted their resumes for distribution in a "resume bank" to commercial stations that re-

quested it. This service was funded by grants from ASCAP and IRTF, the International Radio and Television Foundation. Although CRPS seemed like a fine idea, several problems with the system developed that have prevented it from publication this year. Commercial stations were too slow to respond . . . it took too long to correlate all of the data without a computer and perhaps most importantly, the final survey didn't get published till late summer, long after it would do most graduates any good. In addition, it was discovered that most commercial stations rarely know when they are going to need an employee more than a few weeks ahead of time, except for daytime AM stations hiring extra people in the summer. So, in lieu of a job survey this year, IBS will be publishing another guide . . . this one directed at those who are looking for tips on job hunting in today's radio market. Jim Cameron, an IBS director and a recent refugee from the Job hunting arena, will be writing the guide this spring, and we should have it published before summer. Jim hopes to give some good ideas on what constitutes a "good" demo tape . . . and what goes into an effective resume. By the way, Jim was successful in his own job hunt . . . he's now the News Director of WHCN-FM in Hartford, Connecticut.

One other IBS member service was inaugurated this year, and it's effectiveness was so great, and so popular, that it deserves an entire category to itself.

## EBS Equipment sales

Because IBS is, in effect, a cooperative of college radio stations, we can sometimes function as a bulk-purchaser of various items. Because we are a non-profit corporation, we can sell these items to our members at great reductions, and such was the case with the new EBS equipment.

As a replacement for the old emergency broadcast system, CONELRAD, the FCC has mandated that all broadcast stations install a new two-tone warning device. Jeff Tellis has provided an article on the new EBS equipment in a different part of this magazine, but it was written before the IBS-McMartin agreement was made. By negotiating with different manufacturers of this equipment, IBS was able to arrange a substantial discount for member stations who were required

to buy new EBS devices. In some cases, this discount amounted to more than the amount of IBS dues, so stations actually received a financial advantage from belonging to IBS, in addition to the other IBS services. The EBS equipment must be installed by April 15th, so the period of time that IBS can offer this discount is limited. However, the large numbers of stations that were able to take advantage of this offer has led to speculation that involves other kinds of broadcast equipment. For example, if IBS could arrange substantial discounts on EBS equipment, why not try for the same on turntables? On cartridges? Why not on transmitters? (how many stations are planning to go 10 watt FM this year?). IF this kind of operation is at all possible, we will be assembling the first "IBS equipment sales co-op" broadcast equipment catalogue this summer, and it should be available before the fall semester begins. Keep your eye open for it . . . especially if you plan to spend any money on equipment next year.

Overall . . . the picture of IBS this year is a good one. We have increased our activity level, certainly, and we hope that stations are noticing this. We estimate that something like 17,000 pieces of mail have originated from the Vails Gate office, . . . all of it going to college radio stations in all fifty states of the U.S., along with several stations in Canada and two in Australia. On many levels, IBS is attempting to provide a cohesive background behind the different college stations that make up our share of the so-called "broadcast industry". Commercial stations, through the NAB, are organized on almost the same kind of basis as, say, the American Medical Association or perhaps, the NRA. By effectively banding together, almost every definable segment of the American populace (Doctors, Plumbers, Insurance agents, Dairy Farmers, Commercial Broadcasters, etc.) manage to make their desires known and acted upon (by one means or another).

*There is no reason why college broadcasters cannot do the same!* We all know what the interests of the college broadcaster are, but there are few who care to pursue them beyond the boundaries of the campus. Sure, the immediate problem of the campus broadcaster is usually a morass of record thievery, programming hassels, ab-

sent disc-jockeys and so on, but that is *only* the immediate problem. What will you do about community ascertainment? Will someone from your staff make a filing with the FCC on the subject? How about our friends in the record companies? For the untold millions of dollars worth of free air time that we give to their product, can we expect anything in return? What service there is to college radio is gratefully appreciated, as it should be . . . but will it continue? A good question, and one that is no doubt hotly debated in board rooms across the country. Whether your station is a small (but well loved) carrier current . . . or a giant commercial FM . . . it's not at all a bad idea to belong to something larger than the single campus and your community. As an association of some 700 college stations, IBS provides this "larger" voice for college radio stations.

Low cost equipment, better record service; better employment prospects for graduates . . . all are being worked on for you. IBS continues to provide individual consulting services for member stations, and we also continue to

represent college radio before the FCC (the only such representation). We will continue to grow, and as we do, our effectiveness will increase. More activities will be sponsored, and more services will be established. The only thing we need is, of course, your cooperation, for what use is an association whose members do not care to be associated? We're not asking for a tremendous amount of money (IBS dues have not been increased in 15 years), and we're not asking for a large amount of energy. What we ask for most of all is responsiveness. We cannot claim to represent a group that does not respond as a group. The effectiveness of the Warner Brothers boycott . . . as small as it was . . . astounded many because college radio had never *acted* that way before. We're not trying to make a big deal out of it . . . and no one wants to go on to "bigger and better boycotts". We're simply trying to insure that if college radio must act together, it really will do so.

What should you do? Nothing much . . . simply answer your mail, keep in touch, and keep us busy! That's what we're here for.



# FM

Sometimes when we put this column together, it is difficult to gather enough FCC news for more than one or two items. This issue, things are different. During the past year the Commission finalized a number of rule changes and proposed others which will prove extremely important to Educational FM Broadcasters. Here's a summary of the changes and how they may affect your station.

## CUT-OFF RULES FOR FM ADOPTED

According to a new FCC rule, applications for new or changed FM facilities will be assigned cut-off dates. After that date has passed, no applications which conflict with the "cut-off" proposal will be accepted by the Commission. In the past, an FM application was vulnerable to competition right up until the day the FCC took action on it. In some cases Construction Permits were actually granted but then recalled when it was discovered a competing application had been filed shortly before the date of the grant. If the new rules work as we think they should, each FM application will have a period of vulnerability ranging from 60 to 120 days until the assigned cut-off date is reached. After that, no competitors will be considered regardless of the time required to process and actually grant the "cut-off" proposal. The new rules should benefit college broadcasters seeking new or improved FM facilities since, if a cut-off date passes and no competitors appear, one can reasonably assume that, unless it is otherwise defective, the application will be granted. But the rules may also cause problems for new applicants whose proposals conflict, accidentally or otherwise with cut-off applications. The Commission had already "cut-off" more than 200 FM proposals, as of

February first. If you have an application in process and need to know which proposals have already made the cut-off list, call or write us and we'll send you a copy of the lists already issued for just the cost of postage and xeroxing.

## ASCERTAINMENT OF COMMUNITY NEEDS IS ON THE WAY FOR EDUCATORS

The FCC has at last proposed final action in Docket 19816 which contemplates requiring Educational FM Broadcast Stations to join their commercial kinfolk in the ascertainment process. Comments on the proposal are all in and the Docket is scheduled for Commission consideration on February 18, 1976. If adopted as written, the FCC proposal would phase renewal applicants into the ascertainment process by having each station start the survey effort a year before its next license renewal is filed. Presumably, stations with less than a year to go before license renewal would not be required to include ascertainment material in that renewal application. Class D stations and those stations programmed strictly with instructional material would be exempted from the survey requirements. Commercial broadcasters have lived with ascertainment in one form or another for more than ten years and educational FM stations looking for H.E.W. money have had to face the task as well. If you don't know how to "ascertain", don't worry . . . you have plenty of company. We'll try to include a coherent set of ascertainment guidelines in next month's issue of JCR. If you want to learn how to play the ascertainment game before that, ask the General Manager of your local commercial broadcast station.

## SIDELIGHTS

The FCC has relaxed its rules for accepting new AM applications. The revised rules will permit filing for a new full-time or daytime AM station when that station would result in a first or second broadcast service licensed to a community. Applicants will still be required to abide by the existing interference standards, however. The change won't mean much to colleges looking for frequencies. But a substantial number of new stations will almost certainly go on the air providing additional job openings.

As expected, the Commission denied the Lansman-Milam Rule Making Petition requesting a freeze on applications by religious institutions for television or FM channels reserved for educational stations. The Lansman-Milam Rule Making Petition drew more than 700,000 comments and created a stupendous paper jam at the FCC.

## PREDICTIONS FOR 1976

Looking ahead at the rest of 1976, here's our annual set of educated guesses on the future of educational radio. Look for a continued assault on the ten watters and their frequencies by CPB, NAEB and other trade organizations comprised mostly of high powered educational broadcasters. Ascertainment is virtually a certainty for all but Class D stations. The proposed ascertainment rules will be adopted with only minor changes. A Rule Making Petition will be filed seeking to open up 87.9 MHz (FM Channel 200) for Class D FM Broadcasters. Look for a new Form 340 in about four months. The new Form will call for detailed terrain information and allocation studies for all stations including ten watters.

# Extra Bread to Spend

Have you got a few hundred extra dollars lying around in your budget? Well by April 15, 1976 you may have to come up with anywhere between \$100 and \$300 or more to buy some of the new equipment which will be required for the Emergency Broadcast System (EBS), if you are a licensed on-air station.

It seems the wizards have come up with a new 2-tone system to replace the present carrier on-off attention signal. Assuming you've already got an EBS monitor (which will supply the audio of the station being monitored), you will need a *decoder* to sense the new 2-tone signal, and an *encoder* to generate the new 2-tone signal when your station does its weekly test. (If you're a 10 watt FM station, you will only need the decoder in addition to the receiver. The FCC has exempted you from needing the encoder, but you will still have to perform weekly tests and receive the weekly tests from the station you monitor).

If you're a licensed station, the FCC has probably sent you a Federal Register reprint describing in detail the new system and its requirements. (Check through the pile of unopened mail sitting on your desk). If not . . . go over to your library and look up the Federal Register, Vol. 40—No. 158, Thursday, August 14, 1975. Pages 34116-34118.

The deadline had originally been in January, but it's been extended to April 15, 1976 to allow manufacturers to get their units type approved, certified, and on the market. It also allows stations time to order the units and install them. (It doesn't say how we're supposed to come up with the money to buy the equipment, however).

So far, several manufacturers have been advertising the new EBS units. Prices for the decoder seem to start at about \$100 and go upwards from there. The encoders are at about \$200 and up. If you need a new receiver, there

are specially made units starting at about \$100 or so. (In case you don't know which station you're supposed to monitor . . . call up the chief engineer at the local commercial station, and he'll tell you who he monitors).

There are provisions in the new rules which allow for a station to build its own units . . . but they must be type-approved and certified as with commercial units. If you build it yourself there's no fee for the type-approval and certification processes. Should you decide to try this route . . . you'll need to check out the specifications given in the Federal Register reference noted earlier . . . and the applicable procedures in the FCC rules, subpart J of Part 2, and Subpart B of Part 15.

## *The latest word . . .*

### **Memorandum Re Emergency Broadcast System Two-Tone Attention System**

The Commission has now reaffirmed the deadline of April 15, 1976 for acquisition by broadcast stations of equipment required for the new EBS two-tone alert system, quieting rumors of delay and rejecting requests for extension of time submitted by the National Association of Broadcasters and the Louisiana Association of Broadcasters.

Proponents of the delay urged that the required equipment was both expensive and in short supply, but the Commission disagreed, noting that 14 suppliers have now received type acceptance and/or certification for EBS equipment, priced as low as \$195.00 for a combination encoder/decoder. The Commission rejected the NAB's argument that no efforts had been made to coordinate the new system with hospitals and other non-broadcast organizations who monitor the present EBS system in order to receive warning of local emergencies, such as tornadoes and floods, emphasizing that

the major purpose of the EBS system is interstation signalling.

In affirming the original deadline, the Commission made no changes from the regulations previously adopted (described in our memorandum of August 20, 1975). It did, however, re-emphasize and clarify certain points:

1. EBS transmitters must be type accepted, and EBS receivers must be certified. Licensees wishing to produce up to five encoders or decoders for their *own* use only must apply for type acceptance or certification, must test the equipment before use and submit the results under the rules generally applicable to type acceptance and certification, but need not pay the fees normally required with such applications.

2. With the exception of noncommercial educational FM stations of 10 watts or less in power, all stations must have the required EBS transmitting equipment and all stations *without exception* must have the receiving equipment. Even if there are now no stations which rely on the particular station for EBS transmissions, the Commission noted there may be such stations in the future.

3. Since the new EBS system does not rely on carrier interruption, the EBS equipment may be located at the studio rather than at the transmitter. The Commission said that, under the circumstances, co-owned, co-located broadcast stations (e.g., an AM and FM licensed to the same entity with combined studios) may share *one set* of EBS equipment and still satisfy the new requirements. The Commission also focused on the special situation of licensees, like some educational television systems, which program several broadcast transmitters, licensed to different geographical locations, from a single studio point. Such licensees may apply to the Commission by letter for permission to use only one set of EBS equipment. The letter should give details of the system which show that one set of equipment will be sufficient. The key consideration, according to the Commission, is that "EBS equipment must be installed in such a way that it enables the staff, at normal duty locations, to monitor the emergency message and to act accordingly."

# DIRECTORY OF COLLEGE RADIO STATIONS

## From the editor

Here, here at last is the 1975-76 Journal of College Radio annual directory issue. Each and every one of the IBS member stations—including our international associates—is at least listed in these pages. They are arranged alphabetically by state and by institution, which means that under "California Radio (IBS)" you'll find all of the IBS stations in that state in order of their apparent college name.

Everything listed in this directory has been determined by the people at the stations themselves. During the Spring and Fall of 1975, IBS stations received, filled out and sent back a form called a "Data-Banc". Information on the station's call letters, their method of transmission and power, hours of operation, personnel and format was collected, deciphered and printed up for this issue and believe me, it took some time to do it all. In order to save paper costs, the listings are made in a kind of code, which, hopefully, the following key will make plain.

The first line of all these inscriptions contains only the station's call letters, its type of signal (in this case, carrier

current) and the IBS code number. The next line contains address, phone number, signal type (and any other miscellaneous information) and also, the frequency. The college's enrollment is abbreviated: "en:," the station's potential audience: "pa:," their hours on-air per day: "hpd" and their days on-air per week: "dpw". The stations' personnel are listed in the next few lines, with appropriate abbreviations. Finally, the station's format is described, their affiliations (networks, news services, etc.) and commercial rates, if applicable.

If all of this seems unduly confusing, try looking up your own station in the directory. If your station isn't listed, it means that you are not presently a member of IBS. IF A BIG MISTAKE HAS BEEN MADE, LET US KNOW!!! Also, if there is nothing listed under your station's name, it means that we never received a completed Data-Banc from your station.




