THIS WEEK: Many an anxious radio listener has been wondering these days about what may happen to his entertainment as the pressure of war time on the airlines increases. Now comes welcome assurance from an authoritative source that no matter what happens there always will be a free radio in America.

In a recent address, Don E. Gilman, vice president of the National Broadcasting Company, had this to say: "I will hazard a forecast that there will be no restrictions (by government) upon free radio and no impositions of censorship intended to limit or restrict the present unrestrained open forum of the air which characterizes the American plan . . . The purpose of censorship in a free nation is not to conceal facts from the people, but to prevent the giving of information to the enemy . . . It is well known that we now have in Europe a wide following that defies the Gestapo to listen to our broadcasts. Radio has been developed to its high point of efficiency through the American way. It will function best in preserving our national destiny if it continues to be what it is today, and always has been—a free enterprise, administered by high-minded, responsible men who cherish their obligations."

It is certain that Mr. Gilman does not speak without assurances from the government. It is a certainty to that, along with the preservation of the strictly entertainment value of radio,

this medium will serve to protect the nation in time of emergency, for in no other country in the world can the civilian population be mobilized so quickly for defense by the simple medium of broadcasting. Your radio receiving set is a defensive weapon that has no equal. That it will as well always be a source of entertainment is something for which every American should give thanks!

**W**ITH war clouds threatening the American horizon and preparedness the byword, an interesting conjecture is what various movie stars could do, or would do, in event of war.

Many young leading men already are in the armed forces. Others very likely will find their places in the military should war be declared.

But what of the actresses? What will they contribute?

The great majority, of course, will do their bits in entertainment units cheering up the lads in the barracks and forts. Others in their spare moments will be knitting, working for the Red Cross, helping (as they are now) in defense-bond sales.

There may even be actresses who will become American Mata Haris in the Intelligence Service of the United States of America.

More of a publicity man's dream, however, are some of the pictures shown on this page of certain Universal actresses taking jobs of men called to war. Some occupations seem far-fetched, yet all could be.

While for the most part, screen actresses have been drawn from the ranks of dramatic schools, little theaters, or from modeling, and hence have little experience in other fields, there are some of Hollywood's great who in an emergency could go right back to jobs they once filled while preparing for their life's work.

Notable among the latter is Dorothy Lamour. Dorothy was an elevator operator before Hollywood called. She could relieve some man in this work while he was at the front. And wouldn't the boys too old for Army duty make a beeline for her elevator!

Bette Davis and Frances Farmer served as theater usherettes during their apprenticing days, in wartime they could do it again, or perhaps take over the heavier, more responsible duties of theater management.

Should there be a shortage of secretaries, stenographers, a good many actresses could take over, among them Kay Francis, Hedy Lamarr, Astrid Allwyn, Gertrude Niesen and Ethel Merman. Each had her innings at the keyboard. Speaking of office help, in the long ago Barbara Stanwyck once was a telephone girl, no doubt still could be a good one.

Martha Raye, since her career became successful, took up nursing. In wartime, her knowledge might save many a life. Binnie Barnes has a valuable asset in factory work she did as a girl. Perhaps time will come when she'll be making airplanes. Margaret Sullavan once painted sets for the little theater. Claudette Colbert was an artist. In wartime both might be camouflagers.

Relieving at radio stations might be Ruth Hussey, former commentator; Nancy Kelly, former radio star; Gloria Stuart, who was a reporter. It's a man's world, goes the saying, but in wartime the women carry on, and Hollywood glamour girls would be no exception.—E. P.





# How Lana Turner Was Frightened into Stardom



### To News Desk:

**C**OMPARING youthful, shapely, blond Lana Turner to a baseball sounds like an absurdity, but Lana is the Thespian pellet that M-G-M is tossing around from role to role to complete the biggest triple play in this acting business. Triple plays are a rarity, but in Hollywood when they take a young, comparatively inexperienced actress and present her roles with Spencer Tracy, Clark Gable and Robert Taylor in machine-gun rapidity, it's a Hollywood phenomenon, something that happens slightly less often than rarely.

So the unusual has happened to Lana, and she says she's "scared stiff!" You're probably saying, "What has she to be scared about? Fifty million girls would undoubtedly give their left elbow to be buffeted about in love-scenes with Tracy, Gable and Taylor." And you're unquestionably right. But love-scenes are not worrying Lana. She's worrying about her career as an actress.

After her rookie appearance at real acting with Jimmy Stewart in "Ziegfeld Girl," Lana went into "Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde" with Spencer Tracy and talented Ingrid Bergman with a great deal of confidence in her ability as an actress. But once she started working with Tracy, later with Gable in "Honky Tonk," she got the surprise of her life. To quote Lana, "I realized that I couldn't act." She found herself in with the "tops" of the acting industry and was "scared" because she didn't think she could fill the bill, but that "scared" feeling was a tonic.

Lana suddenly realized that to be a good actress requires more than just a pretty face. She started working hard to learn by observing the techniques of Tracy and Gable. She cut out her night-clubbing, went home at night, thought over what she'd learned during the day, studied her lines for the next day and went to bed early. No longer does she hold the dubious-honor title of "queen of the night-spots." Lana allows herself one night out a week—Saturday night.

It may be that Lana is just getting over the flair for glamour Hollywood opened to her, or it may be she's just growing up and getting a little more sensible, but more likely it's that Lana realizes how lucky she is to be in the movies and is dead set to capitalize on her break.

The Turner girl is a real trouper, too. She reacts like a puppet to any suggestions given her by a director. Without any previous dramatic experience she was parlayed from a high-school kid on a drug-store stool into a big-name star at M-G-M. Lana is just herself at all times. She admits that unless she had received the break she did, she would have been "sunk" as a career girl, because her talents are limited.

And now Lana goes into "Johnny Eager," a gangster picture with Robert Taylor, as a competent, accomplished actress. After seeing "Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde" and "Honky Tonk," fans will undoubtedly see that Lana Turner has been graduated into the "big theaters"; that the little girl who was "plenty scared" has emerged as a full-fledged actress. Today she pursues her ambition to be a real actress with unwavering aplomb because she could "take it" from the "Boom Town twins," Spencer Tracy and Clark Gable.



GENE TIERNEY is coming into her own. Gene, the lovely not-yet-twenty-one-year-old actress who has been playing period ancients and ragamuffins at her home studio, 20th Century-Fox, is getting her first big break from Walter Wanger.

Like most Hollywood newspapermen, I've been watching the guidance of this beautiful young actress' career by Darryl Zanuck. I think he knows what he is doing. He hasn't exposed the allure of Tierney to the screen before—not even with "Belle Starr"—because he first wanted to prove her as an actress and a box-office attraction.

But despite the fact that the public will see her in "Belle Starr" as a dashing, daring lady bandit of the '80's, movie-goers will see much more of her glamorous face and figure, will feel her acting strength in Wanger's "Sundown," Gene's first independent starring film, which will be released in October.

Of course, she has a glamorous acting opportunity in "Sundown," but that isn't all of the story. Miss Tierney is still a young lady. Despite her Broadway-acting background, including the ingenue lead in "The Male Animal," her social heritage of the Tierney family and ultra schools which Gene attended gave her a lopsided perspective on life.

Putting it plainly, Miss Tierney didn't know what it was all about. It took a lot of roughing up of the polished surface to let Tierney know enough about the seamier side of life to make her an understanding actress. She's learning more daily.

In "Sundown" Miss Tierney plays the starring role of Zia, supposedly a half-caste daughter of a wealthy old Arab who raised her from babyhood. The romantic drama finds her most desirably groomed and beautiful, yet with feelings hurt when she attends a party at the British military outpost and is seated at a separate table reserved for natives.

As Zia she must pretend to be bitter at the British, agree to join a traitor. Love, like that of Boyer and Lamarr in "Algiers," develops between British Commissioner Crawford (Bruce Cabot) and Zia when they're jailed together.

All in all, "Sundown" gives Miss Tierney a great opportunity to display her beauty and ability.

Nor is she missing either chance. I saw her working, and she's great. "Sundown" most assuredly will be Gene Tierney's sunrise.

# Is Hollywood

**"NEW WINE"  
 flows  
 freely**

**T**WENTY years ago Hollywood was a Babel of newly rich. The star without a golden bathtub, or at least a solid-silver one, was just too, too minor to be considered. But high income taxes, the talkies, lowered salaries and a code of more sensible living forced on the colony by necessity and better taste have removed much of the tinsel from the Bagdad of the West.

Last month Hollywood correspondents saw what was called the last of the Hollywood premieres—that of "Charley's Aunt"—and the final fling at a gala press party, the "New Wine" preview and champagne party at the Padre Winery.

The last? That's right. By some agreement reached by major Hollywood picture-producing companies as

a part of their "consent decree" to the stoppage of practices deemed unfair competition in restraint of trade (and the smaller independent film-makers and exhibitors), the big parties, excursions and premieres which have done much to advertise the glamour of Hollywood were to be no more—after September 1.

The pinch has not been felt just yet by the social butterflies of the cinema acting-profession nor the public which watched their peregrinations, but it will be. Yes, Hollywood in one fell swoop is losing a large slice of its very pretty ballyhoo which commonly is called glamour. It just won't be the same old town.

But it didn't give in without a struggle. To Cucamonga, California, fifty miles east of Hollywood, Gloria Productions transported by bus caravan, headed




# Losing Its Glamour?

by a band, some six hundred newspapermen and women for the preview of the picture "New Wine" at the ancient Padre Winery. Wine-corks began popping upon arrival and didn't cease until the last busload of guests had departed at midnight. The result, 175 cases of wine consumed, a highly successful stunt and many happy writers, but an unhappily unsuccessful preview. Too many of the critics just couldn't find time to watch the screening of the new Ilona Massey-Alan Curtis production, and many who did didn't remember the next day what they had seen!

Signing off as the last of big formal premieres was the showing July 31 by 20th Century-Fox of Jack Benny's "Charley's Aunt," at Grauman's Chinese Theater. Crowds of the curious public began waiting at noon

in the sidewalk bleachers which had been erected, and there they stayed until the stars began making their entrances at 8:30 p.m. By that time, Hollywood Boulevard was impassable within a block of the theater, and autograph-hunters outside and inside the house were so numerous that it was close to 10 p.m. before the new Benny comedy was thrown on the screen. Stars were on hand by the scores.

And so pass (temporarily?) two favored means by which Hollywood has impressed the outside world with its self-importance, beauty and scintillation. Yet Hollywood would die of thirst without glamour. There will be a substitute or two, more stupendous, more gigantic, more colossal than ever before! Just wait and see.

Errol Flynn, reported last week to have returned to his house with Lili Damita, who immediately stated to the press she hadn't seen him—"even in a movie"—has other than wife troubles. It's money he needs, his money which has been tied up by his agent, Myron Selznick, who is suing for alleged back commissions. Flynn appeared August 13 to the Superior Court for relief of his \$6,000 weekly salary, claiming he needed \$14,595 monthly to meet bills. 



### "The Little Foxes"

Cast: Bette Davis, Herbert Marshall, Teresa Wright, Richard Carlson, Patricia Collinge, Dan Duryea, Charles Dingle, Carl Benton Reid, Russell Hicks. A Samuel Goldwyn production for RKO release, directed by William Wyler. Screen play from stage play of same name, and both by Lillian Hellman.

Type of Picture: Heavily emotional, realistic drama of a heartless, designing woman—played by Bette Davis.

This Is the Story: Regina Giddens (Miss Davis), sister of the two money-worshipping Hubbard boys, seeks to outdo even them in their money-making schemes of the reconstruction South in order to satiate her all-consuming desire for money, power and social prestige. Even her daughter, Alexandra (Teresa Wright), is used as a tool by her mother, and needless to say, Regina's husband Horace (Herbert Marshall), doomed to die from a heart ailment, is tolerated for—the money he has. In a climax scene, in which he has a showdown with Regina, Horace has a heart attack and is let die through lack of available medicine by his wife. But, though her ambition is on the threshold of achievement, she loses the little remaining respect of her daughter, who knows, intuitively, that her father has been murdered.

Verdict: Miss Davis again puts forward a bid for another Academy Award. A sure hit with woman-haters and good for the entire family.—E. P.

### "Dive Bomber"

Cast: Fred MacMurray, Errol Flynn, Ralph Bellamy, Robert Armstrong, Regis Toomey, Alexis Smith, Allen Jenkins, Craig Stevens, Herbert Anderson, Moroni Olsen, et al. A Warner Bros. picture, produced by Hal B. Wallis, directed by Michael Curtiz. Screen play by Frank Wead, Robert Buckner.

Type of Picture: Educational-adventure picture with aviation background.

This Is the Story: Errol Flynn and Ralph Bellamy play the flight surgeons who attempt to discover new ways to make high-altitude flying easier on American aviators. There is a feud between Flynn and Fred MacMurray and a touch of romance involving one Alexis Smith, a blond newcomer to movies.

Verdict: "Dive Bomber" has a significant story the public should know about and tells that story without hesitation. —C. S.

### "Our Wife"

Type of Picture: Lightweight comedy of the domestic type.

This Is the Story: Melvyn Douglas, long the confused and suffering husband, is at it again, but this time in a different way. He plays the society orchestra-leader who has trouble forgetting his ex-wife. On a cruise he meets Ruth Hussey, a brilliant scientist, invites her to his home with her father and brother. Ellen Drew, playing the ex-wife, shows up and effectively spikes the new romance by pretending a paralytic stroke. The scientist heroine suspects the pretending and conceives all manner of plots to get her rival out of bed, even to a fire in the house. All this is done to the tune of clever small talk and fine music, semi-symphonic.

Verdict: Standing alone, "Our Wife" is not a sparkling triumph. Matched against the two other offerings this week, both on the dramatic and slightly heavy side, this picture is worth attention. Particularly noteworthy from this critic's viewpoint is the performance of John Hubbard, who has come a long way since he played the bewildered, disappointed lover in "1,000,000 B. C." —C. S.

## MOVIE VIEWS

THE funny thing about Hollywood is that some little people act big and the big people little. Tyrone Power frankly confesses that he considers his career mainly a matter of luck, while many a bit player puts on in-sufferable airs. With directors it's the same. At one studio a "B" director has just been given his big chance. It's gone to his head so much that he's

calling his players "bums" and "louts." He shoots twice as much film as necessary, then blames it on the stars.

Compared to this unpleasant individual there is Sam Wood. Sam directs such people as Ginger Rogers in "Kitty Foyle," Ann Sheridan in "King's Row," and now "For Whom the Bell Tolls." He has never set himself up as the "great Sam Wood," and as a consequence every producer in town wants Sam to direct.

"People in Hollywood forget," Sam told us the other day, "that the little people are the most important. Do something nasty to a little man and the first thing you know there are a lot of little men who can't forgive

you. It's not that the people with small jobs are vindictive; they merely stick together, and together their work is more important than the biggest person in Hollywood."

Sam Wood believes thoroughly that Hollywood should be a land of opportunity but isn't. In this he confirms this columnist's chief complaint about movie moguls. They pay fancy prices for stars but let underpaid stock contract players stay idle for months. Then one day the contract players step out, make names for themselves and leave the producers flat, and soak them for every nickel they can. If it's a funny world, Hollywood is the funniest place in it!





## RADIO VIEWS

THE best way to determine trends in radio is to keep an eye on the studios where producers audition for possible sponsorship. The kind and number of shows auditioned usually indicates what is in the back of the sponsor's mind. And, since the buyers usually have an ear pretty close to the public's chest, it also indicates what the public prefers in the way of entertainment.

Right now all signs point toward a trend in comedy. To give you an idea as to how extensive this swing toward comedy programs is, we'll mention a few of the big-name comedians who have either been signed or are currently being auditioned for fall programs. For instance there is Walter O'Keefe. Walter has a humorous sketch entitled "Hizzoner, the Mayor," which is getting a good looking-over by the buyers. O'Keefe has been off the air for some time. The demand for more and more comedy shows may bring him back.

Frank Fay, the veteran comedian of vaudeville days, has been signed for a comedy program which will debut on the air October 4. Fay has tried radio before but somehow never seemed to click with the ether fans. Perhaps this time he will.

Bert Wheeler, the one remaining member of the famous team of Wheeler and Woolsey, is now associated with Tommy Riggs on a Pacific Coast program. It may soon be expanded to include a national hook-up.

Bob Burns, formerly with Bing Crosby, and Hal "Gildersleeve" Peary have branched out to head shows of their own. Burns starts soon in a comedy series entitled "The Arkansas Traveller," while Peary, noted for his uncanny laugh, has left "Fibber and Molly" and is now the chief point of interest in a show called "The Great Gildersleeve" (see story, page 36).

That famous pair who romped through the picture version of "What Price Glory" will re-enact the roles of Capt. Flagg and Sgt. Quirt in a radio version of the play. The accent, of course, will be on comedy.

Comedian Milton Berle is another who has signed to appear on a radio program. He will furnish the humor in a show which also features Charles Laughton, the movie actor. Others

who may go on the air this fall are Phil Baker and Ed Wynn. All in all it looks like a great day for the boys who give out with that stuff which is easily the most acceptable form of entertainment—the proof of which is constantly being borne out in the high ratings of most comedy shows.

### GENERAL

#### Fidler Bolts CBS!

HOLLYWOOD.—Charging censorship by the Columbia Broadcasting System under pressure from film executives, Jimmie Fidler has persuaded his sponsor (the Tayton Company, cosmetics manufacturers) to sever relations with CBS and move his Friday West Coast show to Don Lee-Mutual. The movie commentator has released a full statement of his grievances, a copy of which he sent to the Federal Communications Commission. In his statement Fidler said, in part: "During the six weeks of my current series over Columbia, their censorship policy has hampered and worried me to the point that I have felt and feel that I have been denied the right of

free speech . . . The only motion pictures the Columbia network would permit me to review honestly (if they deserved panning) were movies produced by independent or small companies, or in other countries . . . I know for a fact that some heads of the film industry, unable to 'take it,' have gone to my sponsors and Columbia in protest, and have tried to 'get my job'."

In answer, CBS released this statement: "Columbia has often differed with Mr. Fidler as to what is legitimate motion-picture criticism. If he has found a network which will wholly accept his views on this subject, we are pleased."

#### Summer Successes

NEW YORK.—"Claudia and David," sketch about the life of a young married couple, and Ransom Sherman's comedy show, "Hap Hazard," received most votes as a result of MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE asking listeners recently to write their opinion of which new summer shows rated permanent spots. All shows revealed strong followings, but these two drew the most expressions of favor. Fans of the two winners will

be pleased to know that both are to become permanent radio features.

### Oil Out for Football

NEW YORK.—Despite the fact that a shortage of oil exists in the East, necessitating severe restrictions on gasoline sales, the Atlantic Refining Company has announced that it will continue sponsoring the East's outstanding football games. The company may discontinue plugging their products and go in for institutional advertising, plus educational information, such as how to save gas while driving your car. They feel there is not much point trying to increase gas sales during the present emergency.

### Radio Promoting Good Will

CHICAGO.—Karl Weber (Charles Cunningham in "Guiding Light") has returned from a vacation visit to Guatemala and Honduras convinced that American radio programs have helped boost Central America's regard for this country. He found two of the most popular programs there to be Xavier Cugat's musical programs and blow-by-blow descriptions of boxing bouts in the United States. One of the highlights of Weber's trip was an impromptu theatrical production in an ancient theater in Chichicastenango. The guides on the tour did a satire on the tourists, and Weber turned the tables with a little dramatic caricature of the guides.

### HONORS

#### Actors Honored

CHICAGO.—Two young and prominent radio actors of Chicago have been notably honored by election to the Legion of Honor of the Order of DeMolay, junior Masonic order. They are Marvin Mueller, who acts as Gil Whitney in "Romance of Helen Trent," announces "Quiz Kids" and does numerous other acting and announcing jobs, and Olan Soule, well known as Sam Ryder in "Bachelor's Children" and as Kent Cromwell in "Helen Trent." They were among five Illinoisans and seventy in the nation so honored. The Legion of Honor numbers 3,000 members of the million and a half who belong to DeMolay.

#### Hope Tells His Story

HOLLYWOOD.—"They Got Me Covered," Bob Hope's comic autobiography, is scheduled to go on sale this fall. It's a self-kidding piece of work, with a foreword by Bing Crosby. The publishers are starting with a large runoff for the first edition, evidently expecting a heavy sale.

ELKINS, W. VA.—Radio actress Bess Johnson has been Mrs. Peter Fick since June 10, according to an announcement made by the bride's parents, former State Senator and Mrs. Herman J. Johnson. Fick was married to Marge of the "Myrt and Marge" team until her death a few months ago. The new Mrs. Fick was divorced from her first husband several years ago.

#### "Bing" Rochester

HOLLYWOOD.—Emulating the hobby of crooner Bing Crosby, Eddie (Rochester) Anderson, the colored comic on the Jack Benny show, is engaged in acquiring a racing string. Rochester already has two horses stabled here on the coast. This week he added four more to the string when he purchased

a quartet of yearlings at the annual Saratoga Yearling sales.

### Oboler Plays Still Heard

HOLLYWOOD.—Despite reports that Arch Oboler would give up radio writing since he signed to write motion pictures, the noted radio playwright is continuing to dash off scripts for the "Treasury Hour" defense program. Oboler has said he would write for the show as long as it had need of his plays.

#### Marines Are Coming





# PAUL REVERE RIDES AGAIN

## Unmasking the fake patriot who tries to arouse Americans to perils painted by Dr. Goebbels

LATE in April, 1941, just one week after the 166th anniversary of the ride of Paul Revere, a new propagandist calling himself "Paul Revere" went on the air for the first time over the Berlin Shortwave Station. Scheduled to talk to North America nightly, except Saturdays, at 11:30 p.m. EDT, Paul Revere is actually being heard only irregularly at this hour at present.

It was on June 1, his fifty-second birthday (he is the same age as Hitler), that Paul Revere revealed his real identity as American-born Douglas Chandler. Shortly after this date Chandler was interviewed in Berlin

and discouraged, fed up with the depression and Washington bureaucracy, he took his wife and two small children and journeyed to Germany in 1931. Having been an interested advocate of Nazism since 1927, he now had a chance to openly crusade for this cause. What time he wasn't engaged in the interests of National Socialism he spent in doing bits for the German press, occasionally contributing an article to the *National Geographic* magazine. In 1937, Chandler attracted the personal attention of Adolf Hitler, became a leader in the Nazi cause. In the spring of 1941 he offered his services gratis (said he didn't need the money) as a speaker in the North American service of the Berlin Shortwave Station. Sold on Nazi principles, he still claimed a love for America, his native land, and felt he could sell the benefits of National Socialism to United States listeners. Goebbels grabbed him up in a hurry and thus appeared over the air "Paul Revere."

According to Stephen Laird, Chandler is "a tall, handsome, crisp-mannered, crisp-dressed person, with crisp iron-gray hair, gritted eyes and teeth." Handsome in appearance, Chandler is not a handsome character. Not only is his air-manner caustic, sneering and obnoxious but he has made the grave error of setting himself up as a modern Paul Revere, thus satirizing one of America's most popular and beloved historical characters.

Chandler's characterizations of Paul Revere are ushered in with a ridiculous, squeaking piccolo playing "Yankee Doodle," and with a synthetic clatter of horse's hoofs supposedly representing the approach of the Revolutionary rider on his galloping steed. Then Chandler introduces himself by saying, "Your messenger, Paul Revere, greets you again, friends and compatriots, from my tour of the world on my winged horse. Views expressed by the speaker are his own (about the same gag that E. D. Ward pulls) and are not inspired by his German hosts." He then goes into the reading of the latest German news

bulletin, ten percent news, ninety percent propaganda. His favorite targets for criticism are the Jews, Roosevelt and Shortwave Station WRUL, and its president, Walter Lemmon. WRUL he calls the illegitimate child of the *Christian Science Monitor*. To Roosevelt he awards the Meddle Medal. The United States he calls "Uncle Sam's flophouse for European down-and-outers."

Traitor Chandler has no friends in this country, very few listeners. Even his two sisters residing in Baltimore thoroughly disapprove of his foul mouthings and are ardent advocates of all aid to Britain. The Paul Revere stunt has fallen completely flat.

### The Low-Down on Kaltenbach

Additional facts about Fred Kaltenbach, leading Berlin propagandist, came to me this week in the form of a letter from Mrs. F. S. of Janesville, Wisconsin, who writes:

"I was raised just five blocks from 'Fritz,' went to school with him and worked in the same office with him for two years. He was educated at East High and worked as an office 'flunkie' for two years at the Leavitt and Johnson Trust Co. Always antagonistic and 'communistic,' he could get along with no one. Through some 'fluke' he then took a position as a teacher of American history in a public school in the near-by town of Manchester, Iowa. Suddenly he disappeared, and the next thing we knew he returned to Waterloo with his German wife and his tall stories of the fine man he worked for in Germany. None other than Hitler . . ."



No longer is he just a stooge whose blustering run-ins with Fibber were one of the highlights of the popular "Fibber McGee and Molly" show. It wasn't that pompous Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve got fed up with his little chum Fibber. And it wasn't that hearty Hal Peary, who plays Gildersleeve, had any kind of professional disagreement with his bosses or co-workers. Peary and Jim Jordan, who is Fibber McGee, are still good friends and close neighbors, and Peary left the McGee show with the good will of all concerned. The new starring role was simply the outcome of the immense popularity of Gildy, the stooge on "Fibber McGee and Molly."

It wasn't only the famous laugh that he scooped up off his diaphragm and shoveled over McGee that got Hal Peary the break. There were other factors: "Now see here, little chum!" "Why, you little —!" "You're a har-r-rd man, McGee!" And other nuances of the character with a booming voice much bigger than his bite. Peary played the part right up to the echo of his almost inaudible sputtering. So it is gratifying but not surprising to see the phenomenon of a stooge character stepping into his own starring vehicle, complete to glittering

name and trade-mark laugh.

This new achievement is no skyrocket affair for Harold Peary. He has been in radio for a dozen years and was one of the pioneers in commercial broadcasting on the West Coast. He launched his theatrical career as a kid singer in Oakland, Calif. Through Norman Field, then a matinee idol, he went into stock, beginning with juvenile leads. He was in the company that opened Hollywood's Vine Street Theater with "The American Tragedy." From a solid experience in musicals and dramatics Peary stepped into radio, winning his first notable acclaim as the Spanish Sere-nader. His first big-name recognition came on the "Spotlight Review," first two-hour commercial to originate in San Francisco, on which he and Charlie Marshall, cowboy singer, presented "Mr. Marshall and Mr. Peary."

**F**ROM San Francisco he drifted to Chicago for daytime serials and shows, such as "Flying Time" and "Madame Courageous." Peary is a natural dialectician and a flexible actor, has played as many as eight characters on one show. One of the few radio actors of Portuguese descent, he speaks fluently both Portuguese and Spanish. He can't remember all the types of characters he has played—doctors, lawyers, cowboys, cops, villains, many others—but it was as tough-talking, soft-hearted Gildersleeve that he really struck sparks with his interpretation.

As a member of the McGee show, airing from Chicago in 1937, Peary was playing a variety of characters. One of them particularly struck his fancy—a guy with big ideas and menacing exterior but under his bluff as simple and congenial as Fibber himself. He talked about it to writer Don Quinn. Quinn gave the character the

most facetiously pompous name he could make up, and Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve made his debut. The listeners smiled, then chuckled. Then Gildy laughed that laugh, and the listeners have laughed with him ever since.

That laugh! It's really about ten years old. Peary used it first when he played the villain in the "mellerdrammers" on the "Spotlight Review." Later he buried it and forgot about it for about seven years. During that time it aged in a dank, dark corner of his repertoire. When he dragged it out into the light again it was more vile than ever! It happened during an appearance Peary was making with Jim Jordan and Bill Thompson, another famous McGee stooge, at Chicago's Palace Theater in 1938. Fibber McGee (Jordan) was supposed to sell Peary a pair of suspenders. Just as he closed the sale his own pants slipped to the floor, revealing the comic in a pair of red flannels. Peary's reaction was supposed to be a triple-take, three laughs at distinct intervals. To vary the three he recalled his old villain laugh. The audience howled. Writer Don Quinn happened to catch the show, and from then on the laugh was written into all the radio scripts.

Peary has had all kinds of fan mail on the laugh, but he likes best to remember the package he received containing a can of kitchen cleanser with the instructions from the listener to "clean up that dirty laugh of yours!"

Peary's vocational activities have been confined to acting. He has made an exclusive and distinctive career of it, and he's still only thirty-five years old. He was born in San Leandro, Calif., and is descended from a pioneer California family, holders of a great Spanish land grant. He is married to the former Betty Jourdain, a dancer,

whom he met in a California juvenile theatrical company when they were both in grammar school. They have no children.

Recently the Pearys built a ranch home in Encino, almost next door to the Harlow Wilcoxes and only a mile or two from the Jim Jordans and Don Quinns.

This is one case where it makes your picture of a fictitious character more vivid to know how the real person looks and acts. Well, meet the real Gildersleeve: He's medium tall, weighs well over two hundred pounds, has a black moustache and curly hair, merry brown eyes and one of the best dispositions in Hollywood. For hobbies he collects crime photos and plays handball.

Here's just a little introduction to the first episode of the new show. Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve takes his leave of Fibber McGee's Wistful Vista gracefully and expeditiously. He departs for a neighboring city, where his orphaned niece and nephew need his help in managing a business which they have inherited. He hasn't seen the kids for years, so he arrives at their home loaded down with juvenile toys. A bit of a shock awaits him. And that's only the beginning!

**"T**HE Great Gildersleeve" is written by Len Levinson, formerly Don Quinn's assistant. The audition of the show got 117 laughs, more than an average Jack Benny show! That's enough of a tip. Just listen for that familiar laugh that will launch "The Great Gildersleeve" this Sunday evening—and be prepared to laugh plenty yourself. —D. M.

# Meet Your News Commentator: Lowell Thomas

WHEN Lowell Thomas was a boy, working in the gold mines of Cripple Creek, Colo., he had a burning desire to see more of the earth and its people than anyone who ever lived. Today he has so crammed adventurous travel into a half-century of life that he is one of the world's foremost globe-trotters.

Thomas was born in Woodington, Ohio, but was reared in the famous Rocky Mountain mining camp of Cripple Creek. He worked his way through four universities—Valparaiso, Denver, Kent College of Law and Princeton.

When barely of legal age, Thomas headed two expeditions into the sub-Arctic, armed with camera and note-book. He was assigned by the U. S. Government to record the history of World War I, was attached in turn to the Belgian,


French, Italian, Serbian, American, British and Arabian armies. With General Allenby in the Holy Land, Thomas met the fantastic Lawrence of Arabia and gave the world the first account of this romantic figure.

Thomas is one of the world's most-heard speakers. He gave his Lawrence-Allenby lecture alone more than four thousand times in nearly every English-speaking city in the world. His books include: "With Lawrence in Arabia," "Beyond Khyber Pass," "Count Luckner, the Sea Devil" and many other stories of world adventure.


Thomas began broadcasting in 1930, has won many honors among radio newsmen. He is now heard over an NBC network Monday through Friday evenings. —D. M.





# Kay Kyser's

"BEST of all radio shows to watch"—that's the laurel handed to Kay Kyser's "College of Musical Knowledge" (Wed., NBC) by many of those who have witnessed numerous broadcasts. But you have to see the program to get what they mean. It can't be told in words what a rare show the Old Professor actually puts on for his audience over and above his makes-you-want-to-dance-laugh-and-applaud entertainment for home listeners. You can talk of Kyser's spontaneous and really brilliant clowning, his natural ability to mimic, his charming intimacy with his audience. But you don't quite get it until you see him doing fancy dancing with a lady contestant during a song, seating himself suddenly on some feminine lap in the audience, cutting pantomimic capers while directing the band, or keen-wittedly bantering the spectators before the broadcast. Kay isn't the whole show, of course. But it rests solidly on his slight, rubber frame, spring-wire wit and balanced sense of showmanship. He works hard to entertain, and the bigger the audience the better he likes it. The studio from which the program is broadcast in New York seats 1,500. The Hollywood studio, where the show has been originating in recent months, seats 340. Needless to say, both studios are always full. Kyser is keen on recognizing persons who have been in the studio and has been known to "bawl out" persons who show up three weeks in succession, claiming it's fairer to give everyone a chance to see the broadcast. The network for this show, 115 stations, is moreover one of the biggest networks of any radio program. And by the way, it might make you appreciate the "College of Musical Knowledge" even more than heretofore to know that about 29,000 good American dollars are paid out each week for the production of this hour of high jinks and harmony—D. M.





# Arthur Godfrey

## The Outdoor Man



ARTHUR GODFREY, the singing and chattering windmill of the airwaves, had a boyhood ambition "to see everything and do everything." Now around forty, he hasn't quite seen all and done all. But in an amazingly active life the irrepressible redhead has seen a lot and done a lot. And you can add to that he has sung a lot and said a lot on the air.

You can call radio's man Godfrey a windmill without being either inapt or derogatory, because all you have to do is give him the air and he'll go on and on. When you say he's breezy, you're not quite correct. He's windy! He has to be to fill up as much broadcasting time as he has. He has been in many network spots, at present does several morning hours of entertaining Monday through Friday on Columbia's WABC in New York and on his home

station, WJSV in Washington, D. C.


No script-reading for Godfrey. That cramps his style. He seldom rehearses, is one of the most glib and resourceful ad-libbers in the business. His programs are definitely informal. He strums tunes on his ukulele, pounds the piano, sings in a free-and-easy baritone—and just talks. But that "just talking" has fascinated listeners for years. He has more sponsors than you could shake a stick at. But he shakes a stick at them—good-naturedly, of course—and gets by with it mightily. He kids his bosses and their precise advertising blurbs outrageously—and sells their products by doing so!

He got his real radio start with such incorrigible kidding—though he did so as a matter of exigency. He was an early-morning records-time-and-temperature announcer. One morning he forgot himself and muttered, "This is a monotonous business." Then he realized his complaint had gone over the air. So he picked up the blunder and turned it into an entre for a lot more of the same brand of talk. He said what he thought of the music, kidded advertisers and passed out advice galore. Instead of being fired, he was a success.

That brings us back to the fact that he has led a broad and active life. Hence his authentic chatter about anything and everything. He has been a coal-miner, architect's office-boy, Navy radio operator, insurance and cemetery-lot salesman, waiter, cab-driver, vaudeville performer and breeder of dogs, horses and cattle. Especially, he's an outdoor man.



With the exception of George White, bassist, all members of Skinnay Ennis' crew who were injured in that bus

accident recently are back at work. White sustained a broken back and hip, which will keep him hospitalized for some time. Former bandleader Jelly Roll Morton, who claimed to have invented jazz and whose contributions to jazz are undoubtedly without peer, died July 10 of heart trouble. Morton was the composer of many jazz tunes, among the outstanding of which are "Wolverine Blues," "Milenberg Joys" and "King Porter Stomp." The Charlie Spivak band celebrated its first birthday recently. RCA has perfected a new phonograph-record changer which plays both sides of a record without turning it over. The new machine will also play two hours of uninterrupted music without the aid of a human hand. Sammy Kaye had a race-horse named after his style of music—Swing and Sway. The nag romped home the other day to win the \$10,000 Empire City Handicap. It paid eight to one, but unfortunately Sammy forgot that the horse was running. According to those who have seen it, the Fort Dix band, headed by former bandleader Herbie Holmes, is as good a band as the country can boast. The band will tour other Army camps.

Two of Irving Berlin's tunes, "Any Bonds Today" and "Arms for the Love of America," are the sole property of Secretary of the Treasury Henry Morgenthau, Jr., and the Ordnance Department of the War Department, respectively. Your correspondent's nomination for the season's most peculiar song title is "B. I. Bi." Ted McMichael, co-author of the popular "Hut Sut Song," has a horn on his car which plays the darned tune. "Lament to Love," that exceedingly heart-throbbing new song-hit, was written by Mel Torme, a fifteen-year-old Chicago schoolboy.



But most of us, I fear, make good resolutions to jump out of bed ten minutes earlier every morning, stand before an open window and systematically stretch, only to give up after two or three days because we're sleepy and lazy.  
To our rescue comes James Davies, physical instructor at Paramount Studios, who has devised a group of excellent figure exercises that we can do in bed!

While you're still trying to wake up you can promote the flat stomach line you'll need for the fashions of the coming season. Throw back the covers and lie flat on your back with your arms beside you on the bed. Now bend your knees and bring them up until they are almost touching the chest. You'll feel the entire stomach surface contract. Straighten the legs out again and repeat five times very slowly.

For lazy women who wish, as Mr. Davies says, "to firm up flabby thighs and slim down hip lines," there's the exercise you can do by turning on your left side and bracing yourself with

arms stretched out in front of you. Now swing your left leg as far behind you as you can, then bring it forward with a slow kicking motion until you touch your outstretched arm. Do this five times on the left side and five times on the right and see what it does to your hips.

Under these circumstances you'll find it quite easy to get the habit of morning exercises. You'll find yourself adapting other exercises you used to do standing up or on the floor to this lazy-lady manner, and that is fine, for the results will be just as good for your figure.

### Fall Fashions Decree Slender Lines

While we're on the subject of figure-control it's timely to mention that the new fall fashions want slender lines to set them off. When you appear in your first new outfit this fall be sure it's new from foundation garment up. Every woman should wear a girdle or corset, even if she's pencil-thin. If she tends to bulge, a one-piece full-length garment is the best bet. Thymold has some grand slenderizing garments for problem figures, and the Hickory line of foundations has excellent built-in supports which will mold graceful lines and a trim silhouette.

The "frankly feminine" lines on the season's styles call for a well-molded bosom. You can meet the requirements if you'll select a bra that's designed for your own particular bust line. The Bali bras offer an excellent group to choose from, with styles for average as well as full-figure types. The Bali Brassiere people are running a contest right now to find a new word to describe the appeal of a lovely feminine figure. 




