

This Is Indeed the Golden Age of Music

WE ARE indebted to Viva Liebling, our music editor, for calling our attention to the unparalleled number of fine music programs now available to listeners. One look at our renewed "March of Music" department is abundant confirmation. Turn to page 14 now and see for yourself.

Those names may mean little as yet, but read them through. The Cincinnati Symphony offers "The Swan of Tuonela," "The Marriage of Figaro" comes from the Metropolitan Opera Company, the NBC Symphony offers an all-Sibelius show in honor of the great composer's birthday, Radio City Music Hall brings another Sibelius celebration, so does the New York Philharmonic; "The Ford Sunday Evening Hour," the new Coca-Cola hour, "The Telephone Hour," the "Voice of Firestone"—these are weddings of commerce and art which give much satisfaction.

Perhaps you have not yet learned to like fine music—and it is something to be learned, as we have discovered for ourselves. We beg of you a favor, then. Tune to either the NBC Symphony or New York Philharmonic's playing of "Finlandia," by Sibelius. The time and hour are on page 14. This is classical music, but I feel certain that it will thrill you right down to your toes. Let your heart, not your head, enjoy that moving anthem which is the last movement and you may begin to understand why Finlanders fought so furiously and so patriotically against Russia, for out of the spirit of brave Finland grew such music. Fine music does not always mean fancy music. Viva Liebling's comments can guide you to many new pleasures on your radio dial.

THE BATTLE BETWEEN ASCAP AND BMI continues toward a knock-down-and-drag-out struggle. What is this fight all about? The public doesn't know. Probably the public doesn't care. As in most fights, however, the public suffers.

It all started years ago when Victor Herbert had an operetta playing on Broadway. One evening he went into a restaurant and heard his own tunes being presented in an elaborate musical revue. He ordered

them to stop using his music, but they refused. Herbert sued for damages.

When he won his suit, he organized his friends who were authors, composers and publishers into a group, the purpose of which was to collect money for the use of music owned by those authors, etc.

None will quarrel with the fact that every songwriter is entitled to payment for the use of his works. With that principle, none among the embattled broadcasters of today is in disagreement. What broadcasters do object to is the monopoly which they allege ASCAP (the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers) has become. They object to high-handed methods of doing business, of dictatorial decisions, of like-it-or-lump-it attitudes. Last year they got sick and tired of it. They organized BMI, which means Broadcast Music, Incorporated. BMI was

to find new songs and develop new song-writers and make new arrangements of all the old tunes for which the copyrights had expired. All that BMI has been doing very successfully.

What may happen soon is this: On January 1 the networks may throw all ASCAP music off the air. The networks want to pay for ASCAP music by the piece—so much for every time it is used—which sounds fair enough to us. ASCAP wants a lump sum, a percentage of all the money taken in by a radio station. Right now, ASCAP and the broadcasters aren't speaking.

If ASCAP music goes off the air, it will mean a new crop of popular music for our ears. Which isn't a bad idea. It will mean the loss of a lot of old theme songs. Well, theme songs are a hangover from radio's diaper days, anyhow. It will mean that Kay Kyser's musical quiz show may have to be reorganized, because he will be prohibited from playing most of the favorites of the last fifty years. Which may not be such a hardship as ASCAP apologists believe, either.

COMING SOON TO YOUR FAVORITE THEATRE

Too many stories are full of fluff and fine phrases. Too many publications go out of their way to present fine writing. Quite often this obscures personality and truth.

Hereunder, straight from the pen of the man who made it his business to learn about Hollywood's most popular leading man, is the forceful and dynamic story of a celebrated favorite of yours.

We hope you will like it as it is—stark, realistic, and as close to Cary Grant's real self as the hair on his head.—Editor.

KEYNOTE to the character of Cary Grant, Hollywood's most eligible bachelor, is the fact that he still knows everyone who knew him "when," and while he doesn't make friends now as easily as he did in his stage days, friendship is a game he plays for keeps. If Grant were entered in a sweepstakes among the people who know him to select the "greatest guy" in Hollywood, he would win the competition hands down. And when both those who knew him on his way up and those who know him now unanimously agree on the kind of guy he is there must be something to it. Grant is six feet two inches tall,

weighs 172 pounds, has unruly black hair and brown eyes. Official records give his name as Archibald Alexander Leach, his birthplace as Bristol, England, his birthdate as January 18, 1909. All of this is correct with the exception of his birthdate, and as far as his exuberance and enthusiasm are concerned, he might just as well be the thirty-one his records give him instead of the over-draft age, which he really is.

The Cary Grant who plays the effervescent, moody, impulsive husbands in pictures such as "The Awful Truth" and "My Favorite Wife" is a good picture of Cary Grant off the screen, except that he isn't married. Along that line, the smart money boys will lay odds of five to one or better that Grant won't marry in the near or even the distant future, in spite of stories to the contrary. He's having too much fun living life as it is to want to change it.

People who know Grant well also claim his eyes are a dead giveaway to the way he is feeling, and if you watch them you can tell exactly what kind of mood he is in. That mood will change oftentimes as quick as he blinks. And there is no half-way in between with Grant. He is either riding on top of the world or mooning around in the depths of despondency. The only things that remain constant are his impulsiveness and his sense of humor.

Grant is a serious and conscientious workman. When he is on a picture he walks around in something which might be called "a daze," and it is this habit which has given rise to occasional stories and rumors that he was "going high-hat." Fact of the matter is, Grant has a terrific memory for faces and names and seldom forgets

them—or fails to acknowledge and cordially greet people whom he has met before.

He is an extremely sensitive individual—and this sensitivity, his exuberance and moodiness are his three most observable characteristics. He is easily hurt, will carry an imagined slight around in his mind for many weeks.

ABOUT the best word to describe Grant is to call him explosive. The best way to get along with him is to talk right back to him. He has a habit of shouting when he becomes enthusiastic and uses this same trait oftentimes as a defense mechanism by which to get out of things he does not want to do. Those who know him watch his eyes when he starts his yelling technique and if there is still a twinkle there (which is most of the time) they shout right back at him. Result is he usually becomes highly amused and breaks into his infectious, bellowing laugh. (More about this laugh later.)

Grant is pretty much of an individualist and has definite ideas on what he wants to do and what he doesn't want to do. People who have worked with and for him seem to

he simply shrugged his shoulders and never did anything about it. Speaking of other times when his "pals from the old days" took advantage of him was the case of one actor who came in from New York and was given a lift by Grant. This chap hung around his place and lived off him for months, finally wrecking his automobile twice. Grant decided that that was just about enough, so out he went.

Together with Grant's characteristic of not making friends easily but sticking to them when he finally decides they are real guys is a trait which is rather unusual for Hollywood. He simply will not listen to gossip of any kind, shape or description about anybody, and he himself will not talk about anyone whom he knows or anyone who might be the subject of any discussion. If you wanted to gossip with Grant about someone, and took pictures along to prove what you had to say was true, Grant probably would give you an argument and couldn't be convinced—if your story was uncomplimentary or harmful.

Perhaps the most characteristic example of Cary's impulsiveness was the manner in which he and Randy Scott teamed up and established bachelor quarters together. These two lived to-

agree that he says "no" more graciously and still more firmly than any other actor in town. In other words, if Grant refuses to do something a publicity man asks him to do (or publicity girl—his attraction for women is phenomenal) he makes his refusal in such a way that no one's feelings are hurt—and while they oftentimes do not accomplish what they are supposed to, they nevertheless feel kindly toward Grant anyway and get right in and pitch for him the next time they are assigned to do some work on him.

Grant is very methodical about everything he does having to do with physical appearance, both of anything he owns and what he wears. He is an ash-tray emptier, a rug-straightener, and a chair-mover-arounder. He has his shirts all tailor-made, formerly imported his clothes from England. Although his clothes are always of the most conservative type and in excellent taste, he takes a keen delight in selecting them for himself—and also buying novelties for others. At one time he owned a haberdashery store in New York City (this type of wearing-apparel is his weakness) and later opened a shop in Hollywood. The store and its management fascinated him so much that his work "at the shop" began to interfere seriously with his motion-picture career. It finally got to the stage where Grant had to decide between continuing on as a movie star or becoming a clothing salesman—so he stole himself and got rid of the haberdashery. When all of the smoke cleared away, he found that the fellow he had running the store (a pal from "the good old days" whom he tried to do a favor by giving him a job) had nicked him to the tune of about six thousand dollars. Instead of prosecuting the ex-manager,

gether intermittently for about seven years (time taken out while Grant was married to Virginia Cherrill, and also while Scott was married) and still are the best of friends, although Grant now lives by himself in the former Norma Talmadge home, which he bought about a year ago.

At the time that the two met, Grant was working at Paramount and Scott was a newcomer to the lot. They met at lunch one day in the commissary. Scott happened to remark that he was looking for a place to live and Cary popped right back with "Well, why don't you come and stay with me?" This happened within a few minutes after they had met each other, and the combination hit it off very well. Randy is a very steady, conservative sort of individual, and seems to offset the temperamental, effervescent, one-minute-moody, the next-minute-mercurial-and-dynamic Cary Grant. This evidently is the thing that makes them such good friends.

STRANGE as it may seem, Grant likes the simpler things. He goes to big parties, of course, and has a good time; if he's in a good mood he's quite apt to be the life of the party. At the same time, he gets a big kick out of neighborhood movies, roller-coasters and the beach. His idea of a rip-roaring good time is to get together a number of his old-time pals from vaudeville and stage days, then sit around spinning yarns and pounding out English ditties on the piano and singing. He is very serious about his work and seldom goes out while he is working.

Here is a thing that few people know about Cary Grant. He is part Spanish on his mother's side. To this may be attributed his olive coloring and his rather volatile temperament,

not exactly to be expected in an Englishman.

English born, Grant has taken out his first papers. He hasn't continued in establishing his citizenship in this country because of the European situation, feeling that with conditions as they are it might appear as though he weren't standing by, as every good Englishman should—and as Cary Grant certainly is!

Grant is a sucker for a touch. For this reason he has had to have advice on money matters, and the sometimes penurious aspersions which have been cast at him can definitely be traced to these businessmen who help him run his affairs. As far as Grant is concerned himself, he probably would be broke all of the time if he didn't have some protection.

Although much has been written about Grant since he hit the big-time—most stories about him tell his early

life in England and on the stage, then generally jump to the beach-house he for a time shared with Randy Scott—there was an in-between period during which he lived in a studio apartment in Westwood. He probably had as much fun at this time as he ever had before or since. It was while he was living at this Westwood apartment that the incident of the colored houseboy occurred. Also the episode of the invited guests who came to breakfast. And the adventure of the clacking pelican.



'TIS reported that Charlie Chaplin's next motion picture will be budgeted at less than a million dollars, which is pure penury for Charlie. But more surprising is the somewhat-expected-in-Hollywood news that Paulette Goddard will not be in it. Scribes who have endeavored to learn whether a Chaplin-Goddard divorce is in prospect have been turned away skillfully without learning anything. Incidentally, Paulette was given court orders November 18 after her father's suit for a doubling of the seventy-five-dollar-a-week allowance she is now paying to him. Her father, Joseph R. Levee, claims that he needs \$150 a week, because what his daughter is currently paying him is insufficient for his needs, and he cannot obtain a job because a magazine article once stated that Miss Goddard was not his daughter.

Shirley Temple Loses Tonsils

When Shirley Temple went to the hospital November 16 to have her tonsils removed, she became the subject again for newspaper headlines. But to Shirley it was a lark, for she had promised her girl friends at school that she would give a detailed report of what took place. Paramount Pictures will take a vote from the 150 leading book critics of the country for the cast they would prefer to see enact "For Whom the Bell Tolls" . . . The Bennett sisters, Connie, Joan and Barbara, lost their mother, Mrs. Adrienne Morrison, fifty-two, when she died the day before Thanksgiving from apparently natural causes; the three sisters immediately flew east for the funeral . . . Louis Hayward helped Ida Lupino to celebrate their second happy wedding anniversary with a gift of amethyst earrings to match the bracelet he gave her last year . . . Too bad about Eddie Bracken and his wife having that auto crash en route to Palm Springs and the East for a two-month vacation; both had made so many plans for the fun they were going to have, and now Mrs. Bracken will be laid up for weeks . . . Reviews

This week's films are liberally seasoned with spice of life—variety

"Arizona"

Cast: Jean Arthur, William Holden, Warren William, Porter Hall, Paul Harvey, George Chandler, Byron Foulger, Regis Toomey, Edgar Buchanan, et al. A Columbia picture, produced and directed by Wesley Ruggles, who also directed "I Met Him in Paris" and "Sing You Sinners." From the story by Clarence Budington Kelland.

FILMED at a cost of over two million dollars, "Arizona" is a wild tale of the early settlers in old Tucson, where law was respected only when backed by force and courage.

Rather slow-paced and detailed throughout, the picture manages to hold interest as the plot unfolds because of its broad, pioneering theme.

Jean Arthur, as Phoebe Titus, is the only respected white woman in Tucson. She maintains her reputation by being absolutely independent and not asking any favors because of her sex. She makes her livelihood by baking pies, and can't keep the supply up with the demand.

When young cowboy Bill Holden comes to town, he meets Jean almost immediately. They fall in love at first sight but Jean has definite ambitions to realize before she settles down. Her chief desire is to own a large ranch. To get this, she goes into the freight-hauling business and makes a success of it. When the U. S. Army leaves to fight in the East, outlawry again takes over Tucson. Jean's freighting business is ruined through Indian attacks framed by her competitors.

She then decides to bring a thousand head of cattle through Indian country to Tucson, and tells Bill that if he can do it she'll marry him. He brings the cows through, and they are married in the most exciting scene of the picture. Immediately after the ceremony Bill leaves Jean to settle a score with Warren William, the villain, and their battle is another high spot, both from an acting and photographic standpoint.

Warren William is so effective as the villain that the preview audience soon took to hissing when he appeared. Edgar Buchanan is ingratiating and humorous as the judge. Paul Harvey, as Jean's business partner, Solomon Warner, is very good, and Porter Hall is convincing as small-town boss Lazarus Ward. Jean Arthur and Bill Holden are, of course, tops. So is the picture.

"Escape to Glory"

Cast: Pat O'Brien, Constance Bennett, John Halliday, Melville Cooper, Alan Baxter, Edgar Buchanan, Marjorie Gateson, et al. A Columbia picture. Produced by Samuel Bischoff, directed by John Brahm, who also directed "Let Us Drive."

HERE is a thrilling drama of an adventure aboard ship. It offers intense suspense and moderate action. The theme is largely psychological and slightly reminiscent of "Outward Bound," with war the motivating influence.

Pat O'Brien plays a mercenary soldier of fortune. Surprisingly, Constance Bennett is given a very inferior part and, in fact, is not called upon to do any serious acting. There are also Erwin Kalser, famed German doctor; John Halliday, an American district attorney; Alan Baxter, cynical outlaw; Marjorie Gateson, selfish dowager; Melville Cooper, ship's jack-of-all-trades. These people, and others, find themselves thrown together on an English freighter bound for the United States. Soon after its departure, war is declared between England and Germany, which immediately makes the German doctor an enemy of the British ship and he is confined to quarters as a prisoner. The first day out the ship is attacked by a German submarine. The vessel is able to escape only after three of the passengers sacrifice themselves to launch a lifeboat and send down a depth charge to blow up the sub. The tenacity of this climax is tremendous.

With the World War raging, the studio had its difficulties filming this story. It was impossible to charter a real freighter, and a papier-mache duplicate had to be built in the studio. As much of the action was in the engine-room, this particular part of the reproduction had to be especially well done. Because the nation's supply of submarines also seemed to be very busy, Columbia technicians also had to duplicate one of these little instruments of war.

"Escape to Glory" is exciting, adult drama, even entertaining, if you like your pictures on the heavy side. There are many intriguing and unusual elements to make the picture come alive under the excellent direction and characterizations given. Pat O'Brien's role is sincerely and well portrayed. Of the supporting cast, Alan Baxter and Melville Cooper show up to the best advantage. Others are excellent.

"Little Nellie Kelly"

Cast: Judy Garland, George Murphy, Charles Winninger, Douglas McPhail, Arthur Shields, et al. A Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer picture, produced by Arthur Freed and directed by Norman Taurog, who also directed "The Adventures of Tom Sawyer." Based on a musical comedy by George M. Cohan.

JUDY GARLAND gains star billing and joins the adults of the screen with her dual role in "Little Nellie Kelly," which might have been less dragging and more entertaining had its tempo matched the performances of Judy, George Murphy and Charles Winninger. But it didn't.

Perhaps some of the earlier scenes will be sliced to speed the picture before public release. All that they develop now are the courtship of Judy by George Murphy over the objection of Judy's dad, Charles Winninger. Murphy wins Judy, the couple and her father arrive in America, and Judy (the first) dies in childbirth.

Here comes the interesting angle of the story: Little Nellie is likewise played by Judy Garland, and so, oddly enough, in this picture Judy grows from a mature or older role to a younger characterization. Meantime, Judy's granddad and her father still maintain their feud, and comes the day when her suitor, Douglas McPhail, pleads for her hand, and Granddad again objects. He is ruled out, however, and everyone is happy at the ending.

As in the George Cohan musical comedy version, there are two songs, both sung by Judy Garland, "Nellie Kelly I Love You" and "Singin' in the Rain."

Judy really renders a truly fine performance as both Nellie Kelly and Little Nellie Kelly, and Charles Winninger is very amusing as Granddad.

Douglas McPhail, young singing star who first came into prominence in "Babes in Arms" and "Sweethearts," plays his first straight dramatic role as Dennis Fogarty, who falls in love with Nellie. His father, Timothy Fogarty, is adequately portrayed by Arthur Shields, noted stage star, who is known to movie audiences for his work in the historical film, "Drums Along the Mohawk."

The picture is made against the colorful backgrounds of a village in old Ireland and New York. An entire section of Fifth Avenue was built on the M-G-M lot in Hollywood for the filming of important scenes.

"Tin Pan Alley"

Cast: Alice Faye, Betty Grable, Jack Oakie, John Payne, Allen Jenkins, Esther Ralston, Nicholas Brothers, Billy Gilbert, et al. A 20th Century-Fox picture, produced by Kenneth Macgowan and directed by Walter Lang, who also directed "I'll Give a Million." Music includes six favorites of 1917, with the new song "You Say the Sweetest Things, Baby," by Mack Gordon and Harry Warren.

"TIN PAN ALLEY" is a musically excellent and entertaining story of the music-publishing business, particularly that fictitious team known as Calhoun and Harrigan (Jack Oakie and John Payne) and their ups and downs.

Individually, Jack Oakie adds new laurels to his career as a top-notch comedian, and young John Payne has one of his first good opportunities to show that he knows how to handle a love scene.

The story goes back to the 1917-18 period, with the styles of that date authentically (comically now to us) reproduced and with the music-publishing business as the main premise of the picture. Six old-time hits of the 1916-17-18 era are dusted off and reproduced with the better orchestrations and methods that are available today. All of the songs will benefit, but unquestionably "America I Love You," by Edgar Leslie and Archie Gottler (with lyrics strangely appropriate today during World War II), will head again toward the top of the Hit Parade. Other old songs featured by the film include "Good-Bye Broadway, Hello France," "K-K-K-Katy," "Moonlight Bay," "Honeysuckle Rose" and "The Sheik of Araby." Mack Gordon and Harry Warren contribute "You Say the Sweetest Things, Baby," an original.

Plot of the story is thin, but well decorated with music and pulchritude. It concerns chiefly the attempts of Payne (Harrigan) and Oakie (Calhoun) to win success as music-publishers, with the aid of song-and-dance team Katie and Lily Blane (Alice Faye and Betty Grable).

Principals are laughingly supported by Allen Jenkins, and the audience acclaimed again the dance-team work of the Nicholas Brothers, as they did also the appearance and dance steps of Billy Gilbert as "The Sheik of Araby."

Entertainment, Inc.: Here's what comes of the weird goings-on at RKO

ALL RKO is divided into three parts, and the most important part is that star-jammed twelve acres lying between Melrose Avenue and Santa Monica Boulevard on Gower Street. Here such New York musicals as "No, No, Nanette" and "Sunny" are in process of being filmed; here such best-selling novels as "Kitty Foyle" find their way onto film, and such noted dramatic successes as "They Knew What They Wanted" are given to that portion of the public which never sees Broadway.

The other two parts are "The Ranch," a ninety-acre tract twenty miles out on Ventura Boulevard where exteriors are shot, and the twenty-five acres at "Pathe" where many of the one hundred ninety short subjects to be made during 1940-41 will be turned out.

But on Gower Street anything can happen, and last year it did in the form of Orson Welles, boy genius of radio, who was permitted to write his own ticket as writer-producer-director-actor. George J. Schaefer, president of RKO, is a man of great faith. Also he is a very tolerant man, which accounts for some of the weird goings-on in Gower Street. When Welles first came out, he was going to adapt and make Conrad's "Heart of Darkness." After working several months on it, the idea was junked for an original, "Smiler With a Knife." Nothing happened to the Smiler, either, and just about the time movie folk—other than Schaefer—were losing their faith in young Welles, he started testing actors for a new film, "Citizen Kane." It wasn't until the tests were all run off that Welles let studio executives into his little secret. He wasn't testing at all, and the film he'd exposed was really the picture.

Those who have seen rushes of the Welles film believe it will be one of the great pictures to come out of Hollywood this year.

To get a better idea of what happens on Gower Street, have a look at the stars who cavort across the many

business-like sound-stages that rise from the level California countryside. Ginger Rogers, Charles Laughton, Carole Lombard, Charles Boyer, Cary Grant, Jean Arthur, Ronald Colman, Richard Dix, Edmund Lowe, Jean Hersholt, Anna Neagle, Maureen O'Hara, Anne Shirley, Kay Francis, Jack Oakie, Charles Winninger, Lee Tracy, Lupe Velez and Leon Errol are a few of the many who lend color to the Gower Street lot.

Take the last named—Lupe Velez and Leon Errol. This hilarious duo is currently making the "Mexican Spitfire" series, which is guaranteed to roll cash customers in the aisles, and any time you visit the Gower Street studio you're apt to find chinaware and fragile vases flying on the lot where they work. To add to the casual visitor's confusion, on the next set Anna Neagle will probably be going through some highly romantic paces for "No, No, Nanette," set to the lovely music of Vincent Youmans.

Out of all this, however, RKO will bring fifty-three feature films during the 1940-41 season and an approximate one hundred ninety short subjects, including the "March of Time" releases, "Information, Please" shorts, and the product of the Walt Disney plant. Although Disney's work is not done in either of the three rings of Schaefer's circus—Disney owning and operating his own specialized and very complete studio—his films are released through RKO.

Perhaps the top star at RKO is Ginger Rogers, who graduated from the glorified musicals for which RKO is famous into such serious drama as Christopher Morley's portrait of a white-collar girl, "Kitty Foyle." Ginger has been having no holiday on Gower Street, and, with "Kitty Foyle" barely finished, she is already preparing for her part in "Two on an Island," from Elmer Rice's Broadway success. Also on her schedule for the current year is a picture written especially for her, tentatively titled "Tom, Dick and Harry."

On a lot which boasts the services

of Cary Grant, every so often furious comedy at a hectic pace is expected, but even Cary Grant is sometimes dumfounded by the carryings-on of Gene Towne and Graham Baker, independent producers whose most recent exploit was the bringing of Elsie the Cow all the way from the eastern farm, where she sojourned to Gower Street to be milked by Kay Francis in a three-minute scene for the film, "Little Men." Towne and Baker used to be a writing team. Once, according to a Hollywood legend, one of the teammates outlined an idea for a picture-story to a producer at luncheon. The producer, impressed, told the writer to send him an outline the next day and he'd pay him ten thousand dollars. Came the next day, and the writer had forgotten his idea. So had the producer, who thereby saved ten thousand dollars and probably lost a hundred thousand.

TODAY RKO is at the peak of its popularity—a popularity due largely to the shrewd executive ability of Schaefer and his right-hand man, Joe Nolan. For the most part, RKO makes films of stories which are highly successful as fiction. This year, for example, they are filming Theodore Dreiser's "Sister Carrie"; Clarence Budington Kelland's "Valley of the Sun"; Gene Stratton Porter's "Freckles" and "Laddie." Last year, Towne and Baker put onto film those literary classics, "Swiss Family Robinson" and "Tom Brown's School Days."

RKO has also drawn largely upon Broadway for shows—both musical and otherwise—which have been hits. Anna Neagle, now working on "No, No, Nanette," will follow it with the Dillingham stage success, "Sunny." "They Knew What They Wanted," made this year, is from one of the all-time great plays of the stage.

RKO has also drawn upon radio for talent which has been tested. Both Kay Kyser films, "That's Right, You're Wrong" and "You'll Find Out," are RKO pictures. Lum and Abner are making their second picture there


and a recent release was the radio-comic strip favorite, "Li'l Abner." The "Scattergood Baines" pictures to be made shortly are also based upon the stories about the character and the radio serial. Jean Hersholt's "Dr. Christian" series first found voice on radio also.

An interesting new addition to the Gower Street gang is comedian Harold Lloyd, whose first production, "A Guy, a Girl and a Gob," will shortly be released. Now Lloyd is talking about making a second picture—and acting in it himself. Dual responsibilities seem to be the rule at RKO. In addition to Orson Welles, producer-directors on the lot include George Abbott, David Butler and Herbert Wilcox. Other producers include Howard S. Benedict, Bert Gilroy, Erich Pommer, David Hempstead, Robert Sisk, Cliff Reid, all working under executive producers Harry E. Edington and Lee Marcus.

Directors at the Gower Street Gaieties include Leslie Goodwins, Jack Hively, Edward Killy, Boris Ingster, Garson Kanin, Ray McCarey, Anatole Litvak, Lewis Milestone and Irving Reis. Among the films to be turned out there this year not already mentioned are: Jean Arthur in "The Devil and Miss Jones"; Cary Grant in "Passport to Life"; Charles Boyer in "Ariane Pretends" and another untitled at the moment; Ronald Colman in a still-untitled picture; a special studio-built musical starring Maureen O'Hara and Gene Raymond, "They Met in Argentina"; Towne and Baker's novelty film, "How to Meet a Man"; Lupe Velez and Leon Errol comedy, "Lord Epping Entertains"; Carole Lombard in "Mr. and Mrs. Smith," and another Orson Welles film.




Judy Garland Makes Love

JUDY GARLAND, playing her first mature part in "Little Nellie Kelly," will be seen in her first love scene on the screen (first picture, right) as an Irish immigrant kid who marries Jerry Kelly (George Murphy). Going the whole hog in this love business, Judy later enacts the role of her own daughter grown to young womanhood, with Murphy now playing the role of her father (second picture, right). Judy, in this later sequence, is romantically interested in Dennis Fogarty (Douglas McPhail), who came into prominence with Judy and Mickey Rooney in "Babes in Arms." A romantic comedy, the film swings from the colorful background of an old Irish village to the modern New York, with such famous musical numbers as "The Wearin' o' the Green," "Danny Boy" and "You Remind Me of My Mother" interspersed in the fast, sometimes funny and sometimes heart-touching action. Highlights of the film include a reproduction of the famous New York Police School, authoritatively and accurately done, in which the step-by-step training of George Murphy takes place. Real highlight of the picture, however, will be the first screen appearance of a youngster the movie-going public has watched grow from a child to a full-fledged, grown-up portrayal. And Judy handles it with capable ease.

John Doe Makes Faces



PERHAPS the script of no other picture (excepting "The Great Dictator") has been as carefully guarded from the public as that of Frank Capra's "Meet John Doe." Still pictures on the set, barring these published for the first time, have been guarded with equal zeal. Because Frank Capra's film masterpieces are always of interest and because these pictures give a fleeting insight into the tale unfolding behind the closed doors of the "John Doe" set on the Warner lot, MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE's editors are proud of this scoop. John Doe (Gary Cooper) has been operating a scheme whereby people send him a dime a day, and the newspapers—and Edward Arnold—decide to tear him to shreds. They tag him as a fake and a hoax until he crashes into the radio studio during their broadcast and tells his side of the story (picture at left). Met Opens New Season

THE Metropolitan Opera opens its radio season on Saturday afternoon with an opera which last year played to Standing Room Only. Revived after a lengthy absence from the Met repertoire, Mozart's "Marriage of Figaro" proved to be the hit of the season, doubtless because of the beauty and sparkle of the performance. New and exquisite scenery and costumes had been designed, and the opera was played with more of an eye to comedy than is usual at the Met. The libretto is witty and decidedly on the risqué side, but unfortunately we hear it in Italian instead of English. It is one of the many operas that would benefit from translation, as was shown not so many weeks ago in New York by a troupe of young singers who put on the "Marriage of Figaro" in English, with the minimum of scenery and in modern clothes. Their show earned praise from highbrow music critics, who said it was one of the most delightful performances they had ever seen.

The Met has so far come down off its high horse to schedule at least one comedy opera in English, Smetana's "Bartered Bride." This was heard some years ago in translation during the Met's spring season, but was not broadcast. Jarmila Novotna, famous for her interpretation of the leading role in her native Czechoslovakia, will attempt it here for the first time in English. Almost everyone who listens to music is familiar with the exhilarating Overture and the Dance of the Comedians.

Other revivals and novelties to be presented by the Met this winter include Donizetti's "Daughter of the Regiment," in which Lily Pons plays the drum (she sings too); Montemezzi's "The Love of Three Kings" with the composer leading his own work; "Alceste," by the early composer Gluck, never before heard at the Metropolitan; Verdi's "The Masked Ball," famous for its baritone aria "Eri Tu"; "Samson and Delilah," the Bible story set to music by the French composer Saint-Saens, and in

which the young American mezzo-soprano Rise Stevens scored a sensational success this summer in Buenos Aires; Mozart's "Don Giovanni" and Beethoven's "Fidelio."

Almost a dozen new artists have been engaged, and most of those heard last season remain. A new French soprano, Germaine Lubin, unknown to Americans, is heralded as the best dramatic soprano in France. Other new artists are Alexander Sved, Elsa Zebranska, Arthur Kent, Eleanor Steber and Emery Darcy.

Although the Metropolitan comes to us this year as a sponsored commercial program, the routine of the broadcast will remain as usual. Milton Cross will again be the commentator.

IN ITS much-publicized decision to democratize itself, the Metropolitan seems to have concentrated more on its opera house than on its repertoire. The Diamond Horseshoe is no more, its boxes being on sale to anyone who has the price. The Grand Tier has given way to make room for rows of cheaper seats. There is a new curtain, and many improvements on the stage. But there is very little evidence yet of a determined effort to make opera itself fun for the masses. The Chicago Opera has done wonders in that direction this year, playing to sold-out houses with its various English versions of operas. It even went so far as to have John Charles Thomas come out in his costume for "Aida" and sing "Home on the Range" as an added attraction between the acts. We can't help feeling that this is going a little too far, but it certainly gave the audience a good time. They undoubtedly listened to "Aida" with a lot more enjoyment than usual, even though they probably came away with the idea that it was an Egyptian cowboy opera. "Home on the Range" would sound somewhat out of place at the Met, but the spirit that prompted John Charles Thomas to sing it would give that opera house the revivifying shot in the arm it needs.

Musician of the Week Jan Sibelius

The world honors a great Finn
on his seventy-fifth birthday

ON SUNDAY, December 8, Jan Sibelius will be seventy-five years old. Sibelius devotees will doubtless celebrate the occasion with the ardent homage usually reserved for holy personages. Others not so devoted will merely accord ungrudging respect to one of the most notable of the world's living composers.

valiantly against such terrific odds.

News from Finland last year claimed that Sibelius had been killed in the invasion. But a few days later he popped up, very much alive, and, according to unconfirmed report, taking pot-shots at Russian planes with an old hunting rifle. The re-

port did not add how many he brought down.

Perhaps no other music during the last twenty years has provoked as much discussion, has stirred up such violent likes and dislikes as that of Jan Sibelius. Music critics who have fallen under the spell of his strange, fascinating works uncork columns and columns of eulogy. Others, still in a state of doubt, admit that unquestionably Sibelius belongs in the very top rank of composers. Complete dissenters profess to see very little in him, and condemn him for lack of melody and a certain monotony of orchestration.

Sibelius himself is more or less impervious to all this excitement. Acclaimed as Finland's first citizen and most ardent patriot, he lives in his small, isolated villa one hour outside of Helsinki, shrouded by as much privacy as it is possible for mortal man to obtain. Finns, respectful of his wish to be alone, see to it that no outsiders disturb him. Very early in his career his country recognized his genius, and proved its devotion in practical form. When he was thirty-two the government voted him a yearly income which, while not sufficient to take care of all his needs, gave him much more time to spend on his composing. Then too, Finland owes him a very great debt, in that with his music he has made the world conscious of Finland's heroic struggle for freedom. Even before the current Russian invasion, and that of 1918, Finland was forever trying to rid herself of Russian domination. Sibelius pictured this struggle vividly in his tone poem "Finlandia," which has become synonymous with the world over with the little country that has fought so

Although it is generally believed that Sibelius based much of his work on Finnish folk music, he denies this. His imagination has been fired by Finnish folk-lore, but the music is original and only suggests folk tunes. He composes without the aid of a piano or any other instrument, planning the composition wholly in his mind and then setting down the finished product on paper. Many of his works have been published without his ever having heard them played.

Critics are fond of using adjectives like "stark," "bleak" and "grim" in their descriptions of Sibelius' music, thus giving an altogether contradictory picture of the man and his country. He is keenly alive, friendly, bubbling over with humor and energy. His country, when not beset by enemies, is a cheerful place where people live well and sanely. Sibelius' passion for privacy is merely a desire to do his work under conditions he finds most agreeable. His house, which he built shortly after his marriage, is of simple and unpretentious log-cabin architecture. There he lives with his wife and children, working most of the time, with a radio and an enormous library as diversion.

Today there is no major symphony orchestra in America that does not include the music of Sibelius in its repertoire. For Sibelius lovers, this week will provide a feast, as almost every good music program is scheduling at least one of his works. For those unfamiliar with his music, this is an opportunity to get acquainted with it and to form their own opinions in the lively Sibelius controversy.—V. L.

THE CINCINNATI CONSERVATORY OF MUSIC, CBS. Conservatory Symphony Orchestra, Alexander von Kreiser, conductor. *The Swan of Tuonela* (Sibelius), *Symphony No. 5 "New World"* (Dvorak).

The week's Sibelius offerings honoring his seventy-fifth birthday start off with one of his more popular works. The Swan of Tuonela is part of a symphonic poem in four parts based on the great Finnish epic, the Kalevala. A note inscribed in the score reads, "Tuonela, the Kingdom of Death, the Hades of Finnish mythology, is surrounded by a broad river of black water and rapid current, in which the Swan of Tuonela glides in majestic fashion and sings." The piece is brooding and mysterious, and all through it one hears the melancholy song of the Swan, played by the English horn.

A gay and lively tale of eighteenth-century love and intrigue taken from the play by the French writer, Beaumarchais. It takes place in Seville, Spain, and tells how the Countess Almaviva, with the aid of Figaro (her husband's servant and formerly the Barber of Seville), turns the tables on her philandering husband, enamored of Susanna, Figaro's sweetheart. The Count is properly remorseful, Figaro wins his bride and everything ends happily. Mozart's music is light, bubbling and easy on the ear. Highlights of the opera are Cherubino's air and the finale of the first act; the letter duet between Susanna and the Countess, and Cherubino's song "Voi Che Sapete" in the second act; Figaro's tirade against women in Act III; and of course the ever-familiar and delightful overture.

THE NBC SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA, NBC. Arturo Toscanini, conductor. All-Sibelius program. *Symphony No. 2, "Pohjola's Daughter," "The Swan of Tuonela," "Finlandia."*

Toscanini's tribute to Sibelius' birthday includes the most lyrical of all his symphonies, and the one that is easiest to grasp. Particularly the last movement builds up to a terrific melodic climax, and if Toscanini plays it as he did two years ago, radio listeners have a thrill in store.

"Pohjola's Daughter," symphonic fantasy, was first played in America by Sibelius himself in 1914 at Norfolk, Conn. Like so much of his work, it takes its subject from Finnish mythology. Pohjola is the mythological name for the North Country (Lapland). The maid, or daughter of Pohjola, sits on a rainbow spinning a gold and silver fabric. She is wooed by a hero, and promises to wed him if he can make a boat from the pieces of her magic spindle. He fails, and leaves her to go to his home. The music develops brilliantly. One commentator remarked, "The whole gamut of the tonal spectrum is traversed from end to end."

salvation." However, the listener can read his own meaning into the work, which is what Sibelius prefers, as he dislikes any literal interpretation of his music.

Rachmaninoff's Rhapsody is of comparatively recent creation (1934). The theme around which he weaves a set of twenty-four variations was also used by Brahms for a set of piano variations. The Rhapsody is written in brilliant style and in rather more modern idiom than is usual with Rachmaninoff. Only in the last variation does the typical Rachmaninoff romanticism appear, in a lyrically lovely melody.

One of the best-loved and most familiar concertos in the violin concerto repertoire is played here by a young Hungarian violinist who has made quite a name for himself since his debut on the Music Hall program last year. Erno Rapee, who was the first to present a Sibelius festival in this country several years ago, celebrates Sibelius' seventy-fifth birthday by playing his fifth symphony. This was written during the early years of the first World War, was first performed in 1915, and was later completely revised by the composer.

THE NEW YORK PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA, CBS. John Barbirolli, conductor; Gitta Gradova, pianist. *The Return of Lemminkainen* (Sibelius), *Symphony No. 1* (Sibelius), the Orchestra; *Rhapsody on a Theme by Paganini* (Rachmaninoff), Gitta Gradova and Orchestra; *"Finlandia"* (Sibelius).

Lemminkainen was the warrior-hero of the Kalevala and this tone poem describes his return to his country after a long series of wars and combats.

Sibelius composed his first symphony in 1898. His biographer, Karl Ekman, interprets it as "... the struggle of a soul full of conflict for its own

"Alec Templeton Time"

Here are some interesting facts to touch up a favorite program

IT MUST have been true radio inspiration that guided the makers of Alka-Seltzer and the Wade Advertising Agency to hit upon the combination that twirls a multitude of dials to the NBC Friday night spot which opens the loudspeakers to "Alec Templeton Time."

It's a rare combination, indeed—that of Alec Templeton, Pat O'Malley and Ray Noble and orchestra. All three personalities have plus-talent and minus-temperament, and fit together like ham and eggs and fried potatoes. No innuendo meant by the "ham and eggs" phrase, though the boys even touch up their show with a bit of hamming just for fun. All three British-born, they have been in America long enough and like America so well that they fit the American scene also like ham and eggs and potatoes. All three jolly, witty and sociable, they match the sponsor's effervescent, analgesic product for bringing that feeling-well smile. And all three being talented entertainers, they fit the listeners' ears to a Templeton Time "T."

In addition to these headliners, the show's cast includes Fort Pearson, who convincingly peddles Alka-Seltzer and helps O'Malley with emcee duties, vocalist Larry Stewart, and occasionally guest artists. The show has three rehearsal periods, about five hours in all, on Thursday and Friday. Musical arrangements are done by both Noble and Templeton, the latter in collaboration with Leo Kempinski. The script continuity, except for O'Malley's monologs, which he writes himself, is written by Edward Simmons, who also directs the show, assisted by J. Clinton Stanley of NBC.

On the air the cast dresses formally, but the atmosphere is definitely informal.

Before going on the air, Pat O'Malley takes general charge of affairs, clowning around with Pearson, Noble and Templeton, and telling stories that wow the studio audience but are usually a little too tangy for radio use. Between the first show and the rebroadcast Noble and his musicians rush to a Chicago hotel for an early-evening session. Alec, with his bride, who usually attends the show, and the others of the cast go to dinner between programs.

In the studio naturally the most unusual spectacle is that of Stanley North, Alec's manager, sitting beside the blind pianist with a script, ready to prompt Alec with his memorized lines and giving him cues by a special system of touch signals. O'Malley has a superstition that if he bumps an elbow in the studio he must immediately bump the other also or expect bad luck. Noble is the picture of poise during the broadcast, but during rehearsal he's an incessant chain-smoker of both cigarettes and cigars. Fort Pearson, besides announcing this and other shows, is kept busy during football season as one of NBC's crack grid reporters.

Away from radio Templeton's professional time is occupied primarily with concert engagements. His favorite hobby is collecting music-boxes; he has many of all sizes and designs. O'Malley is a sports addict. Noble likes all kinds of home games and collects toy soldiers.

Fan-mail response is in general varied, but one theme does stand out—requests for copies of O'Malley's Lancashire stories about 'Erbert Pinwinkle, Sam Small, etc., and for copies of Templeton's "parting thoughts" with which he leaves the air.

The "Templeton Time" show costs \$12,000 weekly for time and talent.
