THE FOLIO DIAL

IF YOU GENERALLY JUST "TURN THE RADIO ON AND LEAVE IT" ...

Use "FM Guide" to select your station. You see what's on *now* and *what's coming* for several hours ahead on any station you select. Use "FM Guide" to check what you're listening to.

IF YOU REGULARLY TUNE TO ONE FAVORITE STATION ...

Use "FM Guide" just as you would an individual station program guide. It's complete from sign-on to sign-off, and your station appears in the same place on the page for each day.

IF YOU ARE A SELECTIVE LISTENER ...

Scan across the "dial", from left to right at any time level (6:00 P.M. is the prominent band across the page), you'll see *all the programs then in progress*, and approximately where you'll find them on your own radio dial.

EACH STATION SEPARATELY;
IN ORDER OF BROADCAST FREQUENCY;
COMPLETE FROM SIGN-ON TO SIGN-OFF

You Can See ...

ALL PROGRAMS IN PROGRESS (without turning the page or checking back).

THE MAYNARD REPORT

A newsletter devoted to FM,

1970 IS FM'S YEAR — *Broadcasting Magazine* (January 26, 1970) summed up the outlook: "Only FM radio comes off solidly strong in *Broadcasting's* exploration of the radio outlook, emerging as the brightest prospect, with many industry spokesmen seeing 1970 as the year FM radio blossoms into its won as an advertising vehicle of significance."

The record industry declares that stereo FM radio is the single, **BIGGEST INFLUENCE ON STEREO BOOMED-UP RECORD SALES.** Two-thirds of American homes now have record players, and once the listener discovered the superior virtues of stereo sound on records, he then wanted it on his radio receiver. Only stereo FM radio can give the listener high quality stereo on radio. Listeners to stereo records now audition their records, first on stereo FM radio, then make a commitment to buy them. Very few record companies now make monaural records, and very few record outlets now have listening booths on the premises. Stereo FM radio now serves the same role as the many listening booths of old-time record shops. **STEREO FM RADIO** pre-sells the record buyer, so now, the record buyer shops for price after having decided what to buy before he goes into a record shop. This explains the success of the discount record stores, and the record and tape clubs.

STEREO FM RADIO CONTINUES TO EXPLODE — total audience is up 10,000 percent since 1960—purchases of FM receivers are up 620 percent since 1960.

In the greater New York area, WRFM (105.1) joins the top ten radio stations (out of a total of 79 radio stations in the Metropolitan area, AM and FM), knocking WNBC-AM out of the top ten.

Ten stereo FM radio stations are in the top twenty-five (according to the ARB Report, October/November 1969). Many stereo FM stations have doubled their audience in the last six months. Some stereo FM radio stations—such as WRFM, have quadrupled their audience, and WRFM is now in second place among FM stations.

WOR-FM is now seventh among all radio stations, and first among FM stations; WNEW-FM is twelfth among all radio stations, and third among FM stations; WPAT-FM is fourteenth among all radio stations, and fourth among FM stations.

The top stereo FM stations, following the previously mentioned stations, are ranked in this order: WVNJ-FM, WPIX-FM, WTFM, WQXR-FM (ahead of WQXR-AM), WCBS-FM, and WABC-FM in the greater New York area.

Many of the top-rated AM stations in the greater New York area are "talkers": WOR-AM (number one), WINS-AM (number four) and WCBS-AM (number five). Some AMers like WMCA-AM (number six) are changing to a greater talk format. In the New York Metropolitan area, 25 stations are now stereo. Stereo FM stations are making it with the youth; such as WOR-FM, which is now the number one rated FM station in the country. Some like WRFM which is making it with men 35-49, and is delivering more audience in this category than any other station in the greater New York area.

ALL STEREO FM STATIONS IN THE GREATER NEW YORK AREA ARE MOVING UP AND OVERTAKING THE

AM STATIONS. AM STATIONS ARE WORRIED. IS AM TO BECOME AN ALL-TALK, NEWS, NO-MUSIC MEDIUM?

"Youth market coming on strong," according to **AUDIO TIMES**, a leading trade magazine directed at distributors, manufacturers and dealers.

"Component manufacturers and retailers who didn't discover the youth market last year will do so during 1970. The under 25's make up not only the fastest-growing portion of the population as a whole, but the new market for high fidelity components. Indeed, the component industry as a whole will take a youth orientation during the 1970's, forsaking traditional marketing methods and media which appeal to the middle-aged classical music lover in favor of youth-slanted media and music."

FOUR-CHANNEL STEREO is coming on fast and it will really make stereo FM "the musical medium" with the sonic comparison being even more in stereo FM's favor as compared with AM. According to **AUDIO TIMES**, "Four-channel stereo will receive lots of attention this year from the fan magazines, and you'll (dealers) get lots of questions about four-channel equipment. It won't seriously hurt sales of existing equipment."

Hopefully by the time you read this Report, **WNYC-FM WILL HAVE BROADCAST THE FIRST, FOUR-CHANNEL STEREO BROADCAST FROM ONE TRANSMITTER.** At this writing, plans are to broadcast the first, four-channel (Scheiber System) broadcast on my regular "Men of Hi-Fi" program, March 15, 10:00 to 11:00 p.m., to be followed up and broadcast at a press party hosted by Fisher Radio on March 16 in the Time/Life building from 1:00 to 3:30 p.m. The general public will not be able to hear the four-channel broadcast show but they will hear a compatible system off the air. They will hear a good monophonic, or two-channel stereo signal on their present FM receiver or tuner.

SCHEIBER'S SYSTEM is an add-on device and has this virtue: the Scheiber Decoder can be used with current equipment and can play four-channel records or two-channel pre-recorded tapes with conventional equipment, i.e.: record players, tape cartridge players and current stereo tape recorders. The Scheiber Decoder can sell for less than \$100.00 (in mass production), and be placed between pre-amplifiers and amplifiers. Of course, it will require another stereo amplifier and two extra rear speakers.

COMPATIBILITY IS THE VIRTUE OF THE SCHEIBER SYSTEM. Four-channel stereo is not a gimmick to sell more hi-fi equipment. Many manufacturers resisted it at first, and now they realize that some form of four-channel stereo is inevitable. The big question is, what methods will be adopted? Not will four-channel stereo be adopted?

YOUTH WILL LOVE FOUR-CHANNEL STEREO. Shakespeare talked about music's effect on people, "music has the charms to sooth the savage beast." Four-channel stereo won't sooth, but it will bring a far greater dimension than two-channel stereo to music, and the youth who like to immerse themselves in sound will really have found "their medium."

Your reporters conceive this role to expedite the demonstrations of all four-channel systems, possible for the market place.
