MOST DJs think at some MOST DJs think at some stage of writing to record companies in the hope of getting free promotional records. In most cases, however, the record companies are unable to

oblige
They receive thousands of applications every year from DJs and are naturally very choosy to whom they send records.

First of all you must remember, they are in the business of selling records. The only reason they are going to send you they are going to send you promotional records is if they think your weekly audiences are large enough to make a real impact on local sales.

One of the main problems that record

problems that record companies have, is getting the sales of potential hit records started. Once the record has got into the BBC charts it gets daily exposure on national radio and will often go on and on climbing the charts as more people

So to make a potential hit record reach at least the record companies must try and get radio plays and nowadays just as important — disco as important — disco plays in the larger discotheques and ball-rooms around the coun-

NO PROBLEM If you are a radio DJ or If you are a radio DJ or producer you have no problem in getting free promotional records—the only problem you do have is finding the time to listen to 70 new singles every week and keeping the record pluggers at

If, on the other hand, you are a small time DJ doing houseparties. 21st parties, and the local

pay around 50p per record.

However, for those DJs who play to packed houses in large ballrooms or discotheque clubs it is well worth writing to the well worth writing to the record companies telling them how many nights you run a disco and how many people attend, as they do update their mailing list quite regu-

mailing list quite regu-larly.

Incidentally, don't ex-aggerate the size of your audiences as they often contact the clubs direct in order to check their mailing lists, and ser-record compares to the major ballrooms to check audience reaction.
