## OPERATOR'S LICENSE SUSPENDED.

First-grade license No. 20084, issued at Baltimore, Md., October 17, 1919, has been suspended for a period of three months on account of the holder of the license violating article 6 of the International Convention service regulations, in that he caused superfluous signals to be transmitted.

#### ALASKAN STATIONS NOT OPERATING.

This Bureau has been informed that the radio stations at Cape Edwards, Alaska (KEY), and Port Althorp, Alaska (KI.W), will not open this season.

#### AMENDMENTS.

The Radio Laws and Regulations of the United States, edition August 15, 1919, are

hereby amended as follows:

Paragraph 153, page 67, amended April 9, 1921, is modified by the addition of the following provise: "provided that such renewal of licenses may also be issued in the discretion of the radio inspector where the service record on the back of the license shows 12 months satisfactory service during the two-year period of the license."

## GENERAL INFORMATION FROM THE BERNE INTERNATIONAL BUREAU.

Cyrenacia, Erythrea, Italian Somaliland, and Tripolitana.—Since February 1, last, the coast charge for radiotelegraph stations situated in these colonies has been 0 fr. 60 per word.

Ecuador, Czechoslovakia, Venezuela, and China.—These countries adhered to the International Convention on the following dates: Ecuador, April 17, 1920; Czechoslovakia,

April 23, 1920; Venezuela, August 13, 1920, and China, September 1, 1920.

Hungary.—The radiotelegraph station of Csepel will transmit, each day, at 11.30 a. m. (Central European time) the bulletin of the Meteorological Institute and the earth's magnetism to Budapest.

Dutch East Indies.—Working hours for the coast station Sitoebondo are as follows: Week days and nolidays, 7-8 a. m., 11-12 a. m., 1,30-7 p. m., 10-11 p. m.; Sunday,

1.30-7 p. m.

Turkey.—Normal time has been reestablished in this country.

French East Africa.—The Minister of French Colonies advises that the following class of radiotelegrams are not admitted: Radiotelegrams with paid reply, mandatory radiotelegrams, radiotelegrams with collections, radiotelegrams asking receipted acknowledgement, radiotelegrams with charges to follow, radiotelegrams with service taxes, and urgent radiotelegrams.

France, Algeria, and Portugal.—The legal time in these countries has been advanced

one hour.

## WEATHER CODE FOR VESSEL WEATHER OBSERVERS.

The U. S. Weather Bureau will issue a new edition of its "Radiographic Weather Code for Vessel Weather Observers," which will become effective June 1, 1921, and

supersede all previous editions.

The new code book will be ready for distribution about May 1, 1921, and it is expected that the edition will be sufficient for the requirements of all vessel weather observers as well as all Government-controlled vessels having need for it. Application should be made in person or by letter to the Weather Bureau offices in Washington, D. C., New York, New Orleans, Seattle, San Francisco, or Honolulu. If practicable, the old code book should be returned with the application for the new code.

The principal changes in the code are as follows: Time of observation changed from 6 a. m. and 6 p. m. to 7 a. m. and 7 p. m., seventy-fifth meridian time. Position of ships to be reported to nearest six minutes of latitude and longitude instead of to

nearest even minute.

No change has been made in the code words except those pertaining to ship's position. The tables containing these words have been simplified and the number of words materially reduced. In all other respects radiograms prepared from the new code can be decoded by use of previous code books.

Masters of ships are requested to secure a copy of the new code book as soon as possible; but to provide for unavoidable delays the new code words for ship's position will be published in early issues of the Hydrographic Office Pilot Chart.

Observers are urged to read the few pages of text carefully and as soon after receipt of the book as is possible, as minor changes have been made which affect some of the details of the observation work.—From Hydrographic Bulletin, April 20, 1921.
