Mike Parker has a contact who has a Martian crystal set for sale.


George Kirkwood has many engineering books for sale.

shops, 2 radios is not many at all. Maybe all the collectors have picked California clean! Is this the future scenario?



Lastly, I noted "Past Times," a nostalgia entertainment newsletter, advertised on



Beyond the newsletter the site has multiple interesting links to vintage radio and Old Time Radio sites. I found several I hadn't heard about.


During the winter months I hope to supply our editor with more "Wandering on the Web." See you next time.




(L) Admiral 150-52 and (R) Sparton 738 "Selectime" - Jerry Talbott






