WHERE IS SHORTWAVE RADIO HEADED?

Part II

Last month in discussing this topic, the problems of the broadcasters were brought out. So this month I would like to discuss the role of shortwave radio in regards to the listener.

We Americans have it pretty good. We have a very large and complex mass media that brings us our news, weather, sports and entertainment. From television, we get a complete coverage. We get news, weather, sports and entertainment. From radio, we get much the same, only there is no picture and music substitutes serials, westerns, etc. as the source of entertainment. From the newspaper we get a complete one-sided account of the day's news as well as a few entertaining and informative columns. Our magazines cover virtually every aspect of life here in America. Wouldn't it be great if we could fit all these things into one media? Well we can! Shortwave radio!

Throughout the world, a vast number of people rely on shortwave radio for the latest news as well as entertainment. These people do not have the huge mass media complex we do because they aren't as well off as we are. The average person in another country could not afford a television set. So they must turn to shortwave, where the only requirement is a small, inexpensive portable shortwave receiver. From this small tool, millions get their daily news, weather, sports, cultural programs, entertainment, etc.

Here in America, the sales of imported portable receivers is climbing. Why? Because many Americans are discovering the advantages of shortwave radio and what it has to offer. Many Americans are tired of watching the "boob tube". Shortwave, just by the large number of easily tuned stations, offers a broader coverage of the news. Thus the listener is better informed and has a better understanding of world events. The challenge Americans love can be found in the myriad of stations on shortwave. Culturally, shortwave is more appealing to the listener. The "international flavor" is there. These are only a few of the many advantages that can be found in shortwave radio. So you can see that shortwave can provide the listener with the best in news and entertainment.

But unfortunately, because of our large mass media, most of the shortwave listeners in this country are the DXers who tune in a station for the purpose of adding another country to their list and probably another QSL card. Now, in no way whatsoever am I degrading the hobby of DXing, because I love it! However, how many of us DXers have one or more international shortwave stations that we listen to on a regular basis for the sole purpose of news, cultural and entertainment value? Just try it once!

Shortwave radio can provide us with an excellent hobby as well as an excellent way to learn about the other peoples that share this globe with us!

During March, R.Nederland celebrates its 25th anniversary. RN enjoys a popularity today few stations come to know. RN is progressive. RN is concerned and communicative! All qualities not easily found in most international broadcasters. Success of the station can be attributed to two men: Harry van Gelder and Jim Vastenhou. They have, without doubt been the vanguard of RN's attitude, and deserve the highest credit and praise that a listener and friend can offer.

RFE and R.Liberty: In the \$Red\$

U-S Government appropriations for salaries of 3,200 RFE and R.Liberty employes ended February 22nd. Other funds to pay salaries would run out by February 29th. Senate and House conferees are at odds over funding. Hugh Scott (SEN. Rep-Pa) is in favor of government funding, while Foreign Relations Committee Chairman SEN J-W Fulbright (Dem-Ar) strongly opposes.

MISCELLANEOUS (Odds and Ends)

The 'Symposium on Broadcasting in Pacific Nations,' to be held at S.F. State April 20-22, is expected to draw 300 delegates from 56 Pacific countries - with Peking represented. A Pacific Broadcasting Factbook will be published by S.F. State following the conference. (KAMP)...Credit Dr. Richard Wood for restoration of XETT (9555 kHz) to shortwave....Minister of Posts and Telegraphs is studying the feasibility of SW broadcasting in Ireland (decision will likely be released after current fighting ends). (KERR)...Mr. Arno Maier, D-7800, Br ilburg/Brsg., Laufener Strasse 5, Fed.Rep.of Germany, handles a correspondence list of 50 German DXers, who want to hear from U-S DXers. If interested, drop Arno a note....Item from (THORNE)...A fine 48-page FM Atlas and Station Directory at \$2.50 is available from Bruce F. Elving, 3000 N. Oakland Ave., Milwaukee, WI, 53211. (Elving)...The Brazilian Communications Ministry has announced plans to construct 250 kW radio outlets (likely MWBC) at Manaus, and at Belem and Porto Velho. (LEISTNER)...The Colorado DXers Association, 3181 S. York Street, Englewood, CO, 80110 is interested in hearing from Colorado SPEEDXers. (Harrington)....

(continued from January 1972) During my tenure as Editor of Pop. Elec., I saw many surveys made of the SWL market. In the case of PE, the advertising salesmen will tell equipment manufacturers, with a straight face, that PE has an audience of 225,000 SWL's! I leave to your imagination the definition of a SW listener in a survey of this nature.

Obviously, shortwave listeners are held in higher regard in Europe, Asia and Africa than they are in the U-S. But, of far more importance to us - the image of the SWL DXer has reached a very low ebb. My talk is not meant to find fault, but to pinpoint the problem and to offer a few suggestions for your consideration as to how our image might be restored to the status it held 15 years ago. Advice is always cheap - implementing it takes courage, ability, and desire.

My contention is that we should try to find a consensus among SWL's as to the kind of relationship we want to exist between the dilettante listener and the hard-core DXer. Between the avid knob-twister that can and does spend 3 to 4 hours per day tuning - versus the casual listener, that may turn on a receiver two or three times a week. Between the knowledgeable SWL that likes to see his name in print and the non-participating club member --- sometimes referred to as a 'parasite'.

SWEEPSTAKES NOTES

2400 hours GMT on 28 February marked the official closing for the logging period of the SPEEDX SWEEPSTAKES. From then until 30 April contestants have the opportunity to sweat out the mail deliveries in collecting QSLs for entry in the contest.

Several inquiries have been received asking that if the station omits details required for SWEEPSTAKES entry from their verification, may data from some generally accepted reference be substituted. The answer is NO. Contest Rule #6 states the information which must be included on the QSL itself to be eligible....there will be no exceptions considered. This strict interpretation may seem overly arbitrary to some, and without doubt will remove several excellent catches from consideration; but, all things taken into account, it is the only fair and impartial basis to determine the nine category winners.

A question concerning correct continent placement for the Azores has also arisen. Contest Rule # 7 indicates the 1972 edition of WRTVH is to be the basic reference for such matters, and the Azores are listed on page 43 of this publication in the European section. However, some doubt seems to come from the fact that the Azores are depicted as an inset on the African map located on page 104 of this same volume...plus it seems one of the more often used "countries lists" counts the Azores as being African.

Having professional experience in the field of cartography, the Projects Coordinator consulted several charts and determined that, measured from the nearest mainland protrusion to the closest island in the group, the distance is some 145 statute miles less to Europe than to Africa. However, in order to preclude any possible difficulty with this placement, the National Geographic Society is being consulted as the final authority in accordance with the aforementioned Rule #7 and their opinion is now pending. Until and/or unless the NGS rules otherwise however, the Azores will be considered European in view of the WRTVH listing and map measurements to that effect.

Perhaps the most often asked question concerns an estimate of what might be expected for a winning score. Since this particular contest is sort of a "first" for SWling, there is no real basis upon which to risk even the wildest of guesses. It is fairly certain though, that most, if not all, of the winners will have some relatively high power values in their total somewhere. Potential SWEEPSTAKES entrants are encouraged to submit their scores regardless of what they are....after all, there are 3 experience classifications further divided into 3 interest groups each; and it will only cost an 8¢ stamp to enter. Additionally, each entrant will receive a membership credit point for doing so.

Complete SWEEPSTAKES rules and related information is contained in the October 1971 issue of the SPEEDX bulletin, or may be obtained from the SPEEDXTRAS section at the above address for a SASE.

TWR RECEPTION SURVEY

As mentioned elsewhere, some additional observations of signals originating from the vicinity of the Netherlands Antilles seems indicated. Therefore, another club-wide monitoring survey is offered. This time the same transmission is to be logged throughout North America. Tuning details are as follows:

STATION: Trans World Radio Bonaire relay TIME: 0030 to 0100 hours GMT

FREQUENCY: 11815 kilohertz DATE: 17 March 1972 (note: this is the "GMT date", the desired transmission will be aired at 7:30 PM EST/1:30 PM PST on Thursday 16 March).

Reporting will be the same as for the just-completed Radio Nederland survey. Draw up a reception report evaluating the signal quality in terms of the SINPO code and also mention a few program details heard. All correct reports received here by 25 March will be included in the survey. Those SPEEDXers responding may expect a special acknowledgment for their efforts in addition to acquiring another membership credit point.

RN SURVEY WRAP-UP

3h SPEEDers sent reports covering 44 individual loggings, and some rather interesting information was gleaned. For example, preliminary sifting of the raw data suggests:

- 1) The 11730 kHz Radio Nederland broadcast at 0200 GMT beamed toward Eastern North America, while heard with little difficulty there, may be received even better on the West Coast.
- 2) Of the two parallel broadcasts on 9715 and 11730 kHz beamed for the Western states, the latter should be the more suitable channel propagationally.....apparently not so.
- 3) Two fairly well defined patches of sub-standard reception were noted along the Eastern seaboard. (No, you will not be told the locations because further studies are contemplated and it is desirable not to influence future reports in any way).

All of the reception reports received here prior to the deadline have been forwarded to Radio Nederland for verification, and Herr van Gelder of the English section has promised a specially marked QSL will be mailed directly from Holland. In addition, the cover letter asked that reports mentioning the Benelux DX Club be passed along for the QSL mentioned during the monitored broadcast. The names of all participants also have been sent to the Membership Committee, and word just received indicates an additional earned-credit point has been added to each of their totals.

Since Radio Nederland is mailing the veris from Holland, SASEs were not needed on the project. Those that were received are now on file here and the owners may use them for the next SPEEDXTRA requiring one...simply mention you have one here already.

Sincere thanks to roughly 18 percent of the SPEEDA organization for their interest and participation in this project, and also to Radio Nederland for their excellent support.

HANDICAPPED AID PROGRAM

SPEEDer Gene Moser of Coloma Michigan, who has a very close personal interest, has been appointed to head up and be chief advisor to a continuing program aimed at helping the handicapped. In keeping with the SPEEDA policy of doing things properly or not at all, this program will not be a mere "can-shaking" appeal to attract a few pieces of cast-off equipment (although that particular angle may well be included).

The SPEEDA program is being planned around a concept that will introduce the handicapped directly to the SWling hobby, encourage and promote their participation, and finally develop useful applications in which they can become active. To achieve this very ambitious goal will require assistance from many sources, both within the SWL fraternity as well as outside, in addition to some concerted and dedicated effort on the part of several SPEEDers.

At the present moment we have need for a couple of volunteers in the Coloma area to assist Gene directly in getting set up. If you live in the vicinity, you may contact him at: 6805 Woodland Court, Coloma Michigan, 49038. Since the rough plan involves keeping Gene as free from detail work as possible so that he may devote most of his attention to actually contacting the handicapped, the services of a solid "support group" is required. The possibility of incorporating this phase with the existing Sponsorship Committee is now being explored, and there's plenty of room for anyone who wants to become active. One word of caution: No glory-seekers need apply...all we can promise is a few hours work and a lot of personal satisfaction.

Next month's issue will contain more complete details on how this program will work...and, as we get rolling, Gene will present regular reports on his activities.

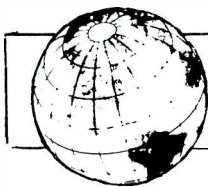
SPEEDX ON THE AIR

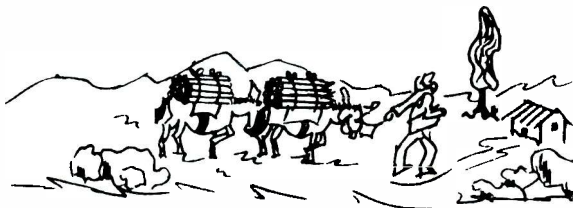

Shortly after the victory of Salvador Allende and his Unidad Popular party in September of 1970, Banco del Estado and Corporación became government property as Allende swiftly moved to fulfill a campaign promise to nationalize Banco del Estado. Consequently, in a land where broadcasters may be classified by their politics, Radio Corporación is a strict pro-government radio.

As a result of its ties to the government monetary system, Radio Corporación is often heard broadcasting patriotic and bank related commercials. News broadcasts are sponsored by Banco del Estado or El Banco Central, the Chilean equivalent of the Federal Reserve Bank. Other frequently heard commercials include those for "Bonos CARs", "prestamos", and "boletas de compra-venta y servicios". The ads mentioning "Bonos CARs" are simply selling savings bonds while those mentioning "prestamos" are most likely pushing loans. The ads mentioning sales receipts or "boletas de compra-venta y servicios" urge people to request a numbered receipt with each purchase which, in addition to giving the holder a chance in the national lottery, serve to keep the merchants tax books honest.

Despite its 1 kw power, Radio Corporación is widely heard in North America on 15150 khz in the 19 meter band. Look for this station in the early evening between midnight and 3 hours GMT. News at 0130 GMT is a nightly feature and Corporacion is easily recognized by its slogans "La radio para todo Chile" and "La voz de la sur del continente". Radio Corporación is a fair verifier for detailed spanish language reports so chances are good that you will all be able to add this one to your list of "gotchas". ejw
