#### A MESSAGE OF THANKS


Members of our hobby, in and out of SPEEDX are to be complimented for the interest they show in others.

I am twenty-five and started listening last December My hus band purchased a Lloyd's Pathfinder 10-band portable for me during Christmas...and away I went, Nobody I talked to knew a thing about shortwave listening, so I went about the task of finding ... or should I say digging up... books concerning the hobby. Finally, after reading several paperback books on it, I began to understand all the history and details of it.

"... Next step was to put on the roof a cheap long wire, which helped my receiver a great deal. I read about clubs and joined one, which helped me discover how bad my receiver was for DXing. After huddling about with my portable I decided I enjoyed the hobby enough to go on to better things and, therefore, purchased an Allied SX-190. My husband constructed a multi-band antenna and my reception seems to be 100% better ...

... I still have many problems, however, because of my limited abilities on being 'stupid' when it comes to mechanics, on being a woman listening to shottwave; for instance, people say, 'YOU listen to shortwave radio', or 'That's odd for a WOMAN to do, etc... I also have a hard time picking up Europe and I get discouraged thinking I just don't have what it takes to really be a good DXer ...

... Anyway, I enjoy my new hobby and am able to 'travel' while sitting at home. I recently joined your club and was truly amazed at the way it was run and organized. I hope to participate in it and also hope being a woman will not have its drawbacks!!! ...

... I have found that Radio Nederland has been a big help and also the kindest of all the stations in generating enthusiasm for the hobby ...

"... I hope that I'll meet other members in the future and that I'll get a little better at DXing harder to find stations in the months ahead. I know your bulletin will help and I am glad that I am with your organization ... "

GHANA BROADCASTING CORPORATION

(Written exclusively for SPEEDX by PAUL K. KUSSE, Senior Technical Assistant, RADIO GHANA, and edited by Serge C. P. Neumann).

THE GHANA BROADCASTING CORPORATION began operations July 31st, 1935, as a wired relay station in the Gold Coast, new Ghana. The station, then a wing of the information services, was known as Station ZOY, and operated from a small bungalow in Accra, the capital of Ghana. Initially, the station relayed BBC programs to about 300 listeners in Accra only.

In 1936, the service began to expand. A radiodiffusion center was opened in Cape Coast (a regional center), and a year later, broadcasting stations opened at Sekondi, Kumasi and Koforidus.

In 1939, the Colonial government provided the funds for the construction of a new broadcasting house in Accra, and the purchasing of a 1.3 kilowatt transmitter- the first transmitter to carry programs from Ghana to its neighbors.

On recommendation of a Commission appointed in 1952, the government established the Gold Coast Broadcasting System in 1954. The first Director of droadcasting was Mr. J. B. Millar, who came to that post from the BBC. He was the Chairman of the Commission which brought reforms to the Service after 19 years of operation.

The first Ghanaian to be appointed the the post of Director of Broadcasting was Mr. W. F. Coloman. He held the post from 1960-1968, when he was appointed Director-General. He held that position until 1970.

The Ghana Broadcasting Corporation (GBC) was formally incorporated on March 1st, 1968 under a decree that (now) consists of nine main areas; Sound (programmes), Television programs; Engineering, News and Current Affairs; Common Services; Administration; Accounting; Music; and Commercials (advertising).

The objectives of the GBC are, among others, to undertake sound, commercial and television broadcasts; to prepare in the field of culture, education and informationentertainment, programs reflecting national progress and aspirations; to carry on an external service of sound broadcasting; and (in its) public service broadcastingincluding the airing of government announcements; political party speeches; and the expression of differing viewpoints on matters of public controversy.

The GBC operates with funds derived from its commercial broadcasting (both radio and television), wired broadcast service, television license fees, and through financial support of the Ghama Covernment.

The Corporation employs more than 3,500 men and women, including engineers, symmetry, administrators, accountants, producers, technicians, aumounters, desi recs, cameraser, monitors, artists and workers.

The CBC operates three radio networks in its National Service. It also operates the External Service and the Television Service. The three National Services are  $\alpha Rt-1$ , UBC-2 and BBL-3.

#### GHANA BROADCASTING- continued.

The GBU-1: Broadcasts in the major Ghana languages, Akan, Ga, Ewe, Hausa, Dagbani and Nzema. But there are a few programs in English broadcast on this network, such as news, commentaries, Ghana Newsreel and various school or educational broadcasts. Most of the transmission time is devoted to programs on culture, plays, features, health talks, and so on. This service operates on 3350 kHz, 4915 kHz, and on 5990 kHz, respectively.

The GBC-2: This service which is our commercial service, is heard on radios only, and covers 13 hours per day on weekends and on holidays. Inaugurated five years ago, GBC-2 carries mainly popular music programs and English programs, with "News on the Hour". Advertisements and social and public announcements are also part of the program fare. Frequencies are 4980 kHz and 3366 kHz.

<u>GBC-3</u>: This is the third network of the Corporation, and it carries only Englishlanguage programs. The programs have been designed to fulfill functions of cultural leadership, and patronage in the fields of Music, Drama, the Arts, Literature, and the Sciences. It operates from 1655 (GMT) until 2300 (GMT) daily, Sunday through Saturdays, on 3295 kHz and on 3326 kHz.

<u>The External Service</u>: This Service was inaugurated on June 1, 1961, and broadcasts in English, French, Swahili, Arabic, Portuguese and Hausa on four 100 kilowatt transmitters situated at Tema. Two high power transmitters of 250 kilowatts each at Ejura in the Ashanti Region augment the service. Service areas include North America, the Caribbean. Europe and the Middle East.

<u>CBC-TV</u>: The 30th anniversary of sound broadcasting in Ghana also marked the birth of the Television Service on July 31, 1965. It consists of studios at Accra, with four transmitters of about 20 kilowatt E.R.P. (effective radiated power) and linked by microweve to the studio center at Accra. GBC-TV is on the air for two-and-a-half hours in the morning when schools and colleges are in session. It goes back on the air from 1755 GMT on weekdays, and at 1600 GMT on Sundays, with entertainment programs.

(Editor's note: Our sincere thanks to Mr. Kusse for providing our readers with an insight into the Ghana Broadcasting Corporation. It can be said without qualification, that the GBC has been a consistently good verifier, now as in former days. This, in combination with their very interesting programs, makes it no wonder that the GBC must be considered as one of the broadcast leaders in Africa. Their programs and attitude cleerly reflect the new and progressive Ghana. We hope you'll give it a listen; often).

From antenna expert and HAP Vice-Chairman, Bill Paschke, comes word of a new antenna tuner, known as the "TG RANDOM WIRE ANTENNA TUNER". It is billed as "especially helpful if you are limited to an inadequate, short indoor antenna. Yet equally beneficial with a too-long Inverted-L". "...Simple to operate and install".

Bill tells us that he has tested out the first one manufactured and found it to be "a FB producer... a good and economical antenna tuner unit". Further, " I can highly recommend this antenna tuner and, I am a hard one on either testing or recommending a product unless it is a producer".

Congratulations to Mssrs Hardester, Straumanis, and Lanoue!! They have been mailed their SPEEDX Select Award cerificates in recognition of their achievements.

A portion of an actual Select Award certificate has been used to highlight the QSL sizewinners, but the editor isn't at all sure just how well it will come through the photoreouction process. In the event it happens to turn out badly, we'll state that they are  $5\frac{1}{2} \times 9$ inches, brown and gold in color, and have a fancy engraved border and background (just like money...almost).

It will be noted that the winning entries are shown in terms of square centimeters (Sq Cm). This was done since the metric system provides units that more readily lend themselves to resolving a really close situation...and such a situation did arise! We received two entries for "Smallest QSL" using a veri from Radio Yerevan which being of

We received two entries for "Smallest QSL" using a veri from Hadio Yerevan which being of slightly different proportions, appeared to be at least as small as the one from Uruguay. Putting an accurate engineer's scale to work, it was determined that R Yerevan officially came in at 108.00 square centimeters...or only <u>one Sq Cm more</u> than CXA19!! (In case you're wondering how big a Sq Cm is, Just divide a standard sized US postage stamp into <u>fourths</u>, and you'll come pretty close). Also not too far off the pace was Hadio Yeace and <u>Progress'</u> werification which came up 112.45 So Cm.

The degree of interest generated in this slightly off-beat award offering insures its continuation and certainly sometime next year SPEEDXers may expect the "Second Annual QSL Size" competition for 1973 verifications....So keep a ruler handy to the mailbox in the mean-time.

Somewhat the opposite seems to be the case for the "Most Non QSLs" award announced last month. Even though no less than four SPEEDXers sugrested the idea, we have not as yet received a single entry!! As of this writing there are still a few days left until the deadline, but it appears as though "Most Non QSLs-1972" will be vacated by reason of default. (This editor received at least four turn-downs last year that would qualify...and would slip in the back door...but alas, he is ineligible). Needless to say, any consideration of continuing this particular award on an annual basis is presently in limbo.

## YOU CAN'T TELL YOUR PLAYERS WITHOUT A SCORECARD

For some time DXers have noted Radio Tupi programming on channels allocated to Radiodifusors de São Paulo and recently Radio Panamericana has appeared on frecuencies allocated to Radio Record. In addition, there are recorded instances of frecuency switches by Radio National and Radio Excelsior and by Radio América and Radio Novo de Julho. Although this all seems a general state of confusion, one look at the ownership of these flip flopping pairs reveals that they are all linked together in some way. Either the stations are both owned by the same owner or organization or they are so closely related that, for all intents and purposes, they may be considered a single entity.

Radio Tupi and Radiodifusora de São Paulo are both owned by the same company. Both operate medium wave outlets in their respective cities but, when it comes to shortwave, on Radio Tupi broadcasts are relayed. From time to time the license holder's name might be aired but, for the most part, only Radio Tupi programming is heard.

A slightly different situation is true for Radio Panamericana and Radio Record. Although they are separate organizations, the Board of Directors is so closely interlocked that it is no wonder that Panamerica would turn to Radio Record to "rent" transmitter time. I suspect, however, that the rent is more a bookkeeping transaction that a sale of spare transmitter time.

The National-Excelsior and Novo de Julho-América switches are also the result of common ownership, a fact which should come as no surprise to most old timers. This won't tell you who is on first, but at least you'll know why he is there.

#### A MONTH OF SURPRISES

Several DXers checked in this mont: with the news that Radio Colosal, 4945 khz, has been noted with English language announcements in the time slot of 0500 - 0630 GHT. These announcements thank those who have written to the station and promise an answer and a souvenir to those who write in to the station. 

## RADIO FREE AMERICA

America's first "pirate" broadcaster took to the air at 12:23 P.M. en 19 September from a location some 12 miles off Cape May, New Jersey. With the words "This is Radio Free America, the silence of the sea is broken at 1160 on the AM dial", Dr. Carl McIntire fufilled his pledge to centinue broadcasting after the F.C.C. shut down his station in Media, PA WXUR. The broadcasts lasted only a day, however, as technical difficul-ties developed and the transmitter was shut down until some minor adjustments could be made.


Radio Free America was born after the F.C.C. shut down WXUR last Solution of the second diction.

Delayed for a time by money and legal problems, McIntire finally arranged for the use of a former minesweeper, the S.S. Oceanic, and outfitted it with a 10kw transmitter. The 138 ft. wood hulled vessel transmitter troubles delayed the commencement of broadcasting. Finally, casting was begun only to be discontinued a day later.


The termination of broadcasting on 20 September was the decision of Dr. McIntire after he received a complaint from station WHEW in Lake-wood, New Jersey that Radio Free America was interferring with its signal on 1170 khz. Dr. McIntire is quoted as saying "There is no dearth of wavelengths and we do not want to interfer with other stations." Present plans call for Radio Free America to try to eliminate the problem of interference through the use of a directional antenna but, if that fails, a move to 1613 khz is contemplated.

The shutdown also stalled for the the moment the confrontation that was was brewing with the F.C.C.. Initially the F.C.C. simply trailed the ship as it cruised along making no attempt to interfer. However, the F.C.C. plans to seek a restraining order in Federal Court should broadcasting resume. The order will be sought on the grounds that the converted minesweeper, which is of U.S. registry, which states "No person shall use or operate any apparatus for the transmission of energy or communications or signals by radio upon any vessel or aircraft of the United States without a license."

By the time this reaches you, Radio Free America may be on the air once again as the required adjustments are expected to take about a week to complete. You had best keep a close watch, however, as there is no assurance that Radio Free America will be around for long. Larry Magne reports in "FREDX" that reports to Radio Free America, Cape May, N.J. Attn: John Jones, Engineer will be answered so, if you hear it, report it. Good Luck!!!!

A spokesman said interference with the reception of the BBC Russian Service and the Russian-language services of the Voice of America and West Germany's Deutsche Welle stopped on Monday.

"But the jamming of Radio Liberty, the American station based in the Federal German Republic, and Israel's transmission to the Soviet Union in Russia, is reported to be continuing," the spokesman added.

The Voice of America is an official division of the US government; Radio Liberty and Radio Free Europe are financed by Congress but do not have official status. edification (coming from the ' Boston Globe recently) may not do too much for your love of Radio Moscow, but is of some interest.

However in your case it could be they sent you someone elses QSL? That happened to me with the PTT in Liberia. The sent me some guy in West Germany's QSL. I sent it on to him. About a week later I received my QSL from a guy in California who had gotton it by mistake. If you ever do get a QSL that is not yours, please be good enough to foward it on to the owner. Many times after addressing the envelopes, stations line them up to put in the letters. More often than not, this involves several people having their QSLs put into the wrong envelope.

SPAINII sent a rept to CINE in Madrid for one of the PTP stations on 14.9 MHz. In 3 weeks I got a QSL for their Coastal Station on 13,17, and 22 MHz. This may be an indication that they do not read their mail to well, or that my Spanish is pretty bad. In any case, if this type of thing happens to you, all you can do is send a follow up.

TAHITI: FTS-Papeete F2099 9928 French no data ltr from Paris but rpted to Tahiti. 25 days for 3 returned IRC's and a FF rpt.

WEST GERMANY: Lahr Military 5690 reject ltr from Lt. Col. Belliveau saying that "It is not the Canadian Forces policy to either acknowledge or deny xmsns made on military nets. Therefore we are unable to comply with your request of 13 July 1973." Is this a New Policy? (Koret) Lahr Military Canadian Forces Europe sent a personal letter saying they can't veri due to regulations. PFC and SASE sent and returned. VS: R.A.Sieffert. How did you get it verified(Simon). I guess I got lucky? My QSL letter is dated April 26,1973. It say's-

"Your letter of March 16 is acknowledged. The Lahr station on the Canadian Military Aeronautical Communications Service provides communications for Canadian Forces aircraft to or from Europe. Being a military unit we are unable to impart any classified information, however, our international Call Sign is DHM 95 and our voise call sign is Lahr Military/ We broadcast weath-er information on a schedule on the hour plus 16 minutes, for Lahr, Soellingen, Dusseldorf and Stuttgart, followed by terminal forcasts for these locations. We confirm that we commenced our broadcast at 0616 on March 16th on 5690 upper er side band. Thank you for your evaluation of our signals. Your reply cou-pon was not required, and is returned. Signed-T.R.Barber, Captain, for the commander Canadian Forces, Europe." Since I sent them a report for their 0616 wx forcast, the Captain QSLed it as it could hardly be called a classified broadcast. However even my QSL is not as "Tightly worded" as I would like. I wrote to them using a West German address-Lahr Military, Canadian Forces Station, Commanding Officer, Canadian Forces Europe, Lahr, West Germany. However they QSLed via CFPO 5000 via Belleville, Ontario, Canada. If you tried the CFPO try direct or visa versa. Also try addressing it directly to Captain T.R. Barber.

As long as I am answering questions, I get about 10 requests a month for addresses of stations. I don't mind answer them, however, you may have to wait a week or so for my answer. However, I would suggest that you purchase the new WORLD UTIL-ITY DXER'S HANDBOOK. It is available from Jack White, 780 NW Wallula, Gresham, OR. 97030. The price for Speedx full members is only \$6.95 (\$7.95 for others). The Handbook is over 200 pages and contains over 100 pages of individual station data, listing alphabetically by country, the addresses, QSL policy, operating frequency and other information on literally thousands of utility stations throughout the world. Also, remember the advise of the Sage of Utility DXing, when you don't have an address of a station and are in doubt, make one up., something is better than nothing.

Back to Utility QSLs. Once again the US loggings dar outnumber the others so I have changed the US logging format- all QSLs listed below are USA.

ESCUELA RADIOFONICA

by E.J. WHITCHEAD

For 24 years, Radio Sutatenza has been a pioneer in the use of radio for educational purposes--especially in the education of the rural adult, the "campesino". From modest beginnings Radio Sutatenza has grown into a major force in the battle against illiteracy in Colombia. Its multi-media approach has been so successful, in fact, that it is now being widely copied by other developing nations in Asia, Africa, and Latin America.

Radio Sutatenza is an arm of Accion Cultural Popular, an organization of educational media dedicated to providing the 8 million rural adults of Colombia with the wherewithal to assume the responsibility for their own development. Radio Sutatenza functions as the primary means of reaching these people with a program of instruction based upon the five basic notions of Health, Alphabet, Numbers, Economy and Work, and Spirituality. These programs in hygene and basic health care, reading and writing, simple arithmetic, increasing productivity, and the recognition of personal dignity are supported and reinforced with a newspaper "El Campesino", rural libraries, personal correspondence, extension schools, and institutes for farmers.


Accion Cultural Popular was founded in 1948 by Monsignor Jose Joaquin Salcedo, the pastor of Sutatenza, a small village in the Andes. An amateur radio operator, Msgr. Salcedo realized radio was the most effective way to bring educational instruction to the far flung rural adults of Colombia. His dream was realized in 1949 when Radio Sutatenza began educational broadcasts using a 100 watt transmitter. At first there were but a few battery operated receivers to receive the broadcasts but the audience quickly grew. So too did Radio Sutatenza which then moved to Bogota and added more powerful transmitters. Later, to meet regional needs, Radio Sutatenza added transmitters in other major cities.

Radio Sutatenza operates two different programming formats simultaneously. The "A" program is a general purpose format mixing entertainment and sports coverage with educational instruction while the "B" program concentrates on instruction with frequent repeat broadcasts of lessons for the convenience of the students. The "A" program serves as the attention getter drawing the attention of the people to the instruction which is then reinforced with repeat broadcasts by the "B" program. Among the many features broadcast by Radio Sutatenza is one of special interest to the SWL. Called "Frecuencia Internacional", this program designed for foreign listeners is aired daily Monday through Friday at 1400 GMT.

The studios of Radio Sutatenza are located in Bogota, Cali, Barranquilla, Magangue, and Medellin. The station in Bogota is the largest with a 300 kw medium wave transmitter operating on 810 khz and three shortwave transmitters, a 50 kw RCA unit operating on 5095 khz, a 25 kw water cooled GE unit operating on 5075 khz, and a 10 kw Gates unit operating on 6075 khz. The Cali station operates on medium wave only. The transmitter there is 120 kw and operates on 700 khz. The same is true of the stations at Barranquilla, Magangue and Medellin which operate 120 kw on 960 khz, 120 kw on 590 khz, and 100 kw on 1010 khz respectively. This totals over 600 kw making Radio Sutatenza the most powerful educational radio in the world.

### R-390A/URR

The R-390A/URR is a 26 tube superhetrodyne receiver for reception of cw, am, ssb, and RTTY signals. This receiver covers 500 Khz to 32 Mhz in 30 1 Mhz wide bands and one 500 Khz wide band. From 500 Khz to 8 Mhz the R390A/URR is a triple conversion receiver, and from 8 Mhz to 32 Mhz, it operates as a double conversion receiver. The first IF stage is variable from 17.5 to 25 Mhz and is used on the eight lowest bands. The second IF stage is also a variable type with a range of 3 to 2 Mhz. The third IF stage operates at 455 Khz. There is one stage of tuned RF amplification prior to the first mixer. The oscillators feeding the first two mixers are crystal controlled. There is provided a set of heaters for these crystals, but they are not needed if the receiver is to be used indoors. Also, there is a built in crystal calibrator. The readout is by means of a digital counter type of arrangement, and there is a mark erery 10 Hz. The readout is accurate to 300 Hz. The linear tuning is accomplished by means of the insertion of powdered iron cores into the RF and IF coils at a rate controlled by a complex arrangement of gears, shafts and cams. The IF selectivity is 100 Hz to 16 Khz in six steps. There are inputs for both a balanced antenna and an unballanced antenna. An output from the 455 Khz final IF is also provided. There also is an 800 Hz audio filter for use with cw reception. The carrier strength meter is marked 0 - 100 and there is a graph in the technical manual for converting this reading into microvolts. There is audio outputs for a 600 ohm unbalanced line, a 600 ohm set of headphones, and a 600 ohm balanced audio line. The balanced audio output is fully metered in volume units ( VU Meter ). The R390A/URR operates from 115/230 volts ac and consumes 140 watts of power with the crystal ovens off. The receiver comes in a standard 19 inch rack mount and weighs 75 pounds. Also, there is a niose limiter, the clipping action of which is manually The R390A/URR is now available from surplus dealers for about \$750. controlled.
