
For Chris Lobdell...a case of tomato soup cans so that he may harken back to his college days and build antennas to his heart's content...




ANTENNA TUNER - PRESELECTOR.....WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE? An antenna tuner (AT) & a preselector (PS) try to do the same thing - deliver a stronger signal to the receiver - but are very different inside. An AT is very simple, consisting or 3 or 4 parts and requiring no external power for operation. It works by matching the antenna impedance to that of the receiver input. Maximum power will flow when the output impedance of the source(antenna)equals that of the load(receiver). ATs are usually explained by saying they electrically make an antenna look longer or shorter, but that is a simplified explaination and certainly does not mean a 10 foot antenna will pick up as much signal as a 100 foot antenna. The AT just helps the antenna get the most signal possible into the receiver. This can be compared to an auto transmission which provides several different gear ratios to match the engine speed to that required by the wheels under different conditions. While the AT is electrically simple, it has two or three interacting controls, which must be adjusted to get the maximum signal. While many people may disagree, l've found them so hard to find the proper adjustment, that I do not consider them to be that useful. Signal strength increase is seldom more than one or two S units.

A preselector, by contrast, is more expensive and requires external power, either power line or battery. A PS consists of a tube or transistor amplifier to increase the antenna signal level before delivery to the set. This is sort of a brute force method but, depending on the amplifier, can provide up to 5 or 6 S units of gain. A PS is much easier to operate, usually having a single dial, like a receiver dial, roughly calibrated in frequency, which is kept peaked for maximum signal as the receiver is tuned. Since the PS has so much gain, it may overload the receiver at times, causing spurious responses - signals appearing in the receiver which really aren't transmitted on that frequency - ghosts anyone? If the PS has a gain control, this can be used to prevent receiver overload by reducing the signal levels applied to the receiver. In some cases a PS may not help a receiver. Any amplifier, be it tube or transistor, also generates a small amount of noise as it operates. This noise is present in the PS output, as well as the amplified signal from the antenna. The noise added to the signal can be expressed as a noise figure, or signal to noise ratio. If this noise figure of the PS is not better thanthat of the receiver, it can end up degrading receiver performance.

A PS is a preamplifier with tuned circuits so that it only amplifies signals near the desired one, instead of all frequencies equally. This greatly reduces images by adding more tuned circuits to the receiver, and is one of the main benefits to a receiver like the DX-860, which has good sensitivity but very poor image response. One case where neither an AT or PS will help is when a strong noise level is being picked up along with the desired signal. There is nothing that can be done to improve on the signal once it is picked up by the antenna. Try the following test to see if a PS might help you. Tune your receiver to a spot between stations and disconnect the antenna. If the noise level stays about the same, the noise is in your receiver and a PS may help. This test may also reveal your receiver meeds repair, if the noise level stays too high. In most cases an AT will not help with images. For use with transmitters they will help prevent harmonic radiation, but with single conversion receivers with an IF of 455 kHz, the image is only 910 kHz above the desired signal, too close for the AT to have any selectivity against. VENEZUELA - A FIRST IMPRESSION

As I write this month's column I have just returned from my second trip in as many months to Venezuela. During these two trips it was my good fortune to see quite a bit of that oil-rich country and to learn a great deal about its culture. I also got to do a little DXing while I was there which gives me a good excuse to share my experiences with you.

The first impression one gets of Caracas is one of progress. New construction dominates the horizon and the "autopistas" are choked with late model U.S style cars. Even the "barrios" or slums which hug the steep mountains pinching Caracas into a narrow valley look prosperous with TV antennae jutting from every roof. The numerous stores also reflect this oil-fed prosperity with luxury goods of all kinds jamming the shelves.

Venezuela is a country growing at a phenomenal phase and Government services, as is true for most rapidly developing countries, are struggling to keep pace. Food is plentiful but expensive and often unavailable for short periods. I could not buy tonic or soda water in one store and, in another, saw a sign that black beans, a Venezuelan staple, were not available. This is because so many farmers have left the farms for the jobs in the city Venezuela must import ever increasing amounts of foodstuffs. This in turn clogs the ports so temporary shortages occur. The flood of people into the cities, principally Caracas, causes overloading of power and water systems with the result that these systems frequently breakdown. The authorities struggle to keep up but, these problems cannot be solved overnight.

I found the countryside much the same as Caracas. Signs of prosperity are evident everywhere but poverty has not been totally licked. I visited Judibana, Punto Fijo and Cardón on the Faraguana Peninsula as well as Maracaibo and Coro. Judibana, Punto Fijo, and Cardon are small company towns housing the workers employed in two of the world's largest oil refineries. One of these refineries processes 680,000 barrels per day of oil and has three huge lakes of low sulfur fuel oil, each holding more than a million gallons, destined for U.S. markets. Coro is a market centerand resort area that once served as the entry point for slaves brought from Africa by the Spaniards. It has a well preserved colonial district that is very picturesque as is the colorful open air market that sells everything imaginable. Maracaibo, on the other hand, is much like Caracas in that it is a modern city with much industry. However, despite its size, Maracaibo lacks the sophistication of Caracas as evidenced by the absence of the business suit and tie.

DXing in Venezuela is, of course, a real treat with the tropical bands active all day long. Interestingly enough you cannot hear maracaibo area stations in Caracas during the daylight hours nor can you hear Caracas-based station, Rumbos excepted, in maracaibo when the sun is high. At night, however, all this changes and even the 49 m.b. is full of Venezuelans from all over the country. Some stations not normally logged in North America, such as K. Mil Cuarenta, 6010 khz, and Radio Valles del Tuy, 6129 khz, dominate their frequencies in Caracas, their prime target area, but suffer heavy interference in Maracaibo. I also noted that some stations, like Radio barquisimeto, cut power during the daytime hours while others dropped shortwave altogether until returning for the 2200 on prime time listening period. The morning hours seemed to be the most active time for Venezuelans but evenings weren't far behind.

An interesting surprise was daytime reception of R. Iris on 3380 khz when the only other Ecuadorian noted was HCJB in the 49 m.b. and reception

was guite good. Another interesting log ing was kavid Universo, La Paz, Bolivia on 6005 khz which regularly dominated that channel around 0900 G&T and was unmistakable with "William Fell Overture" theme music before its ID announcements.

Speaking of announcements, a frequently heard announcement noted was a listing of the "farmacias de turno". In Venezuela the drug stores in each town take "turnos" staying open 24 hrs. and, as you have no doubt already guessed, such announcements list those open round the clock to let folks know who they are and where to find them. Beer ads are also quite common and, since I couldn't buy tonic or soda water in Judibana, I got well acquainted with cervezas Polar, Zulia and Regional. One also hears many ads for various "centro comerciales" which are shopping centers or malls where all stores chip in to pay the cost of the ad. Such ads are heard most frequently this time of year as the various stores try to lure those Bolivars away from the Christmas snoppers.

Venezuela still has many festivals and you can ofter join in the fun via your radio. Nov. 18-27, for example, is the Festival de La Chinita" or "Virgin" in Maracaibo and this festival is similar to the Brazilian carnival in many ways. One such similarity is that upbeat songs called "gaitas" are written especially for this festival and a contest is held to select the best one. Theæ "gaitas" are heavily featured by local stations, such as Radio Mara, Radio Maracaibo and Kadio Popular, and often dominate the Venezuelan pop charts for months afterwards.

These then are my first impressions of Venezuela and what little DXing I was able to do while there. I have tried to give a balanced view but, in a few short paragraphs it is difficult to summarize two weeks worth of impressions. I look forward to going again and to the opportunity to DX a bit more in the "tropics" since I enjoyed my stay just as much as I hope you will enjoy this brief resume of my trip.

ARGENTINE GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES BROADCASTING POLICY

The BBC MS reports that Radio El Mundo carried a statement on 18 October which outlined the ruling Junta's position on broadcasting in Argentina. According to Radio El Mundo, a spokesman for the Public Information Secretariat said that radio broadcasts should serve the country in every respect and to this end the junta had established a broadcasting system consisting of private and public networks. The Government's policy was, he continued, to see that all major government activities received the widest possible coverage and that the Government would exercise its right to cover itself only when the private networks cannot or will not provide coverage of certain events.

The spokesman added that the Argentine State reserved the right to install and maintain an official broadcasting network, consisting of at least one radio station and one television station in each province. This is in addition to installing other stations in areas where the private sector shows no interest or where the lack of facilities do not allow the installation of commercial radio networks.

It was also stated that the Government's policy is that the government run network should be non-commercial and maintained with national funds and revenue from taxes paid by private broadcasters.

I've had some sugestions on dividing up certain countries like Antigua, Canada, and Neth, Antilles. I did that this month. You can find the loggings easier. I had an idma on dividing up the column into North and South America, Write and tell me what you think of that.



Frequency Selection

The broadcasting year is divided into four seasons. These same seasons are observed by all International Broadcasters and are:

- "M" March-April
- "J" May-June-July-August
- "S" September-October

"D" November-December-January-February

These four periods are commonly referred to as Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter, the corresponding seasons of the Northern Temperate Zones. They are based on propagation conditions, rather than the climate or weather. Propagation, in a large part, depends on the hours of sunlight present in certain areas of the path the signal uses, and these divisions of the year are convenient ways to take into account these seasonal propagation changes.

There are several sources of information on which our frequency selection is based. Of course, the ultimate goal is for bands, and those frequencies within the bands, which will give the best target area signal with the least interference so the largest number of people can hear us. Let us follow the process of FREQUENCY SELECTION, in the approximate sequence in which it takes place.

The process starts with band selection. This selection is able to be worked out through known scientific methods. Various countries have developed their own methods, but the end result of all is the same, practically speaking. HCJB has decided to use the method developed by the Institute for Telecommunication Sciences of the United States Government. Based on: a) the coordinates of the transmitting station, b) the coordinates of the re-ceiving station, c) the predicted sun-spot number, d) the month and day in the year. A series of frequencies can be obtained for every hour of the day.

These frequencies are:

- HPF Highest Possible Frequency. That frequency which is "open" 10% of the time and "closed" 90% of the time.
- MUF Maximum Useable Frequency. That frequency which is "open" 50% of the time and "closed" 50% of the time.
- FOT Frequency of Optimum Transmission. That frequency which is "open" 90% of the time and "closed" 10% of the time.
- LUF Lowest Useable Frequency. That frequency which, taking into account the transmitting "Effective Radiated Power" and the noise in the receiving location, will put a useable signal into the receiving location 80% of the time. Operating below this frequency will lower this percentage due to the additional absorbtion losses in the lonosphere.


It is the goal of HCJB to operate one transmitter near the MUF and a second at the FOT on all transmissions. If a third transmitter is available, it is operated below the FOT, providing that frequency is not below the LUF. We use data compiled by computer for every other month and to some 20 key cities around the world. The reception reports received have verified the veracity of the computer predictions, and continue to do so.

Another important factor affecting our transmissions is the LOCAL TIME in the TARGET AREA. There are times when certain bands are very good for transmission but those times occur when there are very few listeners, such as the wee hours of the morning, or the middle of the afternoon in the target area. Those hours, by the way, are very good hours to pick up other than the ordinary stations at times when they are beaming to other parts of the world. The interference is considerably less then, as well.

(This article is a re-run that appeared in the September 1974 issue. It is still timely and gives a good look "behind-the-scene" of a major International Broadcaster.)

To determine the best hours for transmission, several factors must be considered. The local customs and habits of the listeners are important. In some countries, the listener goes to bed very late and rises very early, while in others, the opposite occurs. Some countries have important TV programs on the state operated networks which would take priority over Shortwave Listening. These & other factors must be considered before "Prime Time in the Target Area" can be fixed. Generally speaking, from 7:00 AM to 9:00 AM and from 7:00 PM to 11:00 PM local time at the receiving location are the best times. These then, are the hours of interest, and for which the best bands and frequencies must be determined.

Certain languages and target areas have preference over others. Here at HCJB the Broadcast Director has to determine the priorities and set how many hours of transmission each of the various language divisions can have, and as well he has to resolve the conflicts which occur. Compromises are made and changes incorporated to come up with a combination which will adequately serve the audience we want to cover, and at the same time be within the capability of the equipment we have available. Our transmitters, other than medium wave, average over 23 hours on the air dally, with the little time remaining in the day used for cleaning and routine maintenance.




When the languages, target areas and hours have been determined, transmitter assignments are made, appropriate for the service which the various transmissions require. The bands are chosen according to the previously discussed material, and the actual selection of the frequencies bagins. The meter bands, within which we are required to operate are specified by the International Telecommunications Union. These bands are:

> 49 Meter Band - 5950 kHz to 6200 kHz 31 Meter Band - 9500 kHz to 9775 kHz 25 Meter Band -11700 kHz to 11975 kHz 19 Meter Band -15100 kHz to 15450 kHz 16 Meter Band -17700 kHz to 17900 kHz 13 Meter Band -21450 kHz to 21750 kHz

Not all broadcasters stay within the limits above. But, as the Ecuadorian Government is a signer of the International Telecommunications Union Regulations, we must abide by those regulations.

All of our frequencies are registered through the Ecuadorian Government agencies with the ITU and the International Frequency Registration Board. The registration information includes the hours, the target areas, transmitting power and antenna Information such as gain, direction, vertical angle and beam width. The IFRB then publishes this material on all broadcasters in four volumes printed through the year according to the seasons "M", "Ju", "S" and "D". The Information is not 100% correct, but is a good point of departure from which to make up a final schedule.

The reasons for not being completely accurate are several. Some countries do not cooperate with the IFRB and therefore, do not register any of their frequencies. Many changes are made to the broadcasting schedules, and while "change of Notifications" are filed, the



Combining the IFRB Frequency book, listeners reports from previous schedules, and a good deal of experience, we then determine what we feel are the best frequencies within the bands for doing the job. Experience is valuable in putting the proper weight on the listeners reports as well as knowing what our own and other broadcasters equipment is capable of. We attempt to avoid interference in so far as possible. There are times however when all available frequencies are in use. We then have to look for a frequency where we have the best possibility of coming out on top. This schedule, comprising times, frequencies and target areas is then printed and distributed to some 40 International Broadcasters. They have already been sent a tentative schedule, a schedule drawn up some 6 months before, and made without the benefit of the IFRB book. Not all of these reciprocate, but many do. During the preceeding 6 months we have been studying schedules, making comparisons, checking out listener's reports and exchanging letters with the Broadcasters in attempts to work out possible interference problems.

This state of information exchange, checking up and compromise, goes on right up to the time that the schedule goes into effect. Sometimes no changes are possible and a stalemate will occur. Also, at times, when we get right down to the wire, there is a rapid exchange of telegrams in order to avoid a last minute problem.

Then comes 0100 GMT the first Sunday of the month in the new period. This is the hour when the new schedule goes into effect. The first couple of weeks are turmoil as all the unseen and previously unknown problems suddenly come to the surface.

Regular, almost daily checks are made with our various language divisions to get a look at the first mail that comes in. The first several weeks are critical, especially with regard to new frequencies. The listeners' letters are indispensable during this period. Our monitors letters and reports are scrutinized very carefully to see how things are doing. This is the final proof of 6 months of searching, comparing, calculating and making calculated guesses.


Based on the results of the listeners reports for the first couple of weeks of the new schedule period, we might find that additional adjustments are needed to avoid interference we did not anticipate, and slip into some open spots that equally we did not anticipate. We are usually not aware of these fine details without monitors and listeners with their letters and reports for us. Usually after a few weeks, things settle down and stabalize for the remainder of the schedule period. There are occasions when changing conditions or other Broadcasting schedules and their changes might dictate some changes on our part later in the season. These changing conditions might accentuate otherwise moderate interference and make these later moves adviseable.

The key and goal to the whole process is of course:

"CAN THE LISTENER HEAR AND UNDER-STAND THE PROGRAM MATERIAL ?"

If he cannot, then what can be done to improve the situation? Sometimes the answer is nothing. But, beleive me, we want to be aware of the problems and will continue to work on them until some sort of answer is obtained, even if the answer is wait until next season.

We cannot answer the question without hearing from those who do the listening



to the signal in the target area. You, the listeners are the ultimate in proof. Without your letter, we still don't know of the failure or success of our work. As being very much in the middle of the whole business I would appreciate hearing from you. I will be looking for your letter.





Another year gone down the drain. Again let me express my thanks to the many of you who, through your contributions, have made this column possible. Once more it is time to open the rolls to membership (involuntary) in my "Faithful Twelve" club. This year Bill Miller, Dave Peters, and Wilfred Stone have qualified by sending in QSL reports every month of the year. And Tom Smith, Glenn Thompson, and Bob Yajko earn a pair of hashmarks on their membership cards (imaginary) for not having missed an issue in the last three years. That's quite a record -- and believe me, I appreciate it. To all who have contributed to this issue, and especially to the 14 first time reporters, my thanks. Likewise, the membership has exceeded last year's country total (SPEEDX/EDXC list)

of 136 by a healthy margin--to wit, the 147 reported in the masthead above. Some countries (Nepal, Reunion, El Salvador, etc) are still conspicuous by their absence; others, such as Afghanistan and Antarctica are back, and Andorra, Cook Islands and Laos appear for the first time in years.

Finally, Larry Talbot has contributed a letter from Deutsche Welle explaining their QSL policy in light of the heavy flow of reports and the consequent workload on the department (as you know, DW no longer lists date, time, frequency or transmitter site). A pertinent paragraph follows ...

"In this connection, please be advised that neither QSL cards already prepared by listeners nor stamped cards can be accepted since these measures would put into question the new regulation adopted and make our work more difficult. By the way, you yourself can contribute to receiving confirmation of the reception report sooner by letting us have, together with the report, a self-addressed envelope. It is not necessary to send any stamps."

The last report I had, DW claimed to be receiving about 90,000 QSL requests per year --and that was several years ago. Answering all of them would be quite a job. By the way, the DW QSLs that I have run about 4" x 6" -- which would require a legal sized envelope unless you want the card folded. On with the show.



FROM THE PAPERS This month, most of the articles appearing in Tips and Topics will be from the newspapers. It is always interesting to see how the papers cover the shortwave

scene. Most newspapers do not cover shortwave extensively, if at all. But what they do cover, can sometimes be very interesting and informative, as you will see. In this issue, you will find articles about pirate radio stations in Australia and Italy, an article about the "Voix de la France," and an article about radio in the Falkland Islands, plus much, much more. . .

<u>FREEDOM FIGHTERS' RADIO</u>. ...Three times a week, a faint, crackling radio message is beamed into Darwin - the world's only link with East Timorese fighting against Indonesian invaders. The message is heralded by the song of Mt. Ramelau, East Timor's highest peak - and symbolic rallying point for Timorese fighting for their independence. The song has also become known as the "Hymn of the East Timor Revolution" and calls for a struggle for freedom comparable to the majesty of Mt. Ramelau. These words were written by Francisco Borja da Costa, killed on December 1, 1975, when Indonesia launched its attack on Dili.

Radio Maubere has become the Voice of Timor and a lonely link with the outside world, since Fretilin forces began broadcasts "from somewhere in East Timor's northern border region" in September 1975. A receiver has been set up in a small city office in Darwin to monitor the broadcasts. Broadcast recordings are being translated for local use, then sent on to Sydney to be distributed to external Fretilin leaders around the world.

On duty to monitor the broadcasts are two East Timorese refugees, Carlos Pereira, 25, and Jose Franco, 19, who were both evacuated from Dili to Darwin aboard refugee ships in August 1975, following the Indonesian infiltration into Timor. Radio Maubere broadcasts on 3804 kHz, and monitored in Darwin each Wednesday, Friday and Sunday by a handful of concerned people, has been the main source of information from Fretilin forces since the Indonesian invasion. Though no reciprocal contact can be made with the people still in Timor, they are the only broadcasts to be recorded. Sometimes lasting up to three hours, these consist of music, announcements to Timorese people, and a news bulletin repeated four times in the Tetum Fortuguese, English and Indonesian languages. The voice heard most often over Radio Maubere is that of the Minister for Information and National Security, Alarico Jorge Fernandes.

"We don't know exactly where the radio equipment is set up in East Timor," Jose said. "We understand it could be in the northern coastal region. They have a very low power transmitter and broadcasts are often not clear. The quality depends a lot on the weather conditions in Timor." Carlos said that while Radio Maubere now acknowledged that broadcasts were being monitored in Darwin, and sent special messages, the main purpose of the broadcasts was to reach the Timorese people still in the country.

The radio equipment being used to monitor Maubere broadcasts is the property of the Timorese community in Darwin. Since broadcasts first started coming through, the radio has been in the homes of Timorese families, some who had lived here for years, others who had come to Darwin aboard the refugee ships, MacDili and Komopira Maru in August, 1975. The equipment was eventually set up in the city office, so broadcasts could reach a wider group in the community. The equipment monitoring Radio Maubere in Darwin is again in need of new headquarters. People recording messages, have been told by owners of the building they now occupy, to remove the large, but necessary, outside aerial as soon as possible. The messages are already barely audible. Without the aerial, they would be impossible to hear. (Darwin Star, February 3, 1977.)

'PIRATE' RADIOS RUN WILD IN ITALY. . .On a recent warm summer night, long after the programs of Italy's state-controlled radio and televison network went off the air, a group of young Roman men sat at an out-door cafe listening to the sultry voice of a woman announcer describe over FM radio her scanty bedtime attire. From Naples in the Italian south to the northern city of Milan - where cable TV watchers are treated to a nightly striptease - late-night radio listeners were choosing between all-night pop music or debates on major social and political problems.

A relative novelty in Italy, where the public radio and television network, RAI has had a monopoly over the air waves for the last 24 years, the 600-odd so-called "free" or "pirate" radios that have sprung up around the country like so many wild mushrooms are providing Italian audiences with a greater selection of programs than ever before. Already the bane of RAI's existence since a 1974 court ruling sanctioned private transmissions of local cable TV stations and reception of foreign networks with the purchase of a special antenna, the growing number of private radio and television stations now seem likely to jeopardize the monopoly's survival.

Indeed after years of crisis that produced a controversial reform bill, RAI officials were stunned last month to learn of an 11-to-2 decision by the Supreme Court that local air waves are open to everyone. RAI's president, Benjamino Finocchairo, condemned the court decision as a "farce" and "buffoonery." He said in an interview last week that it "has opened the way to chaos." The court's decision, not yet published in full, may be revolutionary in its impact.

"Although the court's decision refers specifically only to local transmissions and preserves RAI's exclusive right to broadcast nationally, it is nevertheless a severe blow to the monopoly," says Giorgia Bogi, a deputy of the small centrist Republican party and a member of the 40-man parliamentary watchdog commission that supervises the publicly-owned corporation's programming. "In fact," he adds, "it could mean the end of the monopoly unless the competition of the new stations forces a real shakeup from within."

Two years ago, in its earlier ruling regarding the air waves, the Supreme Court said the monopoly would remain constitutionally defensible only if certain conditions involving impartiality, objectivity, completeness of information, and the right of access - which, it said, did not then exist - were met. The court's 1974 decisions were a major factor in hastening the passage of a new reform bill designed to correct the defects of the monopoly which, although lauded for major productions like the widely acclaimed "Leonardo da Vinci" later bought by CBS, was also notorious for censorship and a lack of objectivity. According to one former RAI official, the tendency was "to think of news as propaganda rather than information." Touchy subjects, such as divorce, abortion and political corruption were downplayed or ignored. According to critic Italo Moscati, deputy chief of the experimental programs department, censorship was built into the monopoly's structure, with Italy's governing parties bargaining for broadcasts as well as personnel.

-During almost 15 years of center-left governments, hiring policy at RAI, according to a popular joke, was proportional: "Two Christian Democrats, one socialist, and someone who is professionally qualified. The new reform bill, which strengthened the powers of the parliamentary commission, called for the reorganization of the country's two national channels and three nationwide radio stations as well as for greater decentralization. The idea was to promote freedom of information and provide greater access, says Bogi, but after two years of bickering the only result is slightly better news programs produced by two competing RAI TV stations, a "Catholic" network run primarily by the ruling Christian Democrats and a "lay" network controlled primarily by Italy's Socialists. While RAI officials were busy discussing how to implement the reform, independent radio stations began taking over unused FM frequencies to broadcast music, local news, advertising, talk shows and sometimes political propaganda. Acting without any official authorization, given the Italian Postal and Telecommunications ministry's continued failure to publish a much needed frequency map, the "free" radios have been steadily drawing listeners away from RAI's three national radio stations. The new stations are divided into three principal groups - political, commercial and esoteric. Collectively they have offered their listeners better, more varied music and a more accurate reflection of today's Italian society.

RAI has given no indication that it plans to fold without a fight. Tt. recently decided to introduce color with the Montreal Olympic Games to counter both the anticipated new Italian channels and foreign television. "Color is our best card," RAI's Finocchiaro said. "At this point it is a question of survival." With color TV sets now costing at least \$600, however, others did not agree. "What most people want is not color but choice," says one media buff who has traveled frequently to the United States. (The Washington Post, July 28, 1976).

FALKLANDS' RADIO REEN OFTEN COMES TO RESCUE. . . When the inhabitants of this windy British Crown Colony in the frigid South Atlantic need any-thing they call Katherine Rowlands by radio. Mrs. Rowlands better known as "Radio Reen" by her scattered listeners presides over the Port Stanley base station which monitors some 37 shortwave radio bases in the Falklands.

The radio system, operated by the local government, serves as a lifeline for almost inaccesible sheep-raising settlements, providing services ranging from a radio doctor to wedding messages. "You don't get bored in this job," said Mrs. Rowlands, in her 30's, as she fiddled with dials of her radio transmitter-receiver in a tiny wooden shed, adjacent to a tiny wooden firehouse overlooking Port Stanley.

There are only 12 miles of roads in the Falklands, a loose collection of 200 islands about the size of Northern Ireland. Outside of Port Stanley, where 900 of the colony's 1,957 staunchly British islanders live, small boats, float planes and tough fourwheeled vehicles provide limited access to outlying areas. A small but efficient crank-phone system operates in Port Stanley and connects some of the larger settlements further away; but for most of the other areas, radio must be used.

The islands earn 90% of their revenue from exports of wool to the United The islands earn 90% of their revenue from exports of wool to the united Kingdom. Since sheep require large areas in which to graze, many islanders, by necessity, live in remote places with names like Carcass Island Poul Bay. Some of these hardy islanders don't even come to Port Stanley for years on end and lack all but the most basic of services. "This is a place where you have to do almost everything yourself," says an island resident. "If you don't, you don't survive."

Great Britain has ruled the Falklands since 1833, although Argentina 400 miles to the west says its settlers were here first and also claim the island as territory. Visitors here find it difficult to believe that in the 20th century, there still exists such isolation. "The basic problem here is not that of communicating with the outside world but with each other," said Ted Rowlands, British Minister of State, after a five-day tour of the Falklands which recently took him to the remotest settlements.

There is no television here, no newspaper, no local magazines, no theater, except one or two old movies shown weekly in the town hall. The govern-ment provides news and music for several hours a day on "the box," a local broadcast service piped into loudspeakers installed in Port Stanley homes and its five taverns. If can also be picked up on shortwave. The news is mostly picked up from British Broadcasting Corp. transmissions. Local fare recently included: "commentaries from sheep shearing contests" and "the weather forecast followed by commentaries from the sheep dog trials."

One of the two doctors from the Port Stanley Hospital just a few blocks away from Reen's shed presides over medical consultations at 8:30 a.m. daily. The doctor patiently listens to even the most seemingly trival medical complaint, if only to give a few words of cheering advice to a lonely housewife living in a farflung sheep settlement.

"Stevens calling Stanley, calling Stanley," crackled Mrs. Rowlands radio speaker as Dr. Peter Summers listened at her side. Anne Hobertson, living in Stevens, a settlement located at the southern tip of West Falkland Island, reported that Philip, just ϑ_2^k months old, had little spots on his body. She sounded worried. Summers listened intently and asked several questions about just what the spots looked like. It sounds like diaper rash to me, Mrs. Robertson, he finally said and gave her the name of an oitment to apply several times a day. The settlements keep ample stocks of medicine on hand. When a case sounds serious, the government flotaplane service is called and the patient is brought into Fort Stanley for a hospital checkup. The hospital is equipped to handle surgery cases and routinely delivers bables. But really serious cases mean sending patients to Argentina by once-a-week air flights.

The isolation and lack of amenities available in the outside world, doesn't mean that one can't lead a full life in the Falklands, says Harry Milne, the manager of the Falkland Island Co., which owns about 46% of the land in the islands. Most homes here have wall-to-wall carpeting, stereo consoles, washing machines and freezers. In Great Britain, entertainment and food comes out of the can, he said. Here, almost every house has its vegetable garden. When beef is available, it's half a beef or a quarter and it must be cut up and frozen, or, we catch fish and then clean them ourselves for the freezer.

It appears that the major hobby of many of the men in Port Stanley, a community of five taverns and three churches is drinking. "We have the highest per capita of hangovers in the world," proudly claimed a grand-motherly lady presiding behind the bar of one of them. (Jackson Daily News, March 3, 1977 via Jack Jones.)

"VOIX DE LA PRANCE" ALSO COMES IN ARABIC. . . It began as a de Gaulle effort to increase French influence and prestige in the Middle East. But now, thanks to the oil-price explosion, the French may soon have a money maker as well. For the French Government today finds itself the proud possessor of the biggest Arabic-language radio station beaming advertisments to the nations of the Middle East. "We are the only Arabic-speaking commercial radio service covering the whole of the Middle East, the world's most exciting market," says Jean Heurgon, director of Radio Monte Carlo-Froche Orient which beams 15 hours of programs a day to the Arab world. "The way business interest in the Middle East is growing, we expect to be very profitable within three years," he added gazing from his office toward

In 1960 de Gaulle decided France should bolster its broadcasting to the Middle East. "It was essentially a political decision," recalls Mr. Heurgon. "We were La Voix de la France." The result was Radio Monte Carlo-Proche Orient - an all Arabic service owned by Radio Monte Carlo itself controlled by the French Government - and the French State Radio and TV Corporations. Like Radio Monte Carlo, which broadcasts from the Frincipality of Monaco into France, the new service decided to carry advertising. The station set up a booster transmitter in Southeastern Cyprus, to which its programs are sent from studios in Faris and Monaco.

Then came an unexpected dividend in the form of the oil-price quadrupling in 1973. Overnight the station found itself broadcasting to thw world's fastest-growing market. "Actually, we were not that well equipped to take advantage of the opportunity," Mr. Heurgon recalls. For originally the French Government had been chiefly interested in broadcasting to such countries as Lebanon, Egypt, and Syria, where strong vestiges of French culture remain but which do not have much oil.

Even today, despite more powerful transmitters, Radio Monte Carlo-iroche Orient can only be heard really well both day and night in the countries along the Eastern Mediterranean, where it says it has about 7.4 million listeners. Reception in Baghdad, Kuwait, Riyadh and lower Egypt is less good. And the station's programs only reach the lower end of the Ked Sea, Sudan and Libya in the late afternoon and evening. Still, Fr. Heurgon says, it has nearly 20 million listeners. The station offers Western pop music interspersed with news bulletins, general interest programs and, of course, advertisements - all in Arabic. While the pop music appeals to the Arab world's growing appetite for Western culture, news can present problems. "We try to be objective, though I suppose we tend to present the French view," Mr. Heurgon says.

Advertising revenue has been growing especially since the world realized how much money was flowing into the Middle East as a result of the oil price rise. This year, Mr. Heurgon expects to carry about \$2 million in advertising or more than triple the 1975 figure. Japanese concerns are the leading sponsors, taking 80 percent of all advertising time. "Watches, radios, cameras and household electrical equipment are the main goods they are advertising," Mr. Heurgon says. The West Germans are in second place, followed by Lebanese and French companies.

At the moment, Mr. Heurgon says, his most serious competitor is the British Broadcasting Corporation, which is installing more powerful transmitters in Cyprus. "But luckily, the BBC doesn't take advertisements," he says. (New York Times, Sept. 4, 1977.)

<u>HEARING AIDES</u>. The first the world knew about the army takeover in Pakistan was an announcement on Pakistan radio at 2:30 a.m. that day. It was monitored by the American Foreign Broadcast Information Service (FBIS) in Bangkok and flashed to the BBC at 2:42 a.m. From there it was telexed to the Foreign Office, the Ministry of Defence and the World Service. The episode illustrates the way in which the United States and Britain have become the ears of the West. It is a coup convention to seize the central radio station and then to use it as an instrument of Government thought one reason why, for 24 hours each day, the BBC and FBIS catch electronic straws in the wind.

They have had a number of scoops, such as when they monitored the Hungarian uprising of 1956 and the resistance broadcasts of the Czechs after the Soviet invasion in 1968; and when they picked up Krushchev announcing the missile pullout from Cuba and President Nasser nationalizing the Suez Canal. But their day-to-day business is finding out what other governments are saying and documenting the incessant battle of the air for hearts and minds.

Since the Second World War when the BBC monitoring service began by eavesdropping on Hitler, it has extended its antennae through the Cold War towards detente, oil politics, the antics and atrocities of Amin, the struggle for Africa, and the development of Eurocommunism. Its particular territory is Eastern Europe, the Soviet Union, parts of the Middle East and most of Africa. FBIS listens to the rest and they share what they hear.

The head of the monitoring service, Mr. John Rae, cites this as an example of how operating abroad, "can be pretty chancy these days." The Americans had a grandstand view of the Turkish invasion of Cyprus from their station in Karina, for example, but afterwards had to abandon it to overhear the Middle East from other locations. Such field operations are expensive, another reason why the BBC does 95 percent of its listening at a former stately home in 90 acres of rolling Berkshire countryside at Caversham, near Reading. It is here, in rambling rooms with high ceilings, that 120 monitors and 50 editors tune in to Radio Moscow's domestic services, via remotely controlled receivers in Vienna.

Africa is also receiving increasing attention. The BBC's largest and most productive bureau is in Nairobi where 12 monitors trap the airwaves from the Horn of Africa to Angola and Mozambique. "We made Amin what he is today," John Rae say, "by listening in to his every word. He tunes in to the BBC's world Service in the evening and then dictates his reply on Kampala Radio the next morning - it's like a running dialogue. If we hadn't listened so much, he might have just faded away." One voice he would like to hear a lot more of is South Africa's domestic services. "At the moment we can monitor their external broadcasts but it's what they tell their own people that's interesting" - just as Moscow can learn more from overhearing the World at One than Radio Newsreel.

One change has been the decrease in emigres and the recruitment of graduate British linguists. According to George Novakovic, Head of Reception and one of the old school it used to be full of characters during and after the war. How it is more professional. It can, of course, only listen to a fraction of all that is said but after 28 years, it is confident that next time a general seizes power, someone in Berkshire will be listening. (Manchester Guardian, July 9, 1977 via John Hogers)

CARTER SEEKS LOUDER VOICE AND RPE/RL. . . Iresident Carter is calling for a substantial increase in the US's international broadcasting efforts, particularly those aimed at the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe. In all, he is calling for the addition of 28 250 kw transmitters which he says could be installed in the next three to five years.

The Fresident in a message to Congress said five transmitters are needed by the Voice of America and 11 by Radio Free Europe/Hadio Liberty to broadcast to the USSR and other countries in Eastern Europe. He said the price would be between \$22 million and \$25 million. The remaining 12 would be used by VOA to broadcast in the western Facific and Eastern Africa. Funds for those transmitters will be specified in budget requests. (All 26 transmitters are expected to cost in the \$45 million range - \$30million for VOA and \$14.2 million for RFE/RL.)

The Fresident's report was due on January 31, but delivery was posponed to permit a review of the draft prepared by the Food administration. The report is based on a study done by someone identified by the President only as "a recognized authority in the field of international broadcasting." Administration officials identified him as James Moceri, who had held a number of key posts in the US Information Agency before retiring last year.

Mr. Moceri found that the present transmission facilities of both the VOA and RFE/RL "are inadequate to assure a satisfactory probability of reception in all current languages of broadcast to the USSR and Eastern Europe." A primary reason for the problem, according to the report, is the heavy jamming of RFE/RL broadcasts by the USSR, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria and Poland. VOA broadcasts are said to be generally, if "reluctantly"

VOA and RFE/RL perform distinct missions, which, President Carter said, should be maintained. VOA, an integral part of the US government, presents world news and explains US policy and society. RFE/RL, a nonprofit corporation funded by Congress and supervised by the Board of International Broadcasting, has the assignment, President Carter said, of encouraging "a constructive dialogue with the peoples of the USSR and Eastern Europe."

President Carter said that once the 28 new transmitters are installed, all present US broadcasting needs can be met. Extending BIB-type broadcasting to countries outside of Eastern Europe, he said, would be impractical for a number of reasons - cost, for one. It would probably require \$100 million to build a worldwide network. Obtaining sites for the transmitters would pose another, as would "the frequent political changes" occurring within the countries that would be targets of the new enlarged broadcasting effort. (Via Bill Coleman, Jr.)

<u>AUTONOMY UNLIKELY AT VOICE OF AMERICA.</u>. Independence for the broadcasting service, now part of the United States Information Agency, is an issue that has been simmering for years, gradually coming to a boil. A commission recommended independence in 1975, in November, 1976, about two-thirds of the Voice of America staff petitioned for it; earlier this year the Senate tried to legislate it. But it now appears that even a watereddown version of such a plan may not make it into law.

It seems to me that, when we made the decision to establish the Voice of America, we made the decision to establish a Government propaganda agency, the purpose of which was to transmit our message abroad, said a ranking Democratic Senator. "The Voice of America," he continued, "is a Government broadcasting company and to pretend otherwise is only to fool ourselves. If the Voice of America is not going to be the expression of the American Government in its foreign policy and its objectives abroad, why do we maintain it?" he asked.

The Voice of America's charter calls on it to be "accurate, objective and comprehensive" as well as "reliable" and "authoritative" in its news, and 52

to "precent the policies of the United states clearly and effectively" along with "resonsible discussion and opinion on these policies." But according to the Voice of America staff petition, the agency's position "at the intersection of journalism and diplomacy" has been a difficult one to maintain, and the radio station has suffered "repeated unwarranted restrictions on its output." It cannot, the petition said, continue a "viable relationship" with the information evency, which it called "an adjunct of diplomacy."

enneth liddens, a director of the loice of America who resigned recently, has complained that the agency was subjected to constant state Department pressure, such as "don't say this, don't say that or don't talk about that."

The new director of the United States Information Agency, John E. Reinhardt, has issued new guidelines for the broadcasting service. They seem to indicate an effort to satisfy complaints about interference from the information agency while at the same time opposing independence. The broadcasting service, he said, would be "solely responsible for the content of news broadcasts, " with no interference from outside, not even from the information agency.

Ir. Reinhardt, in the text of a speech scheduled to be delivered this weekend, stressed a theme that might be reassuring to those at the broadcasting service who want independence. "Propaganda has no place in our scheme of things," he said. But Bernard Aamenske, the chief of the Voice of America's news division, testified earlier that many of its professionals are intimidated, "so completely shocked, so completely hounded, that to present the cold, hard facts is a difficult task indeed."

Mr. Kamenske agrees with the widespread view that independence for the Voice of America is unlikely soon, partly because of what he called a "lobbying blitz" by its opponents, partly because of what he sees as a lack of recognition of "the advantage to the national interest, that a more effective VCA would really serve the country." (New York Times, May 29, 1977.)
