HOW MANY OF US CAN RECALL QUICKLY THE BASIC TENETS OF THE U.S. CONSTITUTION AND THE BILL OF RIGHTS UNDER WHICH WE LIVE? OUR IDEA OF THEM IS PRETTY VAGUE.

THE SAME GOES FOR THE OOTC CONSTITUTION.

IN JOINING WE ASSUME CERTAIN COMMITMENTS

UNDER THAT DOCUMENT. LET'S REVIEW A FEW.

ARTICLE II

TO BAND TOGETHER IN ONE FRATERNAL ORGANIZATION ----

--OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL MEMBERS, AS WELL AS OTHER INTERESTED AMATEURS TO JOIN IN OOTC ROUND TABLES WHERE-EVER THEY MAY BE.

-- WELCOME ALL MODES OF LEGAL
OPERATION AND ABOVE ALL TO ESTABLISH A FRATERNAL ATMOSPHERE AMONG
ALL AMATEURS REGARDLESS OF CLASS
OR ORIGIN.

ARTICLE IV

THE AFFAIRS OF THE CLUB SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE ELECTED OFFICERS AND APPOINTED DIRECTORS ----

IF FOR ANY REASON WHATEVER, ANY ELECTED OFFICER OR DIRECTOR IS UN-ABLE TO PERFORM THE DUTIES ORDINA-RILY ASSOCIATED WITH HIS OFFICE HE MAY BE REPLACED BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE OTHER ELECTED OFFICERS AND APPOINTED DIRECTORS.

FEW OF US COULD PASS AN EXAM ON OUR CON-STITUTION WITHOUT PREVIOUSLY "CRAMMING". WE NEED REMINDING FROM TIME TO TIME THAT ALL OF US, WHETHER OFFICERS OR MEMBERS, HAVE COMMITMENTS UNDER THAT DOCUMENT.

THAT CONSTITUTION AGAIN

REVISION OF THIS DOCUMENT HAS BEEN UNDER DISCUSSION FOR NEARLY TWO YEARS. NO FINAL ACTION SEEMS LIKELY BEFORE THE END OF 1966. LIKE THE BLUE BOOK, IT IS BEING WORKED ON - IN THIS CASE - STUDIED.

FEW OF US HAVE ANY INTEREST IN ALL THE WHEREASES AND WHEREFORES OF THE INSTRUMENT. MOST OF US WOULD BE SATISFIED TO KNOW THAT IT SERVES AS A PRACTICAL GUIDE TO CLUB CONDUCT AS ONE OFFICER SUCCEEDS ANOTHER. ALL OF US WILL BE SATISFIED WITH CHANGES, IF MADE, WHICH WILL CONTINUE TO PROTECT THE MEMBERSHIP FROM ANY ACTION WHICH MIGHT "PUT OVER" A MEASURE IN DEFIANCE OF CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS.

THE PROBLEM OF ELECTIONS IS UNDER SPECIAL STUDY. AT ONE TIME WE HAD CANDIDATES COM-PETING FOR THE SAME OFFICE. TODAY, WITH THE INCREASED WORK-LOAD PUT ON THE MORE IMPORTANT OFFICERS, MEMBERS ARE RELUCTANT TO VOLUNTEER. THE RESPONSE TO PUBLISHED APPEALS OVER THE PAST YEAR HAS BEEN NEG-LIGIBLE. SHOULD A MEMBER WISH TO "RUN" FOR AN OFFICE, UNDER ARTICLE V HE MUST MAKE KNOWN HIS DESIRES AT LEAST SIX MONTHS PRIOR TO EXPIRATION DATE OF THE INCUMBENT ADMINISTRATION. THIS RESTRIC-TION IS UNDER SERIOUS CONSIDERATION. DOES IT SERVE THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE CLUB? PARTICIPATING IN THE STUDY IS WITN, WHO RECENTLY GOT THE CLUB CHARTER PROPERLY RECORDED. WE SHOULD LOOK TO HIM FOR FUR-THER COUNSEL. MEANTIME THE NON-ELECTED OFFICERS LISTED ON PAGE 1 ARE IN A TENTA-TIVE STATUS AND SUBJECT TO ULTIMATE CON-FIRMATION WHEN A REVISED CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS HAVE BEEN LEGALLY APPROVED.

HIS VERSION:

WIRELESS AND RADIO, BOTH AS A HOBBY AND AS A BUSINESS, HAVE BEEN GOOD TO ME AND I SINCERELY HOPE I CAN GIVE SOMETHING BACK TO IT, ESPECIALLY THE OLD OLD TIMERS BY DOING A GOOD JOB AS SECRETARY/TREASURER FOR THE OOTC WITH THE HELP OF TWO FINE GALS, BOTH NAMED LOVELY MARY.


COMING EVENTS

BEGINNING WITH THIS ISSUE OUR HISTORIAN, ED RASER - W2ZI, IS TO GIVE US A HISTORY OF OOTC IN 20 MORE CAPSULES - ONE COLUMN EACH ISSUE DEVOTED TO ONE YEAR OF HISTORY AFTER 1949. We'll have 6 of these capsule Histories in 1967, 6 in 1968, 6 in 1969, 2 in 1970. What a project! "What a Historian" - We'll all say.

IN JUNE 1967 SPARK GAP TIMES WE HAVE SCHEDULED A "FOUNDERS" ISSUE". THOSE LEFT OF THE THIRTEEN ORIGINAL FOUNDERS WILL BE ASKED TO CONTRIBUTE "CAPSULE" REPORTS RECOUNTING THEIR ACTIVITIES SINCE 1947. Some of the founders have already BEEN ALERTED; OTHERS WILL GET THE "GLAD" NEWS FROM THIS NOTICE.

IN OCTOBER 1967 - THE LAST ISSUE OF SPARK GAP TIMES UNDER THIS EDITORSHIP, WE HAVE SCHEDULED A CHARTER MEMBERS' ISSUE. THIS WILL INCLUDE ITEMS FROM ALL MEMBERS WHO JOINED PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 1950. AGAIN, WE HOPE THIS NOTICE WILL ALERT THEM. 100 WORDS FROM EACH WILL BE REQUESTED. IRONICALLY, THERE WAS NO CLUB CHARTER ON THAT DATE. YET WE HAD "CHARTER" MEMBERS. THEIR PATERNITY WILL NOT BE QUESTIONED, AS THE CLUB FINALLY ACQUIRED ITS CHARTER IN 1966, BESTOWING THE BLESSING OF LEGITIMACY ALL AROUND, THOUGH PERHAPS A BIT LATE.

FEATURES TYPICAL OF SPARK GAP TIMES IN THE PAST ARE SCHEDULED TO BE CONTINUED. NEW ACTIVITIES ARE ALSO PLANNED. IN FACT HERE, AS WITNESS THE CONTENTS OF THIS ISSUE. THE OBJECT IS TO STIMULATE BROADER PARTICIPATION BY MEMBERS. THE NEW DE-PARTMENT - "EXTRACTS FROM LETTERS" WILL ATTEMPT TO GIVE THE "MEAT" OF SIGNIFICANT LETTERS AND THEREBY GIVE MORE MEMBERS AN OUTLET FOR THEIR IDEAS AND OPINIONS. CONTROVERSIAL MATTERS AN EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO GIVE OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS EQUAL SPACE. LET IT NEVER BE SAID THAT A MEM-BER FOUND HIS OPINION BARRED FROM THE PAGES OF SPARK GAP TIMES. IF MEMBERS, SAY TEN OR MORE, BELIEVE OPINIONS AND ARGU-MENTS HAVE BEEN TOO CONDENSED, LET THEM DROP A POST CARD TO THE EDITOR AND THE MATTER WILL BE GIVEN FULL SPACE. IN A SUB-SEQUENTISSUE. THE EDITOR WILL ALWAYS OBSERVE A REQUEST NOT TO PRINT A LETTER OR ANY PORTION OF IT. NEEDLESS TO SAY, ANY VITUPERATIVE PHRASES WILL BE EDITED SUCH THINGS ARE GROTESQUE IN A FRATERNAL ORGANIZATION.



EVERY SO OFTEN SOME MEMBER POSES THE QUESTION: "WHERE IS OOTC HEADED?" JUST A QUICK GLANCE AT LATEST ROSTER ANSWERS THAT QUESTION IN PART. OOTC NEW MEMBERS OUTNUMBER THE S.K.'s. THAT INDICATES GROWTH IN NUMBERS. PROGRESS IN THAT DIRECTION FAILS TO ANSWER THE QUESTION: "ARE WE STRONGER, AS A GROUP - MORE COHESIVE IN OUR FRATERNAL FOUNDATIONS?"

WE MUST BE DOING SOMETHING RIGHT BOYS,
BECAUSE NEW MEMBERS EXPRESS SUCH ENTHUSIASM FOR OOTC. THEY SEEM LITTLE CONCERNED OVER THE CURRENT INTRA-MURAL
SKIRMISH OVER OUR VALIDITY AS PIONEERS.

THERE SEEMS TO BE AN UNEXPRESSED HUNGER FOR COMPANIONSHIP WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE. THIS YEARNING, AND ITS ULTIMATE SATISFACTION OVER-RIDES THE CLUCKING IN THE BARNYARD OVER TERMINOLOGIES. AFTER ALL, EVERY MEMBER IS A RADIO AMATEUR REGARDLESS OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF HIS PAST.

A PRESIDENT HAS TO KEEP CURRENT CONTRO-VERSIES IN PERSPECTIVE. ONE OF HIS DU-TIES IS TO HEAD THE CLUB IN THE DIREC-TION OF STRENGTH, TOWARD THE NURTURE OF COHESION RATHER THAN DISUNITY. AND STILL GIVE EVERYBODY THE RIGHT TO EXPRESS HIS IDEAS. SOMETIMES HE SEEMS COMPELLED TO WORK BOTH SIDES OF THE STREET.

PROBLEMS? YES, I HAVE THEM. MORE THAN I CAN DISCLOSE HERE. BUT FROM THE ABOVE YOU CAN APPRECIATE MY APPROACH TO THEM. WE MAY BE OF LITTLE SERVICE TO OTHER ELEMENTS OF SOCIETY, BUT WE CAN BE USE-FUL TO OURSELVES IN EXCHANGING IDEAS AND MEANS OF SERVICE TO ONE ANOTHER. OOTC IS PRIMARILY A FRATERNAL ORGANIZATION.

W8JVD TOLD ABOUT THE MANUFACTURE OF GREBE RECEIVERS. JERRY TYNE OF BELL LABS AND HOWARD SCHRADER (PRINCETON) TOLD OF EARLY TUBE DEVELOPMENT, INCLUDING REPLICAS OF A FLEMING VALVE AND A DEFOREST AUDION MADE BY W6IS, THESE HARDLY DISTINGUISHABLE FROM THE ORIGINALS.

THE STORY OF OLD NAA BY K2WW FROM A BRIL-LIANT HISTORICAL RESEARCH BY THE LATE CDR. WATSON, W3BO. INTERESTING INFORMATION NOT COMMONLY KNOWN APPEARED IN THE REPORT OF THE "TITANIC DISASTER AND WIRELESS", BY W3AX AND CHARLES HENRY OOTC #592. HENRY FORD'S RADIO ACTIVITIES WERE TOLD BY FRANK DAVIS, DEARBORN MUSEUM CURATOR - WHERE WE PLAN THE NEXT MEET SEPT. 167.

W2ZH GAVE THE OLD LAND LINE TELEGRAPHERS A REAL PLUG - THE ORIGINAL BRASSPOUNDER. DR. BERNARD FINN, CURATOR OF ELECTRICITY AT SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTE SPOKE ALONG WITH THE CELEBRITIES SHOWN IN SPARK GAP TIMES! HALL OF FAME ON OPPOSITE PAGE.



RECREATING AND RECORDING THE OLD SPARKS

WHEN WE OLD OLD TIMERS STARTED IN WIRELESS, ALMOST ALL OF THE TRANSMITTERS,
COMMERCIAL AND AMATEUR, WERE SPARK. BY
1925 THERE WERE MANY ARC AND TUBE SETS
FOR MEDIUM WAVE AND THE ALEXANDERSON ALTERNATOR FOR THE VERY LONG WAVE STATIONS.
THE INTERNATIONAL RADIO CONVENTION HELD
IN WASHINGTON, D.C. 1927 BANNED THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW DAMPED WAVE TRANSMITTERS
AFTER 1930 EXCEPT FOR EMERGENCY SETS OF
300 WATTS POWER OR LESS AND DISCOURAGED
THE USE OF ALL DAMPED WAVE TRANSMITTERS
ON COMMERCIAL FREQUENCIES.


TAPE RECORDERS WERE NOT IN USE BY 1930
AND VERY FEW PHONOGRAPH RECORDS HAD BEEN
MADE OF SPARK SIGNALS BY THAT TIME.

WE OLD OLD TIMERS LOOK AT THE EARLY GEAR AT AWA, SMITHSONIAN OR FORD MUSEUMS OR MANY OF THE SMALLER COLLECTIONS, AND THINK OF THE GOOD OLD DAYS OF SPARK WITH THEIR DISTINCTIVE MUSICAL NOTES. WE CAN NOT CLEARLY DESCRIBE TO THE YOUNGSTERS WHO HAVE NEVER HEARD A SPARK SIGNAL, JUST HOW THEY SOUNDED. MOST OF THEM DO NOT BELIEVE US WHEN WE SAY THAT SPARK TONES WERE MUCH MORE PLEASANT TO READ THAN THE WHISTLE OF C.W.

FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS, I HAVE FELT WE SHOULD REMEDY THIS SITUATION BY RECREATING THE SOUNDS OF OLD SPARKS. A TAPE RECORDING WOULD REFRESH OUR MEMORIES OF OVER 40 YEARS AND PROVE TO THE YOUNGSTERS WE WEREN'T DAY-DREAMING ABOUT THEIR SUPERIOR NOTES.

TEN YEARS AGO I FOUND A 2 KW, 800 CYCLE, 36 POLE, 120 VOLT INDUCTOR ALTERNATOR IN A SECOND-HAND SHOP ON LONG ISLAND. THAT DID IT; I WAS SOON DESIGNING IN SPARE TIME, A HALF KW VARIABLE FREQUENCY SPARK TRANSMITTER WITH PLENTY OF HELP FROM MORECROFT'S "PRINCIPLE OF RADIO COMMUNICATION" AND BOUCHER'S "PRACTICAL WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY". NOT MUCH PROGRESS WAS MADE UNTIL I RETIRED IN 1963, THEN AFTER MOVING BACK TO CALIFORNIA, SETTING UP MY MACHINE TOOLS, WORK STARTED IN EARNEST.

PHOTOGRAPH #1 SHOWS THE MAIN COMPONENTS
OF THE SET. A PATTERN WAS MADE AND AN ALUMINUM CASTING MACHINED FOR THE GAP HOUSING THAT SUPPORTS THE TWO STATIONARY
ELECTRODES WHICH ARE ADJUSTABLE. POSI-



TION OF THE HOUSING CAN BE SHIFTED BY A SHAFT THAT EXTENDS TO THE FRONT PANEL. A SHAFT EXTENSION WAS ADDED TO THE ALTERNATOR TO MOUNT THE SPARK GAP ROTOR. THE HIGH VOLTAGE TRANSFORMER IS WOUND WITH ENOUGH PRIMARY TAPS TO GIVE FROM 6000 TO 10,000 VOLTS AT ANY FREQUENCY. O.T. IS OF CONVENTIONAL DESIGN, 15 TURNS OF HALF INCH WIDE COPPER STRIP IN BOTH PRIMARY AND SECONDARY WITH COUPLING VARIABLE FROM I TO 6 INCHES. TWO .004 MF 12500 VOLT DUBILIER CONDENSERS MADE IN 1917 FOR THE BUREA OF STEAM ENGINEERING, NAVY DEPARTMENT, COMPLETE THE H.V. SYSTEM.

A 1½ HORSE POWER 1800 RPM 120 VOLT SINGLE PHASE MOTOR WITH VARIABLE PITCH PULLEYS DRIVES THE ALTERNATOR AT THE DESIRED SPEED. FIELD EXCITATION IS SUPPLIED BY A RECTIFIER. MOUNTED ON THE FRONT PANEL ARE DC FIELD AMMETER, AC VOLTMETER, AMMETER AND WATTMETER MEASURING INPUT INTO THE HIGH VOLTAGE TRANSFORMER.

As a neighbor's color TV set is within 40 feet of the transmitter, I was very aware of the necessity for adequate shielding. A specialist in this field suggested use of quarter inch galvanized mesh cloth which has been very successful. Photograph Number 2 shows the Set with all the radio frequency parts shielded ready to run.

AFTER TUNING THE PRIMARY TO 400 KC WITH A GRID DIP METER, I THOUGHT I WAS READY TO CUT TAPES BUT THE FUN HAD JUST STARTED. BACKGROUND NOISE WITH A MICRO-


PHONE PICKUP WAS ENTIRELY TOO HIGH, ALSO THE TONE WAS ROUGH AND NOT TRUE. AFTER EXPERIMENTING WITH ELECTRO-MAGNETIC AND ELECTROSTATIC PICKUPS, I SETTLED FOR A SHIELDED CABLE RUNNING FROM NEAR THE OT TO THE INPUT OF A COMMAND RECEIVER OF 200 TO 500 KC RANGE. OUTPUT OF THIS SET GOES TO INPUT OF TAPE RECORDER, PRODUCING A GOOD REALISTIC TONE.

THE NEXT PROBLEM, DETERMINATION OF ALTERNATOR FREQUENCY, WAS SOLVED BY USING A SCOPE TO COMPARE THE GENERATED VOLTAGE WITH OUTPUT OF A HEWLETT-PACKARD AUDIO GENERATOR, ADJUSTING SPEED TO GIVE THE DESIRED FREQUENCY.

TO GET DATA ON THE TONES USED BY EARLY COML. TRANSMITTERS, I VISITED THE SAN FRANCISCO FCC OFFICE ONLY TO FIND THAT ALL PAPERS ON THESE TRANSMITTERS HAD LONG SINCE BEEN SCRAPPED AT THAT OFFICE; ALSO AT THE MAIN OFFICE IN WASHINGTON, D.C. ED. RASER, ROLAND BOURNE AND BRUCE KELLEY HAVE BEEN MOST HELPFUL IN SUPPLYING DATA ON EAST COAST STATIONS. DICK JOHNSTONE, FRANK GEISEL AND EARL WOHLER HAVE FILLED IN INFORMATION ON WEST COAST STATIONS. EARLY ISSUES OF QST CONTAIN FAIRLY COMPLETE INFORMATION ON EARLY AMATEUR SETS.



MORECROFT STATED THAT ALTERNATOR VOLTAGE WAS AFFECTED BY THE LEADING CURRENT DRAWN BY THE HIGH VOLTAGE CONDENSER. I UNDER-ESTIMATED THIS CONDITION AND SOON FOUND IT NECESSARY TO BUILD A 0-15 KV VOLTMETER TO MONITOR THE HIGH VOLTAGE TO KEEP IT WITHIN LIMITS.



TAPES SOON SHOWED THAT THE MOST IMPORT-ANT FACTOR IN OBTAINING A GOOD CLEAN NOTE WAS THE POSITION OF THE STATIONARY GAP ELECTRODES. A POSITION INDICATOR WAS BROUGHT OUT TO THE FRONT PANEL AND A MOVEMENT OF ONE POLE PITCH WAS SHOWN BY 8 DIVISIONS. THE GAP HOUSING COULD NOW BE MOVED DURING THE OPERATION OF THE TRANSMITTER AND A RECORD MADE OF LOCA-TION OF THE BEST NOTE. CURVE # | SHOWS WATTS, ALTERNATOR VOLTS AND CURRENT, ALSO HV TRANSFORMER SECONDARY VOLTAGE AT 360 CYCLE OPERATION WITH CONSTANT FIELD CUR-RENT OF 0.75 AMPERES, AS THE GAP HOUSING WAS MOVED OVER ONE POLE PITCH. NOTE THAT THERE WAS NO SPARK ACROSS THE GAP FROM POSITIONS 1.0 TO 2.5 AND FROM 9.0 TO 10.5 AND THAT THE BEST NOTE WAS AT PO-SITION 8 WITH RELATIVELY LOW POWER. AT THESE LOW POWERS, COMPLETING THE SECON-DARY CIRCUIT OF THE OT WITH OR WITHOUT SERIES RESISTANCE HAD NO NOTICEABLE AFFECT ON PERFORMANCE.

Speeds below 600 RPM gave rough notes, so for low frequencies a new spark gap rotor was made having 9 instead of 36 teeth.

WITH THIS ROTOR THE SPARK OCCURS ON EVERY FOURTH CYCLE SO WITH THE ALTERNATOR GENERATOR AT 240 CYCLES, A 60 CYCLE NOTE IS GENERATED AT THE GAP. WITH THESE TWO ROTORS, ANY FREQUENCY FROM 40 TO 500 CYCLES CAN BE PRODUCED. AS THE SPARK TRANSMITTER GENERATES A WAVE TRAIN ON BOTH THE POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE HALVES OF THE CYCLE, THE ABOVE FREQUENCIES PRODUCE NOTES AT THE RECEIVING STATION OF FROM 80 TO 1000 CYCLES.

BUILDING THE TRANSMITTER, GETTING IT TO PERFORM SATISFACTORILY HAS BEEN A LOT-OF FUN, BUT THE MOST PLEASURE HAS COME FROM WORKING WITH THE OLD TIMERS IN MAKING THE RECORDS OF THEIR EARLY OPERATIONS.

THE FIRST TAPE WAS PLAYED AT THE ANNUAL AWA MEET OCTOBER 1965. IT TRACED ONE OF THE FIRST AMATEUR SPARK MESSAGES TO CROSS THE USA JUST AFTER WORLD WAR I.

DICK JOHNSTONE RECORDED "THE CONGRESS FIRE" ARTICLE - IN THE FEBRUARY ISSUE OF SGT, THEN WITH THE HELP OF FRANK GEISEL AND EARL WOHLER, WE ADDED THE SPARK MESSAGES EXCHANGED AS A RESULT OF THE DISTRESS CALL. DICK HAS ALSO TAPED HIS EXPERIENCES AT KPH FROM 1907 TO THE END OF THE SPARK ERA FOR THAT STATION, WHICH INCLUDES TYPICAL MESSAGES USING FIVE DIFFERENT TRANSMITTERS OVER THAT PERIOD.

WE PLAN TO MAKE SIMILAR RECORDS OF OTHER PIONEER STATIONS WHILE OPERATORS ARE STILL ABLE TO SUPPLY DETAILS FROM THEIR EARLY EXPERIENCES. COPIES WILL BE FILED WITH OOTC FOR THEIR RECORDS. AS A BY-PRODUCT THIS PROGRAM HAS ALREADY BROUGHT SEVERAL NEW MEMBERS INTO OOTC.

CRUISING ON

THE SS DEL NORTE BY K4EN-W1AO

FOR SEVERAL MONTHS THE XYL, MARY, AND I HAD BEEN CONSIDERING A TRIP TO SOUTH AMERICA. AFTER ACCUMULATING MANY TRAVEL FOLDERS AND DISCUSSING THE MATTER WITH OUR TRAVEL AGENT, WE STILL COULD NOT MAKE UP OUR MINDS AS TO WHERE AND HOW WE SHOULD TRAVEL.

IT SO HAPPENED THAT I HAD SEVERAL QSO'S ON 15 METERS LAST WINTER WITH RALPH -- K5PXM/MM, WHO IS CHIEF COMMERCIAL

OPERATOR ON THE SS DEL NORTE. WHEN I TOLD HIM OF OUR PLANS HE IMMEDIATELY SUGGESTED THAT WE TAKE A CRUISE ON ONE OF THE THREE SHIPS OF THE DELTA LINE, AS EACH ONE CARRIED AMATEUR RADIO EQUIPMENT. OBVIOUSLY HE RECOMMENDED HIS OWN SHIP IN PARTICULAR, AND WHEN HE KINDLY OFFERED ME THE OPPORTUNITY OF OPERATING MARITIME MOBILE IT DID NOT TAKE ME LONG TO ACCEPT AND BOOK PASSAGE ON THE SS DEL NORTE FOR MAY SAILING. THE NECESSARY LETTER WAS WRITTEN TO THE FCC ADVISING OF MY INTENTIONS TO OPERATE K4EN/MM.

THE ROUND TRIP FROM NEW ORLEANS TO BUENOS AIRES AND BACK TAKES 43 DAYS. SOUTHBOUND STOPS WERE MADE AT SAN JUAN, PORTO RICO, BRIDGETOWN, BARBADOES; RIO DEJANEIRO AND SANTOS IN BRAZIL; MONTEVIDEO, URUGUAY AND FINALLY BUENOS AIRES WHERE WE LAID OVER FOR TWO NIGHTS.

NORTHBOUND STOPS WERE MADE AT PARANAGUA, SANTOS AND RIO IN BRAZIL; LA GUAIRA, VENEZUELA AND WLLEMSTAD, CURACAO. PASSENGERS COULD DISEMBARK AT EITHER HOUSTON OR NEW ORLEANS.

IT TOOK BUT A SHORT TIME FOR ME TO FIND MY WAY UP TO THE HAM RADIO SHACK, WHICH WAS LOCATED IN RALPH'S STATEROOM ADJOIN-ING THE COMMERCIAL RADIO ROOM.

THE EQUIPMENT CONSISTED OF A KWM-I TRANS-CEIVER WITH B&W, L-1001A LINEAR AMPLIFIER. ALL OPERATION WAS ON 15 METERS SSB WITH A TWO-ELEMENT BEAM WHICH SWAYED PERILOUSLY IN THE WIND. 'IT HAD TO BE TURNED BY HAND AND WAS GENERALLY LEFT IN A DIRECTION TO FAVOR CENTRAL USA. POWER RATING OF THE TRANSMITTER WAS 1200 WATTS PEP, WHICH PROVED AMPLE FOR MOST CONTACTS.

THE FIRST QSO WAS MADE FIVE DAYS AFTER SAILING AND PRACTICALLY EVERY DAY THEREAFTER I SPENT ONE OR TWO HOURS IN THE SHACK AND HAD A TOTAL OF 65 CONTACTS WHILE ABOARD. BY NOON OR EARLIER EVERYDAY THE 15 METER BAND WOULD OPEN UP. CONTACTS WERE MADE WITH AMATEURS ALL OVER THE U.S. THESE INCLUDED W6BGR, W6ZLN, W1CRA AND W1BFA IN MAINE. ALMOST DAILY QSO'S WERE HAD WITH MAC - W9ARK IN INDIANAPOLIS.

THE HIGH LIGHT OF THE TRIP WAS THE PHONE CONTACT I HAD WITH MY SON WHILE OFF THE EAST COAST OF MONTEVIDEO, URUGUAY. THIS WAS ACCOMPLISHED WITH THE AID OF W9SDQ AND A PHONE PATCH IN INDIANAPOLIS. THE DISTANCE INVOLVED WAS ABOUT 5600 MILES.

Another memorable occasion was an excel-LENT QSO WITH MY GOOD FRIEND ALF - ZS6IQ IN JOHANNESBURG, SOUTH AFRICA. WE HAD HAD MANY PREVIOUS CONTACTS FROM MY HOME QTH IN MIAMI AND IT WAS QUITE THRILLING TO HAVE THIS PRE-ARRANGED CONTACT MATER-IALIZE SATISFACTORILY.

DISTANCES UP TO 6000 MILES WERE COMMON AND THESE INCLUDED EL2R, G31WV, ZSITZ, LU2XH, ZS60S AND OTHERS. THE CHIEF PROBLEM WAS TO GET OFF THE AIR. SO MANY CALLS CAME FROM US AMATEURS IT WAS DIFFICULT TO RESIST THEM ALL AND FINALLY ORT EVERY DAY.

WHILE OPERATING I COULD NOT HELP BUT RECALL AND COMPARE MY LAST EXPERIENCE WITH RADIO ABOARD SHIP. THAT WAS BACK IN 1919 AS COMMERCIAL OPERATOR ON THE OIL TANKER "SOCONY 82", PLYING BETWEEN BROOKLYN AND TAMPICO, AND WHERE IT WAS MOST DIFFICULT TO REACH A LAND STATION WITH THE OLD SPARK TRANSMITTER WHEN IN THE MIDDLE OF THE GULF OF MEXICO. ALSO IT WAS TRYING TO CONTACT NEW YORK CITY AT TIMES WHEN ON THE SS LEXINGTON OF THE OLD COLONIAL LINE PLYING BETWEEN PROVIDENCE, R.I. AND NEW YORK CITY IN THE SAME YEAR.


HOWEVER, AMATEUR RADIO WAS NOT THE ONLY ACTIVITY ON THE SHIP. ALMOST IMMEDIATELY AFTER SAILING SOCIAL ACTIVITIES COMMENCED FOR THOSE WHO WANTED TO PARTICIPATE. THE CUSTOMARY CAPTAIN'S PARTY WAS A GRAND OCCASION AS WAS THE COSTUME PARTY AND THE CAPTAIN'S FAREWELL DANCE.

MOVIES, HORSE RACING AND DECK SPORTS ALSO OCCUPIED MUCH OF OUR TIME.

THE MOST EXCITING OCCASION WAS WHEN THE SHIP CROSSED THE EQUATOR. AT THAT TIME KING NEPTUNE - A JUDGE FROM CALIFORNIA - AND HIS ROYAL COURT HEARD CHARGES AGAINST ALL POLLIWOGS. POLLIWOGS WERE PASSENGERS WHO HAD NEVER CROSSED THE EQUATOR. THIS INCLUDED MARY AND ME. THE INITIATION TURNED OUT TO BE MUCH LESS HARROWING THAN HAD BEEN ANTICIPATED. IT IS SAID THAT IN THE OLD DAYS THE INITIATION WAS REALLY ROUGH WITH THE POLLIWOGS BEING THROWN IN THE SHIP'S POOL FULLY DRESSED.

SHORE EXCURSIONS WERE ENJOYED AT EVERY PORT AND RANGED FROM SEVERAL HOURS TO TWO DAYS. PROBABLY THE MOST MEMORABLE WAS AT



DURING SEPTEMBER 1966 ALL OF THE DIREC-TORS AND ELECTED OFFICERS RECEIVED A TWO-PAGE LETTER FROM A MEMBER URGING CHANGES IN THE CLUB MAKE-UP WHICH IN EF-FECT WOULD ALLOW MOTHER NATURE TO BRING THE ORGANIZATION TO EXTINCTION AROUND 1990. THE CHANGES, IF ADOPTED WOULD RE-QUIRE A RADICAL CHANGE IN THE CONSTITU-TION AND A COMPLETE RE-FINANCING OF THE CLUB. THE PLAN'S PROPONENT GAVE NO CLUE TO THE SOLUTION OF THE FINANCIAL PROBLEM NOR DID HE OFFER HIS SERVICES IN ASSIS-TING TO MAKE EFFECTIVE THE CHANGE. ANY CHANGES IN THE CONSTITUTION, AS NOW FRAMED, MUST BE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE VI. THE DIRECTORS HAVE NO AU-THORITY TO ABROGATE THIS PROVISION AND THEREFORE "LAID ON THE TABLE" THE ENTIRE MATTER. IF A SUBSTANTIAL NUMBER OF MEM-BERS SHOULD PETITION FOR MEASURES WHICH BY CONSTITUTIONAL REVISION WOULD INSURE THE "DEATH" OF THE CLUB WITHIN THE FOR-SEEABLE FUTURE. THE DIRECTORS WOULD RE-CONSIDER THE SUBJECT AND MAKE APPROPRI-ATE RECOMMENDATIONS.

HISTORY SAYS SHE ORIGINATED THE WORDS OW BECAUSE SHE GOT TIRED OF PEOPLE CALLING HER OM. IN LATER YEARS THE GALS OBJECTED TO BEING CALLED OW AND CHANGED IT TO YL AND XYL. BUT I THINK THEY SHOULD KNOW THAT OW WAS STARTED BY A WOMAN. - FRANK, W5VA. 10-6-66.

FROM W5NO, AS EDITED BY W1MPP. JOE, OUR STAR SALESMAN HAS A BACKGROUND IN FRATER-NALISM, HOLDING OFFICES IN THE SCOTTISH RITE AND THE SHRINE, INCLUDING GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND CONSISTORY OF LOUISI-ANA AND POTENTATE OF JERUSALEM TEMPLE A.A.O.N.M.S. (PAUSE FOR BREATH) FIRST 2 WAY CONTACT 1914, GOT FIRST COMMERCIAL 1915. AT SEA 1915, 16, 17, 18. STARTED HAM PARTS BUSINESS 1922, ADDED SETS IN 1922, OPERATED 3 STORES IN NEW ORLEANS FOR MANY YEARS. RIO DE JANEIRO WITH ITS SPECTACULAR HAR-BOR, SUGAR LOAF MOUNTAIN, GUARDING THE HARBOR, IS A VIEW NEVER TO BE FORGOTTEN. ONLY HONG KONG, IN MY OPINION HAS A COM-PARABLE HARBOR.

BUENOS AIRES WITH ITS MANY PARKS AND WIDE AVENUES PROVED TO BE MOST INTERESTING AND ENJOYABLE. AS PUBLICIZED, IT PROVED TO BE THE "PARIS OF SOUTH AMERICA".

SANTOS, PROBABLY THE BUSIEST PORT IN SOUTH AMERICA, IS ONLY A SHORT DISTANCE FROM SAO PAULO, THE FASTEST GROWING CITY IN THE WORLD. THE CITY IS AN INDUSTRIAL GIANT; THE SKYLINE RIVALS THAT OF NEW YORK CITY. IT IS SAID THAT ITS POPULATION HAS ALREADY EXCEEDED THAT OF BUENOS AIRES.

FOR A DIFFERENT AND RELAXING VACATION I WOULD CERTAINLY RECOMMEND TO EVERY OOT, OR ANY HAM FOR THAT MATTER, A CRUISE ON THE SS DEL NORTE OR ONE OF THE SISTER SHIPS, THE DEL SUD OR DEL MAR, BUT DON'T FORGET TO ADVISE THE FCC YOU WANT TO OPERATE MARITIME MOBILE.





HE IS GUIDED BY THE REPORTER'S FIVE W'S WHO? WHAT? WHY? WHEN? WHERE? EVERY HISTORIAN'S AIM IS TO MAKE HIS RECORD COMPLETE AND ACCURATE. IN THIS TASK ED
FINDS SOME INFORMATION HARD TO COME BY AND
SOLICITS DATA FROM ANY MEMBER, ESPECIALLY
THOSE CITED IN THIS FIRST INSTALLMENT,
WHICH WILL ENHANCE OR CORRECT THE RECORD.
SIGNIFICANT INFORMATION SO RECEIVED WILL
BE ADDED AS SUPPLEMENTS TO SUCCEEDING INSTALLMENTS. "ED, WE PRESENT YOU, BELOW":

OOTC WAS THE BRAIN CHILD OF OUR HONORABLE FOUNDER AND FIRST SECRETARY, HUBERT E. INGALLS, WINQ. OTHERS IDENTIFIED WITH ITS EARLY FOUNDING WERE: WIZE, WIANA, WIBBA, W2TK, WIDFS, W2FG, W1MH, W1SS, W1CPI, W1CQR* AND W1PJM. THE CLUB REALLY GOT GOING IN THE WINTER OF 1947, AT A ROUND TABLE ON THE AIR MEETING, WITH 13 ORIGINAL MEMBERS CHECKING IN ON 3990 KC. THESE ARE RECORDED AS BEING W1NQ, W1ZE, W1TK, W2FG, W1ANA, W1CQR*, W1FZU, W2RBH, W2DH, W1SS, W3CC, W2ENX AND W2OUS.

THE NOW HISTORICAL MEETING ON THE AIR WAS HELD ON JANUARY 29, 19--? WITH THE FOLLOWING IN ATTENDANCE: W1ZE, W1NQ, W1ANA, W1LIB, W2TF, W2UH, W2APN, W3NUN, W3FJU AND W4VA. IRVING, W1ZE, WAS ELECTED THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT AND BERT, W1NQ, SECRETARY.

BY November 1949, FIFTY TWO MEMBERS HAD BEEN ENROLLED AND REGULAR ROUND TABLE MEETINGS WERE BEING HELD EACH THURSDAY AT 8:00 P.M. OUR CLUB WAS GROWING FAST IT SEEMED.

IT NOW BECAME NECESSARY TO DRAFT A CONSTITUTION, AS IT LOOKED AS THOUGH OOTC WAS WELL ON ITS WAY TO BECOMING A PERMANENT ORGANIZATION. ROLAND BOURNE, W1ANA, WAS MOST HELPFUL IN DOING THIS, ASSISTED BY W1ZE, W1NQ AND W1BBA. ROLAND ALSO DID A SPLENDID JOB OF CREATING THE ORIGINAL OOTC "SHEEPSKIN", AND THE FIRST 40 WERE LABORIOUSLY PRODUCED BY HAND, USING HIS PHOTOGRAPHIC METHOD.

THE FIRST REGULARLY ELECTED OFFICERS WERE

OOTC HISTORY - CONTINUED

W1ZE - PRESIDENT; W1ANA - VICE-PRESIDENT.
W1NQ - SECRETARY AND W1TK - TREASURER.
W2FG WAS THE FIRST REGULAR MEMBER TO BE
ELECTED TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS IN 1949
THUS BECOMING THE 5TH MEMBER OF THE BOARD.
HE ALSO GOT OUT THE FIRST TWO ISSUES OF
THE CLUB ROSTER IN FINE STYLE.

THE IDEA OF A BIOGRAPHICAL YEAR BOOK OR BLUE BOOK HAD BEEN IN THE MINDS OF SEVERAL OF US FOR QUITE SOME TIME. IT WAS FIRST SUGGESTED BY W2TQ (NOW W1TU) IN A LETTER TO THE SECRETARY IN 1949.

I NEVER RODE ABOARD A DIRIGIBLE, BUT-

EVER SINCE MY TEENS I'D BEEN INTRIGUED BY THEM. THE STORIES I USED TO HEAR AND READ ABOUT GERMAN ZEPPELINS ESPECIALLY INTERESTED ME, AND I ALWAYS HOPED SOME DAY TO RIDE ABOARD ONE.

IN 1923 I SAW MY FIRST DIRIGIBLE - THE SHENANDOAH - FLYING OVER DOWNTOWN PHILA-DELPHIA. LATER, FROM A WINDOW OF A TROLLEY CAR, I SAW HER PASSING OVER LOW-ER MONTGOMERY COUNTY; AND THEN IN 1925, WHEN SHE FLEW OVER MY HOME IN THE CENTRAL PART, I GOT A SNAPSHOT WITH MY BOX CAMERA (I STILL HAVE THE PICTURE IN MY SCRAP BOOK) AND A GOOD THING I DID; THAT SAME NIGHT SHE BROKE UP IN A STORM OVER OHIO.

BUT IT WAS THE LOS ANGELES THAT CAME TO MEAN MOST TO ME. SOME YEARS LATER, WHEN I LIVED IN PHILADELPHIA, I FIRST SAW HER AS SHE PASSED OVER THE CITY AT NIGHT AND WAS GREATLY IMPRESSED. THE IN 1927, DUR-ING THE READING FAIR, WHEN I WAS RADIO OPERATOR AT THE STATE POLICE BARRACKS IN WEST READING, SHE CRUISED OVER THE VICIN-ITY. THE FREQUENCIES OF THE STATE POLICE RADIO STATION, WMB, AND THE LAKEHURST NA-VAL AIR STATION, NEL, WERE ADJACENT, ABOUT 1200 METERS IF I RECALL CORRECTLY. THE AIRSHIP'S FREQUENCY WAS THAT OF NEL, AND I THINK HER CALL WAS NERK. HEARING THE LOS ANGELES WORKING, I GAVE HER A "BUZZ" AND LEARNED THAT SHE WAS ENROUTE TO READ-ING WITH CONGRESSMAN DIETRICH ABOARD.

WHEN THE AIRSHIP ARRIVED OVER READING, I HANDLED TRAFFIC BETWEEN HER SKIPPER AND THE READING FAIR OFFICIALS, WHO WERE TRYING TO DECIDE WHETHER SHE COULD LAND SAFELY AT THE FAIR GROUNDS. BUT SINCE THERE APPARENTLY WOULD NOT BE ENOUGH TRAINED PERSONNEL TO HANDLE HER LANDING LINES, IT WAS DECIDED THAT SHE SHOULD NOT.


I CAME TO KNOW BOTH THE OPERATOR AND THE SECOND OPERATOR ON THE LOS ANGELES - COPELAND AND CAVADINI. WE QSO'D A NUMBER OF TIMES WHEN I HEARD THE SHIP ON THE AIR, AND COPELAND SAID HE'D ARRANGE FOR MY RIDING ABOARD IF I EVER HAPPENED TO BE AT LAKEHURST WHEN THEY MADE A FLIGHT. THIS WAS MY CHANCE; BUT TO MY REGRET AND DISAPPOINTMENT IT NEVER MATERIALIZED.

I WAS HOWEVER, TO HEAR OF COPELAND AND CAVADINI AGAIN, FOR IN 1928 I WENT BACK TO SEA, AND ABOARD THE SS ONTARIO OF THE MERCHANTS AND MINERS TRANSPORTATION CO. I ONE DAY HEARD A YOUNG LADY AT MY TABLE IN THE DINING SALON SAY THAT SHE LIVED IN LAKEHURST, WHERE HER HUSBAND WAS AN ELECTRICIAN. LATER I ASKED HER WHETHER SHE KNEW THE TWO RADIO MEN AT THE STATION AND WAS INTERESTED TO KNOW THAT SHE CERTAINLY DID - BOTH OF THEM AND THEIR WIVES, FOR THEY FREQUENTLY VISITED ONE WITH THE OTHER.

NOR WAS THAT ALL, THOUGH I WAS NOT TO CONTACT EITHER COPELAND OR CAVADINI A-GAIN. HOWEVER DURING THOSE YEARS, I HAD SEEN FLYING ALONG THE COAST, A FEW OTHER DIRIGIBLES THE NAVY HAD CONSTRUCTED; AND IT WAS EARLY IN THE MORNING OF 1923, I THINK, AS I WAS ON MY WAY FROM HOME BACK TO PHILADELPHIA TO JOIN MY SHIP -THE TANKER ULYSSES, THAT I SAW AT A NEWSSTAND THE HEADLINE THAT THE AIRSHIP AKRON HAD CRASHED OFF THE NEW JERSEY COAST.

WHEN THE ULYSSES WAS OUT OF THE DELAWARE CAPES AT SEA, I HEARD THE WIRELESS OF THE GERMAN SHIP THAT HAD RESCUED THE AKRON'S SURVIVORS. JUST ON A CHANCE, I CALLED. HER OPERATOR TO INQUIRE WHETHER THEY HAD PICKED UP ANYONE BY THE NAME OF COPELAND OR CAVADINI. THE ANSWER CAME BACK: "WE HAVE COPELAND ABOARD -- IN THE ROOM NEXT TO THIS. HE DIED AN HOUR AGO."

CAVADINI I NEVER HEARD OF AGAIN. NO
I NEVER RODE ABOARD A DIRIGIBLE.

IT IS ALSO TRUE HOWEVER, THAT LOOSE ENDS AND IRREGULARITIES HAVE OCCURED HERE AND THERE. THIS REFLECTS THE LACK OF ADEQUATE PROCEDURES AND THE FAILURE TO MAKE PERIODIC AUDITS. THEN TOO, OFFICERS SUCCEEDING TO AN OFFICE FIND THEMSELVES HANDICAPPED BY THE LACK OF PROPER RECORDS. IF THEY EXIST, THEY MAY NOT BE ACCESSIBLE. OFTEN THE RECORDS ARE NOT CONSOLIDATED IN A SINGLE BOOK OR FILE, BUT APPEAR AS NOTATIONS ON THE BACKS OF ENVELOPES OR ODD SHEETS OF PAPER.

NEARLY EVERY OFFICER MINGLES OOTC BUSINESS WITH HIS PERSONAL EFFECTS AND IF
HE GOES SK, MONTHS MAY ELAPSE BEFORE
THE OOTC RECORDS CAN BE SIFTED OUT OR
EVEN RECOVERED AT ALL. THE CLUB SHOULD
BE SLOW TO ATTACH BLAME TO THE OFFICER,
WHO MAY BE SUFFERING THE INFIRMITIES OF
ADVANCED YEARS OR WORKING A FULL-TIME
JOB IN ADDITION TO HIS OOTC DUTIES. IN
VIEW OF THESE PERSONAL LIMITATIONS PREVALENT IN THE PAST IT IS ALMOST BEYOND
BELIEF THAT THE CLUB HAS FLOWERED TO
THE EXTENT IT HAS. SOME FEW MUST HAVE
HAD INCREDIBLE PATIENCE AND ACCOMPLISHED
A MOUNTAIN OF WORK.

TO ILLUSTRATE HOW THE LACK OF RECORDS OR FAILURE TO TRANSFER THEM CAN AFFECT EVEN THE "STANDING" OF THE CLUB, THIS RECENT INSTANCE MAY BE CITED: IN SEARCHING TO FIND THE ORIGINAL SUPPLIER OF BLUE BOOK COVERS - A QUEST THAT TOOK

MONTHS - WE FOUND THAT THE CLUB HAD ORDERED FIVE DOZEN FROM THE SUPPLIER, BUT NEVER ACCEPTED THEM. THE SUPPLIER WAS \$90 IN THE HOLE; THE COVERS HAD BEEN MADE UP SPECIAL SEVERAL YEARS AGO. THIS SITUATION, OF COURSE WAS IMMEDIATELY RECTIFIED BY ACCEPTING AND PAYING FOR THEM. NOW WHAT CAN BE DONE TO PREVENT REPETITION OF THIS SORT OF THING?

THE CONSTITUTION PROVIDES THAT THE OUTGO-ING PRESIDENT IN ANY ADMINISTRATION BECOMES A DIRECTOR AT LARGE TO ASSIST THE NEW PRESIDENT DURING THE PERIOD OF TRANSITION. OBVIOUSLY IF A PRESIDENT GOES SKATHERE IS NO PROVISION FOR ANY ADDITIONAL DIRECTOR. THIS COULD BE REMEDIED BY AN AMENDMENT. HOWEVER, WHY GIVE A DIRECTOR AT LARGE SUCH LIMITED DUTIES. WHY NOT GIVE HIM A REAL JOB?

VISUALIZED IS A MAN, SUFFICIENTLY WELL-HEELED TO TRAVEL WIDELY AND PAY HIS OWN EXPENSES. 




