

The Pickens Sisters

"HOME SWEET HOME" is a favorite song around the Pickens' fireside. It typifies, more than any other melody, the atmosphere in which Jane, Patti and Helen, the charming Pickens Sisters, live.

The Pickens Sisters are products of the old South and are proud of it. They were born on a plantation in the cotton country, near Macon, Ga.

It was around the plantation home that Helen, Jane and Patti first learned to harmonize—to imitate instruments. It was during informal songfests around the big fireplace in the Pickens' living room that they developed their unusual style of harmony.

Back of the broadcasting screen, shunning the bright light which has made these three Georgia girls loved by thousands, is a quiet woman who has had more to do with their success than any other person. She is Mrs. Patti Pickens, their mother.

Mrs. Pickens is a typical Southern lady of the old school. Tall like her daughters, and pleasant, her duties are, and always will be, to make home what it should be for her family.

Under the tutelage of their parents, Jane, Helen and Patti early learned the rudiments of music. And from their devoted Negro servant, they learned the old songs of the Negro race.

As they grew into young womanhood, plans were made for their education. Their fame already had spread over Georgia. Jane, who seemed most determined upon a musical career, enrolled in the Curtis Institute of Music. Helen attended the Atlanta Conservatory of Music. Jane's progress was so rapid that her teachers insisted she study in Paris. Helen, who thought she would like to study dress designing, accompanied her sister abroad.

Upon their return to the United States, Patti, who during their absence had grown into an attractive, soft-spoken young woman, joined her sisters in New York and the Pickens Sisters started broadcasting over NBC Networks.

Still Home-Loving

Despite their several appearances over NBC Networks each week, and frequent

vaudeville engagements which often take them away from the city, the Pickens Sisters still are essentially the same home-loving girls that folks around Macon and Atlanta used to call the "singin' Pickens family."

That again brings Mrs. Patti Pickens into the story. Home, whether it be their Park Avenue apartment, or the rambling plantation house near Macon, is the place for a mother with three busy daughters is the limit of Mrs. Pickens' way of thinking.

Being a companion and helper to her daughters is the limit of Mrs. Pickens participation in their careers. She has seen them broadcast only twice, and then only after much urging.

"I dislike theatrical mothers," she said. "I want to be near my children (she still thinks of them as her 'babies') but I think that providing them with a comfortable home and being more of a 'pal' to them is better."

Rehearse at Home

Anyone who knows Patti, Helen and Jane, and visits their home-like living

room with old, well-worn books crowding the shelves which line one complete wall, senses that Mrs. Pickens is succeeding in her life's ambition.

The Pickens Sisters do much of their rehearsing for their NBC programs at home. Certain hours of the day are set aside for their work and the maid (imported from Atlanta because they insist on Southern cooking) guards the door, to prevent intrusion.

Jane, an apt musician, makes all of the arrangements for their programs. Many of the Negro ballads and spirituals which they sing have no written music. These Jane also prepares.

Meantime Patti, who had just finished high school when she joined her sisters, is tutored several hours each day. She also studies music and dancing, and between times, much to the consternation of Helen and Jane, collects unusual breeds of goldfish.

Helen Designs Clothes

Helen designs clothes as a hobby, and is an expert with a needle. She also enjoys cooking and manages frequently to compound original salads.

Helen was the first to learn to drive a car, and at the age of 10, was taking her sisters to school each day.

Patti, the "baby" of the trio, often

grew discontented because games which Helen and Jane played, were too "grown-up," so she invented "Marie," an imaginary playmate who for years was her constant "companion."

Mrs. Pickens laughs when she recalls how Jane taught her schoolmates to play the ukulele, and charged them enough in dimes and quarters to buy a dog.

Helen accumulated \$4.50 in small amounts as her first earnings, and invested the entire amount at a ten cent store in Christmas presents. She was eight years old.

Patti started making puns almost as soon as she started singing, which was at a very tender age. Her family still doesn't know where she learned the trick.

Mrs. Pickens could never tell which of her daughters was hurt when one of those inevitable accidents of childhood occurred. "They would all jump up and down and scream and I would have to examine each one," she said.

Unlike traditional Southerners, none of the Pickens Sisters will acknowledge they are superstitious. Perhaps it was because their pockets were never large enough to hold a rabbit's foot.



WALTER DAMROSCH, celebrated musical authority and dean of American conductors, who inaugurated the NBC Music Appreciation Hour four years ago, is again directing the weekly broadcasts that are being heard over the combined NBC-WEAF-WJZ Networks from 11:00 a. m. to 12:00 noon, E. S. T., each Friday, except on school holidays, through Friday, April 28, 1933.

Six million students who followed the series last year were waiting for the opening remarks of Milton J. Cross, NBC announcer, and Mr. Damrosch's cheery "Good morning, my dear, young people," just before the NBC Symphony Orchestra, under Damrosch's direction, swung into Glazounov's Scherzo from Symphony No. 5 in B flat.

My Place in the Sun



IF I had the choice between being what I am or selecting whatever other profession I liked, I'd take the advertising game. I say this because I've found advertising one of the most fascinating businesses in the economic world.

Maybe I think this because advertising is so closely allied with showmanship. An advertising slogan is only pure showmanship, isn't it? Sure it is. There should be more of a union between the stage and the advertising business. More actors should read slogans. They would learn a lot if they did, especially if they read "Time to Retire" over and over again.

Frequently I have been spoken of as a "home man." Well, I like it. I have no time for off-stage theatrical life. I have a family, five daughters, ranging in names and ages from Marjorie, who is sixteen, to Janet, who is three-and-a-half. For such a crowd, I must sacrifice some of my personal ambition. I am more than willing to do it, too.

I am egotistical enough to think that I would reach greater heights on the stage and screen if I devoted more energy to it. But I am consciously sacrificing this personal ambition of a greater future in the theatre, for a greater future in the community. I feel

that I must lead my children into paths that will secure their futures. Planning an education for five girls is no sacrifice at all; it's a pleasure.

People don't stop telephoning just because there is a rumor of a depression. They don't stop sending telegrams. They eat bread, they build houses, they buy clothes. Besides, I have my own "five-year-plan" of reconstruction if one is needed.

By this plan, I suggest that people buy everything they need for five years without paying. At the end of that time everybody moves. If you move far enough, they can't find you and, by that time, nobody will care.

In this scheme I also have a plan to do away with unemployment. This entails doubling up. Just think! In baseball, nowadays, we have nine men on a side. I say, let's have forty men on a side and twelve umpires!

In prize-fighting, we find only two men in the ring, with a single referee. What kind of employment is that? Let's have six in the ring and three referees. There should be six in every quartet, a duo should have five members and a solo four. It's an idea!

I have heard people say that I belong in a new school of actors. This, because I devote so much time to home-and future-building, rather than to the attendant interests of the stage. They frequently compare me with actors of the past, who were more or less wastrels. But they have a mistaken idea. Sam

Bernard, Lew Fields, Joe Weber and the rest of that group had no characteristic actors' temperament and were as sober-minded as anyone you could name. But there were bums then, as there are bums now. The reason why there are fewer bums now is that there are fewer actors.

Last year, I expected to retire and play on the screen or stage only when I felt like it. The crash did away with all that and here I am, back in the harness again.

Some time in the future, I would like to produce "on my own," with, maybe, myself, in the leading role. I have been more or less of an associate producer for the past ten years, anyhow. During the course of my work for Ziegfeld, I always tried to contribute my share of new ideas for staging and production. I think it's part of one's job. I do the same on "Palmy Days."

I am 39 years old now. I can honestly say that I have been a star since 1920; and I have been on Broadway since 1916. In all that time I have written 75 per cent of all of my comedy.

As for technique, a good comedian has no tricks. He plots to a certain point and then lets himself loose. A bit later, he winds himself up with the plot situation. There are few comedians who do not depend upon authors. Some depend entirely upon them.

I would live anywhere in the world where I might find enough friends. If I had a few more friends from New York there, I'd be satisfied to live in California for the rest of my life. I could settle in St. Paul or Dallas, just as easily.

If my children want to go on the stage when they grow up, it's all right with me. If I didn't think this way, they'd go on the stage anyway. My eldest daughter, Marjorie, is just graduating from high-school and was guest dramatic editor of a Hollywood paper for a week. They offered her a job for the summer, at \$10 a week, as a columnist. The salary of columnists must be going up!

Jack Benny is a comedian. Sid Silvers is his "stooge." So when the latter wended his way through a crowd of studio visitors from the Bronx, it was only natural that Jack should remark: "And now, folks, 'Silvers Threads Among the Goldbergs.'"

ONE writer said she was the reason why science should rush the perfection of television; another described her as "the 'IT' girl of the air"; another saw her as a "female Rudy Vallee."

All of which would indicate that people, generally, agree that Olga Maria Medolago, the Countess Albani, is easy on the eyes and has quite a personality. The Countess is a lyric soprano, heard regularly in programs from the NBC studios in New York. She sings in Spanish, Italian or English and can turn off a popular selection as readily as she rolls through the higher realms of the classics.

The countess is the genuine article, insofar as royalty is concerned. Her parents are pure Castillian and she was born near Barcelona. She has been in broadcasting only since 1929, but in that period has carved a definite place for herself in front of the microphones.

The little Spanish Countess was imported to the United States when she was four-and-a-half years old and was educated in the Academy of St. Joseph, at Brentwood, Long Island. From the time she graduated, she studied voice and music; and shortly before her radio debut, she sang in the Chicago version of "The New Moon."

She has had six love affairs. The greatest was with her husband, Count Arturo Albani. She has a son, Guardo,

four-and-a-half years old, who already speaks Spanish, English, Italian and French; and goes to school. She likes to ride and fence; and goes to the Opera, a lot. She admits that she flirts, occasionally.

Ethel Shutta

ETHEL SHUTTA, slender and blonde, takes things as they come—including the Scandinavian. She took to the stage at the age of three, took up singing a few years later, topping it off by taking leading parts in musical shows and moving pictures. Then a blonde, laughing orchestra leader came along and she took him. That's how she happens to be Mrs. George Olsen, wife of the famous orchestra director.

Some stage and moving picture artists go completely "up in the air" when they are scheduled to face a microphone. The day Ethel sang her first "blues" song over a National Broadcasting Company Network, she played 18 holes of golf, made a movie short, went to the dentist and bought George a new suit of clothes. After the broadcast, she went out with the band leader and danced till 3:00 o'clock.

If Ethel Shutta, (pronounced Shut-tay), is a radio star, moving picture actress and musical comedy singer, at an age when most young artists are just launching their careers, set it down to her calm, competent manner of going about things, plus an early start in life. Her father and mother were veteran "troupers"; and she grew up with the glare of the footlights in her eyes and the odor of grease-paint in her nose.

She made her premiere appearance at the age of three and took her first speaking part when she was eight. From then on, she was never away from the stage for more than a few months at a time. She attended school in whatever city in which the family happened to be playing. Local lessons were added to her other studies and she began to take small parts in musical productions. By the time she was in her early 'teens she was a veteran. She had played all over the country and her repertoire included every role from "Little Eva" in "Uncle Tom's

Cabin" to the lead in "Why Women Sin."

Then a vaudeville act brought her to New York and to her first part in a Broadway revue. She scored an immediate success and the following year was featured in the Shubert musical show, "Temptations." Her next show was "Louis the Fourteenth." This production brought her under the management of Florenz Ziegfeld, in whose current edition of the "Follies" George Olsen and his Music were playing.

Pretty soon, Ziegfeld decided that he wanted Ethel Shutta in both of his shows, and she began doubling in the "Follies." She was one of the first entertainers to have a police escort. Every night, she slipped away from the theatre in which "Louis the Fourteenth" was playing and jumped into an automobile behind a squadron of motorcycle police. Away they went, roaring through traffic to the New Amsterdam Theatre, seventeen blocks away. There, Ethel sang one song in the "Follies," and then the squadron raced her back in time for her next number in "Louis the Fourteenth."

One night, she found a man in her automobile. It was George. He played for her number in the "Follies" and she had complained that he played too loudly. He offered to ride back and talk it over with her. Today, he will admit it was just an excuse;—but he still complains that he had to conduct his courtship under police surveillance.

Ethel retired from the stage when they

were married, but soon discovered a housewife's duties weren't sufficient to keep her busy. After supervising the apartment, taking her daily "horseback," playing golf with her husband and putting their young son to bed, there wasn't anything to do. So she began singing with George's orchestra in night clubs. Then Ziegfeld offered her a leading role in "Whoopee" with Eddie Cantor and she returned to the footlights.

When the stage version of "Whoopee" closed, she went to Hollywood to play the feminine lead in the moving picture production. George went along with his orchestra and opened a night club in Culver City. His playing and Ethel's singing made it the rendezvous for the film folk. After they both had appeared in several pictures, they returned east, where Ethel followed George and his well-known Music into radio work.

Today, they live in New York city, where both are starring in night clubs and being featured over NBC Networks. Between performances and rehearsals, Ethel finds time to run the house, take care of the two children—Charles, four-and-a-half, and George, Jr., two-and-a-half—and buy all of George, Senior's, clothes. He never thinks about clothes and would wear the same suit, indefinitely, if she didn't buy him a new one once in a while.

Recently, she took the boys to a moving picture theatre, where she and

George were appearing with the orchestra. It was the first time the children had ever seen their parents in their professional capacity; and, when it was all over, she asked them how they liked the show.

"Great," exclaimed Charles; "Gee, Tom Mix was swell!"

"Three Keys"

Bring New Rhythms to NBC for Nation-Wide Debut

THE Three Keys, radio's newest entertainment sensation, are appearing in the first of a series of sustaining programs over NBC Networks.

This unique Negro trio,—Bon Bon, Slim and Bob,—are broadcasting exclusively under the management of NBC Artists Service. They sing their melodies, over an NBC-WJZ Network, four nights each week, Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 10:30 p. m., E. S. T., and on Sundays at 10:45 p. m., E. S. T.

Three Keys come to radio from a basement "black and tan" cafe in Chester, Penn. With them they bring a new mode of harmonizing. It is unnamed because it is new and known only to them. They originated their own style from the rhythm of the old South and the modern melodies of Harlem and Tin Pan Alley.

Bob, the nimble-fingered pianist of the Three Keys, has played piano since childhood. He once was a star pitcher for the Philadelphia Colored Giants. He twisted a mean curve until someone who knew music heard him play. Now he tinkles melodies, joyful, sad and often blue. He also has a clear, tenor voice.

In much the same manner did the elon-

gated Slim, guitarist and baritone, learn music. He picked at an old instrument around his home at Chester. Music was in his soul. He did not know Wagner, Brahms or Beethoven. He did, however, learn those old melodies which have been passed from generation to generation of his race. With his music came a new rhythm, different and entertaining. Modern—yet as old as his people.

Bob and Slim met, a few years ago, in a Chester roadhouse. They became the talk of the countryside.

Bob and Slim then were entertainers in the Submarine Grill, in Chester's Negro quarter. Word of their music had been passed over town. Their white friends crowded into the place.

Then came Bon Bon. His tenor voice was just what Bob and Slim had been seeking, to enable them to develop their new mode of entertainment.

Their fame spread and a Philadelphia radio station invited them to sing. An NBC official, at his home in New York, happened to be listening, and soon afterward a representative of NBC Artists Service went to Philadelphia. Almost before they realized it, Bon Bon, Slim and Bob found themselves in the NBC's New York studios.

East and Dumke

"Sisters of the Skillet"

BACK in 1929 Eddie East and Ralph Dumke were working for WGN in Chicago. Their program was a combination of songs and patter. Somehow their act didn't "click." Finally the boys were informed that the station would have to struggle along without them. They went back to vaudeville but managed to fill in without pay at WGN whenever programs were suddenly cancelled.

Then a bright idea struck the boys. "Why not work up a 'gag' act and burlesque the household hints?" they suggested.

Immediately, they went on a regular "spot," and began the climb that finally brought them to New York. As the "Sisters of the Skillet," the boys now have a nation-wide audience.

Both are natives of Indiana. East was born in Bloomington, seat of Indiana University, April 4, 1894. Eddie's father wanted the boy to study law and become "a respectable lawyer." Instead, Eddie ran away at the age of fifteen and joined a carnival. For two years he toured as a "barker." Then he went back to Bloomington and finished his schooling. He read law in his father's office and was admitted to the bar. Three years later, he became an insurance adjuster in In-

dianapolis. Afterward, East was a salesman of automobile shock absorbers and then tires.

Tiring of business routine, East accepted an offer from the Colonial Theater to sing with the orchestra. He doubled on the drums, until, one day, he received an offer from Charlie Davis, director of the Ohio Theater orchestra.

"Charlie had a nice band," says East, "but when I got to the theater for the first rehearsal, I was surprised to see that Charlie already had a banjo player.

"'Charlie,' I said. 'You have a banjo player!'"

"'Yes, I know; but I need two!'"


"'Well, who's this guy?'"

"'Him? Oh, that's a fellow by the name of Ralph Dumke from South Bend.'"

'Ralphie and I plunked the banjo together for several months and became fast friends. It wasn't long before we decided that we'd strike out for ourselves in the show business, at the first opportunity.'

Dumke was born in South Bend, Indiana, July 25, 1899. He attended grammar and high school, then went to Notre Dame, where he studied engineering. He went out for football.

Eddie and Ralph were first heard over National Broadcasting Company Networks, from Chicago, on November 17, 1930. They came to New York in May, 1931, under the sponsorship of Proctor & Gamble of Cincinnati.

East and Dumke are inseparable companions. They weigh more than 500 pounds together and they say they don't intend to diet. The boys make up one of the few comedy teams that improvises its programs during broadcasts.

George Olsen

An Appreciation!

GEORGE OLSEN has his own method of directing his orchestra: Paul Whiteman waves a baton; Rubinoff plays a violin; and Rudy Vallee carries a saxophone; Olsen sits on one side of the platform and grins. And if there is a world of self-confidence in that grin, just set it down to auto-suggestion. The first sight that greeted his adolescent eyes as he awoke each morning in his comfortable boyhood home in Portland, Oregon, was a huge sign: "WHO MOVES THE WORLD? OLSEN, OF COURSE!" This was painted on his father's van. Olsen, senior, was head of a storage and moving firm, and took that method to proclaim his mission in life. After one look at the pianos his father's furniture movers were trundling from one dwelling to another, George decided he would rather play than to juggle them.

Delighted at finding a musician in his family, Olsen, Senior, hurried out and bought his son a piano and violin. George bought himself a set of drums. By the time he entered high school, George was proficient on all three instruments.

High school was a busy place for Olsen—particularly during football season.

He led the parade to the field, directed the band, changed his clothes, played in the game, and then led the band back to town. It was good training, especially the band leading. When he got to the University of Michigan, four years later, he painted a broomstick with the college colors and became the first drum major in collegiate ranks.

Returning to Portland, he organized his first dance orchestra and secured an engagement at the Portland Hotel. From there he went into vaudeville, where he met Fanny Brice. The singer was so taken with Olsen and his Music that she wired Florenz Ziegfeld about him, adding that the young leader would be willing to come east for a show for \$1,750 weekly. Ziegfeld's response was: "He'll take \$800 and like it," he telegraphed. He was wrong. Olsen took \$800 and LOVED it!

The show was "Kid Boots," with Eddie Cantor, and before it had been running a month, George Olsen and his Music were famous. The young leader soon found himself rushing over to another theatre, each night, to play in the finale of the Ziegfeld Follies, and then on to a night club. When "Kid Boots" and the Follies closed, Ziegfeld put him in "Sunny" with Marilyn Miller, Jack Donahue, Mary Hay and Clifton Webb.

It was during rehearsals for that show that a winsome, blonde girl, who after-

wards was featured in another Ziegfeld show, complained to the producer that the music was too loud. Ziegfeld told her to take it up with Olsen, who might do something about it. He did: He married her. That's how Ethel Shutta, frequently heard with Olsen on his NBC broadcasts, became Mrs. George Olsen.

Another Follies followed, and then "Good News" and "Whoopee," establishing a theatrical record that made Olsen's probably the most celebrated stage dance band in the country. Over National Broadcasting Company Networks his music and his fame spread. In New York he continued to delight dancers at his own club, "The Chantee," and at the Hotel Pennsylvania.

As a dance leader, he is unique. Most of the time he wanders around the room, talking to guests.

At one hotel, where he played a brief engagement, the manager rushed over to the table where he was sitting, to complain that he had hired a leader and not a host. George continued to sit, and to grin at the dance floor. It was packed and had been ever since the hotel announced the engagement of George Olsen and his Music.

Still grinning, Olsen took his orchestra back to the Pacific Coast, where they ap-



peared in three moving pictures. While in Hollywood, he opened his own club, which became a rendezvous for screen stars.

Back in New York, he returned to the night clubs and the NBC studios. Between rehearsals, broadcasts and dance engagements, he plays golf. **WHO MOVES THE WORLD? OLSEN!**

David Ross, CBS Announcer

LIKE all Native New Yorkers David Ross began his struggle for fame and fortune as a newsboy. He delivered, as might be expected, a morning newspaper, which made it necessary for him to rise in the wee hours of the morning and brave the cold winds from the East River. All this, of course, is indispensable to any good success story.

The Ross family was not overburdened with wealth, and the budding Native New Yorker lacked some of the advantages enjoyed by more fortunate Native New Yorkers. He worked while he studied and subsequently achieved matriculation at C. C. N. Y. A succession of occupations ensued and the future radio announcer became coach of amateur dramatics at a neighborhood settlement, supervisor at an orphan asylum, and secretary to a Russian baroness.

Diligent research has failed to reveal the exact period at which David Ross began writing poetry, but the records show that it must have been at an early age. The editors, immediately sensing a new and dangerous enemy in young Ross,

hurled barrage after barrage of rejection slips in his direction, but the ambitious author, although only five-feet, five-inches in height, was made of sterner stuff than the editors had bargained for. He met their rejection slips with still more poetry. It could not go on this way eternally, and so the editors finally capitulated.

About six years ago radio awoke one day to find that David Ross had become one of its own. The now defunct WGBS in New York was his starting point. He began as a dramatic reader, became a regular announcer and finally developed a program of poetry readings. After two years with the station he joined Columbia. Among the programs he has announced for CBS are Arabesque, Around the Samovar and many commercial broadcasts. Then, too, there is his own program, Poet's Gold, in which he reads verse to his heart's content.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Through a strange coincidence, there are two members of the CBS staff by the name of David Ross. The other conducts the Roxey Concerteurs, presented each Sunday night, at 8:30, E. S. T., over the WABC-CBS Network.

"Lim. time" or "L. T." indicates that broadcasting is restricted to certain hours. Where higher and lower amounts of power are given, the higher power is for daytime only.
