

IMPORTANT NOTICE

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS to fill three (3) positions on the Board of Directors.

DEADLINE-Nominations must be received before midnight, 15 June.

Accompanying this notice is a current list of all who qualify as Full Members of SPEEDX. A supplemental list will appear in the May and June SPEEDX to bring the list up-to date.

If your name appears on these lists, you are eligible to submit nominations (one or more), or to be nominated (you may nominate yourself).

Mail your signed letter or post card, specifying the name of those you choose to nominate, directly to Jim Whitehead, Chairman, 177 Pine Ridge Rd, Reading, Mass. 01867. Deadline for receipt is midnight, 15 June.

No member who is serving in any official administrative capacity in any other similar hobby group may be elected to, or serve upon, the SPEEDX Board of Directors.

Two present members of the Board (Jim Whitehead and Steve d'Adolf) were elected to serve 4-year terms; they each have two remaining years to serve. No nominations should be made of either, at this time.

Only the three (3) remaining positions are now expiring, and your nominations are for those three positions.

Following the 15 June deadline, the list of valid nominees will be prepared and published in the July issue of SPEEDX.

The July and August issues will reserve space to present brief statements from the nominees (not to exceed 200 words each).

In the September SPEEDX there will appear an official ballot form, together with an up-dated list of all those eligible to vote (Full Members) and a complete list of the nominees. If a nominee declines, or withdraws by written notice-his name will be eliminated from the final list.

DX REDI-LOG

Here is one way to 'remember' when that favorite station is on, or when a wanted station might be heard. It's a redi-log to enable you to have all the needed information on hand for easy reference. No more thumbing through stacks of schedules, DX bulletins, etc., every time you turn on your rig.

I used regular ruled notebook paper divided in half with stations that are heard on one side and those I would like to hear on the other. You can get two hours on each sheet very nicely. Use pencil to make your entries as you will want to make changes to keep it up to date. The information is gathered the first time from schedules, DX bulletins, WRTH, friends tips, DX programs, or what ever. Once the log is prepared, you have all the info at your fingertips. The time you would have spent looking through a bunch of material can now be spent DXing.



This discussion of communications receivers is continued from last month.

Perry Ferrell has sent a few corrections to last months column, but none that change my conclusions. The price of \$380 for the medium priced sets applies to the SE-313 only. (Local store price-\$360 factory mail order.) The XCR-30 should be up to \$290.00 by the time you read this. The SW-4A does cover the broadcast band. The DSR-1 has been replaced by the DSR-2 at \$2700 (Sigh). The National HRO-600 has mostly replaced the HRO-500.

Perry points out my estimate of the number of SWLs is somewhat off, since Gilfer Associates services 20,000 SWLs each year. Wow, that's a lot of catalogs. I still feel a member of a club is more likely to get excited about a new receiver on the market, particularly if it's only slightly better than his present one, than someone who is not in a club, or otherwise in close contact with a large number of other SWLs.

Perry has talked to a number of manufacturers, trying to get more receivers available. He indicates they require a guarantee of 2000-2500 sold the first year (for a \$150 receiver) before they will do anything. My estimated startup costs were \$50,000-75,000 low, and I didn't mention advertising costs, and retail store markup.

In light of everything I've mentioned, I believe new receiver designs will be few and far between. We just are not that big a market. For comparison, look at the CB market. It is growing by, I believe, 2 million licenses a year. They have attracted many, many manufacturers, with every possible combination of features. Yet, even there, they have had a large number of manf. fold, although not for the same reasons as in the SWL equipment field. A radio must first of all fit the needs of a large number of users. Notice that when Radio Shack had to decide whether to devote a foot of shelf space to the SX-190, or to a CB radio, the CB set won. Numbers!

You don't have to buy your radio new! Most issues of most club bulletins have at least one receiver ad, usually at a fair price. There's no problem finding used receivers in a city the size of San Diego. There are still a few Ham equipment houses that take trade-ins, and then sell these "reconditioned." There is a publication, the "Ham Trader", which is a monthly list of ads for most any kind of equipment, almost all from private parties. The one requirement in buying used, and new also, is to be able to operate a receiver for a short time, and tell whether it's performance is suitable for it's class. A good way to develop this ability is to visit other SWLs and try their equipment. Again, this is usually easier for those near big cities. As an example of bargains, I bought a HQ-180 for under \$200 while the last ones were selling for \$579, and it was in good condition. For the ultimate in used gear, there's military surplus. While usually large, and ugly, most offers outstanding performance. The surplus market has recently been flooded with R-392's; these are a jeep version of the R-390, and are selling anywhere between \$125 and \$200. These require a 28 Volt DC supply- if you can handle that, it's a very nice receiver.

Prices have gone so high that a couple of Ham equipment manf. have had to go to direct sales from the factory, dropping prices a third. This practice may spread in the next few years, and eventually affect SWL sales practices. I don't mean to start rumors or advise anyone not to buy now, because it may never happen, and with the current rate of inflation, prices may be lower now than after such an action in a couple of years, but think how nice it would be if Drake dropped prices 30 or 40 %. Incidentally, don't bother complaining about price hikes. The manf. are in the same shape as the rest of us. They are entitled to a fair return for their work, and if they can't get it, there will be one less product for us to choose from.

There are many ways your existing equipment can be improved or added to for those with some technical knowledge. There is also much room for someone who would like to make money serving your fellow SWL. Crystal calabrators, Q Multipliers, Audio filters, Custom receiver modifications, Presselectors, Receiving frequency counters; the possibilities are endless. This is where I see the real lack, not in the number of receiver manufacturers.



Saludos amigos. Gee whiz, it's April already! So much for another DX period. That Daylight Savings Time sure did sneak up on me. How about you? Guess what? Radio Seis is still Radio Seis. How about that? Judging from the loggings things were just about as exciting last month although a few interesting Peruvians were reported. I would also call your attention to Eduardo Rodriguez's logging of the new Brazilian, Radio Brasil Oporto, noted around dusk ECNA on 4837v.

I might also note that things have gotten a bit confusing on the frequency of 4750 khz. and all are urged to get a positive ID before you jump to any conclusions. The Ecuadorian there is not, as many have erroneously concluded, Radio El Mundo but rather is our old friend Radio Centinela del Sur ex 5020 khz. To make matters worse, the Dominican, HIFE, is also active and is being noted on this same freq. at dusk and dawn.

TGWB, ex La Voz de Guatemala, now Radio Nacional is not, as many have pointed out, a new station as reported in SPEEDXGRAM but rather is merely a name change. It is interesting to note that this corresponds to a change in top management as part of an overall government reshuffle and may be but a harbinger of more to come.

Zamora, or Rome if you prefer, was not won (or built) in a day is the translation of last month's Refrán. In other words, have patience, a quality very necessary to become a first class DXer. Speaking of DX, I'd better get to the loggings. Remember, all times are GMT, dates are in the month/day format, and reception conditions are reported in the SIO code.

On page five of this section you will note that Lloyd Scott received a QSL from the FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION. Below is a story of how it arrived.

DXING THE UNTOUCHABLES, BY LLOYD A. SCOTT, JR.

Last summer while dxing some RTTY channels in the six mhz band I ran across a RY marker being transmitted by KGE22. I could not find any listing for this station. This prompted me to call my local friendly FCC office. They could not tell me for sure who was supposed to operate KGE22, and suggested I call the Washington Office, as they could advise the owner of the station. By now I was curious to know who operated the station, and decided to invest in a long distance phone call. The Washinton FCC office was more concerned in asking me questions to ascertain if this station was posing any interference problem, than in answering my question. By now I was really curious, and wrote Steve Handler. A nice prompt reply from Steve told me the FBI in Washington was supposed to operate the station. I sent the usual reception report with one of my multi-colored postcards enclosed. (Registered).

A week or so later the registered receipt arrived, but no QSL. Then in January while going through my "No Results" file I again noticed the KGE22 report had not brought me a reply. This required immediate action as I felt this was a good catch, in fact too good to let slip by. This time I wrote the Director personally with the follow-up, with a copy of the first report enclosed. As a courtesy I enclosed some air mail stamps for the reply. This brought immediate action as swift as lightning. I received a personal FUZZ QSL in the form of a long distance phone call from the FBI office in Washington, at 8AM on January 29, 1975. I was asked all sorts of questions (I was carefull not to mention Steve Handlers name since he told me who the secret call letters belonged to) again if the station posed an interference problem, and I was advised that the station was a government operation and they were not too generous with QSL's. However after chatting with the friendly agent for some ten minutes he said "Mr. Scott we will take your report and mark it telephonically confirmed today". To summarize it appears the FBI is in the same boat with other PTP broadcasters, they just do not have the staff to get out QSLs. But there is a brighter side to the picture, another FIRST FOR SPEEDX, now Lloyd A. Scott, Jr #0775 may just be on Eliot Ness's Top Ten.

I thank Lloyd for his article. If any of you have had other unusual QSL's please drop this section a line.





RELAY STATIONS: A PERPETUAL FEAR

The assassination February 11, 1975 of Malagasy's newly-elected president Richard Ratsimandrava and the six days of martial law which followed refreshes in my mind, a fear that all international broadcasters must share for their overseas relay stations. The perfect example here is the relationship between Radio Nederland Wereldomroep in Hilversum and its relay station at Talata, Malagasy Republic (built in 1971).

The fear that international broadcasters share is that a change in government in a particular host nation may mean a change in the policy of that government to allow foreign broadcasters to transmit from its soil. Examples of foreign broadcasters using another country's territory for broadcasting purposes can be found in Malta, Portugal, Federal Republic of Germany, Swaziland, The Philippines, and so on.

Except where a direct facility trade-out is made between two countries and broadcast organizations (i.e. Radio Canada and Deutsche Welle), investments of several millions of dollars are made to plan, design, construct and operate a relay station. In time when outbacks by international broadcasters is in vogue, are such relatively "high risk" investments warranted or even wise?

At the 1973 International Radio and Television Exhibition in Berlin, a seminar sponsored by the Assoziation Deutschsprachige DXer (ADDX) attempted to touch on that very question. The heart of the question was: at which point does the international broadcaster reach a "return on investment"? It is a question that would surely bring several different answers (if you'd get an answer at all). But in Berlin, Deutsche Welle's Georg Thiele did provide an answer. He indicated the return on investment time for DW is 7 years. If a relay station operates for 7 years, then it has to be considered successful. If it operates longer than that, it's gravy. Less than 7 years, a loss.

In 1971, Radio Nederland built its relay station in Malagasy after surveying several "friendly" countries in southeast Africa--RN's director general himself paying personal visits to those countries. And despite the excellent groundwork laid for the station by diplomats and engineers, it can all be for naught by a change in government. It is a risk that many international broadcasters feel is necessary in order to reach the international audience.

THE VOICE OF FREEDOM HOW RUSSIA GETS THE NEWS: RADIO LIBERTY

If there is one thing Americans are taking for granted---especially during the visit by former President Nixon--it is the extensive--indeed at times overwhelming--coverage of the event by press and television.

Presumably even Soviet citizens were widely informed of the circumstances and ceremonials of the visit. For most of them, it would have been an astonishing experience. Since the free flow of information is nonexistent in the Soviet Union, its citizenry depend for what little news they can get about the outside world on Western radio broadcasts beamed to the East--principally those of American-financed Radio Liberty.

In fact, if it weren't for Radio Liberty's broadcasts, the greater part of the Soviet people would not be able to learn of, let alone hear, the latest privately circulated writings of Soviet dissidents, the "samizdat," which is a curious irony since these do happen to originate in the USSR.

Other radio stations also broadcast, in Russian, to the Soviet Union--the Voice of America, in Washington, DC, Deutsche Welle, in West Germany and the BBC. But Radio Liberty is definitely the most powerful, the most listened to and the most influential. It is also then, and obviously, the most jammed by the Soviets. Indeed, they spend more rubles to jam Radio Liberty than we spend to operate it.

Financed for the last three years by Congressional appropriation, Radio Liberty, as well as Radio Free Europe, previously had been covertly subsidized by the CIA. And now it is in financial difficulty.

The administrative headquarters of Radio Liberty and its president, Howland S. Sargeant, are in New York City. The same building also houses the radio's US division, headed by Robert Tuck, which reports US news and related subjects, such as the developments of detente.

Radio Liberty is staffed by natives of the USSR who were able to escape Communist domination, so it is in a good position to evaluate what those who must remain behind the Iron Curtain would like to learn about.

Its broadcasts, scripts for which are written in NY, Munich and other world capitals, are in the East Slavic languages--Russian, Ukrainian and Bylorussian--nine Turkish dialects and two Iranian. Broadcasts in five North Caucasian languages are being phased out because of inadequate financial support.

In fact, Radio Liberty is chronically hobbled by fiscal distress, the strinking value of the dollar in Europe and Congressional budget-cutting. All this results in pared-down programming, furloughed personnel and sinking morale.

Recently, the Institute for the Study of the USSR, in Munich, which was part of Radio Liberty, was closed down, too, because of lack of funds. Meanwhile, its Soviet equivalent, Yuri Arbatov's Institute for the Study of the USA enjoys unlimited Soviet governmental financing.

Since Radio Liberty first went on the air in March, 1953, five days prior to Stalin's death, the Soviet government has ceaselessly tried to silence it. Diplomatic notes, attempts to infiltrate the radio with agents, and sharp attacks in the Soviet central press continue to this day--seemingly abetted at times by members of the US Senate, who view the station's effort as a remnant of the Cold War.

Major attention is devoted to Soviet domestic affairs, providing the listeners with news withheld or distorted by their own media. At the same time, documented analytical interpretations are presented in order to help listeners better understand developments and trends within their own country.

As Alexander Solzhenitsyn commented in an interview published in the US on April 2, 1972, "If we ever hear anything about events in this country (USSR), it's through them (Radio Liberty broadcasts)."

Transmitters that beam the programs are located in Spain, in West Germany and in Taiwan (about to be closed down for lack of funds), and are powerful enough to cut through most jamming.

"It seems that reception is better outside the big cities, so many Soviet listeners go to the outskirts on weekends to hear the broadcasts," reports Francis Ronalds, Jr., Radio Liberty's boss in Munich, "so we switched some of our more prominent programs to Saturdays and Sundays."

The Soviet government has time and again accused Radio Liberty of distortions and provocations--an improbability since the radio's self-imposed rules restrain it from belligerent language, blatant propaganda, petty attacks or derogatory statements. It does condemn specific instances of the violation of human rights.

True to the motto affixed to a plaque on the front door of its Munich offices--"Everyone has the right to seek, receive and impart information and ideas through any media regardless of frontiers"--Radio Liberty manages to obtain "samizdat" texts and shares them with its avid listeners.

Some ways in which these texts reach the radio are devious. Most often, they are brought out from the USSR by people who were able to defect. At other times, they find their way to the West with returning foreign tourists. The wealth of material is sorted out and decisions are made as to the time and date best suited to the broadcast.

"Audience reaction which can be judged by the numerous letters we receive, is enthusiastic." Ronalds said.

Forbidden music like the forbidden fruit, is also on the most-wanted list in the Soviet Union. Thus the station plays various tapes that are being smuggled out. The so called "magnitizdat" tapes by Alexandr Galich, Vladimir Visotski, Kim, Noshkin and many others--all poets who sing their own anti-government compositions--are not only listened to but, invariably, find their way into the listeners' tape recorders, as does much taboo Western music.

Numerous programs have been devoted to petitions and appeals by individuals and groups, including Soviet Jews, demanding the right to emigrate. By broadcasting such documents, and reporting the reaction of American and Western opinion, Radio Liberty encourages the aspirations of those still inside the Soviet Union.

BROADCASTING IN INDIA

Organized broadcasting in India was started by a private concern, the Indian Broadcasting Company at Bombay and Calcutta in 1927. This venture, however, went into liquidation in 1930. Radio dealers and radio owners urged the government to take some action and the government of India agreed to run radio stations as an experimental measure for a short time. In 1932, the government of India decided to continue broadcasting under the control of the Department of Industries and Labour. In March 1935, the broadcasting organization was constituted into a separate department under the Department of Industries and Labour on June 3, 1936. All India Radio replaced the earlier designation of the Indian Station Broadcasting Service. The second World War spurred broadcasting in India which by 1940, had nine stations. At the partition of India in 1947, AIR was left with six stations at Delhi, Bombay, Calcutta, Madras, Lucknow and Tiruchirapalli.

The broadcasting system in India differs from most of the broadcasting systems of the world in one important respect. AIR broadcasts its home programs in a larger number of languages than in their foreign service. There are 14 major languages mentioned in the India constitution.

The external service division continues to broadcast news bulletins in more than 20 languages. This service works almost all day. The chief aim of these broadcasts is to relate India's point of view on current events in the domestic as well as the international field, to stimulate interest in our art and culture and to inform the outside world of new developments and changing conditions in India. Programs are broadcast in more than 17 languages for listeners in Asia, Australia, New Zealand and Europe. Now AIR broadcasts to Africa also. AIR now wish to have comments from listeners overseas about starting DX programs in the General Overseas Service.

ISRAEL RADIO

On a narrow street in Jerusalem is the main studio for the overseas service of the Israel Broadcasting Authority. The street is Helene Hamalka street. I have been a listener of IBA for about a year now.

IBA isn't a very well known station at the moment on the air but they are gaining more popularity everyday among DX'ers. This is due to their recent increase in their transmitter output and a more efficient antenna system.

Israel radio broadcasts in thirteen languages a day. These languages can be found in the 1975 WRTVH. Israel radio operates various transmitters for their many different language transmissions. The most powerful ones being two 300 kw transmitters for their transmissions to the Soviet Union. I listen to their 2000 GMT transmission for Europe and Africa almost everyday. Their programs consist of News, Jerusalem Calling--a daily newsreel, and a daily magazine program. This particular English transmission is fifty five minutes in length. In their Saturday afternoon transmission they have a program where they read listeners' letters. During this program they also have a brief DX program.

If you have never heard IBA before here is how you can easily recognize them. Their interval signal consists of trumpets and drums being played in succession. All of their English language transmissions begin with, "This is Israel broadcasting from Jerusalem." Full information on all IBA transmissions can be obtained from the WRTVH. Or you can hear all this information broadcasted every Thursday afternoon on the 2000 GMT English transmission for the United Kingdom.

The Israel broadcasting authority will be happy to verify all correct reception reports with their station QSL card. They also send out a current program schedule free upon request. Their address is Israel Radio, Overseas Service, Jerusalem, Israel.

A GERMAN VIEW OF DEUTSCHE WELLE

"It would be madness to stop DW's English transmission to North America," said Mr. Gerald Huebner, spokesman of Deutsche Welle. The rumour that DW plans to stop the English service was caused by a speech made by Mr. Walter Steigner who is the director of DW. He made this speech at a Deutsche Welle committee meeting.

The directors of Deutsche Welle plan to stop the English service to save money. After all, they say, the BBC broadcasts to North America a more comprehensive English service and this group also said that only a very small group of listeners listen to the English service of DW. These arguments have created a big discussion in the German press and Parliament. It is possible that a special session of the "Deutscher Bundestag" will be convened because Radio Berlin International still broadcasts to America in English regularly and this is an important fact in German politics.

Radio Deutsche Welle is ordered by a special broadcasting law to transmit a detailed picture of the political, cultural and industrial life of Germany. This order causes much political tension with states or nations with no freedom of the press. Recently, Deutsche Welle was forced to stop their program in the Ethiopian language "Amharic" because DW gets a lot of threatening letters. The senders of these letters threaten to kill Germans in Ethiopia. Mr. Steigner travelled to Ethiopia to clarify the situation but he did not succeed.

In February there was a meeting of the Deutsche Welle editorial staff. In this meeting they discussed the present situation and are now planning to make changes in their policies.

This article has been composed by several articles that appeared in the Rheinische Post of Duesseldorf, Federal Republic of Germany in February 1975.

This month the spring DX season is in full swing so keep a look out for frequency and program changes. I would also like to mention that the quality of articles sent to me have been quite good and I do hope that you will all continue to send me articles at this sufficient rate. 
