We have just received a letter from a representative of a large radio advertiser, who states that he was interested in the editorial contained in our March 8th issue. This editorial projected our opinion that the majority of radio programs were determined in their appeal by the letters written to the broadcasting station and the advertiser, and that since only a minority of the radio audience wrote letters expressing their opinion of the program, and that minority preferred a particular type of program, this type of program was the one most usually selected for presentation, under the impression that it had been selected by a "representative part of the people listening in to the programs." The letter then goes on to state that how an opinion can be obtained from the non-writing type of listeners would certainly be of great interest to us. Your reply will be kept strictly confidential."

The writer of this letter evidently expected us to include in our reply some dark, secret formula for extracting from unwilling letter-writers an opinion of a broadcast program; some such formula, for example, as an alchemist of old would present to one who wished to know how to extract gold from one of the baser metals. But we are no practical alchemist, and we have no formulas guaranteed to transmute the silence of a part of the radio audience into enthusiastic expressions of opinion. We can, however, offer our opinion of the course which advertisers would do well to follow in this matter, and, provided that our correspondent was not being merely cynical, this should be of some encouragement.

When an artist hangs one of his paintings up in a public gallery he quite naturally expects that a certain percentage of those who view it will express their opinion of his work to him or to the gallery attendant. But we have yet to hear of an artist who tabulated these expressions as "for" and "against," and regulated his future work along these lines by the preponderance of one class of opinion over the others. The wise painter realizes that of the many people who saw his painting only a few were willing to voice their opinion, and the opinion of those few was by no means representative. Inasmuch as it was impossible to elicit an expression from all who saw his picture the artist would, in future paintings, follow the dictates of his own tastes, secure in the knowledge that if the work pleased him it would also be pleasing to

thousands of people whose tastes in art were as elevated as his own.

If De Vinci, Michalengello, Rembrandt, and, to delve into another field, Wagner, Beethoven and Liszt had abided by the opinions of the people who were quick to voice their dislike for anything even slightly unconventional, what would have become of the works of art which have been such a joy and inspiration to the people who lived at the time they were produced as well as those of the future? And do the sponsors of our broadcast programs of today really believe that when they have produced and put on the air a program which shall rank as a classic they will be made aware of this fact by the letters which they receive?

Our advice to advertisers, which is, after all, only our own opinion, and carries no weight other than that of the argument above, can be deduced from what has preceded. We suggest that the commercial sponsors of broadcast programs disregard entirely the letters which come pouring in after each broadcast; disregard them, that is, as an indication of the quality of the program. As a means of creating an enthusiasm in the minds of a certain percentage of the radio audience for the product advertised, letters, and contests, and other such forms of ballyhoo probably have their uses. There are undoubtedly thousands of listeners who have become well acquainted with the trade name of a certain product thru repeatedly writing to the advertiser requesting a sample, and stating that "I enjoy your program very much." However, we doubt the value of such testimonials, or even those which have been sent unsolicited, as an indication of public opinion.

Finally, we suggest to our correspondent, and to commercial sponsors in general, that they cease searching for nonexistent straws in the wind. If they, the advertisers, are satisfied that their program is produced by competent people, that the artists are in every respect satisfying, and that the whole is presented to the listeners in a satisfactory manner, why not allow the program to stand on its own merits? There is no royal road to a knowledge of the quality of a broadcast program, and one of the least reliable of the paths to this knowledge is that of letters from listeners.

# GORDON QUARTET TO PLAY IN SWIFT "GARDEN HOUR"

A quartet of the youngest musicians ever to reach the heights in ensemble playing in America will be guest artists in the Swift "Garden Hour" program which will be broadcast Sunday from 2:30 to 3 P. M. over NBC and KYW. The program, sponsored by the Vigoro plant food division of Swift and Company, is the sixth of a series of 13 Sunday broadcasts over the same network.

The quartet, Jacques Gordon, its leader, Josef Vieland, Edwin Eidler and Nahoun Benditsky, have played before the most critical audiences in the country, according to its sponsors. They have given 12 concerts under the auspices of the Library of Congress and appeared in recitals at Yale University, the Boston Public Library and the festival at the Congressional Library in Washington, D. C.

Jacques Gordon received his early musical training in Odessa, Russia, his birthplace, and came to the United States at the age of 13. His musical career was a series of many successes until in 1921 le was made concert master of the Chicago Symphony Concert, the youngest musician ever to be appointed to this post with a major symphony orchestra. He recently resigned from this post, in order to devote all his time with his quartet.

For his garden talk during the "Garden Hour" broadcast, Sunday, Swift and Company's Master Gardener has chosen the subject: "Man's Love of the Soil."

#### "LIEBESTRAUM" BY CRAWFORD

Jesse Crawford, Royal Poet of the Organ, has prepared a special arrangement of Frank Liszt's "Liebestraum" for his program during the Royal Typewriter Hour on WBBM and the Columbia Broadcasting System, Sunday from 9 to 9:30 P. M.

The remainder of the program will include songs by Paul Small, tenor, and medleys of popular request hits played on the organ by Crawford. Louis A. Witten will be in charge of production and will announce the broadcast.

Liszt wrote three short tone poems for piano which he called "Liebestraum." The first two he gives a subtitle of Nocturne, but they are in reality "Songs Without Words," as they are in truth simple songs of several stanzas which the piano decorates by cadenza and accompaniment.

The most famous of the three is this Liebestraum in A flat, published in 1850 as a piano solo. Liszt originally used this melody as a song, which was set to the poem by Ferdinand Freiligrath (1810-1876), a German Revolutionary poet, who in his youth wrote many charming lyrics reflective of Romanticism. His poem "O Love" made a very deep impression on Liszt, who first used it as a song, then as this transcription.

#### PHIL SPITALNY



The versatile orchestra leader pictured above ranks as one of the most popular conductors in the country, winning triumph after triumph whereever he appears both as a purveyor of dance tunes and the more soothing music. Before coming to Chicago for an engagement at the Edgewater Beach Hotel Spitalny ranked as one of the "Big Four" among eastern conductors of dance bands. Since arriving here he has taken the middle west by storm, not only because of the infectious gaiety and rhythm of his dance music but because of his unusual versatility, which permits him to interpret the greatest of classical selections with the same ease with which he directs his orchestra thru the mazes of modern dance tunes.

Phil is the younger brother of Chicago's own H. Leopold. He believes that radio listeners are sentimental—dancers are not. "The average person sitting at home beside the fire and listening to the radio," Spitalny declares, "like a much quieter type of music than those who have 'gone out' somewhere for a good time." #### PHILHARMONIC. CONCERT

One of Dvorak's lesser-known works, "Othello" overture, will open the concert by the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, under the direction of Arturo Toscanini, at 2:15 P. M. Sunday, to be broadcast from the Brooklyn Academy of Music over WMAQ and the nationwide Columhia network

The overture was originally written as part of a trilogy, in which the three movements, "In der Natur," "Carneval" and "Othello" represented pictures of childhood, youth and manhood. But the composer was persuaded to issue the works separately, although at one of the Richter concerts in 1897, the three were played in succession according to the original plan. The first and third have been overshadowed in popularity by the "Carneval," but "Othello" contains, in contrast with the joyous amours of youth, a musical characterization of the deeper passions and tragedies of the soul.

Generally regarded as the greatest living symphonic composer, Jean Sibelius, the Finnish patriot and nationalist, is represented in the program by his Fourth Symphony in A minor. This is one of eight orchestral works in this form, and reflects the consistent attitude of Sibelius, mingling a profound love of nature with a grave and almost melancholic meditation.

During the intermission which follows the symphony the music will be described by Olin Downes, the distinguished critic, and the concert will conclude with Richard Strauss' "Don Quixote," which he described as "fantastic variations on a theme of knightly character." The program:

# HINTS FOR NBC APPLICANTS

An invisible jury sits in judgment on the qualifications of those who aspire for places on the entertainers' staff of the new mid-west "radio center" of the National Broadcasting Company at Chicago

center" of the National Broadcasting Company at Chicago.

Applicants for these positions are first classified by Miss Elena De-Marco, assistant to A. W. Kaney, program director. From their training and experience she gathers some idea of whether they are even ready for an audition. In the event they are, the time is set. When the applicants assemble they are taken into one of the studios, while Miss De-Marco goes into the studio control room where she can hear them through a reproducer. Special notices, giving the time of auditions, are sent to all the department heads. In the office of each is a large RCA reproducer, and each department head dials in the particular studio where the audition is to be held. Thus, these ten or twelve men are enabled to judge the qualifications of the applicant without ever leaving their own offices. The entertainers, themselves, are unaware of this jury, and insofar as they can tell, there is no one listening except the persons in the control room.

These "secret hearings" are better from a psychological viewpoint, it has been found. As a rule, entertainers appearing for an audition are somewhat nervous. Were they to be taken into a studio where there were ten or twelve people sitting around, it would only magnify their nervous state. As it is, they are able to present their numbers uninfluenced by the thought that people are watching them.

# THE POPE SPEAKS TO AMERICA

Frequent rebroadcasts in the near future from HVJ in the Vatican City were forecast following the successful completion of the initial Papal radio program Thursday (February 12).

No definite arrangement for a regular schedule of programs has been made as yet but experimental work inaugurated three weeks ago will be enlarged upon. In order to determine the fullest possibilities of rebroadcasts from the Vatican much of the testing by engineers under his direction will be conducted on a twenty-four-hour-a-day basis. Particular attention will be focused on atmospheric conditions and signal strength at various hours of the day and night.

Radio officals were particularly impressed with interest displayed by the listening public Thursday in the informal two-way conversations put on the air following the Vatican City station ceremonies.

The United States, England, Brazil, Argentina, Canada, Australia, the Philippines, South Africa and other countries rebroadcast the ceremonies to hundreds of millions of listeners. Seven shortwave stations in this country supplemented the Vatican station and the regular NBC chains by rebroadcasting the program to remote corners of the earth.

England, unable to receive HVJ's signals satisfactorily, depended upon a relay through the General Electric shortwave station at Schenectady for the program and reported highly satisfactory results. All sections of the world reported remarkable reception. The Rev. Father Edmund Walsh, of Georgetown University, radioed he had listened to the broadcast aboard the trans-Atlantic liner Bremen fifteen hundred miles from New York.

Senatore Marconi advised that four hours after the program concluded the Vatican State telegraph station operating at high speed capacity, had received 400 telegrams and cables Thousands more were expected within the next few days.

NBC officals later declared that the results obtained justified the two years of experimentation, research and chart making in connection with shortwave broadcasting. Two years ago NBC attempted this task, in the hope that every fireside would become a front seat at all world events. With ever increasing frequency, engineers have brought to the ears of radio listeners the voices of foreign notables, the descriptions of interesting events and special messages from abroad.

The Papal broadcast climaxed this long work as the greatest and most successful international broadcast yet attained. Particular tribute to the genius of Senatore Marconi, builder of the Vatican City station, was paid.

#### **NEW CBS OFFERINGS**

The ever-changing panorama of radio, with new programs, new artists and new methods of presentation insistently pressing for attention, was never more vividly illustrated than during the first two months of 1931.

A survey of the features heard over the Columbia Broadcasting System reveals that twenty-two sponsored programs and thirteen major sustaining presentations have been inaugurated since January 1.

One outstanding development in this freshening vista has been the entrance of a new group of radio personalities into national favor through the medium of fifteen-minute "recitals." The case best known, perhaps, is that of Morton Downey whose high and unusual tenor voice has found its way into nation-wide popularity almost over-night. His audience mail has grown extravagantly and through dint of his radio activities he contracted for a series of personal appearances at theatres at a weekly salary of \$5,500.

Other entertainers who have been heard in the new policy of presentation are Lee Morse, character singer; Art Gillhan, "The Whispering Pianist"; Mary Charles, featured in her own song vignettes; Barbara Maurel, whose contralto voice is heard on a special program, and Ben Alley, tenor, who appears with Ann Leaf, organist, every Saturday night.

Because of the great influx of sponsored programs since the advent of the new year lack of air time has limited other new sustaining features. A number, however, have merited particular attention. The most important is the Columbia Concerts Corporation Program, one of the results of the merger of seven important concert bureaus by the broadcasting system. There have been brought before the microphone on this feature such artists as Florence Easton, Max Rosen, Nelson Eddy, Luella Melius and Ernest Hutcheson.

Through the efforts of Georgia Backus, Columbia's Director of Dramatics, listeners-in have been enabled to attend a series of experimental laboratory plays, presented each Wednesday night. These productions, written expressly for radio, constitute an innovation in radio dramatics, contributing unusual effects in script acts. "Split Seconds" and "Murder in the Studio" are examples of plays already presented.

"Radio Roundup," corralling different guest artists each week, together with a forty-piece orchestra under Freddie Rich, has provided a fast-moving musical program on Thursday nights. Returning after a year off the air Don Clark's "Story in a Song," a dramatic and musical offering, returned to the air-waves in February.

Twenty-two sponsored programs, embracing virtually every type of radio entertainment, and bringing to the studios talent from every branch of show business, have had "opening nights" since the first of the year.

These features, many of which are heard several times weekly, include the Simmons Program, Dutch Masters, Three Bakers, Golden Blossom Honey Orchestra, Eno Crime Club, Sunkist Musical Cocktail, Wallace Silversmiths, Oxol Feature, Daddy and Rollo, Graham-Paige, Bond Bread Program, Sweethearts of the Air, Peter Pan Forecasts, Devils, Drugs and Doctors; Old Gold Character Readings, March of Time, Blue Ribbon Malt Jester, Chiclet Chuckles and Uneeda Bakers.

On these programs have appeared such celebrities as Julia Sanderson and Frank Crumit, Edgar Guest with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra under Victor Kolar, Lillian Taiz, Mary Pickford, Bebe Daniels, Leo Reisman, Beniamino Gigli, Richie Craig, Jr., Dr. Howard W. Haggard, Associate Professor of Physiology at Yale; Captain Edward Molyneux and Maggy Rouff.

New dance orchestras also have appeared. Frank Winegar and his Pennsylvanians, now playing at the Village Barn, New York, and Noble Sissle's Orchestra, entertaining at the Princesse Resturant, Park Avenue, are two bands that already have established popularity. Both are under contract exclusively with the Columbia System.

Nor is there a tendency to let the existing broadcasting situation stand. Within a few weeks a number of other features will have been added for the nation's radio fans—the new blending with the old in the everchanging panorama.

#### DON BERNARD



Like so many others who have made their mark in the radio world, Don Bernard, program advisor of NBC's Chicago studios and director of the Great Northern Railway's "Empire Builders" dramas, started out with the ambition of being a singer.

After a short career in music following study at Ohio Wesleyan University and the Bush Conservatory of Music in Chicago, Mr. Bernard was bitten by the radio bug. He became program director of a small station in Ohio, then went to New York with NBC, and later was transferred to Chicago as program manager.

In accounting for the popularity of the Great Northern's Monday night playlets, due credit must be given the lavish musical setting which is provided for each program. "Built" would be a better word, for Mr. Bernard and Josef Koestner, conductor of the Great Northern orchestra, collaborate in writing a great deal of original music for this program, as well as in working out special arrangements, all of which are painstakingly designed to strengthen and make more effective the dramatic action of the story, developing expectancy, creating suspense, suggesting danger or discord and the countless other opportunities afforded by each script to play upon the emotions of the listeners and make them really "feel" the reality of the story and actually "live" it with the actors.

There is probably no better example on the air today of the employment of music to strengthen dramatic effect or to beautify a dramatic presentation than the music which not only surrounds but is a vital part of every Great Northern production.

In addition to his work on Empire Builders, Mr. Bernard is the director of two outstanding musical presentations, "Armour Hour" and "Maytag."

## THE CYNIC

What a lot of hokum one can imbibe in a single adventurous expedition up the dial! Where formerly the cultists, the fadists, and those enthusiastic but misguided old women of both sexes who believed they had discovered a cure for all the ills to which the flesh is prone, were limited to a small circle which included their friends and the friends of their friends, today one can find them all teaching out greedily for more and more followers via the radio. Even the chains are not averse to giving a certain amount of time each week gratis to some demented person who believes himself or herself (usually herself) to be a "voice crying in the wilderness."

One night last week I started at the top of the dial, working down, and found no less than four cults represented. After listening to their line of hokum I was surprised that so few people really become converts. All are forceful, convincing speakers, all use phrases and catchwords which any advertising man would be proud to call his own, and they are all either students of psychology or complete fools, I haven't yet decided which. The two broadcasts which I thought worthy of mention were those of Dr. P. L. Clark, who has started a school of "Sanitology" and who spouts from WCHI, and Lorna Fantin's Numerology program on the Columbia chain.

The Doctor opens his program by shouting in a stentorian voice, "The whiter the bread, the sooner you're dead!" which he follows up with, "adios means good-bye in Spanish but operation means bood-bye in every language." For those among his audience who may still be skeptical, he advances countless proofs. He proves (?) that starch and proteins, when eaten together, are fatal to human beings; he proves that the medical "trust" is envious of his reputation, and is slandering him in their official organ; he proves that all medical men are quacks and fakers, and he proves, most convincingly of all, that he is just another nut who thinks he has discovered a cure-all.

Lorna Fantin goes about her mission a little less ruthlessly, and a little more "high-hat," which is the reason she broadcasts over a large chain. Nevertheless, there is mor hokum spilled in her fifteen minute program than in that of Dr. Clark. All life, it seems, moves in cycles of 9 years. If you were born during a 1 year, you will be rich and powerful; being born in a 2 year makes one discontented and unhappy. Miss Fantin has a fine radio voice, and when she speaks of the "magnetic, electric 5" the listener would infer, if said listener couldn't understand English, that she was saying something of tremendous importance. I venture to guess that money is Miss Fantin's one idol, for money is sprinkled liberally thru her talk. "Tomorrow," she will say, "is a money day," or, "the 2 person will make a lot of money" Miss Fantin is no doubt a 2 person, for no one less fortunate could get away with the stuff she does and get paid for it.
