5...continuation of "hold-the-line" methods in financing in order to prevent or minimize dues hikes without forcing a decline in quality of club services.

6...a concerted effort to recruit and retain new members.

For my part, possession of mature judgement and an attentive ear will mean support of well-reasoned proposals in the best interest of SPEEDX and its members that maintain our level of excellence while promising further improvement. Encouragement of more active participation in Board decisions by welcoming suggestions of members would assure that this voice would be representative of as much of the membership as possible.


As Observed By Alan W. Brooks 74 Massachusetts Road...Oakdale, Connecticut 06370

DARF ICH SIE SELBST VORSTELLEN: The 1977 Convention of the Association of North American Radio Clubs...not to be confused with the "Gong Show"...opened on Friday, 15 July, with films, receiver displays, exhibits, informal get-acquainted sessions, and the gradual, day-long appearance of hobbyists from California to New Brunswick and from Agner to Zondlo. At that evening's opening ceremonies Convention Chairman Jeff White revealed that according to registration data the composite DXer in attendance was between 26-35 years of age, had SWBC as his primary interest, and listened to Radio Nederland more frequently than any other station. Messages from those unable to attend and suitable kudos to all whe assisted the host WIRDX club were read...

HE E CREU DE LOC: On the opening night program was a taping from RCI's affable Ian McFarland in which he lamented on his employer's lack of desire to underwrite the expenses necessary to send him to Chicago for the Convention ... wonder if RCI paid for the recording tape?..... Bids for this good cause rolled along se well at one point that a copy of the new SPEEDX Utility Guide sold for 5¢ over its current retail price... "DXing I Love You" patches seem popular, but a copy of the last RCI schedule listing the Radio Canada SW Club program put them all to shame..... FRG-7 Mods: Grant Manning is doing switchable selectivity mods on the FRG My adding a switch to the front panel for broad/sharp selectivity switching. An inboard 100khz calibrator and VLF converter(10khz-500khz) can also be added. For more info write Grant at 3417 Purer Rd., Escondido, CA 92025. Please enclose a self addressed stamped envelope for a reply.

Collins Mechanical Filter: New info on Collins F455FD-38(3.8khz min @ 4dB 10khzmax @ 60dB) filter. I can supply these units @ \$48.00 each. This unit will work nicely in the FRG-7.

FRG-7 Digital Readout: Engineering model has undergone test and is work-ing well, mow on to production. Ham Radio will sell this unit for \$125.00.

Panasenic RF2200: Sent demo back to the factory to have dial calibration elecked and to have them look into dial backlash problem this unit had. This set is very hard to come by, the factory is way behind and we can not get any to sell. Will let you know more next time. Dave Duke of El Paso is going to let me know about the antenna tuning unit that goes with this set. Even with minor problems this is a good muti-band portable.

Balun: Have a question from Charles Young wanting to know what a balun is and does. A balun is a coil and is either made from coax cable or solid copper wire. What it does is to match an unbalanced coax feed line to a balanced two-wire system, like a dipole antenna.....Thanks Charles....

The Badio Shack 100khs Frequency Standard--A user's review -R.Colin Newell It was quite a relief early in June, when I finally got a Frequency standard for my receiving set-up. It was the end of a fair amount of work with my DX150B to obtain a useable frequency readout, namely, right down to 5 khs. You see, I was a fan of the interpolation chart, a medium which performs well with many receivers with bandspread dials. I must have been enthusiastic over these few years with them as I now have a book of 53 sheets of graph paper, many containing 2 or more frequency ranges on one sheet.

As you can imagine I breathed a sigh of relief when I didn't have to rely
om someone class listed frequency to put together my chart. The Radio Shack model did the job. I didn't feel bad after laying out the \$13 for the calibrator. That was one thing that kept me from buying before; the price of others seemed high. Knowing the only expensive item in the calibrator was the crystal, it made things easy. Putting the calibrator together was little trouble. The instructions, I found, were clear though I found the waval trouble of finding my way around the underside of the P-Box. That is, since it's unmarked! Once all the wiring is in place it was only a matter of getting the 3 AA cells required for power. Yes, it does use AA cells, not the 9 volt Alkaline cells that look like AA cells. You know, the ones that retail for \$4.95 each! The convenient source of energy eliminates the old worry of remembering that sole dealer in the city who sells those. Once connected the calibrator is ready to use. The calibrator utilizes the Colpitts oscillator, a reliable, basic, circuit. It is wery stable, and can be set to within 2hz of WWV at 15 mhz. This, in effect, gives your base frequency an accuracy of better than plus or minus .02 hz. Using a pocket one can find the harmonic frequency differential at any frequency giving you the ability to tell who is off frequency. For example, Radio Clarin is listed on 11700 khz. Upon setting the calibrator to within 2 hz of WWV on 15 mhz the difference at 11700 is 2 hz. (100.00002 khz multiplied by 117, the calibrators harmonic for 11.7 mhz) If you hear a het you know their off, knowing your own frequency stability. I figure their frequency to be about 11699.94 khz from my own observations. As is this freq marker would be an excellent base for a counter. As stated in the instructions this can be used with a counter, a clock, or a timer. Don't forget also, that it is excellent for making 50 or more interpolation charts or

#### EMISORA MERIDIANO 70

Recently Emisora Meridiano 70 was the subject of much discussion when, after several years of operation in the 90 meter band, the station began transmitting on 4925 kilohertz in the 60 meter band and became generally audible throughout most of North America. This month, thanks to a friendly and informative letter from station directress, Emperatriz Rodriguez G., we spotlight this Colombian broadcaster and take a look behind the scenes at the station, its environment, and the people that make things go.

Founded approximately four years ago, Emisora Meridiano 70 serves Arauca, a city of approximately 5,000 located in eastern Colombia on the border with Venezuela. Arauca is the capital of the Intendencia of Arauca, a large sparcely settled agricultural region in the "llanos" or plains area of Colombia. The city was founded in 1772 by a Venezuelan, Juan Francisco Lara, and is situated on the southern banks of the Arauca River which serves as the border between Colombia and Venezuela at that point. Nearby is the International Bridge which is the main link between Colombia and Venezuela in the region.

The studios of Emisora Meridiano 70 front on the principle plaza of Arauca, Simón Bolívar Park, and boasts some of the most modern equipment in Colombia. The transmitters, which like the studio equipment are of American manufacture, are located on the outskirts of town on the road leading to the International Bridge.

The beauty of the "llanos" and the gusto of the people who inhabit the region have long served as inspiration for song-writers and it is from this region we get the well known "música llanera" tipified by José Elias Gutiérrez's famous "Alma Llanera". It should come as no surprise therefore that the head of the group which owns Emisora Meridiano 70 is a well known composer and singer of plains music, Dr. Jairo Meza Latorre. Dr. Meza Latorre is best known for his song "Adoración" which won the Colombian equivalent of the "Grammy" award but he has also received other honors such as taking first place in the "Festival of Colombian Songs" held in Villavicencio. Sr. Meza Latorre does not, however, handle day to day operations which are the responsibility of Emperatriz Rodriguez G..

Emisora Meridiano 70 is affiliated with the TODELAR network which currently sits in first place in audience polls. Programming is not limited strictly to network feeds, however, and local programs are produced under the direction of Artistic Director, Henry Arenas Pena. One such program is the news program "Arauca Informa" produced and presented by Bernardo Rivera while another is the Saturday only "Sabadito Popular" which presents the latest in the popular "música tropical" and greets the many listeners to the program. Two regular announcers, three controllers, and two transmitter engineers complete the station's personnel roster.

Emisora Meridiano 70 broadcasts on the frequency of 4925 kilohertz in the 60 meter band with a listed power of 1 kilowatt. This channel is a relatively clear one and thus reception, despite the low power, can be quite good on the East Coast. West Coast listeners have a problem in that

the station signs off long before it gets dark but early morning reception should be possible. You are encouraged to tune their way sometime soon as their programming is highly polished with a distinct and pleasant "llanos" flavor. I have no doubt you'll enjoy the experience.

Radio Nacional de Guatemala, 6180 khz, has begun to play a role in the escalating dispute between Guatemala and Great Britian over the tiny territory of Belize according to a report by the BBC Monitering Service. This takes the form of a new program, aired Monday thru Friday at 1830-1845 GMT, to "explain our rights". The announcement monitered also indicated the featurette was to be "an authentically historical series for the patriotic cause of the return of the territory of Belize, which belongs to Guatemala".

Radio Progreso, La Paz is once again on the air reports the BBC Monitering Service as well as various DXers, most notably Tony Jones of Asunción, Paraguay. This station was shut down recently for siding with the miners in a strike along with those stations controlled by the miners unions. Operations on 6005 khz have apparently returned to normal as the sign-off has again been noted at 0600 GMT after a short period during

which an 0400 GMT sign-off was observed.

As reperted in this column in June, Radio Agricultura, the voice of the Shilean farm owners, has been monitered on 9630 khz. Radio Agricultura heads a network, La Cadena Radial de Agricultura, which according to an announcement copied by the BBCMS includes the following stations:

Radio La Pertada, Antofagasta; Radio Interamericana, Concepción; Radie Alense de Ercilla, Illapel; Radio Soberania, Linares; Radio Sago, Osberne; Radio Provincial, Putaendo; Radio San Martin, Quillota; Radio Renge, Radio Conchagua, Santa Cruz; Radio Jese Santos Ossa, Taltal, and Radio Regional, Traiguen. Don't be surprised to hear any or all of the above as a station ID as this network feeds both ways.

An article in the Panama City Sunday newspaper "Dominical" relayed to your editor by a business associate and also reported by the BBC MS reports that Radio Libertad, the six year old, medium wave only voice of the Panamaniam government exchanges programs with Radio Moscow, Radio Mavama Cuba, Bautsche Well, Radio Tripoli and the BBC. This article also states that technical and other studies have been carried out regarding the feasibility of establishing a short wave broadcasting station and "at any moment" such a station may be established "so its programs can be heard in other countries".

Beginning with this issue Western Hemisphere will be produced in two parts, a textual lead in section prepared by yours truly and a loggings section handled by Tim McCurdy. This change has been made necessary by my increased travel requirements which leave me too little time to devote to my family and my column and hopefully this new arrangement will permit me to continue to play at least some role in the preparation of this column. In the future, therefore, loggings should be sent directly to Tim with the deadline as before, the 15th of each month. Information of a general nature such as newsy QSL letters, articles, program notes, etc. should be directed my way as before. I hope you will all give Tim the same great support you gave me and at the same time don't forget I need material too!

Well, tis time to turn things over to Tim who will need all the space he can get to squeeze in all the loggings. Before I go, however, the usual reminder that all times are GMT, all dates are in the month/day format, and the SIO code is used to indicate reception conditions noted. In addition, I'd like to add a note of warning to all those of you using the new FRG-7 receivers. Many of you are not recalibrating your dial each time you switch from one band to the other with the result that your reported frequencies are often as much as 5 khz off. For a better column, please be accurate!!

Shortly after 1600 on 6th May a programme of western por music with English announcements was intercepted on 6205 khz. Reception initially was very poor, but improved later. In the course of the broadcast the following announcement was made in English: "You are in tune with a test transmission to be heard on 773 and VHF/FM 90MHz and also the 49 metre shortwave band on 6205 khz. This test transmission will continue until 1 o'clock this morning". (Ed. note: The transmission I monitored in May also listed 9810 khz. wlo) The station closed at 2300 with the announcement "We now conclude this test transmission for the moment. We hope to join you again tonight at 8 o'clock." you again tonight at 8 o'clock."
On 28th June a similar musical programme was heard in progress on 6205 khz. This continued until 1630 when the station identified itself as "The Socialist People's Libyan Arab Jamahiriyah Broadcasting Corporation". Thereafter the programme, which was in English, included a news bulletin followed by a press review at 1730-1735. The transmitter went off the air just after 1745, but returned at 1756 with a programme of unannounced music. A time check at 1727 said 'the time in Tripoli is 7:27".
BBCMS Also notes: According to unofficial reports earlier this year the radio-ship 'Mebo II", which at one time was operating off the Dutch coast as 'Radio Nordzee', had sailed for Libya after being equipped with new transmitters. 'Radio Nordzee's theme tune, 'Man of Action,' was also used during the test transmissions observed on 6205 khz. also used during the test transmissions observed on 6205 khz.

(This adds another piece to the puzzle of that mysterious station on 6205!!!)

CAMEROON- Radio Yaounde's domestic service programme has been observed on a new frequency of 5105khz. This is in parallel with 4972.5. (BBCMS)

ANGOLA- It is now reported that Angola now transmits 24 hrs/day in PP on 7245 - 4820 - 3375 khz. (BBCMS)

 $\underline{\text{UGANDA}}$ - The old Blue Channel Service is now reported back to normal on 5026 khz. Reports are being solicited on this service.

RHODESIA- Gwelo's new schedule shows EE on: 6020: 0800-1400; 5012: 0545-1545; 3396: 0350-0615; 2425: 0350-0445. (BBCMS)



The Utility Report is overwhelmed with loggings this month! Please try to limit your contributions to your better loggings. One member sent 185 this month! We addire enthusiasm, but please don't send more than one logging for each station on a single freq. Also, be very careful in deciding what freq you heard -- many are obviously incorrect as submitted. Do not indicate a freq was measured (m) unless it was measured with a BC-221 or its equivalent in accuracy. This cannot be done with a crystal calibrator or a direct-freq readout rx no matter what the quality. Only a good freq meter or digital freq counter properly used can yield the

a good red meter or distal freq counter properly used that the accuracy needed for ute axing. Anything less can be very misleading.

Also, please include all the information indicated on the ute report form whenever it is available. "Station Name" means the name of the company or government agency operating the station. "Call" means the ITU assigned type of call (or tactical call) not, in the case of snips, the vessel identification number (which may be included under "Station Mame"). If the call cannot be determined, strike that portion and give

all the other identifying data you can.

The new SPEEDX Utility Guide is an unmatched aid for ute station identification and contains many freqs for most stations. If the freq cannot be measured nor found listed in the SUG or in other sources, please do not hesitate to list it as approximate (a). If you indicate any freqs to have been measured, include somewhere in the report how you measured it, i.e., with a BC-221 or whatever. Including it at the beginning of

your report with your rx is fine.

And finally, before you send your loggings in, CHECK them for accuracy and completeness! This will insure them to be of the most interest and

value to your fellow SPEEDXers.

This month Jim Young checks in with the first report from TWR Guam and Larry Cotariu submits (via a ricochet off Don Johnson) a transcript of the DX Corner program from Israel Radio of 3 July, 1977. The gist of the article is that Israel Radio will no longer automatically mail QSL cards to reporters, but will mail only to those respondents who desire and request a QSL card. 



# Station Month

DXers and SWLers listen to many stations on the shortwave bands. However, the SWLer and DXer know very little about many of these shortwave stations. Therefore, this month and probably next month, Tips and Topics will be devoted to articles about shortwave radio stations. For some stations, we will look into their history; and for others,

we will look more into their content and programming. We will try to achieve a better understanding of what is a shortwave radio station—be it international or domestic. This month, besides continuing with Adrian M. Feterson's series on VOA relay bases, we will look into the now defunct VOA base on Okinawa, Radio Cairo and the BBC plus much much more. . .

VOICE OF AMERICA RELAY BASES - PART VI

#### MOBILE

#### TEXAS

The first attempt by OWI-VOA in mobile broadcasting at sea took place off the coast of North Africa.

The commander of the Western Task Force had a 5 kw MW transmitter installed on the USS "Texas." As the fleet approached the target on November 7, 1942, OWI-VOA personnel began broadcasting in French on the frequency of Radio Rabat, 601 kHz. This station continued on the air for some hours until the concussion from a salvo fired by the "Texas" put the transmitter out of operation.

#### PHOENIX

The second attempt by VOA at seaboard broadcasting took place in 1945. A Greek vessel, the "Phoenix" was commissioned for this purpose and its electronic cargo consisted of one MW and two SW transmitters. Test broadcasts were conducted off the coast of the USA in 1945 and also in Far Eastern waters, but the ship was never used for regular broadcasting.

#### COURIER

The third attempt at ship broadcasting was in Project Vagabond. An American ship, the USS "Courier" was fitted out with one MW transmitter of 150 kw, and two SW transmitters of 35 kw each. In good weather, a balloon was used to hoist the MW antenna, and an emergency shorter aerial could be used in bad weather.

The VOA relay station, USS "Courier" took a shake-down cruise in the Caribbean and made its first test broadcast on April 2, 1952. This cruise was a success and the ship steamed for the Mediterranean and tied up off the coast of the island of Rhodes. The first test broadcast from this Mediterranean location was made on September 7, 1952. The "Courier" remained at Rhodes for several years pending the completion of a land base station. When VOA Rhodes went on the air in 1964, the "Courier" left the air, and returned to the States for re-fitting.

#### A VISIT TO THE VOICE OF AMERICA: OKINAWA

Frior to receiving orders to Okinawa, from my travel agent--the US Navy, I had tried in vain to log the VOA MW outlet on 1178 kHz, and even the SW outlets seemed difficult at best. However, my faithful travel agent soon put me in the driver's seat, and so on a warm Spring day, my wife and I found ourselves on the road to the VOA transmitter site at Okuma, Okinawa.

Okuma is a small village located near the Northern tip of the island: on one side of the road green lush vegitation stretches seemingly for kilometers and on the other side of the road, the emerald green waters of the East China Sea peacefully wash onto the pearl white beaches. I was so taken by the beauty of the area that I might have missed the turn-off had my wife not pointed out a six-tower array in the near distance--which we were later to learn was the array for the medium-wave transmissions. So, with our course plotted and without benefit of any roadsigns (in English that is), we headed towards the antennas.

On arriving at the transmitter site (the receiver site at Onna is located further south), we were greeted by Mr. Jensen, the Deputy Manager, and Mr. Schlegal, the transmitter Supervisor who joined to give us a very thorough tour of the facilities. Construction began in 1952 and operations commenced in mid-1953 with continual expansion to the present 134 acres upon which the VOA site is situated.

The transmitter building houses the 1178 kHz transmitter which is actually two Continental transmitters of 500 kw phased together to produce a megawatt of power. This transmitter is joined by two 35 kw, one 15 kw and one 100 kw shortwave transmitter plus a 5 kw auxillary transmitter which provides for RTTY service to the IPS: International Press Service located at USIA headquarters throughout Asia.

Program material is received at the Onna receiver site from direct off air monitoring of transmissions from Delano and Dixon relay sites. This is fed via whf circuits to the transmitter site for re-broadcast. Two of the receivers immediately noted were of the Collins 51J series and Hammerlund SP-600 line; Hewlett-Packard frequency synthesizers were also noted.

The MW transmitter is in operation from 1100 to 1600 GMT and provides English Chinese and Korean programming to mainland China, Laos and Korea on beams of 170 and 3150. Reception reports from mainland China indicate no jamming of the English transmissions, however the Chinese Service is jammed a great deal.

The SW transmissions also transmit the same languages to the same target areas or nearby areas, and these also appear to be having an effect as evidenced by reception reports.

And what tour would be complete without checking out the local telephone exchange. Yes, the VOA also has a completely automated telephone exchange system which handles the VOA transmitter site, VOA family housing, and a nearby military recreation center.

After the tour, over tea, several topics were discussed. At present, there is a great deal of speculation over the "planned replacement site" of the VOA Okinawa relay site. The next location is <u>undecided</u>. While several places offer a possible site--Seipan, Micronesia, Korea (South), Hawaii (Remember the old VOA site there?)--however, no specific location has been decided upon. Mr Jensen went on to further point out that from inception to operation takes approximately five years, thus a new site, even after being chosen, wouldn't be on the air too soon. This brought about the point that with host countries becoming fewer and fewer, international broadcasters may be forced to stay at home and beam their message across the miles with power easily exceeding a megawatt!! Can you imagine being a DXer/SWLer who is situated a couple of kilometers away from a megawatt transmitter!! Among other topics discussed, it was mentioned that the VOA site at Foro, Philippines was constructed from almost identical plans as the VOA Okinawa. Lastly on 14 March 1977 at 1500 GMT (12 midnight Japan ST), the VOA Okinawa site

signed-off for the final time, and while the visit was quite pleasent, much like old friends getting together, it was time to hear the final fairwell: "This is the Voice of America concluding its transmission from Okinawa."

EVERYTHING YOU WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT RADIO CAIRO BUT WAS AFRAID TO ASK!

Radio Cairo is a governmentally owned broadcasting station. There are no privately owned radio stations operating in Egypt. However, Hadio Cairo came into operation as a private station in 1934. The Egyptian government took over the station in 1947 and assumed complete control in 1949. Today Radio Cairo is affiliated with the Ministry of National Guidance in order to better serve local African and Overseas listeners.

At present Radio Cairo has 12 services: The general program, the voice of the Arabs, the Sudan program, the local European program, the second program, the holy Quran service, the Middle East service, the people program, the Hebrew service, the Alexandria service, the music service, and the Overseas service.

The Sudan Program which began in 1948 and now transmits 5½ hours a day, and the People Program which began in 1959 to serve all sectors of Egyptian society and transmits 9 hours each day are both popular programs in north-eastern Africa. Another service, the Voice of the Arabs is popular in all parts of the Arab world because it serves the purpose of Arab unity. This service began in July 1953, for only a half hour each day, but it now broadcasts for 22½ hours daily. The Arab Peninsula Program came into existance in 1960 and now transmits for 6 hours daily in addition to the Hebrew Service which broadcasts for 3½ hours daily. There is also the Local European Program and the Second Program which transmits for 3½ hours daily, and the Alexandrian Program which was established in 1959, which transmits for 7 hours a day. The Middle East Service transmits for 13 hours daily.

Internally, Radio Cairo broadcasts its regular Arabic program on several frequency 20 hours per day. But there are also French, English, German, Italian, Greek, and Armenian local programs which cater to their respective communities in Egypt.

Radio Cairo is beamed externally to all Arabic countries, South East and South Asia, East, West, South, and Central Africa, Europe, and North and South America. It broadcasts programs to South East Asia in Arabic, Indonesian, French, Malayan and Thai languages, and to Central Asia in Urdo, Bengali, Hindi and English.

BBC THE BEST FOR INTERNATIONAL NEWS. . . by Russ M. Hollenbeck III. . . Many SWIers and DXers will agree with the fact that the BBC World Service has the best newscasts. BBC started broadcasting news in English in 1932. During world War II, people in occupied Europe risked their lives to listen to BBC news broadcasts because they were regarded as truthful, factual, and accurate. Today, the BBC has 6 million regular listeners throughout the globe; and to this audience, the BBC broadcasts news in English and in 38 other languages. John Tusa, a BBC broadcaster, said that the major concern of the BBC's overseas broadcasts is information. This can be seen by the fact that the BBC is noted for its journalism rather than its diplomacy. And this makes the BBC one of the most independent and respectable shortwave broadcasters in the world. (Much of the material for this article comes from the Los Angeles Times.)

NEW TRANSMITTERS FOR RADIO SOUTH AFRICA. . . In the course of this year, Radio RSA's new giant 500 kw transmitters will be put into operation, adding enormously to the output of the existing 250 kw transmitters. . . (This info is from Yasuo Ishizaki and appeared in RSA Calling, May/Oct. 1977.)

THE FRIENDLY ENGLISH VOICE OF RADIO CLARIN. . . Ed Insinger. . . The inauguration of an English language transmission from Hadio Clarin has added a friendly voice to the airwaves. Easily audible at 2330 GHT on 4850 kHz on the East Coast, comes the identification "This is Santo Domingo," with the amnouncement that listeners can hear a special broadcast from Hadio Clarin, the International Broadcasting Service of the Dominican Republic.

The English programming is most pleasing. A blend of Dominican music, listeners letters, and feature programs spotlighting people, places, and happenings is intended to acquaint listeners with this beautiful and still unspoiled island. Many topics center around tourism and actually encourage listeners to visit the Dominican Republic.

Santo Domingo, the oldest city in the entire New World, has much to offer tourists and vacationers. Prices are very reasonable. It can be reached by jet from New York in only three hours, making it an attraction for stateside visitors. The food is plentiful, including Dominican coffse (costing about \$2.00 a pound) and their specialty drink, rum. The weather in winter ranges between 70 and 80 degrees. Summers are equally beautiful. Sightseeing abounds in historic landmarks such as Christopher Columbus' memorial site (he was actually buried here). For fun, you can attend a horse race or gamble in a casino, and this year's special attraction is the 1977 Miss Universe Contest.

A recent broadcast mentioned that the US dollar was acceptable everywhere, along with credit cards. However, the next best thing to being there is listening firsthand-on shortwave-to Radio Clarin. You'll find them a special treat. Maybe you'll even consider vacationing there too.

ESCUELAS RAPIOFONICAS POPULARES. . . by John Moritz, Jr. . . A nice little Ecuadorian catch is HCER5, Escuelas Radiofonicas Populares. Located in the city of Riobamba, in the Chimborazo provice of Ecuador, Escuelas Radiofonicas has been on the air for about fifteen years now, operating in the 75 meter band, on a frequency of 3985 kHz. Operating six days a week, with a break on Saturday, programming usually runs from around 1000 to 0300+ GMT. Programming is in both SS and Indian languages, with the music being basically of the campesino type. Apparently, however, they do deviate during periods, such as when Ralph Perry, during a trip last summer to Ecuador, heard them doing Motorcraft ads and playing pop Ecuadorian tunes. Since the populace of Chimborazo is basically Indian, the station caters their programs to them, with many programs being of an educational nature, using the Quechua language. HCER5 puts out 1 kw of power, and can be heard best during local, quiet mornings stateside. It is occasionally heard here during our local evenings, but not too often. If you happen to latch on to this fine little station, you might try writing to either Senor Washington Luna, the man in charge of technical operations, or to Padre Ruben Veloz, the director general. Letters should be in Spanish. There is no need to send return postage, but it would be a good gesture. The address is Apartado 4755, Riobamba, Ecuador. Try it, you'll like it. And while you are at it, tell them how much you enjoy the music! (The author would like to thank and acknowledge the assistance of Ralph W. Perry, and Radio Station HCJB in providing various information included in this article.)

# QRM

#### "THE OLD RADIO SHOP"

In my 17 years of DXing, radio and electronics (plus or minus a few maybe) there has always been a limiting factor in attaining the "supreme" DX log. It has varied from the kitchen fluorescent lights at the age 15 that had to stay on all evening, to the night TV watcher in an apartment years later. If one must watch the boob tube, I wish they would at least incorporate a timer to shut it off when they fall asleep.

In the course of building better and better gear, the limiting factor in signal to noise ratio has been how much junk you receive besides the desired signal. In attempting to shut off, or reduce, some of these noises, quite a bit of experience has been gleaned from wandering around in the wee hours of the morning with a transistor radio trying to locate and eliminate the offending QRM.

I have also gone with Mr. Leo Gersch, Radio Inspector for the San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and an ex-lineman. Both Leo's comments and pictures appear in this article. When one gets right down to it, there has been very little written about QRM from powerlines, etc., especially with the shortwave listener in mind. In this article I'll try to explain the most common sourses of annoying noise.

I guess it all started in Pacific Beach, California when I ran an apartment house and had ace DXer John Kolb living there. Between the two of us we probably logged every fish tank in Pacific Beach! By far the nastiest QRM for a SWLer in the city has to be the infernal TV set. These have what is called a "horizontal sweep oscillator" with which (among other things) they develope the high voltage for the picture tube. This operates on 15.75 kHz. The normal output tube is capable of delivering 20-30 watts @ 15 kHz, depending on how they are driven and what type of tube is employed. Most TV sets drive the heck out of this tube, and generally when you loose your picture and still have sound it's the output tube that goes.

The main problem with this is that there is little or <u>no</u> harmonic suppression in this circuit. A harmonic is a wave having a frequency that is an integral multiple of the fundamental frequency. Thusly for 15.75 kHz fundamental you have harmonics at two times, three times, four times, etc. For example, 53 times 15.75 kHz = 834.75 kHz which happens to be the frequency of Radio Belize in the British Honduras. Not a rare catch in the southern USA, but if you want to listen to it you have to put up with the QRM, even if your TV is off. In an apartment house other TV's will almost block this frequency. And remember, the RF adds up. It's quite noticeable in the 19 meter band for example.

HAM transmitters, CB's, etc., are required by the FCC to <u>effectively</u> suppress these harmonic frequencies. Until recently TV manufacturers have not had to, and what is required now is almost not worth the effort. The cure for TV harmonics? Move! And hope the new QTH is better.

QRM - The Old Radio Shop - Grant Manning (continued).....Probably the #2 noise source is the unidentified buzz, either intermittent or steady. You find yourself hunched over the receiver early some evening trying to get an ID on a rare South American station that only comes on the air once a week. All of a sudden, just when they start into the IS & ID a horrible B-U-Z-Z-Z-Z-Z permeates the ether, pinning your S-meter at 20db over nine. You just blew two hours of labor trying to log the station! How many times has that happened to you? What's causing the buzz? We ask Mr. Leo Gersch:

Author: What are the most common household items that cause this noise?

Leo Gersch: Fish tank heaters. Every week I find one or two. In the winter time it's electric heating pads. People buy brand new heating pads or tropical fish tank heaters and the thermostats are no good. Light dimmers are becoming more popular now, and therefore more troublesome.

Even a gas range can cause noise problems. Gaffers & Sattler put out, if you can believe this, a gas range with an electric control on the oven that had a bum thermostat! They have manufactured thousands of these. Orange County is invested with them are several other areas. (I had one of these when living in Poway. When it came on it would almost peg my SPR-4 @ 20db over 9 with a loud buzz rising in frequency from low to high, and finally locking on after five seconds. gm)

Author: Do you replace these bad thermostats?

Leo: No! We don't touch them.

All we can do is tell the customer that it is causing a problem. That it is a faulty product and should be correctd by the dealer or factory.

Author: Can anything be done to stop a customer from using faulty equipment?

Leo: All we can do is ask a customer to discard a piece of equipment that is causing QRM, or have it fixed. I believe that the FCC can

step into cases if they are extreme. What the actual readings have to be before the FCC takes action, I don't know. Somewhere around 50uv/M. If you have a piece of equipment that is in violation of the FCC regulations, they can cite you and take the matter to court.

England & Canada have the best system. If you want to buy a tropical fish tank heater, buy one manufactured in England. They are not allowed to manufacture trash like US manufactures are.

Author: Aren't light dimmers inherently noisy?

Leo: The cheap ones are, the good ones are not. There again nobody is watching the manufactures. There is a capacitor that can be built in to quench the QRM at very little cost. We are too loose. We are over governed, and yet things that could help everyone are ignored.

Author: Do you have any contact with other power companies such as Southern California "Edison?

Leo: No. At one time I gave some thought to trying to get together with Bill Nelson, SCE's amateur representative, to maybe get a group of us to meet, but.....

Author: Your job is entirely experience?

Leo: Yes. By the seat of your pants. Your first one is always the hardest to find, when a newly manufactured item enters the market. Each item has a sound of its own. If I hear a heating pad, I know what it is. If I hear a fish tank heater, I know what that is. It would not be practical to filter out what comes into your house on the power lines. You have to locate the sourse.

QRM - The Old Radio Shop - Grant Manning (continued)..... got fairly good at shaking poles, which is what you do to find the source of actual power line hash. Leo Gersch drives a company provided Ford van which is equiped with a HQ-150A receiver, and a Delcon amplifier with an ultrasonic probe, among other things. The receiver has its AVC defeated and a meter mounted on the dashboard of the van that indicates the amount of hash received (wired across the voice coil of the HQ-180A). To locate noisy poles we drove around in the area of my home (then) and watched the meter.

Author: What makes the poles cause QRM?

Leo: Almost all interference is caused by loose hardware. A broken or cracked insulator happens, but that is rare. A common misunderstanding is to place the blame for noise on the transformers. In our entire system, I don't find one, or even average one a year, that are causing the QRM. People pick on the transformers because they are large and obvious. Dead ends cause 90% of the interference problems. This is where the lines end or change directions. (See photo on next page) The hardware is bonded together and grounded but, with expansion and shrinkage of the wood, the bondings come loose and arcing occurs from the hardware to the bond. It's a continual problem until double coil spring washers are installed. When a maintainance crew goes out, it's standard proceedure to install these washers if the pole is not so equipped. Outside the Dead Ends, the most common cause of QRM is loose bolts on a crossarm brace. The braces are V shaped and clamped to the crossarm with a  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 7" bolt. If there is no Dead End. these loose bolts are a common cause of interference.

To locate noisy poles, in addition to driving around with the receiver on, close visual inspection from the ground and mechanical vibration are employed. To shake a pole sounds easier than it is. The idea is to listen on the radio for immediate disturbance of the noise as the pole is shaken. If when the pole is shaken, an immediate interuption or change is noted in the noise, chances are that you've found the source. If it takes a few seconds for a change in the noise to take place, the source is probably a pole or two away from where you are standing. The easiest way to shake a pole is withthe guy wire. If there is no guy wire at the pole, you take this large sledge hammer.....WHAM! You bash the pole a good one while listening to the receiver. got to bash a few poles.

There was a pole close to where I lived that was fairly new. It had been reported twice (by myself) and was still making noise (\$9) most of the time. I asked Leo just how far SDG & E had to go to satisfy a HAM or DXer.

Leo: Nine-tenths is customer relations, trying to get along with our customers. In a case like this, it's lack of cooperation amongst the people that are supposed to be doing the work.

Be they pro or con, your efforts are certainly appreciated by most broadcasters.

I correspond regularly with several International Broadcasters and the one comment I hear the most is the lack of comments  $\delta$  suggestions on their programming by listeners. It's just the few who make the effort by adding a few remarks to a reception report. Where are the rest of us?

Are we so passive that we don't care? Are we so busy that we can't spare a few minutes to drop a line to our favorite stations? Can't we afford the 31c postage? Don't we have any opinions at all? Are we 100% happy with the present programming? Isn't the hobby a two-way affair? If each of us puts a bean in the pot, won't we all eat better?

As more & more hobbyists are becoming more interested in the programming on shortwave, in place of just listening to obtain a QSL card, it would seem we should take a more active part in selecting & improving what we listen to. How can we do this? By writing to the broadcaster with suggestions and comments. Remember, most International Broadcasters attempt to present programming that is of interest to us, the listener, so they can hold their audience. How else can they reach the largest number of people to promote the country's image and views? The broadcasters need us the listener and we need the broadcasters.

Cooperation and active participation could well improve the programming. Do you like this feature? Do you dislike that feature? Would you like to have a feature added or eliminated? How is the broadcaster to know what features attract & hold the largest audiences unless we write and tell them? Most International Broadcasters ask for our comments, either over the air or on their program schedules. If many have the same thought, changes are made. Also remember that the lack of correspondence from listeners has been the downfall of several good programs in the past

So, let's "get off the dime" and help the broadcasters and ourselves by writing a letter or two today. I've got my pen in hand, how about you? "Dear Radio Nibi-Nibi: I sure enjoy your sub-audible audio....." Heck, I think I will wait until tommorow to finish this letter.....
