

#### EDITORSHIP CHANGE



#### A SHORT WAVE LISTENER SPEAKS OUT

In these days of, what appears to be, universal rising costs, government budget deficits and the re-shuffling of government spending priorties in keeping with changing economic and social needs, it is, in my opinion, completely understandable to short wave listeners everywhere that government attention to the amount of funds allocated to short wave broadcasts is under the same careful scrutiny as are all government funded programs. As taxpayers, we are aware and encouraged that the system for allocating government funds is constantly being studied and improved in a manner befitting government's fiscal responsibility to electorates in all countries.

Quantifiable, tangible evidence or results in the way of listener's reception reports is one form of effectiveness measure of the government monies devoted to short wave broadcasting, and again, as short wave listeners enjoying a longstanding, respected hobby, we can appreciate doing our share in the important task of generating prompt and accurate listener reception reports to ensure that this seriously threatened hobby remains viable, not only for ourselves, but for future generations as well. Put very simply, we the short wave listeners have to cooperate to preserve what has been for all of us an enjoyable and rewarding pastime. Recognizing our responsibility for the continuation of short wave broadcasts, we should willingly do our part in return for the hours of enjoyment provided by the shortwave broadcasts and the respective governments funding these broadcasts. One and all have our deepest appreciation. So much for the listener, our responsibility and the first leg of the communication feedback sub-system depicted in the chart below.



#### SHORT WAVE BROADCAST AND LISTENING SYSTEM

Now to an equally, if not more important feedback loop in the communication system. Sub-system 2 depicted in the chart is the mechanism or the satisfaction on the part of the short wave listener by the short wave broadcaster for having cooperated, namely the receipt of the treasured QSL card. That event, if you will, completes the loop and satisfies, what is, in my opinion, the responsibility of both parties. A QSL card is not to be taken lightly. It is an integral part of the excitement, thrill and adventure of short wave listening, not an academic exercise or peripheral activity with little or no meaning to the short wave listener. Again, we the responsible short wave listeners are alert to rising mail costs and the unrealistic and excessive demands placed on shortwave broadcasters on the part of some short wave listeners to receive multi-QSL cards in a short period of time. It is my understanding that this topic is to be discussed at length at the up-coming meeting of short wave listeners to be held in Canada and it is an issue with many faceted dimensions, many of which are valid. Abuses notwithstanding, it is of little or no satisfaction to me, the reasonable and concerned short wave listener, when, after investment is made in an air mail stamp and IRC/s to satisfy my obligation as a listener, to receive a QSL card three or four months later or worse yet, no QSL card at all. Needless to say that, in my view, there is a responsibility on the part of the short wave broadcasters to fulfill a very real and vital need on the part of me, the listener; station verification. Both parties, listener and broadcaster, should recognize their respective responsibilities and realize that the total communication feedback loop is not closed until sub-system 1 and 2 are completed.

Let's us, the short wave listeners, shake out the un-reasonable demands placed on the broadcasters in terms of QSL and other abuses. But, at the

same time, it is the genuine appeal of this writer that broadcasters consider their obligation to the listener in the formulation and administration of their short wave broadcasting and verification policies in order that short wave as a service and as a hobby may flourish to the mutual satisfaction of both parties.

If we do our fair and reasonable share, the results might well prove synergistic (1 plus 1 equals 3) and the payoff of that effort could lead to the enrichment, embellishment and perhaps even a revival of short wave broadcasting and listening, something of significant importance to each of us.

Ed note; John's article not only conveys an excellent message, but is also timely. We should all be concerned during the "International Broadcasters Year 1978". Too, SPEEDX will be at Montreal during the ANARC Convention.

AUSTRALIA...Radio Australia broadcasts Keith Glover's Mailbag program at 1940 GMT Saturday and at 0140, 0740 and 1240 GMT Sundays. Club Forum is heard at 2040 GMT Fridays and at 0240, 0840 and 1440 GMT on Saturdays. Pop music in some form can be heard daily from 0910-1100 GMT.(all direct) Denis Gibbons Sings can be heard Saturdays at 0110, 0710, 1310 and 1910 GMT. The series is fifteen minutes of the songs and stories of the Australian pioneer.(Jim O'Brien, Surrey, B.C.)

AUSTRIA....Report From Austria can be heard daily to North America at 0130 and 0330 GMT. A feature program can be heard daily following the "Report"--all days are GMT days--Monday--Post Box 700 at 0130, Austrian Musical Trip at 0330; Tuesday--Sports Review; Wednesday--Austria and the U.N.; Thursday--The Austrian Economy; Friday--Pop Corner; Saturday-The Week In Austria; Sunday--For Tourists. Additionally, Austrian Shortwave Panorama can be heard at 0300 GMT Sunday. (direct)

FINLAND...Feature programs are first broadcast over Radio Finland at 1930 GMT daily. They are then repeated at 2130, 2300 the same day and at 0930, 1300 and 1430 GMT the following day. For example, Mondays program is first heard at 1930 GMT Monday and last heard at 1430 GMT Tuesday. The lineup: Monday-Starting Finnish, Fresh Air or Made in Finland; Tuesday-Voices of Finland; Wednesday-Spotlight, Helsinki Calling; Thursday-Standpoint, On the Town or Off the Cuff; Friday-Newsmagazine; Saturday-Letterbox; Sunday-Finland in Focus or Out & About. A special 90-minute feature transmission, Sunday Best is heard at 0800 and 1300 GMT Sundays. (direct)

GREAT BRITAIN...The BBC World Service has the following programs scheduled for July: The State of the Unions explores the labor situation in the UK beginning July 12 at 1430 GMT Wednesday, 0330 GMT Thursday and 2030 GMT Friday; The Promenade Concerts are an annual treat for lovers of classical music. Concerts are scheduled for 1830 GMT on the following days: July 21, 22, 28, 29 and 31. People and Folk is a series devoted to a different subject each week and its representation in the folk music of Britain. Tune in Sundays at 0530 GMT, Tuesdays at 0215 GMT and at 1115 GMT Thursday for this month's topics: War, Love Songs, Women's Lib, Sport, Sea Fishing.(Jim O'Brien) A Taste For Adventure begins this month(July 311). Each week a different "adventurer" will be interviewed @ 0315 GMT Mondays, 0745 Tuesday, 1115 Wednesday and 2145 Friday. (London Calling, except as noted)

#### PROGRAM PAGE #2

PROGRAM SCHEDULES... The best source of program information for shortwave listeners is news from the station itself. Nearly all of the major stations heard will send listeners a program schedule on request. This service is of mutual benefit to station and listener, but for the latter, it can get to be an expensive proposition, especially if he listens to many stations. There are a number of stations which provide an even better service for listeners. These stations provide listeners with program and frequency schedules on a regular basis—through a mailing list. Below you will find a list of stations which provide this service. The list in not intended to be all-inclusive, exhaustive, perfect, etc. It will enable you to get maximum program and frequency information at a minimum of cost. Only stations with some sort of mailing list arrangements will be listed—others(like VOA) will provide schedules only on request.

What length of time will a station keep you on its mailing list? A lot of the Communist countries will keep you on their lists indefinitely. I've been receiving schedules from Hungary and Cuba since 1969. Other stations make you send in a renewal card every two years or so. Many Western stations on tight budgets require this renewal. Practically speaking, if you are interested sufficiently in a station to have a sked sent, keep in touch and you'll remain on their list indefinitely.

VAR AR NI, SVERIGES RADIO? (or "Never Let Your Left Hand Know What Your Right Is Doing!"): One weekend early in May Dr. Richard Wood, ertswhile DXer and linguistic expert, attended the annual meeting of the Society for the Advancement of Scandinavian Study. Among those participating in the conclave was an official representative of the New York-based Swedish Information Service. Periodically....as in our March edition of SOAP BOX....discussion turns to the vagaries of SINPO Code employment. Boston area SPEEDXer BOB FRASER has a few thoughts in that vein:

"...I, too, find the 'overall merit' too ambiguous a term. I decided, finally, to mark this by how much of the transmission I could make out. For instance, if I am able to understand 95% to 100% of the words, I would give '0' a 5; but if I could understand only two-thirds of the message, then the '0' would get a 3. Once in a while, there would be a fairly loud station which would have poor modulation. With no interference or noise to speak of and little fading, it would get a SINPO of 45552. Then I would have to explain why the overall merit was so poor ...

"I would like to propose replacing the 'O' with 'R' for 'readability....a term I've swiped from Ham radio...,making it SINPR (or SIR). I think 'readability' is more to the point.... after all, getting the message across is what radio is all about ... "

Perhaps as a "finis" to the subject under scrutiny from virtually every possible point of view since November 1976 a trio of SPEEDXers have called attention to an article culled from the pages of RSA CALLING ... the subject, of course, is "DXing and SWLing"... and the item forwarded is entitled "What Is A DXer?" ... and it suggests some complex definitions for the radio listener. Maryland SPEEDXer Bruce Chituck, one of our contributors, thought the article worthy of mention. Essentially, the article author purports that enthusiasts be divided into six categories...the NOVICE RADIO LISTEMER, which, of course is the obsolute beginner... the RADIO COUNTRY CHASER, ye olde QSL card collector....the PROGRAM LISTENER, who expresses specific tastes in subject matter....the SHORTWAVE LISTENER, who expresses interest in varied broadcast material....the RECEPTION MONITOR, a semitechnical listener...and, finally, the hobbyist who knows most things about radio listening...whom he calls the DXER. As SPEEDXer Ed Insinger notes this could well result in "a myriad of titles for, shall I say, shortwave radio enthusiasts of one degree or another"...the third member forwarding this item was Indiana SPEEDXer Jerry Dalum who probably captures the spirit of the whole affair when he states, "I personally chase countries, collect QSLs, and at times listen for program content, but, mainly, I enjoy myself ... "

On the other hand, Buffalo SFEEDXer Gary Rafe feels that as an Amateur Radio Operator and a Shortwave Listener he has come up with simple definitions for the terms "SWL" and "DXer" ... which he notes work just fine with him:

"An SWL is anyone who listens to any broadcast, be it for programming or 'DX'; all he does is listen ...

"A DXer, on the other hand, is a licensed radio amateur, or 'HAM', who not only listens to DX countries, but 'works' ... or talks to over the air ... them as well ... "

Well, SPEEDXers, looks like ya pays ya money and ya takes ya choice, after all...don't it?

A new SPEEDXer, Maryland hobbyist PACE PYNE, seeks opinions on a different subject:

"ARO stations are excluded from SWBC or utility classifications for good general reasons. I wonder, however, if we could count some amateur stations in the utility listings. I am referring to the ham stations that send bulletins or code practice on announced set skeds. In effect these stations are ham radio broadcast stations. For instance, W1AW, the ARRL QTH station in Connecticut sends out bulletins and code practice to anyone who listens.... according to a set schedule. CW, SSB, and RTTY is used in a typical broadcast day. They will even furnish program schedules on request ... Another paradoxical example would be the amateur radio satellites which contain beacon marker signals such as OSCAR 8 on 29402 kHz. It seems to me that these could be counted as bona fide utility stations as they perform a defined service in their respective areas ... "

FROM SWEDEN CALLING DX'ERS #1483:UNITED STATES - WYFR has started broadcasting in Portuguese to S. America; heard 2100-2200 on 15130 kHz.

FROM BBC MONITORING SERVICE, we have the following copyright items, which cannot be reproduced without permission from the BBCMS: ARGENTINA: Radio Rividavía, a commercial station which operates from Buenos Aires on 630 kHz, has been observed recently also broadcasting on 5882 kHz.

CHILE: R. Nacional de Chile, Santiago, has been broadcasting its domestic service since the 23rd of May on 9550 kHz instead of 9510 kHz.

R. Universidad de Concepción, which operates on 6135 kHz, now carries a 30 minute news bulletin in English at 1200. PERÚ: It was noted on May 21st that Radio del Pacifico, Lima, ended its transmissions on 9675 kHz at 2300. An announcement stated that the station would continue on

VENEZUELA: The Venezuelan Information Services, Venpres, reported on May 16th the Minister of Information and Tourism as having announced that a 1000 kW broadcasting station with the largest coverage in Latin America would be set up in Northwestern Venezuela in the area of Paraguana, Falcon State. (There was no indication as to the frequency of this station, whether SW or MW - I would suspect SW. cph)

My QSL from the Voice of the Voyager (preprinted, no less) postmarked 6/18/78 from Detroit, MI was received here today - I heard them at SPEEDXer Bob Foxworth's house, and later at my own QTH. We called them at their NY number, and had a long talk with them. At this time (6/3/78) they were using 100 watts with a North-South orientation of antenna. Some of this month's reports indicate that they might have changed QTH's and antenna patterns. Some observations about the QSL: "Voice of the Voyager" seems to be the station name, while they use the slogan "In the spirit of the Voyageurs"; "Chris (written in space) Thx for tuning in the station Everyone is trying to 'catch' (but never will....) on 5850"(again, written in a space). It seems as though they are planning for future frequency changes. Finally, as long as they keep their signal clean, it is Bob Foxworth's and my opinion that the FCC won't particularly make a fuss. E.g. WCPR, in Brooklyn, NY, was broadcasting merrily on 1620 kHz for a long while several years ago. They were only caught when the neighbors started to complain about their signal coming in over the TV or the stereo. Let's keep listening and reporting to VofV. According to one report, they have stated that they can only QSL reports that appear in SPEEDX and FRENDX, as they no longer have access to the ASWLC magazine. So, keep those reports coming in Reports of VoV appear in the usual space (after North America and Central America).

One last point - the operators of the VoV indicated during the phone call that if I printed addresses of reporters their job of verifying would be much easier. I would therefore like those who wish to receive a QSL from VoV to please indicate this in their report, and I will print your address in the column to speed the process

Finally, I would like to welcome Woody Seymour (whose colleague I was as editor of another column for another club) and Orla Reese to the staff of SPEEDK. Woody is a great DXer and will be a good asset and a hard worker for SPIEDX.

Loggings will begin now -- Times and Dates are in GMT, dates are in month/day format, frequencies are in kHz (kiloHertz) and SIO code denotes reception conditions noted.

John asks how the BBI people get these cross country hook-ups. Perhaps I can explain. These are called "loops" - and they work thusly. There is a connection in the phone company where two numbers are electrically connected together, let's say 626-9906 and 626-9904. These two numbers are connected so that, if one calls the 626-9904 number, one gets a tone. If someone subsequently calls the 626-9906 number, they are automatically connected. Why does MaBell use them? To the best of my knowledge, they are used when a number is disconnected or changed. The number changed is linked to the (e.g. 626-9904) first phone number, and the second number is dialled into a recording ( THE NUMBER YOU HAVE REACHED HAS BEEN CHANGED.....) When one dials into the changed number, you are connected to 626-9904 which is connected to 626-9906, and you hear the recording. At any one time, there are many of these numbers which are temporarily or permanently vacant (many of these pairs of numbers, that is). If I call into one side, and another person calls into the other side, we are connected and can talk. What BBI does is this: They dial the 626-9904 number, and get a tone on that connection. Then, anyone who dials the other number is automatically connected into them. Normally, this would be without ringing on the part of the called number. There would just be a click and the connection would be made. This system is mainly useful for concealing your number -- obviously 212-626-9906 is not in Detroit -- and there is no practical way to find out the number they are calling the other side of the loop from. Clear as mud?? I am indebted to a former SPEEDXer (who shall remain anonymous) for this explanation of TelCo loops.

#### Federal Radio Corporation, Nigeria:

The Migerian Broadcasting Corporation has reported that it will restructure its broadcasting operations into the new Federal Radio Corporation (apparently now in operation as of June 1st - see loggings) with a target area of the entire country. Four linguistic zones will be set up with bases in Lagos, Kaduna, Ibadan, and Enugu. The former regional state radio stations owned by the NBC will be turned over to the state governments for use in their own locals and be limited to 10 km owner to sessing them broadcasting to their state areas and thousant to power to assure there broadcasting to their state areas and thereby to not compete with the PRC.

Look for increased powers from the FRC stations who'll identify as "Federal Radio Corporation, (Lagos, etc.). State owned stations will identify as " State Radio". The Voice of Nigeria will will identify as " continue as the external service as an independent operation within the structure of the FRC. (Robert Butterfield, BBC MS, Radio Nigeria)

July again! We're over the hump for this year and even SPEEDX is a year older. HAPPY SEVENTH BIRTHDAY!

Of interest (and importance) is a press release from R. Finland forwarded by Don Johnson which I will quote in part. "....The number of reception reports flooding in has risen to a level where we either have to hire more secretarial staff and cut back on our program-makers, or tighten up on QSL card policy. We've chosen the latter. From now on, a R. Finland Audience Card is going to mean a lot more. From June 1st, the minimum details for a verified report are: (1) date, (2) time (GMT), (3) frequency, (4) program subject, (5) comment on program, (6) reception conditions. But to reward our faithful listeners and regular correspondents, we're bringing out a series of 12 Audience Cards, a different one for every month of the year.

There will still be no charge for an Audience Card - no IRCs needed. We think this would be unfair to our younger listeners, and those in developing countries. And if the postal charges to Finland are too high for any listener, he or she is welcome to send

their report to the nearest Finnish embassy.

For those who don't notice much change, let me point out that it is in item 5. You must have comments on the program. Speaking frankly (and personally), I think it is a good idea. They have a good idea of the quality from their regular monitors; what they really want to know is how their worldwide audience accepts their programming. This single item fundamentally determines their course of action in the future -- indeed, even whether or not they continue worldwide SW broadcasts. At any rate, it is heartening to know that the number of SW listeners is increasing. (And don't forget to send me copies of their new cards as they are issued.)





#### TWR AND RADIO NEDERLAND-BONAIRE



On a recent trip to Bonaire, Netherlands Antilles, on business, I managed to take a little side trip, which I thought might be worth sharing with the readers of this shortwave bulletin. That was my brief visit to the transmitting sites of Trans World Radio and Radio Nederland.

Bonaire is one of three islands that make up what is known as the "ABC" Antilles. The letters standing for: Aruba, Bonaire and Curacao. All the islands in this group lie off the coast of Venezuela. Bonaire itself is about 150 miles Northwest of Caracas, and about 40 miles east of Curacao. The "ABC" group being only three of several Dutch Antillean Islands. Bonaire is also the westernmost of the "ABC" group. The island is most famous to tourists as a place to go scuba diving. Some of the people I casually met say it is probably the finest place to go diving in all of the Caribbean. The reason for this is that the reefs are the island itself. One has only to go a few yards from shore and you are in the reefs and deeper water! Thus you don't have to be bothered with hiring boats, etc., for a decent dive. It is claimed that the beginner can see sights reserved for seasoned divers elsewhere. Unfortunately, time did not allow me to go diving. Another attraction for the tourist is the salt flats or "pans" as they are called there. Here a large colony of flamingoes nests and can sometimes be seen certain times of the year. You might have heard Tom Meyer of the "Happy Station" show mention Bonaire as the "Island of the flamingoes." I'm afraid I didn't get to see any, though.

I stayed at Hotel Bonaire which is a little north of Kralendijk (literally translated: coral dike or reef), which is the only town of any size on this 120 square mile island. Directly across the road was Trans World Badio's BIG sprawling building, which is the studio and office complex. A little further south towards town is the small Radio Nederland Wereldomroep building. This houses an office complex and three small studios. The studios contain only reel to reel commercial tape equipment for playback of the pre-recorded program of the Bonaire relay site. Two RACAL digital receivers are used for the Kootwijk, Holland feeder transmitter reception. These tape the news broadcasts that are transmitted everyday before the regular program tapes like: "His and Hers", "DX Jukebox" etc. Program material is fed via landline to the transmitter site on the northwest end of the island. Radio Nederland and TWR have separate sites on opposite ends of the island, but RN uses TWR's 800 kHz transmitter for their MW broadcast. This to end on January 1, 1978. Behind the RN office in the distance can be seen the rhombic receiving antennas for the feeder from Holland.

The first site visited was that of Trans World Radio past Kralendijk to the South and past the airport. Driving there one can see the big towers that are used on 800 kHz in the distance. As you near the area, you can see the two big curtain arrays and the corner reflector antennas for each band. I met Don Bean, the Chief Engineer and Chuck Roswell, Engineer, both were very friendly and were glad to have a DX'er to show the site. Chuck took me through the big Continental 250 kW shortwave transmitter first. Yes, I said through! One can walk into small "rooms" which comprise the different sections of the transmitter, and stand next to the matching networks, and tank circuits for the various frequencies. For those of you who are technically inclined, the final stage uses three big "triode" tubes, which of course require more driving power than those that use "tetrode" or "pentode" types, hence the transmitter will of necessity be



larger. By the way, don't worry about me walking in the transmitter! It was shut down at the time! Chuck left me with Don and he then took me over to the "little" 50 KW SW trans-mitter. This was really anti-climax after the one I just saw, but the best was yet to come. Next was the GIANT of the western hemisphere: the BIG Continental 800 kHz medium wave transmitter. This is very impressive. Ιſ 500,00 watts doesn't phase you, these statistics will. There are SIX BIG triode tubes in the final amplifier. It takes 40 KW of power just to light up the heaters in the tubes!!! It takes 50 kW (The power of the big clear channel trans-mitters here on MW) just to drive the final amplifier.

750 KW to get 500 KW output!!! Would you believe this beast is powered by a 1,600,000 watt or 1,600 KW generator driven by what looks like a ship's diesel engine!!! Again for the technically inclined, the final amp. is what is called a "Dougherty Amplifier."

We went into other parts of the building to see the water circulation and cooling gear that keeps the monster transmitters cool, then to the building where the two 1,600 kW generators are kept. Next out to the antennas. Beam switching is done by manual switches that are actuated by a "hot stick" like the power lineman use. Most of the gear at TWR is early 1960's vintage. The curtain arrays are supported by straight (untapered) guyed towers, much the same as you find at broadcast stations here. The 800 kHz array uses about 700 foot towers, five of which are used to give various directional patterns depending on how they are hooked up or "phased".

Don says the best time to listen to 800 kHz here in the US is from 0230-0500 GMT. We exchanged goodbyes and I left to go back to Kralendijk and to the North of the island.

winding through the narrow road leading to the north one can see piles of coral everywhere and several varieties of cactus profusely dotting the countryside. You dodge the hundreds of small lizards that claim the roadway and watch them really run at an amazing speed as you get close to them. In the trees you can hear the parakeets chirping to each other as you drive. Soon I was greeted by a sign on a gate leading to the main transmitter building of Radio Nederland. I met Mr. Arcario Eyebrect, Head Technican, who gave me the "50% tour" of the RN complex. They have two 300 kW Phillips transmitters of much later design than those at TWR, that use "tetrode tubes". Although they run more power, they were smaller than TWR's 250 kW rig. Like the TWR transmitters these are "vapor cooled" and require water circulation and cooling apparatus for each transmitter. RN has a complex of 14 towers that support various curtains. The towers here are the tapered or "self-supporting" type. "Beam" switching is accomplished by simply pushing a button on a big control panel in contrast to the simpler method used by TWR. Power for this complex is supplied by six large diesel generators. The number in use depending on power demand etc.

I was about to leave when Leo krabbendam, Chief Engineer drove up. He kindly invited me into his office where we talked shop about the installation there, and about world politics!!! Leo said that the sattelite relay scheme might go into effect this year, but he had serious doubts that things would be ready until at least June of 1978. Unfortunately, time

was running short, and I had to depart for the hotel.

That night, I again listened to the TWR 800 kHz transmitter and was amazed at how "clean" the signal was. The second harmonic was there with a fair signal but not at all strong for being so close. The third harmonic was a little stronger but not objectionable. You could have heard the fundamental on 800 with the radio in a double copper box buried underground:

By the way, the SSB feeders in use now for Bonaire are:

13806 kHz 1515-2020 GMT 10735.5 1825-2120 7742.5 2020-0815

Generally speaking, the day's tour was well worth while, and the transmitter hands friendly at both places. If you are ever fortunate or rich enough to visit Bonaire, don't hesitate to see these SW broadcast facilities. I hope it will be worth your while too. Don't do like I did though. Bring a camera with a working flast attachment, and get some pictures of the transmitters!

TRIALS, TRIBULATIONS AND AN ELUSIVE QSL

The evening of March 29, 1971 was a good one for DXing. At 0145 GMT, I was tuned to Radio Australia on 15320 kHz. The prospect of good DX tempted me to continue my station searching. I moved up to 15380 kHz at 0210 GMT and heard a voice say: "This is Radio Pakistan broadcasting on the morning of Tuesday. . ." I listened ever more carefully, for this was the first time I had logged Pakistan, and was prepared to make every effort to copy down all the details I could. Then I would be able to forward a reception report and request for a QSL.

Logging Pakistan on March 29, 1971 was exciting. Five days earlier, the President of Pakistan ordered the national army to enter Bangladesh and proceed to crush the separatist movement of the Bengali forces. The situation was reported in detail over Radio Pakistan. It was interesting to receive a news update from the country entangled in the essence of the news being reported and discussed.

By 0220 GMT, I had sufficient details to warrent a complete reception report. The next day, I mailed my letter to Radio Pakistan, Broadcast House, Karachi, along with two 15 cent International Reply Coupons.

The mail came on April 25, with no response from Pakistan yet. I realized it would take time. At 1520 GMT, I tuned to 17.910 MHz and found a news report in progress. At 1525 GMT, a male announcer said: "You are tuned to Radio Pakistan." I listened carefully and decided to copy some details for a follow-up report. By 1547 GMT, reception had deteriorated, but I had enough information to forward a second letter to Radio Pakistan. My address was the same as the first, with one addition: "WEST" was written before Pakistan. I mailed my report the same day, again enclosing two IRC's. Now the possibility of receiving two QSL's was real - even though one would be sufficient to please me.

1972 brought a brand new year of DXing, but January came and went without a response from Pakistan. On February 3, 1972 my morning DX included news about Gumnar Jarring, Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, the Paris Peace Talks, and the Eleventh Winter Olympics. A female announcer ended the news with an identification for Radio Pakistan, which I carefully recorded in my log book under 1310 GMT on 11705 kHz. Thus my third attempt to secure a QSL card was under way. I had received a tip previous to this logging that I might try this address, which I did: Radio Pakistan, 81-A Satellite Town, Rawalpindi, West Pakistan. I certainly felt it was worth a try - enough

to cause me to enclose three IRC's. Perhaps this would prove successful. I felt hopeful, reasoning that my first two letters may have gone astray in Karachi, while the QSL's were anxiously awaiting me in Rawalpindi. Why not? Only one thing still left me uneasy: veteran ace DX'er Al Niblack advised me that Pakistan was an erratic QSL'er and responses were few and far between. I felt a little uncertain.

Ey concerns proved more correct as time passed. The spring brought beautiful flowers and budding trees, but no QSL from Pakistan. Still, I felt compelled to continue my search. Too many hours had already been spent on Pakistan to simply give up my attempts. I plodded onward.

The afternoon of June 18, 1972 brought with it good signals from the near east region. At 2000 GMT, I tuned in to 11885 kHz for news and commentary from Pakistan. By this time I was well enough acquainted with Radio Pakistan to begin listening to program content. The news was followed by an interesting commentary dealing with the developmental planning of Pakistan, in terms of this underdeveloped country's land and its people. There was hope of extremes, from economic prosperity to the banishment of widespread poverty. (The entire undertaking was termed a "project.") My interest was further aroused at 2010 GMT, when mention of United States listeners was heard! Hope had sprung eternal and I was eager to again send them a detailed reception report. In order to enhance my report, I tuned in again the next day at 1957 GMT, to catch their unusual interval signal. I was careful to observe reception conditions, with special attention given to existing QRM, the degree of fading and how this affected overall signal quality. The ensuing reception report was complete in every way, with the addition of four US Peace Corps mint stamps and three more IRC's. I again chose the Rawalpindi address for the front of the red, white and blue bordered air mail envelope.

1972 did not pass without my sending one more reception report, from a transmission heard on October 26, at 1330 GMT, way up in the 13 meter band. This program was part of the General Overseas Service beamed to the Middle East in slow speed English. The channel was interference-free, providing good reception conditions on my SX-100 receiver. The signal disappeared at 1345, following the news. I decided to again try mint Pakistan stamps affixed to a SASE, but did not include any other enclosures. My records do not list an address used for this report. The remainder of 1972 passed without a word from Pakistan.

On June 7, 1973, I returned to the bands with yet another reception report in mind. I decided to continue my seemingly endless plight for a response from Radio Pakistan. This time the frequency was 11672 kHz at 2000 GMT. Whatever displeasure I may have felt from their lack of response was at least temporarily overcome by very beautiful and exotic music, aired at 2013 GMT. A combination of instruments and vocals like nothing ever heard before, or perhaps again, filled the airwaves. It was also a reminder to me that music knows no boundaries or particular races; it can please the least, the most and everyone else in between. (I was careful to mention the musical program in my report, and my commentary reached well beyond the immediate hopes of such small things as QSL's.) I addressed my letter to Chief Engineer S.A. Azia at the previously mentioned Rawalpindi location, along with a SASE having mint Pakistani stamps affixed to the upper right hand corner. I also enclosed a block of National Parks Centennial commemoratives totalling an unusual 8 cents, depicting the Cape Hatteras National Seashore. At the same time, I also decided to enlist the help of the Embassy of Pakistan in Washington DC. So I sent them a zerox copy of the above mentioned report, explaining the difficulty I was having obtaining a response from Radio Pakistan.

On July 19, 1973, I received a letter from Miss Nasra Hassan, Assistant Information Officer of the Embassy, stating that it was indeed unfortunate that I had not received any responses from Radio Pakistan. Miss Nassan promised to write to the Director General of the Pakistan Broadcasting Corporation and let me know of her findings. Unfortunately, I never heard from the Embassy or Miss Hassan again. However, my letter to the Embassy brought a monthly newsletter entitled Pakistan affairs. Once again, my efforts proved fruitless.

The years of 1974, 1975 and 1976 were quiet ones for me DX-wise, and without a QSL card from Pakistan mailbox-wise.

Reactivated like an old frequency or country, I logged Pakistan once again on the morning of November 12, 1977 on 15520 kHz, in Urdu to the Hiddle East. A clear ID at 1330 led me to copy some details from a language I did not understand. Words and sounds seemed very strange and most unusual. I listened intently, picking out voices and music and words in the news. By 1400 GMT, I had a brief outline of details, along with an urge to try a report once again. Larry Magne provided me with the name of a person in the Engineering Department to whom I could forward my report, Mr. N. Sarwar Shaikh. As per the 1977 WRH, I addressed it to F.O. Box 443, Karachi, Pakistan, enclosing two IRC's.

A breakthrough occurred suddenly and unexpectedly on April 8, 1978, seven years since my first logging of Pakistan! Peeking inside my brass colored mailbox, I could faintly see the edge of a postcard. I opened the lock and removed the postcard, face side up, which revealed a color photograph of an unfamiliar looking stone fortress. I was puzzled by the scene. Upon turning the card over, my eyes immediately caught glimpse of the words Pakistan Broadcasting Corporation, printed in the upper left hand corner. Below this read the following: "Thank you for listening to our Service. We confirm your report as correct." The date listed was incorrect and no frequency was given for my reception confirmation. I was happy to have received a response, despite the scarcity and quality of information provided. Now, at last, I was able to speak of a QSL card from Pakistan. I could also place an overdue check-mark next to Pakistan on my country list.

Now I have a letter to write, for which I expect to receive no report nor response. This time, I will not report reception or request a QSL. My only intention is to thank the Pakistan Broadcasting Corporation for their response. Perhaps some day I will write again. There remains the possibility of securing a full data verification, which seems to be an achieveable goal. It has been said that the first time around is the hardest.





#### WBF - A TYPICAL UTE

(I am deeply indebted to Mr. Luther W. Eldridge of South Weymouth, Mass., an engineer at WBF, for the technical information and operations of the station; and to Mr. Cornelius C. Maher, Manager of the Public Affairs Administration of the United Brands Company, for a general history of the Tropical Radio Telegraph Company.)

Back in 1871, Capt. Lorenzo Baker of Wellfleet, Cape Cod, Mass., brought to Boston, America's first cargo of bananas. Despite his friends and associates labeling them "monkey fruit", they were quickly sold. Pleased, Baker immediately went into business growing and shipping bananas. In 1885, Baker headed up a Boston group forming the Boston Fruit Company. The headquarters were located in the Board of Trade Building at 131 State Street and the firm leased the whole south side of nearby Long Wharf. In 1899, the Boston Fruit Company headed up and became controlling member of a merger of 12 American banana growing and shipping concerns which became the United Fruit Company. Merging with other food producing firms in the 1950's and 1960's, United Fruit became the United Brands Company in 1970.

Sailing ships first brought the unusual fruit and after 1879, steamships. Refrigerator ships were first used in 1903. The fruit was picked green and ripened on the voyage. But it was highly fragile and the hot tropics or cold New England weather quickly spelled disaster despite all precautions. Often, tons of rotting bananas had to be thrown overboard while at sea. Bostonians quickly learned to flock to Long Wharf whenever a banana boat was expected. Almost always, stalks of over-ripe bananas, which couldn't be sold, would be handed out. A story told me was of a man who received a stalk of about 100 bananas. As he shouldered his way through the mob on the wharf, many "helping hands" reached out. When he was free of the people, he discovered all he had was a bare stalk.

The invention of radio greatly interested United Fruit. By it, they could keep in touch with their Central American branches and ships at sea. In 1903, United Fruit began building their own network. The US Navy's "Wireless Radio Stations of the World" (1907) list four radio stations in Central America owned by the Boston Fruit Company. They were: "B" at Bocas del Toro, Panama; "X" at Puerto Limon, Costa Rica; and "Q" at Bluefields and "UE" at Rama, both in Nicaragua. The only details given was that the equipment was all by Shoemaker. As all long distance stations then, they operated on long wave, were of the spark type, and used CW instead of voice. Oddly, none of the Boston Fruit Company's American stations are listed nor none of the shipboard radios. The latter may be explained as the Boston Fruit/United Fruit only owned one ship in their whole existance, chartering all their vessels.

The tropics are plagued by many thunderstorms with resultant static. Mr. Eldridge was first at an United Fruit spark type radio station in Guatemala. He told me that the reception of a spark type transmission often sounded more like static than did the static itself.

In 1913, the Tropical Radio Telegraph Company was established as a wholly owned subsidiary of United Fruit to take over and operate the parent company's radio network.

It is not known when WBF came into existance but it was in operation in 1928 when Mr. Eldridge joined it. WBF was first located on the Board of Trade Building's roof and the four antennastowers still exist here. Mr. Eldridge passed on two stories he heard of the call letters. One is that they stand for William B. Filene, owner of the famous Filene's Department Store and prominent member of Boston's Board of Trade. The other story was that the letters stand for the Boston Fruit Company. Mr. Eldridge doesn't take stock in either legend.

Due to lack of room for the growing business, WBF was moved to Charles Street, in southeastern Hingham, Mass., located some 12 miles southeast of Boston. Two 250 towers, oriented east and west were built with a four wire flat top aerial. The antenna was divided into two portions, one for

147 kHz and the other for 436/500 kHz on the long wave marine band. The 147 kHz section was fed directly from the main transmitter using a single wire transmission line. The 436/500 kHz section was energized through an open wire feed line to a tuner house under the east tower. Inside it was a relay which selected the proper inductance of the leading coil for either 436 or 500 kHz. The relay was under direct control of the radio operator as well as various other relays within the transmitter itself. A storm (possibly the 1938 hurricane) destroyed the flat top aerial and it was replaced by a single wire, divided into 147 kHz and 436/500 kHz portions.

The main transmitter, covering the low frequency marine band, was rated at 25 kw and used a water cooled tube in the final with 20,000 volts in the plate. The transmitter had come from the TRT Guatemala station at Barrios where it had been a long wave relay between the other TRT stations and as direct communication to New Orleans. The new shortwave transmitters had made it obsolete so it was brought to the US, rebuilt to cover the long wave marine frequencies, and installed at Hingham. No one knows what type it was. Mr. Eldridge said that the nameplate had been removed in the rebuilding and never restored. Despite its age, the transmitter was very satisfactory and under good atmospheric conditions, covered most of the North Atlantic and as far south as Chile.

The auxiliary transmitter was a 750 watt RCA shipboard type. Its antenna was a single line frunning from the transmitter to half way up the east tower. Switching frequencies on the auxiliary was very clumsy to say the least. The radio operator was unable to do it and he had to call the man on duty at the transmitter to do the switching for him. Fortunately, the short range auxiliary was seldom used.

There were also a couple of "home-made" marine high frequency band transmitters rated at 2.5 kw input power. They energized Delta type doublet antennas with one antenna for each frequency used. The transmitters were hand tuned twice a day since there were daytime frequencies and nighttime frequencies. These antennas were oriented northeast-southwest to cover most of the traffic.

Marine operation was shut down in 1942-1945 because of the war and ceased in 1950.

The four point-to-point transmitters were also converted RCA types of 2.5 kw each. Each transmitter had its own line to the receiving station and could be separately keyed by the operator on duty. The PTP transmitters used broadband Rhombic antennas energized by 500-ohm open wire transmission lines. The antennas were oriented on Miami, Florida; New Orleans, LA; La Lima, Honduras; Guatemala City, Guatemala; and Panama City, Panama.

A FCC ruling about 1939 forced a change in the WBF transmissions. Before, a. lot of private messages had been sent but now, it all had to be of a commercial nature. The FCC also required frequent identification on each transmitter while in use. Motor driven identification discs with time delays were used at WBF. With the first impuse over the keyline, the relay opened permitting the use of the transmitter by the remote operator. At the end of the operation and after a predetermined time, the relay closed putting the identification disc back in the keyline.

After World War II, the FCC ruled that each frequency was to have its own call. Thus, the PTP circuits dropped WBF and became WBW, WBO, WBQ, WCA-36, WCB-20, WCB-23, and WCB-27. (Nr. Eldridge thought there were more call letters but was unable to recall them.) Incidently, the PTP circuits continued in use during World War II but Naval personnel were on hand for the usual censorship.

The receiving station of WBF was also moved from Boston to Charles Street, Hingham in 1930 and it stood on the southern half of the property. In 1938, due to increased traffic and its close proximity to the transmitter, the receiver was moved to Derby Street, Hingham and about 2 miles southwest. This used Rhombic antennas for the PTP circuits and Doublet antennas for the high band marine frequencies. Underground hard drawn copper transmission lines ran from the terminating transformers on the antenna poles to the antenna switchboard in the basement of the receiving station.

Until 1952, all traffic was transmitted by hand or by prepunched perforated tape and incoming messages were transcribed by the operators directly on typewriters. Teletypewriters connected the radio station to Western Union and the United Fruit headquarters in Boston. Afterwards, all manual telegraphic operations ceased and teletypewriters were used. Incoming messages were received in printed form and outgoing traffic was transcribed on tape. To prevent reception of all messages by all stations, a "forked system" (Mr. Eldridge's words) was used. A special coded pulse was transmitted first which started the teletypewriter in the desired station.

On June 30, 1960, the Hingham station was closed and its traffic then handled either by Miami or New Orleans. This may have been due to the fact that the Port of Boston had been going downhill since the end of World War II. In fact, only a few of its 250 wharves are in use today.

The northern half of the Charles Street property (where the transmitter stood) was sold to the Maryknoll Fathers who built a school on the site. The southern half of the property (where the first receiver stood) was used by the TRT Engineering Service from 1938 to 1971. Then they moved to the Prudential Building, Boston and in 1974, to Washington DC. This section of the Charles Street property was then sold to a "gentleman farmer". The Derby Street property (where the second receiver stood) is now the Hingham Shopping Plaza. Oddly, and as previously mentioned, the original WBF antennas still exist atop the Board of Trade Building in Boston.

The Tropical Radio Telegraph Company is now the Tropical Radio Telecommunications Corporation with headquarters in Washington, DC. It is still wholly owned by United Brands Company.

Mr. Eldridge added that TRT has only one active radio station in use today - WNU, New Orleans which also has two PTP circuits. The Miami station, WAX, was closed in 1975. As many Utes, TRT is now using landlines, cable, microwave, and satellite relays and automatic message distributions. Despite their radio stations closing, TRT is rapidly expanding its circuits via the new means into Europe, Central and South America, the Caribbean, and the Far East (via San Francisco).

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT. . . by Brett Dauer. . . Did you know that it is possible for you to hear a live broadcast over your radio before the people within the same studio? As strange as it may seem this is true for even the most distant DX. This is made possible because of the fact that radio waves travel at approximately the speed of light which is 186,282 miles per second, compared to sound waves which only travels at a speed of 1/5 of a mile per second.

SWL OR DX. . . by Ed Kavalesky. . .DX or SWL? To some it is very important, to others it makes little difference. As long as it is a subject that can get us to jot down a few lines for a club column it is well worth a discussion.

My own opinion is that a devout DXer is one who hunts through the bands and records or jots down information for the sole purpose of identification and/or QSLs for the club identification columns.

An SWIer is one who depends solely on program schedules, whether it be published schedules or his own, and at no time randomly turns that dial. He does not turn on the ra-did-io unless he knows a specific program is being broadcast and has no curiosity as to what might be 5 kHz up the band.

Myself, I like to turn that dial whenever possible and log whatever I can. However, if a DX program or science and tech program is being aired I'll be listening to it, if possible.

Sure there are devotees on both sides of the fence. But for about 70% of us, who like both sides of that fence, aren't we really SWEs (Shortwave Enthusiasts)??????????????????????????
