# Are Movie Hosts Necessary?

*Just what purpose, if any, do these genial men serve who act as the hosts on your movies on TV shows? Tom Frandsen is one who doesn't believe they are just men who like to flash the personality and hear their own voice.*

**T**HE MEN who act as your host on some TV programs featuring new, old, and tired movies, have come in for some ripe criticism. One group figures they are about as much use as a hole in the head. Others think they are a necessary evil. Some people even like them.

But do they have any real importance? Are they necessary? Tom Frandsen, KNBH's handsome exponent of the movie hosts, has his ideas.

## Hosts Do a Job

"The answer as to why TV has movie hosts is the same as why a lady likes to go into a store where she has her favorite sales person," Tom commented. "She likes to deal with someone she knows. Well, that's what my job is—to be a representative for the sponsors who pay the bills so you can see the movies and to be someone the viewers can feel they know personally, someone they can trust, someone who is directly associated with the products being sold on the program.

"I've had letters from people saying, 'Thanks, Tom, for telling me about your coffee,' (which is one of our products). 'We have tried it and it is good.' As you can see, it's the association between the product and me that seems to have importance to some people.

"Some companies send salesmen from door to door to sell the merchandise. Movie hosts do practically the same job and just by talking into

a camera. However, we're different from the ordinary salesman. If people don't want to buy the products on our shows, they at least get entertainment.

## No Pitchman

"Much of the criticism directed at some programs featuring movies is justified. But the fault is with the station who has adopted the idea that if one commercial pays off, ten will do just as well. On my KNBH shows I do not believe in over-commercializing. We never break into a movie more than twice for any selling. The mail received proves that we're on the right track here. The public knows the movies have to be paid for, but they resent having the pictures interrupted every six or eight minutes for some sales pitch.

"I always try to low-pressure the commercials. I don't believe in shouting at people. Instead, I try to feel as though I'm sitting across from the table talking to people. And there are definitely no shady deals on the show.

"I also don't have interviews with personalities on the program as a rule, but I will occasionally talk about some unnoticed little item in the news to break up a commercial."

Tom has had plenty of experience in both radio and TV. He began his career as an announcer and newscaster in his home town, Los Angeles. During the war he was assigned to the radio broadcasting industry in Hollywood as an ensign, but he

turned to Navy flight training, reaching the rank of lieutenant commander. He is still in the reserve and spends much of his time on weekends in a Navy plane.

After the war, Tom continued his work in radio and became sales manager for KMPC. He is what you might call a reformed executive. He is married to the former Sally Wadsworth and has two youngsters, Tommy, 4, and Chuckie, 1.

He loves his job but he wistfully remarks, "Some day I'd like to do a show with people. It gets lonesome talking to a camera. Let's face it—how can you be friendly to a couple of lenses?"

## TALKS ABOUT TEACHERS

**I**'VE OFTEN wondered what kind of teacher I'd make. I'm afraid I'd never have the courage to flunk a student, even though she or he might deserve it, and I'm also afraid I'd not be able to call it quits at the end of a school day. I'd probably take each child's personal problems home with me.

On the other hand, I think I'd be a good teacher because I'm a fairly patient person and to me, patience goes hand in hand with being a school teacher. I really love children

—they never cease to fascinate or amaze me and they're appealing any time between the ages of one day and eighteen years.

Of course any normal child will at times drive parents to the breaking point, but I've discovered that trying to learn what makes them tick can be delightful fun. Yes, that requires patience, but I'm told that's one of my better points.

Naturally I often think back on my own school days. The things I liked best were rehearsals for a school play or an occasional assignment as

substitute teacher. By far my happiest recollection was getting the lead in our senior play (ironically enough, my best subject was English, though I was also fascinated with French, public speaking and dramatics).

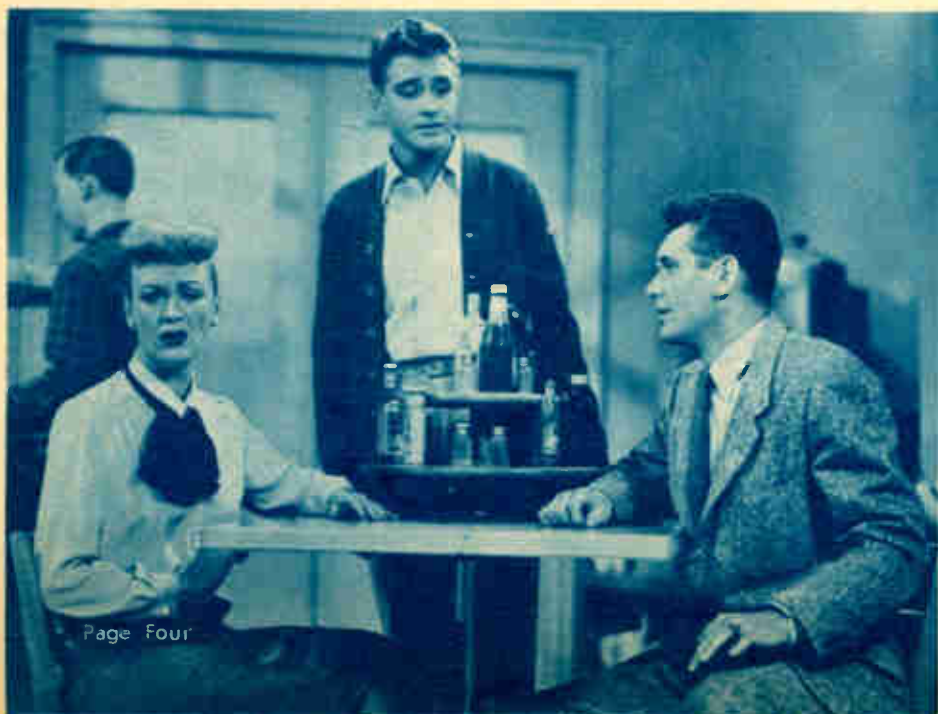
### No Bed of Roses

I hated outlines of any kind—and history! I never flunked out and yet I wasn't addicted to all A's—my grades were always just average. I always behaved myself except for one time when ten other girls and I played hooky from school. (The truant officer followed us up the road in a Model "T" Ford and returned us to school.)

Next to school plays my happiest memories center around the association I enjoyed with some wonderful teachers whose names I still remember—Ruth Van Waterman, Belle Abraham, Lizzi Kiser and Anne Davis. Only once was I ever afraid of a teacher—that was in San Francisco. This teacher was the physical type—heavy handed and everything a teacher should not be. I've mentally blotted his name from my memory.

I don't remember having a teacher exactly like "Miss Brooks," but I had many teachers whose combined personalities very much resemble her

and I suspect that my memories of these teachers have crept into my "Miss Brooks" characterization.

I do feel that our CBS radio and television programs have made contributions to the betterment of the teaching profession, for most of the episodes good-naturedly deal with teachers' problems, and in approaching them with a sense of humor I like to think we are doing a more constructive job for the teaching profession.

Teachers, I sincerely believe, have problems. If I were a teacher, I think my pet gripe would be the pay check; also, some parents' lack of understanding toward teachers and their problems. But I also think a teacher's life is rewarding because teachers help to model the youth of America and their rewards forever are multiplying. Years later their influence is felt by society.

I sympathize with all teachers for two reasons: long hours and short pay. But when anyone asks me if I could live on a teacher's salary, I can best answer by saying that I HAVE lived on LESS. I won't bore you with my early struggles as an actress, but I will tell you that there was a time when I would have gladly settled for three square meals a day.

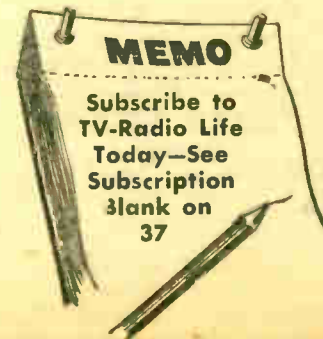

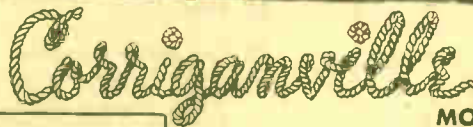

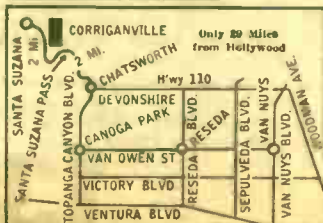

**JACK WEBB IS SUPPOSED TO BE** through shooting his feature "Dragnet," and is now editing the footage. He is also planning on making personal appearances with his film in late summer and early fall. Could this be one of the first of a movie "Dragnet" series?

**PEOPLE ARE COMMENTING ON** Lucy and Desi and how the bonanza baby is now relegated to infrequent mentions. Too bad, especially since Elizabeth Patterson was such a priceless sitter!

**AS SOON AS DINAH SHORE** signs off TV July 1, her clever writer-director-producer Alan Handley leaves for Europe. Alan has been Dinah's triple-threat man ever since she started her NBC-TV series three years ago, but he won't be back with her next fall. He will be doing NBC-TV shows, however, and hopes to work with Dinah on what the trade is calling "spectaculars" (like the Rodgers-Hammerstein show.)

**DURING LUNCHEON THE OTHER DAY,** Alan told me he is going abroad heavily armed with both "still" and movie cameras with which he intends to shoot background for future assignments. Last summer he grabbed about 5000 feet of European background and during the season just concluding he used approximately 1,000 feet on Dinah's show.

**HERE'S HOW ALAN UTILIZED HIS** camera output. Presume he had shot a Spanish street scene last summer, first "panning" the street and then up the side of a building toward a balcony. At a spot below the balcony railing he stopped and took a "still" shot of a portion which his set designers could recreate in the studio.

**WHEN TIME COMES FOR DINAH** to sing a Spanish song as she leans over the balcony, the TV camera runs Alan's street scene, "pans" to the building and stops at the part covered by the "still," then shifts to the studio reproduction, from which it "pans" on up to the rest of the balcony and Dinah. Alan practically challenges lookers to tell where some of his film and studio recreations switch.

**OF COURSE THIS METHOD IS NOTHING** new, but he thinks it hasn't been exploited to much extent on TV and that it can endow a program like Dinah's with great flexibility and scope. Alan has two new TV shows in mind and will shoot for them in England, France, northern Italy, Greece and wherever else the urge takes him. He sails from New York on the Ile de France. "On Bastille Day!" he exclaimed with a "here we come, Paree" expression. But Alan certainly rates a top notch vacation. My rough calculation indicates he has done some 234 shows for Dinah, and though she is a dreamboat to work with, coughing up ideas for this many teleshows can be depleting on the grey matter.

### Off Lens ( Personalities )

#### Miss Frances

A recent visitor to our TV center was NBC's **Dr. Frances Horwich**, or perhaps better known in the kids vernacular as **Miss Frances**. Her "Ding Dong School" program, which originates in Chicago, is aimed at the small fry between the ages of two and six.

**Miss Frances** was swamped by the press during her brief two-day stay, prying her with questions and complimenting her for her multi-award winning program. Her anecdotes about children were precious.

"The kids take whatever I say for the gospel truth," she said.

"On one occasion I concluded my program by saying 'goodbye I'll see you on Friday.' NBC's outlet in St. Louis which carries "Ding Dong School" on a delayed basis cancelled this program because of a special event and consequently disrupted the show's normal viewing sequence. When they picked up the "dropped" show on Saturday a certain youngster became quite confused. Explanations did not mean a thing to the bewildered child, who insisted that Saturday was Friday because **Miss Frances** had said so. The situation caused such a stir that the youngster's irate father phoned me in Chicago and had me straighten the lad out.

"Because of delayed kinnies and geographical differences I must be doubly careful of what I say to the children. But it's worth the effort because I think they're wonderful."

**Miss Frances's** magical powers with children is the result of twenty years of association and a genuine love for them. She understands their world and keys her program to their way of thinking. Her direct charm appeals to adults as well as children.

Her years of experience has taught her to treat each child as an individual. Although she speaks to millions of children on television her approach is personalized and direct so that each child listening feels that **Miss Frances** is completely absorbed in him or her.

Before dress rehearsal began I talked to **Dick** in his dressing room—and talk about your in-love and proud husbands!

"When we were first asked to do this show, I was against it," **Dick** commented. "I felt it was a real inhuman trial for **Susan** to come back so soon—and especially in a new medium and on a live program besides. **Susan** and I talked it over but she wanted to do the show. And the way she came through! She never got tired during the long rehearsals—but I did. We worked at home too by recording our scenes on our new Hi-Fi tape recorder. "I'm the luckiest guy to be married to **Susan**. I love married life—so much so I don't know why you have to wait to get married until you're old enough."


**Susan** and **Dick** certainly deserve the plaudits of everyone. And how fortunate it is that the show was considered one of the best **Lux Video** has ever done.

The more you watch TV dramas the more you wonder how really serious producers are when they cry out for good scripts. So many are immersed in triteness. Yet, a good director can often take a weak script and turn it into a solid hit by rewriting parts and by getting the most out of the actors. There were two examples recently of what can be done by a director who isn't just a traffic cop. **Ted Post**—yes, this column thinks he's one of the really great directors in TV—did a couple of "Waterfronts" that were gems. One dealt with the efforts of **Cap'n John** to clear a young guy who had been wrongfully accused of robbery. All right, this is no unusual plot—but the script was so concise, followed such a straight and believable line, and the direction was so expert that it was the best thing yet seen on "Waterfront." In fact, **Fred Maguire**,

head cutter, said it was the best piece of film he had had in his hands for ten years. The other episode, dealing with a little boy who hates the sea, was a tender, heart-warming story that was sidetracked only by the irrelevant appearances of **Allen Jenkins** and a girl playing a social worker. Their performances were good but they were unnecessary to the story. The rest of the show was a fine example of tight writing and sensitive direction.

This column has often campaigned for new faces to be built on TV. Well, if producers and agents and directors are smart they'll start a talent scout system such as the motion picture studios use. The **Academy Players**, incidentally, has some fine talent in its current show, "All The King's Men." **George Berkley**, **June Hammerstein**, **Earl Marsh**, **Allan Douglas**, **Frank Jurovich**, and **Max Palmer** are especially good bets.

**Final Note:** Haven't the **McCarthy-Army** hearings strayed a bit from their original purpose? It's now like neighbors enjoying peering over the back fence at the other person's dirty laundry.

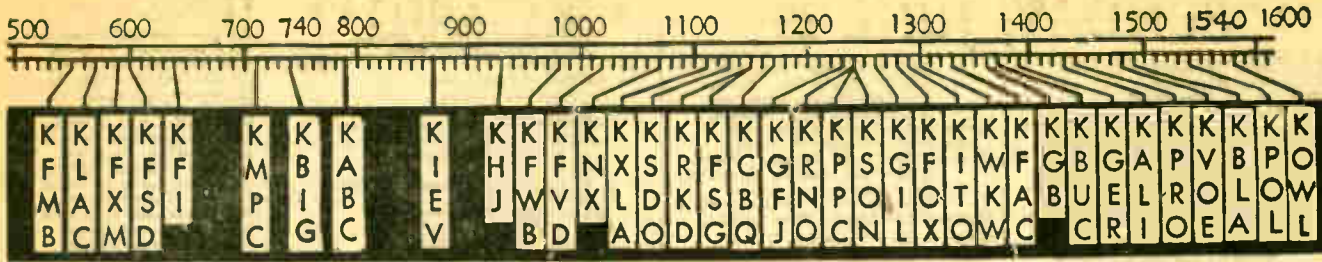

**Record Notes to You**

Long-playing records again hold the spotlight this week with more variety than the single discs. Nostalgia, too, plays a great part, for RCA's "X" label turns back the clock to early releases of the twenties by Benny Moten's Kansas City Orchestra, one of the first to play ensemble jazz. Another features original recordings by Ben Pollack's Orchestra when the Dean's payroll included Benny Goodman, Jimmy McPartland, Glenn Miller and Jack Teagarden. Rex Stewart heads a small group of Ellington men (including the Duke) in 1940 and 1941 recordings, several previously unreleased. If these great stepping stones to jazz are any indication of the other Vault Originals to follow (97 more) instead of being an unknown quantity, "X" will stand for X-cellent.



First release on the new Kapp label features narrator Eddie Albert, a dramatic cast and chorus for "One God." Based on the book by Florence Mary Fitch, "One God" presents the viewpoints of the Protestant, Catholic and Jewish religions as spokes on a wheel that lead to the same God. Beautifully produced, "One God" is the strongest argument for tolerance we have ever heard in or out of the church.

"Inside Sauter-Finegan" (RCA-Victor) is a collection of thirteen selections by this most unusual and unorthodox of all musical organizations. Some are descriptive ("September Sorrow"), some are vocal ("Old Folks"), some are modern jazz ("Pennies From Heaven"), and some feature soloists or groups ("Eddie And The Witch Doctor") . . . but all should win friends and influence record buyers to watch for future releases by Mr. Sauter and Mr. Finegan's modernists.

Celebrating his association with the label since 1943, Capitol has just released "Nat 'King' Cole's Tenth Anniversary." None of the sixteen selections included has been previously released, although they cover the past ten years with The King featured in trio, quartet and solo recordings. Truly a Portrait In Shellac, it's a great and fine tribute to a most deserving artist.

As we say on our KHJ-TV commercials . . . "this is it" . . . the Hollywood Stars and Los Angeles Angels, at Beautiful Wrigley Field.

This spirited cross-town rivalry has developed into a bitter struggle for "Southland supremacy." No holds are barred, and no one can anticipate the various controversies that will be spawned during the 7 games of this series. If, as Bill Sweeney says, "Marquis of Queensbury rules," are to be followed, the Marquis had better be present as the enforcing officer.

Last year this rivalry produced the best baseball fight I've ever witnessed. So intense was the battle that a national magazine ran a "spread" of the highlights, and one set of pictures captured national honors. This was the pictorial "play-by-play" account of Angel catcher Al Evans winding up to deliver his pay-off punch, only to discover he was pitching to an umpire, Joe Iachavetti. Al will be around, again, as will the principals of that baseball brannigan, Angel pitcher Joe Hatten and Stars' outfielder Frankie Kellerher.

In an earlier series, which Channel 9 TV'ed from Wrigley Field, one of our loyal Angel fans became so incensed at umpire Ed Runge that he vaulted over the box seats and "decked" big Ed for a 6 count. This, too, must be considered by even the most understanding fan, as a trifle out of the ordinary.

But, that's the way fans feel about the series. Each one is behind his favorite club on every pitch during

this "civil war" series. If the man next door is a Hollywood fan and you're an Angel rooter, he had just better not even hint that he wants to borrow the lawnmower during this week. Actually, under these circumstances he probably wouldn't want the thing, even if you, an Angel fan, were willing to push it.

The "heat" generated by this "set" will not only establish this week as, perhaps, baseball's best locally so far this season, but should certainly "warm" the financial hearts of Messrs. Stewart and Cobb, as club presidents.

You may think we are isolated from the caustic comments hurled back and forth between the two factions, in our TV booth upstairs. Don't kid yourself!!! The Hollywood Boosters Club will send its strongest lungs in the radio and TV area to assail Kelley and Brundige any time the Stars make a good play. And, if the apparently accepted custom is followed this week the howling wolves from across town will assert themselves verbally from the first pitch until the final out.

They won't hurl invectives, for they're baseball fans . . . just having a good time. But, it appears they derive as much pleasure from chiding Ole Kel and Young Bill as they do from watching the Stars win (which I don't think they will.) And, even Lyle Bond, who has the toughest job at KHJ-TV, remaining non-partisan while covering both teams, will come in for an unwarranted share of critical conversation. When the Angels lead, the Stars' fans will accuse Lyle of being an Angel rooter. If the Stars get ahead, Los Angeles fans will tab him a Hollywood adherent. The guy can't win. But, like Kelley and Brundige, Bond loves it because he knows such an attitude reflects a healthy situation in baseball, with each fan so enthused he overlooks no opportunity to be heard in praise of his favorites.

I'm looking forward to the series between the Angels and Stars, at Wrigley Field. And, I'm prepared for any eventuality. I'm taking with me that helmet the Army gave me in 1943. Evans is lending me a mask. Hamp Pool is donating his old shoulder pads. The Broadway is furnishing a beach umbrella, and my insurance agent has covered me with a short term policy.

So, come on out you Hollywood fans. Bill Sweeney has the Angels ready for Bobby Bragan's invasion—Don Stewart has the west's most beautiful ball park preened for a great week—and we are equipped for any onslaught you may have plotted.

Just be there!!!

If you can't catch all the games at Wrigley Field, Lyle and I will consider it a privilege to guest in your living room on Channel 9, as KHJ-TV's outstanding remote crew covers another spirited cross-town battle between Hollywood and Los Angeles.

**E**VER TRY to put in words what you believe in this life? It wasn't until I tried to do it for this story that I realized how little you think of those things that guide a life.

## Full Life

I suppose it's best to start with a definition of a full life. Well, to me, it means to be happy, not to be jealous of anyone, to have a happy home, a good marriage, to be a good parent. Barbara, my wife, and I are really blessed in that we have three healthy children. Materially, many families are more successful than we are but we don't envy them. What we have worked for ourselves and many of the things around and in our home we built ourselves, such as the pool and certain pieces of furniture. We're still using some of the furniture we got before we were married. There's a chair, for instance, we paid three dollars for that is in the living room—just for sentimental reasons if nothing else.

As for our children, we give them lots of love and attention and hope they'll turn out to be good citizens. I hope they have an easier life than I had as a kid. I was born in the slums and had to fight for all I got. This wasn't the fault of my parents, however, but of circumstances.

Both my parents were wonderful people. I practically worshipped my mother. Only once did I lie to her and I have never forgiven myself for it. When I got married the first time I didn't tell her. Later when she asked me if I was married I snapped back to her, "Oh, leave me alone." I reacted like this because I felt guilty but I have never forgotten how I talked to her.

My other beliefs are not too complex. I want to help people all I can. Many have given me assistance on my way up. I believe in being decent and fair to people. What you give usually comes back to you—or so I believe. Barbara and I have a great many friends in the industry and when things were bad for us they helped us. There was one man we knew at a studio whom we always liked and did what we could for. He was the gardener at the time. Three years later he was the producer.

Yet, I have no time for phonies—for people who are nice to others only for what they can get out of them. I simply believe in an honest love for and interest in others. I guess I dislike phonies because I dislike lies.

I am also sentimental in some ways. I don't believe in killing anything—not even hunting and killing animals. On the "Kit Carson" for KABC-TV show we don't kill anybody. We shoot only in self defense—and only wound the villain in the piece. We try in this way to teach youngsters to use their head first, then their fists. A gun is the last resort.

I believe in keeping physically fit. I used to earn my living doing physical things. I was an acrobat and a champion swimmer at one time. Whenever I talk to children I remind them of the importance of being active in sports. That keeps them out of mischief. A youngster who likes sports isn't going to take up hot rods and marijuana.

## Marriage

Lastly, I believe in working for a good marriage. I have a great girl.

Oh, Barbara and I have disagreements but they are never serious. When we get upset, we just walk away and then wait until we're calmed down before we discuss the problem. Barbara has a very hot temper but she never uses it on me.

We completely trust each other—and I can't think of anything more important than that. When I want to go out with some of the guys, for example, she never asks me, "Where are you going?" Or "With whom are you going out?" When I come back she only says, "Have a good time?"

There is also no jealousy in our home. When we got married I was on top. Not long after, Barbara became the successful one. And yet she never made me feel like an outsider. She always had very real respect for my ability—and considered the pride every man has in being head of the household. She is still more interested in my career than in hers.

In a marriage, a woman has about ninety percent of the job because she has more duties to perform. Barbara has helped to give us a good marriage because she has never neglected any of her responsibilities as a wife and mother.

There are many things I would like to do with my life. All I can do, though, is to do the best I know how and hope my batting average is good.

"Of all sad words of tongue or pen

So goes the adage.

But not the thinking of Carlton E. Morse, whose famous "One Man's Family" celebrated twenty-two years on the airwaves this April. There's practically nothing he would change, either about his "One Man's Family" or his own real-life family consisting of Mrs. Morse and daughter Noel.

Deeply absorbed with getting The Family back on TV and with ideas of eventually putting a dozen more radio properties on video, Morse still takes time out to laud the radio cast which has portrayed "The Barbours" for nearly a quarter of a century.

"If I had it to do over again, I'd pick the same people," he stated. "I have the greatest cast in radio . . . seven of them with it for seventeen years and five for twenty-two."

"The Barbours" themselves have changed, however. It has been a matter of keeping in step with life in this increasingly complicated era. When "One Man's Family" first began in San Francisco back in 1932, the country was in a state of depression. World War I had already had harmful effects on family life by separating families and pulling down moral standards. World War II, which according to Morse was to continue these devastating processes, was only in the making. The American family was just beginning to experience degenerative trends.

#### The Pattern

In Author Morse's opinion, "The Barbours" of 1932 reflected countless American families . . . families closely knit, with love and understanding governing all activities, but with parental control predominant. In line with this idea, the original characterization of "Father Barbour" made

# If He Had It To Do Over Again

him a pedantic, mid-Victorian head of his household.

Today it is a mellower "Father Barbour" because most American families are drifting away from the paternalistic regime. The 1954 young people of "One Man's Family" are also somewhat different from the ones of 1932. "Penny" and "Pinky," the modern ones, are more brash than the original "Claudia" and "Clifford." "The modern child is much more knowing and aggressive," Morse observed.

"The family has always been to me the core of the country," he continued. "Our fast, modern living has resulted in people not having time to be parents. I think the breakdown of the family is largely responsible for the current return to religion. Many young people who are unable to receive guidance at home are turning to the church."

Asked why modern living with its many labor-saving devices and short cuts had not given parents MORE time to be good parents, Morse retorted, "It's true, isn't it, that the less one has to do the less he wants to do?"

Morse personally is a firm believer in being emotionally prepared for all experiences. Things seem to happen

for him when he is ready for them. "Every new challenge has developed the unexpected," he explained. Events of his successful career have invariably borne out the philosophy that "something is offered for a purpose" and that "you can make things happen."

TV is one of the "new challenges" which Carlton E. Morse has taken on. Several years ago he did "One Man's Family" for TV. This spring he plunged into the project again. "TV is ten times more fascinating and ten times more demanding than radio," he remarked. "Preparing 'The Family' for TV was like putting together an intricate piece of machinery. Or like solving a jig-saw puzzle. There were engineering problems. Checking with the Board of Education about the children in the cast who must attend school three hours daily between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. There were the child labor laws. There were problems about available studio space. I even had to go to Petrillo to be allowed to kinescope with the pipe organ.

"I guess," Morse facetiously finalized, "that if I had it to do over again I would have been born twenty-two years later. I could use some youthful energy in television."

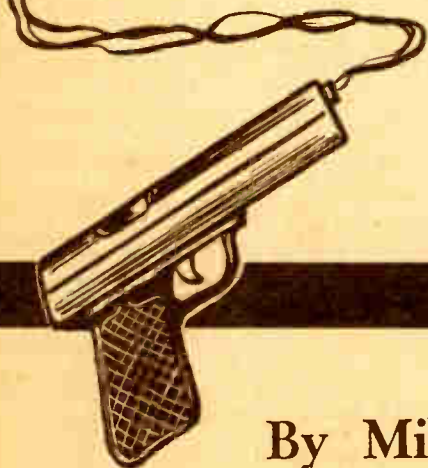

# Murder PAYS OFF

*KABC Tries a New Experiment In Radio Programming*

**K**ABC's TOP BRASS are wearing broader grins of late because of an idea that's paid off handsomely. When Amos Baron, general manager of the station, carefully surveyed daytime radio he was appalled at the unimaginative fare available to listeners and decided to do something about it.

The airtunes were flooded with soap operas, disc jockeys and yak shows. Little wonder that afternoon ratings were so low. Actually it was surprising that these shows were able to maintain any kind of a rating. Mr. Baron searched about for something new and different. He concluded that people who were home wanted something to listen to and it was the station's business to attract them with some worthwhile programs. His probing revealed that, despite their perennial popularity, mystery shows were not logged during the afternoon on any station in the city. His observations resulted in "Murder in the Afternoon."

"Murder" is an hour-long stanza composed of "Philo Vance" and "Boston Blackie" transcriptions which are knit together by live narration. In order to detract from the staleness of old transcriptions and make the program seem fresh and alive, Baron decided to use live introductions, narrations and commercials by an unidentified actor to be known only as Your Host, Orval. To set the mood and maintain the eeriness once it has been created, Orval disguises his voice, stands two inches from the microphone and keeps his voice pitched low. This same sinister de-

livery is effectively used on commercials.

Producer-writer Ken Manson integrates the live and transcribed portions of the program together so perfectly that it is difficult to detect where one begins and the other leaves off.

#### Reaction

The reaction to "Murder in the Afternoon" far exceeded KABC's fondest expectations. Letters poured in from far and near praising the station for its progressive program. Here are a few excerpts from some of the letters: "Murder in the Afternoon" is refreshing radio fare. It's a boon to housewives. . . . We like com-

plete stories for daytime listening.

. . . Thank you for something new. I'm tired of listening to Arthur Godfrey's aches and pains. . . . 'Murder' is the biggest thing that happened to radio since TV reared its ugly head and orchids to 'Murder in the Afternoon' for complete afternoon dramas." Enough said?

Because "Murder" had a great deal of advance publicity KABC's rating (American Research Bureau) jumped from fifth to second place in the 2:00 p.m. time slot on the very first day the program was aired.

Amos Baron can truthfully say "Murder" (in the Afternoon) pays off on KABC.



# TV's Most Famous Nobody!

**T**HIS IS a sad story about poor Jimmy Brown. It's not too sad, though, because Jimmy is a comic on Pinky Lee's NBC-TV show. And although everyone else feels sorry for "poor" Jimmy, the veteran actor is feeling pretty chipper about the whole world these days.

The reason why people feel sorry for poor Jimmy is very simple. Five days a week, ever since January 4, the Georgia-born comic has been featured on Pinky's coast-to-coast show. The forty-year-old artist plays more roles than anyone else on TV today.

#### Roles Enumerated

Just a few of his parts include "Throckmorton T. Throckmorton," a broken-down ham actor; "Dr. Runkel Dunkel," a zany inventor; "Pizza Pete," a fantastic chef; "Lord Balderdash," a very unusual English gentleman; "Mr. Grump"; "The Friendly Irish Cop"; "Pedro the Badman"; "Mr. Gloom"; and many others. All told, Jimmy (at last count) portrays over twenty-two different characters.

On one half-hour show alone he has been known to do twelve separate and distinct characters. (Eight of them involved costume changes;

the other four were voices off-camera.)

#### Everyone But Him

Despite all these roles, Jimmy seldom plays the one he could do the very best—himself. Even Jimmy's most loyal fans probably wouldn't recognize him if he came on stage and said, "Look, kids, I'm Jimmy Brown."

That's why his friends feel sorry for "poor" Jimmy. That's why they are beginning to call him "TV's Most Famous Nobody."

On the serious side, Jimmy doesn't mind this anonymity. He's been around show business too long to get any complexes about it.

He started in show business as a boy singing at the age of seven at the Metropolitan Opera House. For fifteen years he traveled all over the world in vaudeville and night club acts.

After World War II he appeared in several dramatic Broadway plays and on several TV productions.

He first worked with Pinky Lee in Hollywood in 1950 on a local TV show. Four years later, when Pinky needed another assistant for his coast-to-coast program, he called

Jimmy in New York and asked him to do it. James came, and has been at the same routine ever since.

Jimmy Brown is really one of the remarkable people in the show business world. Watch him some afternoon on Pinky's program. He plays all the male roles that Pinky doesn't play.

You may not remember Jimmy Brown's face—but you will remember the dozens of faces that Jimmy Brown puts on.
