

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OLD OLD TIMER W6KAA
LIEUTENANT COMMANDER THOMAS M. STEVENS
U.S.N. (RETIRED)

IT IS WITH MUCH PRIDE THAT THE FOLLOWING ARTICLE BY TOM STEVENS IS PRESENTED TO THE READERS OF SPARK GAP TIMES. THIS GREAT GENTLEMAN IS ONE OF OUR MOST BELOVED, RESPECTED AND ADMIRED MEMBERS. YE OLDE COPY BOY CONSIDERS IT A PRIVILEGE TO PRESENT THE FOLLOW-ING ARTICLE AND HE HOPES THE READER WILL ENJOY IT AS HE DID.

JUST ONE MONTH BEFORE REACHING THE AGE OF SEVENTEEN, TOM JOINED THE NAVY AS AN APPRENTICE, THIRD CLASS, AT HIS HOME TOWN OF AUSTIN, TEXAS AND WAS SENT TO YERBA BUENA ISLAND IN SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA FOR BASIC TRAINING. AFTER SOME SIX MONTHS OF RIGOROUS DRILLING, TARGET PRACTICE, LEARNING HOW TO THE KNOTS, BECOMING PROFICIENT IN WIGWAG SIGNALING AND MANY OTHER DUTIES OF A MANOFWARSMAN, HE WAS DETAILED TO THE OLD WODEN SAILSING VESSEL MOHICAN FOR A FIVE MONTHS CRUISE ALONG THE PACIFIC COAST.

PRIOR TO JOINING THE NAVY, TOM HAD WORKED IN A PLUMBING AND ELECTRIC SHOP IN AUSTIN, AND WAS VERY MUCH INTERESTED IN BECOMING A NAVY ELECTRICIAN. AT THE NAVAL TRAIN-ING STATION AND ON THE MOHICAN HE READ AND STUDIED ALL THE BOOKS DEALING WITH ELECTRICITY THAT WERE AVAILABLE IN THE LIBRARIES AND BOUGHT OTHERS.

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AFTER FINISHING THE SEA CRUISE ON THE MOHICAN HE WAS TRANSFERRED TO THE RECEIVING SHIP HANCOCK AT THE BROOKLYN NAVY YARD IN SEPTEMBER, 1903. THIS WAS JUST ONE YEAR AFTER HIS ENLISTMENT. ONE OF THE FIRST THINGS THAT ATTRACTED HIS ATTENTION IN THE NAVY YARD WAS A WIRELESS TELEGRAPH STATION JUST WITHIN THE MAIN GATE. HE MADE IT HIS BUSINESS TO GET ACQUAINTED WITH THE OPERATORS PERFORMING DUTY WITHIN THE SMALL SHACK.

ONE OF THE OPERATORS WAS GEORGE S. DAVIS, WHO, MANY YEARS LATER BECAME PRESIDENT OF TROPICAL RADIO TELEGRAPH COMPANY AND A DIRECTOR OF RADIO CORPORATION OF AMERICA WITH WHOM TOM HAD MANY BUSINESS RELATIONS. DAVIS HELPED TOM GET STARTED IN WIRELESS AND HELPED HIM LEARN THE CODE - AMERICAN MORSE.

DURING THE LATTER PART OF 1903 AND EARLY 1904, TOM WAS ASSIGNED TO THE BATTLESHIPS INDIANA AND MASSACHESETTS. NEITHER WERE WIRELESS EQUIPPED. BOTH VESSELS WERE DECOMMISSIONED AND THEN TOM WAS ASSIGNED TO THE BATTLESHIP 10WA, WHICH HAD JUST BEEN FITTED OUT WITH A SLABY-ARCO WIRELESS INSTALLATION. TOM GOT DETAILED TO THE WIRELESS ROOM AND UNDER THE TUTELAGE OF LESLIE E. SWITZER, HE BECAME PROFICIENT IN CODE AND THE PROPER MAINTENANCE AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE INVOLVED EQUIPMENT.

SWITZER AND TOM WERE THE ONLY OPERATORS ON THE IOWA AT THIS TIME, SO WHEN ORDERS CAME FOR THE TRANSFER OF SWITZER TO PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT'S YACHT MAYFLOWER, TOM HAD TO TAKE OVER THE WIRELESS ON THE IOWA. THE IOWA WAS ATTACHED TO THE GREAT WHITE FLEET UNDER COMMAND OF ADMIRAL ROBLEY D. EVANS WHO WAS THE FIRST SENIOR OFFICER TO MAKE USE OF THE NEW MEANS OF NAVAL COMMUNICATION.

C FRATORS ON OTHER VESSELS OF THE FLEET WERE, TO NAME A FEW, V. FORD GREAVES ON THE MAINE, FLAGSHIP, WOLVERTON ON THE KENTUCKY, GEORGE ALMOUR ON THE MISSOUR! AND GALLAGHER ON THE ALABAMA. ALL THESE PIONEER NAVY WIRELESS OPERATORS WERE AMATEURS OF THE FIRST ORDER BECAUSE ALL OF THEM WERE CONTINUALLY EXPERIMENTING WITH THE GEAR AVAILABLE. DIFFERENT TYPES OF ANTENNAS WERE ERECTED, THE MERCURY TURBINE INTERRUPTERS WERE ALTERED TO GIVE A FIVE HUNDRED CYCLE NOTE INSTEAD OF THE 60 CYCLE NOTE ORIGINALLY PROVIDED. AND EXPERIMENTS WERE CONDUCTED WITH MICROPHONIC AND ELECTROLYTIC DETECTORS. THIS WAS THE BEGINNING OF THE USE OF HIGHER PICHED SOUND AND WAS LATER INSTRUMENTAL IN DEFEATING THE CLAIM OF FESSENDEN THAT HE DEVELOPED THIS FEATURE.

Tom remained in charge of the wireless on the IOWA until He was discharged in October, 1906. In the meantime he trained a number of wireless operators, among whom were Otto Cline, Robert Schrick and others.

BECAUSE WIRELESS BECAME SUCH AN IMPORTANT MEANS OF COMMUNICATION TO THE NAVY, OTHER OPERATORS WERE ASSIGNED TO ALL THE VESSELS OF THE FLEET. AMONG OTHERS SERVING WITH TOM WERE CYRL D. RINEHART, AUSTIN F. PARKHURST AND OTHERS.

ON BEING RELEASED FROM THE NAVY, TOM RETURNED TO AUSTIN WHERE HE FOUND THE DE FOREST WIRELESS TELEGRAPH COMPANY OF TEXAS WAS ERECTING A POINT-TO-POINT SYSTEM IN A NUMBER OF TEXAS CITIES. HE IMMEDIATELY JOINED THE FORCES OF DEFOREST AND OPERATED THE FIRST WIRELESS STATION IN SAN ANTONIO, HOUSTON, BEAUMONT AND PORT ARTHUR.

AFTER A COUPLE OF YEARS IN TEXAS, TOM RETURNED TO NEW YORK AND RAN ON VARIOUS SHIPS. THERE WAS ONLY ONE OPERATOR ON SHIPS IN THOSE EARLY DAYS AND LIFE WAS VERY INTERESTING FOR THE SPARKS ON PASSENGER VESSELS. AMONG THOSE ON WHICH TOM SERVED WAS THE MERIDA (NOW AT THE BOTTOM OF THE ATLANTIC NEAR CAPE HATTERAS), CITY OF ATLANTA, SUNK BY GERMANS IN FIRST WORLD WARS HARVARD, WRECKED ON THE PACIFIC COAST.

IN MAY OF 1909, TOM TOLD HIS SUPERINTENDENT AND GOOD FRIEND, HENRY J. HUGHES THAT HE WAS ABOUT TO BE MARRIED TO A BOSTON GIRL AND WANTED A JOJ ON SHORE. MUCH TO HIS SURPRISE, HUGHES SAID, 190K, GO TO BOSTON AND TAKE OVER THE NEW STATION BEING

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INSTALLED ON THE BOSTON HERALD BUILDING. THIS STATION BECAME "MH". IN THIS CASE BUS-

IIBHI WAS OPERATED AT ITS ORIGINAL LOCATION ON THE BOSTON HERALD BUILDING FOR ABOUT TWO YEARS AND THEN MOVED TO THE FORERIVER SHIPBUILDING YARD AT QUINCY, SOME FIF TEEN MILES EAST OF BOSTON. ABOUT THIS TIME, THE UNITED WIRELESS TELEGRAPH COMPANY BECAME INVOLVED WITH FINANCIAL LOSSES AND ALLEGED FRAUDULENT USE OF THE MAILS. THIS RESULTED IN IT'S PRESIDENT BEING SENT TO ATLANTA PRISON AND THE COMPANY GOING INTO BANKRUPTCY.

DURING THE TWO YEARS AND TEN MONTHS THAT TOM MANAGED THE BOSTON STATION AND OTHER ACTIVITIES OF UNITED WIRELESS, SHIP INSTALLATIONS BEGAN TO TAKE PLACE ON A VOLUNTARY BASIS. ON JULY I, 1911, THE SHIP WIRELESS ACT BECAME EFFECTIVE AND MANY VESSELS WERE REQUIRED TO BE EQUIPPED WITH SUITABLE APPARATUS. TOM TOOK ON QUITE A FEW ASSISTANTS, AMONG WHOM WERE ART STOCKELLBURG WISS, HARRY (BUCK) CHEETHAM. GEORGE NICHOLS, DAN DECOSTE AND SEVERAL OTHERS. ALL THESE EARLY BIRDS HAD THEIR HANDS FULL IN OPERATING THE COASTAL STATIONS, MAKING SHIP INSTALLATIONS, MAINTENANCE OF SHIP STATIONS, ASSIGNING SKILLED OP ERATORS AND MAKING EMERGENCY REPAIRS AND INSTALLATIONS OF STORAGE BATTERIES AND TELEPHONES. BETWEEN THE WIRELESS ROOM AND THE BRIDGE AS REQUIRED BY THE SHIP ACT.

Now this Ship Act was strictly enforced by a young fellow bearing the name of Harry C. Gawler, the first wireless ship inspector assigned by the Washington Office under the direction of our Honorary member, Mr. W.D. Terrell. Gawler kept Tom and his assistants busy day and night, three hundred and sixty-five days of the year.

AS OF APRIL I, 1912, THE MARCONI WIRELESS TELEGRAPH COMPANY OF AMERICA ACQUIRED THE ASSETS OF THE OLD AND DEFUNCT UNITED WIRELESS TELEGRAPH COMPANY AND TOM FOUND HIMSELF WORKING FOR NEW BOSSES. UNDER THE NEW MANAGEMENT, PAY CHECKS ARRIVED ON SCHEDULE AND PROGRESS BEGAN TO RAPIDLY DEVELOPE.

IN THE LATTER PART OF 1914, TOM WAS TRANSFERRED FROM THE BOSTON AREA TO BALTIMORE TO RELIEVE CHARLES J. PANNILL AS SUPERINTENDENT OF THE SOUTHERN DIVISION OF THE MARCONI COMPANY. PANNILL JOINED THE CIVILIAN STAFF OF NAVAL COMMUNICATIONS AND WAS STATIONED AT ARLINGTON, VA. THE SOUTHERN DIVISION EXTENDED TO ALL PORTS AND COASTAL STATIONS ON THE ATLANTIC COAST SOUTH OF NEW YORK. COASTAL STATIONS WERE AT CAPE MAY, N.J., PHILADELPHIA, BALTIMORE, CAPE HENRY, CAPE HATTERAS, SAVANNAH, JACKSONVILLE AND BEST OF ALL WST MIAMI BEACH, FLA. THE TERRITORY ALSO TOOK IN ALL THE SHIPBUILDING YARDS SOUTH OF NEW YORK, WHERE MANY NEW SHIPS WERE UNDER CONSTRUCTION, ALL OF WHICH HAD TO BE EQUIPPED WITH WIRELESS SETS.

THOSE WERE BUSY DAYS FOR TOM WHO HAD TO VISIT ALL THE COASTAL STATIONS TWICE A YEAR AND MAKE THE ROUNDS OF ALL SERVICE DEPOTS WHICH WERE LOCATED IN THE PRINCIPAL PORTS. HE WAS ABLY ASSISTED BY PAUL C. RINGGOLD UNTIL HIS TRANSFER TO NEW YORK TO WORK DIRECTLY UNDER THE MARINE MANAGER, DAVID SARNOFF. HIS JOB AT BALTIMORE WAS FILLED BY THE APPOINTMENT OF WESLEY P. KELLAND, NOW RETIRED FROM RCA MARINE SERVICE. KELLAND WAS ONLY ONE OF THE MANY HAMS AROUND BOSTON WHO OPERATED A SPARK SET (THEN UNLICENSED), WHO WAS GIVEN HIS EDERST WIRELESS JOB ON A SHIP UNDER TOM PRIMARILY TO GET RID OF HIS INTERFERENCE TO "BH".

WHILE AT BALTIMORE, IT WAS TOM'S DUTY, IN ADDITION TO RUNNING THINGS ON AMERICAN VESSELS, TO ASSIGN OPERATORS TO FOREIGN SHIPS SUBJECT TO THE SHIP ACT, WHICH HAD ENTERED PORTS WITHOUT OPERATORS. ONE SUCH VESSEL WAS A SAILING, AND LOADING AT BALTIMORE FOR EUROPEAN PORTS. THIS WAS DURING THE WAR PRIOR TO OUR ENTRY. A YOUNG FELLOW BY THE NAME OF GEAR WAS ASSIGNED. HE WANTED TO MAKE THE TRIP TO GET A LONG NEEDED REST. HIS NAME APPEARS ON THE VETERAN WIRELESS OPERATORS MONUMENT IN BATTERY PARK, NEW YORK BECAUSE HIS SAILING VESSEL WAS WRECKED IN A STORM OFF THE COAST OF SPAIN AND ALL HANDS LOST. IT IS RECALLED THAT ANOTHER OPERATOR HAD TO BE FOUND TO TAKE A TUG ACROSS THE ATLANTIC IN MIDWINTER.

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THERE WAS ONLY ONE VOLUNTEER, SAM CISSENFELD OF BALTIMORE, NOW A RETIRED MERCHANT. WHEN TOM WISHED SAM "BON VOYAGE" HE NEVER EXPECTED TO SEE HIM AGAIN, BUT THAT LITTLE HEBREW SPARKS RETURNED SAFE AND SOUND WITH A WIDE SMILE AND A BIG BAG FULL OF GREEN-BACKS.

AFTER TWO YEARS OF SERVICE AS SUPERINTENDENT OF THE SOUTHERN DIVISION OF THE MARCONI COMPANY AT BALTIMORE, TOM WAS CALLED TO NEW YORK WHERE HE WAS OFFERED THE POSITION OF MARINE SUPERINTENDENT, PACIFIC DIVISION, MARCONI COMPANY AT SAN FRANCISCO. HE ACCEPTED AND RETURNED TO BALTIMORE TO PREPARE FOR THE TRIP ACROSS THE CONTINENT WITH HIS WIFE AND SON TO THE WEST COAST. ENROUTE HE CAUGHT A BAD COLD AND UPON REACHING HOUSTON, HE HAD TO GO TO A HOSPITAL WITH DOUBLE PNEUMONIA.

AFTER SEVERAL WEEK. DELAY AT HOUSTON, HE PROCEEDED TO THE WEST COAST. THIS WAS LATE DECEMBER, 1916. SEVERAL MONTHS LATER OUR COUNTRY ENTERED WORLD WAR I AND TOM IMMEDIATELY RE-ENTERED THE NAVAL SERVICE, THIS TIME AS A LIEUTENANT (JG) AND ASSISTANT TO THE PACIFIC COAST COMMUNICATION SUPERINTENDENT, COMMANDER EDWIN H. DODD, US N. TOM'S FIRST AND PRIMARY DUTY WAS TO ENROLL ALL AVAILABLE WIRELESS OPERATORS IN THE NAVAL RESERVE. CAPABLE OPERATORS, EVEN THOSE WITH ONE EYE, ONE LEG OR ONE ARM MISSING WERE ACCEPTED BECAUSE OF THE URGENCY OF THE SITUATION.

AFTER COMPLETING ENROLLMENT OF ALL OPERATORS, HAMS AND POTENTIAL OPERATORS WHO WERE SENT TO THE HARVARD WIRELESS SCHOOL, TOM TOOK OVER THE HANDLING OF COMMUNICATIONS PERSONNEL OF THE PACIFIC. THIS INCLUDED OPERATORS FOR ALL CALIFORNIA, OREGON, WASHINGTON, ALASKA, HAWAII, GUAM AND THE PHILIPINES. IN ADDITION, PERSONNEL HAD TO BE FOUND FOR ARMED GUARD UNITS ASSIGNED TO MERCHANT VESSELS AND ALL MEN-OF-WAR VESSELS.

TOM REMAINED ON ACTIVE DUTY FOR OVER TWO AND A HALF YEARS AND WHEN RELEASED TO CIVILIAN STATUS, HE FOUND HIS OLD JOB WITH MARCONI NO LONGER EXISTED; SO HE TOOK OVER THE REPRESENTATION OF THE NEWLY FORMED INDEPENDENT WIRELESS COMPANY ON THE WEST COAST. HE ESTABLISHED SERVICE DEPOTS AT SEATTLE, PORTLAND, SAN FRANCISCO AND LOS ANGELES. HE HAD BEEN IWT ONLY TWO MONTHS WHEN HE WAS OFFERED A MUCH MORE ATTRACTIVE POSITION WITH THE RADIO CORPORATION OF AMERICA, WHICH WAS SCHEDULED TO BEGIN OPERATIONS ON JAN. 1, 1920. HE ACCEPTED AND RETURNED TO THE EAST COAST.

TOM BECAME ASSISTANT GENERAL SUPERINTENDENT, MARINE DEPARTMENT, RCA AT NEW YORK.
THIS WAS A HIGHLY RESPONSIBLE POSITION BUT HE WAS PREPARED FOR IT BY HAVING TAKEN A CORRESPONDENCE COURSE IN ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION. IN ADDITION TO THE OPERATION OF OVER A THOUSAND COMPANY OWNED MERCHANT VESSELS, HIS DEPARTMENT WAS CHARGED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY OF OPERATING AND MAINTAINING OVER FOUR HUNDRED UNITED STATES SHIPPING BOARD VESSELS.

BECAUSE THE MARCONI COMPANY HAD SOLD ALL IT'S COASTAL WIRELESS STATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT AT THE BEGINNING OF THE WAR, AND AS THE NAVAL COMMUNICATIONS SERVICE DID NOT CARE TO CONTINUE HANDLING COMMERCIAL MARITIME RADIO TRAFFIC, TOM WAS GIVEN THE ASSIGNMENT BY GENERAL MANAGER DAVID SARNOFF TO RE-ESTABLISH AN EFFICIENT AND MORE MODERN COASTAL TELEGRAPH SERVICE. HE WENT TO WORK ON THIS HIGHLY COMPLICATED MATTER AND SOON HAD STATIONS IN OPERATION AT NEW YORK, (WNY); CHATHAM, MASS, (WCC); CAPE MAY, (WCY); SAVANNAH, (WSV); PORT ARTHUR, (WPA); GALVESTON, (WGV); SAN FRANCISCO, (KPH); SAN PEDRO, (KSE) AND SEVERAL OTHERS INCLUDING A NUMBER ON THE GREAT LAKES.

THESE STATIONS WERE SOON USING VACUUM TUBE TRANSMITTERS AND BECAUSE OF THE SEL-ECTION OF THE MOST COMPETENT RADIO OPERATORS, THESE STATIONS BECAME FAMOUS FOR THE RAPID

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AND EFFICIENT MANNER IN WHICH SHIP-TO-SHORE TRAFFIC WAS HANDLED.

IN 1924 TOM REPRESENTED THE RADIO CORPORATION OF AMERICA AT A NATIONAL CONFERENCE HELD IN WASHINGTON DURING OCTOBER OF THAT YEAR. IT WAS CALLED BY SECRETARY OF COMMERCE HERBERT HOOVER FOR THE PURPOSE OF STUDYING PROPOSALS FOR THE CHANGE IN ALLOCATIONS OF FREQUENCIES SO THAT THE NEW BROADCASTING INDUSTRY COULD FIND SUITABLE CHANNELS WITHOUT INTERFERRING WITH OR BEING INTERFERRED WITH BY OTHER SERVICES.

UP TO THE TIME OF THE CONFERENCE, THE BROADCASTING STATIONS USED ONE OR TWO FREQUENCIES, VIZ; 360 METERS AND ONE OTHER. BY FULL COOPERATION OF COMMERCIAL, GOVERNMENT AND AMATEUR SERVICES, A VERY APPROPRIATE SOLUTION WAS FOUND FOR THE TIME BEING. BROADCASTING STATIONS BEGAN TO INCREASE BY LEAPS AND BOUNDS AND AMATEUR STATIONS LIKEWISE INCREASED BEYOND ALL EXPECTATIONS. THE AMTEURS WERE ABLY REPRESENTED AT THIS CONFERENCE BY HIRAM PERCY MAXIM, KENNETH B. WARNER OF WEST HARTFORD AND J.B. STEWART OF PHILADELPHIA.

AGAIN IN 1927, ALONG WITH COLOMANTON DAVIS, GENERAL COUNSEL OF RCA AND WILLIAM A. WINTERBOTTOM, VICE PRESIDENT AND GENERAL MANAGER OF RCA COMMUNICATIONS INC., TOM REPRESENTED RCA AT THE INTERNATIONAL RADIO CONFERENCE IN WASHINGTON, D.C. FOR SEVERAL MONTHS PRIOR TO THE CONFERENCE, MANY MEETINGS WERE HELD IN WASHINGTON, PREPARING THE AGENDA WITH THE MANY AND VARIED RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE UNITED STATES DELEGATION. THE USE OF HIGH AND VERY HIGH FREQUENCIES WERE COMING INTO GENERAL USE AT THIS TIME, BUT AS NO INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENTS HAD AS YETBEEN PROMULGATED, IT WAS NECESSARY TO STUDY AND SUBMIT WORKABLE PLANS FOR THE USE OF THE GREAT NUMBER OF HIGHLY VALUABLE CHANNELS FOR WORLD WIDE SERVICE, FOR GOVERNMENTAL, AMATEUR AND OTHER SERVICES.

IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING, COMMANDER T.A.M. CRAVEN, U.S.N., PLAYED A MOST IMPORTANT PART BY DEVISING A COMPREHENSIVE AND WORKABLE DIVISION OF THE ENTIRE RADIO SPECTRUM. TOM PLAYED A PROMINENT PART IN WORKING WITH REPRESENTITIVES OF MANY FOREIGN GOVERNMENTS IN LINING THEM UP TO ADOPT THE CRAVEN PLAN. FOR THE FIRST TIME, THE USE OF HIGH FREQUENCIES WAS FIRMLY ESTABLISHED ON A BASIS WHERE INTERFERENCE WOULD BE HELD TO A MINIMUM. MANY OTHER IMPORTANT PROVISIONS WERE ADOPTED AT THIS CONFERENCE SUCH AS THE DISCONTINUANCE OF THE USE OF SPARK TYPE TRANSMITTERS IN THE MARITIME SERVICE. COASTAL TELEGRAPH STATIONS AND PRACTICALLY ALL SHIP STATIONS WERE EQUIPPED WITH SPARK TRANSMITTERS ONLY, AND THE INTERFERENCE CAUSED TO THE BROADCAST RECEPTION WAS INTOLERABLE IN ALL COASTAL AREAS.

BECAUSE RCA HELD THE BASIC PATENTS ON VACUUM TUBE TRANSMITTERS, IT WAS A MOST DIFFICULT MATTER FOR COMPETING AMERICAN TELEGRAPH COMPANIES TO FULLY COMPLY WITH THE PROVISION OF ABOLITION OF SPARK SETS. IT SEEMED OBVIOUS THEREFORE, THAT THE ACQUISITION OF SOME COMPETING FACILITIES BY RCA WAS HIGHLY DESIRABLE. THEREFORE ON JANUARY I, 1928, RCA PURCHASED THE ASSETS OF THE INDEPENDENT WIRELESS TELEGRAPH COMPANY, INCLUDING ALL IT'S COASTAL AND SHIP STATION CONTRACTS. THOSE SERVICES WERE AMALGAMATED WITH THE MARINE DEPARTMENT OF RCA, AND A NEW COMPANY-RADIO MARINE CORPORATION OF AMERICA WAS FORMED TO OPERATE THE COMBINED SYSTEMS. AT THIS TIME TOM WAS GENERAL SUPERINTENDENT OF THE MARINE DEPARTMENT OF RCA AND CONTINUED IN THAT POSITION WITH RADIOMARINE UNTIL MAY, 1933 WHEN HE WAS TRANSFERRED TO SAN FRANCISCO TO MANAGE RADIOMARINE ON THE WEST COAST.

ON MAY 31, 1937 TOM RESIGNED FROM RADIOMARINE. AFTER A PERIOD OF REST AND TRAVEL TOM WORKED BRIEFLY FOR NBC IN HOLLYWOOD AND THEN WENT WITH THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION AS MONITORING OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE LOS ANGELES AREA.

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ON SUNDAY MORNING, APRIL 6, 1941, Tom, ALONG WITH AN ASSISTANT WAS INVESTIGATING AN ALLEGED UNLICENSED STATION REPORT, WHEN HE HAPPENED TO TUNE IN ON A BROADCASTING STATION WHICH WAS REPORTING THE BOMBING OF PEARL HARBOR BY JAPANESE PLANES. HE REMARKED, "THIS MEANS WAR", AND IMMEDIATELY RETURNED TO THE MONITORING STATION. REAL WAR CONDITIONS PREVAILED FROM THAT MOMENT UNTIL THE FINAL PEACE TERMS WERE SIGNED ON THE MISSOURI.

SHORTLY AFTER THE BOMBING OF PEARL HARBOR, A REPORTED ATTACK ON LOS ANGELES BY JAP PLANES, ERRONEOUS AS IT WAS, NEVERTHELECT CAUSED ALMOST PANIC IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. THE COLONEL IN CHARGE OF THE AIR DEFENSE IN THAT AREA, CALLED TOM AND DEMANDED THAT ALL BROADCAST STATIONS IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BE TAKEN OFF THE AIR IMMEDIATELY. BEING UNABLE TO REACH HIGHER AUTHORITY IN FCC AT THAT TIME OF NIGHT, TOM BEGAN CALLING ALL BROADCASTING STATIONS IN THE LOS ANGELES AREA AND ORDERED THEM TO CEASE OPERATION AT ONCE AND UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE. ALL STATIONS COMPLIED.

LATER, PLANS WERE MADE WITH THE BROADCASTING INDUSTRY TO HAVE STATIONS GO OFF THE AIR IN EVENT OF ENEMY ATTACKS. TOM HAD MANY AND VARIED EXPERIENCES IN INESTIGATING REPORTS OF ILLEGAL AND SUBVERSIVE RADIO OPERATIONS, MONITORING OF FOREIGN AND DOMESTIC BROADCASTING, AND RECORDING FOREIGN STATIONS.

THE USE OF HIDDEN HIGH FREQUENCY EQUIPMENT ON THE BODIES OF PERSONS ATTEMPTING TO GET RACE RESULTS OUT OF SANTA ANITA AND HOLLYWOOD RACE TRACKS WAS OF FREQUENT OCCASION.

THOSE ATTEMPTING SUCH ILLEGAL USE OF RADIO WERE QUICKLY DETECTED, ARRESTED AND CONVICTED IN THE FEDERAL COURTS.

SHORTLY AFTER THE SIGNING OF THE FINAL PEACE TREATY, THE RADIO INTELLIGENCE DIVISION OF FCC, ALONG WITH IT'S SPECIAL MONITORING STATIONS WAS DISSOLVED AND TOM WAS TRANSFERRED TO WASHINGTON, WHERE HE CONTINUED UNTIL SEPTEMBER 30TH, 1950, WHEN HE RETIRED.
WHILE HE WAS IN WASHINGTON, HE SERVED UNDER MR. GEORGE S. TURNER, CHIEF OF FIELD ENGINEERING AND MONITORING SERVICE AND FOR A SHORT TIME UNDER MR. WILLIAM N. KREBS, CHIEF OF THE
MARINE RADIO SERVICE.

UPON HIS RETIREMENT, TOM RETURNED TO CALIFORNIA AND SHORTLY THEREAFTER JOINED THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA CIVIL DEFENS COMMUNICATION DIVISION WITH WHICH HE COVERED SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA FOR FIVE YEARS. UPON REACHING THE AGE OF 70, HE RETIRED. FOR A BRIEF PERIOD AFTER RETIRING FROM THE STATE CIVIL DEFENSE, HE SPENT HIS TIME IN PREPARING RACES PLANS FOR SOME 200 CITIES AND COUNTIES OF CALIFORNIA.

TOM IS NOW FULLY RETIRED; FIRST FROM THE U.S. NAVY AS LIEUTENANT COMMANDER AND FROM FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION AS RADIO ENGINEER. FOR HIS NAVAL SERVICE HE HOLDS TWO MEDALS AND BRONZE STAR. UPON RETIRING FROM FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION, HE WAS TENDERED A DINNER PARTY AND PRESENTED WITH A BEAUTIFUL GOLD WATCH, AND SEVERAL PIPES BY HIS CO-WORKERS.

TOM IS A VETERAN MASON OF OVER FIFTY YEARS. HE IS ALSO A VETERAN WIRELESS OPERATOR AND FORMER DIRECTOR OF VWOA. HE NOW SPENDS HIS TIME RAISING LOVELY FLOWERS AND PLAYING WITH HAM RADIO AND HI-FI SETS. IN RETROSPECT, TOM HAS A DEEP FEELING OF APPRECIATION TO-WARDS ALL THOSE WHO HELPED IN MAKING HIS LONG AND SUCCESSFUL COMMUNICATIONS CAREER POSSIBLE. THIS INCLUDES MANY COMMERCIAL OFFICIALS, NAVAL OFFICERS AND OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AUTHORITIES, PLUS THE THOUSANDS OF COASTAL AND SHIP STATION OPERATORS WHO WORKED WITH HIM SOME FORTY OR FIFTY YEARS AGO.

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THE TEAKETTLE HAS MUCH TO ADMIRE. THE DARNED THING SINGS EVEN THOUGH IT'S IN HOT WATER UP TO IT'S NECK.

HALF CENTURY OF AMATEUR RADIO LICENSING TO BE CELEBRATED IN OCTOBER, 1962

AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS WHO WERE FIRST LICENSED IN 1912 AND WHO ARE STILL ACTIVE TODAY, WILL BE HONORED AT A GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY BANQUET TO BE HELD IN NEW YORK CITY ON OCTOBER 13, 1962 TO CELEBRATE 50 YEARS OF AMATEUR RADIO LICENSING BY THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT.

FIFTY YEARS AGO, CONGRESS ADOPTED THE RADIO ACT OF 1912, BRINGING ORDER TO THE THEN-NEW BUT RAPIDLY EXPANDING ART AND SCIENCE OF WIRELESS OR RADIO COMMUNICATION. AS ONE OF IT'S FEATURES, THE ACT REQUIRED FOR THE FIRST TIME THAT AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS OBTAIN A LICENSE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND LABOR, AFTER PASSING AN EXAMINATION. THE SECRETARY OF COMMERCE AND LABOR AT THAT TIME WHO SIGNED THESE FIRST LICENSES WAS MR. CHARLES NAGEL.

THE CELEBRATION OF THE GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY OF AMATEUR RADIO LICENSING IS BEING HANDLED BY A SPECIAL COMMITTEE COMPRISING REPRESENTITIVES OF A NUMBER OF SPONSORING SOCIETIES INCLUDING THE AMERICAN RADIO RELAY LEAGUE (ARRL), ARMED FORCES COMMUNICATIONS AND ELECTRONICS ASSOCIATION (AFCEA), INSTITUTE OF RADIO ENGINEERS (IRE), QUARTER CENTURY WIRELESS ASSOCIATION (QCWA), RADIO CLUB OF AMERICA, HUDSON AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION, AND THE SINGLE SIDEBAND AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION (SSBARA). THE OFFICERS OF THIS COMMITTEE ARE MR. JOHN DI BLASI, CAHIRMAN, WHO IS ALSO PRESIDENT OF THE QUARTER CENTURY WIRELESS ASSOCIATION: MR. JOHN HUNTOON. VICE-CHAIRMAN AND GENERAL MANAGER OF THE AMERICAN RADIO RELAY LEAGUE, AND MR. DAVID TALLEY, SECRETARY-TREASURER, WHO IS A MEMBER OF ALL OF THE AFOREMENTIONED SPONSORING SOCIETIES.

A SEARCH IS NOW IN PROGRESS TO LOCATE THOSE WHO OBTAINED THEIR HAM LICENSE OR "TICKETS" DURING THE INITIAL LICENSING PERIOD OF 1912 AND ARE CURRENTLY LICENSED BY THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION AS AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS. AN APPROPRIATE AWARD WILL BE MADE TO ALL SUCH AMATEURS BY THE SPONSORING SOCIETIES. THE AWARD WILL BE PRESENTED IN PERSON TO THOSE ABLE TO ATTEND THE GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY BANQUET WHICH WILL BE HELD IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE HUDSON DIVISION CONVENTION OF THE AMERICAN RADIO RELAY LEAGUE AT THE STATLER-HILTON HOTEL, NEW YORK CITY, ON OCTOBER 13, 1962.

(IF ORIGINAL 1912 LICENSE HAS BEEN LOST OR DESTROYED).

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THE BLUE BOOK OF AMATEUR WIRELESS

IT IS PLANNED TO GO AHEAD ON THIS PROJECT REGARDLESS OF THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS WHO HAVE FAILED TO SEND IN THE MATERIAL REQUESTED, OF NECESSITY BE GIVEN ONLY SUCH MENTION AS THE INFORMATION WE HAVE IN OUR RECOEDS. IT WILL NOT BE POSSIBLE TO INSERT ANY MATERIAL WHATEVER AFTER THE PLATES ARE MADE.

THE OOTC "BLUE BOOK OF AMATEUR WIRELESS" WILL BE CONTAINED IN A ROYAL BLUE PLASTIC COVERED THREE RING BINDER WITH A SUITABLE ON THE COVER. A THREE RING BINDER WAS SELECTED SO THAT ADDITIONAL MATERIAL MAY BE ADDED FROM TIME TO TIME AND TO ALLOW FOR THE ADDITION OF NEW MEMBERS EACH YEAR.

IT IS PLANNED TO ISSUE THIS BOOK IN CALL AREA INSTALLMENTS, STARTING WITH THE I AREA, AND WITH THE OTHER CALL AREAS ISSUED IN CALL AREA NUMERICAL ORDER. WE HOPE TO HAVE THE FIRST INSTALLMENT ISSUED IN EARLY OR MID SUMMER. IT HAS NOT YET BEEN ESTABLISHED WHETHER IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO MAKE A CHARGE FOR THIS BOOK OR NOT, BUT IF A CHARGE SEEMS NECESSARY, IT WILL BE ONLY FOR THE ACTUAL PRODUCTION COST.

DEAR EARL & OOTC & ENCLOSED IS CHECK FOR \$5.00 TO COVER COST OF THE OOTC PIN AND A FEW BUCKS LEFT OVER TO CARRY ON THE EXCELLENT WORK OF THE CLUB. REALLY GET A BANG OUT OF THE BLABBER MOUTH, BUT SOMEHOW DONT CARE TOO MUCH FOR THE TITLE BLABBER MOUTH; IT'S MUCH TOO GOOD A SHEET FOR THE TITLE. THE DECEMBER ISSUE'S ARTICLES BY GEORGE STERLING AND PERCE COLLISON BROUGHT BACK MANY MAMORIES.

THE MENTIONING OF WGY, SOS AND OUR VERY GOOD FRIEND HARRY SADENWATER, ESPECIALLY IS CAUSE TO REMEMBER MANY THINGS, SINCE HARRY WAS OUR TOP BOSS MAN IN THE EARLY DAYS OF WGY. HIS TITLE WAS CHIEF ENGINEER AND MANAGER OF WGY AND IT'S EXPERIMENTAL STATIONS WITH X CALLSS SUCH AS 2ZAD, 2XAF, 2XK, 2XI ETC. WE HAD A WHOLE FLOCK OF SUCH CALL LETTERS, RETAINING WGY AND OLD S.W. STATIONS UNDER THE HEADING OF WGEO 1, 2, AND 3, AND HANDLING THE VOICE OF AMERICA BROADCASTS WITH 25. 50 AND 100 KW ANTENNA POWER.

HARRY WAS NOT ONLY RESPONSIBLE FOR WGY AND SW STATIONS BUT ALSO KGO AND IT'S SHORT WAVE STATION IN DENVER, COLORADO, BUT ALSO KOA AND DID A WONDERFUL JOB OF KEEPING THESE STATIONS IN ADVANCE OF THEIR TIMES. WGY AND THE SW STATIONS WERE AMONG THE FIRST, IF NOT ACTUALLY THE FIRST TO USE CRYSTAL CONTROL AND HIGH LEVEL MODULATION, AND VERY EARLY IN THE 20'S WGY WAS A "HIGH POWERED!" BROADCASTING STATION USING FIRST I KW, 5 KW, 25 KW, 50 AND FINALLY 200 KW ANTENNA POWER.

WGY PROGRAMS WERE BROADCAST FOR OVER A YEAR IN THE MIDDLE 1920'S USING SINGLE SIDE BAND MODULATION, USING PEAK POWER OF AROUND 200 KW AND REBROADCAST FROM ST. LAWRENCE UNI-VERSITY FOR MANY MONTHS, WITH HAROLD K. BERGMAN AS CHIEF ENGINEER. HAL DIED SEVERAL YEARS AGO, AND WAS WELL KNOWN IN THE EARLY DAYS WITH THE UNITED FRUIT CO. AT SWAN ISLAND AND LATER WITH INTER-CITY AND RCA. THE SSB PROGRAMS WERE NOT BROADCAST OVER WGY BUT RATHER OVER ONE OF THE "X" STATIONS ON RATHER LOW FREQUENCY AROUND 1500 METER WAVELENGTH, AND WAS FAR SUPERIOR AT THE RECEIVING END THAN LAND LINES AT THAT TIME. MR. OWEN D. YOUNG AND SON CHARLES WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE INSTALLATION AT BOTH ENDS. INCIDENTALLY, MR. YOUNG IS STILL ALIVE AND VERY ACTIVE AT HIS HOME IN THE SMALL VILLAGE OF VAN HORNSVILLE, N.Y. LOCATED BETWEEN SPRINGFIELD CENTER ON US ROUTE 20 AND THRUWAY ON STATE 80.

OWEN D. YOUNG WAS WELL KNOWN IN THE 1920'S FOR HIS WORK WITH THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS TALKS, BOARD CHAIRMAN OF BOTH GENERAL ELECTRIC AND RCA. HE ENCOURAGED THE GE CO. AND HARRY SADENWATER'S WORK ON BROADCASTING ETC., AND COME TO THINK OF IT, I RECALL THE OLD RCA AMATEUR GEAR IN THE EARLY 1920'S OR EVEN EARLIER, SUCH AS THE UP LINE OF TRANSFORMERS AND RESISTORS. COMPLETE LINE OF PARTS AND MANUFACTURED HAM GEAR...10 WATTER, 20 WATTER AND 50 WATTERS AND EVEN A I KW SETUP.

HARRY HAD A GOOD DEAL TO DO WITH THE DESIGN AND MANUFACTURE OF THE TRANSFORMER LINE SUCH AS THE UP-1368 TRANSFORMER FOR THE 10 WATT GEAR; IT HAD A 350 WATT PRIMARY FROM 102 TO 120 VOLTS; 550/550 VOLTS SECONDARY AND TWO 7.5 VOLT FILAMENT WINDINGS TO HANDLE THE 202'S AND KENOTRON RECTIFIERS.

THE UP-1016 WAS FOR THE 50 WATTERS WITH 750 WATT TAPPED PRIMARY FROM 102 TO 120 VOLT LINE...1500/1500 SECONDARY AND A COUPLE OF 10 VOLT FILAMENT WINDINGS FOR THE 203'S AND 217'S KENOTRON RECTIFIERS. I RECALL THE BARREL SHAPED FILAMENT TRANSFORMERS WITH THEIR TAPPED PRIMARIES, SUCH AS THE UP-1658, 150 WATT PRIMARY, 102-120 VOLTS...CENTER TAPPED SECONDARY AT AROUND 12 AMPERES TO LIGHT A COUPLE OF 203'S OR 217'S.

SUCH GEAR IS STILL USED AT WGY AND W2AVG AFTER ALL THESE YEARS AND SPEAKS WELL OF THE

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DESIGN OF ABOUT FORTY YEARS AGO AND COME TO THINK OF IT WGY SHOULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR OOTC SINCE IT WILL CELEBRATE IT'S 40TH YEAR OF MCOMMERCIAL BROADCASTING IN FEBRUARY 1962, 'THO IT'S EXPERIMENTAL DAYS GO BACK MUCH FURTHER. MIGHT ASK WARREN FORD (W2GTB), OOT ON THE EARLY DAYS OF EXPERIMENTAL WORK. HE SHOULD KNOW, HE WAS THERE.

More on Harry.. Recall the UP-1653 30 Hy, 160 MA REACTOR...THE 1654 30 Hy 300 Ma (900 Ohms resistance) and the UP-415 3 Hy 160 Ma modulation reactor... Hot wire antenna ammeters etc. etc... Often what happened to my bible the RCA listing the stuff??

WELL RECALL GEORGE STERLING'S REMARKS ON THE 600 METER WATCH WHICH BROADCASTING STATIONS WERE REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN., WGY AT THE INSISTANCE OF HARRY SADENWATER TOOK NOT ONLY GREAT CARE BUT EVEN GREAT PRIDE IF WGY COULD BEAT ANY OF THE STATIONS, NAVY, COAST OR SHIP AND BROADCASTING STATIONS IN INTERCEPTING AND HEARING AN SOS AND GOING OFF THE AIR. THIS WAS ESPECIALLY TRUE IF WE COULD BEAT WEAF OR WJZ AND IT WAS WITH SPECIAL PRIDE IF WE COULD BEAT WSC OR WIM. THEY WERE ALWAYS HARD TO BEAT.

I STILL RECALL WITH A SMILE WHEN ONE OF OUR OPERATORS, LARRY D. SPRINGER. EX USN WW#I AND WILLARD D. PURCELL EX USN WW#I, (LATTER HARRY'S RIGHT HAND MAN). WE ONCE SIGNED OFF WGY DUE TO A DISTRESS CALL IN THE NORTH SEA AND ON ANOTHER OCASSION WHEN WE HEARD A SHIP IN DISTRESS OFF THE CHINA COAST. BOY, WERE WE PROUD OF OUR HOME BUILT SOUPED UP SPECIALLY BUILT 600 METER SUPER-HET RECEIVER.

Wonder how many broadcasting stations had 600 meter transmitters also. WGY DID, and for the life of me I cannot remember the call letters. Seems it was required by law to be able to receive and transmit on 600 meters to get a broadcasting license in the old days.. Any how, we did test the rig a coupla times, (2KW) CW and ICW; and if memory serves me correctly, we musta raised a few eyebrows at either WIM or WSC with a CRK with the strange call letters. Perhaps George Sterling can give us some dope on the requirements for 600 meter transmitters in the early days... Even Harry Sadenwater was rather surprised when I asked him about testing the rig. After which it was junked... brand new and with perhaps 5 minutes or less "On the air" use. However its remained as part of the equipment for about 8 years. It is interesting to note that the 600 meter rig had a 600 meter "folded dipole" half wave antenna on it back in the middle 1920's, the first I had ever seen. It seems it was designed by Andrew Ring who built crystal control 25 KW rig for WGY.

I WELL RECALL MR. STERLING'S REMARKS ON EARLY TV, ESPECIALLY FROMWGY IN 1926 ON 790 Kcs. With it's neon tube and scanning disc...at first we had as amny as five watchers if we called them first on landline, such as Harry Sadenwater, W.R.G. Baker, Charles Young, Dr. E.M. Kinney and Dr. E.F.W. Alexanderson were among the first who had receivers. Later on TV was broadcast at about 2500 Kcs. still using Disc.

IT IS INTERESTING TO NOTE THAT THE SW STATIONS WERE USING SUPER MODULATION, SSB AND FM EXPERIMENTALLY IN THE MIDDLE 1920'S AS WELL AS FACIMILE AND TELETYPE. AND ALL WITH THE BLESSING AND HELP OF HARRY SADENWATER, WHO IN THE ESTIMATION OF MANY WAS NOT ONLY A FINE GENTLEMAN, BUT WAS ALSO A RARE COMBINATION OF ENGINEER AND EXECUTIVE AS WELL. WE MISS HIS PASSING AND HE WON'T BE FORGOTTEN FOR A LONG TIME TO COME.

I RECALL HARRY FOR ANOTHER REASON, AND IT ALSO DEALS WITH OUR PRIDE IN THE 600 METER WATCH. AT THE TIME WE WERE EXPERIMENTING WITH THE PROJECTED 500 KW NAVY TRANSMITTER. USING THE EXPERIMENTAL 200 KW WGY AM TRANSMITTER FOR DEVELOPMENT OF TUBES AND CIRCUITS AND RUNNING AS HIGH AS 1200 KW INPUT TO THE FINAL STAGE, AND KEYING IT.

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Most of the work was done on the mid-8 AM watch with a crew of "Young Squirts", most of whom were fresh out of college with a brand new Master's or Doctor's degree. Surprising Ly enough, while a few were hams, most didn't know the code. I won't give all their names except a few such as Andrew D. Ring, who later was with the FCC and now a consultant in Washington, D.C.

EARLY IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF HIGHER POWER, WE RUN INTO MANY SNAGS, SUCH AS PARASITICS HIGH POWER TUBE FAILURES DUE TO DYNATRON OSCILLATION, ETC..ETC., AND TO MAKE MATTERS WORSE CORONA ON THE ANTENNA; ALSO THE CATCHING FIRE OF AN ABANDONED CINDER COVERED ROAD UNDERNEATH THE TUNING HOUSE TO THE BURIED GROUND RADIAL SYSTEM, WHICH WAS REPLACE WITH A COUNTER POISE ABOUT 10 FEET OVER THE GROUND. ALL THIS CAUSED HARRY SADENWATER AND US TO GIVE INTERFERENCE ON 600 METERS, CONSIDERABLE WORRY AND ESPECIALLY WITH THE CORONA ON THE ANTENNA.

WE WARNED OUR OPERATOR ON THE 600 METER RIG TO BE ESPECIALLY CAREFUL WHILE PREPAR-ING FOR FURTHER TESTS AFTER MIDNIGHT. WE WERE GIVING ONE OF OUR NEWER OPERATORS A "TEST RUN! ON THE 600 METER WATCH WHILE BROGRAMMING THE REGULAR WGY EVENING PROGRAM, THEN USING 50 KW. HE WAS STRICTLY OK ON "COPY", AS HE HAD SERVED ON THE GREAT LAKES AS AN OPERATOR, WHILE ATTENDING SCOOL DURING VACATIONS ... IN FACT HE WAS VERY GOOD . THINGS HAD GONE SNAFU AND DEVELOPMENT WAS BEING HELD UP AWAITING PARTS BEING REPAIRED. TO PASS THE TIME AWAY, WE DECIDED TO GIVE OUR 600 METER OPERATOR SOME "CODE" PRACTICE AND THE BIZ!!! OUR RAY ---WHO LATER BECAME ONE OF THE BRASS OF GE, AND JACK----- WHO IS ONE OF THE BRASS WITH RCA, (AND HTEREFOR NO NAMES PLEASE), WERE DIRECTLY INVOLVED. JACK WAS A REAL TOP RADIO OPERATORHIMSELF, BESIDES BEING A REAL TOP ENGINEER AND ACTIVE HAM DECIDED THAT RAY COULD BE A BIT BETTER... SO MUXES UP THE VARIOUS NOISES THROUGH A CAPACITOR FROM THE 250 VOLT "SHOP" DC SYSTEM AND AN ASSORTMENT OF NOISES FROM OTHER DC GENERATORS...THIS MIXED WITH AN AUDIO OSCILLATOR SO THAT JACK COULD IMITATE A FEW "SPARK" TRANSMITTERS AS WELL AS THE TONE OF WIM AND WSC... BY GOLLY, PRETTY SOON THINGS BEGAN WARMING UP ON 600 METERS. THINGS WERE KINDA TOUGH IN FACT "SHUT HER DOWN"..."HEAR AN SOS"... OUR HERO IS DOING HIS STUFF. WAS THIS A SHOW? I'LL SAY!

MOST OF US WERE WATCHING THE SHOW...OUR HERO WAS HARD AT IT. OTHERS TOOK TURNS IN BEING VARIOUS STATIONS HELPING ALONG WITH THE "DISTRESS". IT SEEMS THAT THE LEVIATHON HAD STRUCK AN ICEBERG..THINGS WERE ROUGH..."TAKING TO THE BOATS"..."BOILER ROOM EXPLODED"...
"LISTING TO THE PORT"...EVERYONE WANTED TO GET INTO THE ACT..."INTERFERENCE" AND "COPY!"
WAS TOUGH...ALL WAS CONFUSION...IT LASTED FOR TWO HOURS. UNTIL THE DAMAGED PARTS NECESSARY TO CONTINUE THE EXPERIMENTAL WORK WERE RECEIVED.

OUR HERO FAITHFULLY COPIED EVERY WORD AND PART OF WORD...UNTIL WIM OPENED UP AND ANNOUNCED THAT A GRAVE MISTAKE HAD BEEN MADE, THAT THE LEVIATHAN HAD NOT STRUCK AN ICEBERG BUT A FLOATING "COW TURD". BOY!!! OUR HERO BLEW HIS STACK...HE FLUNG THE 600 METER LOG BOOK ACROSS THE LAB...HE HAD BEEN TAKEN BUT GOOD...; AFTER ALL THEY WERE MASTERS AT IT...RAY LIVED IT DOWN, BUT NOT FOR YEARS AFTERWARDS. HIS "COPY" SHOWED THAT HE WAS REALLY ON THE JOB IN SPITE OF FADING, STATIC AND ABOUT EVERYTHING A GOOD MIXING PANEL COULD THROW IN FOR GOOD MEASURE. RAY HAD HARDLY MISSED A LETTER IN OVER TWO HOURS OF THE "DISTRESS".

THIS REALLY TICKLED THE BOYS, BUT THIS SORT OF THING CAN AND DID BACKFIRE. IT MAY BE GOOD CLEAN FUN AND OFTEN GOOD PRACTICE FOR CODE, BUT SOON AFTERWARDS ANOTHER TOP ENGINEER WITH POOR OPERATING ABILITY WANTED TO STAND 600 METER WATCH...WE WEREN'T SURE...CONDITIONS AT SEA REALLY WERE BAD...HURRICANES COMING UP THE COAST. AS STANDBY, THE MASTER CONTROL AT WGY STUDIOS WAS ALSO PARALLELED ON THE 600 METER RECEIVER... MCR WAS TIPPED OFF ABOUT A BIT OF CODE PRACTICE...THINGS QUIETED DOWN AND MORE OR LESS FORGOTTEN WITH COMPANY BIZ..IN FACT WE HAD FORGOTTEN TO TO TELL THE RELIEF OPERATOR AT MCR ABOUT "CODE" PRACTICE....

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WELL, OUR RELIEF MAN AT MASTER CONTROL COMES ON DUTY AND BEING EX NAVY AND MARINE OPERATOR, KNOWS WELL THE CONDITIONS AT SEA DURING HURRICANE SEASON...AND SHORTLY SQUARED AWAY. HE LISTENS ON THE 600 METER RECEIVER AND LO! AND BEHOLD!... AN SOS... JUST AT THE WRONG TIME, WE HAD GIVEN OUR NEW REGULAR 600 METER OPERATOR...WHO NOT ONLY COPIED IT THE FIRST TIME BUT HAD ALREADY GOTTEN THINGS STARTED.. ALL WAS CONFUSION, SO WHAT DOES OUR MASTER CONTROL OPERATOR DO BUT FOLLOW HARRY SADENWATER'S STRICT INSTRUCTIONSTO "SIGN OFF WGY FIRST".....

BOY! WAS HARRY SADENWATER MAD!...ONE OF THE FEW TIMES HE EVER BLEW A GASKET..INSTRUCT IONS TO ALL HANDS..."THERE WILL BE NO MORE..REPEAT NO MORE CODE PRACTICE ON THE 600 METER RECEIVER". ALL THOSE INVOLVED WERE CALLED ON THE CARPET...ALL WERE GIVEN A TALK...NONE WERE FIRED BUT COULD HAVE BEEN. AFTER SEEING BOTH LOGS AND COMPARING THEM, HARRY WAS SECRET LY PLEASED, AS THEY WERE IDENTICAL IN EVERY DETAIL, AS NOT A SINGLE MISTAKE HAD BEEN MADE IN THE COPY.... EVEN THO IT WAS A FAKE SOS; AT LEAST THE BOYS WERE ON THE JOB...HE TOOK GREAT PRIDE IN IT.

YOU CAN BE SURE THERE WAS NO MORE OF THIS SORT OF THING...WE ALL HELD HARRY SADEN-WATER IN GREAT RESPECT, NOT ONLY AS OUR BOSS, BUT AS A REAL FINE GENTLEMAN WHO KNEW HIS BIZ...AND COME TO THINK OF IT KNOW THAT HARRY HELD A PINK TICKET...ONE OF THE XTRA CLASS LICENSES...WAS IT THE NUMBER I OR DID PICKERELL GET NUMBER I...SEEMS THERE IS A STORY ABOUT IT...IVE HEARD VARIOUS VERSIONS..AND NONE FROM HARRY HIMSELF...WONDER IF SOME OF THE OOT'S SUCH AS MR. GEORGE STERLING COULD COMMENT ON THIS???

ALONG WITH BLABBER MOUTH. RECENTLY RE-READ "SOS TO THE RESCUE" BY KARL BAARSLAG. OXFORD UNIVERSITY PRESS 1940, BROUGHT BACK MANY MEMORIES SUCH AS THE LONG WINDED STORY I HAVE GIVEN YOU IN REGARDS TO OUR EXPERIENCES WITH HARRY SADENWATER, AND WHICH I HOPE WILL BRING BACK MEMORIES AND WARNINGS. ON THE BOOK BY BAARSLAG, I WOULD RECOMMEND IT TO MANY OF THE OOTC'S FOR SOME INTERESTING READING BY A SEAGOING RADIOMAN AND HIS VIEWS, AND SOME STORIES OF THE EARLY SHIP DISASTERS. CHAPTER 10 IS ON THE SUBJECT OF LADY MARINE OPERATORS. ONE WODERS ON HOW MANY OF THEM ARE STILL AROUND? AND ARE THEY ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP IN OOTC? (YES IF OTHERWISE QUALIFIED). THEN TOO, HOW COULD THEY, AREN'T THE LADIES ALWAYS SUPPOSE TO BE 39 OR YOUNGER? BUT, ALL KIDDING ASIDE, IT WOULD BE AWFULLY NICE TO KNOW OF THEM AND HAVE THEM AS MEMBERS.

AS CAN BE UNDERSTOOD FROM THIS EPISTLE, I'VE HAD VERY LITTLE SEAGOING EXPERIENCE OTHER THAN IN THE US NAVAL RESERVE...ACTIVE DUTY ABOARD SUBS AND 4 STACKER TIN CANS...SEVER AL COMPASS STATIONS...LOTS OF AIRCRAFT...BUT LITTLE COMPARED TO MANY OF THE OOTC'S WHO WERE REALLY ACTIVE. HAVE ALWAYS TAKEN A KEEN INTEREST IN STANDING WATCH...EVEN A BIT AT OLE RCA COMMUNICATIONS AT 64 BROAD STREET, NYC IN THE EARLY 1920'S...

I HAVE MANY SAMPLES OF OOTC VOICES AND FISTS THAT I HAVE RECORDED ON TAPE..OFTEN REFLECT ON HOW WONDERFUL IT WOULD HAVE BEEN TO HAVE HAD A HIGH GRADE TAPE RECORDER 40 OR MORE YEARS AGO AND TO HAVE TAPED UP FOR HISTORY THE OLD "VOICES" THAT ONE HEARD ON SPARK AND ARC IN THE BEGINNING SUCH AS NAH, MGY (TITANIC), THE SHRILL VOICE OF VCE AT CAPE RACE...FFU IN FRANCE, AND MANY THOUSAND MORE; THE INDIVIDUAL FISTS AND SOUNDS, NOT TO MENTION THE "MESSAGE", WOULD BRING BACK MANY MEMORIES AND PERHAPS A TEAR OR TWO... SUCH IS THE PASSING PARADE...THE STRAIGHT GAP...ROCK CRUSHERS...QUENCED GAPS... NON-SYNCS ARCS... EACH HAD IT SVOICE AND PERSONALITY...THE FELLAS THAT WOUND UP AND DOWN THE SCALE AND COULD PRODUCE AN OCTAVE OR MORE...OH BOY!!!

WELL FELLA,, THESE ARE A FEW THOUGHTS I HOPE YOU CAN DECODE FROM A POOR FELLA WHO STILL EARNS A LIVING WHILE MAKING A ONE MAN SHOW FROM WGY ON THE MID-8 SHED... TRYING TO

HE SOON AFTERWARDS GOT HIS MASTER'S DEGREE AND IS PRESENTLY ONE OF THE TOP RADAR MEN AND BRASS FOR GE AT ELECTRONICS PARK, IN SYRACUSE. N.Y.

THE REAL CULPRIT WAS AN UNUSUALLY SHARP BOY BY THE NAME OF JOHN E. YOUNG..WAS W3AUV JACK | BELIEVE GOT THE HIGHEST GRADES WERE EVER GIVEN AT DREXEL...BOTH OF THE ABOVE WERE REALLY SWELL FELLERS, VERY GOOD LOOKING LADS.JACK WAS A CRACKERJACK HAM BUT HAD NO COMMERCIAL TICKET...HAD UNUSUAL ABILITIES AND COULD TAKE SOLID 45 WPM MIXED UP STUFF ON THE MILL. JACK INSTALLED HANY OF THE GE TRANSMITTERS, THE FIRST GE 50-B, (50 KW) AT WTIC, HARTFORD...

TRANSMITT 1 AT CHICAGO, IN TEXAS, THE SW AND BC TRANSMITTERS AT ROME, ITALY FOR THE POPE AND MANY MORE. HE WAS VERY HIGHLY THOUGHT OF BY GE AND OTHERS... JACK IS ONE OF THE BRASS WITH RCA PRESENTLY.

ANOTHER OF THE BOYS WAS ANDREW D. RING...ANDY WAS ALSO AN EXCEPTIONALLY ABLE BOY AND WAS ONE OF THE TOP DESIGN MEN FOR MANY PIECES OF EQUIPMENT, INCLUDING THE NAVY 500 KW JOBS. HE LEFT GE MANY YEARS AGO TO BECOME CHIEF ENGINEER FOR FCC, BUT HAS FOR MANY YEARS NOW BEEN IN CONSULTING PRACTICE IN WASHINGTON, D.C. THERE ARE SEVERAL MORE OF EQUAL CALIBRE...SO YOU CAN SEE WHY I NEGLECTED TO INCLUDE THE WHOLE NAMES.

I COULD WRITE A BOOK ON THE EXPERIENCES IN THIS FIRETRAP OVER THE PAST 35 YEARS OR SO WITH GE'S RADIO DIVISION, AND THEY ARE MOSTLY PLEASANT MEMORIES AND A WONDERFUL EXPERIENCE. FOR THE PAST 15 YEARS OR SO OR SINCE THE END OF THE WAR THERE HAS BEEN VERY LITTLE DEVELOPMENT, JUST BREAD AND BUTTER STUFF, OPERATING THE 5 TRANSMITTERS. IT'S BEEN LOTSA FUN...AND TO THINK ON HOW WE HIRED TOP BOYS AT STARTING WAGE OF 40¢ AN HOUR... AND I DO MEAN WITH DEGREES. BOY! HOW WE DREAMED OF A \$4000 A YEAR JOB.. BUT THEN TOO, I BOUGHT A BRAND NEW DELUX MODEL "A" FORD ROADSTER DELIVERED FER \$487.50!! SO IT'S ALL RELATIVE. ON THE "X" CALLS, AT ONE TIME WE HAD 18 TRANSMITTERS ON SIMULTANEOUSLY AT SOUTH SCHENACTADY, USING 8 MODES OF MODULATION ON 18 DIFFERENT FREQUENCIES FROM AROUND 800 Mcs. TO 125 Kcs... You name it and we tried it...SSB, TV, FM, Facimili, etc., etc.

THINK IT IS TIME FOR ME TO GET IN MY TWO CENT'S WORTH RE BLABBER MOUTH. GET A BIG KICK OUT OF IT, ESPECIALLY IN READING ABOUT SOME OF THE BOYS I EITHER KNEW OR KNEW OF "WAY BACK WHEN".

GOT MY FIRST HAM TICKET AS 6WL, OUT ON THE WEST COAST, IN 1912. HAD BEEN MESSING AROUND FOR SEVERAL MONTHS PRIOR TO THIS. FIRST RIG CONSISTED OF THE USUAL COIL, INTERRUPTER, AND HELIX. RX WAS A QUAKER OATS BOX MOUNTED COIL, CRYSTAL DETECTOR, OIL IMMERSED VC AND HEAD PHONES. HAD QUITE A SKY WIRE, THOUGH. IT CONSISTED OF A TWO-WIRE FLAT TOP, ONE END ON A THIRTY FOOT POLE ON TOP OF THE HOUSE, THE OTHER ABOUT EIGHTY FEET UP IN A EUCALYPTUS TREE, AND 450 FEET BETWEEN SPREADERS. NEEDLESS TO SAY, THE WIRE HAD BEEN DONATED BY A NEIGHBOR WHO WORKED FOR THE TELEPHONE COMPANY.

GOT MY FIRST COMMERCIAL TICKET IN 1914, AND WENT TO SEA FOR A YEAR FOR THE OLD MARCONI CO. OUT ON THE COAST, IN 1915. HIT THE NAVY FOR A HITCH DURING WWI, DURING WHICH I LOST MY HAM TICKET.

WENT TO WORK FOR AN ELECTRICAL JOBBER IN OAKLAND, CALIF. IN 121, AND GOT BACK ON THE AIR AS 6CEG IN 123. CHANGED JOBS IN 129, GOING WITH THE OLD BOEING AIR TRANSPORT CO. AS A RADIO OPERATOR, IN OAKLAND. WAS TRANSFERRED IN 130 TO A JOB AS CHIEF OP FOR THE COMPANY IN CHEYENNE, WYO., AND GOT THE CALL W7GCO. DURING THE TIME I WAS IN CHEYENNE, NATIONAL, BOEING VARNEY AND PACIFIC AIR TRANSPORT WERE CONSOLIDATED INTO UNITED AIR LINES, WITH WHOM I HAVE BEEN ASSOCIATED UP TO MY RETIREMENT THE LAST OF JANUARY OF THIS YEAR. IN 135 I WAS MADE FLIGHT DISPATCHER FOR UAL, AND IN 141 WAS TRANSFERRED TO DENVER, COLO., AND GOT THE CALL W9YBS. WAS TRANSFERRED AGAIN IN 142, THIS TIME TO NEW YORK, AND GOT MY PRESENT CALL ON APPLYING FOR MODIFICATION.

ONE ITEM OF INTEREST THAT MIGHT INTRGUE SOME OF THE BOYS IS SOMETHING THAT HAPPEN-ED DURING THE FALL OF 1916, AT WHICH TIME I WAS A FRESHMAN AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, IN BERKELEY. SOME OF US GOT TOGETHER IN THE RADIO CLUB OF THE COLLEGE, AND CAME UP WITH THE IDEA OF BROADCASTING THE U.C.-STANFORD FOOTBALL GAME. OF COURSE WE PLANNED DOING IT BY USING A I KW QUENCHED ROTARY JOB THAT WAS OWNED BY ONE OF THE MORE AFFLUENT MEMBERS OF THE CLUB, INASMUCH AS NONE OF US KNEW MUCH ABOUT VOICE AT THAT TIME, ALTHOUGH ALL HEARD THE VOICE MODULATED ARC OUTFIT THAT WAS OPERATING ON THE FAIRMONT HOTEL, IN SAN FRANCISCO.

AS I WAS THE ONLY ONE IN THE OUTFIT THAT HAD A COMMERCIAL TICKET, I WAS PICKED TO DO ALL THE DIRTY WORK IN CONNECTION WITH GETTING PERMISSION TO SET UP THE GEAR. I MANAGED TO DO ALL THIS, BUT I'LL GUARANTEE THAT IT WAS NO EASY JOB.

THE DAY OF THE GAME EVERYTHING WAS ALL SET - ANTENNA STRUNG ALONG THE TOP OF THE GRANDSTAND, AND THE RIG TESTED OUT WITH SOME OF THE LOCAL GANG. WE PLANNED ON TRANSMITTING THE RESULTS OF EACH PLAY, AFTER PLAY HAD BEEN COMPLETED, USING SYMBOLS FOR THE PLAY, SUCH AS ILLH/REII PLUS 5, WHICH MEANT THAT THE LEFT HALF HAD CARRIED AROUND RIGHT END FOR FIVE YARDS. VERY SNAZZY! EVERYTHING WAS FINE UNTIL WE PUT ON THE FIRST TRANSMISSION, THEN A WILD-EYED GUY SHOWED UP AND SAID THE COACH DEMANDED THAT WE QUIT THAT RACKET, AS THE QUARTERBACK COULDN'T MAKE HIS SIGNALS HEARD. (THOSE WERE THE DAYS BEFORE THE HUDDLE). WHAT TO DO!!!!

WE FINALLY CAME UP WITH A COMPROMISE. WE MADE OUR TRANSMISSIONS AFTER THE BALL WAS SNAPPED, AND WHILE THE PLAY WAS GOING ON, AND WHILE EVERYONE WAS NOT EXACTLY HAPPY, WE WERE. BUT DON'T LET ANYONE EVER TELL YOU THAT A QUENCHED ROTARY OUTFIT WAS QUIET!!!

WELL, GUESS THAT THE ABOVE SHOULD KEEP YOU OCCUPIED FOR A WHILE. AS I SAID AT THE OF THIS BLURB, I THOROUGHLY ENJOY READING BLABBER MOUTH. THINK THAT THE TITLE IS QUITE APROPRO. AS MOST OF WE OOTC MEMBERS DO JUST THAT!

OLD "DF" -- A SATIRE

Some years ago, following the early development of wireless, a station stood in a low section of swamp land, a short distance from Manhattan Beach, N.Y. Various powers were used from time to time and the range was unusually great. Incredible distances were covered even with low power, and the nightly press was copied by ships near and far. Old operators of that day will recall the the low frequency spark of "DF", and how well nigh impossible it was to tune him out. Owing to the broad tuning of those days, the signals were generally "All over the tuner". Although the press was sought after and welcomed, the interference at other times added not a little bit to the trials and tribulations of operators of that day.

IT WAS AN ORDINARY OCCURANCE TO LEARN FROM OPERATORS, THAT "DF" HAD BEEN COPIED IN MANY FAR OFF CORNERS OF THE EARTH, SUCH AS ALEXANDRIA, EGYPT AND IN SOUTH AMERICAN WATERS. WHILE NO EXPLANATION WAS GIVEN, FOR THE UNUSUAL CARRYING POWER, IT WAS GENERALLY CONSIDERED GOOD GROUND AND CLEAR RANGE AT SEA, COMBINED WITH SOME OTHER FREKISH CONDITION, PLACED "DF" IN A CLASS BY ITSELF.

WAY UP MID' THE LABORADOR ICEBERGS, WORKIN' A "CPR" BOAT
WHEN YOU THINK YOUR FREE FROM JAMMIN', DOESN'T IT GET YOUR GOAT?
YOUV'E GIVEN 'EM "G" FOR TWENTY, WITH HIS SIGNAL WEAK AS BREATH,
WHEN HE'S JUST STARTIN' UP WITH HIS THIRD ONE,

FOR WE HEAR THE BOUNDER A SENDIN', BUT THE BOUNDER, HE DON'T HEAR US,

SINCE RECEIPT OF THE CURRENT ROSTER OF MEMBERS OF THE OLD OLD TIMERS CLUB, WHEREIN THE YEAR OF COMMENCEMENT AS AN AMATEUR IS INDICATED AS 1908, I HAVE BEEN SOMEWHAT EMBARRASSED BY MY FRIENDS WHO UNDERSTOOD THAT I BUILT MY FIRST AMATEUR EQUIPMENT AND OPERATED IT IN 1899. THIS IS THE DATE INDICATED ON MY QSL CARDS AND RECORDED, EVEN IN MY BIOGRAPHY IN THE PUBLICATION WIRELESS PRESS, LTD., PUBLISHED BY THE MARCONI WIRELESS TELEGRAPH Co., IN LONDON, ENGLAND, AT THE TIME I WAS OPERATING THE WANEMAKER-MARCONI WIRELESS TELEGRAPH STATION ATOP THE WANEMAKER STORE IN PHILADELPHIA, PA., IN 1902, AND AGAIN IN WHO'S WHO IN ENGINEERING, BY JOHN WILLIAM LEONARD, PUBLISHED BY WHO'S WHO PUBLICATIONS, INC., IN NEW YORK CITY, 1925.

OF COURSE THE REASON FOR THE 1908 ENTRY IN THE ROSTER IS DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE OLD OLD TIMERS CLUB, UNDER ARTICLEVIII OF IT S CONSTITUTION SHOWING QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP, REQUIRES THAT THE APPLICANT FOR MEMBERSHIP MADE A TWO WAY CONTACT OVER HIS OWN TRANSMITTER WITH SOME OTHER WIRELESS STATION. IT ALSO REQUIRES THE "DATE OF HIS OR HER FIRST TWO WAY CONTACT BY WIRELESS". THIS INFORMATION I FURNISHED BUT DISTINCTLY STATED THAT WHERE-AS MY TWO WAY CONTACTS HAD OCCURRED IN 1908, AND THAT I AM LISTED IN THE FIRST ANNUAL OFFICHIAL WIRELESS BLUE BOOK OF THE WIRELESS ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA, PUBLISHED IN MAY, 1909, I DID HOWEVER CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE MY WIRELESS TRANSMITTER AND RECEIVER IN 1899.

IN 1899, I WAS LOCATED IN PHILADELPHIA, PA., AND READ IN THE NEWSPAPERS ABOUT THE INTERNATIONAL YACHT RACES BEING REPORTED FOR THE FIRST TIME BYMARCONI WIRELESS OFF SANDY HOOK, N.Y. THIS AROUSED GREAT INTEREST IN ME TO BE ABLE TO RECEIVE SUCH REPORTS OF THE NEXT YACHT RACE IN 1900. I COMMENCED IMMEDIATELY TO CONSTRUCT PARTS AND ASSEMBLE A TRANSMITTER CONSISTING OF A ONE INCH RHUMKORFF COIL (SPARK COIL), THE PRIMARY OF WHICH I ENERGIZED BY A BATTERY CIRCUIT CONTAINING A TELEGRAPH KEY, AND ACROSS THE SECONDARY TERMINALS I CONNECTED A SPARK GAP CONSISTING OF TWO SMALL BRASS RODS WITH A BALL AT THE END OF EACH ROD, THE BALLS BEING SEPARATED ABOUT A QUARTER INCH APART; THE APARK OCCURRING BETWEEN THEM WHENEVER THE TELEGRAPH KEY WAS DEPRESSED. TO DNE OF THE TERMINALS OF THE COIL I CONNECTED AN ANTENNA OF ABOUT SEVENTY-FEET IN LENGTH, AND TO THE OTHER TERMINAL I MADE A CONNECTION TO GROUND. THIS IS PRECISELY WHAT MARCONI WAS USING AT THAT TIME; NO OSCILLATION TRANSFORMER OR TUNING

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COIL AND NO CONDENSERS; JUST A PLAIN ANTENNA TO GROUND CIRCUIT BROKEN ONLY BY THE SPARK GAP.

MY RECEIVER WAS ALSO PATTERNED AFTER THAT OF MARCON; AND CONSISTED OF A SILVERNICKLE FILINGS COHERER WHICH I CONSTRUCTED BY USING A GLASS TUBE ABOUT A QUARTER INCH IN
DIAMETER IN WHICH WERE INSERTED TWO SILVER PLUGS SEPERATED ABOUT AN EIGHTH INCH APART AND
THE SPACE BETWEEN THEM FILLED WITH A MIXTURE OF SILVER AND NICKLE FILINGS. ONE OF THE PLUGS
WAS CONNECTED DIRECTLY TO THE ANTENNA WHICH WAS ALSO ABOUT SEVENTY FIVE FEET LONG, AND THE
OTHER PLUG WAS CONNECTED TO GROUND. AGAIN THERE WAS NO TUNING COIL OR CONDENSERS IN THE CIRCUIT, JUST AN ANTENNA TO GROUND THROUGH THE COHERER. ALSO CONNECTED TO THE TWO SILVER PLUGS
WAS A LOCAL CIRCUIT CONTAINING A BATTERY OF LOW POTENTIAL, A SENSITIVE RELAY WHICH OPERATED
AN ORDINARY ELECTRIC BELL WITH THE GONG REMOVED AND THE HAMMER PLACED CLOSE TO THE GLASS
TUBE COHERER TO TAP IT AND SHAKE THE FILINGS APART AFTER THE FIRST SIGNAL HAD COHERED THEM
AND PERMITTED CURRENT TO PASS THE RELAY. THUS THE RELAY CIRCUIT WAS OPENED, THE TAPPER STOPP
ED, AND AND EVERYTHING IN READINESS FOR THE NEXT SIGNAL. THIS ARRANGEMENT ACTUALLY WORKED
WHENEVER THE TRANSMITTER WAS OPERATED.

THERE WAS ONE IMPORTANT TROUBLE; THERE WAS NO OTHER STATION IN THAT LOCALITY WITH WHICH TO WORK. THE NEXT AMATEUR (WALTERJ. DEERY), WD, AGENERAL ELECTRIC SALESMAN, DID NOT APPEAR UNTIL ALMOST A YEAR LATER, IN 1900. SO, IN ORDER TO WORK MY EQUIPMENT, I LOCATED THE TRANSMITTER AT ONE PLACE AND THE RECEIVER A SHORT DISTANCE AWAY, AND HAD A COLLEAGUE OF MINE, CHARLES WACHTER, ALTERNATELY OPERATE THE TRANSMITTER WHILE I WAS AT THE RECEIVING EQUIPMENT SOME DISTANCE AWAY AND VICE VERSA. IT WAS ACTUALLY A TRANSMISSION BETWEEN TWO STATIONS BUT EACH STATION LACKED EITHER A TRANSMITTER OR A RECEIVER THAT WOULD ENABLE THEM TO WORK BACK AND FORTH.

Unfortunately, AS RECORDS WILL DISCLOSE, THERE WAS NO INTERNATIONAL YACHT RACE OFF SANDY HOOK IN 1900, SO I NEVER DID RECEIVE THE RESULTS SO EAGERLY SOUGHT.

FINDING THE COHERER RATHER SLUGGISH IN OPERATION AND QUITE UNRELIABLE, I MADE VARIOUS KINDS OF DETECTORS, THE NEXT BEING THE COPPER OXIDE TRIPOD WHICH CONSISTED OF A METAL
TRIPOD WITH THE BOTTOM OF IT'S LEGS POINTED STANDING ON A PLATE OF OXIDIZED COPPER; THEN THE
CARBON-STEEL DETECTOR WAS TRIED. THE FIRST TYPE BEING TWO SMALL BLOCKS SET UPRIGHT ON A BASE
WITH THEIR UPPER EDGES GROUND TO A KNIFE EDGE AND A STEEL NEEDLE, WITH A SMALL WEIGHT SUSPENDED FROM IT'S CENTER TO KEEP IT FROM ROLLING OFF, LAID ACROSS THE CARBON BLOCKS. THIS
WAS THE FIRST AUTOMATIC DECOHERING TYPE OF DETECTOR THAT I USED; BUT THE EDGES OF THE CARBON
BLOCKS WERE HARD TO MAINTAIN IN A SUFFICIENTLY SHARP CONDITION BECAUSE THE CARBON IS SO
BRITTLE. IF I DID THIS TODAY I WOULD USE A COUPLE OF RAZOR BLADES STANDING UPRIGHT, WITH A
SMALL ROD OF CARBON ACROSS THEIR EDGES OR PERHAPS USE THE CARBON STRIP FROM A PENCIL.

WITH THE CARBON-STEEL DETECTOR A SINGLE DRY CELL WAS CONNECTED IN SERIES WITH THE CARBON BLOCKS AND A TELEPHONE RECEIVER. THIS WORKED FAIRLY WELL BUT I GOT A BETTER IDEA. PROCURING FROM THE DRUGGIST A SMALL WOODEN PILL BOX (THEY DON'T COME THAT WAY ANYMORE), I INSERTED A SEWING NEEDLE THROUGH EACH SIDE AND KEPT THE POINTS ABOUT ONE QUARTER INCH APART AND THEN FILLED THE BOX WITH CARBON GRANULES FROM A TELEPHONE TRANSMITTER. BOY! OH BOY, HOW NICELT THAT WORKED; ALL THE TROUBLES OF THE OTHER TYPE DISAPPEARED. I HEARD THE NEW NAVAL WIRELESS STATION AT THE PHILADELPHIA NAVY YARD, CALL LETTERS PV AT THAT TIME, AS SOON AS THEY OPENED UP. I CAN'T RECALL THE EXACT YEAR BUT IT MUST HAVE BEEN AROUND 1913.

MY NEXT DETECTOR WAS THE ELECTROLYTIC, THE FIRST ONE | MADE WITH A GLASS EYEDROPP ER TUBE. RUNNING A PIECE OF VERY FINE (I/1000") PLATINUM WIRE THROUGH THE TUBE | SEALED IT INTO THE FINE POINTED END WITH A BUNSEN BURNER FLAME AND THEN CAREFULLY GROUND DOWN THE END OF THE TUBE UNTIL IT PRESENTED A SMALL FLAT SURFACE WITH A MINIATURE DOTHOF PLATINUM IN THE CENTER. THE SMALL END OF THIS TUBE WAS THEN INSERTED IN A SMALL AMOUNT OF NITRIC (OR SUL-NEXT PAGE PLEASE

FURIC) ACID SOLUTION (ABOUT 10 %) AND CONNECTED IN A CIRCUIT WHICH INCLUDED A POTENTIOMETER FOR ADJUSTING THE POTENTIAL, A BATTERY OF A COUPLE OF VOLTS AND A TELEPHONE RECEIVER. THIS WAS CONNECTED IN THE USUAL MANNER IN THE RECEIVING CIRCUIT AND WORKED QUITE WELL FOR A WHILE BUT HAD THE HABIT OF GETTING RATHER INSENSITIVE AFTER WORKING FOR A DAY OR TWO.

DISCOVERING THAT WOLLASTON WIRE WHICH CONSISTED OF A VERY FINE, ALMOST INVISIBLE, PLATINUM WIRE COATED WITH SILVER TO MAKE IT USABLE, COULD BE OBTAINED FROM BAKER & CO., IN NEWARK, N.J., I OBTAINED A SMALL QUANTITY AND MADE A DETECTOR FROM PARTS OF A TELEGRAPH SOUNDER. USING THE UPRIGHT YOKE MEMBER AND SAWING OFF THE LONG END OF THE ARMATURE, I TAPPA HOLE IN THE SHORT END AND SCREWED A WIRE HANDLE TO IT SO THAT BY PRESSING DOWN ON THE WIRE HANDLE, THE LONG END OF THE ARMATURE WOULD RISE UPWARD. ON THE LONG END OF THE ARMATURE, I PLACED A SMALL CLIP TO HOLD A SHORT LENGTH (ABOUT 3'8") OF WOLLASTON WIRE. DIRECTLY UNDER THE CLIP, I SUPPORTED A SMALL PLATINUM CUP PARTIALLY FILLED WITH A SOLUTION OF NITRIC ACID INTO WHICH THE WOLLASTON WIRE DIPPED ABOUT 1/64 INCH.

THE NITRIC ACID DISSOLVED THE SILVER FROM THE WOLLASTON WIRE TIP ALLOWING THE FINE PLATINUM WIRE TO CONTACT THE ACID. THE PLATINUM TIP WAS SO FINE THAT I HAVE SEEN IT UNDER A MAGNIFYING GLASS REFUSE TO ENTER THE ACID BUT RATHER TOUCH THE SURFACE AND THEN CURL UPWARD JUST AS THOUGH THE LIQUID WAS A SOLID; THAT'S HOW FINE THE PLATINUM WIRE WAS. THIS ARRANGEMENT ALSO EMPLOYED A BATTERY, A POTENTIOMETER AND A TELEPHONE RECEIVER. (THERE WERE NO WIRELESS HEADPHONES YET AVAILABLE, SO WE USED TELEPHONE RECEIVERS AND INCIDENTALLY, MY FIRST HEAD RECEIVER WAS A SINGLE ONE ON A BAND FOR ONE EAR AS SHOWN IN AN EARLY PHOTOGRAPH OF MY STATION).

THE WOLLASTON WIRE ELECTROLYTIC WORKED VERY WELL WITH THE EXCEPTION THAT YOU HAD TO RAISE THE PLATINUM WIRE FROM THE ACID EVERY YOU TRANSMITTED OR IT WOULD BE BURNED OFF. ALSO A NEARBY STATION A NEARBY STATION OR A BLOB OF STATIC WOULD BURN IT OFF AND YOU HAD TO TO GO ALL THROUGH THE PROCESS OF DISSOLVING THE SILVER OFF ANOTHER PORTION OF THE WOLLAST ON WIRE BEFORE YOU COULD RECEIVE AND THIS TOOK SOME SECONDS. IT WAS, THOUGH, A VERY SENSITIVE DETECTOR AND ONLY OUTDONE BY THE CRYSTALS THAT FOLLOWED.

THE NEXT DETECTORS WERE THE CRYSTALS, CARBORUNDUM, SILICON, IRON PYRITES, PERIKON (CHALCOPYRITE AND ZINCITE), AND FINALLY GALENA, AND CERUSITE. CERUSITE WAS A GRAN ULAR FORM OF GALENA WHICH APPEARED TO BE MORE SENSITIVE, AT LEAST YOU COULD FIND A GOOD SPOT MUCH EASIER THAN WITH GALENA. I FOUND A SUPPLY OF CERUSITE IN THE LEAD BEARING ORE OF PENNSYLVANIA SOMEWHERE AROUND YORK, AND MY COLLEAGUE AT THAT TIME PROFESSOR LLOYD M. KNOLL OF CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL, PHILADELPHIA, USED TO MAKE TRIPS UP THERE FOR SUPPLY.

OF COURSE THE DEFOREST AUDION OUTDID THEM ALL, BUT WHEN ARMSTRONG CAME UP WITH HIS REGENERATIVE CIRCUITS, WE THOUGHT THAT WAS THE END OF THEM ALL. HOW THOSE SIGNALS BOOMED IN THAT EARLY MORNING WHEN PROF. KNOLL AND I LEFT NEW YORK CITY ON THAT MIDNIGHT TRAIN AFTER HEARING ARMSTRONG ANNOUNCE HIS REGENERATIVE CIRCUITS AT THE MEETING OF THE I.R.E. AND IMMEDIATELY WIRE UP OUR AUDIONS FOR REGENERATION; IT WAS JUST UNBELIEVABLE.

BUT NOW I AM GETTING UP TO THE TIME WHEN I WENT COMMERCIAL AND BOARDED A STAND-ARD OIL TANKER AT BAYONNE, N.J. AND HESITENTLY CALLED NY TO GIVE HIM A DEPARTURE REPORT AND HE FLASHED BACK AT ME WITH A LONG MESSAGE FOR THE SKIPPER WHICH, EVEN AFTER MUCH REP-ITION, THE SKIPPER COULD NOT UNDERSTAND. SPARKS HAD A VERY RED FACE THAT TIME.
