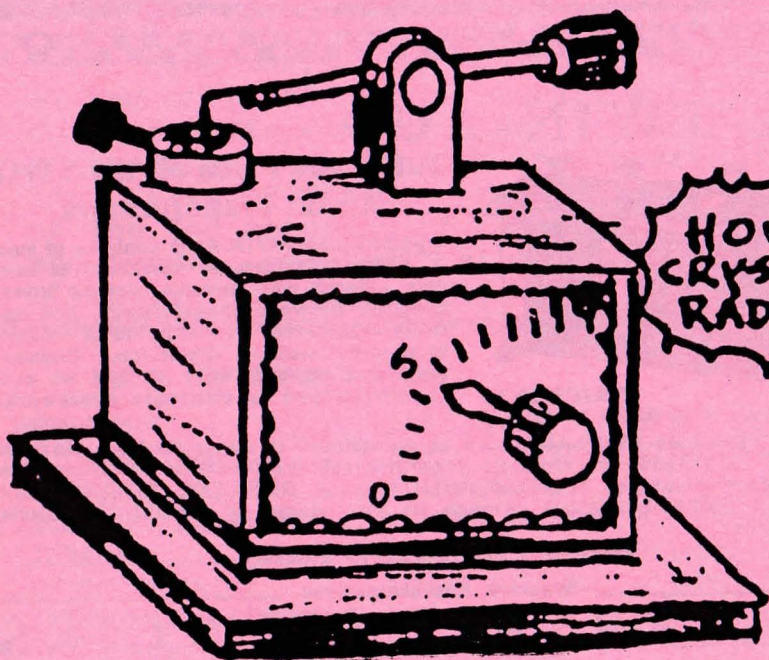

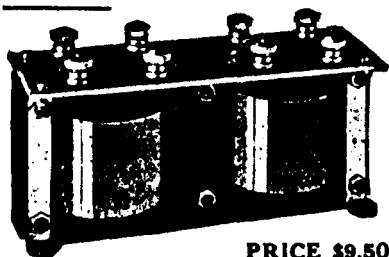

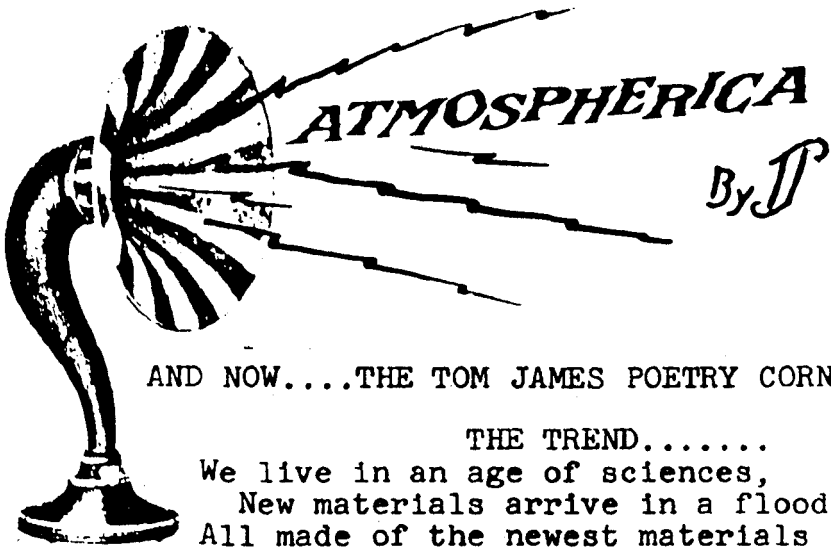

GUESTS WERE WELCOMED.

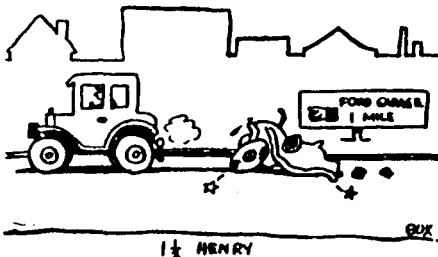

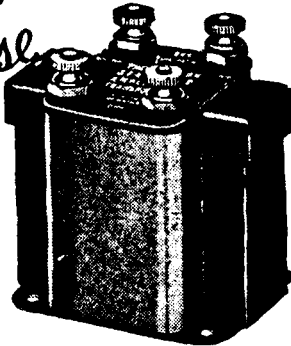
