
The Annual Christmas Party will follow the business meeting. All family members are welcome.

And what the Hell would you say?



Meeting Minutes

The November 10th meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Pres. Jerry Talbott. Minutes of the October meeting were approved as published in the CALL LETTER.

The Treasurer's Report was given and accepted.

GOOD AND WELFARE

The membership was informed of the November 6th death of member Doug Warren. A contribution to the American Cancer Society in the Club's name was authorized.

OLD BUSINESS

Dick Karman reported that four drawer file cabinets ranged in cost from \$100.00 to \$125.00. There was little difference between new ones and used ones. No further action was taken.

Various possibilities were discussed as to where the Spring Swap Meet should be held, and whether paid advertising was worth the cost. An alternative would be to mail flyer to collectors and individuals known to be interested in attending. No decisions were made.

The matter of decreasing interest in the Club's Choice contest was discussed, and it was decided to discontinue it in favor of members bringing their latest acquisition to show. No objections were raised, as it was pointed out that this already was a fairly common practice.





Let's look at some of the years in the last decade.

To some it seems like only yesterday when Joe Tompkins told Bob Bilbie to get the "H" out. He was referring to the way that Bob continued to misspell Joe's name. This was 1976.

But some memories were not so noteworthty. Just after Christmas in 1977 the "Golden Hours" people sponsored a Radiothon. Regretfully the portion that our Society played took a lot of work, and in the eyes of all who were around, the entire episode was a bomb.

In January of 1978, a lawyer was retained to start the first steps toward incorporation. (I trust this did not result from the Radiothon).

In 1978 things quieted down. The membership renewals were down and only the active members stuck together. Bob and Sandy Bilbic had left the club for Bob's health. Bob Hay was acting as the Call Letter editor. Tom James was the President.

In March that year, KOIN television aired a special on the hobby. Harley Perkins and Tom James did an exceptionally fine job of representing the Society during the two hour show.

On a darker note, member Jerry Novak died of a heart attack in April.

In June of '78 Tom James took over the position of Editor and was the first (and last) time since Bob Bilbie where the editor and President were the same.

There are many many memories perhaps more important than those listed here, but those who remember the "beginnings", will surely remember these.


Douglas H. Warren

Douglas H. Warren of Tualatin, a public relations consultant and former journalist, died of cancer Tuesday in a Portland-area hospital. He was 55.

Funeral will be Friday in the Dokken-Nelson Funeral Home chapel, Bozeman, Mont., with burial in the Bozeman Ceme-

tery.

Mr. Warren was born in Bowdon, Ga., and moved to the Portland area in 1978. Previously, he had been editor of the Montana Agricultural Experiment Station at Montana State University in Bozeman, where he directed the communications program from 1965 to 1978. He also had been



news director at several radio and television stations in the Midwest from 1957 to 1962 and was a member of NBC-TV's regional election reporting team.

He held a bachelor's degree in agriculture from the University of Georgia and a master's in journalism from Oklahoma State University. He was a member of the American Association of Agricultural College Editors, from which he received many awards; Sigma Delta Chi Society of Professional Journalists, the Kiwanis clubs of Bozeman and Tualatin, the Chrysler 300 Automobile Club and the Northwest Vintage Radio Club.

Survivors include his wife, Evelyn; daughter, Elaine Olson of Wolf Point, Mont.; mother, Alma of Bowdon, Ga.; and two grandsons.






