ANARC CONVENTION

Montreal has been chosen for the 1975 ANARC Convention. August 22, 23 & 24, co-sponsored by SWL International and Radio Canada International. Full particulars will be published by SPEEDX when received from Marc Champagne of SWLI and or RCI.

RADIO CANADA INTERNATIONAL

RCI announces that many listeners are confused with the CBC Northern Service, and the Armed Forces Service with Radio Canada International transmission service. RCI will verify it's own transmissions only. All reception reports for the other services should be directed to the service in question. The mailing address for both is the same as Radio Canada International.

RCI also announces their change over to a new OSL card. The new card will not have the time, date, and frequency of the transmission being verified. Reception reports however must contain all information as in the past, program details will be very important.

DX CONTEST

Radio RSA is offering another contest for DXers. Listeners must correctly verify one transmission of either Radio RSA or SABC in each of the shortwave bands in use during the May to September season. That is either a RSA or SABC transmission in each band from 120 meters to 11 meters (if all bands are being used during this period). First 40 qualifiers will receive a book on DXing by Gerry Wood, DX editor for Radio RSA. All other qualifiers will receive a book before a booklet on foreign language reception reporting. MY BBC DEBUT (er "Robert Burns Was My English Language Tutor"): I could have been in Mozambique preparing a study on the mating habits of the Zambezi River shrimp...but I wasn't. I could have been in Munich outlining a proposal for a rotatable laboratory for conducting revolutionary experiments...but I wasn't. I could have been in London's Heathrow Airport submitting to a BBC home service interview about the Glasgow Air Shuttle controversy..... and I was. 

YOU'RE NOT LIKELY TO HEAR IT ON THE VOICE OF AMERICA, BUT ... it's built of beer cans and soda cans and it is hoped it will lead to a dent in the national housing shortage. Now that the first "can" house is completed the New Mexico architect responsible for this structure has initiated construction on another with his patented "building block" the size of a six-pack. According to Newsday his plans for a third "can" house has drawn an experimental nod from HUD indicating that it may be a sober idea. The architect's first client has settled into his cylindrical home, shaped somewhat like one of the 75,000 steel cans from which it is made. Of course, this method also creates an incentive to clear the roadside of litter while gathering an inexpensive building material. Each building block consists of eight 12-ounce-size steel cans, baled together with wire. Four stand upright. CHANGES IN CHAD: The assassination of President Tombalbaye and the military take-over of government that followed recently in Chad may have had a presumably temporativeffect on the radio programming emanating from Nd jamena. The tri-lingual format fluxuated for a while and some of the normal 2130 GMT sign-offs varied. On 15 April the transmission on 4904.5 KHz featured speeches by the new head of the central African state, General Maloum, and liberal domes of brass band music.... all extending the schedule to an 0100 GMT termination. Since then, however, transmission times, if not programs, seem to have returned to normal....so regular Saturday only extensions would

regular Saturday only extensions would run ip to 2300 hrs GMT.

MUTED VOICE?: If a recent Newsweek story is correct. one unexpected result of detente is a change in tone at the Voice of America. According to the article, instead of reporting on opposition astir within Communist countries. VOA executives are now trying to avoid "provocative" stories. In the process, it is reported, they have restricted their correspondents to the point where many VOA newsmen feel that legitimate stories are being suppressed. The VOA's stated mission is to report on the United States and American foreign policy and to "combat communism". In practice, it has wobbled between its dual roles as government propagandist and conveyor of straight news, so that clipping states. Apparently, many experienced journalists at the VOA are bitterly disappointed and feel the executives have allowed political considerations to mute the "Voice". A written order stiffening a 1967 rule that correspondents must obtain advance approval from local American embassies before the undertaking of a story, which some feel gives the embassies new power to censor Voice stories...also because the VOA has always been a lifeline for dissidents in Communist countries, many apparently now feel let down ...



TWO GGLDEN RADIO ANNIVERSARIES COMMEMORATED: On March 20th the postal agencies of nations; a globe apart released commemorative philatelic issues honoring Fifty Years of Broadcasting in their respective countries. Japan chose to pay homage with a 20-Yen value depicting the images of "kan"...for seeing ... and of "mon"...for hearing. Denmark honors radio through 90-ore stamp showing an older radio receiver. The first radio broadcast in Denmark actually was arranged in October of 1922 by a newly established radio club and sent out over a small transmitter in Copenhagen. Up to that time, "radiots", as radio amateurs were jokingly called, could listen only to foreign stations. The Danish Government took over broadcasting of April 1,1925.



For example, one of our editors was treated to a report on a logging of the Voice of "CHILI"...probably heard while eating a bowl of "Chile"...and yet another report listed program content as including "MARSHALL" music ...from a station located in the "Martial" Islands, no doubt...

Here we go again, answering your questions, so send them in.

Mark Bixby would like to know about changing the crystal in his xtal calabrator in order to get markers at 1 MHz, 500, 50, 10, 5, and 1 KHz. This could be done to get freqs higher than 100 KHz, but crystals become difficult to manufacture (and very expensive) below 100 KHz. The answer is to build, or buy, a calabrator which starts with a 1 MHz crystal and divides it down using integrated circuits. Palomar Engineers, Box 455, Escondido, CA 92025 sell one for \$32.50, which has outputs of 100, 50, 25, 10, or 5 KHz. A few other small companies also sell these.

Gary Froemming writes he has logged 32 countries with a DX-150 and a 65 ft. Dipole. He is having trouble finding new stations, and wonders if he has reached the limits of his receiver. Looking through the Sept 74 NASWA Scoreboard, I found the following people using DX-150's: David Ball, Canada, 102 countries heard, David Coursey, Texas, 80 C/H, and Mark Brown, Ohio, 58 C/H. A better receiver is always a convenience in DXing, but it's not a replacement for knowing how to get the best out of a receiver, knowing where and when to listen, knowing exactly what it is you are hearing, and having just plain patience to keep trying, night after night, until conditions are right for the rare one to be heard.

Michael Fleming would like to know about the different types of jamming. In my years of listening, there have only been a few times I thought I was hearing jamming. When I told Don Johnson that, he immediately dialed up a horrible buzzing sound on top of R. Liberty. The Navy Radioman's manual spoke of bells, whistles, sirens, and diesel engine sounds, There is a buzz or carrier with a two letter CW ID heard often in the SWBC bands, as if it were a beacon transmission. These have a habit of sitting on R. Liberty, or RFE freqs. Glen Hausser reported a couple of these in the April FRENDX, "FB" on 15240 at 1825, and "BR" on 15370 at 1613 (R. Liberty). Perhaps some of you readers can add more info on this.

S. Peter Neumann reports "Fair Radio Sales", Box 1105, Lima, Ohio 45802 has a catalog free for the asking, listing HRO receivers, R-388's and R-390's, direction finders, headsets, ect. Serge also tells of a recent comparison of a Drake R-4B receiver with a 1955 RCA AR-88DM, in which the RCA outperformed the Drake in both sensitivity and selectivity. Maybe so, but I think I'll keep my Drake. The big difference between modern and the older recievers is in strong signal handling, the absence of cross-mod and intermod from nearby signals. The Drake recievers may have rotten audio quality, as everyone keeps telling me, but I don't get the cross-mod I do from the SX-190, even with a preamp in front of the Drake.

Ronald G. Spangler writes in with a "S" meter problem in his DX-160; with the RF gain half way up, R. Moscow and others come in greater than S9/30 db. With the RF gain up full, the meter is always pegged. The readings on a "S" meter are meaningless by themselves; they can only indicate the relative differences between stations, on the more expensive receivers, S9 may be set to equal a 50 or 100 microvolt input signal, but this still does not give you the field strength of the transmitting station. Also, the "S" meter is not reading the strength of a single station, but of all signals in the bandpass of the receiver. That includes the stations under the desired one, the hets nearby, and perhaps even the VoA 5 kHz away. Keeping this in mind, it doesn't matter what number we get on the "S" meter so long as it's useful and can be compared to other stations. A meter reading of S9 plus 60 db for all stations is not useful, and should be corrected. This can be done by changing the value of R24, a 3.3 kohm resistor, either by replacing it on the PC board with a larger value, or by inserting another resistor in series with one of the two wires going to the meter. This will have to be determined by trial and error, but a good starting point would be changing to 4.7 or 6.8 kilohm (2.2 or 3.3 Kohms in series at the meter). This approach will not work in all receivers, as some develop their meter current in other ways. Adjust the value of the resistor up or down until the strongest station you can find still doesn't peg the meter. Instead of trying several different values, you can put in a 10 Kohm potentiometer.

HANDICAPPED AID PROGRAM - UNITED KINGDOM

Ted Hindle

When I was asked to take ever HAP activities in the U.K. and Ireland last year there was only one other member besides myself. The HAP membership in the U.K. and Northern Ireland today is over 20, plus three associate members whe help us with technical assistance, and fund raising etc. I am presently receiving 2 er 3 applications for HAP membership each menth. I have publicised HAP in various magazines which are distributed amongst disabled people. Several shertwave radio stations have alse given out details of HAP activities in the U.K. and these include Radio Sweden, Radio Canada International, and Radio Australia. Radio Nederland gave a mention to HAP-UK on its DX Juke Box programme of January 16, 1975. I have been unsuccessful in getting any assistance from the BBC world Radio Club, the world DX Club, and the International Short wave Club, so far, but I will continue to try and get their help.

I have received one or two small denations from the public, and two receivers have been denated to us and which are being loaned to our members.

I think because of the fact that the Radio Amateur Invalid and Bedfast Club (RAIBC) has been in existence for several years, and their aims are similar to those of HAP (except thatthey help disabled hams as well as SWLs) has hindered HAP. Also, the fact that disabled people get assistance from the social services and welfare departments, could have had some effect on HAP in the U.K.

Some menths age we started to produce a newsletter which is distributed to our members free of charge. All members are encouraged to contribute to it. I appointed John Rose as my Vice Chairman a few weeks age. John also edits the newsletter.

I am running a raffle to raise funds for HAP at present, and the draw took place on January 27. In the coming year I hope to run a concert to raise funds as well. I am its negotiating with a firm to produce kits that will enable transister receivers to be used from a main voltage supply.

We will have to find an alternative way of producing the newsletter seen, as Cliff Hedgkins will be unable to centinue doing this after March.

In the future I hepe to increase our membership, develop the newsletter to improve its quality, and to obtain sufficient funds through the stamp drive, and raffles etc., to enable our members to benefit in the coming year. LATIN POTPOURRI

Jim Whitehead, our Latin expert, could not type this edition of his column as he was called away on pleasure to vacation in sunny Florida. So, this is being typed by his humble assistant, Chris Lobdell.

Jim wanted me to point out the following items of interest: Glenn Hauser's logging of the rare Radio Atlantico in Bluefields, Nicaragua. The return to the air of Radio Cristal in the Dominican Republic on 5010 kHz. Be careful not to confuse this one with Radio Surcolombiana. On the frequency of 5040, don't confuse Radio Cinco in Colombia with Radio Libertad in Peru. In Chile, Radio Presidente Balmaceda, the Christian Democrat station, was shut down by the government for 10 days.

Senor Whitehead will return next month with the soloutions to the last two "refrans" and many more interesting Latin tidbits.

Instead, it was what might be considered one of the most extreme cases of misjudgement in the history of shortwave broadcasting. For Deutsche welle announced the cancellation of its regular programs to North america and its substitution with an "information program" of twenty minutes duration. The decision, in escense, was based on the fact that there was a vast media system available in the United States and Canada and that Deutsche Welle could not hope to compete with it.

One cannot argue against the fact that North America does have an extensive network of the different forms of media. The fact that "the media" takes its form in various guises is well known and shortwave radio happens to be one of them. This form of broadcasting is an intergral part of the system, albeit more so in what may be termed the "developing" nations. It is hard to distinguish exactly what Deutsche Welle means by "media". To many people "media" denotes "news", and perhaps also to Deutsche Welle. If so, their point here is clear, news from the local forms of media is more likely to rank above that from foreign sources. The new "information program" may then be looked on as a token representation in the field of shortwave broadcasting to North America. Very few international broadcasters realistically expect their programming to fully cancel that of local media (with a few exceptions), but instead see it as a compliment or an alternative to that of the local area. In this respect shortwave is seen to play a considerable role. Others look on the media as playing a more extensive role than just "news"—educating, entertaining, and explaining various facets of a country's culture, policies and people. In this respect Deutsche Welle is mistaken if it believes the media in North America can sufficiently cover that aspect.

Deutsche Welle seems to recognize the role of the international broadcaster as many see it, at least they did in the past. It was pointed out by Deutsche Welle in an article published in their DW HANDBUCH 72 * written by George Jacobs on the "Future of High Frequency Broadcasting" that "In the field of international relations, high frequency (shortwave) broadcasting plays an important and unique role. It is the only broadcasting medium capable of direct, universal, personal and immediate communication between the people of the world." In fact, the article goes on to answer the question raised on the popularity of television and MW-VHF (AM-FM) broadcasting and the future of shortwave broadcasting. "One can easily remember a similar question asked in the United States and Europe about MW radio when the television expansion began ... We now know the answer ... MW radio continued in popularity and VHF radio developed despite the introduction of television. In all probability the answer will be the same for shortwave radio."

Does it not seem strange then that only three years ago Deutsche Welle in a publication under their control was promoting the idea of shortwave radio and to now contradict the same? Granted that few other cuts have been nade (a notable exception being the discontinuation of Italian broadcasts on shortwave), but that still does not diminish the ominous future foretold. It seems impossible that one of the leaders in the field of shortwave broadcasting which in little more than a decade has expanded to such a great extent, would now turn its back on its listeners in North America. One cannot solely base a program on news, that is, not when resourses such as those available to the Federal Republic of Germany are present. The culture of the German people, its history, its future, is of interest to many. International broadcasting is "direct, universal, personal and immediate communication between the people of the world"; how else are we to receive it unless we get from those who live it.

In the North American 2/75 edition of HALLO FRIENDS the station decision on the reduction of transmissions to North America was announced. The heading of the announcement was: "To whom It May Concern", it concerns all of us interested in shortwave radio and then some. We have little recourse now, we can only express our opinion to Deutsche welle and decry the situation as it now stands.

- SATELLITE CHINA-2 a Solar Powered Satellite launched by the People's Republic of China can be heard transmitting data on the frequency of 19994 KHz (19.994 MHz). The orbital period is 101.113 minutes. (via the Kettering Group)
- JOINT AMERICAN-SOVIET SPACE FLIGHT: may be using a beacon from the Soviet SOYUZ craft on 20008 KHz (20.008 MHz). The Orbital period is expected to be 88.9 Minutes. Salyut flights in the past have used 15008 & 19944 KHz for a beacon frequency. Telemetry downlinks for Soyuz will be 192.04 MHz and 922.75 MHz. Launch is still scheduled for July 15th, 1975. For more information see page 35 of the March issue of SPEEDX. (info via the Sable Island Group)
- DANCER: ALL DXers Beware. It has been reported that the Cable & Wireless Station on Malta has been nationalized. The station has been causing problems for DXers by reporting those who send reception reports to their respective governments who issue warning letters to DXers for alleged violations of ITU and local rules (Alex Moore)
- SWAN ISLAND: Per a cooperative treaty signed between Honduras and the United States, the U.S. will operate a cooperative meteorological program with facilities located on SWAN ISLAND. Frequencies to be used include-2738, 2774.5, 3223, 3329, 3361.5, 5923.5, 5945, 6855, 6976, 8150, 9840, 9946, 12175, and 14790.5 KHz. A Honduran Call sign is being used. (via TIAS 7454 pg 2641)
- EMERGENCY BROADCASTS will be made on 3670 KHz. Swan Electronics sold the Government of Mexico thirty 75watt long range radios for use along the Transpeninsular Baja California Highway that extends from Tijuana to the tip of the peninsula, over 1100 miles. Radios will be used in emergency vehicals that patrol the highway 24 hours a day. (via Morton Meehan-CA)
- NEW SUBMARINE COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM at a cost of one-half billion dollars may be erected in New Mexico. The Pentagon has decided that the SANGUINE communications system formerly planned for Wisconsin will be scaled down and constructed on federal land in New Mexico or Nevada. The new system will be called SEAFARER and will be used to communicate with submarines will they are submerged. Current communications equipment using HF shortwave frequencies requires submarines to come to the surface where they are vulnerable to attack. SEAFARER will use VLF frequencies which penetrate deep beneth the ocean surface. The antennas that are planned for use are about 2,000 to 2,500 miles in length. A half-dozen or so transmitters will be used. The strick environmentalists forced the Navy to abandon the Wisconsin site. The SEAFARE system is scheduled to begin operation on a regular basis in 1980, which means that construction will have to begin in 1977. (via Alpena News and Steve d'Adolf)




Several items of interest and/or importance before we get to the QSLs. Ed Pyatt, Chmn of ANARC QSL Committee reports "correct reception reports to R. Tunisia will be verified and should be sent to: A. Marzouki, Pour le Directeur Général, Le Chef du Service de la Coopération et des Relations Extérieures." Presumably remainder of address is as in WRTH. Ken Earhart passes on the following info from R. Canada: reception reports on broadcasts of the CBC Northern Svc and the Armed Forces Svc should be sent to those departments and NOT, repeat NOT, to R. Canada International. Address is the same, but department is different. Two items from Doug Snyder (who he?): first a report from RCI's SW Club said they would no longer enter verie info on QSL cds due to "inflation" (also reported by Jim Vecchiola); 2nd, a letter from Mrs. Stepanova of R. Moscow N. Amer. Svc states RM will not QSL unless the outline of the program heard in the spoken language is given--which means she isn't going to QSL an Arabic report for you unless you speak Arabic and can tell what was on the program. I don't know whether this is RM policy or E. Stepanova policy, but suspect the latter -- Dave Chaffin's 61 Sputnik Memorial QSLs came in and he had a bunch of exotic language bdcsts QSId--by O. Rakita of the African Svc. Apparently the point of origin of your report determines who gets it in Moscow. Solution -- send all your exotic language reports to Dave and let him forward them from Africa -- shouldn't cost him more than a month's salary for postage and you more than a 2 year wait for a QSL. (I'm only kidding Dave -- and to prove my heart's in the right place, your mysterious Kingisepp is about 60 miles SW of Leningrad (RSFSR, European). And Pat Kerrigan locates Oakdale about 10 miles up the river (wouldn't you know it) from New London, CT. Serge Neumann is following in your editor's footsteps with a report to R. Libertad returned stamped "No Corresponde al Apartado Indicado". Did anyone ever get thru to this outfit? And Sanserino and Fleming verify the DW signer as Gustav George Thiele. So unless there's an S. Mele floating around the DW office too, that's it!

Within the present format, I can include about 350 QSLs per month. Lately we have run over that number. This month I had over 100 reports from the USSR alone. To include the bulk of the reports and still print several QSL reproductions, I will consolidate some reports from stations that receive heavy traffic--R. Moscow, VOA, RCI, HCJB, and RA. 

Try the one above--a quick count in WRTH shows it is used by at least two of the major international broadcasters, plus at least 13 other stations, so it isn't hard to hear. (Translating may be something else!) And I'll guarantee it is used on both ECNA and WCNA, and in between.

As usual, several reports arrived today, after the contributor's list had been submitted and this column was well under way. Five months experience on this job shows the following: (1) Allow a minimum of three full days for mail from ECNA, i.e., mail by the morning of the 12th for reasonably sure delivery here by the 15th. Air mail postage does not guarantee faster service since most 1st class mail travels by air anyway. (2) Air. mail from UK usually arrives in 5 days; other areas, let your conscience be your guide (Canada--usually 3-5 days; ditto Puerto Rico). (3) All bets are off around Christmas-mailing a week early is not too much, even (particularly) within California. All in all, why not mail a week early and be sure -- QSLs are not classed as dated material anyway.

I will print as many QSL cds each month as space permits--but that means that I will need copies. Which ones I print depend on what I have, the quality of the copy, and where it falls on the page, so I would appreciate receiving good, sharp, copies of your choicer QSLs--common or uncommon. The camera sees only the contrast between black and white, so many photos don't do so well (which is why I have some reservations about the Australia QSL this month--we'll see how it comes out). If you do not have access to a copier, you can send the QSL to me (if you trust the P.O. and me!), I'll copy it and return to you. See comment on copies in March issue. Also note that QSL report forms are available from SPEEDX HQ. If you do not use a form, please write on only one side of the paper and leave $\frac{1}{2}$ -1 inch between reports; they must be cut apart for sorting. For report forms, send 25-50 cents in stamps (US) to Don Johnson, PO Box E, Elsinore, CA 92330, and he'll send you a bunch (wad, flock, bevy, covy, gaggle, or whatever). 73's 4://

INDOOR ANTENNA

by ROBERT WIRRELL

This article is for you DXers who live in apartments or in houses where you can't erect outdoor antennas. I had this problem for a long time and my DXing was nothing because of it. I decided to find an answer to this problem or else give up DXing. I found the answer!

First of all let me make one thing clear. In this article I am going to mention two products by brand names, however, I do not represent these companies in any manner. The names are mentioned so you will know where such materials are available.

The solution to the antenna problem was the Cushcraft "TRIK STIK" antenna, a multi-band, multi-purpose antenna, that may be used in the vertical or horizontal position. In the vertical position it is used for transmitting or monitoring. In the horizontal position it may be used for TV, FM & SW re-

ception.

The element comes in four sections, which are adjusted to any one of the uses mentioned above. This has been a general description of the antenna itself. Now for the specs. The antenna comes with an 18" boom, which is used for; Mounting on a mast, mounting outside your window or on a window sill. For hanging in a cellar or attic. Or, it may be placed under a bed, behind a couch, or hung from the ceiling with results equal to (in my opinion) an outdoor antenna.

I have used this antenna indoors with excellent results. I now have it on a fence post and the results are even better. In my opinion, this antenna has definitely increased received signals over a long wire, whether used indoors or out. Even if I could, I would not go back to using a long wire.

doors or out. Even if I could, I would not go back to using a long wire.

This antenna could well be a solution for you apartment dwellers who need a decent antenna. Cost of this antenna is under \$15 from Lafayette Radio.

Part number is 40 F 19188 W. Other DXers who have seen & heard this antenna in action agree that it is fantastic.

Another useful item is an an antenna tuner put out by Goldline products. This tuner covers all the shortwave bands plus HAM bands & UHF/VHF. With the above "TRIK STIK" antenna, this tuner works very well. The results may amaze you. It is set up so that it can be used with either twin-lead or single lead wire. Internally it has a slide control coil and, instead of a tuning capacitor it has a tunable choke. I can't give technical information on this tuner as I am not qualified to do so.

I will close by saying that this antenna & tuner set up is an ideal and inexpensive answer for apartment dwellers who have the problem of where and how they can put up a decent antenna system. The above article is based on my own personal experience. I end by saying that your receiver can only be as good as your antenna.



I'M PROUD TO BE A DXER

I quickly removed the card from my QSL collection and made a quick trip back to the handicapped exhibit. I quickly(which is a nice way to say rushed)made my way to the side of the wahine who had given me the braille typewriter demonstration. Then I handed the "World Handicapped Aid Programe" card to her and watched her fingers lightly touch the braille type portion. She read the words out loud and asked me where I had gotten hold of such an oddity.

Then it was my turn to "turn on" with the mention of my shortwave hobby, SPEEDX membership, Radio Nederland's commemorative card, and on & on. She felt honored to know that someone cared enough to "reach out and touch her heart and mind", as she had done so many times before is her rehabilitation program and demonstrations. In time I had to leave in order that she could go on and show people how the handicapped can function just as well, if not better, than those who take the five senses so much for granted.

I felt good inside that in the space of five minutes the impact of "turning someone on" was truly an emotional uplift and consolation. So next time you strain your ears to make out that ID of a distant station, sit back awhile and be greatful that you can see the dial position and controls. Some people can't but, with the publication of QSL cards like Radio Nederland's handicapped commemorative, these same people can.

BRIEF LOOK AT RTV DOMINICA

by MICHAEL MAHONEY

The radio equipment of Radiotelevision Dominica was inaugurated in August 1942, the television equipment in August 1952.

The radio system is an integrated network of stations located in: Santo Domingo, La Vega, Santiago, Puerto Rico, Monte Gristi, La Romana, El Seybo, Barbarona, San Juan, and Pedernales; the last location is on the border area between the Dominican Republic & Haiti.



The principal TV transmitter(channel 4) is installed in Santo Domingo, the capital. It has a power of 5 kw video and 2.5 kw audio. Channel 5, which retransmits the signals of channel 4, operates from Alto Bandera, a mountainous elevation of some 2,834 meters above sea level. Channel 5 operates with the same power as channel 4. There is a satellite station(Ch.12) in Puerto Plata, and another relay is planned for La Romana.

In reality, RTVD uses various cameras, and is equipped with a transistorized film chain capable of using both B & W and color film. RTVD also has one mobile TV unit, plus machines for video tape & video cassette. It also owns a photography studio including a film laboratory. There are 2 TV studios and 3 radio studios.

Daily TV programming is from 11 am to 11 pm. Local radio(mw)operates from 6 am to 12 midnight. The International Service airs from 6 pm to midnight. Listeners on 5 continents report reception of RTVD transmissions. These programmes present, in a general sense, aspects of news, education and culture. RTVD is considered to have the best programming of this nature in the D.R. and is also well known throughout the Americas.

Besides the Director General, RTVD's personnel consist of: Technical services, producers and directors of programming, newsmen, photographers and cameramen, people in public relations, commercial affairs, artists and scenery production. Within RTVD there are 4 central departments: administrative, technical, artistic, and operation.

The SW service operates on 9505 kHz(31 meters) with a power of 50 kw. The main national service operates from Santo Dimingo on 620 kHz with 10 kw.

OWNER REVIEW OF THE DX-160

by RONALD NUTTER

The Realistic DX-160 Communications Receiver is sold by RADIO SHACK for \$160. For those who would like more info about this receiver then is given here, you can purchase the owners manual seperately from Radio Shack.

When you view the DX-160 you will see the following controls on the front panel: AF gain, RF gain, antenna trimmer, band switch, BFO, ANL, AVC, mode control, receive/standby switch, main tuning, band spread and, an 8 ohm output jack.

The DX-160 has the following coverage and sensitivity:

Band A is the long wave band where you can hear weather broadcasts. The broadcasts are for aircraft but a portion of them are matched to road routes. Band B is the standard AM band. Bands C, D and E are the shortwave bands.

The sensitivity on this receiver at 6db is 4 kHz, and at 40db its 18 kHz. The DX-160 operates on 120 VAC and 12 VDC. One disadvantage with this rig is that on the DC function, the dial lights do not operate. There is no momentary switch to temporarily have the lights work when using DC power.

Being a solid state receiver there is no long waiting for the tuning circuits to stabilize. It takes only a minute or two for the circuits to stabilize. If you want to leave the receiver on but do not want to be bothered by the audio signal you can switch from receive to standby, which cuts out the audio circuit.

The bandspread dial is calibrated for the HAM bands and has a O to 100 log scale. Setting the dial pointer where the manual tells you to, and by refering to the charts inside the manual, you can fine tune the SW bands.

With a good antenna, single wire or dipole, you can pick up just about anything you want. On a recent DX outing one evening with just a 4 foot antenna, I picked up Ecuador, Spain, East Germany, Australia and Holland! If the DX-160 will do that well with a 4 foot antenna, think what it does with a decent one.

are getting through to their audiences very well.

What would be the consequences of the VOA operating 2500 kw transmitters? We all know that it would add to the already impossible congestion on the shortwave broadcast bands, and wipe out even more DX than is being wiped out already by stations using 500 kw transmitters. In addition to that, several other countries will feel the need to compete with us, and they too will construct 2500 kw transmitters. By that time, the countries that didn't really want to go to the trouble of buying and the expense of operating those 2500 kw monsters will, out of necessity, have to go out and get one of those shiny, new, super transmitters, because that's the only way they're going to get through. By that time, your favorite 49 meter band Colombian domestic station might as well use its shortwave transmitter for spare parts for their AM station. for all the good it will do them to stay on shortwave.

So, we see that if VOA carries through with the USIA's advice, the power norm will be 2500 kw. (About that time, a USIA committee will tell VOA its time for the introduction of the first-gasp-5000 kw transmitter) We've seen the power norm go from 50, to 100, to 250, and now 500 kw, and we'd be foolish to think that Uncle Sam would be the only country in the world operating on shortwave with 2500 kw.

Scientific studies have concluded that too much RF is hazardous to the health of the ionosphere. A day is coming when the ionosphere could give out on us completely. Unreliable as it may be, it's the only ionosphere we've got, and we have to take care of it. It's been said that 2500 kw, beamed directly into the ionosphere can disable it temporarily, from reflecting radio signals. Can you imagine half the countries in the world operating six transmitters of 2500 kw each, and its affect on the ionosphere? It would be a tragic day for long distance communications without sattelite. And VOA would be the trailblazer.

Let's look at another aspect, in regards to VOA building those supermonsters. Our government is in debt, and we are in an inflationary recession. People are unemployed. The government is making or considering making cutbacks in such programs as food stamps, etc. Now I ask you, CAN WE AFFORD NEW TRANSMITTERS FOR AN ALREADY OVERSIZED SHORTWAVE OPERATION? It seems to me that Uncle Sam can use the money that it would cost to build and operate a few 2500 kw transmitters for better purposes. The USIA's recommendation states clearly enough that the only reason for this new high power equipment is for national ego purposes. Now I don't want anyone to get me wrong. I think the VOA is doing an excellent job, and has a legitimate, and even necessary, function. It's just that I don't think VOA needs to, or can afford to for communications sake, expand any further. Wake up, America! Write to the USIA and your Congressman. The end of DXing is at hand, unless we do something to prevent it.

TRY 60 METER BAND

If you have been listening to the higher meter bands, you have noted that there are several stations trying to use the same frequencies at the same time. The result? A horribile screaching noise in your speaker and a slight headache coming on. I found myself in this situation recently. One night I was at my desk, DXing the 41 meter band, when suddenly I heard an unfamiliar signal coming through. But, before I could ID it, Radio Moscow signed on the same frequency. Boom! "That's it", I said to myself, there's got to be a better way.

I decided to try something I rarely, if ever, did. I switched my set over to the 60 meter band, and 'discovered' a great variety of Spanish speaking stations. I was amazed to hear so many unusual(to me)stations. In the two years I've been DXing, I have avoided the tropical bands because of the high static one encounters there. After thinking it over though, I realized that I would prefer to battle a bit of static than all the QRM on the higher bands. I have found that the 60 meter band is more fun to listen to than hearing BBC, RCI, and R Moscow all on the same frequency at the same time. Give the tropical 60 meter band a try. You might find it a welcome change.
