"YOU ARE TUNED TO 'THE VOICE OF BREZHNEV": According to the semi-annual report of the U.S. Information Agency, VOA carried Secretary Brezhnev's voice back to the U.S.S.R. in its Russian language broadcasting during June of this year. In an item forwarded by Mississippi SFEEDXer Jack Jones from pages of the Jackson Clarion-Ledger, the report mentioned that this led to the interesting situation in which the Soviet leader's own words, as well as accounts of his actions. were being blocked by his own jammers during his visit to the United States. Only on one occasion did this irony prove too much for the people who were making jamming decisions. That was when the VOA preannounced a simultaneous broadcast of Brezhnev's TV address to the American people on June 24. Jamming stopped about two minutes before the address began and remained off for the duration of the speech....at that time it was the first clear-cut interruption of the Soviet jamming of VOA since such electronic QRM was resumed in 1968 during the Soviet troops presence in Czechoslovakia ...

YOU'RE NOT LIKELY TO HEAR IT ON RADIO UGANDA, BUT...good of Ernie Ford had a voice in the abortive revolt which took place in March. According to an item from the Chicago Sun-Times noted by Steve Handler and a Faul Harvey News broadcast heard by Roger Giannini, the playing of a recording of Tennessee Ernie Ford singing "Onward Christian Soldiers" was the signal for the nationwide military uprising against President Amin. The recording was played over Radio Uganda when the rebels briefly took over the station, but the revolt in the Frovinces never happened. If you heard this particular broadcast, I'd advise against mentioning it as part of your program details in the reception report...

RON LANCUE (Massachusetts): Satellites ending DXing on shortwave? Hogwash! First, the number of countries capable of launching satellites and/or pooling an orbital transmitter with someone else can be counted on your fingers and toes with enough digits remaining for you to twirl your dials...

Second, international broadcasts from satellites should be more dependable than those via the ionoshpere; thus broadcasters should be content with one or two signals per transmission...and not clutter up the bands with dozens of signals in the hope that a few make it through no matter what. Imagine all the DX now being blocked by the powerhouses which will be able at last to come through!!!



Third, logging the U.S.S.R. or Canada or Germany might once again become a challenge if we wers forced to listen for local stations in those countries, instead of easily picking up their international services. This is mot to mention...as Mr. Hyndman discussed as part of the SOAP BOX for December...



<u>ERANDON LOVETT (Ohio)</u>: I would like to speak for all DXers who use .ower-priced communications receivers by telling the pros who have receivers with hot and cold running water and a beer tap...C'mon, guys, give us a break!

Now we realize that our DX-150A's may not be SFR-4's, but it gets slightly depressing when we hear the more affluent of our great hobby describing our receivers as "okay for a beginners' rig", or, the really depressing one, "I use it as a spare, "junk" receiver...

My DX-150A is my pride and joy, the effort of a lot of saving! When aimlessly tuning images on my overpriced 4.5-12 MHz SW, 1.6-4.5 MHz MB, AM-FM radio, I admired the DX-150A....the impossible dream, I thought...

Finally, however, the day came for that trip to Lima Radio Shack to pick up the last DX-150A on the shelf. At last I could DX the 60-metre band without images getting in the way. I'll be the first to admit that I can't tell the difference between 4960 and 4890 with it...and that the calibration may be a bit off, but I can still DX on it...

Maybe someday I'll be able to fork out enough for a Drake SPR-4...but for now I'm content with my DX-150A. So, DXers with better rigs, I say to you, sure you'll hear Tristan before I will, but have a little bit of consideration for us "poor folk"...

ARJON D'ANGELO (California): In November I logged Radio Ghana and sent a reception report. In February I received a letter from a man in Ghana who wished to be my pen-pal. I promptly returned a letter of my own and in a few days received three of his local newspapers, Following this was still another letter and, later, a third letter and picture postcard. This correspondence and exchange of local newspapers continued. He is a nice pen pal to have and is sincere in his letters. He loves the Voice of America ...and in his local newspaper, I noticed the V.O.A. times and frequencies listed next to the B.B.C. schedules. He stated that he hoped he would be able to have a pen-pal in the U.S. and was extremely happy to find someone who shared his interest...



As a direct result of shortwave listening, I have been able to communicate with an individual thousands of miles away. I never did get my QSL from Hadio Ghana, but I received something a lot more interesting. I never thought that our hobby would serve international relations, so to speak, right here in my own home. I have learned a lot about Ghana and I hope he has learned about our country...



BRUCE GOLDMAN (New York): International Utility Hunters had come up with an excellent abbreviation...the idea of using an asterisk prior to a time for a sign-on and one after for a sign-off. The IUH developed and used this since its foundation...and I was gratified to see it appear in the "Asia-Occania" column...hoping that it will become as popular as 72 or QSL...it is a very simple and easily recognizable aid. I am interested in finding if DXers have found it to be of help, so that other clubs and/or DX columns will use it...

TECHNICAL TOPICS

Wes Mullen has been listening to utility stations on his 3X-190 by deliberatly mistuning the preselector control, and would like to know how to tell what frequency he is tuned to. Receivers, such as the SX-190 or SPR-4, which tune in 500 kHz bands normally have a preselector control to tune the RF Amplifier seperately from the frequency range selector control. If so, the preselector can be tuned to what would normally be the image freq. In a normal, single conversion receiver, the image is a constant amount, twice the IF frequency above the tuned freq. In a double conversion receiver of this type, it's a little more complimented. On the SX-190, 0 on the Kilohertz dial is 5840 kHz above the normal freq., and then the dial tunes down from this freq., instead of adding to the base freq. Thus the 3.5-4 kHz band becomes 9.34 (at 0) to 8.84 (at 500) kHz. The 11.5-12 kHz band becomes 17.34 to 16.84 kHz. In this case, the crystal freq. is being subtracted from the received freq. to form the first IF, instead of subtracting the received freq from the crystal freq. As well as causing the dial to tune backwards, subtracting from the base freq., instead of adding, it also causes the sidebands to be inverted. That is, a station transmitting on USB would be received on ISB. The conversion factors above are for the SX-190 only, and would have to be calculated seperately for other receivers. The preceeding taken from a NASWA publication "ALLIED SX-190 RECEIVER A Consumer's Report" by Ed Shaw.

Wendell Vogel would like to know if it is better to use a wooden support at the end of a long wire antenna or a aluminum pipe or tube. Either can be used, or anything else. You should, of course use a insulator between the antenna and the supporting object. If you are using a tree to hold up one end of your antenna, the antenna end and insulator should be outside the edge of the leafy area. This is to prevent tree limbs burshing against the antenna itself, creating static, or shorting the signal partialy to ground. Also the length of rope from the insulator to the tree trunk should be well away of limbs which might swing around in a wind to knock down the antenna. Of course, if you used a three story steel frame building for a antenna support, you might find some shielding effects in some directions.

Stephan Schilde, W. Germany, would like to know the antenna input impedance or how to measure it, of the Barlow-Wadley, and the effectivity of an outdoor antenna. Well, Stephan, as you said, the input Z is not listed in the service manual, but it would probably be very low, being designed for a very short (compared to wavelength) antenna. The receiver could be measured with a RF Impedance Bridge, but you are not likely to borrow one of these from your next door neighbor. The Barlow Wadley, because it was designed for use with a short antenna, is unusually sensitive, and I don't think you need to worry about the losses you would have connecting a long wire antenna to the B-W. I think even a poorly situated outside antenna such as you describe would help; your problem, if any, will be receiver overload caused by too much signal, not a lack of signal strength.

Neal Kolb (no relation) was written to report on the new Drake R-4C. While intended mainly for the radio amateur, it can bu used for SWLing by adding accesory crystals. The R-4C is a hybrid, using both tubes and transistors. It's main disadvantage is that it does not tune below 1500 kHz, omitting the broadcasting band. Neal is quite happy with it, but has not had a chance to compare it side by side with his SPR-4, which is out for repairs. Neal writes. "The SSB operation with pass band tuning and the notch filter have made it possible to get readable signals from stations that were only an indistinguishable blur of sound in the AM mode. ... the R-4C has the same problem that we experience with the SPR-4 - that is, the tuning shifts several kHz when changing from band to band, but with the built in xtal oscillator which gives a check point every 25 kHz, this is not too much of a problem. The R-4C still does not have as much gain as I would like and the set as received has the really broad (8 kHz) filter on AN ... The preselector peaks rather sharply, and I have found it necessary to peak it almost every time a different station is tuned in. This is not intended as a criticism, but can be considered an asset and 1 find that on occasion detuning the preselector slightly will really clear up a signal." The October issue of "Ham Radio Magazine" has a good article on this receiver, mostly about the passband tuning. One feture I don't like- in the R-4C, as in the SPR-4, Drake has ganged the mode and selectivity controls, so you can't stay in AM and switch to a sharper filter, you have to go to SSB and zero beat the carrier. The R-4B had seperate switches. I will admit this is not essencial-Ialmost tune around in the SSB mode anyway- even though I rewired the SPR-4 to have seperate controls.

The February issue of "CQ" magazine has a very outstanding article on the role of radio communications in New Guinea. It's well worth a trip to your local library. I finally found a world globe I like, the one being offered by the Reader's Digest. It's free-floating in a craddle, rather than being held in a frame by pins through the poles.

A HAPPENINGS X-TRA

The following letter appeared in the DISCUSSIONS section of APRIL EDXC NL. I am reprinting it with mixed feelings. 1rst, it looks like WDXHAY is washed up. Today there are many projects like HAP. But they need world support, which WDXHAY could give. 2nd, changing WDXHAY to a CAMPAIGN is a healthy suggestion. If we all look at WDXHAY as a continuing project, all may turn out even better. Read over the letter, then spend 28c. 18c for an AEROGRAM expressing your thoughts to Harry van Gelder (c/o Radio Nederland, PO Box 222, Hilversum, Holland) then 10c to me (Gene Moser, 6805 Woodland Court, Coloma, MI 49038) telling me how you feel about Harry's suggestion.....gm

"The following will, I hope, clear away some misunderstandings and bring matters into prospective.

- 1) 1974 was not 'proclaimed' World DX Handicapped Aid Year by Harry van Gelder, as some seem to believe, and has been stated in publications.
- 2) In a circular-letter dated November 1973, addressed to DX Federations and Clubs, and to SW stations, it was <u>suggested</u>, on the evidence that some DX clubs in the USA & Europe were concerning themselves with introducing DXing to the handicapped, that DX Clubs worldwide might care to undertake similar projects in their own area.
- In that circular-letter the matter was put forward for discussion, & a ten-point proposal was submitted.
- 4) There has been some positive reaction (not enough by far), and some negative. It is not for a broadcaster to question or criticize the attitude of a DX Organization. Nor can he dictate a course of action. He can only state what he has in mind, and leave it to the people concerned to accept or reject his proposals. But, for the sake of that 'perspective' mentioned above, please permit the following observation.
- 5) Too much emphasis has been laid on the '1974' element. It has been argued that the proposal came too late to do anything about it. But is it right to make activity on behalf of handicapped people dependent on on how much time is available in one particular year? Would it not have been more realistic to regard WDXHAY '74 as a year for getting things underway? It was never intended that the project should be restricted to 1974. And is not preperation an activity in itself?
- 6) It is now being suggested that the WDXHAY be postponed until 1975.
 Once again, this is up to the people concerned. However, 1975 has only twelve months also, andwe have already seen that too much importance is being attached to a point in time. As a counter-suggestion: why not forget about the year altogether and concentrate on a WORLD DX HANDI-CAPPED AID CAMPAIGN. Then 'dating' our activity doesn't matter anymore. It can start anytime and go on indefinitely.
- 7) DX RALLY Seeing only 3 SW stations (R. Canada, R. New Zealand, & R. Sweeden) out of 24 have replied to the November '73 circular-letter, the idea of coupling the DX Rally to WDXHAY will have to be dropped. In fact without the cooperation of a fair number of stations it will not be possible to have a DX Rally at all.
- 8) Radio Nederland will continue to support DX Club initiatives on behalf of the handicapped, and to devote air time to such initiatives. A special QSL-card is being designed, bearing the inscription 'WORLD DX HAND-ICAPPED AID CAMPAIGN' in print and Braille. This may seem premature, & even presumptous (the matter still being "sub judice") but it is in fact a tribute to those DXers on both sides of the Atlantic who inspired the WDXHAY idea by their efforts in the interests of the handicapped. It is also hoped that it will, in turn, inspire further action"

BRAZIL BEGINS TESTING NEW TRANSMITTER

There can be little doubt that Radio Nacional de Brasília has begun testing its new transmitters as many DXers report hearing test broadcasts this month. The only problem seems to be where to find them as the broadcasts, which consist of continuous music and announcements describing the transmitter and antenna, have been noted on 11780, 11820, 15245, and 15385 kilohertz. Look for the International Service, no longer noted on 15445 kilohertz, on one of these frecuencies soon.

RADIO CLARÍN - NEW DOMINICAN POWERHOUSE

That strong signal now dominating 4850 kilohertz is, for those of you who haven't yet noticed, station HIRL, Radio Clarin. Located near Santo Domingo in the Dominican Republic, this station was first noted testing in late April and began regular programming on April 25 th. In addition to 4850 kilohertz where it lists 3 kw of power, this new Dominican also lists 50 kw on 11700 kilohertz. To date, however, HIRL has not been noted on this latter frequency.

Programming is parallel the medium wave outlet of 860 kiloherts with a mixture of music, news, commentary and sports. IDs and commercials are numerous and there is frequent use of slogans such as "Radio Clarín, la emisora más potente de la Republica Dominicana". Politically, HIRL is pro-government and in the days before the Dominican elections, which were held on the 16th of May, the obviously pro-Balaguer feature, "Revolución en Marcha", could be heard nightly at 0100 GMT. At 0200 GMT there is a half hour summary of world, national, and local news called "Clarín Informativo". This newscast is sponsered by Monte Carlo.

A full identification announcement is presented every thirty minutes. This lengthy message is read by two men and a woman and advises that Radio Clarin broadcasts "para que el mundo conozca un país que se proyecta."

NO END TO TROUBLE FOR CHILEAN BROADCASTERS

From the weekly newsletter LATIN AMERICA comes word that Radio Presidente Balmaceda was shut down for a week in late April after the ruling military Junta protested against a series of commentaries by the Christian Democrat ideologue Jaime Castillo Velasco. As the gap between the junta and the Christian Democrats continues to widen, Radio Balmaceda, which was given to the Christian Democrats for 40 years by the Allende government, is likely to play an increasing role in politics once again. It is no wonder LATIN AMERICA notes Radio Balmaceda is "unlikely to remain independent much longer."

DITTO FOR BRAZILIAN BROADCASTERS

The closing of Brazilian radio stations continues, reports Bob Veltmeijer from São Paulo. Quoting an article headlined "Three more stations say goodby to their listeners", Bob relays the word that Radio Emissoras Piratininga (1200, 6025, and 11745 khz), Radio Rio Preto (640),

and Rádio Jornal de Baurú (1270 and 3305) have all lost their licenses through a legal procedure that leaves little chance for appeal. Though still being heard as of this writing, these stations will likely depart the airwaves as soon as formal notification procedures are completed.

These new closings follow closely on the heels of three similiar closings several months ago. These stations, including Rádio 9 de Julho, remain temporarily on the air by virtue of a court order that was issued pending a final decision by the Court of Appeals. The Government, however, seems determined to silence its opposition and I, like LATIN AMERICA above, don't expect any of these broadcasters to be around for long.

AND SO TO THE LOGGINGS ...

Well, I'd best get to the loggings before I squeeze them all out with my long winded prose. But, I might ask if you got last month's refran. Very applicable to DXing I believe is "The best sauce is the hunger". Think about it. OK? And, while you are at it remember that all times are GMT, all dates are in the month/day format, and reception conditions are reported using the SIO code.

The Feature Section of SPEEDX

Exactly who's responsible for coining the phrase "power game" isn't known to me, but at the 1973 DX Parliment (the annual meeting of the Swedish Riksforbundet DX Alliasen) at lindesberg, it became common DX Jargon. Misused at best, the "power game" means to refer to the continual increase in transmitter output power by international shortwave broadcasters. The following article attempts to deal with this problem as it applies to international broadcasting, with emphasis on Europe.



In Europe, concentration of transmitter power far exceeds that of any other region of the world. It is the area where frequency congestion, interference, and output power are the greatest. It's where the "power game" is most heavily contested.

What are the rules of the "power game?" For most international broadcasters, the first rule is simple enough: Provide a good signal into your target area. Something that in practice is far more difficult to achieve than on paper. The stations need equipment and transmitters and antennas to put their game plan into motion. Rule number two: Be prepared to invest large sums of money mainly for the construction of sophisticated antenna farms and transmitting facilities. Money then is the ticket into the game.

In order for broadcasters to achieve their primary goal (to be heard in a specific target area), they have (out of necessity) been forced to take some steps toward coodination of their frequencies and broadcast schedules.

In this respect, the International Frequency Registration Board (abbr. IFRB), a subdivision of the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) coordinates transmitting schedules (both planned and actual) of broadcasters belonging to the ITU, and only member countries of the United-Nations belong to the ITU. The work of the IFRB is far from all-encomp-

assing. Not all of the earth's political systems are members of the UN, so, likewise, they are not members of the ITU (and IFRB). Their broadcasting schedules are not considered by the IFRB.

The IFRB publishes a white book of intended and actual frequency usage four times a year, corresponding to seasonal changes (March, May, September, and November). A major drawback here is that frequency users have to preregister their intended frequencies with the IFRB four months in advance of the start of the broadcast season. So for one thing, the planning of frequencies is compounded by this element.

Aside of coordination of frequencies and schedules through the IFRB, many international broadcasters send their frequency managers to small gatherings where they meet headon and bargin for frequencies, and at the same time, settling conflicting frequency schedules. So, tough frequency bargaining is a major tactic of the "power game".

It takes at least two to play the "power game," the broadcaster and the listener. The problem is simple enough: there are about three times too many transmissions on the air than the bands can handle there is abundent co-channel and adjacent channel interference the signals are not getting through to the listeners. These are the problems and dilemmas facing today's international broadcaster.

Despite this, the listener is the most important element. He is, after all, what international broadcasting (or broadcasting of any form) is all about. And he can, perhaps run the winning play by tolerating present day conditions, while efforts are made to curb entrants into the "power game."

Iet's consider some points which go a long way towards solving the puzzle of the "power game". First, it must be clear to listeners that broadcasters too, are faced with the dilemma. There are two distinct sides to this

"game," and these should be recognized by both. The "power game," as it has been so inaccurately dubbed, is far from a game. It's no fun for broadcasters to spend millions of dollars each year to "barely" be heard, or heard with marginal signals. It's no pleasure, on the other hand, for listeners to have to try and listen to have to try and listen to it all. So one thing we might as well realize now, is that we are all one the same playing field.

International broadcasting is often a political device. Broadcasting is often a tool of a larger political juggernaut, of which we are all a part. With this in mind, we can perhaps look at the consideration to be heard with a more realistic approach. Power increases are mostly out of this necessity, and are not uncontrolled, malicious and thoughtless, as seems to be felt by some. In Europe, the power crisis (not the energy varirty)

is clearly evident. The most involved broadcasters are not difficult to spot. (See chart: information from "Weltweit Horen"-WM-)

What can be done? What can we, as listeners do? We can be tolerant. Try to work with established groups and bodies, and with international broadcasters. Committees such as EDXC Frequency Registration Committee and ANARC'S Frequency Recommendations Committee deserves un-yielding support from all of us, but in particular from those listeners equipped to assist.

Listeners everywhere can begin to improve their reception reports to stations, by giving a bit more technical information than merely date, time and frequency. Make every effort to give the station's technical department a real chance to use your reception information. Perhaps, most important, listeners must refrain from antagonizing international broadcasters with such phrases as "the power game" and "frequency pirating," That's no gain. It's a 15-yard loss.

Tolerance, cooperation, and reason. That's the only possible remedy to the power crisis. There are no winners and losers. There are only winners or losers. We either all win, or we all lose. Shortwave broadcasting knows no political or geographic borders. So if we collectively let the crisis continue without tolerance, cooperation or reason by all sides than we must all collectively be carried off the field.


