



Arkansas Traveler Settles Down

Bob Burns Invents, Raises Prize Pigs on Bazooka Berk Ranch in San Fernando Valley; Collects Guns But Hasn't Heart to Kill Anything

BIG, BRONZED, Lincoln-esque Bob Burns waved genially, called "Howdy, come right in" across his park-like lawn. Radio Life was visiting NBC'S "Arkansas Traveler" on his California homestead nostalgically named "Bazooka Berk Ranch." "Bazooka" comes from the musical instrument of the same name, Bob told us—"Berk" from Berkshire, the type of prize hogs he raises.

"Every square foot of the place is just the way I planned it," Bob said proudly of his 70-acre model farm in the San Fernando Valley, then proceeded enthusiastically to usher us around. In slacks and a sport shirt, Van Buren's most famous citizen made plain the source of his fame as a story-teller. He just relaxes and talks about everything in the world—and everything in the world interests him. This we gathered as he showed us around his model establishment. Bob built and

designed the whole farm himself without the aid of an architect or a contractor. "I made pieces of cardboard the shape of the rooms and buildings. Then I kept adding and moving them around 'til I got 'em how I wanted 'em," was the way he explained the plan of the place.

His white frame house is long and low and sprawled in a semi-circle around a patio and swimming pool which is the center of activity. Grouped around the end of the pool away from the house are three aviaries which contain a large portion of the thousands of birds and fowl Bob breeds—parroquets, zebra birds, canaries, rare and exotic gold-er pheasants, as well as the more plebian duck, turkeys and chickens. Rare varieties of doves and chickens wander around the house on the wide green lawn and under the many shade trees.


Produces Own Feed

With the aid of only two men,

Bob farms 400 acres. He produces alfalfa, barley and other grains from which he grinds all the feed for his herd of 100 prize Berkshire hogs, also his cattle, goats and fowl, and whips up a little breakfast food for the family on the side.

No backwoodsman of hillbilly origin in spite of his homey tales and countrified manner, Bob is a college graduate in civil engineering, and son of a civil engineer. He has never practiced engineering; although his aptitude for things along these lines comes out in many ways. He has a complete workshop in which he builds and repairs everything on the farm—with his own hands he put together every one of the hundreds of bird nest boxes, cages and aviaries.

He showed us a long cable slanting from a raised platform to which was attached a pulley and handle which he built for his three youngsters to play on. One end was anchored down as firmly as an oil well derrick, with cables attached to an underground post known as a "dead man,"—the other was tied to a tree. He told us of his plan to build a model city for his three youngsters, complete with merry-go-round, houses, little street cars and all the trimmings. "It's pretty

sad when people get bored for lack of things to do," our subject commented.

Comfortable House

Bazooka Berk Ranchhouse is in excellent taste, a comfortable, long, low and crescent-shaped building, most rooms of which look out onto the patio. The exterior is white frame, modified New England farmhouse style, and the interior is modern. Bob's own room is done in dull greens and browns. Three built-in glass cases cover one wall—one contains Shakespeare complete, another his gun collection, though, he claims he "can't bear to shoot anything."

It hasn't always been good going

for Burns — his present self-made Utopia is only four short years old. After completing college, he turned to show business, got his first job with a touring carnival at the fabulous salary of \$3 a week, plus room and board. He moved from one carnival to another, once had a yen for the life of a sailor and worked on tugboats on the Mississippi out of New Orleans and freight boats along the Atlantic seaboard. When World War I came along, Bob joined the Marines, came out of the A.E.F. a sergeant and champion rifleman. After the war he went back to show business, tried various things, including a slide-show in Atlantic City and a blackface act in vaudeville. Then he came to Holly-

wood in 1931, and, after a brief stint in motion pictures hit a low when he could only get engagements at women's clubs and as master of ceremonies for businessmen's meetings around town at a few dollars a performance. He feared that such appearances might lower his standing and ruin his future chances and was undecided as to what to do.

Friend of Rogers



Birth of a Mystery

MEET "BILL LANCE"—"that ace of criminologists whose daring exploits and infallible accuracy have earned him, from the underworld, the nickname of the Fer de Lance, the deadliest of reptiles, so swift, so sure, that it never misses!"

IT TAKES a year to write each script!" Stewart Sterling stated brusquely. Sterling is one of the scribes penning the exciting weekly escapades of Bill Lance—"that ace of criminologists whose daring exploits and infallible accuracy have earned him, from the underworld, the nickname of the the Fer de Lance, the deadliest of reptiles, so swift, so sure, that it never misses!" The brain-child of mystery-writer, J. Donald Wilson, "The Adventures of Bill Lance," is brought to CBS listeners each Sunday night at nine.

"Into each script," said Scripster Sterling, in explanation of his statement, "are incorporated ideas and impressions and knowledge it has taken us at least a year to acquire."

Bill Lance's originator, the aforementioned Mr. Wilson, has been in radio for twelve years, specializing in crime shows. In his large library at home, with its extensive stock of books on criminology and medicine, he studies intently. A mystery writer must have a thorough knowledge of the human body, its reactions to abuse, poisons and antidotes, and their effects. He has certain wartime and censorship restrictions which he must observe; no spy stories in the western hemisphere; no information about inventions that are, or may be, in process; no revealing knowledge about such subjects as radar or vital chemical compounds.

Plot Format

"Lance," according to Wilson, is a typical detective story. It starts with a situation which the sleuth and his cohorts solve. Someone has been killed, or is about to be killed, and the writer drops clues for the detective and clues for the audience. His clues for the audience are obvious, so that listeners may pat themselves on the back and say: "That's how I had it figured out!" The play is built on a premise which is based on revenge, greed, fear, hate, then works toward a climax.

Of Bill Lance, Wilson says: "He has the deductive type of mind and he is very fond of music." Of the character of Lance's friend, Professor Ulyses Higgins, he adds: "Hig-

gins doesn't have the deductive type of mind and he isn't fond of music."

Consistency Stressed

Glen Heisch, producer of the program, stresses the importance of consistency of character. "Little things about Lance are salt-and-peppered throughout each script," he told us. "This makes the listener feel that he really knows the man. We have established him as being fairly good-looking, well over six feet tall, and somewhat of a ladies' man.

"We must make sure," Heisch continued, "that his expressed likes and dislikes are kept fairly consistent, and that he responds to every situation in a manner in keeping with his character."

Heisch has also spent twelve years in radio, and has produced more mysteries than any other form of air entertainment. Two prime factors for a good radio mystery story, he declares, are A) the selection of a colorful scene for the story, and B) the creation of interesting characters to carry out the plot. The scene of the story must stir the listener's imagination. Circuses, waterfronts, morgues, South American cafes and such countries as North Africa provide excellent background for murder and mystery.


The characters of the story must capture the listener's immediate attention. Unusual voices and accents are often employed. Radio's top-flight supporting performers, including Mercedes McCambridge, Joe Kearns, Cathy Lewis and Frank Graham appear prominently in the "Bill Lance" mysteries.

About Players

The title role is enacted by airplane veteran, John McIntire, who has been in radio exclusively since 1928. Off the air, McIntire is a rancher, rides horseback like a cowboy, likes to hunt and fish. His favorite literature is historical biographies, and he thinks Edgar Allen Poe wrote mystery stories which he terms classics in construction and development.

"Just Call Me Max--"

*Marilyn Maxwell, Beauteous KMH
Singer and Rising Movie Star,
Has Had Varied and Spectacular
Career, Remains a "Regular Gal"*

SHE UNWOUND her classic chassis from a chair, met us with a firm handshake and a warm and friendly smile, and informed us that "My friends just call me 'Max'". Which was not quite what we expected from blonde, statuesque Marilyn Maxwell, smooth-voiced songstress heard over NBC's Kraft Music Hall with Bing Crosby—and also without him while he's on tour among the armed forces.

"I used to 'Swing Through the Air With the Greatest of Ease' on a flying trapeze while singing 'You Nasty Man,'" she further unexpectedly responded when we asked about the steps that led up to her present high spot on the airlines. She used to sing with Ted Weems' band and from the age of three 'til she was thirteen she danced on the stage—all of which leads up to her present role of one of the most rapidly rising young stars of radio and screen.

Excluding her exceptional beauty, blue-eyed, blond-haired (she used to be a brunette, but the studio insisted on lightening her crowning glory), Marilyn is as natural and good-natured a typical American girl as you could hope to find. She is 23, measures 5 feet 6, weighs 125 pounds, was born in Clarinda, Iowa, but grew up in Fort Wayne. She enjoys her work, her singing, sports, people, and life in general, and happily told us all about it.

About Trapeze

"The trapeze incident," she explained, "came about when a famous but elderly lady aerialist who lived next door to me wanted to make a comeback. She figured her act needed rejuvenation, and I, being fourteen and next door and willing, learned to stooge for her in a few simple acrobatics. This phase of my career lasted one week—then the act folded," she amusedly reminisced.

"Max," to which name Marilyn responds as quickly as a G. I. does to "Joe," has never studied singing in

her life, but thinks she should have. She comes from a musical family, loves to collect records of all types. Before landing the vocalist's spot with Ted Weems' band she had served a brief stint with Amos Ostot's orchestra, tried her luck as solo performer in Chicago night clubs and hotels, and toured with Buddy Rogers and his orchestra.

She was almost always to be found backstage at the local theater whenever big name bands came to town after she got back to Fort Wayne. All the reporters around town knew her as a "regular" kid and were plugging for her, and when she finally landed her bigtime singing spot the press sendoff was something terrific.

Should Try Hollywood

"Then after I'd toured with the band for two years, I thought I should make a try at Hollywood. Mother and I started to drive west to Pasadena when our car was wrecked in a sleet storm in New Mexico. So we proceeded the rest of the way on the train," so she described the bumpy road to the scene of her present success. After arriving in California she spent the next six months playing small parts in Pasadena Playhouse productions for the experience she felt she needed. Paramount spotted her, gave her a screen test, but nothing came of it so she went on a tour of army camps with a cigarette radio program.

"I made 3-minute 'soundies' with Ted Fio Rito, Buddy Rogers, Jan Garber and other bands while I was at Pasadena and became known as 'Queen of the Soundies,'" she laughingly admitted. That led to a Paramount star subject, which led to the aforementioned dramatic test. After six long months of silence she got a call from MGM—a producer had seen her test and decided that she had what he wanted, "Max" told us. Two years ago she signed a long-term contract with that studio. Since then she has made several Dr. Gillespie pictures, rated the head in a

Presidential Poll

According to a five-state unofficial presidential straw vote conducted by Sam Hayes on the Blue's "World Wide Review," Dewey has the lead over Roosevelt. Approximately 8,000 votes from California, Oregon, Washington, Nevada and Idaho give the New York governor a percentage lead of 52.6 to 47.4.

Young Artists

The first concert of the second annual "Los Angeles Philharmonic Young Artists Competition" got underway on Wednesday, October 4, at 9:30 p. m. over KFI with approximately seventy-five contestants taking part during the season. The competition is open to young instrumentalists who will not have reached their twenty-fourth birthday by April 15, 1945, and the winner or winners will receive a \$500 war bond and a personal appearance with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra under the direction of Alfred Wallenstein.

An added feature this year will be the selection of a contestant who will not have reached the age of fourteen





How Made Show

How did she come to be on the Kraft show, we asked? It seems that she was out at a Lakeside golf tournament when she met Bing. He knew she was a singer, asked his agent why she wasn't on the show—and the next thing, she was on! Things just happen that way to "Max."

Her acting ambitions are serious, but she likes best to be cast in light comedy roles, doesn't think she's convincing in heavier parts. "When I was at Pasadena Playhouse the other students couldn't understand why I'd give up touring with a band to study acting—they would like to have done what I had and I wanted to do what they were doing," she said.

easy job and that he envied his ability to "jest talk," as Burns puts it. Rogers had just come back from a tour of Arkansas and Oklahoma in which he had drummed up thousands of dollars of relief money for flood victims, when one lean day he ran into Bob on the street. "Come on, boy, I'll tell you about the folks back home," he insisted, heading for the nearest restaurant. Bob eventually got around to the tough going and his confusion as to what to do. Will advised him to "Keep goin', no matter what—even if you have to work for \$3 a performance, just keep workin'!" Which was all the encouragement Bob needed.

Burns told us about one time after Will Rogers' death when he was asked to speak before the Chamber of Commerce of a neighboring town. The master of ceremonies built him up as "the only man who could take Will Rogers' place." Bob, who is almost hyper-modest, was completely floored, said he "felt awful." Then he told them how he felt about his late contemporary. "If they could build a monument so high you could reach out and touch God that wouldn't be enough. I'd be satisfied to be just one little pebble on which the shadow of the monument might be cast," Bob explained to them in parable.

Before he was introduced to the radio public on the Rudy Vallee program in 1935—a show that for years acted as the major showcase of radio talent and led directly to Burns' present radio and film fame—he had quite a bit of radio experience. He appeared on the old Gilmore show and on Johnny Murray's Hi Jinks.

Still Tough Going

For two years after that he made 15-minute recordings for \$5 apiece—sometimes as many as eight in a night. "Once in a while I got hostile and threatened to quit, then they'd raise my pay to \$7.50," he recalled. "These recordings were sold to some fellow in the middle west who sold sausages and put in his own commercials," he went on. "They were dedicated to moonlight, the Northwest mounted police, wives, husbands, flowers and everything in the world." First a girl backed by a band sang a little song about moonlight or whatever the subject of the program happened to be, then Bob gave out with a ten-minute monologue on the subject, and the recording ended with

nouncer John Conte, and, despite Hollywood rumors to the contrary, they plan to be married at the earliest possible date. "But just now he's in New York with the 'Screen Test' program, so we'll have to wait a while," she said with a three thousand-mile-away look in her eyes.

another little song. He made up the monologues as he went along, did them on every imaginable subject, and recounts it as wonderful experience. Now he's the only man in radio who uses no script at any time—just occasional notes.

Burns auditioned for Vallee when, as he put it, "you could shovel hillbillies around like potatoes." Auditioners were skeptical, gave him that "this-is-something-we-go-through-twice-a-week" cold stare when he informed them that he didn't have an act, he "jest talked," and what would they like him to talk about. They told him to talk about anything but make it snappy, so he did... twenty minutes later he stopped, said they knew by then whether they wanted him or not. So he got his chance and was on the show the rest of the summer. Bob also appeared with Bing Crosby on the Kraft Music Hall before landing his present exclusive spot on the airplanes as the "Arkansas Traveler."

Bob Burns is a simple man and very much of the people. His homey anecdotes about his Arkansas friends, relatives and neighbors are rare Americana. It's his belief that people prefer a simple radio program to a "moneyed show"—that "radio listeners are like the people standing on the street outside a premiere." Only a few can get in on the extravagant glittery shows—so he aims for the simple, more universal type of entertainment. And achieves it.

HO-HO! WHAT a character!"

To millions of radio listeners this is the special trademark of "Leroy" who is helping his ether-uncle, Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve, rake in the nation's top ratings on listener popularity. But success is anything but new to "Leroy," alias Walter Tetley who, at the tender age of ten, was salting away more than \$100 a day as a radio actor.

Now further along in years, Walter has dwarfed his ten-year-old salary by playing movie parts, free-lancing in many radio shows and becoming a permanent fixture on the top-notch NBC comedy show, "The Great Gildersleeve." Walter can point to the future and say, "Life Begins at Twenty." His star shows no signs of waning.

"I started in show business when I was five years old doing a single act in vaudeville," Walter says. "I was seven when my mother was working on a case as a registered nurse and the mother of the little girl she was taking care of knew that I was working. She suggested that I do some radio work and got me an audition with NBC. The next thing I knew I was singing Scotch songs on the Children's Hour over WJZ, New York, every Sunday morning."

Walter's next radio job, also on NBC in New York, was a part in a kid's strip show called "The Lady Next Door." It was Walter's first script reading experience. "Every-

thing on the green earth happened," he says.

Accidental Casting

When Walter landed a part in NBC's children's serial, "Raising Junior," it was quite by accident. When tryouts were held for a part in the show, Walter dropped around with a friend. His friend got the part and Walter didn't even try out. Then on the day of the program, Walter was in the studios doing his part in "The Lady Next Door."

When he had finished he calmly walked into an elevator going down. But, at that moment, a hand grabbed him by the collar through the elevator door. He was whisked into a studio and told that he would have to read his friend's part in "Raising Junior." His little chum hadn't shown up and time-to-go before the show would hit the air was approximately four minutes. With nary a look at the script, Walter found himself doing the part into a live mike. He repeated this process weekly for the next four years by landing the part permanently then and there.

A Working Woman Gives a Party

YOU KNOW what happens to "Jack" when it's all work and no play—well, the same is true for our busy, war-working "Jills." So, Norma Young, home economist at Don Lee's Hollywood headquarters, dips into her short-cut files to show busy women how to mix work and play in just the right proportion to keep the sparkle of happiness from being dulled.

Interested participant in Mrs. Young's recipes for making home supper parties a success while holding down a job is pretty Karen Holdt, or rather, "That Amazing Jen-

nifer Logan," for "Jen" is a working woman, too, running a huge war plant—that is, according to the Don Lee serial heard every morning at 9:45-10:00 a. m.

Mrs. Young's first advice to "Jen" and her sister Jills is to take a tip from our war plant managers who have been setting records for getting things done in short order. Mrs. Young recommends a "Production Chart" to guide every step of party giving—the planning, the shopping, the cooking. One thing a chart, or working schedule, does, is encourage us to do first things first—early shopping for raw materials, advance preparation of such subsidiary productions as dressings, pickles, pastry, and such, serves as a reminder for

such parallel party duties as checking linen and silver.

The Line-Up

Well, let's get to work—with an eye on our chart. Here's what we see lined up:

The menu plans: A buffet supper, set for 6:30 Thursday evening. The food, selected with a thought for the hard-working "Jacks" who are on the guest list, including sliced cold meats, hot potato salad, fruit gelatin salad with mayonnaise thinned with fruit juice, sliced tomatoes and cucumbers, pickles, hot biscuits, and chocolate pies — one pie for each guest, no less.

Start to work on the party on Saturday, when you have home time for

shopping. Buy all the "staples" first—gelatin, potatoes, biscuit mix, pickles, bacon, shortening, packaged chocolate pudding, and a bag of marshmallows.

Monday: Check the silver, linen and flower garden to make sure you can set the table without delay.

Tuesday: Buy milk, cream, butter, vegetables, fruit and cold meats.

On Wednesday evening we really get on the assembly line: Make the gelatin salad first—while the gelatin is thickening, slice fruits and have ready to fold into the gelatin in a jiffy. Pour into serving bowl, set in ice box, and forget it till serving time. Other Wednesday duties include boiling potatoes, and while they're cooling, mixing and baking pastry. While potatoes cool, tomatoes are peeled, wrapped in waxed paper and stored in vegetable bin with cucumbers. Then, peel potatoes, slice, cover and add to ice-box collection.

Set Table Next

Setting the table is more fun than work, of course, but it's listed next on our production chart, so the cloth is spread, silver is laid out, and all the serving dishes are set out ready for filling on Thursday evening. Before going to bed, cover the buffet table with a dish cloth, so dust can't settle on its gleaming beauty.

Thursday morning, before you leave for work, mix your chocolate filling with milk, and while the coffee perks, bring the pie filling to a boil, pour into pastries and let cool. Before you leave the kitchen, lay wax paper over the pies and they'll be ready to serve when dessert time comes.

While making your toast, make the biscuits—and store them in the ice box, too, till baking time.

Zero Hour

When the five o'clock whistle blows on Thursday evening, you make a bee-line for home and the kitchen, stopping in the dining room just long enough to put your fresh flowers on the buffet table.

In the kitchen, cucumbers are sliced, soaked for a few seconds, while you slice the tomatoes, then alternated with the tomatoes on a vegetable plate. Next, the cold meat is arranged on a plate, and decorated with a huge bouquet of parsley, in one cluster, like the French milliner puts on a hat. The fruit salad is added to the buffet with its dressing in a bowl beside it.

Now we concentrate on the potato salad, and keep an eye on the clock. While the dressing is heating, coffee goes into the percolator, and water is added, so it will be ready for cooking during the supper hour. Take a second to drop a marshmallow on each little pie, and add pickles to the table collection.

Just as the door bell rings, pop the biscuits into the pre-heated oven, and as soon as the hellos are over, pour dressing over potatoes and invite your guests to serve themselves—the party is on its way!

He's Really Like Riley

William Bendix, Cast and Recast As Neolithic Type, Is More Like The Typical American War Worker. He Is on Radio's "Life of Riley"

THE MOTION picture industry has made the most of William Bendix's extreme type of ruggedness and has cast and recast him as a super-primitive man, which he enacts convincingly, but is not.

Radio has made the most of William Bendix as he is, rather than the way he appears to be, and has cast him as the war working head of a typical American family in the titular role of the Blue Network's "Life of Riley."

Bill is ideal for the part of Riley, the riveter. He gives it everything and is no dead-panned "voice"—he does it with gestures and is as much an actor in the airplane parts as in any stage or screen role. He's perfectly natural when he gives out over the ether and has never in his life had "mike fright," so common even among experienced actors.

And what's more, he's in real life the head of a typical American family. His charming brunette wife, Theresa, was his childhood sweetheart and his 15-year-old daughter-Lorraine, and he are the best of pals. Bill and his daughter share an avid interest—record collecting. Mrs. B. is always having a time dragging the two of them out of record shops about town. Classical and popular recordings are equally accepted by the Bendix family, collectively speaking.

His Real Personality

Tough guy, simple, and a little on the empty-headed side in most of his acting roles, Bill Bendix in real life is none of these. Fond of his family, he is the typical ever-loving husband and father who likes his golf on week-ends. He takes his acting seriously, is happy that his roles thus far have been a happy mixture of comedy and tragedy.

The Bendix home is a colonial brick house located in the Los Feliz section of Hollywood. "Bill loves California and the climate and every-

thing out here," Mrs. Bendix told us, "but he wanted this particular house because it looks so Eastern." Gracing the grounds of the House of Bendix is a large Great Dane who answers to the name of Riley. Said beast's diet admits no chance for a plug for the sponsor—he eats only horse meat. ("Life of Riley" is sponsored by the American Meat Institute.) The Bendix clan also had a kitten named Dumpling, which Riley (the dog) dearly loved, but she had to be given away when they discovered that Bill was allergic to cats!

It's not his Brooklyn accent and it's not his rugged appearance that has been the cause of Bill Bendix's rapid rise to radio and film fame. It's his way of putting himself completely in a part, relaxing, and giving out with his own personality. It's the way the heart of gold shines through the rough exterior in every role he plays.

How Fame Came

Burly, blue-eyed, blond-haired Bendix is more than typical in that he has breached the phenomenally wide chasm between relief and riches in half a dozen and one years. His present career as an actor started ten years ago when he was a grocery clerk in Brooklyn—he used to get together with the neighborhood talent after hours and play the type of parts for which he has since become famous. Bill took up acting seriously during the dark days of the depression after the grocery store folded upon building a super-market across the street. He had been unable to obtain any sort of employment except an occasional session as a singing waiter or the like for some time,

when he went to work on a Federal Theater Project seven years ago. After that he landed the role of the cop in Saroyan's "Time of Your Life." Other acting followed, then radio guest star appearances, and the next thing he knew, he was Hollywood bound.

His Background

Born in East Side New York and brought up in the Bronx and in Brooklyn, Bill made his debut in the theatrical world at the age of five in the role of a small boy in an old Vitagraph film produced in New York. His father, who wanted to be an actor all his life but was everything else but that, had a job as a handyman and extra at the studio at the time. He was later offered a job as leading man in a stock company, but little Willie's mother decided "no" and life in the Bronx went on while the histrionic urge welled up within the youngest member of the family. The hopeful passed through his "school daze" in P. S. 5 and in five years of high school. Then came a year of semi-pro baseball and a season of pro football, followed by marriage to the girl next door. After that the grocery business—and you know the rest.

Bendix is one of the actors most in demand around Hollywood these days because he's a type and always gives a sincere performance. How he does it? "I just relax and be myself when I act," says he. He doesn't imagine he is some fanciful character, he's just Bill Bendix doing his best. And there's no reason to believe that the best won't continue to come to, and from him.

MIRIAM LANE, presented each morning by The Broadway—downtown—over KMPC, is one person who really loves her work. Home-making being her chief hobby, it's the most natural thing in the world for Miss Lane to chat with you each morning on a subject that is so close to her heart. This hobby, she claims, began back in high school days in Detroit, her native city, when the teacher found her lingering on after the others had gone, to ask questions about cooking and foods. The teacher made Miss Lane her assistant, sitting back on occasion to allow her prize pupil to take over.

Dramatic Training

Just as it began to look as if Miriam would choose home economics as her principal interest, she went on to the university, and in her freshman year had her first taste of dramatics when her room mate urged her to come along and try out for a play. Much to Miss Lane's amazement, she was given the lead. With great misgiving, she undertook to study the part, and happily for all concerned, the play turned out very well. That began a serious interest in speech and drama.

She might have been one of Hollywood's shining stars but for an incident that occurred one morning in January on Detroit's icy pavements. A friend of the family who had taken an interest in Miss Lane's acting ability, arranged an appointment for her with Jessie Bonstelle, whose name is well known in the theater, and in whose stock company in Detroit, Ann Harding and Katharine Cornell began their work in the theater.

As Miss Lane stepped out on the icy pavement to keep her appoint-

ment with Miss Bonstelle, she turned her ankle, was carried back into the house, and remained there for seven weeks. Miss Bonstelle went away for a holiday in late March, and by the time she returned, Miriam had left the University and was involved in activity in advertising circles, enjoying it very much.

Radio Start

The theater began to fade in the background, and it looked very much as though home-making and cooking, too, were beginning to lose out until one day when a good friend, who happened to be Home-makers' Director for a large network station, remarked that with Miss Lane's background of drama, speech and advertising, PLUS a genuine interest in cooking, foods and homemaking in general, it was a "made-to-order" combination for the women's department of radio.

Miss Lane became thoughtful, while the friend got busy and made an appointment with the manager of WJLB, Detroit. She was engaged as Women's Editor. That was six years ago. The friend was right. The program, known in Detroit as "Miriam Lane" gained momentum from the first day it was broadcast. Her success was largely due to her keen interest in

As in the East, one of the features of "Home Chats", (the program which Miss Lane is now broadcasting for The Broadway—downtown) is an occasional interview with an outstanding personality. She retains interest by broadcasting, in addition to material on beautifying the home and person, timely news of interest to women, ration information, and keeps listeners informed on all government campaigns in which women are

when Fred Allen gave Walter a call to be on his weekly show. For Walter it was invaluable experience. He had to play all kinds of characters and master such dialects as English, Irish, Scotch, hillbilly and tough brat. When Allen came to Hollywood he brought Walter with him. But when Allen returned to New York, Walter stayed right here.

In the Abbott and Costello film, "Who Done It?" Walter was assigned to a small part in one scene. The next thing he knew Costello requested added scenes for him. Walter ended up in ten good scenes which ran through the entire picture!

In one sequence of the movie, Walter is seen walking into a drugstore. Costello is seen standing behind the counter.

"How much is your orange juice?" asks Walter.

"Fifteen cents a glass," answers Costello.

"That's too much money."

"Not the way I make 'em."

"I betcha a dime I can drink the orange juice faster than you can make it."

"That's a bet."

Costello proceeds to make the orange juice and Walter proceeds to drink it—faster. After ten glasses, Costello gives up.

"You win. Here's your dime," he says.

After ten takes of the scene, Walter had drunk one hundred glasses of orange juice in one day alone. Everything would have been all right—only Walter is allergic to citrus juices.

Peary Sends For Him

Whenever Fibber McGee and Molly had a boy's part on their show, they called Walter. Hal Peary was also on the program, playing a part he had created and named Gildersleeve. Three years ago when Peary went his own way and a sponsor became interested in the prospect of a new comedy, Walter had returned to New York with his family. A wire from Hal Peary brought him out to Hollywood where he has remained ever since.

Walter's characterization of "Leroy" has become so famous that many listeners react as though he were one of the family. "Uncle Mort" had to give "Leroy" a spanking over the radio recently. Along in the mail the following week came a package addressed to Walter. It was for "Leroy" to use in protecting himself from "Uncle Mort." It's name? "The Van Court Scientific Course in Boxing!"

Typical scene from the script:

GILDERSLEEVE: Who hit you, Leroy?

LEROY: Eugene Clananhan. The big cheater

GILBY: Clananhan! Here, wipe your nose.

LEROY: Okay.

GILBY: Not on your shirt! I'm giving you a handkerchief!

LEROY: Thanks.

GILBY: What do you mean when you say Eugene cheated, Leroy?

LEROY: He started throwing rocks.

GILBY: Just like his father. By George, I'll go and see that Clananhan! I'll knock his block off!

LEROY: (Cheering a little) Attaboy, Unk! Can I watch?

GILBY: Well—maybe I'll just speak to Eugene.

LEROY: He's the toughest kid in the school.

GILBY: He is? Confound it, Leroy, why can't you play peaceably with your friends?

LEROY: How can we play peaceably? Eugene's gang won't leave us alone.

GILBY: Wait a minute. What is this gang of yours?

LEROY: Just a gang, that's all. Only our gang fights fair, and Eugene's gang cheats, throwing rocks all the time.

MARJORIE: Didn't I see you throwing rocks yesterday?

LEROY: (Indignantly) We never throw anything but dirt clods!

MARJORIE: Well, yesterday you threw a—

LEROY: If there's a rock inside of it, that's an accident!

With his family, Walter lives fifteen miles outside of Hollywood in the San Fernando valley. They have an attractive white stucco Spanish-style house, a swimming pool and, believe it or not, a farm, where Walter's dad spends all his time. They call the place the "Big Oak Ranch" because the house is built around a big oak tree whose branches afford a natural cooling system.

Walter's mother is a Lieutenant Colonel in the Women's Emergency corps and is in charge of a free canteen for servicemen in Beverly Hills. Mr. Tetley was in the New York post

office for thirty-five years until he retired on a government pension around a year ago. Walter's brother is a precision parts inspector in a nearby defense plant.

The Tetleys also have a stable with two horses. One of them pulls an old-fashioned "Surrey with the Fringe on Top" which stands on the farm and has been used in many old-time movies. The Tetleys have four dogs, five cats, two hundred chickens and two ducks—which Walter named Hedy and Lana.

After a busy day in downtown Hollywood this famous young radio actor can retire to the peace and quiet of the San Fernando valley and make plans for his future career. He'll stick to radio, but don't be surprised if he ends up by being a writer or producer.

"Why, Walter, you'll probably be producing the biggest shows on the air," says a friend.

"Are you kiddin'?" says "Leroy."

Howard T. McNear, who plays "The Professor," friend and collaborator of Lance, first appeared in radio in 1933, made his stage debut ten years previous to that at the age of eighteen. Away from the microphone, McNear is an ardent baseball fan and dog-lover. He is a veteran of World War II, having served in the Army Air Corps, and spends much time in following current campaigns and plots daily fronts on a set of world maps.

Returning to Producer Heisch, we asked him for his ideas of the importance of sound effects and music in the production of an air mystery story. "Except upon occasion," he replied, "I use music only to bridge scenes. An exception was the time the story's setting was a South American cafe. The soft strumming of Spanish guitars was heard behind the dialogue."

In regard to sound effects, Heisch declared: "I employ them only when they will motivate the plot or create suspense. In those instances, I believe in taking time with them to create fully the effect meant to be achieved. As much as fifteen to twenty seconds of air time may be occupied by the sound of someone walking across the floor, if there is suspense in his doing so."

Popular Type Show

Writer Wilson pointed out his thought that the extreme popularity of mysteries in these times is due to the fact that, in contrast to comedy, a mystery requires the listener's complete and undivided attention. The boys in the South Pacific say, "When we're listening to a mystery, we can forget what's going on here."

"A good mystery story," summed up Mr. Heisch, "is the result of extensive preparation and meticulous attention to the most minute details. The hardest part of the job is done before the first rehearsal."








