I've been buying Radio Life for years and don't like to criticize but why do you print programs the following week after they are over and through with? I turn the page every day in the magazine to see what is on and half the time it is so different. You must print the daily schedule by the thousands and never look to correct any. The newspapers do better than that. I get the paper for seven cents including the radio listing. You charge nine cents for what? You'll probably destroy this card and not even read it.

It must seem that way to you, Mrs. Greenberg, after you find two or three incorrect listings of your favorite programs. It must seem that we do it on purpose, or just don't care. But we can assure you that we correct our logs to the full extent of our knowledge and information at press time (and some folks claim that we do very well). Our log corrections average nearly five hundred changes a week—and we wouldn't call that "never looking to correct any."

We don't know just what errors you discovered or whether they were in the logs or the precasts, so we can't offer any specific explanations. However, we have found that nearly all cases of incorrect listings arise from failure of the stations to advise us of changes in time for publication. We don't think this is entirely (or even mostly) the fault of the stations, most of which have given us the best possible cooperation. Some errors seem to us to be inevitable, because of the innumerable things which can happen in a radio station to upset the neat schedules of the program department. Stars or guests can bow out for any one of a thousand reasons; special events are entirely unpredictable but very disruptive; and perhaps the most frequent cause is the sponsor, who may cancel unpredictably, or may buy a program at the eleventh hour without a word of protest from the sales department concerning the effect on program schedules.

This fine print would probably be as good a medium as any for the admission that we also make a few mistakes of our own—but we sincerely hope they never happen on any of your favorite programs, Mrs. Greenberg.

By the way, a newspaper is only seven cents to be sure, but six newspapers would be forty-two cents. We charge nine cents for "an enormous good reading—two weeks' good listening."

World Radio History

➡ **THIN FROM ARMY** hospitalization, Sgt. Elliott Lewis married Cathy Lewis April 30, 1943—just two years after actor Jerry Hausner had introduced them when both were cast on the old Woodbury show. One of the West Coast Networks Set Up a Department Especially to Handle the Work Of Hopeful Script Writers. A Young Ex-Musician Happily Handles the Reins Here.

IF YOU have ever submitted a radio script to the American Broadcasting Company in Hollywood, then you know all about a "Literary Rights" department. ABC is the only network west of New York which has this operation.

And it is a good bet that anyone directed to the office of Literary Rights will be surprised to find a pretty, blondish young lady there

where there are already so many talented musicians. Alice realized this, and so jumped at the chance of breaking into radio in any capacity when she learned there was an opening in ABC's mimeograph department, hoping this would prove an opening wedge for exploitation of her talent.

Alice's promotion was rapid—but it wasn't in the music department. In

"Dragnet"

Much as we love most of our favorite crime programs, the last claim that we would make for them is that they bear any relation at all to real life. That's why we think the new Jack Webb program, "Dragnet," KFI, 9:00 p.m. Friday, is pretty exciting news. To these ears, it sounded absolutely believable.

Mention is made on each broadcast that the dramatized stories are based on the actual files of cases handled

by the Los Angeles Police Department, and for once the claim to reality is valid. The acting sounds as authentic as the stories. Jack Webb as "Sergeant Joe Friday" and Barton Yarborough as "Ben Romero" are to be credited for this.

Listeners yearning for spooks and haunted houses, poetic detectives on the prowl for lovely blondes, and mysterious strangers who warn their victims with picturesque messages won't cotton to "Dragnet." Its criminals are portrayed as the dull-headed, poverty-stricken members of the submerged tenth that they usually are. Their cruelty is the dangerous sort that springs from sordid breeding places of crime, not the vicar's garden of Agatha Christie nor the millionaire's drawing room of S. S. Van Dine.

"Music for You"

A good baritone voice and some pleasant piano classics add up to fine late-afternoon listening on KWEW, 4:30 p.m. Monday and Friday. The voice is that of Gene Hart, young Chicago concert and night-club singer, while the piano belongs to Lorraine Langdon.

We just know that if a man plans to murder his wife, it'll be she who knocks him off at the end of the show. We've got a swell idea for a "switcheroo" murder—why don't they have the butler do it?

As the title indicates, the thirty-minute stint is completely about **Dixieland** music, and we can't think of another thing that any two-beat addict could ask for. Sending us straight into a musical heaven was the piano-playing of **Marvin Ash**, who has a style reminiscent of **Peck Kelly** and **Bob Zurke**, but knocked us out with his own very special brand of **Dixieland** in the theme, which, naturally, was "Is It True What They Say About Dixie?" During the program he rendered such choice numbers as "Muskrat Ramble" and "Lonesome and Lovesick."

We can't think of anyone more appropriate to emcee a **Dixieland** show than **Harry Hickox**, who himself had a two-beat band back in the thirties. Add his easy style of talking and singing to any show and it would come out great. Even the commercials for the **Rigid Manufacturing Company** were easy to take.

The guests spots are nothing short of sensational, for they include revered names like **Red Nichols**, **Matty Matlock** and **Charlie La Vere**. When **Red** was on the show he told a story about hot-lick trumpet player **Bix Beiderbecke** and finished up the tale by playing **Bix's** famed chorus on "Singing the Blues."

Course, the show just wouldn't be complete without **Harry** giving out with a song. We liked best his recent pick of "The Blues," and he used as lyrics some phrases he had heard long ago from a strawberry vendor down in **Houston, Texas**. Fill-ins were sup-

plied that time by **Nichols** and **Ash**.

If anyone doubts the intoxicating beat of **Dixieland** music, we suggest that he, along with two-beat addicts, run quickly to the nearest television set next Sunday afternoon and learn "The Truth About Dixie."

Developed by the **Sampson Electric Company** of **Los Angeles**, the principle is in projection, regardless of the size of the master set. The company is now engaged in developing a miniature television set to act as the master to the large robot screen-mirror.

December of 1945, just four months after she joined the network, she was advanced to the Continuity Acceptance Department as assistant to Editor Dorothy Brown. One year later, the Literary Rights Department was created as a sub-department of Continuity Acceptance, and smart young Alice Box was picked to head this important work. ABC sent her to New York for intensive briefing in her duties by the Literary Rights head there, and she has since been on her own, working closely, of course, with John (Bud) Edwards, ABC's Western Division Program Director, and members of the network's production staff. She also continues to actively assist Miss Brown in editing scripts and passing on program gimmicks, handling this function for such shows as "Kyser's College of Fun and Knowledge," "Surprise Package," "Jay Stewart's Fun Fair," and the "Sippy Hollywood Theater," scripts for broadcast on ABC's Detroit station.

As Literary Rights Editor, Alice clears titles and formats for all local (KECA) and ABC network shows originating in Hollywood. She clears all published quotations and excerpts and all impersonations of such. She reads and registers all scripts submitted for both television and radio—between seventy and 100 scripts cross her desk each month—and then she makes her recommendations to the program director. Also, she handles requests for scripts from schools and various organizations when they are wanted for non-profit production.

Every Script Read

The actual reading of scripts is the most interesting aspect of her work, according to Miss Box. No matter how bad they might be, she reads each one through thoroughly, looking for the merest germ of an idea. They are submitted by people ranging from seven-year-olds up to octogenarians, and she is stimulated by the various thought processes they reflect.

As for her personal history, Alice Box was born in Nome, Alaska, but was raised in Oakland, California, where she attended the public schools and then went to Mills College in the Bay City for a year. She followed her Mills studies with two years at the University of Chicago.

All through her school years Alice studied piano, organ and arranging, with the singleness of purpose of making music her life's work. Now, however, she is so happy that she has given up all idea of a career in music, and plays the piano only for her own and friends' entertainment, and occasionally for church services.

- ¼ t. salt

➡ **RAFFLES II**, a mynah bird from Malay Peninsula, is Wells's constant at-home companion. The playful bird joins the commentator for breakfast; after only two weeks of domestication had learned to say, "Hello, darling."

From the primitive pottery of the hairy Ainus, the Japanese bear-worshipping aborigines, to the delicate craftsmanship of the Chinese and Indian artisans in wood and metals, the house abounds in interesting objects.

Prized Possession

"If there was ever a fire here, that's the first thing I'd try to save," he says, indicating a large, beautifully carved Chinese chest. "William von Tell"

Harry Took a Lot of Jestin' From Friends Until He Showed Them Several Tricks With the Bow and Arrow That Surprised Everyone . . . Even Him!

HARK the hunter who approaches with the quiver and bow! It's Harry von Zell, otherwise familiar as announcer and comedian on NBC's "Eddie Cantor Show," who has now stepped to the front as an archer.

No longer do comedians heckle him as they watch him trudging across the greens of Lakeside Country Club, setting up flags for targets. For he has proved his adept aim . . . even though it still amazes him.

Harry, who several years ago grew tired of the game of golf, was asked

by his friend Howard Hill, one of the world's greatest archers (he has shot nearly every species of prey on the North American continent), "Why don't we play a game that I can beat you at?" Harry consented, and the sport turned out to be archery.

Big Laugh

At first friends were greatly amused as they saw him laden with archery equipment, but the laughter subsided when he accepted a sudden bet made by Bob Hope. Said Hope, who had just returned from a game of golf, "Look, I'll bounce this golf ball on the ground and we'll see if you can hit it." Said von Zell, "Okay." Hope threw the ball down, von Zell drew the bow (praying to

himself that he could at least raise some dust fairly close to the ball), released the arrow and tore off the cover on the tiny ball! Said Hope, "Well, I'll be . . . !" To which von Zell replied, "Yes." The rest of the spectators gasped mildly, "Gee!" No longer do they laugh.

Von Zell uses mostly a bow with a ninety-five-pound pull. He is a "spot shooter" and has been instructed by Hill to shoot from all positions, lying down flat, on the side, stomach, and crouched on his knees. He insists there is no trick in hitting the target, but the main idea is that if you can pull the bow correctly, you're bound to hit what you're aiming at.

Word of Warning

He stresses good equipment and the ability to keep the bow from wiggling as it is pulled back. The steadiness is achieved by constant practice and getting the muscles accustomed to the exertion. He gives the warning that pipe smokers should leave their pipes at home when they go out to shoot. Harry knows from a painful experience that is the best thing to do.

Learned Lesson

"Howard Hill had constantly told me to take my pipe out of my mouth when I was shooting," he recalled, wincing, "but I didn't listen, thinking surely that nothing could happen." But it did . . . the string hit

Most of them are no longer available anywhere.

Wells started collecting more than thirty years ago, before war and poverty had taken their toll of native crafts.

His collection of miniature elephant pieces started because he considered the animal good luck for him. As an engineer in Malay, he had used them as work animals. The mantelpiece of his fireplace in Brentwood is covered with elephants in precious stones, metals and glass. Most of them have their trunks lowered. The popular superstition that it's bad luck to own an elephant figurine with a lowered trunk doesn't hold as far as Wells is concerned. "An elephant lifts his trunk only when he's getting ready to charge," he smiles, "and that's bad luck for anyone who happens to get in his path."

A huge library including many travel books and copies of the volumes that he has authored would be the next choice for survival in Wells's mythical "fire." He's particularly sentimental about a book he won as a school prize when he was a small boy.

Wells Books

Wells was born in Surrey, England, studied at London University to be a mechanical and civil engineer. Six years in Malay, surveying the route of the east coast railway, resulted in first books, a field engineer's notebook and a volume about the country. Other Wells books include "Raffles, the Bird Who Thinks He's a Person," an entertaining tale of the famous talking mynah bird that Wells and his wife Zetta had for many years; "Panamexico" (Mexican and Central American travels); "Around the World with Bobby and Betty," a children's book; "North of Singapore" (Malay, Japan and China); "Kapoot," perhaps his best-known work, contains the fascinating sub-head, "the narrative of a journey from Leningrad to Mount Ararat in search of Noah's Ark."

No word about the Wells menage would be complete without mention of Raffles II, successor to the late Raffles, perhaps the most famous bird ever known. The new mynah, secured from Malay by Wells's son-in-law, an airline pilot, had lived with Wells for only two weeks before he was able to chirp "Hello, darling" with complete appropriateness. He is good-tempered and playful and is learning quickly.

Just outside the front porch of Wells's home is a small but compact room full of the film that the explorer-commentator has shot during his travels throughout the past thirty years. Some of it is that old and most of it is irreplaceable. He believes that his film on Czarist and Soviet Russia is unique, in that so little footage of that country has

been available for many years. He owns two projectors, and at present is editing his entire film library, looking toward the time he can present it on television. As a pioneer member of early New York television days, Carveth Wells added that new world of exploration to his experiences many years ago!
