ITHOUT the small stations in the smaller communities there would be no networks,"Frank Danzig said as he sat in his office overlooking Hollywood Boulevard, "it's the small stations who perform the service on the local level that makes the whole thing tick."

Mr. Danzig was referring to the major national networks but quickly turned his statement into a description of his own organization, the Imperial Broadcasting System. "We formed the network in January of 1957," he explained, "at a time when people were saying that there was no life left in

radio. My partner — Bart Ross — and I believed overwise. We bought four stations — in Riverside, Indio, Blythe and Brawley — and proceeded to revamp them from programming to personnel. Although we're still a long way from being finished, we believe that small city radio stations like small city newspapers are going to be here for a long time."

Although the Danzig-Ross radio organization is officially known as a network, it is not in the strictest sense of the word. All programs, except those picked up from ABC, originate from the individual stations — no one station "feeds" programs to any other station. The four stations are grouped into a network, Mr. Danzig explained, more for sales than programming purposes.

"As a group," General Sales Manager Bart Ross inserted, "the stations cover three valleys—the Imperial, Coachella and Palo Verde—and three counties, San Bernardino, Riverside and Imperial. For a national advertiser, that means that on a four station spot campaign his message is reaching one million people who spend one billion dollars a year."

"You're right, Bart," Frank replied, "but I think that any success the stations have or will accomplish can be traced directly to the service they perform in their communities. At the risk of being corny, we like to think of them as being 'service stations' that fulfill a real need not only in presenting entertainment but in becoming an integral part of the community's daily life. And by that I mean an active member - if it's good for the community we're for it, whether it's seeing to it that a vacant lot is turned into a sandlot baseball diamond or helping the school board get out the vote to approve a bond issue. If it should be done, it is done.",

The Real Mc Coys

The ABC-TV series, starring Walter Brennan, may start a whole new trend for next year. Read this behind-the-scenes story of how this surprise show of 1957 was created and produced.

WO PRODUCERS, Pineus and Pincus, started the idea. But it took three other men -Brennan, Thomas, and Weisbord - to have that idea see the light of TV

Only two of the names are familiar to TV fans. Brennan and Thomas. They're Walter Brennan and Danny Thomasfor years two of Hollywood's most respected and admired actors. The other names are Norm and Irving Pincus (they're brothers) and Sam Weisbord.

The show which these men are responsible for is The Real McCoys-the ABC-TV series which has been aptly called "the TV sleeper of the current season."

As with all new programs, The Real McCoys took a few weeks to build up an audience. There was little outside promotion. The show had to stand on its own. And it did. At the time of writing, The Real McCoys has consistently pulled a larger percentage of the audience than either Dragnet or Climaxthe two other network shows which are on at the same time.

Dragnet and Climax, of course, have been two of TV's top favorites for several seasons now. But then, seemingly from out of nowhere, The Real McCoys comes along and keeps up with and even beats two of TV's perennial favorites. Why? How did it all happen.

In the Beginning The story begins several years ago with Irving Pincus. It was Irving, the "thinker" in the Pincus operation, who originally created the idea for The Real McCovs.

"Even then I only had one man in mind," Irving recalls while sitting at lunch at the Brown Derby. "And that man was Walter Brennan. I told Walter about the series and although he liked it, he wasn't quite ready to do the part. NBC bought the first rights to the series. After one year my option was up to them—and since they didn't take any action-I offered the package to ABC-TV.

"Maybe it was fate, I don't know, or else I caught him in the right week, Irving continues, "but at that same time Walter said he was finally ready to try a TV series. As I said, the role was originally created for him. But why Walter Brennan? Why not someone

Because to me Walter Brennan is not only a great actor. He has that unique ability to turn the emotions on and off, like a faucet. One second he can have you on the verge of tears. And the next second, you're laughing at some remark or gesture he makes. A treacle cutter we

"The Real McCoys," creator Irving Pincus points out, was based to some extent on the kind of people John Steinbeck writes about in his books. Partic-

ularly the Grapes of Wrath.

"Farm people. Simple people. People who are better adjusted because they never expect too much. Material things are important, but not all-important. The big thrill comes to them in gradually acquiring the material things. Economically, if we had to classify them, I suppose they would be in the very low income bracket of the middle classes.

Originally I was going to have the family live in Arizona. But then I found the only problem with this situation, comedy and dramatic-wise, was that they didn't meet enough different people. As farmers they would only meet farmers. In order to give them the same occupation-but to have them come in contact with all kinds of people and situations-where better could I locate them than in the San Fernando Valley of California? That's why we use that particular location.

When it comes to not only speaking but actually going on "location," that's when brother Norm literally enters the picture. For Norm is the man who is primarily concerned with the physical production of the Channel 7 program.

"We do use an awful lot of exterior shots," Norm explains, seated next to his brother. "More than any other comedy show on the air, I believe. Although we are officially under Desliu's production schedule, unlike most of their shows, we do not use the three-camera technique. We think the old method of rehearsing each scene and moving in for good closeups is much more effective

Enter Mr. Thomas

At this time Danny Thomas entered the Brown Derby and quite by accident took a seat directly opposite the Pincus brothers but on the other side of the room. Danny Thomas also has his show filmed at Desilu.

Previous to the time Danny sat down. Irving Pincus was elaborating on actors such as Walter Brennan who are expert "treacle cutters"—which we mentioned earlier. At that time we ourselves pointed out that there was one other comedian with a TV series who had that same ability. And that was Danny Thomas.

"Yes, I think you're right," Irving remarked then, almost non-committal.

Back to Norm Pincus, again, we were discussing some of the business aspects of The Real McCoys. We asked who actually controlled the McCovs package. The Pincus brothers replied there were four men involved. Themselves, of course. Mr. Brennan. And another per-

"Can you tell us who the other person is?" we asked.
"Well if you must know," Irving remarked rather hesitantly, "it's that gentleman sitting right over there. The man we were just talking about.

"You mean Danny Thomas?"
"One and the same," Norm remarked. "It was Danny who put up the money for our pilot film. Without him we couldn't have made it."

So that is a story for you! Here's Danny Thomas putting his money into a show now on a rival network (Danny's on CBS-TV now). And it a family situation comedy series similar to his!

'As long as you're finding out the story of who actually made our series successful," Irving continued, "I wish you would mention Sam Weisbord of the William Morris Agency. We created and produced The Real McCoys, but it was Sam who sold it. And I don't care how good a product is, if you can't sell it, it's not worth anything.

The Beginning of the End


So that's the really remarkable story of Pincus and Pincus, and Brennan, Thomas and Weisbord, and how they were responsible for getting The Real McCovs on the air.

Many people have been surprised that The Real McCovs has become so successful. But quite seriously the Pincus brothers have never had any doubts.

"We were only worried when we couldn't get Walter Brennan," they explain. "After we signed him, we knew we had a success. Not because Walter is great box-office like a Gable or Sinatra, but because we knew he was the best actor for the role of Grandpa in our series.

The final effect of The Real McCoys has only began to be felt. Just as the TV Westerns did this year, the Pincus brothers believe that the basic idea behind their series will create an entirely new vogue for next season on TV.

No matter how many follow the idea of this series, however, TV viewers will long remember that there is only one Real McCoy.


"I also like fishing," Gail continued.

IFELINER AGREES WITH ALL THOSE viewers who think Judge Younger's bowing off KABC's Traffic Court is a ctying shame and the decision of his confreres bringing it about a very stuffy and questionable one. Here is a public service program which has had sufficient attention-compelling content and viewer self-identification to spiral it to high popularity. In a city where traffic casualities and property damage reach frightening proportions it would seem we should chuck the formalities, forget personalities, and pull together to put across a message of traffic safety by means of today's potent medium, television. I take it everyone is sufficiently hep to know that prime time like 7 p.m. Friday costs money, so a sponsor should be welcomed. In Traffic Court's instance, the bankroller, Chevrolet, seems to me to have maintained a pretty dignified commercial attitude which in no way has either detracted from the public service aspect of the program or made Judge Younger less a solon. So it's beyond me to see why it was thought unseemly for the Judge to fill his TV role. This is one case where the good that the program is doing should far outweigh any other considerations.

THIS ISN'T TO IMPLY THAT Traffic Court is calling a recess. Far from it. Right now, since Judge Younger's last program is March 7, search is progressing for a retired judge or qualified person considered suitably detached from active court life. Let's hope they pick someone with the verve and TV naturalness which Mr. Younger has displayed. Meanwhile, this upset has caused some hectic moments at another station, Channel 11, getting set for its new (Feb. 26) program, Divorce Court, over which a real-life judge has been sched-

uled to preside. As it now stands, this judge will appear anonymously on the new series! Though anything might happen between now and air time. Making the Divorce Court judge's situation interesting is the fact that KTTV's owner, the Los Angeles Times, came out with an editorial supporting the decision that Judge Younger should not appear on Traffic Court. Really no connection, but a real twist.

JACK WEBB HAS ONLY A COUPLE dozen more Dragnets to film and there'll be enough of them "canned" to last through June 1959. Soon as he's through, Jack will start on his next Warner Bros. movie (he has three more to go) in which he'll star. He's looking for a comedy. Bob Crosby is now definitely out as star of Webb's Pete Kelly's Blues TV series, for which twelve scripts are now completed and on which production will have to roll before Bob shakes loose from his CBS pact. As soon as he's through filming Dragnets, Ben Alexander begins his lecture tour of three months. "Always submit three subjects on which to talk," Ben explains, "and whichever one they pick I make the same speech!"

JACK STILL INSISTS HE'S TIRED of playing Friday, but "if public acceptance and the ratings warrant it, the show and/or I will go on." He points to seven years' run as a marathon and says what he yens is to sit at his desk and read the mail. Can't blame him.

IN THIS OFF-AGAIN-ON-AGAIN TV race the deal now seems to swing to resurrecting some series. Rumor is that Panic may grip us again, Noah's Ark may float anew and The Brothers be given a reprieve . . . Dotto, the Channel 2 afternoon program replacing Strike It Rich, is rather different, but the questions are far too simple . . . Jack Narz, who did some of our

▶ HIS has been a week of decisions—most of them stupid. It started off with the inane business of dropping Judge Younger off of Traffic Court. And whoever said that actors were the ones most afflicted with petty, professional jealousy? Make room for the judges! Then came the business of dropping Annie Get Your Gun from Emmy consideration because of the statement that it was not produced for TV. This is really stretching a point. The decision to do Annie on stage was made only after the decision to do it on TV. Sure the stage was used to break in the show - and prepare it for TV. But in many ways, Annie Get Your Gun offered more problems in its transference to television than many shows done entirely for the medium. It was one of NBC's biggest tasks of the year. In addition, Annie is still considered by most as the top TV attraction of the year, so isn't this of any importance? This whole business seems mighty strange. I wonder if this same decision would have been made if the show had emanated from New York instead? Want to make a bet that nothing would have been said then? Too bad because certainly this is one show that deserved some awards. At least Mary Martin and Richard Halliday have the personal satisfaction of knowing that they were responsible for the best TV show of the year.

Frank Ross and Joan Caulfield threw a deelightful party to present the new Sally format—and to introduce Gale Gordon and Arte Johnson who are regulars on the new look, along with Johnny Desmond, who was in the east. Whether or not Sally can get another lease on life with this change is questionable since, at this writing, it is due to bow off in a few weeks. It was at least a smart thing for Mr. Ross to

toss this party. It had an encouraging, confident air about it—for it is certainly unusual to give any kind of affair for a show that is supposed to be canceled. Joan Caulfield really impressed by being one star who acted as hostess at the party and met everyone. Most of such deals find the hostess or host hiding away behind some table.

Low Irwin is becoming more and more of the crusader on KPOL — which is all to the good. He is starting on February 24 a new campaign for safety measures on the freeways, primarily a crusade to give more protection on these dividers. This is really a worthwhile cause. Give him a listen. He can help save many lives if he puts across this one.

Eydie Gorme, a Steve Allen graduate, although suffering from a miserable cold, proved that her years on TV were of real value when she opened at the Cocoant Grove. Martin Obzina, a set decorator, at Revue, is the man responsible for the very interesting decor at the famous Queen's Arms restaurant in Encino, Not that he could get too much TV into a medieval setting, but he has added some highly unusual touches. For instance, in one room the chandeliers are made out of film cans—and they look medieval. It boasts the only twin fireplaces—and altogether it has five fireplaces, one even in the lady's room. As for the excellent food, Jean Hagen, the ex-Mrs. Danny of

Pick OF THE DIX

A CCORDING to recent statistics, over fifty per cent of those who weekly patronize the movies are teen agers, and over twenty-five per cent of the nation's TV viewing time is occupied by movies. Just what does this mean? How should I know? Of course, it could mean that when Hollywood sells its post-1948 product to television, the rest of us will be spending twenty-five per cent of our time watching pictures produced expressly for teen agers. No wonder adults weakly patronize the movies.

"My Darling Clementine." (2) Feb. 22, 10:00. 1946. This John Ford production anticipated by several years the current phase of western addiction by including in one package all the Earp brothers, all the Clanton boys, Doc Holliday and the gunfight at the OK Corral. And it's all pretty good, too. Henry Fondo, as Wyatt Earp (he uses a set expression for it, too) suspects Holliday, Victor Mature, of killing two of the Earp boys, but in the end, the two join forces and wipe out those really responsible. In between, there is some folderol with Linda Darnell and Kathy Downs, several very good scenes involving drinking and fighting in the Old West, and even an operation in a saloon. An interesting picture whose atmosphere has an aura of authenticity.

"The Mortal Storm." (11) Feb. 28, 8:00. 1940. Adapted from the novel by Phyllis Bottome, this film offers an appraisal of the beginnings of Nazism in Germany, its attraction for certain of the young people, and its effect on dignity, tradition and honor. Professor Frank Morgan is a distinguished scholar whose belief that the aryan is not necessarily the superior being involves him and his family in a struggle that leads inevitably to violence and flight. The fine cast includes Margaret Sullavan, as his daughter, Robert Young, as a fledging Nazi who rises to the top, and James Stewart, as a fighter against the new order. The picture might seem a bit old hat, now, but its warnings about fascism will never be dated.

"Cornered." (9) Beginning Feb. 24, 9:00. 1945. Ex-Air Force pilot Dick Powell goes to South America in an effort to find the man responsible for his wife's death during the German occupation of France. In spite of warnings, beatings and information that his quarry is already dead, the foolhardy Powell finally brings the culprit to heel. The film is slightly ludicrous in some of its heroics, but it is entertaining, and Wulter Slezuk, as a sleazy guide and con man, gives a first rate comically villainous performance.

"Something To Shout About." (5) Feb. 23, 7:30. 1942. It isn't, but anyway...Cobina Wright, Jr. finances William Gaxton's show so she can play the lead, but the show dies, so press agent Don Ameche discovers Janet Blair, a small town girl who turns the flop into a smash.

"Three Wise Fools." (11) Feb. 23, 9:00. 1946. Lionel Barrymore, Lewis Stone and another wise fool adopt Margaret O'Brien so they can do her out of some land they plan to donate to a university, but she makes them ashamed of themselves and they lead better lives. Miss O'Brien is now a much larger girl and is attempting to make amends for her childhood transgressions.

"Sterling Metal." (11) Feb. 28, 10:55. Usually, Iron down these movies, but brass yourselves, I zinc this will appeal not only to tin agers, but also to those with a few bronze in their heads... An aluminating story of a young lead who steels a copper's plate to teeth him, but the cop shoots him in the ear where the nickel show. With Phil Silvers and Myrna Alloy.



While delectable and delightful are not appropriate for Sterling, I, as a male, have no doubt that the female of the species has equally suitable terms for the personable Sterling, who most men would term a "swell guy" even though this opinion at times might be corroded with a bit of male jealously that Sterling has at least the opportunity to become involved in so many situations with Miss Jeffreys.

Sterling and Jeffreys are the insurance for any series that many a harrassed producer of television fodder dreams of. Rather amusing proof of this came my way when witnessing one of the series with a person to whom the coming and going of television shows, names of actors, and other information vital to the average television fan, is more or less immaterial.

Not until the end of the show did I realize she was unaware that the couple were appearing in a new series. Title, characters, situations meant nothing — but the show did have those two people, whose names, I'm sure, she had not the faintest idea of. Greater loyal tribute no actor can have.







For a reason which I have not yet been able to uncover, I am one of the few Americans extant who missed Shirley Temple in her heyday as a child star. Thus, the fact that I had never become a Temple fan can only be credited to my own ommission. The fact that Miss Temple had made so little a dent in my life plus her connection with a series of fairy tales left me rather cold when the Shirley Temple Storybook was announced. I had heard before the siren trumpetings of publicity, and to my regret had seen classic shambles made of classics.

However, make no mistake about it, the fairy tale series of Miss Temple's scores a notable hit in television fare. There are several fundamental elements that have gone into this achievement.

First of all, it is significant that in an era whose dramatic entertainment rather consistently follows a pattern of hard-hitting action and violence to find time given to poetic fantasy. No little credit must be given the creative mind, or minds, who have so boldly challenged the status quo of programming, and have refused to gimmick up the simplicity and charm of these old tales. One is singularly impressed by the fact there is no truckling to what is commonly supposed to represent the mass mind.

The simplicity and honesty of approach is borne out in the writing, directing, and acting departments. Nothing can be as sticky as trying to put over the miraculous fantasy of a fairy tale to an audience saturated as today's are by dreary realism, for in weaving the delicate threads of such a tale, one false note, one false move, reduces the total to nonsense. No greater tribute can be paid the creative talents responsible for this venture than to witness a group of adults following the old stories of childhood on the television screen with the same engrossment as when first heard as a child from the lips of a parent.

A special nod must be given the creators of the sets and costume who in dressing stages and actors adroitly avoided the blatantly glittering splendor of much of television's art work that intrudes itself on the viewer with the delicacy of a riveting machine. Here is art work, rich and satisfying, keying in as an integral part of the whole.

In viewing the first two presentations of this series, one cannot help but reflect that the greatest stories are the simplest, stories that are a part of the common heritage of all men as they pass from generation to generation.

The fact that this series also breaks hallowed tradition in appearing monthly instead of at the weekly interval, suggests that something might be in the wind in recognizing that there is a greater payoff in offering quality shows at less frequent intervals than filling a weekly time slot with junk.

If you want to recapture that old magic you knew once upon a time when you possessed that infinite capacity for belief of childhood, don't miss this.





William Dozier is now producer of the program—and this alone is significant. Recently, he was in charge of production at RKO-Radio but when that studio decided to take an extended "vacation," CBS' Al Scalpone, vicepresident of network programs of CBS-TV Hollywood, offered Bill the reins on Studio One. That he would take this spot certainly proved he had faith in the CBS show.

Reasons For Move

"Studio One had been thinking of the move for some time – about six months, to be exact," Al Scalpone remarked. "Suspicion on NBC-TV with its strong easting began hacking away at Studio One's ratings, so it was felt that more stars would be available for the productions if the entire set-up were moved west.

"So far this has proved to be true. For the first couple of shows we had Cameron Mitchell, Joanne Dru, Tom Drake, Richard Carlson, Sir Cedric Hardwicke, Phyllis Thaxter, Glenda Farrell, and Marilyn Erskine, not a bad

We plan no changes in the general format of Studio One. We simply hope to take advantage of the broader benefits of production here. We are going in for depth easting, several important actors in one show. And we are also continuing our search for the kinds of stories that have made Studio One such a fine TV offering."

This isn't Bill Dozier's first TV venture since he had been with CBS for four One of New York's ace dramatic shows

kicked up its traces and headed to California.

The reasons are interesting and provocative.

and a half years prior to his RKO stint. He has always had as much interest in television as he has had in movies.

Since Dozier has done so much on film it is in a way surprising that he is now involved in a straight live show, although most of his TV work has been on non-film efforts. Studio One will continue to be done live.

"I see no reason to go to film," Dozier said flaly. "This isn't the kind of production that needs film. Also, it would be about sixty-five percent more expen-

sive to do, so why change?
"Bringing Studio One here was not without its problems and headaches. There were those in New York who believed-and still do believe-that New York is a more stimulating climate for television. This has, however, been pretty well disproved by shows like Climax and Playhouse 90. Real pros, after all, can work anywhere.
"Another argument advanced against

the move was that it would be less expensive to do Studio One in New York. It is true production costs are less, but even though the shows cost more here we hope to make them worth more.'

Dozier is approaching his task with very real enthusiasm and an awareness of his own problems, He is especially enthusiastic about live TV-and has sound reasons for such a feeling.

"Performers usually give better per-formances on live TV since they're not wrung dry by repeated takes, as they are in pictures," he went on. "You have to be more resourceful in this medium too, since there isn't as much money to spend. Too, doing a live show once a week is a great challenge. A one-hour production is, after all, equal to twothirds of a movie. And there is another advantage to live TV over movies-you get the public reaction faster. The jury comes in sooner. A few days after a TV show is done you get the verdict. You may wait months to get the results on a picture.

Movies In Trouble

"Movies, as everyone knows, are going through quite a transition now. There are those who say they're through. I don't entirely agree, al-



though the motion picture industry has made some bad mistakes.

"Movies have tried to too great an extent to give the kind of entertainment that could be done as well or better on TV, so people would rather stay home to see something twenty per cent less good. By the time they hire a baby sitter, pay for parking, pay the high admission cost in a theatre they've had an expensive evening. The movies then must make productions that are so good people will want to go out to see them. The industry simply hasn't re-tooled itself. Bigness, huge spectacles – these are not enough. The pictures have to be good too. Motion pictures have tried to compete with TV and have made mistakes in so doing. Let's hope TV doesn't make the same mistake by trying to compete with movies.

"TV is now a habit entertainment the way movies used to be. The old question of 'What are we going to do tonight?' used to mean what movie are we going to see?' Now TV has taken over-and the question is usually answered with, 'Let's watch TV.' Movies must change that attitude to continue

Many wonder, as does Bill Dozier, if the movies will really wake up now -or if they will completely throw in the towel to TV.

Cornell as the lead in the play, "Bill of Divorcement" and played the leading roles in countless other David Belasco

theatrical productions.

Then, she moved to Hollywood and switched to movies and motherhood. She and husband, Leon 'd Usseau brought four sons into the world. She's proud of them and has every right to be. Oddly enough, each son pursued a different and yet highly creative type of career: Leon Jr. is an artist; Andre an architect, Arnaud a writer and Loring 'd Usseau is a TV director for station KTLA.

Horror Hostess

Recently, KTLA bought a block of horror films. The problem now was how to present the shows a little differently. Producer Ray Lukshis therefore created the idea of having a sweet, old ladyslightly screwy but completely lovable -act as the hostess.

"How about my mother?" director Loring asked. "She's an actress, you know, and would be perfect for the part.



Loring wasn't kidding, however, and he went so far as to set up an interview

between the producer and his mother.
"That was it," Ottola picks up the story. "After we lunched, Mr. Lukshis said I had the role. You have no idea

of how much I love doing this part."
Ordinarily when a TV performer
makes a remark about how much she "loves" her work, she's either lying or hiding something. But this little ole lady isn't fooling.

"It's gotten to the point now," Ottola explains "where I find myself doing many of the same things my TV personality does. She's really not all there, you know-but everyone genuinely likes

Proof of this popularity is reflected in the various fan clubs which have started around town for Ottola Nesmith.

Horror Offers Security

"What pleases me the most is that many teen-agers follow the program. One night a group of them from Occidental College came down to the show. They were very intelligent, I thought, and exceptionally well-behaved. And they thoroughly enjoy the horror pictures. They don't really take them seriously, of course. But I do think it puts them at ease and gives them a sense of security.

On her show, Ottola appears before the camera and pointing to the door with her name clearly written on it, tells her "night people" that "I'm not really Ottola Nesmith at all. I'm -Then she'll fill in the name of one of

the stars she's featuring on the horror movie that night.

Before and after the show, and between commercials, of course, Ottola manages to add some interest to what are usually pretty tenth-rate pictures.

Ottola the night-girl never goes out during the day. "I don't trust those day people," she whispers. "I only go out after dark and I always use the back door.

"After midnight all the stores are closed. And I do have some shopping that I must do. It's really quite convenient at those hours. The stores are never crowded with all those day peo-

That's how Tola talks to her audience. On the serious side, the only regret she has, business-wise, is that "the old theater has lost its glamour. Why, I can remember the days when they flooded the footlights with flowers on opening night.

And that was why-on her opening night at KTLA-Ottola Nesmith could have hugged her son, Loring, and producer Ray Lukshis for ever and everwhen they advanced toward her loaded

with an armful of flowers.

Hank Weaver's nightly off-beat, on-beat, far-out and down to earth show on KABC-TV really lives up to its name:

From Main Street to Malibu

ANK WEAVER is a quiet, pipe-smoking guy who knows what's going to happen next but does not show it. "The element of surprise," he said, "is what I believe keeps the show interesting—and confidentially," he continued, "sometimes I really don't know what is supposed to be a port." posed to happen next.'

Sportscaster Weaver (he was ranked among the top four best fight telecasters in the nation by Ring magazine) presides over his five nights a week hodgepodge of entertainment with pipe puffing geniality; interviews well known personalities and what KABC-TV publicists call 'little people with big stories to tell'; presents variety acts; the music of regulars Bobby Mammack and his quartet, and then, reverting to type, also tosses in a bit of sports news and com-

This mixture, from all indications, sits pretty well with L.A. viewers. With the well-known Weaver brand of honesty, Hank stated that he doesn't think the show has or will garner the entire night time L.A. audience but, he said, "we feel that if we can appeal to one out of five and get them to watch the show one night a week, we're reaching a lot of people.'

Hank's KABC-TV show, sub-titled "From Main Street to Malibu," is an outgrowth of his KABC Radio show of the same name. To back up the subtitle, the 115-minute potpourri travels freely through the landmarks and back streets of L.A. bringing to light interest-ing and often times little known facets of Weaver's adopted home town.

Off Beat Subjects Since the debut (Monday, Nov. 11,

1957) Hank has presented, narrated or presided over visits to the L.A. County Jail System; interviews and demonstra-

tions of burlesque flourishing in Los Angeles; explorations of Chinese, Spanish and Italian colonies; discussions of marriage by the president of the Marriage Anonymous club, an organization of male divorcees; legal argumentation surrounding "art" films labeled as "obscene"; a look at models in swim fashions for 1958; an investigation of missing people and how they are found; explanations of the sports by out-rigger and wild boar hunting enthusiasts; the story of the "Woman in Black" who visits Rudolph Valentino's grave every

year; a look at gambling in L.A. and other off-beat, on-beat, far-out and down to earth subjects.

"We're not running a musical-variety show," Hank commented, "we try to present what interests us in the hope that it will interest the viewers. When I say we," he clarified, "I mean my producers Pete Robinson, Bruce Lansbury and Bud Widom. A hard working bunch, believe me. Ideas for 'what will happen next' come out at meetings and we kick them around. What's left after we get through that distillation process is what gets on the show. Rehearsal? We only have one hard and fast rule: all the acts get a chance to rehearse with the musicians. If we can't do it right we'd rather not do it at all."

He 'Does it Right'
Hank's "do it right" philosophy has

earned him many testimonials over the years since he arrived in L.A. in 1932 to cover the Olympic Cames. Born and reared in Pittsburgh, Pa., Hank began his career as a stringer for several Eastern news papers. In California he served as a correspondent for the Pittsburgh Press, Newark Evening News and Kansas City Star. He joined the ABC Radio news staff in 1941, leaving the rewrite desk of the L.A. City News to do so. Hank's news gathering and reporting ability can be typified by listing two of his "firsts." He filed the first story (for United Press) on the dramatic flag-raising ceremony on Mount Suri-bachi in Iwo Jima and he broadcast the first interview with General Douglas MacArthur after he had been relieved of his Far Eastern Command by President Truman during the Korean

On the local level, Hank received the Southern California Radio-TV News Club's 1953 award as the best newscaster of the year and has been commended several times by the L.A. County Board of Supervisors for promoting civic betterment.

Although his late night stint keeps him busy, Hank still keeps his hand in the sports and news side with a nightly news and sports show on KABC-TV and a daily news show on KABC Radio.
