

STATIONS BY THE HUNDREDS

A really good turnout for the contest! The totals were 118 SWBC stations (give or take a few pending final editing by HQ) heard on 27 different even hundred kilohertz frequencies! In addition there were 2 tentatives, 1 unknown, 2 jammers, 1 harmonic, 1 spur (RHC, naturally) and 2 time stations reported. The winners, scores and prizes are:

- 1st place: Glenn Hauser, TN.60 SWBC stations heard. 1 year extension of SPEEDX membership, 1 year extension of SPEEDXGRAM, SPEEDX certificate and pennant.
- 2nd place: Bill Breeden, MS.53 SWBC stations heard. 6 month extension of SPEEDX membership, 1 year extension of SPEEDXGRAM, SPEEDX certificate and pennant.
- 3rd place: Bill Estes, MS.50 SWBC stations heard. 3 month extension of SPEEDX membership, 1 year extension of SPEEDXGRAM, SPEEDX certificate and pennant.

THE SONG OF THE NIGHTINGALE (or "How Roma Radio Gives You The Bird"). Ever wonder about the origin of the tuning signal utilized by RAI before each transmission? The nightingale song of the Italian Radio was produced by an old spring mechanism and tubes invented some hundred years ago in Paris by a man named Mastro Bontems, characterized as an extravagant and witty personality. This instrument originally reproduced bird songs, imitating some of the most charming ones. In addition to the patient technical work required, Bontems carried out some lengthy research in the Parisian woods.....then still populated with blackbirds, thrushes, and nightingales....and set constant ambushes in order to get the particular song he required. Bontems' invention was a rudimentary tape recorder with a conglomeration of whistles worked by pistons which he constantly moved until he got the sound he wanted ...it was, in fact, a prehistoric "musicassette", which, once known and mass constructed, made a fortune for its inventor. And it can be heard daily on your receiver...the mating cry of the wild, mechanical Bontems.

RATHER THAN FIGHT, FINLAND SWITCHED: Every second year the Nordic Shortwave and Transcription Services meet to discuss common problems and ways of improving co-operation between Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland, and the Faroe Islands. One of the results of the latest confab was an agreement not to beam transmissions to a common target simultaneously in the same language. For some time in the past both Finland and Sweden had beamed English programs to North America from 1400 to 1430 GMT. In view of this year's agreement Radio Finland agreed to move their programming in English to the new time of 1330 to 1400, allowing Radio Sweden to keep her 1400 North American Service time slot. The FBC has been heard at the new time since...

DIXING... "LOVETT" OR LEAVE IT: Though it was not a shortwave station, this scene could be repeated in many small domestic SW outlets which generally are not deluged with listeners' reports. Ohio SPEEDXer Brandon Lovett shares an experience occurring at a local BCB station for which he formerly worked... A report was sent by a well-known all-band DXer...and it was a tentative report which turned out to be incorrect. The Chief Engineer read the report, gave it to the Front Desk Secretary, and told her to send the reporter a rejection letter. She looked at it and just couldn't understand. 

The discussion on proper use of the SINPO code continues as Maryland DXer ROBERT FRENCH offers the following commentary on signal quality evaluation:

"The whole business of rating signal quality seems to be rather subjective and qualitative, as the average DXer has neither the sophisticated equipment nor the means of obtaining the expensive equipment needed to perform quantitative measurements of signal quality...

"Personally, I judge a SINPO rating as follows: S-5 if the strength is such that good reception is had with minimal setting of RF gain control with due allowance for receiver sensitivity dropping off at higher frequencies. Example: local BCB station is S-5. This drops to '4' if I have to advance the RF gain a bit to get good reception; S-3 for signals which cannot be heard exceptionally well with any RF gain setting; S-2 for signals which are so weak as to be marginally intelligible; S-1 for signals which cannot be understood due to weakness..."

"The 'I' rating: '5', no interference audible; '4', a little interference audible, but not annoying; '3', can copy desired signal OK, but the interference is distinctly annoying; '2', can copy partially through heavy interference, but solid copy impossible; '1', too much interference for any useful copy..."

"The 'N' rating....as for 'I', but substitute 'noise' for 'interference'. I include both local electrical noise and atmospherics in the 'N' rating..."

"For 'P' rating... '5', no fading detectable to the ear; '4', a little fading, mostly long-term, or distinct changes in level from one transmission to the next; '3', fading clearly noticeable, but does not significantly degrade ability to copy; '2', rather severe fading, with degraded ability to copy; '1', fading to inaudible at times..."


"The 'O' rating... '5', easy copy, like local BCB station with no degradations from external interference or noise... equivalent to the 'A' service area of local BCB stations; '4', solid copy, but with some annoyance like a low level of interference or some noise; '3', copy OK, but with difficulty... requires attention to what is being said at all times... and mental effort to follow, but can copy OK; '2', requires considerable effort to copy, with some gaps; and '1', unreadable..."


"The 'O' rating can be degraded on a signal... C.W. or voice... with straight SINP '5555' if the modulation is lousy! Some ships heard here on C.W. sound like a flock of birds chirping, with the result being almost unreadable even though they have a strong signal in the clear... same for modulation of very shallow markers such as are sometimes heard from Mexico and others..."

California-based, but Okinawa-bound MIKE HARDESTER raises a new, but interest point:

"Being an avid DXer and QSL collector, I send several reports to stations each month... occasionally a new station will be logged where return postage is a must. Two choices are available: IRCs or mint stamps. When I began DXing, IRCs were 15¢ each and I didn't know about mint stamps, per se. Today, being wise to both, I opt for the mint stamps. I recently ordered some mint stamps from DX STAMP SERVICE... and noted a few increases in the price list... I find it difficult to justify spending \$1.06 for a single report to a station where there is no guarantee that I'll receive a reply. My wife, who has been a SWL, has never questioned my sending reports, but she has asked if there isn't a less expensive way to obtain a QSL. Of course, there is always the tape recording method, but somehow there isn't the same thrill of receiving a card from the station involved. One cannot help but wonder what the future holds when postage rates continue to rise and many DXers revert to SWL status... not necessarily by choice..."

"One way in which I've tried to help other DXers is when I report to a QSL column I list the amount of postage, when possible, used by the station to mail the card or letter to me... if a station is known to send only cards and the postage used is 10dx, but DX STAMP SERVICE sells only a packet of 20dx value, then intelligence directs you to send only half in postage and save the other 10dx for another station and report. Further, I check the QSL columns and, if postage amounts are listed, I record them for future reference. I would encourage other DXers to help each other by doing similarly..."

YAESU FR101 DIGITAL SOLID STATE RECEIVER

This writer again had the good fortune to tune another fine product from the Yaesu people. I would like to thank the Yaesu people for loan of the equipment for testing. The FR101 is probably the best receiver on the market today in its price range. It was built as a partner to the Yaesu FL101 transmitter for ham use, but it will do an excellent job for the SWL.
COVERAGE-1.8-30 mHz plus *50.0-54.0 mHz, *144-148 mHz (*optional plug-in modules). MODE-USB, LSB, CW, AM, RTTY & FM(144-148mHz). SENSITIVITY-luV for AM, 0.3uV for SSB. SELECTIVITY-2.4kHz @ 6db, 4.0kHz @ 60db for SSB, for AM a broad/sharp switch-broad is 6kHz @ 6db, 12kHz @ 60db with optional filter, sharp is not stated but block diagram shows SSB filter in place. IMAGE REJECTION-better than 60db. The FR101 also has selectable AGC, fast, slow & off. Built-in noise blinder. +5kHz clarifier. Built-in 25 or 100kHz calibrator. Built-in AC supply and 12VDC operation. RF Attenuator 10 & 20db. Re-corder jack. Better than 1kHz readout on all bands. SUMMARY-Another fine piece of gear from Yaesu. 

ANTENNA WIRE - Have a question about using insulated wire for an antenna. Insulated 12 or 14 gauge stranded or solid wire will do the job nicely, you can use the same wire for the lead-in, be sure to keep lead-in away from metal frames, lead-in is part of the antenna. In the near future I will feature a very good inverted 'L' that works first rate.

RCSSB - question on the use of this abbreviation in the August issue of Speedx in the Utility Section page 39, eight lines from top of page. RCSSB means - 'Reduced carrier single-side band', this is regular single-side band with a slight carrier added. The carrier can be detected by the beat note, from your receivers BFO. RCSSB is used in radio telephone ship to shore. Thanks to John Kolb for info on this one.

QRM from the local TV set. Have a question from Larry Brookwell about this problem, he wants to know what is the origin of the SW QRM at approx every 15kHz caused by the TV receiver. Is it fed to the SW receiver via the TV antenna, thru the electric lines, or by direct radiation? Is there any device on the market, or a home-brew that will eliminate, or reduce this QRM? I have been told the only remedy is to line the inside of the TV cabinet with aluminum foil and ground it. In your opinion would this work? The problem is from a 20 watt transmitter they call a oscillator, and it radiates the signal into everything, including the fillings in your teeth. There is nothing that you can buy, build or steal (unless its the TV set) that will eliminate this problem, except putting the switch in the off position. I do not recommend lining the TV set with Reynolds wrap, maybe if you are a TV tech, touch the wrong thing and on your ear you go if you do not discharge the set. The only thing I can suggest is DX when the TV set is off.

SUPPORT WORLD DX HANDICAPPED AID CAMPAIGN

I've just announced a new member of HAPS Board of Directors, Wayne Davis, and now I take pleasure in announcing the appointment of a public relations director for HAP. He is Larry Cotariu, 8041 N. Hamlin Ave. Skokie, IL 60076. Larry will coordinate our various public relation efforts on all the various fronts on which we are now active.

We have achieved something of a breakthrough in terms of public relations: A few days ago, I wrote to Raymond Cheever, editor-publisher of the magazine Accent on Living, a quarterly publication edited in Bloomington, IL and directed to a worldwide readership of the physically handicapped. Ray wrote back immediately, and asked me to submit a letter to the editor, briefly outlining the services which HAP provides. I've done as he asked, and the letter should appear in the winter edition, due to be published in Dec. 1976.

In addition to more than a dozen articles on topics of interest to the disabled in each issue, the magazine carries product evaluations, news of importance to the disabled, items about the progress of legislation relevant to it's readers and operates a computerized information retrieval system. It also has available a number of special publications covering selected topics in depth. All in all it is a valuable magazine, with a varied readership of disabled persons, providers of sevices, and proffessionals in the field of services to the disabled. It has great potential for reaching a much larger audience than we have been or would be able to contact us-ing other methods.

HAP'S long awaited presentation to Harry Van Gelder took place on schedule without a hitch. Harry's last official act in behalf of HAP will be to assist HAP-Netherlands in getting it self organized and in working out a means through which HAP can receive the assistance of the Benelux DX Club in promoting HAP-Holland.

Our tape sales have reached a virtual standstill, and I'd like to take this opportunity to urge those who have not purchased tapes to do so. Some-time around the first of the year, we should begin making available a new series of tapes, this will consist of tapes on noise sources, and Utility station information.

HAP was mentioned recently on a DX program produced by the South Asia division of the Seventh Day Adventist Church, a program broadcast by the Sri-Lanka Broadcasting Company. We want to thank Mr. A.M. Peterson, of Poona, India for his cooperation in this matter.


We have recently inducted HAP-97, a man in California who is returning to the hobby after a considerable time away from it.

THIS AND THAT

For all who asked I will report that my business trip to Mexico City was successful and, despite the revenge of Moctezuma, I enjoyed the trip as I always do. I'd like to report on the shortwave activity there but, I'm afraid I can't despite the fact I had my Grundig portable along. The Maria Isabel Sheraton hotel sits in the middle of a circle formed by seven A.M. antennae and my travel worn radio gave excellent reception of those seven on all bands. What an RF wasteland.

The game of musical frequencies continues in Colombia where the latest tally shows three stations now displaying new 60 m.b. frequencies. First it was Ecos del Combeima, ex-4785 khz, moving up to 4785v khz followed by Radio Guatapurí's 100 khz drop to 4815 khz. The latest to pop up is Brisas del Citará, ex-5030 khz, which is the unidentified station being reported by many on its new frequency of 4895 khz.

Down Rio way, the BBCMS reports that, according to Radio Nacional de Brasília, Radio do Educação Rural de Santarém, Radio São Francisco, Radio Clube de Marília and Radio Televisão Gaúcha have all received 10-year extensions of their licenses. This same announcement indicated that Radio Cidade Canco had been authorized to establish a tropical band radio station in Mandaguassu, Pirana State.

It can now be said with certainty that the first transmitter to come online at the BBC Caribbean relay base on Antigua began regular operations on October 1. Thanks to Roger Legge and Alan Thompson via Numero Uno for the following schedule: 6175 khz: Antigua replaces Sackville at 0430 and carries the World Service (WS) to WCNA till 0730. 6195 khz: Carries WS to Caribbean 1100-1330 and 2000-2115. (Note that UK xmtr carries WS here till 2000 when it switches to GG) 9765khz: Carries PP to Brazil 2200-0015, SS to Latin America (LA) 0015-0415. Alan Thompson also relayed the frequency plans for Montserrat that will presumably be used once that site is activated. This schedule includes the use of 6040.khz for SS to LA 0215-0415, 9600 khz for WS 2000-2115 and 11790 khz also WS 1100-1330.



PROPAGATION

FORECAST Winter 1976

Season's Greetings; dx season I'm referring too of course....but since this is my last column for the bicentennial year of 1976, let me wish each one of you a joyful holiday season and lots of good health and may your first Christmas present be a new receiver.

I have received a few compliments on the Autumn supplement and I hope that it has proved beneficial for those of you that have used it. This winter forecast follows the same format, but I would certainly appreciate hearing from any of you concerning your suggested additions or changes or if you have any problems interpreting the charts; my address is 3130 Woodmont Drive, San Jose, CA, 95118.

I would like to say thanks to all that protested the cancellation of the WWV GeoAlerts at 18 minutes past the hour; they are now back on the air due to a flood of letters. The GeoAlert broadcast, which is updated every day at 0418 GMT, announces the previous day's Solar Flux reading (a measure of Solar activity), the previous day's 'A Index' (geomagnetic activity), a word description of solar activity (very low, low, moderate, high, very high), a word description of geomagnetic activity (quiet, unsettled, active or disturbed) and a general forecast of the following day, for example: "Solar Activity will be very low and the geomagnetic field will be quiet." The GeoAlert broadcast is from WWV only and has been discontinued from WWVH.

I have been charting the Solar Flux and 'A Index' for over two years now and would like to give a capsule summary of these charts: for the last eight months of 1974, the Solar Flux averaged 88.5; in 1975, the S.F. averaged 76.2; during the first nine months of 1976, the S.F. has averaged 72.8. So you can see the definite downward trend of solar activity. 1977 will also see a very low level of solar activity, averaging in the mid-seventies. What does this mean for shortwave? Well, for one thing, continued severe crowding in the lower frequency International SW bands, 49,41, and 31 meter bands. But its a boon to the tropical bands dx'er, especially during the winter; the 120, 90,75 and 60 meter bands will be very active with the Asiatic, Latin and African regionals, but of course only during periods of darkness. During periods of quiet geomagnetic activity, that is the time to dx for Central Asia and the Far East if you're on the east coast, the Middle East, East Africa, Central Asia and Europe if you reside on the west coast. For the dx'ers in between, openings to the Middle East, Central Asia and Europe will occur with low A Index. I hate to ignore all our overseas members, as they have their special propagation problems, but space dictates that we concentrate on the U.S. However, I will be glad to try and answer any questions that any member has concerning propagation, whether in the U.S. or overseas.

Well, what's in store for this winter, you ask? The main thing going for us is, obviously, darkness. By consulting the charts, you can see that every area covered has a common darkness period with the U.S. This means, that during that period, the entire transmission path is in darkness, which is essential for low frequency communication. Of course, these charts don't relate to the actual broadcasting times of the desired stations; for example, if your common darkness period falls during the middle of the night at some place where there is only domestic broadcasting, don't expect to hear that regional because it probably won't be on the air. The charts will, or should be valid until middle February; near the end of winter, you will notice that the higher frequencies will be opening up more than the charts show, and of course, the darkness periods will be shorter. But I have found that February is one of my finer months, dx wise. You will also notice on the charts the higher daytime frequencies, higher in fact than the summer. This is because, although its winter in the northern hemisphere, the Earth is much closer to the Sun and thus receives more ultra-violet radiation during the daytime and thus raising the frequencies. The northern Polar region, everything above the Artic Circle, during winter, is in darkness 24 hours a day. Now that's the place to dx, if you can take the cold weather!

Now, perhaps an explanation of the charts and how to read them. Let me first say that this supplement may be removed from the bulletin and placed near your receiver for ready reference. If you leave it in the bulletin and don't use it, shame, shame; you might miss one of the best dx catches of the winter.

The following two pages contain nine charts each. One page is for listeners on the west coast (Pacific & Mountain Time) and the other page is for listeners on the east coast (Eastern & Central Time). The pages are marked 'WCNA' for west and 'ECNA' for east. The charts represent transmission paths between nine areas of the world and the east & west coasts of the U.S. (NOTE: since these are areas and not specific sites, the charts represent average frequencies for that area).


The charts show an envelope of expected reception, based on propagation conditions and not broadcast schedules. The upper limit of the envelope indicates the estimated Maximum Useable Frequency(MUF) based on a solar Flux reading of 72. It may be said that the MUF is determined, not from a particular frequency beyond which you would suddenly not hear a signal from a certain region, but from a certain signal level at that frequency, under normal propagation conditions. Beyond that frequency, you still might be able to receive stations from a certain area, but the signal level would be significantly less than within the upper portion of the envelope. The MUF is not a constant value; some days it will be somewhat lower and some days it will be higher. The broadcasts over WWV at 18 minutes past the hour will help indicate what days will provide what. On the days that the Solar Flux climbs to about 15 to 30 more units over the current average, you can expect the next higher SW band to open up. During this low period of solar activity, any great and/or sudden increase in the S.F. would also indicate greater flare activity on the sun, therefore most likely causing moderate to severe ionospheric and geomagnetic storms here on Earth, which in turn could lead to Polar Cap Absorption events and increased D-layer absorption on daylight paths. These events also increase (to a higher frequency) the Lowest Useable Frequency (LUF) which is indicated by the lower limit of the envelope. This LUF is being roughly estimated for inclusion in these charts on the basis of expected absorption levels and the length of the transmission path. Some other factors that influence the LUF is transmitter power, antenna beam direction and local noise levels.

Along the top portion of each chart is indicated the daylight/darkness pattern between transmitter & receiver. This is another useful propagation aid; the solid black portion indicates darkness at both the transmitter & the receiving sites; daylight at both transmitter & receiver is indicated by the unmarked squares of the grid; the diagonal lines sloping up to the right indicate darkness at the receiver, but light at the transmitter; diagonal lines sloping down to the right indicate darkness at the transmitter, and daylight at the receiver. Again, since these charts represent areas, the patterns show average times; for precise times, refer to the SPEEDX Sunset-Sunrise Booklet(newly revised for over 260 sites, computer accurate!). You'll notice that for the charts of Central & South America, I have shown two time patterns due to the large area covered; the top is for Cent. America & western S. America; the bottom is for the rest of S. America.

Next to the area named on the charts, you will notice some of them marked with one or two astericks ('+' is used for Midwest); these indicate what areas in which the signal travels through the Auroral Zone in route to the receiver. The A.Z. is an area that surrounds the Geomagnetic North Pole and which affects signals passing through it; one asterick or + sign indicate that the signal passes through the zone for 40% or less of the total path length; two astericks or + signs indicate more than 40% of the path length is through the A.Z.; the further a signal travels thru the A.Z., the more it is deteriorated, depending upon the amount of geomagnetic activity.

As mentioned in the Autumn forecast, the termination of the propagation forecast at 14 minutes past the hour over WWV did occur and there is now no realtime (newly updated) information being broadcast. Whether or not these broadcasts will be resumed is questionable; I am sure they (the Dept. of Commerce) received a volume of complaints, but should the forecasts be resumed, an announcement will be made over WWV at 4 minutes past the hour. The real value of these forecasts were the announcement of the K-Index which were updated every three hours. (The K-Index is related to the A-Index through a logarithmic function)

To finish off this supplement, here are a few stations that I will be hunting for this winter: Falkland Is., 2370 kHz, 1300-1500GMT, Mon-Sat. & 2200-0130, Mon-Fri.; AIR, Simla, India, 3223kHz, 0100-0200GMT & 1300-1830. FR3 Moroni, Comoro Rep., 3331kHz, 0330-0500 & 1400-1930. R. Maldives, 4740kHz, 1500-1730. Plus as many Indonesians as possible...they are slowly building more mediumwave studios to replace the SW facilities, so get 'em while they are still gn.'Til '77, good dx, good health & HAPPY New Year!

HINTS FOR UTILITY DXING

by Greg Watts

I have not been a Uter very long, but already I have discovered that there is a minimum arsenal of information necessary for any DXing of the thousands of Utility stations across the radio spectrum. I will share here some of these things with you who are also beginning Utters.

1. The uter's receiver must have the ability to receive CW/SSB mode, including BFO and fast/slow AVC controls. Without these, Ute-DXing is very limited. The frequency bands outside the broadcast bands should also be available, since most utility stations are in these "off-band" regions.
2. Several issues of the SPEEDX bulletin, or other sources containing frequency lists such as the upcoming SPEEDXtra bulletin on utility DXing, or the Confidential Frequency List by Robert B. Grove (Gilfer Associates), are invaluable references.
3. Knowledge of the International Morse Code (CW) and Q-codes is essential. With experience, one cannot help but improve one's CW skill. Tables of the code and the Q signals accompany this article.
4. Exact frequency determination is important. Use zero-beat (see July SPEEDX, p. 7) to determine exact frequencies. For most receivers, making a set of frequency interpolation charts (May SPEEDX, p. 7.) will aid in determining exact frequencies.
5. Pay attention to the ITU regulations regarding private communications. (ITU Geneva V:17 (1968) 1,2.) This prohibits the unauthorized interception of radiocommunications not intended for the general use of the public, and the divulgence of the contents, simple disclosure of the existence, publication or any use whatever, without authorization, of information of any nature whatever obtained by the interception of the radiocommunication mentioned in the first part of this regulation.

This means that anything further than the identification of the stations and their frequencies which are private communications is illegal. Note that many QSL's obtained by Utters are tacit authorizations of publication of the existence of such stations, but these stations will not QSL if you quote messages, or text of voice markers, since they do not authorize disclosure of the content. CQ markers may be regarded as "Broadcasts," but traffic on such coast stations which transmit CQ or V markers is non-publishable communications. With this in mind, the Uter can report and QSL a majority of utility stations with no ramifications due to violation of the ITU regulations.

A QUESTION TO AN INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTER

Last July, I sent a questionnaire to several international broadcasters concerning the validity of the average SWL reception report and the benefits derived from these reports by the station staff. I received replies from the Swiss Broadcasting Corporation and NHK, Tokyo. It is interesting to note their conflicting opinions of the SIO code - as you will see by their answers. The following is a verbatim account of my question and their replies.

QUESTION:

Will you please take time from your busy schedule to give me your thoughts on the benefits, if any, a station receives from the majority of SWL reception reports? I think it is impossible for a SWLer, with the average amount and quality of receiving gear, to play it by ear and come up with realistic information.

ANSWER FROM SPC:

Hi Wes - Thanks for all the reports, snaps, and also for this query. Well, I think BC stations get benefits in two particular ways: First they get a "straight-off-the-bat" confirmation that their broadcasts are being heard at all; and secondly, how strong, clear, and the amount of interference the signal has. Of course, most stations get regular reception reports from commercial outfits, most of them belonging to official monitoring stations. I know that SBC is getting regular reports

from the GPO in Melbourne, in Tokyo, and the USA. However, this does not replace the immediate contact we have with the listener and it is for the listeners that we do our programs, not for those commercial monitoring stations. We broadcasters are interested only in what the listeners think of our outlets and in getting them involved with what we have to say. For this we need only three items on a report - the signal strength, interference, and overall merit; in other words, the SIO report scheme. This is simple and for me the best way to report broadcasts. However, of more value are your comments and your thoughts of what we have to say in these broadcasts - may it be critical, approving or whatever, as it confirms that you are really listening and not just adding another station to your log.

ANSWER FROM NHK:

Radio NHK sent me a card saying my question would be dealt with on the "Hello America" program on Saturday, August 14. In my question to Tokyo I also asked their opinion of a recorded report. The highlights of their reply follow.

NHK prefers SINPO and says, "When it is properly used it is very valuable to our engineers." Their opinion of SIO was expressed as follows: "SIO is a very basic code and is not of much value to us." They do not seem to be much in favor of recordings and they state that "recorded reports could be a better method, however, many other things enter in to it - the kind of tape used, speed, the kind of recorder, and a lot more."

NHK left a lot unanswered but it is easy to see that they don't agree with SBC about SIO. The last sentence of the Swiss reply has a message we all must keep in mind.

PROGRAM REVIEW

"PLAY IT AGAIN, SAM" by Woody Allen

I would really like to be able to give this presentation a good review. Woody Allen is one of my favorite comedians, authors and filmmakers. Unfortunately, the BBC has done him wrong. They've taken an amusing play (not hilarious I grant you, but full of it's share of laughs) and turned it into a lifeless amateur production. Plotwise, "Play It Again, Sam" is the story of Alan Felix, a recently divorced New Yorker who writes film commentaries for an esoteric magazine. His best friend Dick and Dick's wife Linda try to help Alan get over the feelings he still has for his ex-wife Nancy by fixing him up with various girls.

Along the way, Alan receives advice from his fantasy-hero, Humphrey Bogart, but to no avail. Alan Felix is a loser. The only girl that will have him is Linda, his best friend's wife and their brief affair is doomed from the start.

To begin with, if you have seen the movie with Woody Allen in the lead, there is just no way that Christopher Monck can stand up in the comparison. Woody is the ideal New York nebbish, mainly because he's playing himself, the same loser he plays in all his films. Monck sounded like a cartoon voice. He didn't have any of that self-deprecating quality about him that is so necessary to the character. He was utterly unconvincing in the role.

The casting of John Sampson as Humphrey Bogart was another mistake. Sampson's imitation of Bogart, as poor as it was, was hampered by Sampson's heavy British accent. Bogie came out sounding like a Cockney thug instead of the familiar-sounding Bogart, a major flaw in the BBC production. The remaining players were pretty much undistinguished, being neither outstanding nor dreadful, but leaning toward the bland.

I don't know whether the actors are British or not (with the exception of Sampson who most noticeably was) but I believe the major downfall of the production was that the actors in no way related to the material. It was completely foreign to them and they misplayed their parts or were misdirected in them, missing all the humor which comes more from the characterizations than from the actual lines. Further, the play is too visual to be properly presented on the radio. When, for example, Alan Felix falls off his chair while trying to impress his date, the fall just isn't funny on the radio. Not being able to see the ghost-like Bogart character was another major drawback.

I was hoping that this BBC production of "Play It Again, Sam" would be a treat for all Woody Allen fans and all comedy lovers. It was not. I shudder to think of how this presentation must have gone over in other parts of the world. Like the proverbial lead balloon, I daresay. At least I know what the play could be in the hands of the author. Anyway, Here's hoping that next month won't find the Threater of the Air doing their version of "Blazing Saddles!"

Well, that's it for another month. Let me take this time out to wish everyone a happy Thanksgiving and don't eat too much Turkey.
