




PROBABLE THAT THE BINDER AND FIRST
INSTALLMENT OF THE BLUE BOOK OF AMATEUR
WIRELESS HAS BEEN MAILED TO YOU OR WILL
BE VERY SHORTLY.

IT SEEMS FITTING AT THIS TIME THAT MOST DESERVED RECOGNOTION BE GIVEN TO BERT FOR HIS HARD WORK IN EDITING THIS BOOK AND FOR THE TALENT HE HAS SO FREELY GIVEN TO THE OLD OLD TIMERS CLUB.

THE BLUE BOOK WAS CONCEIVED ABOUT 1948 BY CHARLIE ELLSWORTH, WITU THEN W2TQ. NOTHING OF A CONSTRUCTIVE NATURE WAS DONE ABOUT IT HOWEVER UNTIL ABOUT 1956 WHEN ONE OF THE MEMBERS WAS REQUESTED TO TAKE ON THE PROJECT.

PUBLICATION OF SUCH A VOLUME. WITHOUT A LOT OF CHEST THUMPING AND CONFESSING LACK OF EXPERIENCE IN SUCH WORK BERT UNHESITATINGLY AGREED TO TAKE ON THE JOB, DESPITE HIS MANY
OTHER ACTIVITIES, AND THEY ARE NUMEROUS YE OLDE COPY BOY CAN ATTEST AS A PERSONAL FRIEND.

A WORD OF EXPLANATION REGARDING THE BLUE BOOK

THE PUBLICATION OF SUCH A VOLUME AS THE BLUE BOOK IN THE LIMITED NUMBER REQUIRED FOR OUR MEMBERS IS RATHER COSTLY JOB DONE IN THE CONVENTIONAL MANNER. IT HAS BEEN NECESSARY OF COURSE TO TAKE THIS INTO CONSIDERATION BUT BY HAVING THE VERY LEAST POSSIBLE WORK DONE PROFESSIONALLY, THE COST HAS BEEN KEPT DOWN TO AN ACCEPTABLE LOW.

THE CUTS HAD TO BE PREPARED PROFESSIONALLY BUT THE TYPING OF THE MASTERS WAS DONE IN BERT'S OFFICE AT A COST OF MATERIAL ONLY. ALL OTHER WORK HAS BEEN DONE BY BERT WITH AN OCCASIONAL ASSIST FROM THE OTHER OFFICERS. K2BX, MERRILL BEAM WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN GETTING A GOOD PRICE ON THE BINDERS. AS A MATTER OF FACT HE WAS ABLE TO GET THEM AT A PRICE ABOUT 20% LOWER THAN WE HAD HOPED TO GET. THE ART WORK FOR THE BINDER WAS DONE BY ONE OF BERT'S ASSISTANTS UNDER THE DIRECTION OF BERT.

THE MATTER OF GETTING PICTURES AND BIOGRAPHICAL DATA WAS QUITE A CHORE. NO DOUBT MANY OF OUR MEMBERS HAD PREVIOUSLY SENT IN THE PICTURES AND DATA ONLY TO FIND THAT IT HAD AGAIN BEEN REQUESTED. THIS WAS CAUSED BY LOSS IN TRANSFERRING FROM ONE SOURCE TO ANOTHER. IT WAS REGRETABLE BUT BEYOND OUR CONTROL.

IT HAS BEEN NECESSARY TO CUT DOWN ON THE BIOGRAPHIES OF SOME OF THE MEMBERS IN ORDER TO KEEP THE BLUE BOOK DOWN TO AN ECONOMICAL SIZE AND TO MAKE FOR UNIFORMITY. PERHAPS SOME OF OUR MEMBERS MAY FEEL THAT THEIR BIOGRAPHY HAS BEE CUT A LITTLE SHORT; NO DOUBT THE FEELING IS JUSTIFIED BUT IN ORDER TO GET SUCH A VOLUME AS THE BLUE BOOK A GREAT MANY COMPROMISES BECOMES NECESSARY IN ORDER PUBLISH WITH OUR LIMITED FUNDS.

IT IS THE HOPE OF THE BLUE BOOK EDITOR AND THE OFFICERS OF OOTC THAT THIS LITERARY VENTURE WILL IN SOME SMALL WAY MEET THE DESIRES OF OUR MEMBERS AND THAT IT WILL BE FOUND OF INTEREST. PLEASE BEAR IN MIND THAT THIS IS NOT THE WORK OF PROFESSIONALS BUT RETHER AND LABOR OF HOPE THAT IT WILL SERVE OUR MEMBERS IN RECALLING SOME OF THE PAST ENJOYABLY.

THE BLUE BOOK WILL HAVE THE OTHER CALL AREAS PROVIDED IN ORDER AND IT IS PROPOSED TO HAVE INTERESTING PICTURES AND ARTICLES ADDED FROM TIME TO TIME. IT IS PROBABLE THAT ALL CALL AREAS WILL BE REPRESENTED BY THE END OF THE YEAR. YOUR CONTINUED COOPERATION WITH THE BLUE BOOK EDITOR IS URGENTLY REQUESTED. ALSO CONSTRUCTIVE CRITICISM WILL HELP.

A FEW RAMBLING RECOLLECTIONS By John N. HERLAND W2MDB

PERHAPS SOME OF YOU OLD TIMERS REMEMBER THE FIRST DAY WHEN WBF OPENED UP FOR BUSINESS ATOP THE WILLIAM B. FILENE STORE IN BOSTON. THE FIRST MESSAGE WAS QST TO ANYONE HEARING THE TRANSMISSION, WHICH IF MY MEMORY SERVES ME RIGHT WAS TAPPED OUT BY DAN DE COSTA IN HIS BEAUTIFUL FIST ADVISING ALL WHO HEARD IT TO SEND YOUR COPY OF THE MESSAGE TO THE STORE AND THAT YOU WOULD RECEIVE A COPY OF "ROBINSON"S MANUAL OF WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY".

IT WAS MY THRILLING PLEASURE TO BRING IN PERSON MY TRANSCRIPTION OF THE MESSAGE AND REPORT OF THE SIGNAL. IT WAS BROUGHT IN PERSON BECAUSE OF MY JUVENILE THINKING THAT DOUBTED THE U.S. MAIL SERVICE WAS RELIABLE ENOUGH TO ENTRUST WITH SUCH AN IMPORTANT COMMUNICATION. SURE ENOUGH, I RECEIVED MY WHITE CLOTH BOUND COPY OF THE BOOK, AND IT REMAINED ONE OF MY MOST TREASURED POSSESSIONS FOR A LONG TIME.

I CAN'T REMEMBER WHAT BECAME OF THE BOOK. I RECALL TAKING IT WITH ME WHEN I WENT INTO THE SERVICE IN WORLD WAR I. ONE OF MY FIRST ASSIGNMENTS IN THE SIGNAL CORPS WAS TO START A CLASS IN "WIRELESS" FOR ARTILLARY OFFICERS AT CAMP JACKSON, S.C. I USED THIS BOOK AS A GUIDE IN TEACHING THE CLASS. BECAUSE IT WAS A NAVY MANUAL, AND THIS WAS AN ARMY CLASS I RECALL KEEPING IT OUT OF SIGHT OF ANY ONE IN THE CAMP. SOMEWHERE IN THE SHUFFLE IT GOT LOST, TO MY GREAT REGRET.

THIS SAME WBF AND NAD THE BOSTON NAVY YARD STATIONS WERE VERY CLOSE NEIGHBORS. BOTH STATIONS USED CONSIDERABLE SPARK POWER AND OCCASIONALLY ONE OR THE OTHER WOULD OPEN UP NOT KNOWING THE OTHER WAS LISTENING ON FREQUENCY WITH THE RESULT THAT ALL HELL POPPED. LOGSE. EAR DRUMS HURT, DETECTORS BURNED OUT OR JUST PLAIN RUFFLED FEELINGS. ACCORDINGLY A COMPROMISE WAS WORKED OUT.

VERY OFTEN THE OPERATOR AT WBF MIGHT BE COPYING A LONG SERIES OF MESSAGES ON THE MORSE

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WIRE FOR RETRANSMISSION ON THE AIR. IT WAS ALSO POSSIBLE THAT THE YARD OPERATOR MIGHT BE COPYING A LONG ONE JUST ABOUT THE TIME THAT THE OPERATOR AT WBF WAS READY TO GO ON THE AIR. TO AVOID THIS TROUBLE, THE OPERATOR AT SAY WBF WOULD TAP OUT A MORSE C (---). IF THE OTHER OPERATOR WAS WORKING, HE WOULD SAY .-... IF NOT --- THIS SIMPLE SYSTEM WORKED OUT TO THE COMPLETE SATISFACTION OF ALL CONCERNED. OCCASIONALLY SOME ONE SLIPPED AND THEN WOW.

Spark-Gap Times

Wonder if some of you fellows reading this, remember when the use of the OMNIGRAPH was instituted in place of hand sending for the code tests for all classes of licenses at Boston. Perhaps you were one of those with me that day. I DO remember that the entire group that took the code test that day were "knocked down". Among them were United Fruit and Marconi operators who could handle traffic at any speed.

I HAPPENED TO BE THE YOUNGEST OF THE GROUP AND DIDNOT FEEL TOO BAD ABOUT IT WHEN THESE MEN FAILED. IT SEEMS THAT THE MAN WHO SET UP THE MACHINE WAS NOT VERY GOOD AT CODE. IF THAT MACHINE WASN'T DOING BETTER THAN 60 WPM I'LL EAT YOUR OLD STRAW HAT. WHAT A "HOPPING" MAD GROUP THAT WAS! AT ANY RATE THE FUSS WAS GREAT ENOUGH FOR THE POWERS THAT BE ALLOWED ANOTHER TEST THE FOLLOWING DAY WITH THE RESULT THAT ALL HANDS PASSED WITH FLYING COLORS, THE OMNIGRAPH HAVING BEEN SET UP PROPERLY.

I BELIEVE THAT THIS EXAM RESULTED IN MY RECEIVING MY RADIO OPERATORS COMMERCIAL FIRST GRADE LICENSE # 5212, SIGNED BY Z.Y. WILLIAMS, LT. CMDR., U.S. NAVY ENGINEER OFFICER, DATED DEC. 22, 1912. THIS LICENSE WITH THE BIG RED CANCELLED STAMP ACROSS THE FACE IS STILL IN MY POSSESSION. EXPIRED LICENSES WERE STAMPED CANCELLED WHEN THE LICENSE WAS RENEWED.

GOT A REAL KICK OUT OF PERCE COLLISON'S APRIL 27 LETTER THAT APPEARED IN THE JUNE ISSUE OF SPARK-GAP TIMES. WELL DO I REMEMBER THE OLD BRANDT ROCK STATION. I SEEM TO REMEMBER THAT IT BLASTED OUT A CONTINUOUS D D D D, NIGHT AND DAY. AM I SLIPPING OR WAS IT SOME OTHER STATION? HOPE SOMEONE WILL STRAIGHTEN ME OUT ON THAT ONE.

Don't suppose that you OOTs have forgotten the nightly press transmissions of old WCC on Cape Cod---"To all ships and stations" etc. I'll bet Irving WIZE could come up with some real stories of this old landmark. I believe that Irv was Chief Operator of that station for years. Not so long ago I ran across him on 75 phone-AM--NOT SSB. We were batt-ing the breeze about this and that, and the subject of WCC came up. Without a moment's hesitation he gave out with the entire preamble of WCC's nightly press broadcast.

DURING THE QSO, IRVING TOLD ME THAT WCC WAS KEYED IN THE HIGH VOLTAGE SECONDARY! IT WAS DONE SUCCESSFULLY BY VIRTUE OF A BLAST OF COMPRESSED AIR BLOWING THE ARC OUT! SHADES OF MARCONI! WONDER HOW MANY OF THE MAINTENANCE PERSONNEL WERE ELECTROCUTED IN THE BOOBY TRAP! AT LEAST IN THE LIGHT OF SUBSEQUENT DEVELOPMENTS IT MIGHT BE CALLED THAT! BUT WHO HAS THE RIGHT TO ARGUE WITH SUCCESS. IT WORKED, WELL AND CONSISTANTLY. THERE WERE NOT MANY NIGHTS MISSED ON THAT STATION.

BACK AROUND 1911, IT WAS THE DUTY OF THE RADIO INSPECTOR AND HIS ASSISTANTS TO MAKE PERSONAL VISITS TO EACH HAM STATION. I REMEMBER VERY WELL THAT DAY WHEN ARTHUR BATCHELLER THE THEN ASSISTANT R.I. MADE HIS INSPECTION OF MY STATION IJY AT 148 BRUSH HILL ROAD, AT MILTON, MASS. I WAS VERY PROUD TO SHOW AND OPERATE THE STATION, COMPLETE WITH MY MANHATTAN ELECTRIC SUPPLY COMPANY'S 210 SPARK COIL, THE HOME MADE SPARK GAP AND HELIX. HE GOT A REAL BOOT OUT OF MY HOME MADE VOLTMETER, AMMETER AND WATTMETER IN THEIR BLACK WALNUT CASES, POLISHED UP TO THE QUEEN'S TASTE.

ALL THE METERS HAD THE SAME BASIC MOVEMENT, A CURVED ARMATURE SOLENOID WITH #18 ENAMMELED WIRE FOR THE POINTER. ACCURATE TOO! THEY HAD TO BE; THEY WERE CALIBRATED WITH A

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BATTERY TESTER, AND YOU CAN HARDLY BEAT THAT FOR A STANDARD! AFTER HIS INSPECTION OF MY STATION, I GUIDED HIM TO THE HOME OF ANOTHER HAM IN THE SAME TOWN. EVERYTHING WAS ALL RIGHT UNTIL MY FRIEND'S BULL DOG TOOK A NIP AT ARTHUR'S LEG! OH, THE MENTAL ANGUISH THAT WE KIDS SUFFERED WHEN THAT OCCURED! KEN'S MOTHER BROKE OUT HER VERY BEST CHINA AND CAKE, AND ALL WAS WELL FROM THEN ON. ACTUALLY, I DO NOT BELIEVE MORE THAN ARTHUR'S DIGNITY SUFFERED AS A RESULT OF THE DOG'S EFFORT TO ESCHEW SOS RADIO ATMOSPHERE.

THANKS JOHN, KEEP UP THE GOOD WORK YE OLDE COPY BOY.

THIS NET WILL BE CALLED "THE HANDI-CAPPER'S NET" AND IT IS PLANNED THAT CERTIFICATES WILL BE ISSUED TO PARTICIPATING MEMBERS W6MLZ REQUESTS THAT ALL AMATEURS FURNISH HIM WITH NAMES, CALLS AND DETAILS OF AMATEURS WHO MAY BE HANDICAPPED".

THESE CERTIFICATES, COMPLETE WITH GOLD SEAL, ARE BEING ISSUED TO ALL KNOWN HANDICAPPED AMATEURS, AND TO THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR AIDING THE HANDICAPPED TO GET ON THE AIR. THE LATTER IS IN THE FORM OF AN "HONORARY" MEMBERSHIP CERTIFICATE AND A REAL TREASURE FOR THOSE WHO MAY HAVE DEVOTED TIME IN BEHALF OF A HANDICAPPED AMATEUR.

IT MAY INTEREST YOU TO KNOW THAT RAY STATES WE HAVE CLOSE TO SEVEN HUNDRED OF OUR FRATERNITY WITHOUT SIGHT SCATTERED ABOUT THE WORLD TO SAY NOTHING OF THE MANY WHO MAY CONFINED TO WHEEL CHAIRS, OR DESTINED NEVER TO GET OUT OF BED AGAIN, ALL OF WHOM ARE ENJOYING AMATEUR RADIO.

THE ORGANIZATION HAS NO BY-LAWS, RULES OR REGULATIONS, SEEKS NO FINANCIAL OR MONETARY ASSISTANCE WHATEVER. IT IS SIMPLY A MOVE TO MAKE THOSE OF OUR GREAT FRATERNITY, WHO MAY BE HANDICAPPED, KNOW HOW MUCH WE ALL ADMIRE THEIR EFFORT AND DETERMINATION TO OVERCOME THE HURDLES IN ORDER TO PASS THE LICENSE EXAMS IN ORDER TO GET ON THE AIR.

CERTIFICATES, SEALS, PRINTING, ETC., HAS ALL BEEN ACCOMPLISHED BY KIND HEARTED AMATEURS AND OTHERS IN THE BUSINESS WORLD TO WHOM WE ALL SALUTE.

MANY THANKS FOR THE FINE ISSUES OF BLABBER MOUTH. LIKE GOOD WHISKEY, IT SEEMS TO GET BETTER WITH AGE. HI! AT THE OLD TIMERS DINNER LAST SATURDAY NIGHT PUT ON BY THE WASHINGTON CHAPTER OF QSWA, GEORGE, WIAE WAS THERE AND WE HAD QUITE A QSO.OH YES, GUESS WHO WON THE \$150.00 DOOR PRIZE. OLD GEORGE WZALS. WZLAE WAS THERE. OL DOCTOR HEISING GAVE A TWO HOUR TALK ON THE FIRST RADIO TELEPHONE AT NAA IN 1915. IT WAS A SELL OUT ABOUT 170.

EARL, HERE IS AN OLD SNAPSHOT OF AN ARMY AIR FORCE STATION WE HAD CHARGE OF IN 1921. MAYBE YOU COULD PUT IT IN BLABBER MOUTH OR SPARK GAP TIMES. LET'S SEE IF ANY OF THE BOYS CAN REMEMBER THE GEAR. THIS STATION WAS OPERATED ON 360 METERS BUT AT NIGHT WE WOULD DROP TO 200 METERS. ISSUES OF QST FROM 1921-1923 HAD QUIRES ABOUT THIS STATION; THE LAST ONE WAS IN THE 1923 ISSUE OF QST THAT A PHOTO OF OLD WNP FROZEN AT THE GREENLAND BASE ON THE COVER. THE GEAR IS AN SCR 109 XMITTER, CW, MCW AND PHONE. THE RECEIVER IN THE CENTER IS AN OLD 1420-C LOANED BY THE NAVY. NEXT TO IT IS A TWO STAGE AMPLIFIER, THEN THE OLD SCR 67-A WITH THE MAGNAVOX SPEAKER. COST \$75.00 FROM THE SQUADRON MESS FUND. THIS STATION WAS OPERATED FROM A BANK OF BATTERIES NOT SHOWN.



THE SUPPLEMENTS CONTAINED ADDITIONS, ALTERATIONS AND CORRECTIONS FOR COMMERCIAL, GOVERNMENT, EXPERIMENTAL, SPECIAL AND AMATEUR STATIONS. SUPPLEMENT NO. 1 WAS DATED OCTOBER!, 1913: SUPPLEMENT NO. 2 WAS DATED JANUARY 1, 1914 AND SUPPLEMENT NO. 3 WAS DATED APRIL 1, 1914.

I AUGUST, 1962

SPARK-GAP TIMES, #9, June I, 1962. HIS REFERENCES TO THE GREAT WHITE FLEET (UNITED FRUIT COMPANY) AND THE WIRELESS EQUIPMENT ABOARD IT'S BOATS, AMUSED ME AND BROUGHT TO MIND HAPPY AND CAREFREE DAYS ABOARD THE SANTA MARTA, SIXAOLA AND TENADORES.

Two of the nicest guys in the world were with me on the first two ships. They are Harold Bergman and Jerry Potts, both of whom I understand are now deceased.

I REGRET THAT MY MEMORY DOES NOT GO BACK TO 1915 VERY WELL, BUT I THINK WE HAD FESSENDEN EQUIPMENT ON THE TENADORES (WHERE MY ASSIGNMENT WAS VERY SHORT) AND NATIONAL ELECTRIC ON THE OTHER TWO SHIPS, ALTHOUGH I COULD BE 100 % WRONG IN EACH INSTANCE. I DO REMEMBER, HOWEVER, THAT WE HAD QUENCHED SPARK GAPS, AND I REMEMBER VERY CLEARLY HOW WE USED TO DISASSEMBLE THESE CONTRAPTIONS AND CLEAN AND SANDPAPER THE DISCS SO AS TO TRY TO GET A CLEAR 500 CYCLE NOTE SUCH AS THE ZACAPA HAD. THE ZACAPA'S NOTE WAS THE MODEL OR PATTERN WHICH ALL TROPICAL RADIO OPERATORS STROVE TO EQUAL.

I ALSO REMEMBER WELL THE BIG FLAT TOP ANTENNAS. ONE TIME, WHILE DISCHARGING A CARGO OF BANANAS AT PIER 9, North River, I remember that we lowered the ANTENNA, PULLED IT OVER ONTO THAT ROASTING HOT ROOF OF THE PIER. AND RENEWED ALL OF THE WIRES.

I ALSO REMEMBER THE METICULOUS CARE AND ATTENTION THAT WE GAVE TO OUR BANKS OF STORAGE BATTERIES. THEY WERE THE NICKEL-IRON EDISON TYPE AND THE CAPS AND CONNECTORS SHOWN BRIGHT-LY FROM THE POLISHING THAT WE GAVE THEM. IN THOSE DAYS, THE FRONT OFFICE JUDGED, TO A GREAT DEGREE, AN OPERATOR'S EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS, BY THE APPEARANCE OF HIS STORAGE BATTERIES.

ONE OTHER POINT ALWAYS COMES TO MIND IN CONNECTION WITH THE GREAT WHITE FLEET AND PARTICULARLY THE S.S. SIXAOLA. THERE WAS A LARGE VENTILATOR AT EACH SIDE OF THE WIRELESS SHACK. THESE VENTILATORS CAME UP FROM THE BANANA HOLDS AND THEY SERVED ALSO AS AN EXCELLENT ESCAPE ROUTE FOR TARANTULAS. WHILE THEIR ESCAPE WAS NOT FREQUENT, FROM TIME-TO-TIME WE FOUND ONE OF THE DEADLY SO AND SOS IN THE SHACK AND WE WERE ALWAYS CONCIOUS OF THEM.

I ALSO RECALL HOW, WHEN LOADING BANANAS, WE USED TO GET TWO STEMS AND HANG THEM IN THE MOTOR-GENERATOR ROOM. ON ONE STEM, THE BANANAS WOULD BE HARD AND GREEN. THE OTHER STEM CONTAINED BANANAS THAT HAD RIPENED ON THE TREES. WE WOULD EAT THE RIPE BANANAS GOING NORTH AND THE GREEN BANANAS, NOW RIPENED, GOING SOUTH. I HAVEN Y EATEN ONE COMPLETE BANANA SINCE.

ONE OTHER POINT STRIKES ME EACH DAY I READ ABOUT EXTENSIVE PREPARATIONS THAT ARE NOW UNDERTAKEN TO TRACK HURRICANES, - AND TO COMPARE THE INFORMATION GIVEN OUT NOW, WITH THAT WE HAD TO GET ALONG WITH IN THOSE DAYS. I REMEMBER WHENEVER WE WERE ABOUT TO LEAVE SANTIAGO, CUBA, THE CAPTAIN WOULD ALWAYS COME AFT AND CHECK WITH US FOR WEATHER INFORMATION, DURING THE HURRICANE SEASON. IF THERE WAS A HURRICANE COMING IN FROM THE SOUTHEAST, HE WOULD USE HIS BEST JUDGEMENT, COUPLED WITH OUR BEST INFORMATION, AND DECIDE WHETHER HE HAD TIME TO GET OVER TO THE ISLAND OF JAMAICA, OR WAIT UNTIL THE STORM PASSED OVER. SOMETIMES WE WOULD SCRAM FOR JAMAICA AND GET UNDER THE LEA OF THE ISLAND UNTIL IT PASSED OVER, THEN COME ALL THE WAY AROUND AND INTO KINGSTON WHEN IT WAS SAFE. AT OTHER TIMES WE DARED NOT VENTURE OUT OF SANTIAGO'S HARBOR. ONE TIME WE TRIED TO MAKE IT TO JAMAICA BUT WE GUESSED WRONG AND GOT NAILED HALF WAY ACROSS. AT THAT TIME, ONE OF THE FLEET, SAILING OUT OF NEW ORLEANS, WAS NAILED BY THE SAME STORM AND NOT AN OAR, BOX OR MATCHSTICK, MUCH LESS A FEW HUNDRED PASSENGERS WAS EVER FOUND. --- NOW LET ME ASK PERCE OR ANYBODY ELSE WHAT THEY KNOW ABOUT A DEAD SPOT IN THE WINDWARD PASSAGE. 73,

In this issue appeared an article "A Modern Wireless Telegraph Station" by W.S. wilson, Class of June, 1914. I am enclosing a typed copy of this story and perhaps you may use it in a future issue of SPARK-GAP TIMES.

AS I HELD A FIRST CLASS COMMERCIAL TELEGRAPH LICENSE AT THE TIME I WENT TO SEA AS WIRELESS OPERATOR THAT SUMMER AND SERVED ABOARD SEVERAL SHIPS OF THE MERCHANTS AND MINERS TRANSPORTATION COMPANY, SAILING BETWEEN PHILADELPHIA AND SAVANNAH AND JACKSONVILLE. AFTER MANY TRIPS ON MANY SHIPS EAST COASTWISE, EUROPE AND SOUTH AMERICA, I WOUND UP AS ELECT. 2012 CL USN DURING WWI. AFTER I DISCARDED THE BELL-BOTTOMED PANTS I RETURNED HOME AND BUILT DELAWARE'S FIRST COMMERCIAL RADIO BROADCASTING STATION, WHAV, (LATER CHANGED TO WDEL).

I WANT TO THANK YOU FOR SENDING ME SPARK-GAP TIMES AND I ENJOY READING THE MANY INTERESTING STORIES.

A MODERN WIRELESS TELEGRAPH STATION By W. S. WILSON

THE INTERCEPTION AND TRANSMISSION OF WIRELESS MESSAGES IS ON OF THE MOST MODERN AND GREATEST SCIENTIFIC WORKS EVER INVENTED. AS IT WOULD BE IMPOSSIBLE TO GIVE A COMPLETE DESCRIPTION OF ALL WIRELESS APPARATUS, I SGAL ENDEVOR TO PRESENT A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE MODERN WIRELESS STATION, WHICH IS USED FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES BY THE MARCONI WIRELESS TELEGRAPH COMPANY, OF AMERICA.

FIRST, ALL COMMERCIAL WIRELESS TELEGRAPH STATIONS ARE COMPOSED OF TWO MAIN SETS, NAMELY, THE RECEIVING SET AND THE TRANSMOTTING SET. BOTH SETS OF APPARATUSES ARE BASED ON THE SAME THEORITUCAL PRINCIPLES, AS ONE SET IS USED TO SEND THE WAVES, THE OTHER, TO RECEIVE THEM. BUT THE OPERATION AND WORKING OF THESE SETS DIFFER GREATLY.

THE RECEIVING SET CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING INSTRUMENTS: THE LOOSE COUPLER AND LOOSE COUPLES APPARATUS, THE VARIABLE AND FIXED CONDENSERS, THE MINERAL DETECTORS, THE AUDION VALVE RECETIFIER, THE PHONES, AND THE STORAGE CELLS. THE OSCILLATORY WAVES SENT BY THE TRANSMITTER OR TRANSMITTING STATION ARE IMMEDIATELY CAUGHT BY A SET OF COPPER WIRES, OR OTHER NON-MAGNETIC WIRES, WHICH IS SUSPENDED IN THE AIR.

From the Aerial the waves pass through the variable condensers and the close and loose coupled apparatus. These two instruments are of great importance on account of the inductance which they produce. They are commonly called tuners, as they tend to tune in or out several stations sending at the same time so that one station may be heard, thereby preventing interefrence. After the waves have been induced through the coupling and the variable condensers they are rectified by the mineral detector or by the audion bulb rectifier. The mineral detector is composed of a mineral such as silicon, zincite, pyrites or some other mineral which has the power of rectification. The waves are also rectified by the audion bulb detector.

1 AUGUST. 1962

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THE AUDION BULB DETECTOR IS A VERY DELICATE INSTRUMENT AND ALSO VERY SENSITIVE. IT IS MADE OF A VACUUM BULB IN WHICH IS PLACED A THIN METALLIC PLATE ABOUT AN INCH SQUARE. ON ONE SIDE OF THIS PLATE IS A COIL OF NICKEL WIRE AND ON THE OTHER SIDE IS A SMALL CARBON FILAMENT. THE CARBON FILAMENT IS LIGHTED BY MEANS OF A STORAGE CELL AND A NEGATIVE FLOW OF ELECTRICITY IS APPLIED TO THE METALLIC PLATE. THE WAVES APPROACH AND PASS THROUGH THE NICKEL COIL AND ARE RECTIFIED BY THE METALLIC PLATE WHEN THE CARBON FILAMENT IS LIGHTED BRIGHTLY AND THE NEGATIVE CURRENT FLOWS STRONGLY ENOUGH.

THE RECTIFIED WAVES THEN PASS TO THE PHONES. THE PHONES MUST BE VERY SENSITIVE AND SHOULD BE WOUND TO A RESISTANCE OF ONE OR TWO THOUSAND OHMS. AS THE RESISTANCE IS SO HIGH THE WAVES ARE STRONG ENOUGH TO PRODUCE A VIBRATION OF THE DIAPHRAM AND A SOUND IS PRODUCED. THIS SOUND IS DOTS AND DASHES, AND MUST BE TRANSLATED BY THE OPERATOR.

THE SENDING OR TRANSMITTING SET IS COMPOSED OF THE STEP-UP TRANSFORMER, THE TRANSMITTING CONDENSERS, THE STATIONARY OR ROTARY SPARK GAPS, OSCILLATION TRANSFORMER, HOT WIRE AMMETER, KICK-BACK PREVENTER AND KEY. IF 110 V.A.C. IS NOT AVAILABLE, A DYNAMO OR A MOTOR-GENERATOR SET MUST BE INSTALLED.

THE OSCILLATORY WAVES ARE SENT IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER. THE 110 V.A.C. IS SENT INTO THE PRIMARY OF THE STEP-UP TRANSFORMER BY MEANS OF PRESSING THE KEY. A GREAT MAGNETIC FIELDS IS PRODUCED AROUND THE CLOSE CORE BY THE ALTERNATING CURRENT CIRCULATING AROUND IT IN THE PRIMARY CIRCUIT. ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE CORE IS WOUND THE SECONDARYSECTION. THOUSANDS OF TURNS OF VERY FINE WIRE, ABOUT NO. 32 B & S GAUGE ARE USED SO AS TO RAISE THE VOLTAGE BUT OWER THE AMPERAGE. THUS THE VOLTAGE IS RAISED FROM 110 TO 20,000 or 30,000 volts. THE LARGE TRANSMITTING CONDENSER IS PLACED DIRECTLY ACROSS THE TERMINALS OF THE SECONDARY. THE OSCILLATIONS COMING FROM THE SECONDARY OF THE TRANSFORMER PASS INTO THE CONDENSER. AS SOON AS THE CONDENSER IS CHARGED TO IT'S FULL CAPACITY, IT IMMEDIATELY DISCHARGES ACROSS THE ROTARY OR STATIONARY SPARK GAP. THESE DISCHARGES OCCUR THOUSANDS OF TIMES EVERY MINUTE.

THE OUTPUT OF THE SPARK GAP IS CONNECTED TO THE OSCILLATION TRANSFORMER AND TUNING CONDENSER. THE OSCILLATION TRANSFORMER IS A DOUBLE HELIX AND IS MAINLY USED TO INDUCE THE HIGH VOLTAGE INTO THE AERIAL AND GROUND. THE HOT WIRE AMMETER IS PLACED IN SERIES WITH THE AERIAL WIRE AND REGISTERS THE AMOUNT OF CURRENT PASSING INTO THE AERIAL. BY VARYING THE NUMBER OF TURNS OF WIRE ON THE OSCILLATION TRANSFORMER, THE WAVE LENGTH MAY BE CHANGED.

THE MODERN WIRELESS TELEGRAPH SETS CAN SEND AND RECEIVE MESSAGES THOUSANDS OF MILESS AND ARE USED TO THE GREATEST ADVANTAGE TO SHIPS AND LAND STATIONS ALL OVER THE WORLD.

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
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
