

I KNOW THAT YOU HAVE HEARD THE KPH TAPE PRE-PARED BY THORN MAYES, WEAX, AND DICK JOHNSTONE IN THAT TAPE THE MAIN PART WAS THE SENDING OF PRESS BY DICK AND OF COURSE PART OF THE PRESS WAS ABOUT THE PREPARADNESS DAY BOMBING. JULY 17, 1916...LEFT HONOLULU FOR SAN FRANCISCO AT FIVE P.M. ALL OUR HONOLULU FRIENDS DOWN TO WITNESS THE SAILING AND TO WISH US ALOHA AND BON VOYAGE. NO MAIL RECEIVED, GUESS OUR MAIL IS ON THE MATSONIA WHICH ARRIVES TOMORROW. MORGAN, OUR CHIEF STEWARD HAS A TERRIFFIC STEW ON AND IS RECITING LOVE BALLADS TO RILEY. JULY 19, 1916...WEARING HALF WHITES TODAY. SHIP STILL GOING SLOWER. LAFFERTY IS BUSY POLISHING THE BRASS WORK. RECEIVING SET ON THE BLINK AND HAVE TO RELAY ALL OF OUR TRAFFIC.

JULY 20, 1916...FIRE-DRILL THIS AFTERNOON.

MY WATCH BELOW SO MISSED TWO HOURS SLEEP.

LAFFERTY HAPPY BECAUSE DRILL HAPPENED ON
HIS WATCH. HE HATES TO LOOSE SLEEP AS THAT,
IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT THINGS IN HIS
LIFE, NEXT TO EATING BREAKFAST. RELAYED
OUR TRAFFIC VIA THE CAPTAIN A.F. LUCAS, WTV
IMPOSSIBLE TO WORK KPH DIRECT.

JULY 21, 1916... WEATHER PRETTY COLD TODAY. MISSIONARY PASSENGERS STILL PLAYING DECK GOLF. WILL BE GLAD WHEN WE GET TO SAN FRANCISCO.

JULY 22, 1916...VERY STRONG NORTHEAST GALE BLOWING. ONLY MADE 280 MILES YESTERDAY. ALL HANDS BUSY POLISHING BRASS SO WE WILL HAVE A GOOD LOOKING SHACK WHEN WE GET TO

SEEM TO BE IN ORDER. ARTICLE 4 SEEMS TO BE
SOMEWHAT CONFLICTING. I BELIEVE THAT THE LAST
PARA. SHOULD READ. "THE PRESIDENT SHALL APPOINT
ONE OF THE DIRECTORS TO SERVE AS CHAIRMAN OF
THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS." THE PRESIDENT IS AN
ELECTED OFFICER AND IS NOT A MEMBER OF THE
BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

ARTICLE 5 AS PROPOSED AMMENDED SEEMS A BIG CONFUSING TO ME. THE SECOND PARA. SHOULD READ SOMEWHERE IN THERE THAT THE PRES. TO APPOINT THE ASS'T SEC. NO PROVISION FOR SUCH APPOINTMENT SHOWS IN EITHER THE CONSTITUTION OR THE PROPOSED AMMENDMENTS. I BELIEVE IT WOULD BE THE DUTIES OF THE SEC. TO POLL THE ELECTED OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS IN THE EVENE OF THE VICE-PRES. TAKING OVER ETC. THIS PART OF PARA. SHOULD READ "CHAIRMAN". YOU HAVE THE PRES. AS VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD UP IN ARTICLE 4 BUT IF HE VACATES THE OFFICE HOW CAN HE ACT AS VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD TO

TO FILL A VACANCY. THE NEXT PARA. SHOULD READ "A VICE-PRES. PRO-TEM SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE NEW PRESIDENT SUBJECT TO APPROVAL OF THE ELECTED OFFICERS AND THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS BY A MAJORITY VOTE."

THIS METHOD OF FILLING THE SEC-TRES. POSITION SHOULD LIKEWISE BE IN EFFECT. THE TIME LIMIT CAN BE ELIMINATED AND THE VOTE OBTAINED BY PRESIDENT POLLING THE REST OF THE ELECTED OFFICERS AND THE DIRECTORS. LET PARA. A.B. AND C. STAND AS IT IS.

ARTICLE 6 AS PROPOSED IN THE AMMENDMENTS SEEMS A LITTLE BIT CONFUSING BY MY ANCIENT BRAIN?? IT SEEMS THAT ANY AMMENDMENT BY THE UNANIMOUS VOTE OF THE ELECTED OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHOULD BE NULLIFIED IF 2/3 VOTE OF THE MEMBERSHIP IN 30 DAYS WOULD BE MORE IN ACCORDANCE WITH PRINCIPALS OF GOV'T OF CORPORATIONS. THIS VOTE WOULD BE WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF ANNOUNCEMENT. AS FOR CHANGE OF AMMENDMENTS BY MEMBERSHIP, I BELIEVE THAT ANY GROUP OF 10, 15 OR 20 MEMBERS, WHICHEVER, DECIDED, COULD SUBMIT AN AMMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION. THE AMMEND-MENT WOULD BE SUBMITTED TO THE SECRETARY WHO IN TURN SUBMITS TO THE ELECTED OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR THEIR UNANIMOUS APPROVAL, THE SAME PROCEDURE THAT EVOLVES WHEN AN AMMENDMENT IS SUBMITTED BY THE ELECTED OFFICERS-BOARD OF DIRECTORS. THE AMMENDMENT SUBMITTED BY THE MEMBERSHIP GROUP TO APPROVED IN THE SAME MANNER, BY A 2/3 VOTE OF THE REST OF THE MEMBERSHIP.

ARTICLE 7 SEEMS TO BE TOO BROAD TO ME. BELIEVE THE ORIGINAL READING OF THIS ARTICLE UNDER NR 8 IN THE ORIGINAL CONSTIT-UTION IS MORE FITTING. THE WAY ARTICLE 7 NOW READS AS AMMENDED OCT. 1, 1963, LEAVES THE DOOR OPEN FOR A LOT OF UNQUALIFIED MEMBERS GETTING IN. THIS OUTFIT IS REALLY SOMETHING TO BE PROUD OF IN MEMBERSHIP AND WE SHOULD MAKE IT SO THAT ONLY THOSE WHO ARE REALLY "PIONEERS OF AMATEUR WIRELESS" MAY BECOME MEMBERS. UNDER THE PRESENT READING OF ARTICLE 7 WE COULD CITE A CASE WHERE SOMEONE SERVED A HITCH IN THE NAVY IN 1924 AS A RADIOMAN. HE THEN GOT HIS DIS-CHARGE AND WENT TO WORK AS A FULLER BRUSH MAN, DOOR TO DOOR. IN 1959 OR LATER HE SUDDENLY DECIDES TO BECOME AN AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR, AFTER TALKING WITH ANOTHER HAM. WHILE TRYING TO SELL HIS WARES. UNDER THE PRESENT READING OF ARTICLE 7, THIS BOY WOULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP WOULD HE NOT??..

IS HE A REAL PIONEER OF AMATEUR WIRELESS IN

THE TRUE SENSE??

THIS SAME SITUATION MIGHT COME UP WHERE SOMEONE BOOTLEGGED A STATION IN 1915 FOR A WHILE. HE QUITS, GIVES UP WIRELESS AL-TOGETHER. THEN LONG ABOUT 1939-40 HE DECIDES TO GET A LICENSE AND GET ON THE AIR. WHICH HE DOES. IS HE ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP?? I CAN CITE ANOTHER CASE. A MAN OBTAINS A COMMERCIAL LICENSE AND OP-ERATES FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS, AS A COM-MERCIAL OPERATOR, HE NEVER HAS A HAM STATION UNTIL HE RETIRES FROM THE COMMERCIAL FIELD IN 1955. EUNICE, THERE IS SO MUCH TO WRITE ABOUT, I HARDLY KNOW WHERE TO START BUT WILL HAVE TO CUDGEL MY COMPUTER TO COME UP WITH A FEW ANECDOTES IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

AT PRESENT, I READ WITH GREAT INTEREST THE LETTERS FROM THE OOT'S. MOSTLY LOOKING FOR ANY OF MY OLD COMPADRES. I DO REMEMBER ONE TIME WHEN SEVERAL SHIPS WERE DOCKED AT THE SAME PIERS IN NY, I WENT ABOARD THE OLD SS FINLAND WHERE HARRY WRIGHT WAS CH.OP. AND FRANK GEISEL (FIRST LETTER SHOULD BE G) WHOM KNEW IN SAN FRANCISCO ALSO. OF COURSE WE HAD A FINE QSO. HARRY ASKED ME IF I WAS INTERESTED IN GOING OUT TO SEE THE LAYOUT OF A WELL KNOWN AMATEUR .. R. K. HEWITT. SO WE HEADED OUT (BROOKLYN, I THINK) AND FOUND HIM AT HOME. THE OUTSTANDING THING I REMEMBER WAS THAT HIS ENTIRE TRANSMITTER WAS IN A COVERED OVER HOLE IN THE GROUND IN HIS BASE-MENT! HAD RIDDEN REPEATERS WITH ALL THE HIGH SPEED STUFF .. AP. UP. INS. BANK LEASES, STOCK LEASES AND SEVERAL VERY HIGH SPEED TEST WIRE CIRCUITS WHERE, IF YOU COULD NOT WORK 50 WPM, YOU HAD BETTER STAY OUT AS THE USUAL SPEED WAS 60 OR 65. ANYWAY I HAD STUDIED E.E.BUCHERS BOOK AND WAS READY FOR ANYTHING .. I WAS LIVING IN AMARILLO, TEXAS AT THAT TIME, BEING JUST OUT OF THE ARMY. SO I HAD TO TELL DICK THAT I DID NOT HAVE MY LICENSE YET. HE TOLD ME TO GO GET THE TICKET AND THEN COME BACK AFTER A JOB!

I WENT UP TO THE OLD CUSTOM HOUSE AND MET MAJOR DILLON, EX. SIG. CORPS. AND BERNARD LINDEN (BRAND NEW INSPECTOR) AND TOOK MY EXAM. GOT THE TICKET THAT AFTERNOON! TOOK IT DOWN TO JOHNSTONE AND HE ASSIGNED ME AS SECOND OPERATOR ON OLD WGP. FOR TWO MONTHS..AT SEA, I WAS SEASICK..ASHORE I WAS O.K.! OH, YES, I WONDER IF DICK REMEMBERS THAT HE OFFERED ME THE L.L. JOB FROM KPH TO SF?? I WANTED TO GO TO SEA..NO MORE LL FOR ME.

AFTER A NUMBER OF ASSIGNMENTS, I WENT TO THE EAST COAST WHERE I MADE TEN YEARS OF ROUND THE WORLD TRIPS, EUROPE, THE ORIENT, A YEAR IN THE MEDITERRANEAN DURING THE TURKO-GREEK WAR, WHICH I SAW A LITTLE OF FROM SMYRNA, TURKEY.

SINCE I HAD TO TAKE ALL MY LAUNDRY TO A LAUNDRY, I DID NOT HAVE TIME TO TRANSFER THE RADIO EQUIPMENT .. THE NAVY 5 KW SPARK TRANSMITTER .. SO THE COMPANY DECIDED TO SEND THE TOWBOAT OUT WITHOUT RADIO. MY "LUCKY STAR" WAS WORKING, AS, AFTER SOME DAYS ATTACHED TO THE DISABLED SHIP AND IN A TYPICAL NORTH PACIFIC GALE. 

IT MAY BE OF INTEREST, FOR YOUR RECORDS IF I UPDATE MY STATISTICS TO COVER THE PAST YEAR SINCE JOINING THE OOTC.

FIRST OF ALL, I WENT TO TO THE FCC DETROIT OFFICE AND OBTAINED MY AMATEUR EXTRA CLASS LICENSE WHICH IS DATED MAY 27, 1965.

NOVEMBER 1, 1965, I RETIRED WITH PENSION FROM THE PLANT ENGINEERING DEPT. OF MICHIGAN BELL TELEPHONE CO. AFTER 39 YEARS AND 8 MONTHS SERVICE.

WE TOOK A 5 WEEK TRIP SOUTH THIS WINTER TO FLORIDA, NEW ORLEANS AND THE MARDI GRAS, THEN TO GALVESTON, TEXAS.

MY PURPOSE IN GOING TO GALVESTON WAS TO SATISFY MY CURIOSITY AND NOT TO ENJOY THEIR WEATHER. WE HAVE COLD WEATHER IN MICHIGAN TOO.

BACK IN MARCH 1922 I SHIPPED ON THE U.S.B. TUG BUTTERCUP, KIJT IN NEW ORLEANS AND OUR MISSION WAS TO GO TO GALVESTON AND TOW THE OLD CONCRETE SHIP SELMA OUT TO HER GRAVE.

THE SS SELMA WAS ONE OF THE FIRST RE-INFORCED CONCRETE TANKERS BUILT FOR THE U. S. SHIPPING BOARD.

IN 1921 IT RAN INTO THE ROCK JETTIES AT TAMPICO, MEXICO RIPPING A BIG HOLE IN THE HULL. RAISED AND FLOATED BY COMPRESSED AIR PONTOONS IT WAS BERTHED AT THE WHARF AT GALVESTON AND WHARFAGE WAS RUNNING \$1500. PER MONTH. SO OUR JOB WAS TO GET RID OF HER. REPAIRS TO THE HULL WERE NOT FEASIBLE. A PROPOSAL TO SINK IT IN DEEP WATER WAS ABANDONED BECAUSE OF THE COST AND DIFFICULTY OF FLOATING IT OUT THAT FAR AND IF THINGS DIDN'T WORK OUT PERFECTLY IT MIGHT BE A MENACE TO NAVIGATION. IT WAS DECIDED TO LOWER IT INTO A "GRAVE" IN THE SAND FLATS AT ONE SIDE OF THE GOVERNMENT CHANNEL ENTERING GALVESTON. A 400 FOOT BY 30 FT. CHANNEL WAS DUG AND WE TOWED THE OLD SELMA OUT AND LET HER DOWN. IT'S DECK AND UPPER WORKS WERE STILL ABOVE WATER.

Now after 44 years, I went back to see the old ship. Went to the Coast Guard and

THEY POSTED ME AS TO THE CONDITION OF THE OLD TANKER AND WE SAW IT STILL OUT THERE ABOUT THE SAME IN APPEARANCE AS WHEN WE LEFT HER IN 1922.

HOPE THIS NOSTALGIA DIDN'T BORE YOU TOO MUCH.





2 LOCK WAY-NUT FOR FASTENING RETTYSNITCH TO A TRIODELTRON.




SPARK COIL AND MERCURY INTERRUPTER EQUIPMENT USED AT STANISLAUS COLLEGE

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY

FR. J. SLATTERY. C.M.

IN 1904 FR. JOSEPH SLATTERY PIONEERED OVERLAND RADIO TRANSMISSION IN AUSTRALIA AT ST. STANISLAUS COLLEGE, BATHURST. HIS FIRST EXPERIMENTS WERE CONDUCTED IN THE COLLEGE GROUNDS WHERE HE DID THE TRANSMITTING AND FR. M. O'REILLY WITH MR. JOHN KING AT THE RECEIVING END. WITH THIS SUCCESS HE THEN TRANSMITTED FROM THE COLLEGE TO THE TOWER OF ST. MICHAEL AND JOHN'S CATHEDRAL, A DISTANCE OF 3/4 MILE. EMBOLDENED BY HIS SUCCESS HE THEN SENT A'MEDSAGE FROM THE COLLEGE TO THE CATHOLIC PRESBYTERY AT KELSO, A DISTANCE OF 3 MILES. AT THE RECEIVING END OF THIS EXPERIMENT WERE FATHERS FLANAGAN AND O'REILLY C.M. WE HOLD THAT FATHER SLATTERY WAS ONE OF THE FIRST, IF NOT THE FIRST, TO SUCCESSFULLY TRANSMIT RADIO OVERLAND IN AUSTRALIA.

W2USA/ TV
NEW YORK WORLDS FAIR 1940
BY: ARTHUR H. LYNCH. W4DKJ

Two way television, with voice, was accomplished at the New York Worlds Fair in 1940, for the first time in history. It is very interesting to note that this remarkable achievement was the work of radio amateurs.

TO THE BEST OF MY KNOWLEDGE, THE FEAT WAS NEVER DUPLICATED, SINCE THAT TIME, EVEN COMMERCIALLY, UNTIL THE RECENT ACCOMPLISHMENT, USING TELSTAR!. THERE ARE SOME WHO HAVE QUESTIONED THAT STATEMENT AND WHO POINT TO THE DEBATES BETWEEN KENNEDY AND NIXON, BOTH APPEARING ON MILLIONS OF SCREENS AT THE SAME TIME AND QUESTIONING AND ANSWERING EACH OTHER. REMARKABLE AS THAT WAS, IT WAS NOT IN THE SAME CATEGORY AS THE W2USA/TV WORK, FOR SEVERAL REASONS. FIRST AND FOREMOST IT WAS DONE BY CABLE. THE ONLY PART DONE BY RADIO WAS THE TRANSMISSIONS FROM THE VARIOUS TV STATIONS TO THE HOMES OF THE VIEWERS.

WHILE THE STORY OF W2USA - THE SIX STATION AMATEUR SET-UP AT THE WORLDS FAIR, 1939 - IS "OLD HAT" TO MANY OLD TIMERS, THERE ARE NOW THOUSANDS WHO NEVER HEARD OF IT AND A BRIEF REVIEW IS INDICATED.

ONE OF THE MOST ACTIVE AMATEUR RADIO GROUPS IN THE METROPOLITAN NEW YORK AREA WAS THE GARDEN CITY RADIO CLUB, OF GARDEN CITY, L.I. ONE OF THE OUTSTANDING FEATURES OF THAT CLUB WAS THE FACT THAT IT HAD NO CHARTER, BY-LAWS, NO OFFICERS AND NO REGULAR MEETING TIMES. BY GENERAL CHOICE, STANLEY P. MCMINN, W2WD WAS "HONORARY SECRETARY." *LATER BECAME W4WD AND NOW A "SILENT KEY."

WHEN SEVERAL OF THE "GANG" GOT THEIR
HEADS TOGETHER AND THOUGHT WE SHOULD HAVE
A MEETING, MAC WOULD BE NOTIFIED AND IT
WAS HIS JOB TO PASS THE WORD TO ALL THE
MEMBERS. MOST OF THE MEETINGS WERE SUMPTUOUS
AFFAIRS, INCLUDING COMPLETE BAR SERVICE,
THE MEETING AND THEN ROAST TURKEY AND ROAST
HAM, WITH BEER, WINE OR ALE. AS RULE, SOME
PROMINENT PERSON, WHO HAPPENED TO BE IN THE
NEW YORK AREA, WOULD BE THE GUEST OF HONOR.
THESE MEETINGS GENERALLY TOOK PLACE IN THE
ELABORATE BASEMENT PLAY ROOMS, IN THE HOME
OF FORMER A.R.R.L. HUDSON DIVISION, DIRECTOR
DR. LAWRENCE J. DUNN, THEN W2CLA AND NOW W2LP.

WHEN DR. JOHN S. YOUNG, THE FAMOUS ANNOUNCER, WAS ASKED BY GROVER WHALEN, PRES. OF THE N. Y. WORLDS FAIR., 1939, TO BECOME HEAD OF THE COMMUNICATIONS DEPARTMENT, IT WAS DR. YOUNG'S IDEA THAT AMATEUR RADIO SHOULD HAVE A PROMINENT PLACE IN THE FAIR'S ACTIVITIES. HE COMMUNICATED WITH A.R.R.L AND WAS TOLD THAT DR. DUNN COULD, NO DOUBT, BE OF GREAT ASSISTANCE TO HIM. HE MOST CERTAINLY WAS. AT HIS SUGGESTION, THE WZUSA RADIO CLUB, INC. WAS ORGANIZED. THERE WERE FIVE DIRECTORS: L. M. COCKADAY, W2JCY; C.B. COOPER. FISCAL DIRECTOR; ARTHUR H. LYNCH, W2DKJ, MANAGING DIRECTOR; DR. A. L. WALSH, W2BW AND JOHN S. YOUNG, LIAISON DIRECTOR. THERE WAS A VERY IMPRESSIVE LIST OF "HONORARY MEMBERS" INCLUDING; DR. LEE DEFOREST, PRES. LEE DE FOREST LABORATORIES; PAUL F. GODLEY, PRES RADIO CLUB OF AMERICA; RAYMOND A. HEISING, PRES INSTITUTE OF RADIO ENGINEERS: LENOX R. LOHR, PRES., NATIONAL BROADCASTING COMPANY; ALFRED J. McCosker, Pres., Station WOR; WILLIAM S. McGonigal, Pres., Veteran Wireless Operators ASSOC.; WILLIAM S. PALEY, PRES., COLUMBIA BROADCASTING COMPANY, AND EUGENE C. WOODRUFF, PRES. AMERICAN RADIO RELAY LEAGUE. IN ANY ONE'S BOOK THAT WOULD SEEM TO BE AN IMPRESSIVE GROUP!

ACTUALLY, THE WORK DONE AT THE WORLD'S FAIR BEGAN LONG BEFORE THE FAIR OPENED. FOR INSTANCE, THE FAMOUS "ROUND-THE WORLD - ROUND THE CLOCK" RELAY MESSAGE, TO STATIONS THROUGH - OUT THE WORLD, FROM GROVER WHALEN, WAS SENT EVERY HOUR, ON THE HOUR, FOR TWENTY FOUR HOURS, ON NEW YEARS DAY, 1939, FROM THE FAIR GROUNDS, THROUGH W2DKJ/2, TO MANY RELAY STATIONS, IN THE NEW YORK AREA AND RELAYED BY THEM, ON MOST OF THE AMATEUR BANDS, GIVING US WORLD COVERAGE. WITHIN AN UNBELIEVABLE SHORT TIME, JUST FOUR HOURS, WE RECEIVED A REPLY, FROM A LLAMA PRIEST, IN THIBET.

Unfortunately, the impression was created in some quarters, that all work, from the Fair was to be carried on on 5 meters, which was the frequency (wave length, if you wish) to be used at W2USA, when we received our license. Incidentally, the license was not

RECEIVED UNTIL THE DAY THE FAIR OPENED. ALL COMMUNICATIONS, PRIOR TO THAT WERE HANDLED BY W2DKJ/2, LOCATED AT THE FAIR GROUNDS.

ACTUALLY, WHEN WE WERE COMPLETELY SET UP, WE HAD COMPLETE RECEIVING, TRANSMITTING AND ANTENNA FACILITIES OPERATING ON EVERY AMATEUR BAND THEN AVAILABLE - AND ALL FROM A SINGLE ROOM. IN THE HALL OF COMMUNICATIONS.

Some of the finest operators in the country helped us, both at our temporary "shack" and through their home stations, handling "relays". Ultimately, when we did get our W2USA license, most of our problems were washed out. Because I was able to put in the necessary time to conduct affairs at W2USA, I was chosen Managing Director. Looking back on the Job Done, at that time, I take a great deal of pride in the number of "Firsts" born there. And that brings us to the story of W2USA/TV.

WHILE CONTROLLING THE OPERATION OF W2USA, I WAS OPERATING A RADIO MANUFACTURING BUSINESS AMONG OTHER THINGS, SUCH AS BEING THE NEW YORK REPRESENTATIVE OF THE NATIONAL COMPANY. AS A MEMBER OF THE RADIO MANUFACTURERS ASSOC., I WAS ATTENDING THE ANNUAL "TRADE SHOW", OF RMA, IN CHICAGO. ED BRADDOCK, W3BAY's OF THE AMATEUR DIVISION OF THE RADIO CORP. OF AMERICA AND AN OLD FRIEND OF MINE, INVITED ME TO THE RCA ROOM. TO WITNESS THE DEMONSTRATION OF THE FIRST SHOWING OF A SPECIAL TUBE, WHICH RCA WAS INTRODUCING AMATEUR FOR TV USE. THE SHOW WAS REMARKABLE! FROM THEIR ROOM, IN THE OLD STEVENS HOTEL, THEY WERE ABLE TO PRODUCE RATHER GOOD PICTURES OF BOATS, OUT IN THE LAKE, A COUPLE OF MILES AWAY. RIGHT THEN THE IDEA OF W2USA/TV WAS BORN. MONTHS OF HARD WORK FOLLOWED. AS BRIEFLY AS I CAN TELL IT, WITHOUT LEAVING OUT ANY OF THOSE WHO HELPED TO MAKE IT A SUCCESS, HERE WE GO!

FIRST, WE SECURED THE ASSISTANCE OF LEE WALLER, W2BRO, WHO HAD PUT ON THE SHOW IN CHICAGO. USING SOME OF THE TECHNIQUES, DESCRIBED IN A SERIES OF ARTICLES BY J.B. SHERMAN AND HIMSELF, WHICH HAD APPEARED IN THE MAY, JUNE AND JULY ISSUES OF QST, AND WITH THE COOPERATION OF MY GOOD FRIEND, CLIFF DEBTON, THEN IN CHARGE OF THE RADIO DEPARTMENT OF THE N.Y. DAILY NEWS, SET UP A TRANSMITTER ON THE ROOF OF THE DAILY NEWS

BUILDING, IN NEW YORK AND A RECEIVING RIG, IN OUR "HAM SHACK" IN THE COMMUNICATIONS BUILDING, AT THE FAIR GROUNDS. FRED CUSICK, W2HID, AN ENGINEER WITH CBS, WAS SELECTED TO RUN THAT SHOW. BOY! WHAT A JOB HE DID!! FRED, BY THE WAY, IS STILL VERY ACTIVE AND HAS DONE MUCH TRAVELING WITH THE ARTHUR GODFREY SHOW.

SO, WITH THIS INTRODUCTION, MUCH LONGER THAN I THOUGHT IT WOULD BE, I BELIEVE THE PHOTOS, WITH THEIR CAPTIONS CAN GIVE YOU A FAIR IDEA OF THE JOB, DONE ENTIRELY BY AMATEURS, MORE THAN A QUARTER OF A CENTURY AGO, OF WHICH THEY HAVE EVERY REASON TO BE VERY PROUD!!

ON THE OPENING NIGHT OF THE TWO-WAY TV/VOICE CIRCUIT WAS INAUGURATED AT W2USA, THE FOLLOWING TELEGRAM WAS RECEIVED FROM KENNETH B. WARNER, WIEH, SECRETARY OF THE AMERICAN RADIO RELAY LEAGUE AND EDITOR OF THE ORGANIZATION'S MONTHLY MAGAZINE, QST.

TWO DEAF-MUTES HAVE HELD THE FIRST SIGN LANGUAGE "CONVERSATION" BY RADIO IN NEW YORK BY MEANS OF THE PIONEERING TWO-WAY TELEVISION CIRCUIT SET UP BY RADIO AMATEURS BETWEEN A MANHATTAN SKYSCRAPER AND THE COMMUNICATIONS BUILDING AT THE WORLD'S FAIR. EIGHT MILES AWAY.

BOTH THE TWO-WAY TELEVISION SYSTEM AND DR. GRIFFIN'S OWN UNIT UTILIZE THE NEW ICONOSCOPE TUBE DEVELOPED BY RCA TO PICK UP TELEVISION IMAGES. THIS TUBE. BECAUSE OF ITS HIGH EFFICIENCY AND EXTREMELY LOW PRICE (APPROXIMATELY THAT OF A MICROPHONE). HAS MADE AMATEUR TELEVISION POSSIBLE.


THE "TALK" BY THE DEAF-MUTES WAS BUT ONE OF THE MANY EXPERIMENTS IN TELE-VISION BEING CONDUCTED BY THE FAIR'S AMATEUR RADIO CLUB DURING PUBLIC DEMON-STRATIONS OF THE TWO-WAY SYSTEM SEVERAL TIMES DAILY. MISS BERTHA O'DONNELL OF

THE BRONX, AND MISS ADELE COSTA, OF MANHATTAN. CARRIED ON THE CONVERSATION IN THE SIGN LANGUAGE WHILE INTERPRETERS STOOD BY TO UNFOLD THE TALK TO BYSTANDERS IN BOTH STUDIOS. THE IMAGE DEFINITION WAS VERY GOOD, VIEWERS ASSERTED, AND THE WOMEN "TALKED" WITH THE SAME EASE AS IF THEY HAD BEEN IN THE SAME ROOM.

MR. GRIFFIN TOLD OF HIS NEW RECEIVER UNIT IN A LETTER TO EDWARD BRADDOCK, RCA AMATEUR RADIO SALES MANAGER. HE SAID THAT ALTHOUGH THE TELEVISION TRANSMITTER AT THE FAIR IS ONLY 12 MILES FROM THE RADIO CLUBHOUSE. HE ACTUALLY RECEIVED THE TELECAST OF THE DEAF-MUTE CONVERSATION FROM THE DAILY NEWS BUILDING STUDIO, 17 MILES AWAY.

HE ESTIMATED THAT HIS NEW RECEIVER HAS APPROXIMATELY 100 TIMES THE GAIN OF OTHER MODELS. ADDING THAT HE HAS RUN INTO A WHOLE NEW SET OF INTERESTING PROBLEMS BECAUSE OF THE HIGH SENSITIVITY. HE INDICATED HE IS PLANNING OTHER TELEVISION TESTS FROM POINTS IN NEW JERSEY 25 MILES AWAY FROM THE AMATEUR TELEVISION STATION IN NEW YORK.

HERE'S ONE FOR THE BOOK

MY LITTLE 'PLUG' FOR THE QRP INTERNATIONAL RADIO CLUB, ELSEWHERE IN THIS ISSUE, BRINGS TO MIND A HUMOROUS INCIDENT WHICH PROBABLY IN-FLUENCED ME, AT LEAST SUB-CONSCIOUSLY, TO REMAIN A 'LOW POWER MAN' DURING ALL OF MY HAM CAREER! FACT....I'VE NEVER HAD A TUBE TRANSMITER OF AS MUCH AS 100 WATTS AND IN THE OLD SPARK DAYS, MY GREATEST POWER WAS A QUARTER GALLON!

I WAS 8 DAG IN CINCINNATI IN 1922 WHEN I WAS NOTIFIED THAT I HAD PASSED THE EXAMINATION FOR FEDERAL RADIO INSPECTOR AND WOULD PROBABLY RECEIVE APPOINTMENT TO FILL THE NEXT VACANCY. I WAS OPERATING A 900 CYCLE \(\frac{1}{4} \) KW FRENCH AIRPLANE RIG (SURPLUS FROM WW-I) AT THE TIME. WITH APPOINTMENT AS A RADIO INSPECTOR APPARENTLY IMMINENT, IT LOOKED LIKE I'D BETTER WISE UP TO THESE NEW-FANGLED VACUUM TUBE TRANSMITTERS WITH WHICH I'D DOUBTLESS SOON BE ASSOCIATED.

I HAD BEEN TOYING WITH THE IDEA OF TRYING VT TRANSMISSION, FOR QUITE AWHILE. I HAD HEARD VEM NIGHTLY ON MY LITTLE REINARTZ RECEIVER AND SOME PRETTY UNBELIEVABLE CONTACTS WERE BEING MADE WITH 5 AND 10 WATTERS. MOSTLY USING VT-2 TUBES SCROUNGED FROM WW-1 MILITARY SOURCES. THINKING IN TERMS OF A COUPLE OF THESE BOTTLES I CONTACTED MY NEIGHBORING HAM BUDDY, RUSS BLAIR; I THINK HE WAS 8ER BUT I'M NOT SURE. RUSS SCOFFED AT MY TEN WATT IDEA; HE HAD BEEN A KILOWATT ROCK-CRUSHER HAM BUT HAD RECENTLY GONE OVER TO A COUPLE OF UV-203'S RATED AS 'FIFTY WATTERS', RUNNING THEM IN PARALLEL. THE IMPROVED OPERATION WHICH HE EXPERIENCED OVER HIS OLD KILOWATT ROTARY WAS UNBELIEVABLE BUT INDISPUTABLE. RUSS POURED ON THE PATTER AND EVENTUALLY SOLD ME, BUT WITH SOME MISGIVING, ON DUPLICATING HIS LASH-UP. TOOK A BIT MORE DOUGH THAN I'D FIGURED ON INITIALLY WHAT WITH UV-203'S AT \$30 A THROW; PLUS A 1500 VOLT PLATE TRANSFORMER, HEAVY DUTY RECTIFIER TUBES, AN RCA 'RIBBON' INDUCTANCE AND A LOT OF MINOR ACCESSORY ITEMS. | DROPPED ABOUT \$125, STILL WITH SOME DOUBTS WHETHER IT WOULD PROVE WORTHWHILE.

Anyway, IN DUE TIME I HAD THE THING ALL NICELY MOUNTED AND WIRED. I MUSTERED NERVE ENOUGH TO TRY THE FILAMENT CIRCUITS AND ALL PPEARED WELL; ALL FOUR TUBES LIT UP LIKE AN JRORA BOREALIS WHICH WAS NORMAL ILLUMINATION THEN BUT I JUST COULDN'T SUMMON SUFFICIENT COURAGE TO FLIP THE PLATE SWITCH AND MAYBE KNOCK THE NEEDLE OUT OF A \$7 PLATE MILLIAMETER! SO....I PHONED RUSS AND TOLD HIM THAT WITH HIS

BACKGROUND IN TUBE TRANSMISSION, SLIGHT
THOUGH IT WAS BY THEN, HE'D BETTER COME
OVER AND INITIATE ME INTO THE INTRICACIES
OF TUNING THE THING UP AND GETTING IT
PERKING. HE AGREED WITH ALACRITY AND I
STOOD BY TILL HE ARRIVED.

CONFIDENCE SIMPLY OOZED FROM HIM; A QUICK LOOK AT THE GLOW OF THE FILAMENTS AND HE WAS OFF. HE QUICKLY BUT CASUALLY PULLED CLIPS OFF THE INDUCTANCE. FROWNED FOR A MINUTE IN DEEP THOUGHT AND THEN JABBED THEM HERE AND THERE AROUND THE RIBBON. "THAT OUGHT TO BE SOMEWHERE AROUND 200 METERS; LET'S SEE WHAT SHE'LL DO' AND WITH THAT HE FLIPPED THE PLATE SWITCH. ALL SEEMED WELL BUT IN THOSE DAYS WE KEYED THE CENTER TAP OF THE HIGH VOLTAGE WINDING, SO HE HIT THE KEY. OH! BOY! EMITTING A GRUNT LIKE A HOG IN DISTRESS. ACCOMPANIED BY A BLUSHING! AT THE PLATES OF ALL TUBES AND A SUDDEN DOUBLING OF THE FILAMENT BRILLIANCY. THE RIG JUST GAVE UP .. RIGHT NOW! WE PULLED THE MAIN POWER SWITCH AND BEGAN A GINGERLY 'POKING' PROCESS NEITHER OF US BEING QUITE SURE JUST WHERE TO LOOK OR WHAT TO DO! EARLY IN OUR SEARCH IT OCCURRED TO US TO CHECK THE TUBE FILAMENTS .. THAT DID IT! TWO TUBES AT \$30 EACH WERE NOW JUST SO MUCH BALLAST! AS WHO WAS IT USED TO SAY: "OF FILAMENTS THERE WAS NIX!" THAT DID IT .. VACUUM TUBE TRANSMISSION IN THE HIGH (?) POWER BRACKET WENT OUT THE WINDOW FOR ME RIGHT THEN AND THERE!

WERE YOU REALLY AN OPERATOR?

WHEN THE PLENIPOTENTIARIES OF THE NATIONS OF THE WORLD GOT TOGETHER IN BERNE, SWITZERLAND, IN 1912, TO AGREE ON STANDARD PROCEEDURE IN INTERNATIONAL COMMUNICATION, THEY NOT ONLY AGREED TO ASSIGN CERTAIN LETTERS TO INDIVIDUAL NATIONS, BUT THEY PROVIDED WAYS TO OVERCOME THE LANGUAGE BARRIER, BY THE INTERNATIONAL "Q" SIGNALS.

IT SOON BECAME APPARENT THAT ADDITIONAL SIGNALS SHOULD BE STANDARIZED FOR CONVENTIONAL SIGNALS, AS WELL AS INDIVIDUAL SIGNALS FOR EVERY PUNCTUATION MARK AND VARIOUS LETTERS IN FOREIGN LANGUAGES, SUCH AS THE GERMAN A, O, U, THE FRENCH E, THE SPANISH N AND THE SCANDINAVIAN A. SOMETHING HAD TO BE DONE WITH THE SPANISH GERMAN CH ALSO, AS WELL AS CAREFUL CONSIDERATION OF A STANDARD DISTRESS SIGNAL: AND ALL THE NECESSARY CONVENTIONAL SIGNALS TO EXPEDITE COMMUNICATION AND UNDERSTANDING MANY OF THE OLD TIMERS WILL REMEMBER THE CHARTS THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE PUT OUT,

CONTAINING ALL OF THESE. THEY WERE KNOWN AND UNDERSTOOD BY ALL FIRST CLASS OPERATORS, AND COMMONLY USED IN INTERNATIONAL COMMUNICATION. KNOWLEDGE OF THE CONVENTIONAL SIGNALS WAS QUITE COMMON, BUT IT WAS SELDOM THAT YOU WORKED AN OPERATOR WHO KNEW THE SIGNALS FOR ALL THE PUNCTUATIONS..ALTHOUGH THEY WERE AVAILABLE TO ALL.

ALONG WITH ALL OF THIS WE HAD THAT PROGRESSIVE "BREED OF CATS" KNOWN AS THE "AMERICAN MORSE MEN". THEY HAD INVENTED A FASTER CODE, AND HAD EVEN CREATED A STANDARD SET OF ABBREVIATIONS KNOWN AS "PHILLIP'S CODE". EVERYONE HAD ONE OF THESE LITTLE BOOKS FOR REFERENCE AND IT GREATLY SPEEDED UP SUCH WORK AS ASSOCIATED PRESS WIRES AND STOCK BROKER OPERATORS. HOW MANY OF YOU OLD TIMERS WOULD KNOW WHAT TO HECK WAS GOING ON IF A FAST MORSE WIRE OPENED UP WITH "T SNT CVD WSN TD". THE REAL MORSE MAN WOULD WRITE: THE UNITED STATES SENATE CONVENED IN WASHINGTON TODAY."

QUITE A FEW OF THE BEST CONTINENTAL CODE MEN ALSO USED THESE SIGNALS. SOME OF THEM HAVE

WERE YOU REALLY AN OPERATOR? ... CONTINUED ..

BEEN IN COMMON USE BY HAMS FOR YEARS. THERE ARE ALSO SOME SIGNALS WHICH ARE VERY COMMON BUT MOST OPERATORS NEVER KNEW WHERE THEY CAME FROM. TAKE THE COMMON SK. I NEVER KNEW BUT A FEW OPERATORS WHO KNEW THAT IT WAS BORROWED FROM THE MORSE "30" IT IS THE SAME SIGNAL WITH DIFFERENT SPACING.

LET'S GET DOWN TO CASES. DURING WORLD WAR I, THIS NEW CW WORK WAS CONSIDERED THE ARISTOCRATIC BRANCH OF THE ART. CW OPERATORS WERE SCARCE, ESPECIALLY THOSE WHO UNDERSTOOD THE TRICKS OF THE FOREIGN OPERATORS. QUITE OFTEN THESE FOREIGNERS USED ALL THE ABBRE-VIATIONS. AND TO MAKE IT MORE COMPLICATED THEY FOULED YOU UP SOMETHING AWFUL. PERHAPS THE ENGLISH WOULD USE TWO AS FOR A BAR INDI-CATING A FRACTION. THE FRENCH MIGHT USE TWO IS. OF COURSE YOU WERE CONTINUALLY ENCOUNTER ING THOSE SPECIAL SIGNALS FOR FOREIGN LETTERS. THE MOST COMMONLY UNDERSTOOD ONE BEING THE GERMAN CH. THOSE FOUR DASHES CAME INTO QUITE COMMON USE, BUT IF YOU SUDDENLY HEARD TWO DOTS AND TWO DASHES, YOU HAD TO THINK FAST TO PUT DOWN THAT GERMAN U.

I HAD ONE AMUSING EXPERIENCE. WE WERE DESPERATELY SHORT OF CW COPING OPERATORS AT NED. WE HAD A YOUNG FELOW ON SPARK WHOM I THOUGHT SHOWED CONSIDERABLE PROMISE. HIS NAME WAS CHESLIE C. CHISHOLM. HE WAS AN EX-HAM AND A GOOD ONE. IN THOSE DAYS A MAN WHO MADE CW THOUGHT HE WAS IN THE ELITE 400 CLASS. AFTER TALKING TO THE SKIPPER I ASKED HIM IF HE WOULD LIKE TO TRY OUT FOR CW. THAT WAS A SILLY QUESTION, AND OF COURSE HE WAS ENTHUSED. WE WERE HANDLING A LOT OF TRAFFIC WITH OUR ALLIES AND I KNEW ONE PARTICULAR WATCH WAS COVERING "YN" AT LYONS, FRANCE. I FOUND OUT THEY WERE HETERODYNED ON THE LOW SIDE OF HIM, AND CAREFULLY TUNED ANOTHER RECEIVER WITH THE BEST NOTE ABOVE HIM. SO NOT TO INTERFERE WITH THEM AND SAT "SHORTY" DOWN TO COPY WITH ME. "SHORTY" WAS ONE OF THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO HAD WHAT WE MIGHT CALL AN EXPLOSIVE LAUGH. HE WAS DESPERATELY SERIOUS AND HE PUT THE STUFF DOWN PRETTY WELL, BUT VERY SOON HE CAME TO A WORD "ENEMY . --- . S" THIS WAS HIS FIRST ENCOUNTER WITH A PUNCTUATION MARK. HE HAD SEVERAL LETTERS FOR THAT INVERTED COMMA AND HE LOOKED AT ME PERPLEXED AND ALL OF A SUDDEN BROKE OUT WITH AN EXPLOSIVE LAUGH AND SAID "WHAT TO HECK WAS THAT?"

THIS IS ONLY ONE ILLUSTRATION, BUT LET ME TELL YOU SOMETHING ABOUT THAT YOUNG FELLOW. HE

WAS ON LEAVE FROM THE AMERICAN TEL AND TEL.
CO. IN BOSTON. HE HAD ENLISTED AT THE
BEGINNING OF THE WAR AND HE WAS ONE OF THE
FIRST SPARK MEN AT NED. HE WAS ONE OF THE TOP
BRASS IN THE NAVAL RESERVE UNIT OF BOSTON
AND STAYED IN. DURING WORLD WAR II HE WAS
COMMUNICATION SUPER, OF THE SOUTH PACIFIC
AND WAS VOTED THE MOST POPULAR RADIO OFFICER
IN THE SOUTH PACIFIC.


DURING WORLD WAR II, I INSTALLED RADIO, RADAR AND SONAR ON THE DESTROYERS AT THE BATH IRON WORKS. WE TURNED OUT A DESTROYER ABOUT EVERY TWO WEEKS AND HAD TO DELIVER THEM TO BOSTON, ALONG THE LAST OF THIS I HEARD "SHORTY" WAS BACK IN THE FIRST DISTRICT. WHEN WE ARRIVED AT THE CHARLESTON NAVY YARD. DELIVERING A DESTROYER, I WENT OVER TO THE BUILDING OF THE DISTRICT COMMUNICATION OFFICE AND RAN INTO ROSS REGAN. ROSS HAD BEEN ONE OF THE GANG AT NED DURING WORLD WAR I AND WAS NOW A CHIEF. HE GREETED ME CORDIALLY AND SAID; "DID YOU HEAR ABOUT SHORTY?" | TOLD HIM | HADN'T, HE SMILED AND SAID: "COME WITH ME." WE WENT THROUGH A BIG ROOM FILLED WITH YOEMANETTS AND VARIOUS NAVAL OFFICERS AND I SAW A PRIVATE OFFICE OVER IN THE CORNER. ROSS HID ME BEHIND THE DOOR AND STANDING IN THE DOOR, SALUTED SOME HIGH BRASS AND SAID; "SIR, AN IMPORTANT VISITOR. 11

HE THEN PULLED ME INTO THE DOORWAY, AND THERE SAT "SHORTY". DISTRICT COMMUNICATION SUPERINTENDENT OF THE FIRST NAVAL DISTRICT!

A WILD SCENE FOLLOWED. HE PRACTICALLY JUMPED UP OVER THE DESK AND GRABBED ME. RAGAN HAD ENOUGH SENSE TO CLOSE THE DOOR, BUT IT WAS SURE A NOISY REUNION. "SHORTY" WAS ONE OF THAT SELECT FEW WHO REALLY WERE OPERATORS. IT AMAZED THE OPERATORS TO SEE A TOP BRASS REALLY SIT DOWN AND TAKE A BUSY WATCH. HE HAD HIS OWN PLANE AND A BASE IN AUSTRALIA. HE WROTE ME FREQUENTLY FROM THE SO. PACIFIC DURING THE WAR AND I'LL NEVER FORGET HIS HUMOROUS ACCOUNT OF WHEN HE GOT DISENTARY, AND WHAT HE DID ABOUT IT.

I STILL REMEMBER EVERY ONE OF THOSE PUNC-TUATION SIGNALS, HONESTLY, HOW MANY OF YOU KNOW THE SIGNAL FOR A SEMI-COLON, HYPHEN, COMMAS OR PARENTHESIS?

WELL, I GUESS IT'S JUST THE RECOLLECTION OF AN OLD CODGER WHO HAS BEEN IN THE GAME NEARLY 60 YEARS, AND VAIN ENOUGH TO THINK HE WAS ONCE AN OPERATOR.

AFTER THE ARMISTICE OF NOVEMBER 11, 1918, THE SKIPPER HAD A PHOTOGRAPHER COME TO THE STATION AND HE ASKED ME AS THE FIRST CW MAN ON THE STATION AND CHIEF CHISHOLM TO POSE WITH HIM ON THE STEPS OF THE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING.

AFTER BEING AWARDED THE NAVY CROSS AND A CITATION FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, HE SENT ME AN 8 X 10 PRINT OF THIS PICTURE. ON THE BOTTOM HE WROTE: "To CHIEF HAROLD W. CASTNER, WHO HAS CONTRIBUTED SO MUCH TO THE SUCCESS OF THE STATION. WITH THE REGARDS AND SINCERE APPRECIATION OF HIS COMMANDING OFFICER, ALESSANDRO FABBRI."

THE ORIGINAL OF THIS PICTURE IS IN THE EXTENSIVE RECORD OF THE STATION AT THE NAVAL STATION IN WINTER HARBOR, MAINE.

AT THIS TIME IN 1918, LATER COMMANDER CHISHOLM, HAD JUST BEEN MADE CHIEF RADIOMAN, BUT HE HAD NOT RECEIVED HIS UNIFORM.

LIEUTENANT FABBRI ALSO HAD GROUP PICTURES TAKEN OF THE ENTIRE COMPLEMENT OF RADIO MEN, ON THE 165 FOOT WEST TOWER, AND ALSO A LARGE GROUP OF SUPERNUMERIES IN FRONT OF BARRACKS "B", WHICH INCLUDED THE MARINE DETATCHMENT AND MECHANICS, WATER-TENDERS, COOKS, MESS ATTENDENTS AND THE OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE SUPPLY OFFICE, DENTAL OFFICE AND MEDICAL STAFF.

LIEUTENANT FABBRI DIED IN 1922 OF INFLUENZA AND COMMANDER CHISHOLN BECAME A "SILENT KEY" ALONG ABOUT 1960.




