## WIRELESS ON ITALIAN VESSELS.

"Lloyds-List" weekly summary, for December 31, 1920, published the following:

The "Official Gazette" publishes a decree ordering all motor and sailing vessels of over 1,600 tons and carrying passengers to be supplied with wireless installations.—Reuter. Rome, December 27, 1920.

## OPERATOR'S LICENSE SUSPENDED.

License No. 18115 issued at Seattle, Wash., August 18, 1919, has been canceled on account of the holder using the license before the radio inspector had signed it.

### RATES FOR SWEDEN.

The following information has been received from the Berne International Bureau:

Beginning January 1, 1921, the ship charge for Swedish stations will be 40 centimes per word with a minimum charge of 4 fr. per radiotelegram.

Also, the two first charges indicated in note 44, page 339, of the Official Nomenclature of radiotelegraph stations will be, respectively.

40 centimes and 4 fr. On the other hand, the telegraphic charges under Sweden, B, page 354, and relating to radiotelegrams exchanged with Denmark and Norway will be raised beginning the same date as follows:

a-up to 10 words 1 fr. 96 centimes. b-for each additional word 14 centimes.

For urgent radiotelegrams these last two charges will be trebled.

#### RATES FOR NORWAY.

Beginning January 1, 1921, the coast charges for stations of Bergen, Flekkeroy, Rost, Sorvaagen, Tjome, and Utsire radio stations will be 40 centimes per word, with a minimum charge of 4 fr. per radiotelegram.

#### RATES FOR DENMARK.

Beginning January 1, 1921, the coast charges for Danish stations will be 40 centimes per word, with a minimum charge of 4 fr. per radiotelegram.

#### STRAITS SETTLEMENTS.

The British administration informs us that beginning January 1, 1921, the coast charge for the Penang and Singapore radio stations will be 60 centimes per word.

#### OPERATOR FINED.

An amateur operator in the third radio district has been recently fined, for violation of section 1 of the act of August 13, 1912, in that he failed to obtain a station and an operator's license.

## OPERATOR'S LICENSE SUSPENDED.

License No. 20502 issued at New York, N. Y., November 22, 1919, was suspended for three months, beginning December 13 last, for violation of Article VI of the International Convention.

## HEADQUARTERS PORT OF EIGHTH DISTRICT CHANGED.

The headquarters port of the eighth radio district has been changed from Cleveland, Ohio, to Detroit, Mich. This change should be made in the "Radio Communication Laws of the United States." All communications for the radio inspector in this district should be addressed to the Federal Building, Detroit, Mich.

## INCREASED RATE FOR NEW YORK STATION OF RADIO CORPORATION OF AMERICA.

Effective February 1, this year, the New York station of the Radio Corporation of America, located at 47 West Street, call letters WNY, will charge 10 cents per word for ship service, in lieu of the previous rate which was 6 cents per word.
