FROGRAM LINEUPS...Reports of daily program schedules will be presented as space permits. Due to space limitations, members will be urged to write to their favorite stations for program schedules.

PROGRAM GUIDE NEWS...Nearly every station broadcasting over shortwave today publishes a program guide. News of guides available and stations with mailing lists will be presented as appropriate.

PUBLICATIONS... Publications available on the subject of programming will oe mentioned from time to time. Every effort will be made to check out the publications mentioned, but members are reminded that a mention is not necessarily an endorsement.

COMMENTS FROM MEMBERS...Do you have a favorite program? If so, what makes it your favorite? Do you dislike a particular station's programs? If so, what makes them so bad? Let's have your comments.

DX PROGRAM NENS...News and reviews of new DX programs, information on changes in DX programs and announcements of DX shows being dropped will be presented each month.

INITIALIY there may be some overlap between this column and other columns in SPEEDX. Articles on stations, lists of DX programs available and long articles on programming will be pubiished in "Tips and Topics". Time and frequency schedules will appear in the "Station Skeds". Topical program information should be sent here. Let's hear from you today!

I have gotten numerous letters asking about incoor antennas, preselectors, antenna tuners or couplers and "active antennas". I have used the McKayDymek DA-100 on one occasion. I cannot really pass judgement on it except to say that ANY active antenna is a compromise, and won't work miracies!!! In some very difficult situations like high atop an apartment house, where your apartment is surounded by steel framework, something like the DA-100 will seem to work wonders. (It will!!) However, if you are in a wooden Erame house in the suburbs, it may seem to do no better than a 25 foot hunk of wire strung to the nearest tree!!! PROVERD: mry other ways of tmproving reception, such as antenna couplers etc. BEFORE shelling out the crice of a good "active anterna". Just to rish out and buy ore based on what wonders it is supposed to perform mifht be a waste of money! Some firms will allon jou a froe trial periad or charge you a $10 \%$ restocking fee to return an item. This will sertainly save money if the item won't do as advertised or how you expected. A lot depends on your individual situation, the building you are in, noise from power lines and the receiver you are using. Some very adverse images might appear when using a preselector or active antenna on some of the newer "sensitive" sets, such as the RF-2200, RF-2900, ICF-5900 etc. In this case, a more suitable arrangement might be a $102^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{CB}$ whip mounted on a plank mounted on your window sill at around a 45 degree angle. This used in conjunction with an antenna coupler of some sort. If this fails, try a ereselector and so on. The key is to EXPERIMENT! If you can erect two or more antennas, so much the better. You will find one will do a better job on one band or grea of the world when the other one is lousy, and sometimes the reverse will be true.

For those of you that are inclined to do some building, write to Radio Nederland, DX Jukebox, P.O. Box 222, Hilversum, Holland. Ask for the information sheet on the "active antenna". This can be built for about $\$ 75-\$ 50$ depending on what parts you can scrounge from a friendly "han" operator. Performance is very good for an active antenna.
At the time this article is being written, I will te soon leaving on a business trip to England. Therefore, please bear with a slow answer to your inquiries. I'll be there for $2-3$ weeks and plan to to some European DXing! Sy the time this is in SPEEDX, I will return. Until then best of DXing to you all and 73!

This month we are going to spotlight the new bootleg radio station, the "Voice of the Voyager". This gtation has burst upon the airwaves within the last three months with the force of a whirlwind. One might ask what makes the VoV any different from another bootleg, or any clandestine station. The answer is simple - the people who own and operate the VoV seem to be DXers, or at least SWL's. How do we know that?
 Two ways - first, there is a DX program occasionally broadcast, and second, they QSL reports which appear in the major shortwave club bulletins!! Unique in my memory. We have six reports this month of the Voice of the Voyager, and we will print them below, so that those who wish to try for them can have a better idea of how to go about hearing them.

58500456 Voice of the Voyager, 7 and 8 note guitar IS, px "Nighttime Melodies". two ancrs, R\&R and jazz selections closing with a Maynard Ferguson number. Mentioned located "1 mile north of nowhere", ID: "Champions of Bootleg Broadcasting," QSL instructions. 0536*, after taking calls over the air. ( $4 / 22$, Gerry Dexter, $W 1$ ) 0520 VoV, playing rock records, mentioned what sounded like a phone number, got a good ID and 0538* (212; 4/30. Sandy Blaize, LA)

0500 VoV, guitar ID, "We will Rock you," tx, mx, phone number: (415) 285-0045. (in California), 0534*, power given as " 600 W of insanity." quality varied between poor and fair (4/30, Mike Maghakian, NY)
$0455 \mathrm{VOV}, 7$ note guitar ID, ID @0501, into "Night at the Opera" by Queen.
Mentioned " 100 W of power", went into reading of all sorts of numbers, almost sounds like reading loggings as if in a DX listeners' px (You'rs right, John, it is a DX px!! cph); gave same number as in Maghakian logging above, say that they have to sign off at 0532 because "engineer is getting mad!" John got through on the phone number after s/off, and had a nice chat. They know of John's program on HCJB and request a plug, which was duly given on $4 / 29$ in a show about pirates in general. They are converting to DST, and will begin bc at 0400 instead of 0500 GMT. They are also considering a slight change of fq. to 5855 or 5860 to get away from the UTE QRM on 5950. (333; 4/30, Trautschold, WI)

0515 VoV, "Nighttime Melodies px" using the 1918 Edison phono. "Big Boom Fradio" serial segment, 4 minutes of $D X$ px. Phone patch never materialized though ancd. 0542* and much static throughout xasn. ( $252,4 / 16$. R. Utter, NY)

0500 VoV , continues to be hrd amid heavy static. QSL received for phoned report. On $4 / 15$ hrd with $\pi x$, and "Mail Call" quoting reports from DX bulletins. Fhone \#: (212) 626-9906 (NI Telco loop). Said for a QSL to send a report to FRENDX or any other major SW club bulletin. Unison chant at s/off: "May the Spirit of the Voyager be with you always." and abrupt s/off. (Hauser, N )

A few comments have been received indicating that the place of origin of these broadcasts is probably upper Michigan, confirmed by the fact that the QSL was postmarked in Detroit, MI. I have been trying, but the UTE mentioned by John Trautschold is quite heavy here and, while some twitters want to get through, nothing definite yet. Might try the loop some evening after 0600. Keep trying for them, and, if they are reading these lines, I say to the owners of the VoV: "May the Spirit of the Voyager be with you always."
Speaking of phone numbers, my own phone number here at the Sem is: (914) 968-6200. Prepaid calls will be gladly received between 2300-0300 CMT or so.
Loggings will begin on the next page. Times and dates are GMT, dates are in month/day format, fqs. are in kHz (kilohertz) and SIO code denotes reception conditions noted.

Recently here at Radio 4 VEH we have been receiving a number of reception reports from various listeners stating that they have been listening to Radio $4 V E H$ on various frequencies at different hours of the day.

We realize that with the crowded band conditions today that it is not always easy to identify the various stations and that due to this many reception reports are received by stations who have to reply and say, "We're sorry, but the station you heard was not ours..."

Since the last part of October 1977 Radio 4 VEN has not been broadcasting on any of its shortwave frequencies due to problems with its equipment and also due to the fact that we are reconsidering our entire program schedule for English broadcasts and the best way of utilizing our facilities.

Therefore until further notice Rio $4 V E H$ will not be broadcasting on shortwave and for that reason we realize that we will not be receiving too many reception reports except from the occasional SWL who makes listening to hard-to-get stations on the broadcast band his special hobby.

We want to express to those of our listeners who have faithfully monitored our station through the years and have sent in reception reports from time to time our sincere thanks for your help and interest in our broadcasts. We hope that when our evaluation program has been completed it may be possible some time in the future to again return to the air on shortwave. In the meantime we shall be continuing our broadcasts on the frequency of 840 kHz for our French and Creole listeners here in Haiti and on our 1035 kHz frequency for those who listen to us in the English and Spanish languages in the Caribbean area.


This letter, submitted by R.F. Johnson of Ft. Lauderdale, FL, speaks for itself. I hope that this is not permanent. Perhaps a few judicious inquiries will show 4 VEH that interest in their SW services is still present.
I would like to thank all 74 reporters this month, and even though the lower bands are pretty poor by now let's hope that things will return to normal soon (1.e., winter conditions on the bands). Remember, you write SPEEDX W/H, I just type W/H. I will be at the Montreal ANARC Convention in July, and Trope to meet many of the SFEEDX brethren while I am there. ## Technital month ...

Many members have been asking if I can publish more technical articles within Tips and Topics. Well, this month I will fulfill this request. I am going to devote the entire column this month to the very best technical articles that I have received during the last several months. In this issue you will find a receiver review in addition to several antenna articles as well as some technical articles of a more general nature. Do enjoy, for this column is devoted to you!

##  <br> the daake sw-4a receiver

By Steve Kennedy

The SPR-4 receiver is one of the more popular receivers in use today by SWL/DXers. It replaced the SW-4A in 1974, and of ten I have wondered where are all the $S W-4 A ' s$ made over the years. I am an owner of a $S W-4 A$, and feel it is a fine set; despite the misunderstanding a lot of SWL/ DXers have about it.
The $S W-4 A$ was the first direct reading dial receiver sold at a price many SWL/DXers could afford. . $\$ 335.00$ new. This set has only 5 controls. . .volume, tone, tuning, preselector, band change, and was simple to operate. The circuit has 6 tubes, 7 transistors, and 8 diodes. It is simple to maintain, and seldom require little adjustment of the $B F$ and IF circuits.

A few suggestions here will enable you to enjoy your SW-4A, and help resist the temptation to trade it off for another set. Once a year, purchase a set of tubes from your local electronics supply and retube the entire set. There are only 6 tubes in the circuit, so an investment of $\$ 25.00$ has to be reasonable for an improvement of sensitivity! I recommend using Amperex tubes since these have a lot less intermal noise than other brands.
After you have retubed the set, a slight touch-up of allgnment should have the set in A-1 shape. Be sure to read the alignment directions very carefully in the manual before attempting to retune the set. If you feel you will not be able to do $1 t$, have a ham or a competent DXer do it for you.
A vast improvement in zensitivity can be obtained by using a preselector or a tunable preamp. I use an Ameco preamp on mine and have heard over 130 countries. Selectivity is the only fault with the SW-4A. It is too wide for real serious DXing. . about 5 kHz wide at -6 db . There are only two solutions which will improve on the selectivity of the SW-4A. The easiest is to use an audio filter like those made for SSB use. It is simply connected to the speaker terminals on the rear chassis. . and really works! Or, if you expect to keep the set, add a Collins mechanical filter. I use a 3.1 kHz filter, connected into the first IF amplifier. This may seem a iittle expensive, but the extra expense is well worth it. My SW-4A will separate stations from 2 BM 11ke a R-390A:
Although the SW-4A is equipped with crystals for medium wave, and the 49 through 11 meter bands; it is possible to tune the 60 meter by merely inserting a 15.590 MHz crystal into the socket provided for the 49 or 41 meter bands. I have also been able to tune 60 meters by simply setting the bandswitich to_7.02 tuning the dial to . 123 in the dial
window, and peaking the preselector to the $90^{\prime}$ cock position. At night WWV should appear at this setting. However, the tuning knob will not read out 75 kHz per revolution, and the set will tune "backwards". That is, when the dial is tuned to a "igher setting, the receiver is actually being tuned to a lower frequency. Remember, if you try this trick with your $3 \mathrm{~W}-4 \mathrm{~A}$, be sure to set up your dial for proper calibration, and when the knob is moved 5 kHz as marked on the rim of the knob. . it is actually 10 kjz . This applies to this trick only, so don't worry about it if you have a crystal for 60 meters.

All in all, the SW-4A is still a decent receiver for a back up set or for a starter for the beginner. Used ones are avallable at many ham equipment dealers for about $\$ 225.00$ for one in A-1 shape to maybe $\$ 150$ for one in average condition. The SW-4A must be a good receiver... HCJB uses them for off air monitors!

THE LAST RESCRT ANTENNA THAT NORKS!:!

Are you ready to commit suicide because you can't run an antenna to your roof and an indoor antenna won't puil them in? Well, hope is on the way with the "Last Resort" antenna!

If you live in an apartment above the ground and below the roof of your building (no underground apartments please) and your windows have at least ten feet between the two farmost windows, then the "Last Resort" antenna can be your savoir.

What is this antenna? Basically it is a short wire (as opposed to a long wire) antenna which would be notcable only by someone looking for it and within a few feet of the wire itself, so you can see, no one will see it but you.

How do you build it? First let us picture the environment we will be working in. Assume the building you live in is of a normal shape (square, rectangle type), in other words it does not have rooms sticking out all over. Assuming you have four or five straight windows on one side of your building, then two people looking out of the two farmost windows should be able to see one another without difficulty. If you meet this condition then let us proceed. My idea is to get a wire connected between the two farmost apart windows. This wire will be used as an antenna. In many cases the length will be up to fifty feet long, indeed a satisfactory length for a good antenna.

As for putting this antenna up, well there are many possibilities of which I will discuss a few. The basic idea assumes you must work only from your windows. Working from your own window means you should work one window at a time. Assuming you have four windows spread over thirty five feet. Take about 45 feet of 20-24 gauge insulated or bare copper wire and with the help of a stick of some sort (broom handle, etc.) tape the end of the wire to the stick and leaning out of the window with the stick (and wire) pointing as near as pssible to the second window, have a friend pull the wire off the stick and through the second window. Then take the stick to the second window and have your friend go to the third window and repeat the procedure again. Do this until you reach the last window. Then secure the wire outside the last window, allowing for slack for the wind.

A variation of this plan might include dropping from the end windows a length of string to the ground and have someone tie them together therefore making the string continuous from the windows. Then tie the wire to one string end and pull in the string at the other end, pulling with it the wire. This plan is useful if you live within a few floors of the ground. If you live a few floors oelow the roof then consider this 1dea: take a string to the roof and drop each end to the end windows and proceed from there. If you live in the middle floors of a high rise building then the original idea or your own variation would be used.

When leading in to the radio, you can either use one of the ends if your receiver is in a room with the end window or you can tap the wire and make a sort of "T" antenna.

The performance of this antenna is very good. I use a variation of this antenna and pull in stations from all directions. With as little as fifteen feet you should pull in more stations than with an indoor entenna, and bring a smile to your face.

A HINT ON IMPROVING RECEPTION. . .by David Ambruster. . .Here's a tip that may help a lot of SPEEDX'ers improve reception. Many members are aware of "buzzing" noises that can virtually ruin reception, especially on the lower frequencies. These annoyances can be virtually oliminated by tuming off some household appliances. As many DX'ers know, the most common culprit is the fluorescent light. Other offenders include television sets, $C B$ radios, riostats, humidifiers, dishwashers and countless more. of course, if your household is anything like mine, you may not have too much say on whether or not the dishwasher runs or not, but a simple explanation, and maybe an offer to do the dishes later, may help convice non-DXIers that Ulan Bator Radio is more important than the dishes! So, if you want to improve reception, and maybe pull in a few new stations - TURN OPF THAT FLUORESCENT LIGHT.

SOME NOTES ON THE 1978 LAMVENTION
by Serge Peter Neumann

Probably close to 23,000 persons attended the three day annual hamvention, held this year at the Hara Arena and sponsored by the Dayton Amateur Radio Association. Of primary interest to shortwave DXers:

Torrestronics. Inc. has introduced a "universal digital frequency readout" unit that is guaranteed to work with ANY receiver, regardess of Ir frequencies. Connects directly to rear of Drake, Kenwood and Heathkit receivers; connects internally to others. Is four digit readout, with last digit in increments of 100 Hz . There is No megaifertz readout, so what you get for a frequency such as 4885.5 kHz would be 885.5 on the counter. HAMvention display showed the unit in operation on all bands of an $\mathrm{HQ}-180 \mathrm{~A}$, which is double and triple conversion; and on a Drake unit also. Lists at $\$ 89.95 \mathrm{kit}$ and enclosures. Built and tested price at HAMvention was $\$ 109.00$. Address: Torrestronics, Inc., 4850 Hollywreath Ct , Dayton, OH 45424 . (Coverage is 1 to 50 mHz and although I've seen unit in use, have not yet purchased one. . . but plan on doing so this summer. They were selling like hot-cakes at Dayton.)

Drake's new $R-7$ receiver, the sister version of the TR-7 transceiver, is going on the market at $\$ 795$. It's a solid state, synthesized readout receiver in a new look design which seems to be in this year: it looks more like an $F M$ tuner. My guess is that it will replace the R4C although none of the reps at the booth would come out and say it. one told me "it's possible, " and that's as close as I got. $R-7$ has an excellent external, clear plastic band selector switch on the left which is very functional in design, but looks like something off a CHEAF FM tuner.

Yaesu's new $\mathrm{FR}-7000$ was also on display, but that's about all. The reps just got it in, or so they said: they had not received any spec sheet nor price list, and know little of the receiver. Shaped much like Drake R-7 unit. Has tiny speaker built in (which I didn't like), direct readout and lacks notch filtering. Has built in digital clock which can read out in GMT or local time. . .

Sor someone who's used to using equipment you can get your hands on, the trend was disappointing for me: delicate little knobs and meters that are hard to get a hold of and read.

Cther feature: the flea market was simply fabulous, and far more enjoyable than the new nroduct displays. In excess of 150 vendors came from around the country to sell used gear. Used HQ-180's were going for between $3275-\mathbf{B} 300$; an SFR-4 for $\$ 475$. An R 4 B for less than $\$ 400$. Lots of military and scrap gear. An impeccably clean $\mathrm{E}-390 \mathrm{~A}$ was going for $\$ 400$, in fact it could have been new (but wasn't). Some really good buys, some were rip-offs. Either way, it was lots of fun looking. Next HAMvention in Dayton to be held April 27, 28, 291979.

HELICALLY WOUND VERTICAL FOR SWL

Last summer as $I$ was just beginning as a SWL I was searching for a workable antenna system. For the $49,31,25$ and 19 meter bands I decided on a quarter wave multiband dipole mounted on the roof of my two story apartment building. I did not have room however to construct a dipole for the $120,90,75$ or 60 meter bands.

The answer I settled on was a helically wound vertical described in the ARRL's Radio Amateur's Handbook ( $1977 \mathrm{ed} \mathrm{pp} .606,$.607 ). I decided to make several modifications to their design since mine was not to be a transmitting antenna. The description that is contained is of my antenna as it stands today, for the original design please refer to the handbook.

The mast of the antenna must meet several important considerations: (1) It must be a dielectric, (2) it must be weather proof, (3) it must be strong enough to stand the amount of stress (wind, etc) placed on it, and (4) it should be round to insure complete omnidirectional response.

Ny choice for a mast was a twelve foot length of hand rail. I located it at a building supply outlet. It was completely sealed with spar varmish, four coats.

The next step was to wind the mast. I chose 20 gauge, insulated, solid conductor wire. The helically wound antenna will be electrically 4 wave when wound with wave length of wire. (Flease note that it was my experience using a dip meter, that unless coax lead in is used, the length of the lead in must be considered in the antenna.) Before beginning to wrap, I coated the mast with another layer of spar varmish and allowed this to become tacky, this helped to hold the windings in place during construction. The antenna should be spaced wound in as innear a manner as possible. The distance between wraps was one inch (I am not sure this is really critical in a receiving-only antenna.)

Once the antenna was wrapped the entire mast was again given four coats of spar varnish to hold the windings in place and insure weather proofing.

According to the handbook, the high end of the antenna should have 6 inch metal disk or 12 inch spike connected to the winding to act as a capacitance gain. This was omited as it was deemed unnecessary for reception.
For a lead in, I again chose 20 gauge, insulated, sold conductor wire.
A vertical antenna needs to work against a good earth ground system for best results. As an apartment dweller it was impossible for me to construct an in ground, ground plane. Ny solution for this was to use a 10 ft length of copper tubing driven completely into the ground. A one point ground system is not to be recommended for optimum performance out has worked satisfactorally for me.

To mount the antenna I used four mV mast type U-bolt brackets. I would suggest when using a wooden mast that $25-35 \%$ of the total mast height be located between the top and bottom brackets unless guys are to be used.

My finished product sits atop my apartment building. The top of the mast is 42 feet above ground level. I used no guy wires and the mast has survived the $35-40 \mathrm{mph}$ winds of this last winter with no problems. The antenna is resonant at 3.1 mHz . I work it with a coil and capacitor tuner into a $D X-160$. This set up has been satisfactory for the bands intended and performs within 2 S-units of my dipole at the higher bands.

Sooner or later most SWL's develop a preferred list of stations and countries to hear and/or aSL. I wondered if there was much difference among DXers of the East Coast verses west Coast. Analyzing results submitted over the past 7 weeks I have found very little difference. No comparis on between US versus Europe can be made from the one report from England that was received; surprisingly, his "most wanted" were similar to the US choices. Apparently, a very rare country is rare over most of the globe. Asia and Facific are the most difficult to hear and confirm.

In the order of most votes received we have the following:

1. Mongolia
2. Antarctica
3. Cook Islands
4. Falkland Island
5. Maldives
6. Bhutan
7. Tristan da Cuna
8. New Hebrides
9. Comoro Island
10. Cambodia

Almost all stations reported Mongolia as the number 1 most "sought, after" confirmation; including yours truly.

I had intended to report on the most favored $2 S L$ of all but received only Iimited response to this item. I was not surprised to see many U'tility stations listed for the question.

Over all, I am quite happy with the responses to the "most wanted"; yet now I feel compelled to go one stage further in asking all our Mongolian SWL'ers what is your "most wanted?"

MYSTERY RADIO SIGNALS DELAY SATELLTHE LAUNCH. . .Mysterious radio signals, whose origin cannot be traced led to the posponement on Sunday, November 20,1977 of the scheduled launching of Meteosat, the first European weather satelite.

The parasite signals were on the same frequency as the one that would be used to send self-destruct orders in case something went wrong with Meteosat's launcher, US Thor-Delta rocket.

The delay was the fourth in launching Meteosat, which will be the European space agency's i3th satellite and the first to be used for weather research. The launch had been rescheduled for the 22 nd of November.

Two previous lauch rockets and satellites were destroyed because of malfunctions. (The Vancouver Sun, Canada, November 21, 1977 by Don Dutkowski.)

## E. Y. Sandy Elaize,

I recently had the pleasure of testing the Nordmends $3 G B$ all zand receiver. The set is a large size portable, about the size and layout of the Grinig Eatallit series, which it no doubt was producer to corpete with. It is a little lighter an smaller than the Grundis, and the dial has been somewhat simplified. It is offered as an "SSe receiver" and was found to be satizfactory for SSB reception on the general coverage bands and the "spread" bands. Tuning on the general coverage cands is a bit touchy, but once the signal desired is tuned in, the set was amazingly stable considering the arrangement. I listened to 6540 one night (aeronautical SS3) for about two hours and didn't retune, ance the set settled down

The dial scheme is rather unusual in that the LN, MN and SWi ranges can be read from the top and front of the big slide rule dial. rm and "spread" band turet is read from the front only, while Sw2 and SW3 bands are on top only. This is kind of unhancy if you co any UTE DXing, as you must get up sut of your chair to tune the two highest bands in order $=0$ see the scales if you have the receiver sitting on a normal height desk. The general coverage SW bands tune 1.6 thru 19 MHz . in the three bands. Performance on these bands was good, but one has to interpolate by "eyeball" the frequency as the calibration marks are fairly far gopart.

The "scread" ranges cover amateur bands from 80 thru 10 meters as well as SWBC bands from 49 thru 11 meters. SSB reception on these bands is stable and very satisfactory. The "S" meter is calibrated in ३SA units from 1 to 5 and appears to be useful and accurate. It really takes a wholloping signal to nake it read "5"!! The set performed well on both its built in whif antenna and a 26 meter end fed longwire with no sign of spurious responses or images. One disappointing thing was the omission of the to meter band from the "spread" ranges. This popular DXers band must be tuned on the not too well calirrated Swh band, and finding a station by frequency is a chore.

The dials and "S" meter are illuminated at all times when the set is used on $A C$ power and a pushbutton switches on the lamps when the batteries are in use. Dial illumination, while not very bright, is adequate in a darkened room.

A "DIN" socket is provided on the side for recorder input/outcut. The line cable stores in a compartment in the rear of the receiver when not in use. The set will work from 115 or 230 volts AC 50-60 Hz . Voltage range is selected by a coin slot operated switch. It may also be powered by an external voltage source from 9-16 volts DC. Batteries are the standard "D" cells and the set uses 6 . NiCad batteries were tried and the set worked very well on these. The changeover to batteries from AC is automatic when the line cord is pulled out of its socket. (Similar to the new Panasonic sets.)

For SSS operation, a product detector is used and the built-in BFO has a front panel pitch control, which doubles as a fire tune control when using SSB on the "touchy" general coverage bands: SW1-3. AGC is defeatable, if desired and an RF gain or sensitivity control is provided. AGC works fairly well on SSB, but has a short time constant which makes strong SSB signals "pop" between words.

Two degrees of selectivity are provided: Broad and Shary. The sharp position is adequate to seperate some close stations, but could be sharper for really "digging them out". The Sharp position also cuts in an audio filter to linit the audio bandpass of the receiver, and this helps filter out some of the "crud" and tends to minimize low frequency hets;

One feature peculiar to this receiver is a "squelch" control. This is set by a pot in the rear of the set and switched on and of: on the rront panel. I Aished they had put the level or "threshold" control on the front panel, as it would have been easier to get at! It proved very useful when monitoring a UTE "network" frequency where there are short transmissions followed by periods of static that are best "quieted" to save the family's nerves! (For example: Aero or Coast Guard channels.)

The FM band produces very nice hi-fidelity audio when you are tired of BEC, Yadio Nederland or whatever. Sound is reproduced by twin loudspeakers and a 7 watt music power audio amplifier. ( 4 watts on batteries due to reduced voltage on audio trannys in the output stages)

This receiver, while adequate for the S'NL or casual DXer cannot be classified as a "Communications" receiver. It will serve the S'NL/DXer well who plans to use the hobby as a stepping stone into amateur radio due to the "dual band" sunction, and can be called upon as an auxiliary "ham" receiver.

(Measured using an ACVTVM and a URM-25 signal generator modulated $30 \%$ by a 1000 Hz . tone.)
Image rejection: Setter than 40 db . from SW1-SW3. Eetter than 60 db . on "spread" bands. Not measured on LW, MW and FM bands. No detectable images were experienced whilst "listening" tests were in progress. Bands Covered: $145-420 \mathrm{kHz} ., 515-19,000 \mathrm{kHz}$. in 5 bands, plus FM-88-108 Mnz, Bandspread: 11 bands covering $80,40,20,15$ and 10 meter amateur bands. 49, 41, 31, 25, 19, 16, 13 and 11 meter bands. Plus CB band. SELECTIVITY: Broad Sharp

As stated before, the arrangement is quite similar to the Grundig Satellit and three seperate tunig controls are used to tune 1.) MW, LW, SW1-SW3, 2.) FM and 3.) the "spread" bands. This makes it nice, as you can leave the FM pointer set at your favorite FM station with out disturbing the setting when going to other bands. Band selection is accomplished by pushbuttons on top of the set, while the "spread" bands are selected by a rotary knob on the right side of the set. A seperate scale coming up ror each "spread" range.
