**HE VOICES FORD PHILOSOPHY; HE TAKES THE RAP FOR IT. HE IS W. J. CAMERON!**

I WAS going to interview Henry Ford, and then, suddenly, my position was reversed. I, the interviewer, was being interviewed. Not by Henry Ford. I had not yet gotten to him, and when I did he answered my questions frankly and freely. I was being interviewed by a short, stout, gray little man with spectacles who stands as a buffer between Ford and the world at large. Before you enter the presence of Henry Ford you can be sure that William J. Cameron knows all about you. That's part of his job.

When you do get in to talk with the motor magnate, the chances are ten to one that Cameron will be there, a guardian angel hovering over his employer. Another part of his job is to see that Ford's quick, unguarded and offhand comments are explained so that there will be no danger of misconstruction. What Mr. Ford has to say, he'll explain, is important, Mr. Ford being Mr. Ford. And he'll take a puzzling, enigmatic, ten-word statement by Ford and expand it into a clear-cut paragraph. As a result, most of the polished and crystal-clear Ford quotations you read in the papers have been thoroughly strained through the Cameron mind and, more often than not, actually reach the public through the Cameron lips. In short, William J. Cameron is Ford's voice, almost Ford's other self,

for, from his close daily contact with the manufacturer, he knows his employer's views and principles as well as Ford himself.

To the radio listening public, Cameron has become something of a personalization of the Ford Motor Company. Ford is seldom heard on the radio, but every Sunday evening the announcer on the "Ford Sunday Evening Hour" breaks into the music with this announcement:

"You will hear from William J. Cameron of the Ford Motor Company."

The voice comes from a microphone on the stage of the Masonic Auditorium in Detroit. On the stage are musicians whose program has just been interrupted by the voice. Across the footlights sit five thousand guests, many from far away, who have come to see the great symphony orchestra in action, to see the famous guest star—maybe Marian Anderson or Lawrence Tibbett or Grace Moore. But they've come, too, to see William Cameron, spokesman for Ford.

"So that's William Cameron." They seem surprised. If they had met him on a village street they might have taken him for the village preacher or perhaps the editor of the local paper. And their estimate would have been surprisingly accurate. Cameron has been both a preacher and a newspaperman, and this, in a way, accounts for his ease of expression with both pen and tongue.

William Cameron is fast becoming an American institution. His Sunday night talks, repeated in the high and low places of America, are beginning to be recognized as shrewd commentaries on the American scene. They have acquired a weight and an importance almost unequalled elsewhere. And behind each talk, the formula which has made Cameron a success is easily recognized. When times are good, he points a warning finger. When times are bad, he sees the workings of a Divine Providence which hardens men's souls in the fires of adversity so that their sinews will be toughened and their hearts softened. He may talk on the significance of Christmas, the place of labor in a democracy, or on the spiritual nourishment of walking under budding trees in the spring. The formula is always there.

But no matter what the subject, the Cameron talk will be beautifully done. The message will be one of wisdom and the voice will be tempered by experience. It is perhaps one of radio's best-known voices. The surprising thing is that the man behind the voice is so little known.

Cameron will be sixty-one years old on December 29. His clothes—neat grays and blue serges—are perhaps as indicative of his retiring, self-effacing personality as any other physical aspect of the man. For one who speaks so confidently and with such poise, he is surprisingly shy in his personal relationships.

Cameron was born of a Canadian father who emigrated to Detroit from Canada when William John was but four years of age. There the elder Cameron lived out his days, voting, believing himself an American citizen. It was in 1935, while planning a trip abroad, that Cameron went to the State Department for a passport, learned that his father had never taken out second citizenship papers in the belief that he needed only his first papers. Detroit chuckled

when Cameron went into a Federal court there to be sworn to citizenship, for here was a man who preached Americanism on every occasion.

As a boy, Cameron loved oratory above all things, and his two boyhood idols were Bob Ingersoll and William Jennings Bryan. It didn't matter to him that they were poles apart in philosophy and beliefs, they were united for him in the silver-tongued quality of their oratory. At nineteen he moved towards achieving his ambition to become a lingual giant by accepting a post as minister of a small church in Brooklyn, Michigan. Six years later he gave up this post to take a reporting job with the *Detroit News*.

As uncommunicative about himself in those days as he is today, Cameron was still no recluse, and on occasions even tipped a few glasses with fellow newspapermen and told stories in a rich Scotch dialect. A favorite story, one which remains to this day a local classic, concerned the Scotch parson who became tipsy and the misfortunes which befell him.

In those days he was thin and short—he stands only five feet six inches high today—and his contemporaries remember him as a "little skinny guy who seemed to be afraid of his own shadow." That first impression, however, failed to keep him from becoming known as a chap who could write like a house afire, and almost before he knew it he was writing the sheet's editorials. Many of his editorials are still included in journalism text-books today.

IT WAS Cameron's fame as an editorial writer that prompted Ford to hire him for the editorial page of the *Dearborn Independent*, Mr. Ford's own weekly which he hoped to build up into a weekly of national importance. There Cameron really found himself. His duty was to write things that Ford wanted written, and his amazing facility to take an unpromising topic or one hopelessly involved and turn it into a clear and readable piece of writing soon won him complete editorship of the *Independent*. It was under his editorship that the weekly attacked the international Jewish bankers, with the result that a Jewish attorney, Aaron Sapiro, sued Mr. Ford. Cameron then testified that he, as editor, conceived and wrote the campaign and that Mr. Ford had nothing to do with it. The case, you may remember, was settled out of court and the paper was discontinued.

It was then that Cameron became a member of Ford's secretarial staff, and his particular duties were to arrange Ford's contacts with the world. It was in this position that Cameron grew to his full stature. He is not just a buffer between the boss and the world. He is a human sounding-board for the great industrialist and a public-relations counsel of the first water. A good public-relations man, he has committed himself to a permanent selflessness to become almost a part of the magnate he serves. When he speaks in public, he speaks the thoughts of Henry Ford garnished by his own rich words. His home life is almost as selfless.

When he has finished his day's work at his office in the Ford Motor Company's enormous establishment at Dearborn, he goes to a modest home on a modest Dearborn street. His four children, grown, no longer live with him, and it is a quiet place as befits the home of a quiet, successful man and his modest wife. He was married during his preaching

days to a Brooklyn (Michigan) girl. There is nothing unusual about the house except the two libraries. One is on the second floor, the other on the first, and they are jammed with hundreds of volumes of every conceivable type. In one of these libraries, after a quiet dinner, the voice of the "Sunday Evening Hour" is muted as its owner seeks, among these volumes, the inspiration or the information that will go into the next Sunday night radio talk.

His outstanding quality or character trait—and one which should, by all the laws of human relations, have doomed him to a life of mediocrity and failure rather than success—is his total lack of personal aggressiveness. Typical of this is the brief note he allowed to be printed concerning himself in the latest edition of "Who's Who In America." It reads:

Cameron, William John; b. Hamilton, Ontario, Dec. 29, 1878. Hon. LL.D., Alma, (Mich.) and Washington and Jefferson Colls. m. Eleanor Maude Clough, Brooklyn, Mich., 1901; 4 children. Has lived in Detroit, Mich., since 1887; on editorial staff The Detroit News 1903-18; with Ford Motor Company since 1918. Home: Dearborn, Mich.

Any secretary to a crossroads congressman would find it tough to boil his own life down to a starker outline, but for Cameron it was an easy job. He can take a few words of Henry Ford and expand them into a column of type, but he looks at himself simply as an instrument of expression and plays down his own personality on every occasion.

He spends his week-ends on his farm in the Irish Hills, near the little town of Brooklyn where he once preached. Walking over the rolling hills and beside the shimmering lakes, he finds a quiet delight in nature which lends a freshness to the figures of speech with which he adorns his talks. Here, perhaps, in his solitude he thinks his own thoughts and forgets, for a little while, the wheels of industry which he helps to keep turning in a world not far away. Perhaps, years before, he walked in these same spots as he composed the sermons he preached to the circumscribed flock he herded there, little dreaming that his words would one day be heard from Maine to California and farther.

He does not play golf or cards. He has no intimate circle of friends. More and more he seems to be turning to the Bible for the faith and comfort which men begin to seek as they feel the years press upon them. More and more his speeches are sprinkled with references to the Old Testament; more and more do they reflect the sonorities of the King James version; more and more do they echo the rolling periods of the Hebrew prophets.

That is, perhaps, as it should be. The man for whom he speaks, Henry Ford, often seems to be made of Old Testament fiber—hard, yet pliant; practical, yet poetic; stern and ruthless, yet often kindly and tolerant. And as long as William J. Cameron is the voice on the "Ford Sunday Evening Hour," you may be sure the voice is expressing the sentiments of Henry Ford.

# AIRIAL TO LOWDOWN

## Rocky Mount welcomes Kay Kyser home; Ed Wynn tries a comeback

NEW YORK.—Kay Kyser, America's No. 1 local boy who made good, returned to his home town, Rocky Mount, N. C., on November 15 and received the greatest ovation and reception I have ever witnessed. It surpassed any homecoming of a local boy who made good that I've ever read about or have ever seen on a movie screen. Our party arrived in Rocky Mount about 9:30 a.m. and there were about five thousand people at the station to greet the town's favorite son. And what a greeting it was! Kay shook at least one thousand hands, he posed for the newsreel camera, and then thanked everyone for the wonderful reception. Then he and his troupe were taken through the New Ricks Hotel and out the back way, where cars were waiting to take them to his mother's home. I caught up with them there about an hour later and found the house jammed with friends. One of them was an old colored preacher who worked for the Kysers years ago, and when he walked in he told Kay and his mother he would like to say a prayer for them. It was so beautiful, they just couldn't help shed a few tears.

Kay was having an awful time trying to finish his breakfast, because people kept walking in and out. He finally had to lock himself up in a small room in order to devour his bacon and eggs, toast and coffee. At 11 a.m. the visitors were taken on a tour of the tobacco-auction market, and you can take my word for it, the chant of the tobacco auctioneer you hear on Kyser's program is very authentic. But I still can't conceive how anyone can understand what they're saying. At 1 p.m. a private buffet luncheon was given for Kay and his friends at the country club. The giant parade, which included the bands from the Rocky Mount High School and the University of North Carolina, Kay's alma maters, got under

way at 3 p.m. and was witnessed by at least 40,000 people, who not only lined the streets but hung out of windows and from the rooftops. In the reviewing-stand were such notables as the Governor of North Carolina, Clyde R. Hoey, Rocky Mount's Mayor J. Q. Robinson, senators, judges and many other political biggies. The most amusing thing in the parade was a huge sign mounted on a car, reading, "All is forgiven, Kay—the teachers of Rocky Mount High School welcome you."

From 5:00 to 6:30 p.m. a reception and buffet dinner was given at the Ricks Hotel for the visitors and invited guests. From there the party went to the theater for the world premiere of Kay's new RKO picture, "That's Right, You're Wrong," which was followed by his regular weekly Lucky Strike broadcast. You'll enjoy the picture, because it's good entertainment and it will show you just what takes place in the studio during a regular "College of Musical Knowledge" broadcast. The songs from the picture, "The Answer Is Love," "Happy Birthday to Love," "I'm Fit to Be Tied," "Chatterbox" and "The Little Red Foxes," should land on the Hit Parade very soon. Next stop was the Kay Kyser homecoming dance at a tobacco warehouse that was converted into a dance hall overnight. No less than 14,000 wild and cheering people jammed their way in, and when I say jammed I mean just that. RADIO GUIDE's expert photographer, Charles Seawood, was at Rocky Mount to make a photo record of this gala day. He got some swell pictures of the arrival at the station, the luncheon, the parade, the reception, movie preview, broadcast and dance. Watch for them to appear in the December 22 issue of RADIO GUIDE.

Immediately following his broadcast Kay made another speech, and his last words were, "Since 9 o'clock this morn-

ing I've had the biggest thrill of my life. Now I'm going to find someone's shoulder so that I can have a good cry." With that he left the stage, and I don't think it took him very long to carry out his plan.

### Kilocycle Chatter

"Sky Blazers," a dramatization of the personal adventures of airplane pilots, makes its debut over CBS on Saturday, December 9 . . . The ten biggest news stories of 1939 will be dramatized over the NBC-Blue network on Sunday, December 31 . . . "Cavalcade of America," heard in former years over CBS, switches to the NBC-Blue net when it comes back very shortly and will be heard following the "Information, Please" program . . . Pick and Pat are being considered for a new air show . . . The same goes for Ed Wynn . . . Walter O'Keefe will be looking for a new sponsor soon. His current program folds soon . . . Mort Lewis folded his "Fun With the Famous" program and will try to find a sponsor for it. He didn't want to use up too many big names on a sustaining basis.

### Behind the Scenes

Immediately after his broadcasts from the NBC newsroom each week, Walter Winchell is swamped with phone calls from listeners. Last Sunday night I waited for the newsscooper to show him an advance copy of RADIO GUIDE with the photo-tour of the "Jergens Journal" broadcasts. The phone rang and the voice on the other end asked for Mr. Winchell. Walter got on the phone and all the caller could say was, "I'm sorry, I can't talk to you, I lost my nerve," and hung up. Getting back to the Winchell pictures that appeared in the last issue of RADIO GUIDE, Walter told us that his wife thought they were the best he's ever taken.

Kate Smith did her broadcast of No-

vember 19 with her head swathed in bandages. She was badly burned while having her hair dressed and insisted on doing her broadcasts despite the pain . . . By mistake he had handed them two front-row seats for their Broadway show, "Streets of Paris," for the following night. Fortunately he found them and made the exchange.

On Saturday nights "See My Lawyer," the New York stage hit starring Milton Berle, doesn't start until 9:05 p.m. They have to hold the curtain because Berle's radio show, "Stop Me If You Heard This One," doesn't get off the air until 9 p.m. and it takes him just about five minutes to rush from NBC to the theater . . . Vernon Crane, whose "Story Book" is heard over NBC, has decided not to do the story that he had planned about an elephant. Not so long ago he did a story of Trilby the Turtle and a listener in San Francisco sent him a real turtle with "Trilby" painted on her back . . . A listener from Fort Sam Houston, Texas, Mr. J. E. Banks, was tuned in to a recent "Ask-It-Basket" program. He heard Jim McWilliams read a question over the air that he had sent in. In Scranton, Pa., a lady was listening to the same program. It was Mr. Banks' sister and she hadn't seen nor heard of her brother for eleven years and never knew what had happened to him. She put in a long-distance call immediately after the program, and thus long-lost brother and sister were reunited through the power of radio.


#### "Lady" Was No Lady

## FORECAST

**T**O LISTEN to "Die Meistersinger" and Beethoven's Ninth Symphony on the same day is a pretty tall order, but if you have the stamina, try and hear them both. You won't regret it.

The performance of the Ninth marks the end of Toscanini's Beethoven Cycle and of the first part of his season; "Die Meistersinger" inaugurates this year's opera broadcasts. Toscanini returns in March and in the meantime his place in the Saturday night series will be taken by an interesting list of conductors. New conductors will bring out new qualities in the orchestra.

ing, and finally fade into impotence. Prof. Donald Tovey, noted Beethoven authority, imagines that the first movement gives us the tragedy of life; the second develops from sadness to exuberance; the third is beauty like that of the stars in their courses; the last movement realizes and hymns joy completely.

It is certain that some unifying spiritual idea underlies Beethoven's thought in this prodigious and eloquent symphony, for some of its themes recur throughout the score and indicate that it tells some kind of related story. Maybe Prof. Tovey's analysis is the right one.

The other number on this program does not rank, in my belief, with most other large compositions by Beethoven. The form is hybrid and unconvincing. After some early declamatory measures for piano, the chorus intervenes (to

Beethoven was long troubled by doubts before including solo singers and chorus in a symphony. Where was the connection between three instrumental movements and a vocal finale? He must have found it in his own mind, however, for he ultimately embodied the text of Schiller's "Ode to Joy" and set it for singing. Why he did so he never explained.

Others have been busy explaining ever since. Of all the theories, I prefer the one which has Beethoven struggling to express man's pursuit of joy and finding its most spontaneous musical utterance by bursting into song. Just before the human voice is heard, the orchestral instruments seem to be puzzled and grop-

Beethoven's "Prometheus" ballet came to creation in 1800, the year that also saw the premieres of his first symphony and of the Septet, recently performed at the Toscanini series. Some other things of importance happened to the composer in the same twelvemonth. He was in love with Giulietta Guicciardi and Prince Lichnowsky presented him with an annual pension of 600 florins. No wonder Ludwig's music of that period (he was thirty then) expressed more charm than drama.

Gifted Helen Jepson sings the florid aria which ends the first act of "La Traviata" and is heard too in an appealing bit from the rich treasury of Czech folk-song.

The words of "The Last Rose of Summer" are by Tom Moore, famed Irish poet, and he set them to an old Irish air, "The Groves of Blarney." The composer Von Flotow lifted both the text and music and used them as a number in the second act of his "Martha."

THE annual concourse of sound, spectacle and society which the New York almanac records at this time of year is here again, to stay for the next sixteen weeks. That is another way of saying that the Metropolitan Opera House reopened its doors on Monday evening, November 27. (Writers rarely remain factual when they talk about that institution; its musical glamour and Golden Horseshoe seem ever to prompt purple description.)

Yes, glamour is still the chief characteristic of the Metropolitan. However, democracy too is not far away, for directly under the Golden Horseshoe the standees pack a serried circle; and outside the house a multitude of curious plebes gape at the fashionables as they step from their limousines and are flashed by the photographers. Meanwhile society reporters note what Milady wears and by which Mygent she is accompanied.

Recent lean financial years wobbled the Metropolitan a bit occasionally, but always salvaging ways and means were found. Not only New York helped but also the rest of the country, for the great opera house has long been regarded as belonging not alone to New York but to all of America.

Edward Johnson, in his fifth season as general manager, is doing his work well, brilliantly preserving the high standards of former years. Best of all, he has admitted many Americans to his singing-roster. If he were also to produce at least one American opera each year, his batting average would be an even 1,000.

All the old favorites are in the projected casts and repertoire. A score or so of new vocalists have been added (including the young Audition winners, Annamary Dickey and Mack Harrell) and seven long-neglected operas will be revived. Warmly welcome, too, is the return of tenor Lauri-Volpi, so regrettably absent from the Metropolitan for a number of years.

To radio listeners in every section of America the Metropolitan's reopening is doubly welcome. As in other years, the Saturday afternoon broadcasts will continue throughout the season, giving listeners as complete a repertoire of grand opera as the New York socialite who steps into his Golden Horseshoe box one evening a week.

On, then, with the show, and may it shine as brightly as ever for the ticket-buyers and the lucky gratis listeners over the air!



Beckmesser, who criticizes his departure from vocal and poetical rules and brings about his rejection.

However, venerable and benign Hans Sachs, the famous cobbler-poet (also in love with Eva but resigned because of his age to see her marry youth) takes up Walther's cause and invites him to his home. During the night Walther dreams the melody of a beautiful song, which Sachs helps him to formulate and correct. The manuscript is left on Sachs' desk and the interloping Beckmesser steals it. At the contest he sings the song as his own, forgets and bungles it lamentably, and the hooting

WAGNER is not credited with any special sense of humor in his conversation or literary efforts (he wrote a small library of essays), but when he fashioned the libretto of his "Meistersinger" he created in grand opera a comic classic as immortal as Shakespeare's "Merry Wives of Windsor" in the realm of drama.

His John Falstaff is no funnier than Wagner's Sixtus Beckmesser, and the characters are similar also because both fell victims to their own vanity.

Melodious "Meistersinger" had its premiere at Munich in 1868 and was an instantaneous success. Its summarized story (obliging commentator Milton Cross fills in with details for radio listeners) concerns chiefly Hans Sachs, Walther von Stolzing, Beckmesser, and Eva, daughter of the rich Nuremberg (sixteenth century) goldsmith, Pogner. Walther, a cavalier, falls in love at first sight with Eva, whom he sees in church. She is to be the bride of the successful competitor in the public contest of the Minnesingers to take place at the Feast of St. John. The enamored youth enters the contest, but at the preliminary audition, in the same church where he met

Eva, incurs the jealous opposition of

populace chases him from the scene. Then Walther steps forward, delivers the "Prize Song" perfectly and wins the contest and the hand of the lovely Eva. A minor character helpful to Walther is David (apprenticed to Sachs), who loves Magdalene (maid to Eva), and their romance ends happily.

It is an open secret that in the figure of Beckmesser Wagner satirized those music critics of his day whose pedantic conservatism made them oppose his new, radical style of creation and intrigue against his success.

Hardly a German operatic baritone of note has failed to try the role of Sachs, one of the most appealing ever written, and Friedrich Schorr, who sings the role today, is among the best. Nearly every celebrated German tenor has fulfilled his ambition to interpret Walther. The role of Eva is small but altogether sympathetic and entrancingly lyrical. Walter Olitzki, making his American debut today as Beckmesser, has won renown abroad for his particularly sharp characterization of that unhappy suitor. Young Erich Leinsdorf conducts the performance in place of Artur Bodanzky, who is ill.

## HOW TO HEAR TURKEY

**A**NKARA, the new capital of the Turkish Empire, built by the late energetic Kemal Ataturk, is the site of "Radio Ankara," 20,000-watt short-wave station of the Ottoman government. This station operates normally on two frequencies, namely, TAQ (15.195) and TAP (9.465). The first of these has recently been withdrawn from service due to interference with its programs caused by German station DJB (15.20), operating on almost the same frequency. TAP (9.465) relays Turkey's 120,000-watt long-wave station TAR week-days from 2:30 to 4 a.m. PST, Saturdays from 3:30 to 5:30 a.m. PST, Sundays from 2:30 to 4:30 a.m. PST, and daily from 8 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. PST. TAP (9.465), at the low frequency side of the 31-meter band, slightly higher in frequency than Cuban station COCH (9.44), can only be located with delicate tuning since it is very close to a powerful code station which often partially covers its channel. TAP's aerial is omni-directional, that is, it radiates equally in all directions without being beamed at any particular part of the world.

"Radio Ankara," due east of New

York City, is best received in the central and eastern states from approximately 12:00 noon to 1:30 p.m. PST, during which period it gradually builds up to peak strength just before sign-off. No special identification signal is employed by the station but a constant tone note is used as an interval signal. Both men and women announcers are on the station's staff and announcements are made in Turkish, French, German and English. A program of dance music, including many American selections, is broadcast daily from 12:30 p.m. PST to close-down. On Saturdays at 12:00 noon PST, an interesting English talk on Turkey and the Turkish peoples is broadcast. This is followed at 12:15 p.m. PST by the English Mail Bag program, during which letters from English listeners in all parts of the world are read.

Transmissions from "Radio Ankara" are still experimental in nature and reception reports are therefore eagerly welcomed. These should include an international reply coupon (to insure return postage for a reply) and should be addressed to the Correspondence Department, Radio Ankara, Ankara, Turkey.

**THE NEWS IN GENERAL:** Sunday nights from 8 to 9 p.m. PST, the following stations operate in a network: XEQQ (9.68), XEBT (6.00), XEWW (9.503), XEXA (6.175), XEUX (6.117), all in Mexico, and TGWA (9.685) and TGWB (6.41), in Guatemala. The Cubans are moving again. COCX is on approximately 9.192, and COCQ on 6.395 mcs, at present. PZH (6.79), a good DX catch, at Paramaribo, Dutch Guiana, is on the air Tuesdays and Fridays from 2:40 to 5:40 p.m. PST and on Sundays from 5:40 to 7:40 a.m. PST. EAJ43 (7.49), operated by the Radio Club Tenerife at Santa Cruz de Tenerife, Canary Islands, and a main station of General Franco during the recent Spanish revolution, is still broadcasting nightly from 4 to 5 p.m. PST. August Balbi of Los Angeles, California, writes that in addition to the regular overseas broadcasts from Tokyo, fully described in last week's Radio Guide, JYH (14.60), is being heard irregularly from 7 to 8 p.m. PST; JLT3 (15.325), nightly from 6 to 7:30 p.m. PST, and JVV3 (11.73), daily from 10:15 to 11:20 p.m. PST. Norman Kriebel of Ambler, Pennsylvania, recently received a communication to the effect that CR6RC (11.74), a 50-watt station operated by the Radio Clube de Angola, Caixa Postal 229, at Luanda, Angola, Portuguese Africa,

is now on the air daily from 3:30 to 4:45 a.m. PST; Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Saturdays from 12:30 to 2 p.m. PST and on Sundays from 6:30 to 10 a.m. PST. I suggest you listen to: The lovely chimes concert broadcast each Sunday morning at 6 a.m. PST, over Boston stations WRUW (15.13) and WRUL (11.79); the Asiatic Mail Bag program consisting of intensely interesting letters from listeners throughout the Orient and the South Seas, broadcast Saturdays at 5:45 a.m. PST, over San Francisco station KGEI (9.53). The several short-wave stations in Manila, Philippines, have finally been straightened out as follows: KZIB (9.492 and 6.04), P. O. Box 440, Manila, power 1,000 watts, operates daily 3:30 to 7 a.m. PST; KZRF, formerly KZEG (6.14), "Radio Philippino," Manila, operates daily in parallel with KZRM (9.57), daily from 2 to 6 a.m. PST, or later; KZRH (9.635 and 6.1), "The Voice of the Philippines," Manila, operates daily from 3 to 8:30 a.m. PST. A new government station planned for Rangoon, Burma, has been assigned the following frequencies: 6.002, 6.047 and 9.59 mcs. Bob Hetzel of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, writes that a letter from E. H. Healey, manager of station XMHA (11.86), Shanghai, China, states that broadcasts are being made daily from 2 to 8 a.m. PST.



● Although neither RADIO GUIDE nor network officials are infallible, such discrepancies in program listings usually occur because of RADIO GUIDE's unavoidable advance press deadline. Program changes can be made by network officials right up to the time the program goes on the air. RADIO GUIDE gets its information corrected up to press time, which, however, may still be several days before the date of the program. In these remaining days other changes may be made—too late for our

listings. This is a mechanical operating condition which cannot be helped. We make our listings as accurate as possible and hope the reader will bear with these unavoidable discrepancies.—V. O. L.












