1978 TROPICAL BAND MONITORING AND CONTEST

Because of interest shown by many listeners, James W. Young, P.O. Box 576 Wrightwood, Calif. 92397 U.S.A. is proposing a worldwide monitoring & contest of the 120, 90, 75 & 60 meter bands to be held from 0001 GMT February 11 to 2359 GMT March 13, 1978. Participation may be as a contestant or as a monitor, or both.

RULES

A. Participation:

1. Contestants may enter any one of the five categories; 120, 90, 75, 60 meters, or an all band entry. Contestants must mark each log sheet as "entry". If a contestant wishes to enter the 90m contest, he may also be a monitor of any of the other bands. A contestant who enters the all band category will not be a monitor participant.

2. Monitors may send in any loggings on any or all of the four bands, or any combination of bands. Monitors will omit the points section column on his log sheets. Monitors will mark each sheet "LOGGINGS".

B. All participants should use a logging sheet format similar to that which follows, but all sheets must contain the date, time, freq, station, country and points scored (except monitor sheets) for each station heard entry.

Separate sheets must be used for each band, whether contestant or monitor. Actual entries need not be in frequency order, but it is suggested that each 100 kHz band segment could be on separate sheets, especially for those who anticipate many loggings in that segment.

C. All participants must submit the following information: Full name, complete mailing address, receiver(s) used, antenna(s) and any accessories. Your main club affiliation is requested, but not a must. See item F.

D. Frequencies will be as follows: 2200 to 3000 kHz(120 meters); 3000 to 3600 kHz(90 meters); 3600 to 4200 kHz(75 meters); 4200 to 5100 kHz(60 meters).

Freq are requested to the nearest kHz, but those with digital readouts or freq measuring devices are requested to state loggings to the nearest 0.1 kHz.

E. Point scoring will be as follows: 2 points for any station in one's own continent; 5 pts for any station in any other continent. Separate loggings may be made of previously logged stations if by long path and will be awarded with 10. State all long path receptions with "LP" in the country column. All unidentified stations will be given 1 point. Utilities can be logged such as time stations, feeders, etc, but will not be given any points.

F. Prizes will be awarded to contestants in this manner; Each of the five categories will have a 1st, 2nd & 3rd place winner. A cash prize of \$5 for 1st, \$2 for 2nd, and \$1 for 3rd place winners along with a certificate of merit. Monitors will receive certificates of merit in the same fashion under the 5 categories. The club with the highest membership participation ratio will be awarded a special certificate of merit. You are therefore urged to mention your main club affiliation; only one per individual.

G. All entries must be postmarked no later than April 1 1978 and in Jim's hands no later than April 22 1978. This applies to all participants. All entries become the property of J. Young and none will be returned.

H. Entering requirements:

1. Contestants are required to send one SASE franked with 24¢ in stamps along with a 50¢ entry fee to cover the cost of Xerox machine, handling, and mailing. Overseas contestants send SAE with 3 IRCs(6 for airmail return).

2. Monitors are not required to send any fee or SASE. However, if a monitor wants a list of loggings, participants, etc an SASE (24¢ in stamps) must be enclosed. Overseas monitors send an SAE with 2 IRCs(4 for airmail return).

I. Results to be mailed to all contestants and those monitors requesting so will be sent the entire participants name, scores, winners and complete list of the loggings for all the four bands monitored.

J. The honor system will prevail! Station ID's will not be required, but if you think list logging is an easy way towards a prize, forget it. I can assure everyone that each entry will be carefully and completely checked. Entries and loggings from experienced DXers will help serve as guide lines in the final judgements. All results will be final.

K. All monies for the prizes will be awarded and are being furnished by and guaranteed by Jim Young. J. Young will not be eligible for any award or certificate. Any additional monies or donations will be used to raise the cash prizes accordingly. This is your contest. Comments, suggestions, and or criticisms are welcomed now or with your entry. J. Young may solicit certain participants to act as additional judges. A complete accounting of all monies and donations will be made available upon normal SASE request.

L. Address all loggings, entries, and or correspondence to James Young.








ACORNS FROM OAKDALE

DX QUOTE-OF-THE-YEAR: Jim Meehan's wife at a confab on foreign language broadcasts observed, "So many stations speak static"....

YOU'RE NOT LIKELY TO HEAR IT ON THE BBC, BUT... Christmas doesn't mean a lot in Bonnie Scotland, but Hogmanay, mon! That's something else! Hogmanay? What's that, you say? SOAP BOX



It has been some time...July, I believe...since anyone has climbed atop the SOAP BOX. This month we present views on a single subject by four different SPEEDXers. The first of these thoughts is in direct response to a member's remarks in that July SOAP BOX...

CHEERS!

PAUL MASON (Ontario): "I disagree with Mr. Kawchuk's comments that a DXer is superior to a SWL. Most DXers are in such an ardent hunt for new QSLs for their wall that they don't take time to listen to the content stations offer. Mr. Kawchuk stated that 'merely' listening to and logging stations is a relatively easy task". It appears that the most important part of Mr. Kawchuk's DXing is getting QSL cards and that he does not hold listening to the content of the broadcasts very important..."

"There is nothing wrong with sending reception reports to stations, but do you send one reception report, get your QSL card, and forget about the station in search of more verification cards? Stations want to hear comments about their programs; they want you to support their mailbag programs; and they want to hear from you on a regular basis as to how you are receiving their signal..."

"Let it be said that I do collect QSLs, but only first-time-heard stations...and if I like listening to the station I request their program guide and report to them regularly....not because I want their precious QSL card, but because I want to help the station. This to me is more enjoyable than searching the SW spectrum for a chance to get more QSLs..."

"So to all QSL-addicts I say take time to listen to the broadcasts and enjoy them....learn something about another culture...appreciate the true purpose of shortwave radio. There is a lot to be found besides QSL-cards...look for it."

RODNEY BOYD (Newfoundland): "The way I see it, 'DXing' means listening for new stations...whether for the purposes of keeping a log, recording IDs, or writing reception reports....whereas 'SWLing' means listening to certain programs for one's own enjoyment. Therefore, most DXers are SWLs and vice versa, according to this definition, making both terms somewhat ambiguous. Even though I distinguish between the two terms, I use them interchangeably...so, perhaps, those who hold that the question as to whether a person is a 'SWL' or 'DXer' should not be asked are right."

MARK ZIMAROWSKI (Massachusetts): "The problem seems to be that everyone thinks there is some certain set of standards which must be achieved before a person can call himself a 'DXer'..."

"Since every listener has his own set of standards what we end up with is 500 different definitions of the word 'DXer'. If the word is to have any meaning at all we have to realize that the difference between a DXer and a SWL has nothing to do with how long you've been listening or how many countries you've heard, but it's a matter of what you listen to and why.

"A SWL listens to a particular station because he wants to be entertained or informed by its programs, but because he enjoys the challenge of hearing new and different stations. Of course, in order to use this definition we have to abandon the idea that everyone is either 100% DXer or 100% SWL. Most of us are probably a combination of both, but it certainly makes more sense than saying that only people with 'x' number of countries heard can call themselves DXers."



WESLEY ROGERS (Ontario): "Every club I belong to has this same stupid thing going about DX versus SWL...well, I would like to know how a person can be a 'DXer' without being a listener? To say one is a 'DXer' does not make sense...because when he says he is a 'DXer' he is saying he is a 'distance'...because that is what 'DX' means. But, if he said he was a 'DX listener' he would be saying he was a 'distance listener'...that makes sense...and if he listened to shortwave he would be 'DX-SWL' or 'distance shortwave listener'. So, now tell me again how one can be a 'DXer' without being a 'listener'...or does he wish to be a TV-DXer with the sound turned off?"

SUPPORT WORLD DX HANDICAPPED AID CAMPAIGN



We would like to kick off this month's column by extending our warmest wishes to all SPEEDXers for a happy and successful new year. With the sunspot activity on the upswing, it looks like 1978 has the potential to be a fine year for DXers.

Short wave listeners will now be offered an opportunity to keep abreast with HAP's activities via monthly reports being presented on Ian McFarland's "DX Digest" which is aired every Sunday by Radio Canada International. The first report was broadcast on December 11 and covered the results of the SPEEDX Christmas Fund Drive which raised \$240 for HAP.

Next month's report is expected to take on a new look, however, as Jeff White of the Association of Illinois DXers, will man the mike to bring news of HAP to the listeners of Ian McFarland's innovative program.

Jeff is an 18-year old student of Northern Illinois University in DeKalb, IL. He is presently majoring in broadcast journalism, and intends to pursue a career in this field. Jeff currently works as a reporter for WNIU-FM (89.5) in DeKalb. He is really kept busy by his school work, his activities with AIDX and preparing his weekly "Que Pasa" reports that are presented on the mid-week edition of HCJB's DX Party line. "It takes quite a bit of time," Jeff said, "but I enjoy it all."

Jeff has been a shortwave listener since 1972, when he was playing around with a multi-band portable and happened to hear Deutsche Welle. "From the very beginning, I was fascinated with the thought of hearing radio broadcasts coming from the far corners of the world, and I'm still fascinated by it today." That early fascination soon developed into a full time interest, as Jeff still spends several hours each day tuning the bands with his Panasonic RF-2200 receiver. White, who considers himself to be more of an SWLer than a DXer, is a member of SPEEDX, NASWA, NRC and of course, AIDX.

"I have met, either in person or by correspondence, all kinds of fascinating people through shortwave activities," he said. "One of the most fascinating times of my life was the 1977 ANARC Convention held in Schaumburg, IL, which I was chairman of. I got to meet in person dozens of people who, until then, had only been names."

A staunch HAP booster who, along with Keven Mikell, coordinated last summer's HAP auction, White said, "I strongly believe in the principals of the Handicapped Aid Program. Shortwave listening is a hobby that is particularly adaptable to disabled persons, and I think that we who are already SWLs should strive to introduce the hobby to as many handicapped people as possible. I am very pleased to be able to serve HAP by producing the HAP-US reports for Ian McFarland's DX Digest. And we're glad to have you aboard, Jeff!"

In closing this month's report, we would once again like to thank those SPEEDXers who helped make this year's Christmas Drive such a resounding success. We raised enough to buy 5 additional DX-40 receivers, and induct five new HAPIes. We like to offer a very special thank you to Oliver Ellsworth, Don Johnson and Alan Brooks for their work with the Yule page, and to our friends who belong to SCADS which recently raised \$93 for HAP in an auction. Your continued support is really appreciated, and makes my job a whole lot nicer.

WYFR OKEECHOBEE SITE OPERATIONAL

On November 23, 1977 Family Radio, WYFR, began regular transmissions to Central Europe and South America from its new transmitter site in Okeechobee, Florida, U.S.A.. According to WYFR's Winter-Spring Newsletter graciously forwarded by Greg Watts, frequencies in use include 15110 (from 1600-1650), 15130 (from 1650-1850), 11780 (from 1850-2050), 9630 (from 2050-2250) and 11885 (from 2250-0500*). There is also a Sunday-only broadcast 1250-1600 GMT on 17730 khz.

WYFR is still operating its transmitter in Scituate, Massachusetts and is interested in reports comparing reception of broadcasts from the two sites. Reports should be addressed to

and a new QSL card is being used to verify reports on the Florida site.

With its new transmitter on-line, Family Radio will expand operations to include a Portuguese language service beginning January 1, 1978. This new service, WYFR's seventh, will include slow speed English Bible readings as well as reading and commentary in Portuguese.

RADIO SRS - SURINAM

Believe it or not, Radio SRS does verify and their folder card QSL contains considerable data which Bob Donly was kind enough to share with us. Radio SRS, it seems, is a government-owned station that was founded in 1965. The station employs 26 full-time and an equal number of part-time personnel who prepare and present the music, news, entertainment and educational programs aired daily from 5:00 a.m. to midnight local time.

Radio SRS broadcasts on 725 khz A.M., 96.4 Mhz F.M. and 4780 khz in the 60 meter band. The transmitters are of 50 kw, 10 watts, and 1 kw respectively, although the latter is to be increased to 10 kw in the near future to provide better coverage of the interior and Caribbean areas.

Surinam, the nation it serves, gained independence in 1975 after 350 years of Dutch rule. It has an area of 162,000 sq. km. and produces bauxite, aluminum, wood, rice, sugar, bananas and other agricultural products. The population is a racial potpourri with the Negros, Indians, Chinese, Javanese, Amerindians and Whites all represented. The programming of Radio SRS reflects the tastes of these diverse ethnic groups and thus you'll find oriental hits mixed in with the latest rock and tropical music favorites not to mention programs in oriental languages as well as "Sranang tongo" (the Surinam language) and Dutch.

BAD, BADDER, BADDEST -- HOW BOSTON GOT THE BAD GUYS

I was one of the semi-original BAD Guys in Boston ... but only one or two of the present group with that collective handle could possibly associate me with that group. In the interest of connecting the present with its roots in the past, here's how the BAD-Guys got their name.

Back in 1967, a bunch of medium-wave DXers in Boston -- including Gordon Nelson, Phil Sullivan, Tom Holmes, Randy Kane, Bob Karchevski, and myself -- took over the publishing of the National Radio Club bulletin.

About that time, a number of members of the NRC and the other all-BCB club, the International Radio Club of America, in the San Francisco - Oakland area, called themselves the Bay Area DX'ers -- B.A.D.

In April of 1968, we NRC people published a four-page April Fool's insert in the NRC publication DX News. We called it BAD NEWS, published by the Boston Area DX'ers -- BAD -- a direct theft from the Bay Area DXers!!!

Over the Labor Day weekend in 1968, the Boston Group hosted the National Radio Club convention. Karchevski was placed in charge of name tags, and he came up with a special tag for each of the host committee members. "I'm a Bad Guy" -- read the name tags, and it was there the name was born.

Mike Macken was a fledgling BCB and SWBC DX'er back in those days, and he helped publish the NRC bulletin and host the NRC convention. Chris Lobdell joined NRC shortly before the convention, and had a BAD GUY name tag, too.

BAD became so well associated with the Boston Area DXers that the San-Francisco - Oakland DX'ers felt constrained to come up with a new name for their group... hence the Bay Area Radio Freaks -- or BARF.

Ironically, Karchevski, the guy who penned the "Bad Guys" monicker, moved to the San Francisco - San Jose area and is now a BARF in good standing.

The BAD GUYS have grown to be one of the forerunners of the movement toward local DX get-together oriented groups, and that is one of the most promising developments in the DX hobby in the late 70's. I'm proud to have been on the fringes of the roots.

ON THE CORRECT USAGE OF LETTER SYMBOLS FOR THE PREFIXES REPRESENTING MULTIPLES AND SUBMULTIPLES OF SI UNITS

by Robert H. French

I have noticed that many, many people have been rather sloppy in using the correct symbols for multiples and submultiples of SI units -- in particular the symbols for "kilohertz" and "megahertz". This is not restricted to SPEEDX and other DX clubs -- it also occurs in technical publications.

The prefixes for use with units in the Systeme Internationale d'Unites (the modern version of the metric system) are the following:

Note in particular the distinction which must be made between upper case and lower case letter symbols to distinguish Peta (P) from Pico (p), and Mega (M) from Milli (m).

Another point to note is that the symbol for the Kelvin, the unit of thermodynamic temperature, is K, which must be distinguished from the symbol for the prefix "kilo-", which is k.

Thus, if you write "KHz", you are measuring some strange quantity in "Kelvin-Hertz", temperature times frequency! The symbol for kilohertz is "kHz". And, if you write "mHz", you are talking "millihertz" -- or one cycle every 1000 seconds! The radio frequencies we listen to are in megahertz -- symbol "MHz".

Other points of confusion are Watts (symbol W) and kilowatts (symbol kW) which are used to measure the power output of the transmitters.

BBC BRINGS OUT A NEW FORMAT FOR THEIR "LONDON CALLING"

The BBC monthly program guide which costs \$10 a year for a subscription, has been greatly modified as of the November 1977 issue. The biggest change is in size. The page size has been greatly enlarged so that it is now a full 8½ x 11½ inches. This has allowed them to increase the type size. Also, they have added lots of color. Perhaps the greatest improvement is in the Frequency Charts, which tell you at a glance, in graph form, what frequency to tune to at any particular time. The increased size makes these very easy to use.

3. Spain - Radio Nacional de España wrote a short letter mentioning that they were not interested in a long report; they said that they were sending me under separate cover a few pre-printed post-cards with all the information needed by them to be filled in by the listener. The printed card is an improvement for them and I feel this will certainly make the listener's job much easier, but there is still one problem: the card has only three lines on it for dates of reception, so you can only report on three different days. The reverse of the card has a space $3\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{8}$ inches for additional comments that the listener might have. The card is filled out in English and Spanish, and is very professional.
4. Moscow - Radio Moscow responded with a short sentence stating that all the information needed by the listeners would be on the pre-printed reception form. The form is a letter 8×13 inches, and the form makes the job easy, as there is not that much room for a lot of details. They ask what your occupation is on the form, and your age. They didn't answer the question included in my letter about IRC's, so since they didn't say they were required maybe they aren't.
5. Radio Nederland - They sent the best letter of all. Their letter was very friendly, and they mentioned that the listener only has to report date, time, frequency, SINPO, and two or three items talked about to insure a card. They mentioned that their staff would not like to receive two or three pages of single-spaced information, but that they would be most happy to receive almost happy to receive almost anything at all from the listeners.

I try to use the aerogrammes that the post office sells for reporting to those stations that do not require exhaustive reports. They cost 22¢.

SUNSPOTS AND WEATHER

(Excerpts from an article by Peter J. Ognibene, compiled by Edward J. Insinger.)

Besides the well-known National Bureau of Standards Time Signal station in Boulder, Colorado, there is the National Center for Atmospheric Research. Here, scientists carefully study and try to understand the many unusual, unpredictable aspects of weather.

Studies conducted at the center have thus far revealed a sound relationship between sunspot activity and weather patterns. This finding is of interest to the radio enthusiast also concerned with sunspot activity and radio propagation.

Mr. J. Murray Mitchell, senior research climatologist for the government's environmental data service, says that "as fantastic as it may sound, tree rings and sunspots may be the key to understanding our weather, past and future."

Mr. Peter J. Ognibene reports that "for reasons which scientists cannot fully explain, periods of extensive drought are linked to changes in the number of sunspots, which varies over a similar 20-year period.

Mitchell agrees, and states "it's a rhythm -- like breathing. The drought cycle is related to the solar cycle." He explains further: "The highest risk of drought tends to follow very shortly after a sunspot minimum, and last year was a sunspot minimum. It means that, for the time being, we are in the highest-risk portion of the 20-year drought cycle."

Further research is being conducted in order to learn the secrets of our atmosphere. These studies will undoubtedly uncover further valuable information and perhaps shed light (on an already bright subject) that affects shortwave listening.

SHORTWAVE MUSIC - A WORLD OF DIFFERENCE

Are you getting a little tired of hearing the same old rock group? Is disco music becoming a monotonous bore (shake, shake, shake; shake, shake, yawn)? Too many commercials on that jazz station? Consider importing your music!

With that shortwave receiver you already have, you could be hearing sensuous, exotic melodies from a tropical island, the hauntingly beautiful strains of Inca flutes from the Andes, cool cool mambas, sambas, marimbas (and all sorts of other -bas) from way way down south; black tunes from Africa, which are entirely different from American soul sounds; East-Asian music, which is totally unlike what is heard here; as well as the latest hits in such languages as Hungarian, Turkish, Dutch, and Hebrew. At virtually any hour during the day, you can receive interesting beautiful music from some distant land. Despite the obvious limitations of audio quality, due to constantly changing propagation conditions, the sound is often as good as many of the weaker AM outlets in your area. A relatively unselective receiver will often provide a better tone than a sharp one.

The main difficulty in listening to this music is knowing when to listen to what frequency. This problem exists, of course, whenever you are trying to receive a certain type of shortwave program, such as a news or DX show. This article will point out a few music programs which I feel are worth listening to. This list is naturally selective. It would take many more pages to list them all. The main criteria used in this list are that the music has to sound quite different from what is heard here on local stations, and generally comes through well on a set of decent quality. There are many other programs which meet these conditions; this list is only a sampling.

In the morning, the lively music of Cuba ought to help keep you awake while eating breakfast. Radio Havana's Spanish service starts at 1100 (all times used are GMT), and except for a few minutes of propaganda every half hour, plays a lot of great stuff. For a slightly more subdued Latin sound you can tune to Radio Mexico on 9705 kHz, which is also on all morning. They have very little talk to interrupt. On a weekend or holiday, when you may get up later, Radiodiffusion Portugal may turn you on with its own style of music, which sounds like a blend of Latin and Castilian rhythms. Look for this on 21700 kHz after 1400 GMT. Israel's Hebrew easy listening music comes in on 15545 kHz during the morning hours. Listen about 10 minutes after the hour unless you want the news in Hebrew.

If you are home during the afternoon, the music keeps on coming hot and heavy from Kuwait, on 12085 kHz., after 1700 GMT. Though much of their music consists of American rock, they mix in many European hits, and Arab tunes. The announcers have many interesting comments on the stuff they play. The Voice of America has a very good jazz show at 1615 GMT, which comes through best on 9760 kHz. France is on during the early afternoon on so many frequencies that you can find it by spinning the dial, especially in the 19 meter band; 15155 kHz is one of the best spots. They do have a lot of talk, especially around the top of the hour, but the possible wait for music is worthwhile if you like good singing voices. The zillions of Soviet frequencies also provide fine listening and superb voices. I personally find Russian music among the most relaxing and pleasant to listen to.

In the mood for really different sounds? All India Radio's chanting tunes come in

well during the late afternoon on 9912 kHz. The same for Egypt, which plays music during its Arabic transmission from 1500-2000 GMT, on 17745 kHz.

At night most of the music programs tend to be briefer, with the exception of the domestic services on the tropical bands. West Germany, after 0400 GMT on 6080 kHz offers German pop tunes. Spain has flamengos on during much of their Spanish language programming from 0100 - 0500 GMT, on 9360 kHz. Switzerland plays yodelling tunes on 3995 kHz at 0645 GMT, Albania's Home Service (no propaganda!) is on after 0330 GMT on 5050 kHz. Cuba blasts in after 0300 GMT on 9550 kHz. Music from the African country of Togo, on from 0530 - 0800, at 5047 kHz and Benin, which broadcasts on 4870 kHz after 0515 GMT, provide exotic tunes. Tahiti's music, heard throughout the night, on 11825 kHz, is unique and provides a fine background for reading.

There are hundreds of tropical band stations from South and Central America which spend most of their time transmitting lively Latin rhythms. Among my favorites are Radio Nacional Espejo (Ecuador) 4680 kHz, Radio Brasil Central, on 4985 kHz, Radio Atlantida (Peru) on 4790 kHz, and Radio Colosal (Colombia) on 4985 kHz.

The station listings given above are intended only to help you get started in this branch of our hobby. As your tastes are, no doubt, different from mine, you can set yourself a goal of finding more enjoyable music programs than the ones listed here. Happy hunting!!

REMEMBER...?

Remember your first SW receiver, the one that you were so proud of? All of us remember at least one receiver. I remember mine, a Hallicrafters S-38D. It was given to me by my uncle in 1975, in unworking order. Since I did not then know anything about electronics, I took the receiver to my friend, whose father is an electrician. The only problem, he found, was a couple of burned-out tubes. Three tubes cost me \$26.00! (What a rip-off!) I soon found out, to my sorrow, that they would only have cost me \$16 from Radio Shack.

When I got the rig home I plugged it right in. I set it to the BCB. I heard several strong BCB stations, and then heard some hard-to-get stations that I had never heard before. So, I quickly switched the band selector to a SW band (1.7 - 5.0 MHz). I turned the knob desperately trying to get a foreign station. To my surprise, NOTHING! I told my father that it didn't work, and he told me that it needed an antenna. So, early the next day I got to work on making an antenna for myself. I looked in the garage for some wire and found some solid iron wire, about 10 gauge. I strung it across the roof letting it ground to almost everything in my haste. I finished at noon, came into my shack, and hooked it up to the receiver. Presto! Radio Japan coming in at 1800 GMT on 9505 kHz (This was a surprise, as then I did not know anything about frequency settings, QSL's, DXers, or propagation conditions). I was just like a baby playing with a toy.

However, just like a baby, I began learning about the radio, and progressing in DXing. Later that night, 0500 GMT, I picked up Radio Nederland on 6155 kHz. They gave their address at the end of their program. I got it down, and wrote the letter. I got a reply three months later; a letter half torn in my mailbox. I did not get a QSL form/card because I had not sent the correct information. It was a folder card of the Radio Nederland staff, with Christmas greetings.

About that time I gave up on SWLing and returned to medium wave listening. However, one day in July of 1976 I turned to a SW band, and heard HCJB and the SPEEDX report. They gave an announcement concerning a special QSL for July, available only from SPEEDX. I sent for one, but again did not receive it since I knew nothing about making out a reception report. Don Johnson sent me a letter explaining why I had not received a QSL, and also included a brief outline explaining how to submit a reception report. I sent in another report, and, like magic, I got my first QSL ever.

I have continued to improve my rig and antenna, and have gathered enough information to get into electronics — I have now completed my first year of electronics in high school. I've also built two or three SW receivers from kits. See what this fantastic hobby will do for you if you have SPEEDX to help you?

DIRECT DIGITAL READOUT

SOME THOUGHTS ON RECEIVER ELECTRONIC
FREQUENCY READOUT....FOR THE NOVICE

EVERYONE should have a radio that can be accurately tuned to within a kilohertz or so! All who have used a digital frequency readout, even briefly, will agree with that. Or those who have high priced gear capable of 1 kHz accuracy. Now there are a variety of units available to upgrade a medium or modest priced receiver. However, there are a few problems associated with hooking up a frequency counter to your favorite radio that you should be aware of.

RESOLUTION - "the act of resolving something". Just how close do you want to read freqs? A readout of 1 kHz requires the receiver to be able to determine which station you are tuned to within 1 kHz before you measure it! If you tune onto a strong SW signal, and are using the "peak the S-meter" method of being "on frequency", you probably won't be close enough to be within 1 kHz unless you have a good sharp IF bandpass.

Most readout schemes measure the "LO" (Local Oscillator) or "VFO" (Variable Frequency Oscillator) frequency and then add or subtract the output of these with a local crystal oscillator to glean the correct frequency.

If we hang a counter (a counter "counts" frequencies and displays the frequency digitally on a visible readout) on the VFO of, say the FRG-7, you read the VFO frequency, which changes as you tune the set. It would count from 3455 to 2455 kHz as you tune from zero to 1000 on the dial. So, if you were on 100, you'd read 3355 on the counter. Accurate except somewhat tacky and difficult to read. Impossible for those of us that can't add and subtract!

What if you have a different receiver, like the DX-160? They are "single conversion" radios, and their LO is 455 kHz above their received frequency. If you were tuned to a station on 1000 kHz, the LO would be at 1455 kHz, which, if measured, would accurately display 1455 kHz. Subtract 455 kHz IF frequency and you are in business. That is, until the last band. On band 4, they change the LO to work below the received frequency, so now you have to add. WWV on 15,000 MHz would be read 14.545. Not very convenient on the 19 meter band. So far we have examined a few possible problems and can see that it is not all that simple.

Another method of measuring frequencies is to use an external RF oscillator & counter. Measurement this way works fairly well to within 500 Hz or so (depending on the equipment) but takes an additional step. You tune your DX-160 to CHU on 3330 kHz. Then with the counter connected to read the output frequency of the RF generator, and enough antenna (a foot or so of wire) to radiate into the DX-160, you slowly tune the generator and "zero beat" it to your receiver. This will then read your frequency.

The problem with the display units is one of having the DXer correctly locate & extract the VFO signal so that it can be counted. On any external output of a LO or VFO there should be some sort of "buffer" circuit which "isolates" the output of the VFO or LO. Without a buffer circuit you stand the chance of "pulling" the LO (changing its frequency by loading it with external equipment) or introducing external noise into the receiver at this point. Any equipment noise introduced by not "buffering" the VFO or LO output will ride right on through the IF and show up as hash, or other undesirable noise in your speaker. Another problem encountered if you don't "buffer" the VFO or LO output is the coax used to bring the signal out. It has enough capacity to possibly decrease the VFO or LO output, or kill it entirely.

In the case of the DX-160 for \$169.95, they don't even give you selectivity specifications. However DX-160 owners will readily admit that the IF response is broader than the proverbial "barn door". This isn't really a problem until you count it, then you realize that even though the S-meter has long since pegged, you still are not "right on" frequency. Inexpensive ceramic filters do not always end up "right on" their specific frequency either, and so state in their specifications. This is again no problem, except when tuning in a station with an inaccurate or wide filter, it blows your resolution of 1 kHz.

There are two ways to eliminate this problem to some degree. #1. Use your BFO to zero beat all signals and offset the BFO to compensate for the lack of selectivity and/or poor filtering as needed. #2. Construct an internal oscillator "right on" 455 kHz, or whatever IF frequency your set uses, and zero beat with that, to give a true frequency reading despite your meter, and IF filter deficiencies.

Direct Digital Readout....continued

In summary, to read out the frequency to 1 kHz is expensive, but very desireable. It is most expensive for those DXers that have inexpensive equipment to begin with. One must consider the worth (to themselves) of their receiver before investing 100 plus dollars in an electronic frequency counting scheme. For different receivers, the cost would vary. For a good counter you can easily spend \$200-500, and for a generator (kit form) about \$80 or so.

As of this writing, there are devices available for several of the more popular receivers. Digital displays for the FRG-7, SSR-1, XCR-30 and DX-160 can be obtained for \$120-150. A small unit that will work on any receiver in the 440 kHz - 30 MHz range and sits on top of the rig, is a combination counter-generator that will give 1 kHz accuracy is available for under \$250. More advanced(more features and/or accuracy)units cost up to \$500. For more information on readouts and where to obtain them, write to: Grant Manning, 3417 Purser Road, Escondido, CA 92025. State what receiver one is needed for. I'll try to dig up the information for you and, if I think it's a waste of money to obtain a readout for your set, I'll tell you that too.
