






The following is from Joey Tompkins, our good old Salem collector:
This is written exactly as we received it. (Ed.)

Bob:
Maybe you can glean something from all of this for the next newsletter.
You mentioned that it is hard to come up with things to mention in it.
You will note that for forty years I've written news style, no corrections,
save that for the re-write. Joe
(Guess I fall into the category of re-writer, so we'll dress it up a bit, Ed.)

One of the most common complaints we so often find in the old battery sets is that the transformers have either secondary or primary windings opened up. You need not tear your hair out for there is an easy way to repair them. Remove the winding taps from the PLATE entro, and the B power, insert a 100k resistor. On the grid side between the GRID and the C or A bias source, whichever is used, insert a 1 meg. IF in the first stage, 500k in the second stage, 250k in the third, if there is a third stage audio. Between the plate and grid of the transformer insert a .01-1.10% 400 DC condenser. There will be a loss in volume, but quality will be much better. Plate voltages may have to be boosted a little, but don't exceed the voltages required.







The Golden Age of Radio

KVIX Radio, The World Forestry Center, and The Northwest Vintage Radio Society have gotten together to make a dream come true. The Golden Age of Radio, Memories in Wood, will open in the Gallery of the World Forestry Center on November 15th thanks to Mark Reed of the Forestry Center, Jon and Judy Fessler of KVIX and the NWVRS display committee.

The men who volunteered for the committee were Ed Buhite, Ed Charman, Sonny Clutter, Jim Mason, Ray Nelson, and Jerry Talbott. Dick Karman will help as time permits. These members have set aside their time to make this venture work. This display has great potential and may help lead to a permanent radio display.

Members of this committee will contact collectors soliciting radios for display as they fill out their exhibit quotas. Welcome their requests with a warm affirmative answer.

The display will be divided into segments. A large glass display case will feature battery radios. There will be two glass table cases. One will hold crystal sets, the other will display "hollow-state" technology. A special attraction will be a studio displaying microphones, transmitters, and receivers from the "Golden Age of Radio". Five smaller clusters will feature favorite brand names from the vintage years. They will include: Zenith, Crosley, Atwater-Kent, Grebe, and Philco. Finally there will be a historical display of radios which were manufactured in Portland.

KVIX Radio has agreed to do a great audio sound track for the display and will be helping to clean up many of the loose ends. The NWVRS should be thankful for the sponsorship of KVIX Radio and the enthusiasm that will make this a success.

An agreement is also being worked out with a gentleman who holds a doctorate degree in the History of Technology. We hopefully will persuade him to write some scripts for us, and perhaps help us with the beginning of a Radio Museum.
